Pop-up Libraries bring the books alive in a park. The next sessions are Wednesday 10 and 24 February from 9.30am to 11.30am.





TOP TIPS FOR WEIGHT LOSS IN PETS

The festive season often sees everyone indulging a little more than usual. This can lead to excess weight gain – in our pets too! Obesity in pets can lead to a number of health issues including heart disease, diabetes and arthritis.

Weight loss in dogs and cats requires a combination of diet and exercise, just the same as in people.

Here are some tips to help your furry friends regain their ideal body condition.

- Carefully monitor your pet's food intake. The occasional treat does not hurt but constantly giving titbits during the day can really add up.
- If you are using treats as rewards when training your pet make sure that you reduce the amount of food you are giving in their regular meal.
- Look for healthy treats. There are a number of ready-made treats available which have low fat and calorie contents. Try veggies as a reward some dogs will happily chomp on a carrot!
- Make time every day to exercise your pet. For cats as little as 10 to 15 minutes of interactive play such as chasing a laser pointer or pouncing on a fishing line type toy can help move those excess kilos. Regular walks or swimming are good if they enjoy it, and both are great ways to exercise your dog (and you get the added benefit of being able to enjoy the beautiful walkways in our area).
- Visit your vet to make sure that your pet has no medical issues which may be contributing to weight gain. Conditions such as hypothyroidism and hyperadrenocorticism (Cushing's disease) can lead to unexplained weight gain. Your vet can diagnose these with blood tests.

The BCLS legal services are applied across a broad spectrum of legal issues and problems, such as

debt, family, child support, domestic violence, consumer, tenancy, crime, employment, Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal (QCAT) applications and driving offences. The BCLS also provide a mediation service.

Having noticed an increase in family law matters and other personal legal matters during the Covid-19 pandemic, particularly to those most vulnerable, DBL Solicitors reached out to the Bayside Community Legal Services to offer their support and time as volunteers to ensure that those from all walks of life get access to justice.

partner providers offering free counselling will be back, namely Centrelink, Silky Oaks, QHinN and Housing Commission.

EXPANDING THE HARVEST TRAIL SERVICE TO SUPPORT FARMERS

Australians are encouraged to take up seasonal work opportunities in horticulture as part of a collaboration trial funded by the Morrison Government.

Federal Member for Bonner Ross Vasta MP said relocation assistance was available to people who relocated to harvest in regional areas to take up short-term agricultural work.

"This includes Australians who are not currently receiving income support and those with the right to work in Australia," Mr Vasta said.

"If you're considering relocating to take up short-term agricultural work, you may be eligible to receive up to \$6000 if you're an Australian worker, or \$2000 if you're a visa holder with general work rights."

The Morrison Government has also expanded the Harvest Trail Service into 16 regions to ensure major horticulture areas have access to the workers they need.

Minister for Employment, Skills, Small and Family Business, Senator the Hon Michaelia Cash said the trial would test-run different ways to promote harvest work to Australian job seekers.

"We know growers are struggling to find the labour they need, which

is why Harvest Trail Services is as important as ever," Minister Cash said.

"As part of Harvest Trail Services, we have provided additional funds to a number of growers groups for them to develop innovative approaches to promote new opportunities in the horticulture sector."

- Bundaberg Fruit and Vegetable Growers Cooperative Limited

"These funding opportunities range from pre-employment projects, mentoring, training, development of videos, engagement with school leavers, and social media campaigns," Minister Cash said.

"The Morrison Government is committed to ensuring job seekers in regional Australia can find work and to help growers meet their workforce needs."

NEW SKIPPER HELPS ALL SAILORS GREAT AND SMALL

The phone rang early on Mark Sherwood's first day as new Duty Officer for Coast Guard Brisbane's 'B' roster, and on the end of the line was a sailor needing help to return to Manly from Lamb Island.

Mark quickly gathered his crew, and the team took to the bay in the recently refurbished vessel CG22 to rendezvous with the disabled yacht. After a long, slow tow back to Manly, Mark and the team deftly parked the 54-foot yacht into its berth.

The calls continued throughout Mark's first day as Duty Officer, with the last two jobs highlighting the diversity of work the team prepares for. While relocating a small two-metre dinghy across the harbour, a more urgent call for help came from a 46-foot catamaran with a seized engine that had run aground while berthing in the marina. The team quickly responded and helped the catamaran off the mud bank and into its berth.

"As members of Coast Guard's Marine Assist scheme, both the sailor from Lamb Island and the catamaran owner were towed to safety for free," Mark said.

"Marine Assist provides boaties with peace of mind that wherever they are in Queensland waters, we will be able to look after them."

Coast Guard offer a Marine Assist service for an annual fee. Operating in much the same way as automobile clubs do for motor vehicles, the Marine Assist service provides boaters with 24 hour a day marine rescue assistance by Coast Guard for all emergency and breakdown situations.

STATE MEMBER FOR LYTTON

Queensland's response to the pandemic continues to be strong, thanks to the hard work and patience of the community.

Managing the health impacts has been vital for our economic recovery, which is now well underway. In annual terms, QLD job vacancies increased by 22% — the highest level on the east coast and well above the national average of 12%. This year, I'm looking forward to continuing to deliver for Baysiders on several key priorities including:


- Keeping people safe by continuing our strong COVID response

A SLIP IN TIME: RESURRECTION OF BALGUE'S SLIP (PELICAN'S PERCH)

Noel Balgue came to Wynnum in 1922. He bought a 22-foot sailing boat called "Lizzie" and applied to the then Town Council of Wynnum to build a boat slip at the foot of Havelock (now Penfold) Parade. The boat was floated into the slip at high tide, then, as the water receded, the barnacles could be scraped off bottom of the boat, ready for painting.

At 5.30am on Sunday 21 October 2012, two utes, a generator, and 12 Rotarians from Wynnum Manly ventured onto the rocky, muddy foreshore to re-erect the collapsed half of the slip. Engineer Rotarian David Groves was in charge. The stainless steel brackets were donated by Sean Carroll of Capalaba. 

FRESH FEBRUARY FISHING TIPS WITH SPERO

The year is flying along already! It's February and hot cross buns are in the shops, and before you know it we will be singing jingle bells again.

February is a mixed month for fishing, not because the fish don't bite, but the weather can be very unpredictable. At the end of February last year we had a very severe storm come through and lots of rain, so it's a good idea to keep your eye on the weather when going out in the bay.

Spotty mackerel are still in the bay and should be in bigger numbers feeding on the surface, so keep an eye on the feeding terns as they hover over the top of the spotties feeding. A chrome slug around the 35gm weight is the best for these feisty fish; cast around the feeding schools and a fast retrieve works best but don't use wire.

The school mackerel are throughout the bay and you will find them from Hyubers Light out to Hope Banks, along the drop off towards Ormiston and the basin between the Lazaret Gutter and Amity Banks, and the area on the western side of Moreton Island from Shark Spit all the way to the two yellows in front of the Sand Hills. Diving boards with a 3-inch spoon works the best, but floating out pillies is also a good way to get a few, and jigging with a chrome slug is also lots of fun.

Tiger squid are now throughout the bay in most weed banks and judging by the number of small ones around in January, it's going to be a great season for the calamari eaters. Use 3.5gm size jigs in any of the prawn pattern in orange, red or natural.

Whiting are throughout the Small Boat Channel and the Rous Channel, and Amity Banks and the Sand Hills are the other two areas where you will get a nice feed. Blood worms, peeled prawns or strips of squid are the best bait to use on a paternoster rig.

February also is a very good month for sand crabs and judging by the amount being caught there will be plenty for all.

So get out on this beautiful bay (weather permitting) and get a fresh feed!

SHARP TURN RIGHT FOR THE BAKER'S CART

In Manly during the 1940s and 1950s deliveries of bread, milk and other staples were much more widespread than today, because few families owned a car and there were no large shopping centres.

This meant that the majority of the residents relied either on home delivery services or nearby corner stores for their food needs. At this time the Neuman family owned a bakery which supplied bread to the Manly/Lota area. Horse drawn carts were the main means by which they delivered bread to customers. These carts had two large steel shod wheels with the box for the bread between and seat for driver and helper on top.

My family and theirs went to the same church and they offered me a job over the school holidays, which I gladly accepted, to replenish my much needed pocket money stock.

The horse that pulled the cart knew the route well and would often move on without us to the next delivery point in search of tufts of grass growing by the roadside.

Our last delivery was a home for orphaned children along Manly Road. We would drive up the long path to the home, drop off the bread and then turn the cart back towards the Manly Rd entrance. The horse knew that oats and fresh hay were waiting for him at the bakery stable and he would bolt down this path until he reached the entrance where he had to do a sharp right on to the road home.



I always dreaded this moment. I would hang on tightly to the armrest expecting the right wheel to lift at any moment and disaster to follow. The regular driver next to me never seemed to be concerned.

Somehow we always managed to get back to the bakery safely, but the memory of those fleeting moments have never left me.


Jo-Anne set about collecting and collating treasured family favourite recipes that had been handed down to Rotary members from their families and friends.

SPERO'S SQUID AND RICE PAELLA RECIPE

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos shares his delicious paella recipe, best made with fresh local squid.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 3 medium sized squid, cut into strips, skin on, flaps on, and use the tentacles as well
- 6 cloves of garlic
- ½ cup of olive oil
- 2 medium onions, diced
- Half a red capsicum and half a green capsicum, diced
- 5 chopped fresh tomatoes OR 1 can of chopped tomatoes
- 4 − 5 bay leaves
- A couple of sprigs of thyme and a couple of sprigs of Italian parsley
- 1 hot chilli to taste (optional)
- 1 tsp paprika and a pinch of saffron
- 1 cup of paella rice
- 3 cups of fish stock (heated)





METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees
- 2. In an oven proof paella pan, sauté garlic and bay leaves in the olive oil then add the squid. Fry and mix constantly.
- 3. Season with salt and pepper and push the mixture around the side of the dish in a circle, leaving a well in the centre.
- 4. Add the onion, sauté, then mix in with the squid and again move to the side, leaving a well in the centre.
- 5. Add capsicum and sauté, then mix in with the squid mixture and again, move to the side leaving a well in the centre.
- **6.** Add the tomatoes and the herbs and sauté, move to the side and add the rice, then mix to coat the rice and mix well with the sauid mixture.
- 7. Add the saffron and paprika, then your hot fish stock, mix well and keep stirring so the rice doesn't stick to the pan.
- **8.** Let it come to the boil and reduce a little (10-15 minutes), then place in the pre-heated oven and bake for 20 minutes or until the rice has softened and the juices are totally absorbed.

KEEPING YOUR INDOOR JUNGLE SUMMERTIME HAPPY

Indoor plants don't enjoy extremes of temperature. Whilst air conditioning makes the summer heat tolerable, the unit actually sucks the moisture out of the air to cool the space. This can result in plant dehydration, making the plant foliage wilt and potting mix dry out. To ensure that your plants do not suffer too badly from moisture depletion, give the plant and foliage a good water when the soil starts to dry out. A light misting on hot, dry days will also be beneficial.

Natural light is essential to indoor plants. Though some do quite well in dim surroundings, most need at least bright indirect sunlight for several hours a day to flourish. Generally, flowering indoor plants will bloom better with access to more light. When planning where to put your indoor plants, take advice from your garden centre and learn from your own experience. Some plants, such as ZZ plants, flourish in low-light conditions, while others must have filtered sunlight. Don't place large, spreading plants in walkways or landings where they may suffer damage from passing traffic.

To prevent uneven growth, quarter-turn pots regularly so all sides of the plants are exposed equally to the light.


