#### **ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATIONS**

On Anzac Day each year we remember all Australians who served and died in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations. 25 April marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.

On the Bayside, Anzac Day commemorations at Manly Lota RSL, Wynnum RSL and Bayside National Servicemen's Association took place in a respectful and COVIDSafe way.



# **ALL ABOUT ARTHRITIS IN DOGS**

Arthritis is a degenerative joint disease and is the most common cause of reduced mobility in dogs. It can occur at any age and body weight, but is most commonly seen in large breed older dogs or in animals after an injury.

Signs of arthritis include:

- limping, stiffness, change in gait
- reluctance to walk, jump or climb stairs
- difficulty rising from a resting position or finding a comfortable position
- licking affected joints
- reduced interaction with people
- change in toileting behaviour
- increased vocalisation

There are five significant components of equal importance to consider when treating arthritis.

- 1. Weight control overweight dogs have a greater load to carry on their joints.
- 2. Provide a warm, soft bed in a draft-free location.
- Exercise regular gentle exercise such as short leash walks or swimming can be very beneficial in keeping joints moving and maintaining muscle mass.
- 4. Physiotherapy regular massage and range of motion exercises can be performed at home (your vet can demonstrate these). There are specially trained animal physiotherapists who utilise a range of treatments including massage, underwater treadmills, ultrasound, laser therapy and acupuncture to help relieve arthritis pain.

 Medications – there are a range of medications used to help treat and prevent worsening of arthritis. Injectable chondroprotective agents can be administered by injection. Oral supplements are available in a range of options including powders and capsules which can be added to food. Anti-



inflammatory and analgesic medications are often necessary – make an appointment with your vet to discuss the best options for your pet.



# **AUTUMN ORCHID SHOWCASE BRINGS BEAUTY TO BELMONT**

Brisbane Orchid Society Inc. will hold its 47th Annual Autumn Show at the Belmont International Shooting Complex Centre, located at 1485 Old Cleveland Road, Belmont.

Over the weekend of Saturday 22nd and Sunday 23rd of May, visitors can expect to enjoy an extensive display of orchids nurtured by Orchid Society members who hail from the greater Brisbane area.

"This show is an opportunity to see and learn; there will be members available to answer any questions you may have in relation to the care and growing needs of your orchids, and there will be potting demonstrations over the weekend," explained Brisbane Orchid Society Vice President Milton Ludlow.

# **BACK IN TIME: THE QUEENSPORT HOTEL**

# In the *Brisbane Courier* of 5 May 1891 Martin Kavanagh was advertising "a new hotel for Hemmant".

Martin Kavanagh was already well established in the district. He had purchased seven acres of land in Doughboy Creek (Hemmant) in 1867 and was then advertised as a "farmer". The government-owned land, originally occupied by the Gnaloongpin people, was gradually sold off in the 1840s and 1850s to private landholders. The land was cleared, and the Aboriginals displaced. Farms were established, with fruit and vegetables transported by boat up-river into town. The bridging of Doughboy (Bulimba) Creek in 1861 further opened up the area. The small villages of Doughboy Creek (renamed Hemmant in the 1870's) and Lytton developed.

Martin changed his occupation to "Publican" and was the publican of the Lytton Hotel from 1879 to 1891. During those years, Hemmant acquired a school, a postmaster, a policeman, three dairymen, 26 farmers, a butcher, and a baker. The Queensport meat works was established in the 1880s close by on the riverbank. The railway line to Cleveland passed through Hemmant in 1889 and a permanent station was in place by 1914.

One of Brisbane's first amusement parks was built in 1889, at the end of today's Aquarium Avenue, beside the river. Day trippers boarded steam boats in the City to be brought to the "Queensport Aquarium". Within the park were six large glass fish tanks, a penguin enclosure, performing seals, tame pelicans, a dance hall, a switch-back railway and a merry-go-round. A zoo, with monkeys, tigers, snakes, cheetahs and panthers, was also an attraction. Unfortunately, as a result of the 1893 floods and poor financial



management, the park closed in 1897.

Martin realised the potential of establishing a hotel at Hemmant and announced his intention in the Brisbane press. He was granted a hotel license in 1891 and built the hotel on his land, near the Queensport Aquarium, as well as close to the Queensport meat works, ensuring that he had a steady clientele for the hotel.

The new Queensport Hotel was designed by respected Brisbane architect, Charles McLay, who had worked for the Queensland Government from 1885. In 1890 Charles McLay moved into private practice and the Queensport Hotel was

one of his first assignments. The building was of brick and timber construction.

When Martin opened the Queensport Hotel in May 1891, the license for the Lytton Hotel was transferred to his daughter, Bridget Kavanagh. Martin died in 1898 and passed the license for the Queensport Hotel over to another of his daughters, Mary Ann Kavanagh.

Mary Ann Kavanagh married Martin McGladrigan and the hotel was run by the Kavanagh family until 1911. Then the lease passed to John Henry Campbell and thus followed a series of licensees for the hotel. Many of Brisbane's small villages established around the mouth of the river in the nineteenth century have disappeared – Lytton, Cribb Island and Myrtletown – due to infrastructure and industrial expansion. Pinkenba and Hemmant remain today.

The Queensport Hotel is the last nineteenthcentury hotel remaining and continues to provide hospitality to industry workers and the local community.

The Queensport Hotel is located at 49 Gosport Street, Hemmant.

# FEDERAL BUDGET TO BE DELIVERED ON MAY 11

The 2021-22 Federal Budget will be handed down by Treasurer Josh Frydenberg on May 11 and the Prime Minister has indicated it will focus on building on our National Economic Recovery Plan.

As the Prime Minister said in an address to the Business Council of Australia recently:

"We have a long way still to go to deliver the jobs, to guarantee the services that Australians rely on and keep Australians safe, both now and into the future. And our economic recovery plan, the second phase of that which will be in the Treasurer's Budget, is geared to keeping our economy on that right track. To protect and preserve those lives and livelihoods, but also to build a strong and durable recovery for the future. Not one that depends on the taxpayers' continued subsidy, but one that is based on a robust, vibrant, business-led economy that can stand on its own two feet. Stage Two of our National Economic Recovery Plan will be in that Budget in a few weeks' time, and it builds on the strong foundations laid in last year's October Budget."

# **INTRODUCING THE BAYSIDE WOODIES**

FROM THE BAYSIDE WOODTURNERS AND CRAFTERS CLUB

From humble beginnings in a bayside home, to a membership of over 160, the Bayside Woodturners and Crafters Club has grown to be one of the leading clubs of its type.

The club formed in 1989 through the efforts of a small group of like-minded enthusiasts, willing to share their ideas, skills and knowledge. This primary aim remains strong in the club today, with experienced members only too willing to pass on their expertise in a number of wood crafts, in a variety of ways.

In 1993 the club moved to a member's home in Thorneside where monthly Saturday meetings and demonstrations were held. Over the next two decades the club expanded and found a permanent home, clubhouse and extensive workshops to accommodate the rapidly growing membership in Manly.

The club holds beginner, intermediate and advanced sessions for members in the areas of wood turning, scroll sawing, intarsia, carving, pyrography, instrument and box making.

The Bayside Woodies are now a familiar addition to a number of state-wide shows and exhibitions where they demonstrate their crafts, exhibit some of their wares and sell a variety of wooden items to the attending public. These shows include Redfest, the Mt. Gravatt show, the tool, timber and artisan show and the Maleny wood exhibition.

"Masks are a feature of the piece, and some of our artists have created some detailed ceramic pieces. Others have used woodwork and some have enjoyed acrylic painting," she said.


"The artists have loved being involved in the entire ceramic process – from hand crafting, to glazing, then seeing the pieces return from firing with incredible glaze effects."

# **EASY SALT AND PEPPER SQUID RECIPE**

BY SPERO KARTANOS

This is one of the easiest dishes and one of the best tasting ones you are ever going to have, and I think it's so easy anyone can make it. You'll need fresh squid – cleaned, guts out and head and beak removed, and leave the rest as is with skin on, wings/flaps on and leave the tentacles on.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- A couple of squid
- 1/2 cup of white flour for dusting
- Salt and pepper
- Chilli flakes
- Lemons

- Olive oil enough to fill your frypan 1cm deep
- 4 cloves of garlic chopped finely
- A few sprigs of flat leaf parsley
- Crusty bread for dunking

#### **METHOD**

- 1. In a plastic bag put in all your cut pieces of squid and tentacles, add half a cup of flour and shake make sure all the squid is lightly covered in flour.
- 2. Heat up a 1cm deep of good virgin olive oil in a large pan, put in all your squid and cook for a few minutes until the colour changes and the skin browns up a little.
- 3. Stir in your garlic and parsley and chilli, add the salt and pepper, and cook for another few minutes, then squeeze some lemon over it.
- **4.** Put pan in the middle of the table and start eating, and of course some chunks of bread to dunk in that garlic chilli infused oil...it's yummy! And remember, it's better underdone then overdone.

# **BILL'S BEEF & GUINNESS PIE RECIPE**

#### FROM THE ROTARY CLUB OF WYNNUM MANLY'S ISOLATION: KITCHEN DESTINATION COOKBOOK

CONTRIBUTOR: BILL SIMPSON

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1.5 kgs stewing beef (cut into 15mm cubes)
- 4 fatty rashers of bacon (sliced into 10mm squares)
- 5 tablespoons plain flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 5 tablespoons of extra virgin olive oil
- **METHOD**
- 1. Heat 1 tablespoon of oil into heavy frying pan and add the bacon and cook for 3 minutes or until brown.
- 2. Remove bacon including fatty bits and rest until beef is cooked. (Leave bacon fat/olive oil in pan).
- 3. Toss beef with seasoned flour in a bowl to coat. Shake off any excess flour.
- 4. Add and heat the remaining 4 tablespoons of olive oil in a heavy saucepan with left over bacon fat and oil, adding the beef in batches, and cook until browned.
- 5. When cooked return all beef to pan (including fried flour scraps), add bacon, garlic and onion, and cook, stirring for three minutes.

- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 2 large onions chopped
- 2 x 440ml cans Guinness
- 2 beef stock cubes dissolved in 300ml water
- 4 bay leaves
- · Leaves from 3 thyme sprigs or a teaspoon of dried thyme
  - 6. Prepare slow cooker, add 2 x 440ml cans of Guinness and 300ml beef stock, with mushrooms, bay leaves and thyme. Set on high for 20 minutes before adding meat.

• 1 1/2 cups sliced button mushrooms


• 2 sheets puff pastry, thawed


• 1 egg beaten for glazing

• I cup corn kernels

I cup peas

- 7. Remove meat from pan, scraping all the sediment from the base of the pan and add to slow cooker.
- 8. Cook on low for 6-8 hours until very tender and mix is thickened.
- 9. Cool and spoon mixture into pie ramekins. Place corn and peas on top of beef. Cover with thawed puff pastry and use a fork or knife to make a vent. Glaze with beaten egg. Cook in a medium oven until pastry is golden and brown.

# **COAST GUARD VOLUNTEER WINS MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD**

#### Phillip Smith, Coast Guard volunteer in Manly for 43 years, has just received their top operational award.

Phil joined Coast Guard in 1977, when he was a 32-year-old Queensland Rail employee.

After initial training, he became a rescue crewman, serving on scores of rescues, saving dozens of lives, and eventually becoming a duty officer.

However, after 30 years working on rescue boats, in all weathers, by day and night, a medical problem made Phil decide to come ashore. Still keen to serve the community, Phil transferred his skills to Coast Guard's radio room in Manly, where his decades of marine rescue experience still proved vital.

On numerous occasions, when boaties called Brisbane Coast Guard in a panic, shouting for

help, Phil's calm voice and advice kept them safe until he could direct rescue boats to their location.

Phil never sought praise nor reward for the many times he saved lives at sea. But his shipmates asked Coast Guard's National Board for appropriate recognition.

Last week, Phil's Roster Skipper Mark Sherwood (whose regular job is Manager of The Good Guys in Capalaba) called Phil's shipmates together in their radio room in Manly ... and surprised Phil by presenting him with Coast Guard's Meritorious Service Award.

Very few of these awards are presented in Australia each year. Phil's name will now be added to the Honour Board at the Manly base, and he'll be entitled to wear the blue and white award ribbon with pride, for a job well done.

# MARINE RADIOS ARE A VITAL LIFELINE

In today's modern world, many boat users rely on mobile telephones for emergency communications. This can cause challenges when boats are in mobile phone blackspots on the Bay, or the phone battery runs dead.

"A handheld or mounted VHF radio can make the difference, providing a lifeline to monitoring stations on land – although radios are not just for emergencies, they are also used for weather updates, advising about hazards to navigation, and communications between boats," Coast Guard radio officer Nigel Moore said.

One Sunday each month Coast Guard Brisbane conducts public radio courses, accredited by the Australian Maritime College, that licence people to use VHF and HF radios.

The Long Range Operator Certificate of Proficiency (LROCP) and Short Range Operator Certificate of Proficiency (SROCP) courses cover theory on how radios work and how to make calls, and includes practical demonstrations on using handsets.

"I try to keep the training relatable based on my experience in the Merchant Navy," Nigel explained, "and I usually tell a few salty sea tales as well!"

I was homeless for a little while, living in temporary accommodation at a caravan park, when Jai was very young, he doesn't remember it but I know that acknowledgement and kindness can make a big difference."

As the child of a single parent Jai has seen first-hand what it's like to struggle and he wanted to help those who were doing it tough.

"Jai is a very sweet, kind hearted boy and had been asking about the different ways that we might be able to able those who were homeless," Amy said.

Amy and Jai first approached Rosies with the idea of making sandwiches for those who came to outreach.

"I spoke to someone in the office and she suggested the best way to help was by holding a noodle drive. When Jai got home from school that day I'd purchased a few pot noodles and explained to him what we were going to do," said Amy.

Amy and Jai started collecting noodles in late March, and five days later they had collected over 160 pot noodles from friends and neighbours! They are aiming to collect 500 pot noodles by the end of the month.

Rosies is so grateful for the generosity of community members like Amy and Jai. It's because of individuals like them that Rosies can keep its vans fully stocked and in the communities where they are needed most.

We worried lately about his frailty. Every waterfront walker, on hearing of his passing, has been questioning. We don't know what to ask, except to express our loss of a man who helped, locate us a little, in our lives.

# LOCAL FISHING

# **COOL AUTUMN FISHING ON MORETON BAY**

### The weather has finally cooled and calmed down, but the fishing is as good as ever!

There are plenty of whiting in the Maroon Gutter all the way to Maroon Hole and on the eastern Amity Banks as well – just remember they love a good run in the tide, so don't think there are no fish when it's slack water.

There's also plenty of whiting at the Sand Hills and the Blue Hole, and have a squid jig out in all those areas as the tiger squid will be fighting to get to the jigs. Tiger squid are even in their dozens on the foreshores and marinas, so if you are land-based, a night's fishing off any of the jetties should get you a squid or two, and red and orange jigs will do the trick.

The school mackerel are now spread throughout the bay from close in between King and Green Islands to the front of the Huybers, and along the deeper water to Ormiston, and all the way to Hope Banks. At the drop off at Amity Banks to Peel Island, there are some nice big spotties hanging deep as well, and the broad mackerel should not be far away.

Squire and snapper, sweet lip, cod and a few jewfish are around Green and the passage to King Island, and live herrings are doing the trick as bait. In the same area lots of big tailor are hanging around as well.

By all reports there are plenty of sand crabs in the bay and plenty of big muddles in the marina at the moment.

Cuttlefish and arrow squid are showing up in the deeper water so a sinker above the jig and bouncing it off the bottom should catch you a couple; remember the razorback squid jigs work really well for cuttlefish.

The bonito and long tail tuna are smashing whitebait all over the bay and a chrome slug into the feeding packs should produce a nice feed.

So get out onto our beautiful bay – it's a great time of the year for a fish, or cast a net for some prawns for young and old. Good fishing!

# FISHERS TACKLE LITTER IN LOCAL WATERWAYS

FROM OZFISH UNLIMITED

#### Australia's leading fishing conservation charity OzFish Unlimited has partnered with Tangaroa Blue Foundation to help recreational fishers tackle rubbish in their local waterways.

From flotsam collecting in saltmarshes, to riverbank dumping, from forgotten tackle to microplastics that end up in fish bellies, OzFish and Tangaroa Blue are finding innovative ways to create lasting change and turn around outdated practices of past generations.

OzFish Director of Habitat Programs Cassie Price said the new partnership and education program, ReefClean Look after your Tackle, reinforces the changing perception of recreational fishers in Australia and their motivation to be part of the solution.

"Actions that make fishing more sustainable remain an ongoing challenge and key area of focus for the Australian recreational fishing industry.

"Many fishers are knowledgeable of the problem and practice responsible fishing, including taking their litter with them, and catch and release best practice. We're becoming more aware of what are now some outdated fishing behaviours, so we are seeing real change," says Ms Price.

"Recreational fishers are some of the most passionate people when it comes to caring for our waterways. They see firsthand the impact that litter has on their own fishing experiences, whether that's in our oceans, estuaries or inland rivers.

"Litter can have lasting impacts on the natural environments we fish in, reduces fish numbers and even makes some fishing spots difficult to access and certainly less enjoyable.

"We are thrilled to be working with Tangaroa Blue on such a critical issue. While there have been some small improvements, we know there is more work to do and as an industry we need to step up and take action. That is exactly what we are trying to do – and we know that education is key.

"With the expertise of Tangaroa Blue in this issue, we know we can make a real difference," Ms Price says.

Tangaroa Blue Foundation CEO Heidi Tait says the marine debris organisation is excited to be joining forces with OzFish to tackle the issue of fishing litter.

Combating marine litter is a complex issue with a wide variety of sources contributing to the levels of plastic in our oceans. But collaborations like this one offers fishers a simple and effective solution to improve the long-term health of our marine environment through both the removal and prevention of marine litter. As part of the partnership the organisations will:

- Launch the #Know Your Knots Challenge, which encourages fishers to tie knots successfully to reduce the amount of tackle lost and left behind.
- Start a Rig Recycle program enabling fishers to recycle their old fishing gear at BCF Stores across the country. It will also see additional fishing line bins made available at popular fishing sites.
