"Bonner's local charities and organisations always go above and beyond to support vulnerable people in our community and this is our chance to make a difference and give back"



STATE MEMBER FOR LYTTON

Queensland continues to be the envy of the world when it comes to our COVID-19 response. Thanks to the hard work of Queenslanders, we have been able to get our economy back on track as we unite & recover from the pandemic.

I've been so pleased to see the return of Bayside icons like the Wynnum RSL, Wynnum Manly Leagues Club, and Cedar & Pine. And last week, we were finally back at Manly Hotel for the Manly-Lota RSL's famous meat raffle!

A big thank-you as well to all those businesses like the Waterloo Bay Hotel and Moreton Bay Trailer Boat Club that kept trading throughout the lockdown.

Most importantly, our plan for economic recovery means creating jobs for Queenslanders. Amazingly, Queensland was the only state to record an improvement in the unemployment rate between May and June

On the Bayside, we're supporting local business with our COVID-19 Adaption Grants of up to \$10,000. Twenty-five Lytton businesses have already received the grant, including local favourites like Caffeination Station, Celtic Corner, and Fun Fit Play. We're also backing sporting clubs, with grants of up to \$20,000 available for repairs and upgrades as community sport returns.

I was especially proud this month to officially open the Wynnum Community Place, our new neighbourhood centre at 154 Bay Terrace. The Community Place is funded by the Palaszczuk Government to provide services and support to locals, as well as offering a place where community groups and residents can get together. I'd like to say a heartfelt thank-you to everyone who donated to my food drive to help the Community Place get started!

The Manly Boat Harbour public consultation process is now under way. I urge all Baysiders to have their say on the future of our beautiful harbour by going online to tmr.qld.gov.au/ManlyBoatHarbour. Submissions close on the 14th of August.

I feel so passionate about protecting the harbour and our beautiful Bayside environment – that's why I'm so proud that the Palasczuk Government recently introduced legislation to ban certain single-use plastics like straws, cutlery, and plates.

Finally, recent events in Victoria and overseas are a critical reminder that this pandemic is far from over. I urge all Baysiders to continue social distancing and washing your hands. If you feel any cold or flu symptoms at all, please self-isolate and call your GP or 13 Health to get a COVID test.

Our border to Victoria has been firmly shut since the 3rd of July, and we will continue to assess community transmission elsewhere. I commit to you that we will always follow the best health advice and put the safety of Queenslanders first.

Your worst habit? Chewing things around the house like the bottom of the laundry door, screens at the back of our house, and opening the cupboard doors looking for snacks.


Your favourite local hangout? I love to visit Ebb and Flow because Julianne is always excited to see me and give me treats.

PETER CUMMING'S LOCAL AREA UPDATE

WYNNUM MANLY WARD



DEVELOPMENT APPLICATIONS

Substantial development applications continue to be lodged and in some cases, approved, in the Wynnum Manly Ward area.

The Sisters of Nazareth, who own Nazareth House, have lodged a new application for approval for 150 nursing home beds.

Around 10 years ago the Sisters first applied for such a redevelopment. It was approved by Council.

However, it was never built. The Sisters' nursing home development in Christchurch,

New Zealand, was severely damaged by the earthquakes in that city. Insurance only covered about one third of the cost of repairs and the Sisters were forced to divert their surplus funds to the balance of the project.

Now the Sisters have the funds to move ahead. The application has been lodged and is being considered.

OTHER DEVELOPMENTS

There are a few other developments, the status of which have changed in recent times.

The new unit block on the corner of Stratton Terrace and Cardigan Parade has finally been approved after an appeal by residents concerned about the effect on their views.

The developer agreed to make minor changes which improved the situation for local residents. Work is expected to commence in mid-2021.

The new development consists of two buildings with 43 units and several small shops.

In my view it is a well-designed development which will add quality to the housing stock of Manly.

The developers have already been involved in a quality development in Wynnum with the 'Enclave' which looks good and sold quickly.

Meanwhile, a standard subdivision has been approved on one of the few remaining blocks that are not flood prone in Wynnum West. This is 420 Kianawah Road, Wynnum West which is situated between the Wynnum Vikings AFL Club and Wynnum Road.

There will be 31 housing blocks ranging in size from 405m² to 728m². The average house block size is around 475m².

In addition, 5.857 hectares of low lying land and bushland will be transferred to Council to add to Council's stock of bushland.

DREAMS COME TRUE IN MANLY HARBOUR VILLAGE

Most people's response to the idea of taking over a bar in the middle of a pandemic would be, "Tell 'em they're dreaming." In fact, the new owners of Bluebottle Bar + Kitchen had a dream of finding a small business in a seaside village to run, and to become part of a local community.

At the beginning of June, their dream came true. After selling another business, Joe and Michelle Arrabal jumped at the chance to become the new custodians of Bluebottle Bar + Kitchen in Manly Harbour Village.

Despite the uncertainty and trading restrictions associated with COVID-19, Joe and Michelle had confidence in the area and saw an opportunity to build on the popularity of Bluebottle Bar. Michelle and Joe's confidence has so far been rewarded. New and returning customers are enjoying the extended trading hours (12 noon to late, Wednesday to Sunday) and a tapas-

style menu that gives a nod to Joe's Spanish heritage, while still featuring popular Australian bar snacks.

For most food businesses, the last few months have been more like a nightmare. Manly Harbour Village traders have worked hard to survive, shifting to take-away and home delivery services, with many using the opportunity to renovate. Manly traders say they have appreciated the outstanding support from their customers.

Restrictions are easing, but businesses are still struggling. Continued support from the local community will be essential in keeping the dream alive for all the traders of Manly Harbour Village.

SOUTH PASSAGE: OUR OWN TALL SAILING SHIP

You may have noticed a tall ship docked at the William Gunn Jetty at Manly recently. That's South Passage, and her volunteers invite you to experience a day on Moreton Bay under sail.

South Passage is an impressive 100-foot gaff rigged schooner, built specifically for adventure sailing and education, launched 26 years ago.

As the brainchild of local businessman Simon Steenland and his family, South Passage was built to give to the next generation of Australians the opportunity to experience a tall ship adventure. Designed by local sailor and naval architect Rick James, the busy ship usually spends 240 days each year at sea.

Today it is owned and operated by a registered charity and not-for-profit association, The Sail Training Association of Qld Inc. As a true non-profit ship, South Passage still continues to fulfill Simon's vision of education and adventure.

Past President Neil Richardson explained that South Passage's goal is to teach ROPES, an acronym for Respect, Opportunity, Participation, Enjoyment and Safety.

"In the last 10 years we have changed the lives of 13,440 school students, 7,251 public passengers — a total of 20,691 people — not to mention the many volunteers who crew and sail South Passage from ports as far north as Cairns in the winter, and

south to Sydney and Wollongong in the summer," said Neil.

South Passage is available for local voyages now because COVID-19 has forced a change of plans. This is great news for those wanting to experience a unique day on the

water departing from Manly, and support the great experience that South Passage provides for young people.

"The opportunity will not last as our main clientele is high school students. Come and help us help young Australians by booking a day sail now on Moreton Bay," said Neil.

SAILING FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITY AT MANLY

Sailability Bayside is an all-volunteer, not-forprofit organisation, which has been operating from the Darling Point Sailing Squadron premises at Trafalgar Street Manly since its inauguration in 2003.

The concept of Sailability was developed in the UK during the 1980s and has since spread around the globe, providing a system of sailing for all people with a disability. The Bayside group is one of a number based in South East Queensland, with others located at Southport, Graceville, Shorncliffe, Mooloolaba and Noosa.

Sailability Bayside operates each Monday and Thursday during school terms, however activities are currently suspended due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Presently, volunteers are attending one day each week to maintain equipment and ensure the group is ready to return to sailing when the situation is deemed safe for volunteers and their clients. At this stage, a review will occur in September.

Hansa 303 dinghies are primarily used for sailing as they are extremely safe and stable and accommodate two persons - a volunteer skipper and a passenger. However, a seven-metre Payne yacht is also part of the fleet, which can accommodate a volunteer skipper and a crew member, plus seating for another eight people.

Volunteers are always needed, and whether you can sail or not is of little importance. There are many positions for land-based activities such as maintenance, administration, food preparation and fitting lifejackets. And, if you also have an interest in learning to sail, there are more than enough qualified people who will provide you with the necessary experience.



LOCAL AUTHOR PROFILE JEANNETTE MAREE

Sydney-born author Jeannette Maree now resides in Brisbane. Her latest book, Plum Blossom, reflects her interest in her current locality of Wynnum Manly. Jeannette's earlier novel, Remember to Breathe, is also set in Queensland.

The mother of five took up writing in 1990 after someone remarked, "You've had such an interesting life, you ought to write a book!"

This comment encouraged Jeannette to write her first novel, I Belong to Me, which was written under the name Louise Ayden.

Plum Blossom tells a story of a young man arriving in Wynnum in the 1960s.

"In the summer of 1967, Gabe Connor, a young man with a dark past, arrives in Wynnum. He is quickly accepted among the fishermen as brave and hardworking, but is feared for his unpredictable violent rages," explains Jeannette.

"Gabe meets the love of his life, Bonnie, who helps him become a guieter man. However, his dark past haunts him and during a late night walk, Gabe meets his fate. But Gabe's spirit was not ready to leave. Gabe has unfinished business and so becomes a spectator in the life he should have lived."

by Martii Maclean and illustrated by Sharon Clark



THE LOUDNESS OF UNSAID THINGS

The Loudness of Unsaid Things is our next book club read for August, and is the debut novel of Melbourne author Hilde Hinton.

It's a story of seven-year-old Susie, whose mother is often hospitalised with deteriorating mental health, and a father whose poverty is a source of embarrassment for her. It's a coming of age story about a child who finds adults to be complicated and confusing; a child who is mistaken for being a "bad child", when all along, she is just misunderstood and doesn't have the skills to explain herself.

Susie's struggle to be accepted, especially by her mum, is heartbreaking. She is so full of love, but doesn't know how to live that life to its fullest. It's as if the adults around her constantly fail her, with the exception of Miss Kaye.



Hinton's writing style is incredibly engaging, thoughtful and seems to draw on some of the experiences Hilda experienced in her own childhood. It's also evocative of the Melbourne and Sydney landscape of the 1980s, and having grown up in the Sydney outer suburbs, I felt a sense of belonging with the setting. This familiarity of Australian life is something it shares with another great Australian novel, The Dry by Jane Harper. If you loved Boy Swallows Universe, you will love this.









LOCAL FISHING TIPS WITH SPERO

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos gives us his tips for successful August fishing in Moreton

Normally this time of the year means westerlies, the EKKA (show bags – in the old days the Triple M/FM104 show bag was the one to get if they hadn't sold out), colds and flu, and some good fishing. Well, this year only good fishing is left, and that's ok by me!

There will be no snapper or squire fishing until the 15th, but that's ok, imagine how big they will be when we get back into them.

August is a very good month for school mackerel, especially in the Rainbow Channel and Peel Island areas. Also good are Hope Banks on the western side of Moreton Island at the sand hills all the way to Shark Spit, and the shipping channels and beacons (the Measured Mile beacon is one of the best, depending on where the mackerel are feeding).

The other fantastic event this month is the start of the whales migrating south, and I can't wait to see these majestic mammals in the Bay with

their young. We've had a few pods in the last few years as close in as Hope Banks and east of Ormiston and Green Islands towards Peel Island, and plenty towards Tangalooma and the sand hills. September is better, but we have had them as early as the start of August.

Now, back to school mackerel, paravaning with diving boards is becoming a common sight, and it's great to see fisherman learning to use them (and even yachties) to catch a few fresh fish to put on the dinner plate.

The Delta and Yamashita boards, followed by the orange Yozuri type boards, are by far the best with a three-inch spoon by Halco. Kimberly spoons and the old Smith jigs in white, pink and silver are the most effective. It's no good looking for Makka spoons anymore; they don't make them, so I'm hoping someone picks up the business as they were a very good spoon.

Water Tower Bait and Tackle have all the tools to get you started on trolling with boards and spoons, with diagrams on set up and up-to-date information on where the school mackerel are at, so it's worth calling in to have a chat to Toni.

50 PLUS FITTER BOUNCES BACK

Keeping people fit as they age is serious business for Katie Stewart. She runs 50 Plus Fitter in Manly and works with over 70 local people to help them maintain strength, coordination, flexibility and balance as they grow older.

Katie's classes are run under the jurisdiction of Gymnastics Queensland and take place each Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday mornings in the Manly-Lota RSL Hall.

Keeping people fit and active is a passion for Katie and her fellow instructor, Abby. During the COVID shutdown they continued classes on the web with live classes on Mondays and Fridays and a recorded class on Wednesdays. They also included brain activities to help people cope with isolation.

"It is much easier now that we are back in person," Katie said. "I really missed seeing and speaking with my clients. Many were not savvy with technology and could not do the on-line classes but they are back in force now. We have

had to introduce some COVID-safe rules, but we are able to do many of the activities we have always done."

The activities are varied and cater for a range of abilities. The aim is to keep people active and moving as they age. A major benefit of the classes is friendship, and participants enjoy the social activity. Classes are affordable (\$10 a lesson or \$80 for 10 lessons) and seniors may be eligible for government subsidies. Katie offers the first class for free so that people can try before they commit.

While anyone over 50 can join, many of the star participants are over 70. They all benefit from the exercises.

POSITIVE COMMUNITY FEEDBACK FOR LINDUM STATION PRECINCT STUDY

A safer level crossing, increased car parking and improved pedestrian and bike access are some of the top priorities identified by the Lindum Station Precinct Study.

Community feedback from the study's first stage will be analysed to guide how the project will take

Federal Minister for Population, Cities and Urban Infrastructure Alan Tudge said local knowledge was crucial to ensure the best outcome was achieved for the Lindum Rail Crossing upgrade.

"We know this intersection is dangerous and the Morrison Government has prioritised this study so we can find solutions to fix it," Mr Tudge said.

Queensland Minister for Transport and Main Roads Mark Bailey said the consultation process included a digital approach with a survey and ideas wall, as well as face-to-face engagement with community and stakeholders.

"Lindum Station and its surrounds are a crucial

part of the local community. That's why it's vital we prioritise the community as part of the study," Mr Bailev said.

"The importance of this study has been reflected in the community's feedback with nearly 7000 website views, almost 300 surveys completed and 180 ideas shared on the interactive wall.

"This study will allow us to consider the broader station area and identify opportunities for the precinct. If we get this right, it will serve as a catalyst for new local economic activity, which means more local jobs.

"Both the Member for Lytton Joan Pease and I want to plan for a new community transport hub that safely caters for commuters, school children, business, bike riding and walking connections as well as local motor vehicle traffic."

Federal Member for Bonner Ross Vasta said community safety was his top priority, with the level crossing and five-ways intersection a

nightmare for motorists during peak commuter

"Options to be explored to improve safety for motorists and pedestrians include grade separation, upgrading the existing level crossing and relocating the level crossing," Mr Vasta said.

The Lindum Station Precinct Study is jointly

funded by the Australian and Queensland Government's both contributing \$400,000. The Australian Government has also committed \$85 million to the construction of an upgrade to the Lindum Rail Crossing.

INGREDIENTS

LEMON LIME SYRUP

- 4 lemons, juiced
- 1 cup water
- 4 limes, juiced
- 1 cup white sugar

LIME SALT RIM

- 3 tbsp salt
- Zest of 1 lime

COCKTAIL

- 45ml mezcal (if you don't like the smokiness of mezcal, tequila blanco will work too)
- 30ml Applewood limoncello
- 90ml lemon lime syrup
- Dash of rosewater
- 2 large ice cubes

METHOD

- In a saucepan combine the sugar, water and bring up to a simmer. Stir occasionally to dissolve
- Allow the sugar syrup to cool for 10 minutes then add lemon and lime juice. Refrigerate for up to 2. two weeks.
- In a small bowl, add salt and lime zest. Stir until combined and keep in an airtight container.
- 4. Add cocktail ingredients into a cocktail shaker or a jar with a lid. Shake for 15 seconds.
- 5. With a lime wedge, coat the rim of your favourite glass and dip into the lime salt. Strain the cocktail into the glass and enjoy!

CREAMY MUSSELS WITH WARM BREAD

INGREDIENTS

- 150ml white wine
- 1kg mussels
- 50g butter
- 1 tsp crushed garlic
- 1 tbsp sliced chilli
- 80ml thickened cream
- 2 slices sourdough
- Chopped parsley to garnish

SERVES 4

METHOD

- 1. Rinse mussels under running water, scrubbing off any dirt or seaweed.
- 2. Melt butter in a large saucepan over low heat. Add the garlic and chilli. Cook for 3 minutes.
- 3. Add the mussels and the white wine and increase heat to high. Cook for 3 minutes until the wine starts to evaporate.
- **4.** Add thickened cream. Cook, stirring occasionally for 3–5 minutes or until the mussels have just opened.
- 5. Discard any unopened mussels. Transfer mussels to a serving bowl and pour over the liquid. Serve with 2 slices of toasted sourdough and garnish with the parsley.


