

PETER CUMMING'S LOCAL AREA UPDATE

COUNCILLOR FOR WYNNUM MANLY WARD

NEW CONSTRUCTION

Wynnum's first new buildings above five storeys in height are well advanced and near completion in Wynnum Central.

The Lato Baia complex opposite the Waterloo Bay Hotel is expected to be completed by March 2021. As well as a seven-cinema complex there will be 67 residential units.

The residential units are expected to be completed by December 2020 or January 2021. The cinemas are scheduled to be opened in mid-March 2021.

In addition another nine storey building is being constructed in Bride Street. Alta Vista and is situated behind the George Hartnett Funeral home.

It will also be eight storeys and contain 21 two-bedroom units.

The new buildings are a lot higher than the five storey unit blocks which have been built to date and will confirm the Wynnum area's attraction to the private development industry.

There have been 14 unit complexes of five storeys and over built since the first one in Ronald Street, Wynnum around five years ago.

Also new to Wynnum Manly is a new medical facility opened during the last month. The Lighthouse GP Clinic is in the Bayside Medical Hub at the Corner of Bay Terrace and Pine Street, Wynnum. A new wine bar at the bottom of the IGA building will open soon.

OFF LEASH DOG SWIMMING AREA

I am pleased to advise that after 12 months of consultation, Council has approved the off leash dog swimming area at Manly. The area is located at the end of Davenport Drive, Manly. This is the road to the right of the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron.

It has proven very popular with dog owners and is also a very popular location for wind surfers. I ask that all dog owners take their bags and clean up after their dogs and make sure they play nicely with other dogs and people who share the space.

Please note fines can be given to dog owners if you take your dog off the leash prior to the designated area and do not carry a plastic bag with you, or clean up after your dog.

At 7am last Sunday morning there were seven owners and eight dogs wading off the beach or walking on the beach so the facility is already being well used.

PARK UPGRADES

I have approved the following park upgrades in Wynnum Manly:

- Federation Street, Wynnum West park will receive an upgrade of the playground and installation of gym equipment. The project will cost \$130,000.
- Lota Point Park will receive a shade sail costing \$40,000.
- Greene Park will have a new electric BBQ installed costing \$35,000 and I am in discussions for bud lighting to be installed next financial year.
- Herbert Street Park, Lota will see the installation of a shade sail costing \$40,000.

The following upgrades have already been undertaken this financial year, since 1 July 2020:

- The playground and shelter upgrade in Moreton Bay Lions Park, Pine Street Wynnum, which cost \$34,640.
- A new playground and shelter upgrade in Robtrish Street Park, Manly West. The cost was \$15,400.
- Clare Avenue, Wynnum West had a shade installed, costing \$30,000.
- Elanora Park Small Dog park shelter, \$8,900.
- Park Gym Equipment on the Esplanade, across from the intersection with Picton Parade.
- A new toilet block at Ed Davenport Rotary Park, Lota, next to the PCYC.

SAFER CROSSING

I am pleased to receive confirmation that Energex has submitted their design to Council for the lighting of the pedestrian crossing at 202 Preston Road, Manly West.

City Lighting has accepted the design and asked Energex to proceed with the project and install the new lighting.

I am hoping that this project will be completed by the end of December 2020.

This is the pedestrian crossing at Corner House, which is very well used.

HOT TIPS FOR COOLING YOUR PETS THIS SUMMER

The summer heat is here already! We are so lucky to live in the lovely bayside where a cooling sea breeze is often not too far away. However, as the weather heats up it is important to make sure that we help our pets to stay cool.

Dogs and cats only have sweat glands in their paws so they rely on panting to help cool themselves. This is an issue in brachycephalic (short faced) pets such as French bulldogs, Pugs, Boxers and Persian cats.

How can you help keep your pet cool? Avoid exercising pets during the heat of the day - the best time to walk your dog is first thing in the morning.

The ground can heat up very rapidly during the day and stay hot late into the afternoon. If the footpath is too hot for you to touch, it is too hot for your pet's tender paws.

NEVER leave your pet in a car. Even in fairly mild temperatures (24C), a car can heat up to 38C within 10 minutes, and as high as 50C within half an hour.

Provide your pets with a shady place to shelter from the sun if outside during the day. If your pets are indoors, provide a fan or air conditioning.

Ensure pets have a plentiful supply of cool, clean water. It's a good idea to place extra water bowls around in hot temperatures. Adding ice cubes to water bowls can keep them cool for longer.

Keep your dog or cat's coat well groomed -a knotty, dirty coat will make it harder for heat to escape from their skin.

If you suspect your pet is suffering from heat stroke, it is important to seek veterinary attention urgently.

STAR TECH GIVES SENIORS A TECHNOLOGY LIFELINE

Wynnum EACH is a social activity centre for older adults, which endeavours to assist older people (or an adult with a disability) to continue living at home and participate in the community.

EACH social activity groups offer a planned program of structured activities, while also providing respite and support for carers. Activities focus on health and wellbeing programs, along with an art group, shopping trips and general outings.

The current global pandemic has made it extremely lonely for some of our older people due to them not seeing their loved ones.

"At EACH we have listened and partnered with STAR Community services to come up with a solution so that our older generation could see and hear their families," said EACH's Chanel Haydon.

Through the new STAR Tech program, hundreds of seniors have become more proficient in communicating using the latest technology.

Seniors can choose to learn on their own device (e.g. an iPad or Smartphone) or get a new computer Tablet through the program. Training is provided by supportive and patient trainers, and to date, the program has supported over 300 clients.

The program is open to adults aged over 65 and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders over 50 living in the South Brisbane area who may be isolated, frail, living independently or with a carer.

Participation in the program only commences following assessment, but the manager at EACH has the ability to make arrangements on behalf of participants.



THE HISTORY OF 78 WILDE STREET WYNNUM

CONTRIBUTED BY THE WYNNUM MANLY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

This Wesleyan Methodist Church, the first recorded church building in Wynnum, was opened for worship on 30 August 1890. The church cost £182 and held 100 people. Previous to this time worship was thought to be in the private home of Joel Wilde in Wilde Street.

The church remained in use for 11 years, then the congregation moved to a larger church in adjacent Ashton Street. Both churches were built by John lley Greene.

The trustees authorised the sale of the Wilde Street property on 5 November 1901 to James Pickels. James and his wife Frances improved the property and added verandahs to the front and left side. Benjamin Pickels and James Nuttall inherited the property, and on 27 February 1911 sold it to Mary Jane Colledge. She lived here for 35 years and added a wing at the rear which housed two more bedrooms.

Frank Colledge inherited the property on 7 July 1944. He sold it on 21 October 1960 to Frank Henry Johnson (with Roy and Lillian Colledge as mortgagees). Since that

time the house has received many improvements at the rear and has changed hands several times.







READING TO DOGS IS A BARKING GOOD IDEA

Local volunteers and their dogs are working with kids to improve their reading skills as part of the Story Dogs program.

Story Dogs has been operating in Australia for more than 10 years. Based on the very successful American literary program Reading Education Assistance Dogs (R.E.A.D) which was launched in Utah in 1999, the Story Dogs program is built around the appealing idea of children and adolescents reading to dogs.

Reading sessions are scheduled weekly, and the same children (selected by the school) attend each week for the school year. Over the course of the year the child's reading skills improve markedly by reading to and interacting with the dog, and their personal confidence soars.

"Our small group of enthusiastic volunteers here in Wynnum/Manly are passionate about the program and enjoy the interaction they and their dogs have with the children and their school community.

"We currently have more schools signed up for the program than trained volunteer teams, so I am on the quest to recruit new volunteer teams for our area."

FOUR SIMPLE STEPS FOR HOLIDAY WATER SAFETY

As the weather warms up and the holidays approach, many people are eager to launch their kayaks, jet skis, boats and yachts.

For Brisbane Coast Guard, the summer holiday period is often the busiest, so here are four simple steps to make your water activities safe.

- 1. Plan your trip. Check the maps for Marine Parks, go-slow areas and shallow ground. Work out how much fuel you'll need, and add some more for contingencies like headwinds or extra time spent trolling.
- Equipment. Visit the MSQ website to ensure you have all the right equipment, and check that all your safety gear is working. Check the dates on your flares and EPIRB, and if they're out of date, drop into Brisbane Coast Guard to buy a new set of inshore flares and drop off your old flares. We also accept your old EPIRB for recycling for a \$10 donation.
- 3. Weather. The wind conditions in the middle of the Bay can be dramatically different than at the boat ramp, so make sure you check the forecast and know your boat's limitations.
- 4. Tell someone where you're going and when you'll be back. You can log on to Coast Guard using your radio or phone, and that way if something happens we know where to start looking for you.

"These four simple steps will help make sure that your time on the water is enjoyable," Coast Guard rescue boat skipper Tom Miller said. "A little bit of preparedness, especially for small craft like kayaks and tinnies, can ensure a great day out on the water."

FISHING MORETON BAY WITH SPERO THIS CHRISTMAS

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos shares his wealth of fishing knowledge in Moreton Bay so you can enjoy a fresh feast of seafood this Christmas.

How time flies! It's that time of the year already, and what a year it was. All I can say is thank heavens we could go out and catch a fish, otherwise I think I would have not coped well at all.

The fishing in December is always very good, the only problem is the winds tend to strengthen and the storms roll through, but in between there are calm days and plenty of fish to catch.

It's time for spotty mackerel to make their run in the bay, not always as big a turnout as in the past, but still some will come into the bay. Looking for the feeding schools on the surface is lots of fun with the terns showing us the way to them, a good spinning rod and reel and a few chrome slugs will do the trick – it's just a matter of cast and retrieve around the feeding schools.

Try not to cast in the middle of the school as most times you will get bitten off. Water Tower Bait and Tackle have plenty of the 34gr chrome slugs and are quite inexpensive, so losing a few does not hurt as much, and remember no wire traces in the bay, it just does not work.

The school mackerel will still be in the bay so try some trolling with boards and spoons (the new Halco 3-inch should be available in December) but looking at all my past records it seems Smith jigs in white, chrome and pink work the best this time of year, and you really can't go wrong with the Halco chrome spoons.

Whiting will be throughout the Small Boat Channel, Rous Channel, Fisherman's Gutter, Sand Hills and Amity Banks, so a few live blood worms, squid strips and peeled prawns will get you plenty of fish to make the kids and the family happy.

Snapper and squire are also prevalent around the Bay Islands and the artificial reefs with whole small whiting, whiting heads, garfish or any small fish being the best baits, and mullet flesh and squid are also worth a try.

The treat in December is the tiger squid which come into the bay and they are quite ravenous



this time of year – it's always worth having a jig out while whiting fishing and unlike the cuttlefish and arrow squid, the tigers prefer the shallow and clean water wherever there are weed beds. Emeralda nudes in the prawn patterns are my favourite squid jigs, but any orange/red prawn pattern will work and 3.5 size is what I would recommend.

To all the readers may you all have a wonderful and safe Christmas and enjoy our beautiful bay.

GREEK ALMOND SHORTBREAD COOKIE RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

- 250g unsalted butter. The butter must be at room temperature, not melted.
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 1 cup self-raising flourA good dash of vanilla extract
- A good dash of varina extract
 1/2 cup roasted slivered almonds
- 2 nips or more of Ouzo
- Plain flour. *Use the Greek measuring technique use as much flour as you need until a soft dough forms
- Icing sugar (icing sugar mixture rather than pure icing sugar is best)

- **METHOD**
- 1. Get a bowl and whack in all the ingredients at the same time.
- 2. Mix with your hands, which is the best part of this recipe.
- 3. Form the dough into balls.
- 4. Place the balls on a tray lined with oven proof paper.
- 5. Place in a pre-heated oven at 180 degrees (or 160 degrees fan forced). Cook until they become a golden colour.
- 6. Take the cookies out of the oven and let them cool until slightly warm. You can sprinkle ouzo over them if you like.
- 7. Dust a generous amount of icing sugar over the cookies.
- 8. Make yourself a nice cup of tea or coffee, and sit down and enjoy your cookies.
- * Sorry about any recipe omissions but this is the Greek way of cooking! The cardinal rule is to make it up as you go and it will taste great.

'ALL I WANT FOR CHRISTMAS' IN ST HELENA PENAL ESTABLISHMENT

Separation from friends and family makes for a difficult time at Christmas. Prisoners, warders and families living on St Helena Island were only 8km but a world away from participating in mainland festivities. So they made their own celebrations.

Prisoner Michael Minnis was a religious man, a school teacher in Tingalpa and also a convicted killer sentenced to life in St Helena's prison. Michael was employed as the Head Cook in the prison kitchen for eight years, having responsibility for kitchen operations and fellow prisoners. Christmas celebrations in 1895 saw a bullock killed for Christmas dinner, for which Chief Warder Bowden remarked "The dinner was very nicely cooked." Prisoners Minnis, McGee and Bryson also received similar praise for their plum puddings made for Christmas and New Year celebrations.

In 1897, 116 Christmas letters and cards from Mrs McConnell and other Christian ladies were distributed to prisoners during recreation time in the prison yards. In 1899, Mrs Mary Pennefather,

the wife of the Comptroller General of Prisons, personally gave Christmas cards to prisoners. No sport was held on Christmas Day, though it was not a holiday from work. However, Warder Brennan and Rev McPherson conducted Divine service for all worshippers.

Even the colourful gardens around the superintendents' and warders' houses made a Christmas contribution. An entry in Chief Warder Bowden's diary on the 24th December 1897 states that the 'Steamer Otter lay at anchor all night ready to take a quantity of flowers and evergreens to decorate a church at Ipswich'.

A few lucky warders were able to get leave to be with family on the mainland, but the majority continued to work. However, the Christmas spirit was evident in surprising ways, as experienced by Warder Patrick Falvey, who found himself before the Superintendent charged with a miscount of prisoners. With Christmas looming, the case was dismissed "owing to Christmas Eve".
