### **NEW HUB FOR BRANCHES LIFESTYLE SUPPORT**

Branches Lifestyle Support is a small not-for-profit service organisation based in the Bayside area. Operating for the last 17 years, Branches provides 24/7 care to help people with intellectual disabilities to live successfully in their own homes and to participate in their local communities.

It has always been the organisation's dream to have a public space where their people can gather for recreational or educational activities, or to simply just hang out together.

Now that dream is about to become a reality with the opening of a new Community Hub at 29 Fox Street Wynnum. The hub will contain a meeting, training and activity space at the front, offices and gym in the former residential property at the back, and a community garden in the enormous yard at the rear of the property. The premises will also serve as the base for the Branches Blokes mowing crew.

The hub will be a hive of activity for Branches during the day, but the great news for the community is that it will be offered as a meeting or training space for others to utilise in the evenings, fully equipped with all amenities.

RE/MAX Advantage recently held its annual charity gala in support of Branches Lifestyle Support, and through this event (and with support from local businesses and the community), they were able to raise in excess of \$50,000 for this wonderful charity and their clients. These funds have assisted in the purchase of the new local hub.

Branches will hold a grand opening for the hub on March 6.

#### **NEW BUSINESSES IN WYNNUM**

The popular Matilda Art of Gelato shop has moved from Edith Street to the corner of Bay Tce and Florence Street where The Olive used to be. According to all reports business has picked up.

A Japanese restaurant Mr Hibachi has opened in the old IGA building at first floor level.

The Fat Duck bar has opened next door as has The Fat Duck Café.

Over at Gibbs Street, Wynnum, off Tingal Road is Wynnum Manly's first micro-brewery, Hudson Brewing. So driving north you go past Bartons, past Burke Street you reach Gibbs Street. The Brewery is at the railway end of Gibb Street.

My inquiries reveal many locals from around that area are walking to Hudson's and often bringing their children with them. There was a nice atmosphere when I was there one Sunday afternoon

Don't drink and drive if you are drinking any heavy beers.

Frenchies is now open at night to add to the night time offerings on Bay Terrace from Cedar & Pine, Vietnam Eat Alley, Matildas, Absolute Thai, Kebabzone, Pierre's and The Coffee Club. Mates is busy in Edith Street.

In Manly there is also a great range of venues including the Bluebottle Bar, Manly Deck, Manly Hotel, Celtic Corner and further down Cambridge Parade you can visit Manly Kitchen, Keith's on Cambridge, Lido Italia and Sea Vibes. And don't forget Coopers is now open Friday and Saturday

These are just some of the great venues bringing Wynnum Manly alive this summer.

#### CHILDCARE CENTRES GALORE

You might be aware of the 108-space childcare centre application for 18 Ernest Street, Manly, between the BP and the Manly railway station.

This is controversial due to the current traffic congestion already in this vicinity.

A new proposal has been submitted to Council for 215 Whites Road, Lota. This site proposes 109 childcare spaces.

#### NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN WYNNUM AND MANLY

At 22 Ronald Street, Wynnum there is a five-storey building proposed which would have 16 apartments and 16 carpark spaces.

Manly also has a new site for an apartment complex on the Esplanade at Manly. The three-storey complex will feature eight apartments and 20 carpark spaces at 437 Esplanade, Manly.

There is a two-storey, four-unit complex at 18 Nelson Parade Manly, and a four-unit complex at 13 Wellington Street, Manly.

#### MANLY ROAD PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

I have received numerous concerns about the safety of the pedestrian zebra crossing on Manly Road, near Fisher Street, Manly,

I wish to advise Council's Transport Planning and Operations has investigated these concerns and will be making some changes.

A site inspection and investigation has been undertaken into the request to improve the pedestrian crossing. There is a build-out on the western side of the crossing, which improves visibility of the signage and shortens the crossing distance for pedestrians.

Consideration was given to implementing a build-out on the eastern side, however there is a driveway immediately to the north of the crossing location, meaning a build-out could not be installed without causing an obstruction to this property's access.

I have asked for a signalised pedestrian crossing installed at this location. Council's response is that there is a high demand for these facilities all across Brisbane, and as such Council must prioritise these requests based on pedestrian volumes and their safety record.

Council will be carrying out a survey after the school holidays and then the data will provide further information on whether signals can be prioritised at this location.

In the interim, Council will improve the location of the existing signage, and have this improved with newer, more highly visible signage incorporating fluorescent target boards.

I will continue to monitor this investigation and will keep you updated.

#### **STORM WARNINGS**

The Brisbane City Council's Early Warning Alert Service provides advanced warning for severe weather or other public safety events. This helps you to prepare and protect people and property.

The message is sent from Weather Zone from BoM weather warnings. To register use this link: https://ewa.brisbane.qld.gov.au/

It is also best to listen to local radio for up to date weather changes if severe weather is due.

Locally you can also access free sandbags for your home from Herbert Street, Lota.

Sandbags are left on the footpath and available to anyone needing them.

Council has a 24/7 Contact Centre who can help with Council trees, footpaths, parks or bushland by calling 3403 8888.


What do people love most about you? I have very nice manners and always sit and wait to be patted, but once you've patted me I'm your new best friend!

### HELPING YOUR DOG TO COPE WITH BEING ALONE

The upheaval caused by COVID-19 last year had a big impact on everyone's lives. As we start to head back to work and other activities, it may become an issue for our pets who have adjusted to a "new normal" of never being home alone!

Dogs are naturally social animals so any changes in the home or in people's schedules can result in them developing separation anxiety — put simply, they become afraid of being alone.

Separation anxiety can present in a number of ways including increased barking, howling or whining, destructive behaviours such as digging or chewing furniture and having toileting accidents in the house.

Treating separation anxiety usually involves a combination of behaviour modification and medication.

Doggy day care is a great way to keep your precious pooch entertained while you are out. There are a number of excellent doggy day care providers in the bayside area.

Use food dispensing or puzzle toys such as Kongs, treat balls or snuffle mats. Having to work for their food helps to keep anxious minds busy and distracted.

Some dogs enjoy playing in sand pits — you can bury favourite toys or treats for them to find.

Create a safe space for your pet — this may be a kennel, a small room in your house or a crate. Leave an old item of clothing which will have your scent on it and give special treats only when in this area to make it an even more appealing place for them to go and relax.

Classical music left on while your dog is alone

may have a soothing effect.

Downplay your arrivals and departures. As much as we instinctively fuss over our pets as soon as we see them, it is important to reward calm, relaxed behaviour. Wait until your pet is sitting calmly to give them your attention.

Make sure that when you are at home you have quality time with your pet. Taking your dog out for a walk will help to tire them out and give them the added bonus of extra time with their favourite person: you! If you feel that your dog is developing separation anxiety, make an appointment to see your vet.

There are a number of medications which can be used to help reduce anxiety and your vet will be able to give you advice on how best to help your dog.



### FORT LYTTON HISTORIC MILITARY PRECINCT REOPENS

After a year of restricted access due to COVID-19, the Fort Lytton Historic Military Precinct will reopen to the public from January 17.

Mike McLean, President of the Fort Lytton Historical Association, said his volunteers have been preparing for the reopening for months, installing new exhibits and refurbishing old ones, with the assistance of the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service, and other supporters.

Mr McLean said two important new exhibits arrived just before Christmas. They are an L119 Hamel Light Gun used by the Australian Army until 2014, and an L5 Pack Howitzer like those originally used in Vietnam. These two guns will be placed in one of Australia's largest historic Gun Parks.

The Fort Lytton Gun Park now houses 34 historic artillery pieces, dating right back to the earliest cannons sent from England to the Australian colonies.

Fort Lytton National Park was created in 1990 as Queensland's first historic national park. The Military Precinct, built around a Coastal Artillery Battery dating from the 1800s, now includes five museums, many historic buildings, and several instillations like the gun park.

Mr McLean said his volunteers planned to progressively open the Fort Lytton museums and installations on every Sunday and public holiday throughout the year, starting on Sunday 17 January, with free guided tours, and special open days and re-enactments.

### FISHING MORETON BAY IN JANUARY WITH SPERO

Spero Kartanos is back to share his in-depth knowledge of Moreton Bay. Follow his advice to find your fresh feed of fish this summer.

I hope you all had a great Christmas and 2020; let's all hope COVID and all the other stuff we put up with is behind us, and 2021 will be a fantastic happy, healthy and great fishing year.

It's time to get the chrome slugs from Water Tower Bait and Tackle as the spotties are in the bay. Large females close to a metre in length came in November and December, and it's time for the smaller males to arrive in their thousands (smaller only by 10 to 15 cm), so a good 10 to 20lb spin rod and a 4000 to 5000 size spinning reel is all you need. A couple of things: cast around the feeding schools and don't use any wire traces in the bay, just look for the terns flying above the bait balls and the little black mutton birds hanging around getting a feed.

School mackerel will still be in the bay so trolling a board with a spoon (chrome or chrome plus colours) will do the trick .

Summer also heralds the start of the tiger squid which not only are good to eat but lots of fun to catch. They will be in the weed banks in the nice clean water and it's a matter of cast and slow retrieve. Look for them where you are catching your whiting, and they will be all through the Small Boat Channel, Rous Channel, Sand Hills and Amity Banks. These days it's also worth trying on the northern side of the leads at Manly towards St Helena, and also at the north-west tip of Green Island.

So it's only a matter of picking a good weather day as the bay has everything we need for a fresh feed, but do keep an eye out on the weather. With storm season don't ever be pressured to going out if you don't think the weather is not going to be good — there is always another day, safety first fishing second.

Some good news to report for all boaties is that I have received an email from Dr Andrew Johnson, CEO and National Director of Meteorology, to advise that we will be getting a wind/weather station put onto the Hope Banks beacon this year.

To be honest I am over the moon as in my opinion it's going to give us the most accurate wind reading for the bay, so a huge thank you to Dr




Andrew. It can only be a good thing to know what the wind is doing in this part of the bay. When I started sending out letters I really was hoping it would happen, but I am so happy it made it to the right person to get something done.

### WINNAM TO FIND HOME AT VACANT HOSPITAL SITE

The old Wynnum Hospital site is set to be developed by the Winnam Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Corporation (WINNAM) as an integrated indigenous health and aged care hub.

Labor Member for Lytton Joan Pease said she had been working on ensuring the future of the site would benefit the local community.

"I have been working with my Cabinet colleagues on opportunities for WINNAM to use the site, so I am very pleased to be able to make this announcement," Ms Pease said. "As the former hospital site, I believe the site should continue to benefit the health and wellbeing of our Bayside community.

"WINNAM came to me with their goal of building and operating an integrated indigenous health and aged care hub — I knew that this site would be perfect.

"This is a win for our community, who will not only benefit from the services this facility will have but also the construction jobs this project will bring to the region." "This is an innovative concept of delivering services across the spectrum of life such as aged care, allied health, child care and provide employment opportunities for the Quandamooka people and the surrounding broader Community," said Ms Rebecca Thomson, Chair of the Winnam Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Corporation (Wynnum).

Ms Pease said the previous Government had reduced services at the Old Wynnum Hospital and begun closing it completely.



The State Government intends to gift the land to WINNAM, subject to the delivery of a business case. A business case will be due to the State Government by October 2022.

### **BLUE TONGUE'S COFFEE FOR A GOOD CAUSE**

A new morning coffee cart that's opened for business on Tingal Road represents the culmination of a two-year journey for its operator, a young local man living with disability.

Chris Morris has become a qualified barista through the School Leavers Employment Support (SLES) program, offered by local disability services provider Tea-Cup Cottage.

The program has helped him develop the skills he needs for his new job, serving top-quality coffee at the cart outside the Blue Tongue Collectables studio.

Tea-Cup Cottage director Alex Shaw said it's a proud moment for Chris and for Blue Tongue Adventure's SLES program.

"Chris is just the first of our participants to work at the coffee cart. We'll soon have more of our crew coming through to train and work — and enjoy the satisfaction, confidence and independence that comes with having your own job."

And, if locals need an excuse to drink more coffee, how about a good cause? Fifty cents from every cup sold at the coffee cart will go towards buying a kiln for Blue Tongue's Art + Soul studio, so artists in the program will be able to fire their own ceramic creations on-site.

Barista skills are just one of many avenues in Blue Tongue Adventure's SLES program. Participants are also training and working in industries like gardening in the Green Thumbs program, and retail in the Blue Tongue Collectables store.

# VIRGIN EMERGENCY CALL: BEHIND THE SCENES WITH SEARCH & RESCUE

As a recent Virgin Australia flight descended over the bay to the airport, eagle-eyed passengers spotted a red life jacket floating in the water. The flight crew notified air traffic control, and within minutes search boats from Brisbane Water Police, Coast Guard, Volunteer Marine Rescue and Airport Rescue were scrambled to the scene.

"With light fading, we called in two crews and launched our boats," Flotilla Commander Craig Bowen said. "Despite the rough seas we were on scene within 20 minutes of the call."

At the search location, the boats were directed by a Water Police SAR coordinator, who takes into account wind and tide information to lay out search patterns.

"The boats move across the search area in a line, spaced closely together so we don't miss anything," Craig Bowen explained. "When any of the crew spot something in the water, the entire line of boats pause so it can be checked out."

As dark settled and visibility reduced due to rough weather, Brisbane Water Police called off the search. At a debrief held the following week, which coincided with trials of new flares and EPIRBs, teams from all rescue agencies compared notes to help future searches on the water. The teams from Brisbane Water Police, Coast Guard and Volunteer Marine Rescue regularly train and work together to support all boat users in the bay.

### MORETON BAY'S INTERNATIONAL ARRIVALS FLY IN

CONTRIBUTED BY PORT OF BRISBANE

Despite Australia's current restrictions on international arrivals due to COVID-19, Moreton Bay has been welcoming its own visitors from overseas, in the form of thousands of migratory shorebirds arriving on their annual pilgrimage from the northern hemisphere.

Adjacent to RAMSAR wetlands on the edge of Moreton Bay, Port of Brisbane is home to internationally important high tide roosting habitat, which the Port provides for migratory shorebirds.

Bird species including Far Eastern Curlew, Bar-tailed Godwit and Curlew Sandpipers travel tens of thousands of kilometres from the northern hemisphere to Moreton Bay, with up to 15,000 shorebirds known to visit the Port of Brisbane at one time during the peak migratory season.

Some of these visiting species are listed as endangered or critically endangered, making habitat such as this vital to their long-term survival

The Port's Shorebird Roost was the largest of its kind in the southern hemisphere when built in 2005 and over the years has welcomed hundreds of visiting school children and members of the community. It's also an important site for Queensland Wader Study Group - a non-government volunteer organisation dedicated to the protection of shorebirds and their habitat, who has conducted shorebird monitoring out at the Port for almost a decade.

While the Port of Brisbane Shorebird Roost is currently closed due to COVID-19, there is still an opportunity to see roosting migratory shorebirds in the local area. The Wynnum Wetlands Bird Hide along the Wynnum Mangrove Boardwalk lets you get up close to the region's magnificent mangroves and view migratory waders in the summer months, particularly at high tide. You can also visit the Port of Brisbane Lake, which is home to a variety of water bird

### **GNOCCHI TARTUFO RECIPE**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 500g fresh gnocchi (cooked as per packet instructions)
- 200g chopped mushrooms
- ½ medium brown onion (diced)
- 1 tablespoon of garlic (crushed)
- 480ml of thickened cream

- 1 tablespoon of truffle paste
- A pinch of chopped parsley
- 30ml of white wine
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Parmesan cheese to sprinkle
- Vegetable oil

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Heat the pan, add oil, sauté onion, mushrooms and garlic.
- 2. Add wine to the pan to deglaze; doing this will lift all the flavours into the dish.

# JOURNEY BACK IN TIME AT THE HISTORY ROOM

The suburb of Manly celebrated its centenary in 1982 with a week of celebrations and the production of a book titled *Mangroves to Moorings*.


Many photographs, maps, articles, newspaper clippings and incidental information was collected by the book's editors, Mervyn and Myrtle Beitz. With the help of the local Rotary Club, a room was made available for storage of this material in the Wynnum Library. The room opened in May 1988 and was called the Merv Beitz Room.

The "Friends" of the new history room decided to form a local historical society, and the Wynnum Manly and District Historical Society came into being in October 1988 with the aim of gathering and recording the area's history before it is lost.

The history society room in the library soon became too small. General meetings were moved upstairs to the community room, then to the former ambulance centre, then the former Baptist Church hall, and finally back to the ambulance museum auditorium.

A research centre opened in 2003 in the former Civic Centre in Bay Terrace, Wynnum. Since 2016 the Society has been based in the former Wynnum Central State School building (now the Wynnum Community Centre), and is open to the public on weekdays from 10am to noon. Here you can join, learn, and contribute to the early history of the Wynnum Manly district.


### WILD SCOTCHMAN AND ST HELENA MOSQUITOES

James MacPherson was not your typical prisoner. A convicted bushranger named The Wild Scotchman, he was sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment. His time in the St Helena Penal Establishment was spent fighting with other prisoners, disobeying orders and attempting to escape.

Yet James also spent his time writing poetry to pass the time. One poem, called St Helena declares: "How wretched are they who are shut up in prison; lying unhappy in the dark night and reflecting on the past life?".

James MacPherson also wrote an epic poem about the mosquitoes that tormented him every night in his prison cell, and anyone who has spent time on St Helena Island in summer will appreciate the accuracy of his words.

...I'm number ten within a den in St Helena's hold. Oppressive heat, I could not sleep, 'twas 'bout the hour of one, No breath of air within my lair, my burning brow to fan. Me thought I heard some raindrops fall, then came a sudden shower; The lightning gleamed in fitful flash, and then it 'gan to pour'. It ceased, me thought I heard a humming sound! I scarce had time to think! They come! They come! Mosquitoes come; through every bar and chink! In, in they pour! Relentless shower! Now comes the tug of war. Now Mars, put on thy helmet bright, Belona mount thy car. This cell shall be my battlefield, I'll fight till dawning day. Aurora with her chariot bright, shall chase them far away. Up from my dungeon floor I sprung and seized a blanket in my hand And scowling round with purpose dire, set on the harpy band. As some strong thresher swings his flail high o'er the ripened corn, So did I fling my blanket round from midnight to morn. Ten thousand bit the dust that night, my blanket still went round.

The original manuscript was typed and made available for publication in the 'Bulletin' by Mrs Moreen Trethewey.

Their wings like chaff about me flew, their corpses strewed the ground....


