FOOTPATH AND PARK UPGRADES

This half of the financial year there is plenty of work happening around the Wynnum Manly Ward.

I have approved the following upgrades to footpaths and playgrounds in the area and they will completed, weather permitting, before June 30, 2021.

NEW CONCRETE FOOTPATHS

- Tingal Road, Wynnum: Numbers 519 to 535 a small missing link.
- New Road Manly: from Gordon Parade to Manly Station carpark (even numbered side), to create a better surface for people walking to the railway station.
- Alexander Street, Lota: between Belgamba Street and the Esplanade, north side.
- Andes Street and Greta Street Manly West.
- Federation Street, Wynnum West: from bus stop No 1067 to School Road.
- French Street, Wynnum: between Wynnum Rd and Cameron Parade.

PLAYGROUNDS

- Greene Park Wynnum: an electric BBQ and lights in the shade shelter.
- Shade over playground equipment in Clare Avenue Park, Wynnum West.
- Shade over playground in Herbert Street Park, Lota.
- Shade over playground in Lota Point Park, Lota.
- Federation Street Park, Federation Street, Wynnum West shade over the playground, the installation of an outdoor gym fitness equipment, replacement of the playground rubber mat and flying fox in the park.
- Lota Skate Park upgrade, Lota.



Your favourite food? Mum's cheese and Dad's vegemite toast.


Your worst habit? I love unwinding toilet rolls and spreading them through the house, especially when I'm left home alone.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD I BATH MY DOG?

Pets these days are generally spending a lot more time inside or in close proximity with the family and the dreaded "doggy smell" is not ideal. There are a number of factors to consider when determining how often to bath your dog.

Length of coat

- Does your pet have long or curly fur? Longer coats have the potential to trap more dirt and debris and require more frequent bathing than their shorter furred counterparts.
- Keeping your pet's coat brushed and free of knots can help to reduce the amount of dirt which accumulates.

Activity levels

- Is your dog mostly indoors or do they spend time outside?
- Is your dog a digger and likely to be covered in dirt?

- Does your dog swim?
- Does your dog play in the park with other dogs? Wrestling with friends often results in saliva all over their coat!


Allergies and skin conditions

- Does your pet have itchy skin?
- Is their skin dry, scaly or scabby?

As a rule of thumb it is suggested that dogs be washed a minimum of every three months. Dogs with skin conditions or those prone to getting really dirty can require washing as much as every week.

It is important to use shampoos formulated for dogs – the skin pH of dogs is different from humans and the use of human shampoos and conditioners can lead to the development of skin problems.

Pets with skin conditions can benefit from the use of medicated or soothing shampoos – have a chat with your vet to decide on the shampoo best suited to your dog's particular skin and coat.

Branches clients have enthusiastically embraced the opportunities offered by the organisation's new Community Hub since its opening in March.

Branches Lifestyle Support, a disability service organisation, celebrated the opening of the newly refurbished hub at 29 Fox Street Wynnum with a gala opening ceremony.

According to Holly Smith (Assistant Manager), it was an emotional day for the everyone who is part of the Branches community, marking 17 years of hard work coming to fruition for the company started by Shane Bruun and Wendy O'Brien in 2003.

"The atmosphere on the day was one of excitement and elation," said Mr Micah Fraser, Community Hub Manager. "Locals will no doubt see clients working in the community garden, or partaking in one of the various other programs including Zumba, music sessions, and cooking."

Since early March the Hub has been fully operational as a disability day service between 9am and 3pm weekdays for client programs and drop-in activities.

The Hub is also available for hire during weekday evenings and weekends for local community groups, so if you're part of a local group, Branches encourages you to get in touch if you require a space to hold classes or meetings. However, the venue is not available for hire for parties or functions.

"We encourage members of the community to pop in and see what we are all about," said Mr Fraser.



BAYSIDE MARKET RACKS UP 25 YEARS

Since 1996 Wynnum Baptist Church has held a once-a-month Saturday market, connecting the community via pre-loved goods, arts and crafts, and a great morning out. And while Covid may have erased the market from the 2020 calendar, it's now back in its 25th year.

Wynnum Manly and Districts Men's Shed members have paid tribute to 2158 Private GIRVAN, Roderick (Roddy) Roland Charles, 55 Infantry Bn AIF, with a touching photographic restoration.

On the 27th April 1918, a young Australian soldier lay wounded on the battlefield in France. He died alone, under foreign stars, to be remembered by family and friends who had known him for a short 24 vears.

The family kept a framed photograph of Roddy's grave on a wall until close relatives passed on and memories faded.

The photo turned up worse for wear in a building recycling yard where it was recovered, researched and repaired by the Wynnum Manly and Districts Men's Shed for eventual return to Roddy's birthplace in Bombala New South Wales.

As Peter told us during our visit "Josh and the Government told us to spend to keep the economy going and that's exactly what we did. We put all our staff on JobKeeper, even hiring new staff during the pandemic, including two apprentices under the wage subsidy scheme.

"We utilised they cashflow boost and instant asset write -off, purchasing a tractor, ute, shade structures and a fridge – all this was spent to put it back in the community. We couldn't of done any of that without JobKeeper.

While Wallum Nurseries is still recovering and not quite back at pre-pandemic levels, he and the team are grateful for the Government support and as Peter explained, he did what was asked and as a result, Australia is getting back to normal and our economy is improving.





BAYSIDE PCYC READY TO WELCOME GYM-GOERS

The Bayside PCYC's new gym is a fantastic facility and the grand opening is only days away.

Tina and the team have done an incredible job transforming the old martial arts space into a modern, spacious gym facility.

ANZAC DAY, A TIME FOR REMEMBRANCE

On the anniversary of World War 1 three years ago, St Helena Island Ranger Daley Donnelly and I asked ourselves if there were WWI soldiers in amongst the ranks of Prison Warders on St Helena Island. We had no answers, but thankfully I can now pay homage to the 30 St Helena warders who enlisted for action in WWI.

Some men were already working on St Helena Island and left to answer the call. Warders John Burns, John Mitchell and Ludwig Rowe resigned to enlist at the very beginning of the war. It must be said that the stomachs of the entire prison population breathed a sigh of relief when Edward Heathcock, the prison baker, departed to enlist, as Edward Heathcock was a butcher by trade. On his return, Edward was employed as a warder, not a baker.

But many more men were employed within St Helena Penal establishment once they had returned from fighting, as part of the government's efforts to support and repatriate returned 'diggers' through gainful employment. At least seven warders from the 9th Battalion, the first battalion recruited in Queensland, saw action in Gallipoli before finding a new life as a St Helena Warder on their return.

Octavius Spreadborough's description of the Gallipoli front line gives us a sense of what he faced:

"When it was clear enough to see, the scene before our eyes was horrible to look upon. Thousands of dead... Take it from me, I was not sorry when it was over."

One can only imagine the stark contrast after he and his brother Lomas were injured and evacuated back to Australia, re-employed on a small, quiet prison island in Moreton Bay in August 1916.

The final remembrance belongs to warders William Galloway and John Mitchell, who never made it home.


A couple of doors open as others close:

LOCAL FISHING

EASTER FISHING ON MORETON BAY WITH SPERO

The year is flying along and I have to say compared to the lockdown of last year, this April is feeling much better.

The fishing in April is normally one of our better months with all our favourites in abundance: whiting, school mackerel, squire and snapper, tiger squid, arrow and cuttlefish and sand crabs all through the bay. All you need to do is to get out on Moreton Bay on a nice day and come home with a fresh feed for the family.

Whiting are throughout the Chain Banks, especially the Maroon side of the Small Boat Passage. The Sand Hills have plenty of fish as well, and if you are looking for really large whiting, Amity Banks is the place to be, but there has to be a good run in the tide.

School mackerel will be throughout the bay and if you are prepared to do some trolling with a diving board and a spoon, you should pick up a few nice fish. Try the Huybers Light around the Hope Banks all the way to Peel Basin, and around the Naval Banks should get you a few. The bonito and long tail tuna will be there as well so a chrome slug cast into a feeding frenzy should pick up one of these speedsters, and they are great to eat as well.

Squire and sweet lip snapper are in all the shallow island reefs as well as the artificial reefs, and an hour each side of the tide is a good time – use large baits and any small fish as good bait for the reef fish; my preference is whiting heads.

Tiger squid will be in all the weed banks throughout the bay so it's a good idea to have a squid jig wherever you are catching whiting, and the arrow squid and cuttlefish in the deeper water. April is the start of the season for these great tasting cephalopods, and any jig with red or silver works best.

One more thing: if you are out overnight close to any of the islands, a light at the back of the boat should attract whitebait this time of year. A butterfly net is all you need to scoop up a fantastic feed of crispy fried whitebait, one of my favourites.

Crab season is in full swing with plenty of crabs throughout the bay so no reason not to come home with something fresh - just pick the good days to go out, the family will enjoy it so much more and

so will you. Keep an eye on the weather and always play it safe. There's nothing better than seeing kids having fun and their smiles just say it all.

One other piece of information is that we should be getting the Hope Banks beacon online on the BOM site as a weather and wind beacon in April or May, so a big thank you

to BOM and especially the CEO Dr Andrew Johnson for all his effort.

VOLUNTEERING HELPS OUR BOATING COMMUNITY

Midway between the Manly foreshore and Norfolk Point, a yellow building with a forest of antennas on its roof is the home base for Coast Guard Brisbane. Run entirely by volunteers, each year the flotilla assists over 400 boats – with more than 1000 people on board – back to the safety of dry land. Our volunteer crews are drawn from diverse backgrounds, and together provide on-call support on the bay 24 hours a day all year round.

Manly local David Purcell has been with Coast Guard Brisbane for four years, and says any day on roster can be different. In his time with the flotilla, in addition to helping numerous brokendown boats, he has cradled a baby in his arms on a trip back from Tangalooma, hauled terrified paddlers from the sea after their kayaks sank, and worked for over an hour hand-winching a yacht's anchor out of the mud.

"A recent highlight was my first unsupervised trip as a new rescue boat skipper, where I was diverted from a training run to recover a jet ski stuck in a creek," David said. A volunteer's day can also include duties around the station such as preparing emergency equipment, operating the station's radio room, or repairing breakdowns on the boats.

"Just like recreational boaties, we need to do regular maintenance on our vessels," David added.

Coast Guard volunteers go through a series of training courses that take people who might have little boating experience, and give them the skills to work on our team. David explained, "I joined Coast Guard to give something back to the community. I've achieved this and more, and have had opportunities and training in skills I never imagined".





BACK IN TIME: THE WATERLOO BAY HOTEL

The Waterloo Bay Hotel (Berrima Street, Wynnum) was built by George Gibbs, the son of a mariner, who was born in Cornwall, England in 1842. George started work as a tool boy in a granite yard, where he learnt the trade of a granite cutter.

George brought his family to Moreton Bay on the "Fiery Star", landing on 20 November 1863. However, with no work, and the financial crisis of 1866, the family returned to Cornwall.

George travelled to America arriving in Boston in 1868 and found granite cutting work for Public Buildings. However, the weather was too severe, and the family returned to Cornwall. They set sail again, on the sailing ship "Great Queensland", for Maryborough, Queensland and landed on 18 November 1875.

George was aware of the plans to build a rail link between Brisbane and Cleveland and in May 1889 bought a piece of land in Wynnum near the proposed rail line to build a hotel. By 7 November 1889, the South Brisbane Licensing Courts declared, "the house is complete and ready for occupation". The rail link also opened in November 1889. The new colonial-style hotel was able to capitalise on the influx of holiday makers and day trippers visiting this district.

Due to ill health George sold the hotel in March 1892 to Sarah Jane King. William Dennis O'Connor purchased the hotel in 1898 and he remained owner until his death in 1950. In 1918, hhe commissioned architect George Henry Male Addison to design the prominent two-storey extension.



A beer garden and restaurant were added in the 1980s. Week-long festivities celebrated the 100th birthday in 1989. The statement was made in the Bayside Bulletin (14 November 1989) that, "the hotel is serving the community as never before and looks set to take on its second hundred ears with ease and equanimity".

The hotel was entered into the Queensland Heritage Register on 28 July 2000. (Entry 601729).

EISTEDDFOD CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF ARTS

In 1971 a local group of like-minded individuals formed the Wynnum Manly Eisteddfod. Their main goal was "to promote, foster and encourage in all worthy ways the love of music, art, literature and dancing to assist in all possible ways the development of artistic talent".

RUDI'S SGROPPINO RECIPE

Sgropin in Venetian dialect (or Sgroppino in Italian), is an alcoholic drink invented during the age of La Serenissima in Venice, North-East Italy.

The word comes from the dialect Sgroppare, which means "to release knots" and that's why it is usually enjoyed in between meals or at the end of a big lunch or dinner to assist in digestion and to cleanse the palate.

Here's my recipe, using freshly made gelato from my store.



INGREDIENTS (SERVES 6)

- 1-litre tub of lemon sorbet (gelato) from Matilda the Art of Gelato
- 200ml of prosecco or white sparkling wine
- 50ml vodka

METHOD

- 1. Mix all the ingredients in a blender or use an immersion/stick mixer.
- 2. Rest in the fridge (not freezer) for 10 to 15 minutes.
- 3. Pour into flute/champagne glasses and garnish with lemon zest.

My tip for the perfect Sgroppino is to put the glasses in the freezer while you make it, and use very cold prosecco and vodka. I get my prosecco from italianwineconnection.com.au





COMMUNITY COMES TOGETHER TO CLEAN UP TINGALPA CREEK

OzFish volunteers got dirty for their annual Clean Up Australia Day event with an army of recreational anglers and 15 community volunteers working together to clean up almost 6 cubic metres of rubbish out of Tingalpa Creek.

Their efforts removed a range of litter from the local waterways including piles of derelict timber from disused pontoons and jetties; plastic and glass bottles; old shade cloth that was half buried in mud and mangrove roots; 5 bags of broken fibre sheeting; and old steel drums. They even recovered an abandoned, rusting lawn roller.

It is estimated about two million tonnes of plastics enter the oceans from rivers and creeks each year. Sadly, the majority is a result of human behaviour and Covid-19 has without a doubt seen an increase in single use items.

Local OzFish Chapter President, Robbie Porter was disappointed but not surprised by what they found.

"When litter is dropped on land, the wind and rain often carry it to stormwater drains which empty into creeks and rivers which then carry it to the ocean. Once litter reaches our waterways, it is very difficult to remove," said Mr Porter.



"Our beautiful waterways shouldn't be conveyor belts transporting waste into the oceans.

"Everyone should be very proud of what they have achieved today, and their hard work should be applauded. They have done themselves proud and their community," said Mr Porter.

Local community volunteer, Steve Hawthorne participated the clean-up at Tingalpa Creek this year and saw first-hand the difference that can be made when the community simply picks up the rubbish.

"What a fantastic effort and what brilliant result! Now that all those dangerous old rotting structures are removed, the creek is a much safer and more beautiful place for local people to come and enjoy." said Steve.

Thanks to the new partnership with Tangaroa Blue Foundation, all of the litter OzFish collected has been sorted and counted and will be entered into the Tangaroa Blue Australian Marine Debris Database which is used by researchers to determine the best way to combat marine litter.

OzFish will also use the information collected to investigate new solutions recreational fishers can use to reduce litter entering local waterways.

REX IS SAVING VETERANS' LIVES

K.M. SMITH'S RICH HISTORY IN THE BRISBANE COMMUNITY

K.M.Smith, Brisbane's oldest family funeral firm, began in the 1870s and has remained in the same family for six generations.

It all began with Kate Mary Farrell, who was born in Dublin in 1846. As a teenager in 1864, she boarded the ship Fiery Star bound for Queensland. She made her way to Somerset, a settlement at the very tip of Cape York Peninsula. Also arriving in Somerset in the same year was John Smith, an infantryman with the Royal Marines, who had been born in London in 1844.

John and Kate married in Somerset in 1868 when Kate was 21 and John 24. Their first child, John Thomas Smith is likely to have been the first white child born on Cape York Peninsula.

After a stint in Sydney due to poor health, John set up shop as a cabinet maker in Elizabeth Street,

Brisbane, where he was also called upon to make the occasional coffin. The family lived in South Brisbane and in 1883, purchased the undertaking business of William Walsh.

Alas, John became ill a few months later and died in May 1886. Kate, with six children still in her care, began running the business at a time when it was rare for women to attend funerals much less work in the industry. Kate was to become Brisbane's first female Funeral Director.

Now, more than a century later, K.M.Smith continues to build on its legacy with great grandchildren Allen and Denise Smith as directors and great-great grandchild Liam Smith chairman. K.M. Smith is still proudly a 100% Australian family-owned company.

STAY SAFE ON OUR ROADS THIS EASTER

With the Easter break just around the corner it is a timely reminder to remain safe on our roads and act responsibly.

Statistically, the Easter and Christmas periods bring an increase in fatalities on Queensland Roads.

Queensland has a double-demerit points scheme in place all year round, not just during holiday periods. If motorists are caught committing some offences twice within 12 months, they will incur twice the amount of demerit points, regardless of what time of year.

Make sure you turn on the 'Do Not Disturb While Driving' feature on your mobile phones so you prevent distractions. Such a simple step can save lives and also prevent a hefty fine. You can be fined \$1,000

and have four demerit points recorded against your traffic history if your mobile phone is in your hand, including when you're stopped at traffic lights or in congested traffic.

There are courses to help educate about the dangers of such behaviour. The Queensland Police Service at Victoria Point runs the Attitudinal drivers workshop, which is designed to teach young and inexperienced drivers the dangers of poor driving behaviour.

Mr Cummins also said that around one third of women at the Port had taken up the challenge to upskill by commencing study to obtain Certificate 4 or higher qualifications to support them to progress their career.

ARE RADIATION LEVELS IN DENTAL X-RAYS HARMFUL?

But one thing every patient wants to know is: are dental X-rays safe?



Many patients are concerned about excessive radiation exposure, however radiation exposure associated with dentistry represents a minor contribution to the total exposure from all sources, including natural and man-made.

Fortunately, with advances in technology and the introduction of digital dental X-rays, radiation levels are very minimal. In fact, there are several other activities that we often engage in that have far more radiation than dental X-rays. These include watching television, using mobile phones, smart watches, and microwaves – all these things made our lives easier, safer and more enjoyable – we think the same can be said for dental X-rays! Dental X-rays can help diagnose disease and pathology which means less toothaches and unknown problems, and better preventative care to ensure the long lasting health of your teeth and mouth!

Before COVID when everyone was still travelling on airplanes, a short trip of one to two hours on an airplane would expose you to the same amount of radiation in your dental X-rays if you had four X-rays per year. We recommend screening X-rays based on an individual risk assessment but on average this is usually every two years, unless otherwise indicated by your oral health needs. This means the radiation exposure in our practice is far less than if you took a quick trip to Sydney and back for a long weekend!

So next time you're considering skipping your routine dental X-rays because you're concerned about radiation exposure, consider the long-term effects to your oral health and what might be missed if you don't have them taken.
