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RAISE A GLASS TO THE MANLY HOTEL



It may seem like a long time between drinks thanks to the current lock-down, but the McDonald family marked a milestone in March, celebrating 50 years as custodians of The Manly Hotel.

Birthdays, corporate events, weddings and meals with friends: The Manly Hotel is a much-loved venue where memories are made and good times celebrated.

"The hotel has always been about providing the bayside community with a place to enjoy a drink with friends, have a great meal, and experience some fantastic entertainment and events we put together," said hotelier Sandy McDonald, reflecting on the hotel's iconic place in the community.

Long-time residents may remember the hotel housed the Sea & Steer restaurant in 1976, while the liquor barn was established in 1982, and the beer garden in 1986. Over the years the McDonald family and their dedicated staff members have worked hard to build a business that's more than just a watering hole.

As a kid, the late Stewart McDonald worked in a bakery purchased by his father during the depression. "What he gave us was hard work," said Stewart, who then went on to purchase his first hotel in Esk in 1961, followed by the City View Hotel in Ipswich, Country Club in Strathpine and the Leichardt in Spring Hill. It was 1970, at the age of 60, when Stewart took over The Manly Hotel.



Like many family-operated premises, Stewart and Dulcie passed the licence down to their children. Jenny Bradley, Doug, and Sandy McDonald, still hold the licence today.

According to Sandy McDonald, the continued success of the hotel is thanks to forward thinking and a family of dedicated, loyal staff, many of whom have been employed for more than 35 years. "Fifty years is quite a long time for a business to survive and maintain its relevance to its community," said Sandy.

As a family operated business for 50 years, with a 65-year presence in the Manly Harbour Village, The Manly Hotel has been a long-standing supporter of local sporting groups, schools, fundraisers, charity organisations and events. "We are more than happy to sponsor local events to help give back to the community that supports local business," said Sandy.

The McDonald family would like to thank the community, their loyal customers, and the employees who have contributed to The Manly Hotel's success on this landmark anniversary.

JOAN PEASE'S COMMUNITY UPDATE

STATE MEMBER FOR LYTTON

The Coronavirus pandemic is one of the biggest challenges we've faced as a community for a long time, but thanks to the great work of Queenslanders and Baysiders we've flattened the curve. Thankyou Baysiders, we have done this together.

During this crisis, we've seen the absolute best of Queenslanders. Our healthcare workers have done an amazing job testing, tracing, treating, and quarantining patients. We have one of the highest testing rates in the world and anyone with any symptoms is urged to get a test.

All students are now back at school, but I want to

pay tribute to all the teachers, parents, and kids who embraced learning from home. I also want to thank Baysiders for doing the right thing and following the guidelines. Because of you, we've been able to loosen some rules in line with our Roadmap to easing Queensland's restrictions.

We know how volatile the situation remains, so we need to remain vigilant and make these changes with extreme care. The Premier has made it clear that if there's a new spike in cases then restrictions will be toughened again.

It has been incredibly heart-warming to see how Baysiders have stuck together during this crisis. We've seen local workers raise over \$5000 to help disadvantaged kids learn from home, while lona College and Brisbane Bayside College combined to make personal protective equipment for Queensland Health staff combating the virus.

The Palaszcuk Government is doing everything we can to support Queenslanders during this time. The \$200 utilities rebate is being automatically applied to electricity bills (you can contact your retailer to check when yours will be applied), and we've launched a \$400 million Accelerated Works Program to deliver new roads and bridges across the state and create jobs for Queenslanders.

I'm also proud of our \$1 billion business support package including payroll tax relief, \$500 electricity bill rebates, and grants of up to \$10,000 for small businesses. I've been visiting Bayside business owners with information packs about the loosened restrictions and I've been blown away by their creativity and resilience. I urge everyone to support our fellow Baysiders by always buying local.

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WYNNUM PLAZA DRIVES KINDNESS

Wynnum Plaza has been delivering care packages to people in the community who are struggling to buy essentials during COVID-19, including the elderly, disadvantaged families, and those with a disability.

The care packs contain basic staples including breakfast condiments, bread, eggs, milk, tea and coffee, soap, tissues, hand sanitiser, kitchen wipes, disinfectant sprays, and magazines or puzzle books.

Wynnum Retail Management General Manager Michael Belfield said the care packs are a way for the Centre to give back and support the community during this challenging time.

"We know that our community is doing it tough right now, with many families not being able to afford groceries and some vulnerable groups not being able to leave their homes," Mr Belfield said.

One of the first recipients of the care packs was Lota resident Jo Longley, 62, who is suffering from broken ribs and has been unable to leave her home to collect basic goods.

"When people do lovely things like this it really enforces your faith in the community and the good deeds, and as they say, we are in this together," Jo said.

Wynnum Plaza also arranged for the delivery of free coffee to frontline workers



in the Bayside during the month of May. Recipients included the hard-working teachers at Wynnum State School, and health workers at Baywest Medical Centre.

Wynnum Plaza's care pack and free coffee initiatives were made possible with the support of valuable retailers and partners including Donut King, Taste the Aroma, Michel's Patisserie, Dollar Stretcher, Nextra Wynnum Plaza, St Peter's Anglican Church, Wynnum Baptist Church and the Bayside Patrol Group.

ELECTION RESULTS



The Brisbane City Council election has been finalised.

I ended up with 61% of the vote, after preferences. Only 77.76% of the 28 835 residents on the roll actually voted.

In 2016 it was 86.53% and in 2012 84.55%. I put the 7-9% drop down to people being worried about the Coronavirus which is fair enough. I hope no one gets fined by the Electoral Commission.

In the Mayoral vote in Wynnum Manly Labor's Pat Condren received 51-78% of the vote, but across the City the LNP's Adrian Schrinner received 56.32%.

LOCAL **UPGRADES**



The following park upgrades have been finalised since the election on March 28.

- 1. Moreton Bay Lions Park on Pine Street, Wynnum has been fenced and received a playground upgrade.
- 2. New toilet block next to the Lota PCYC.
- 3. New outdoor gym on the Esplanade opposite Bandstand Park.
- 4. Federation Street, Wynnum West has received a new shade cover.

In addition some local road resurfacing has taken place. Milfoil Street, Manly West from Stannard Rd to Talwong St, was done before the election and Glading Street, Manly West, after the election.

COUNCIL COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE

Council is offering some assistance to community clubs during the lockdown.

The assistance to date is \$5000 towards water bills and lease payments being waived for one quarter.

Credit needs to be given to the management of our local clubs in the Wynnum Manly Ward as none of them seem to be in desperate straits. The clubs I have talked to are Wynnum Golf Club, Bayside United Football, Wynnum Junior Rugby League, Wynnum Rugby Union, Wynnum Vikings Australian Football and Wynnum Croquet Club.

Local restaurants are cautiously opening and I believe most are waiting for the 100 people to be allowed in a venue before fully opening. This is scheduled to be introduced from July 10.

Can anyone who has been lucky enough to keep their job try to support local venues.

COMMUNITY GENEROSITY HELPS SCHOOL KIDS

When schools recently moved to a "learning from home" model due to the Coronavirus pandemic, it was vital to make sure that every family had access to the digital devices and stationery necessary for kids to continue to learn.

Member for Lytton Joan Pease MP said local principals contacted her about some families not having the tools to learn from home.

"We all know the change to learning from home was a heroic effort from teachers, kids, and parents. While the Department of Education provided thousands of additional laptops and devices, there were still some Bayside families going without," explained Ms Pease.

"I reached out to some kind-hearted Baysiders who I thought might be able to help, and their response just blew me away."

Iconic bayside company BMD purchased 12 new laptops for Darling Point Special School and Brisbane Bayside State College. Scott Power, BMD Group Executive Director — Operations, said BMD was delighted to help facilitate learning from home by providing laptops for local students.

"BMD has a strong 40-year history of giving back to our communities and as proud locals in the bayside, we're thrilled to support children at Darling Point Special School and Brisbane Bayside State College during these challenging times," Mr Power said.

Darling Point Special School Principal Charmaine Driver said the laptops helped maintain the critical connection between teachers and students.

"Darling Point Special School students are truly special but as the school community grappled

with connecting with children and families in isolation, digital devices suddenly became essential," said Ms Driver.

"To the rescue came BMD and Joan Pease. Quicker than Superman can fly across town arrived six brand spanking new laptops." At the same time a major fundraising effort was getting under way, led by Tingalpa local Peter Bruekers. "Peter works at the Port of Brisbane, and together with his fellow Maritime Union members he raised a staggering \$5300 for the kids," Ms Pease said.

Donations also came from Fielders Club Tingalpa, Wynnum Haulage, newsXpress Wynnum, and Wynnum North Newspower. The epic fundraising effort gave Bayside schools 25 electronic tablets for disadvantaged kids, \$1500 worth of stationery vouchers for families to use at local newsagents, and mobile broadband dongles and data for families without internet at home.

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

LOCAL TRIVIA

Queensland's first amusement park was built in Hemmant in 1889 (now known as Queensport Rocks Park, Murrarie). The Queensport Aquarium was home to seals, sharks, tigers, exotic birds and reptiles, and featured a 1400-seat concert hall. Visitors would arrive from Brisbane City via steamer. A flood in 1893 destroyed its fences and subsequently, the tourist site was used as a dance hall until 1901.

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OCEAN CRUSADERS CLEANING STATION SYSTEM (A)

You've probably seen the Ocean Crusaders' boxes dotted along the Esplanade. Here Ocean Crusaders founder lan Thomson explains how to access the boxes and help marine and bird life.

Did you know that local charity Ocean Crusaders created a cleaning system for the foreshore? No, it isn't some magical device that cleans up after us, it actually encourages the community to clean up on their daily walks.

Having seen the amount of debris left along the foreshore on a regular basis, the plan was concocted to create a cabinet where people could gain access to cleaning equipment to make the job easier. After receiving a grant through the Brisbane City Council's Lord Mayor's Grants, the system was installed and up and running in January 2019.

The cabinets are in locations from Lota through to Wynnum Creek and you can access them through a website www.OceanCrusaders.org/ CSS. Fill out the form and you will be emailed back immediately with a code to give you access. You then collect rubbish on your walk and can drop the equipment back in the same cabinet or in any other cabinet.

Each week they are cleaned out and an audit done by the Ocean Crusaders team. Statistics are being gathered to create source reduction schemes with the idea to eventually make the cabinets obsolete.

In 2019, 182 people signed up for the program and removed over 500kg of rubbish from the foreshore. Now more people are using the system and the foreshore is becoming one of the cleanest places to visit in Queensland. However, it takes everyone to play their part, so make sure you leave nothing behind when you visit the foreshore, and if you're taking a walk, why not pick up a set of tongs and a bag and pick up anything you see? Together we can ensure our marine and birdlife are safe from marine debris.

INTRODUCING OZFISH

This local group is working hard to recycle oyster shells, which is great news for seafood lovers, and anyone who loves to fish.

OzFish Unlimited is Australia's only recreational fishing conservation organisation committed to restoring fish habitat. Our local OzFish chapter is currently involved in a project to recycle oyster shells collected from oyster farmers, wholesale oyster handlers and restaurants.

President of the Central Moreton Chapter, Robbie Porter, explains that shellfish do a great service to our community and environment as they increase fish numbers, biodiversity, improve water quality and help combat climate change.

Unfortunately, oysters have been overfished since European settlement. Many were harvested for food but the majority were harvested for the lime in their shells, which is used to make cement for the building industry. Now in many places like Moreton Bay, shellfish reefs are considered functionally extinct.

Functional reefs produce 2.5-ton of harvestable seafood per hectare per year, which benefits communities with better (and more) seafood.

Amazingly, each adult oyster can filter 180 litres of sea water per day. This cleans our waters and lowers turbidity. They sequester

suspended sediment, micro plastics and chemicals including nitrogen and carbon. The clearer water encourages sea grass and corals to grow due to increased light availability. This helps marine animals, including dugongs and turtles, by giving them food and habitat. The community gets the benefit of clearer and cleaner water.

Restoring shellfish reefs greatly increases biodiversity as the reef provides shelter, breeding sites and food for a vast array of invertebrate and fish species.

"We are currently recovering over 100 cubic metres of shell per year that would otherwise be dumped as landfill," explained Robbie.


"There is an estimated 200 cubic metres of additional shell produced in Brisbane each year that we hope to recover and use for shellfish reef restoration projects," said Robbie.

"Oyster shell has a chemical signature favoured as a host site for shellfish spat, which makes it the ideal substrate to create shellfish reef. The shell is pre-treated to eliminate any bio-security risks before being formed into modular structures and installed in the waterway."

Chances are you'll see Robbie and the OzFish volunteers collecting shells from your local seafood restaurant. If you'd like to help make Moreton Bay healthier, go to ozfish.org.au for more information.

BOURBON & CHIPOTLE OYSTER RECIPE

Our bourbon & chipotle oysters are converters of die-hard Kilpatrick fans and self-proclaimed non-oyster eaters alike. Even purists from The Church of Au Naturel take pleasure in slurping these back by the dozen.

INGREDIENTS

- 500g butter, softened
- ½ cup your favourite bourbon
- 170g tinned chipotle in adobo sauce (or half of a 12oz. tin)
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- 1 head of garlic (12-15 cloves)

METHOD

- 1. In a food processor, combine sugar, bourbon, garlic and chipotle.
- 2. Blitz until smooth.
- 3. Add butter and process until combined.
- 4. Heat the grill to medium. Scrunch up alfoil on baking tray and arrange oysters on top. Place about 1 teaspoon of butter mixture on each oyster.

5. Grill oysters until butter is melted and sugar is beginning to caramelise, about 2-3 minutes.

To really chef it up, finish with a creme brulee torch. The butter mixture keeps in the fridge for two weeks, although, we doubt it will last that long. Eat bourbon and chipotle oysters with a light red, or try the butter on butterflied prawns on the barbie.

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WYNNUM'S TREES LIGHT UP THE NIGHT

With so many regular local events cancelled this year, there is light at end of the tunnel: Wynnum Manly Events Incorporated (WMEI) is behind a shining initiative to light up Wynnum's trees.

June heralds the start of winter veggie season, so now's the time to plant your patch in preparation for a bumper harvest.

In Brisbane, try growing beetroot, broccoli, cauliflower, peas, carrots, silverbeet, radishes, onions, lettuce, broad beans and most herbs.

Spero Kartanos has been fishing in local waters for 45 years. Here's his rundown on what fish you can expect to see this time of year, and where to catch them.

Winter is upon us and the fishing is as good as it gets, especially for our school mackerel, which are all over the bay at the moment.

Broad mackerel are also showing up early this year between King Island and Green Island, out to Hope Banks and out towards Peel Island. As we go further into winter the area north-west of the Lazaret Gutter at Peel is a spot worth a troll with diving boards and three-inch spoons. And if you don't like to troll, a pilly floated out on threeganged hooks will get you a fish or two, and a little burly helps to attract them close behind the boat. Remember, no wire traces in the bay, it just does not help get you fish!

Winter whiting are starting to show up on the Maroom side of the Rous Channel all the way to the Maroom Gutter, with blood worm strips of squid or peeled prawns being the best bait (and you can't go past a paternoster rig).

For all your local fishing needs, Water Tower Bait and Tackle on Manly Road carry most of the fishing items I use, and they have updated information about where to find fish.
