When Little Gnome Bookshop's Bel Ellis decided to enter the renowned outback driving adventure, there was only one problem: she didn't have a car.

"Tony Piccardi, from Piccardi Fry Legal came along and said 'I have a rusty old 1979 Mercedes you can use,'" explained Bel.

"No less than 12 of our awesome customers put their hands up and volunteered to be the Little Gnome Pit Crew, or the 'Pitties' as I came to call them. The car was moved to Peter and Daphne Stringfellow's home

Wynnum will take centre stage when the inaugural Wynnum Fringe hits the suburban streets with a stellar lineup of local talent from 13 to 15 November 2020.

Wynnum-based producer, performing artist, actor and singer Tom Oliver is the creative mind behind the three-day fringe festival, which aims to shine a spotlight on the arts and invigorate the bayside area. The initial acts include more than 24 ticketed and free performances with more shows to be announced soon.

Mr Oliver said he was thrilled by the tsunami of support and interest that saw hundreds of Australian performers from all disciplines apply for slots on the Wynnum Fringe program.

"This year's lineup has a fantastic mix of renowned and emerging talent from Brisbane, Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast, which is perfect for a bold new festival which will light up a stunning seaside town. We've got pretty much every genre covered – dance, circus, cabaret, comedy, theatre, music and art," Mr Oliver said.

Edith Street will be the heart of the festival, a pedestrian playground allowing patrons to coast between three zones spanning multiple venues, food trucks, outdoor bars, art installations and pop-up performances.

The ticketed venues will also showcase the unique character of this seaside locale from musical cabaret at Wynnum Opera House, a historic church, and comedy and theatre at the old church hall (dubbed Winston ChurchHall) to circus acts in Mrs Quinn's Carpark and dance performances at Kellehers Dance Academy.

In conjunction with the ticketed shows, Wynnum Fringe will showcase free alfresco performances, thanks to Arts Queensland's Open Air Funding program.

The open-air Main Stage on Edith Street will play host to various musical acts, while the Salvos Loading Dock moonlights as an intimate performance space. Shows at these outdoor venues will also be live-streamed.

The diverse program promises an array of home-grown talent and internationally renowned acts. Award-winning comedian Damien

Power brings his swagger to the stage; Bree Tipoki presents the songs of Diona Ross in Little Diana; Bee Gees drummer Colin Petersen (the first non-Gibb to become an equal member of the Bee Gees) invites you to spend the afternoon with him; Winner of Channel 7's All Together Now, Lai Utovou will bring the funk on Friday night and Mario Queen of the Circus blends circus artistry and comedic timing in homage to Freddie Mercury as the host of Dionysus.

Mr Oliver hopes Wynnum Fringe will be an immersive portal for escapism and wonder where audiences can be inspired, entertained, and moved by talented performers, musicians and artists.



PETER CUMMING'S LOCAL AREA UPDATE

COUNCILLOR FOR WYNNUM MANLY WARD

UPGRADING FACILITIES

My office has funds available for expenditure on upgrading facilities at any local clubs that lease their premises from Council.

The idea is that the money would be spent quickly to provide local employment.

I have decided solar power and LED lighting would be worthwhile areas of expenditure. The groups selected to benefit to date are:

- Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre
- Bayside United Football Club
- Wynnum Manly Junior RLFC
- Wynnum Lawn Tennis Association

The Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre has no solar panels but substantial electricity costs. The centre has around 14 activities available to the public and electricity costs are a major part of their overheads. The centre is run entirely by volunteers as are all the other groups selected. Bayside United Football Club is to get solar panels to cover the costs of running freezers and refrigerators in its clubhouse.

Wynnum Junior Rugby League is looking to get their solar system repaired and expanded to cover electricity costs of the clubhouse.

Wynnum Tennis has plenty of solar capacity but is looking to expand the number of LED lights they have on their courts.

I wish these clubs the best of success with these projects.

40 K/HR SPEED LIMIT FOR THE ESPLANADE, MANLY?

I have been told by a Council contractor that a 40k/hr speed limit has been proposed for the Esplanade at Manly, between Nelson Parade and Benalla Street.

This would be a reduction from the current 50k/hr.

This section of the esplanade has large numbers of pedestrians crossing to visit the walking path along the Esplanade, various food and beverage outlets as well as access to Cambridge Parade. Also there are Jan Power Markets held twice a month and Manly Harbour Village Chamber of Commerce organised Manly Creative Markets every Sunday in Little Bayside Park.

I am seeking feedback on whether local residents want the change in speed limit.

The area is heavily pedestrianised on weekends, public holidays and school holidays, but is not as busy during the week.

In the interests of pedestrian safety, I am generally supportive of the proposed change.

What do you think?



SUNDAY SAILING WITH WYNNUM MANLY SAILING CLUB

Discover your sea legs and set sail for an afternoon of fun-filled competition and friendship with SAGS.

Sunday Afternoon Go Sailing (SAGS) is a fun event open to all members and visitors of the Wynnum Manly Sailing Club, running most Sunday afternoons throughout the year with a summer break from late December to late January.

On average, about 15 yachts compete in a friendly race of about two-and-a-half hours on Moreton Bay, starting and finishing off Manly Harbour. There are prizes for the first three yachts over the finish line, and a seasonal trophy.

"The nice thing about this event is that skippers and crew of all levels of experience can compete against each other in a friendly but still competitive way enabling them to improve their skills," explained long-term SAGS participant Fred Cramer.

"Spinnakers are not allowed, except for about three Sundays a year to enable crews to improve their skills in that area as well if they desire to do so. Everybody agrees that this is an ideal way to meet people and make new friends," said Mr Cramer.

Participants meet before each race to register, then come back to the clubhouse after the race to sign off and enjoy a drink with their peers.

"Every week we welcome visitors who like to come for a sail, experienced and starting sailors alike," said Mr Cramer.

"We will assign you to a skipper and we notice that most of the time visitors will join the rest of the crew after the race in the clubhouse. Many visitors have become regular crew members."

SEAGULLS CELEBRATE IMPRESSIVE GRAND FINAL WIN

Wynnum Manly Seagulls centre Junior Pauga has a smile from ear to ear after scoring a try in Wynnum Manly Junior's emphatic 41-6 victory over the West Brisbane Tigers in the Brisbane Rugby League A-Grade Grand Final.

Pauga was one of three players, including Max Elliott and Harrison Graham, from the Wynnum Manly Seagulls' Intrust Super Cup squad to play in the Brisbane Rugby League A-Grade grand final.

The contribution of the trio was enormous in the 35-point victory with Elliott crossing for two tries and Pauga scoring one.

Despite the score line, Pauga believe the team had to work for the win.

"I knew that it was going to be a hard game, but we had a game plan; we stuck to it and came out on top in the end," he said following the match.

Elliott was stellar, producing his typical workman like performance mixed in with a bit of x-factor, when he barreled over from close to the line with defenders hanging on for his first try and then putting the game beyond doubt with a second late in the game.

Graham, the Iona College graduate and product of the vaunted Seagulls Academy, was everywhere on the ground and his defence was relentless.

When the Panthers made a break early in the second half to mount a comeback, Graham was one of the Gulls leading the chase to bring him down.

After the Wynnum Manly Seagulls Seniors won the BRL A-Grade titles in 2018 and 2019, the Wynnum Manly Juniors' victory this season makes it a 'three peat' of sorts that the Bayside can celebrate.



NEW OYSTER WASHER TO TRIPLE SHELL RECYCLING

A new oyster shell washing plant is now in operation at the Port of Brisbane to boost shellfish reef restoration efforts.

The washer will be used for washing and preparing shells recovered from Brisbane restaurants, pubs and professional shuckers to be reused to restore shellfish reefs of Moreton Bay. The facility is the work of the local Moreton Bay Chapter of OzFish Unlimited – Australia's fishing conservation charity.

OzFish Unlimited SEQ Project Officer Robbie Porter said the washer would speed up work that previously had been done by hand by OzFish volunteers and was vital in regenerating the lost shellfish reefs.

"Shellfish reefs are Moreton Bay's unsung hero," he said. "Oysters and mussels clean the water, increase fish stocks, and improve marine biodiversity in our bay.

"Sadly, we have lost 95% of these precious reefs

in Moreton Bay and they need our help to return.

"Recycled oyster shell makes the perfect building blocks for reef restoration. They create new homes for baby oysters and provide habitat and food for many other marine species."

OzFish volunteers of recreational anglers have been collecting and cleaning oyster shells for over two years and have diverted 100 cubic metres of used shell that would have otherwise gone into landfill. Some of the recycled shells have already been given a new home in a trial restoration site on Pumicestone Passage.

"The oyster shells must be sterilised and washed before we can use them in restoration work as they have come from all over Australia and may contain unwanted pests," Mr Porter said.

Federal Member for Bonner, Ross Vasta, helped secure a funding grant through the Australian Government Communities Environments Program for the OzFish fish habitat restoration project.

"With so many shells to wash, this machine will make it faster and easier. It will also do a much better job of washing them than we have been able to do by hand," Mr Porter said. This business is something they would usually outsource overseas, but they utilised the Instant Asset Write Off to bring





this particular service back to Australia with jobs for Australians.

This Budget is creating jobs, it's growing our economy, and this is what the LNP does.

THE SURVIVORS **BY JANE HARPER**

The Survivors is the compelling new novel from Jane Harper, the New York Times bestselling author of The Dry.

Kieran Elliott's life changed forever on the day a reckless mistake led to devastating consequences. The guilt that still haunts him resurfaces during a visit with his young family to the small coastal community he once called home. Kieran's parents are struggling in a town where fortunes are forged by the sea. Between them all is his absent brother, Finn. When a body is discovered on the beach, long-held secrets threaten to emerge. A sunken wreck, a missing girl, and questions that have never washed away.

This is the fourth book from Harper and it retains all the suspense of her first novel, The Dry. For me, The Dry was her best book and I thought she lost some of that evocative descriptive writing of the Aussie outback in her next two

novels. The shift to a coastal town was just what was needed and she has nailed it once again! You really get a sense of the landscape she is writing about. That's an element of her writing that I'm most drawn to. For crime writing, Jane Harper is certainly up there with the best of them.



CYPRUS MAN FUNDRAISES FOR COAST GUARD BOAT


Brisbane Coast Guard has been touched by the generosity and spirit of a man who reached out to us to commemorate the life of his late wife. David Coppin, an 81-year-old man from Cyprus lost his beloved wife, Gwyneth Eileen, in 2018. Gwyneth was a lifelong supporter of the lifeboat service in the United Kingdom.

Gwyneth's grandson and two great-grandchildren live in Ipswich. David reached out to the Brisbane Coast Guard in late 2018 and learned that it costs well over \$600,000 to fund a primary rescue vessel. David decided that he was going to honour his late wife by walking 1700 km from Brisbane to Cairns, in order to raise funds towards a new rescue vessel that could be named in honour of Gwyneth.

David had planned to come to Australia to walk from Brisbane to Cairns. Due to COVID, and because of international travel restrictions, it was mutually agreed that the walk would continue in Cyprus instead.

On 1 July, 2020, David began his 1700 km walk. However, eight days into his walk David had an accident and broke his patella. After a break for rehab, he has amazingly recommenced walking. David has walked 670 kilometres so far, an average of just over 19 kilometres per day.





LOCAL HISTORY

LOVE, DEATH AND MARRIAGE ON A PRISON ISLAND

BY BELINDA DALY, THE ST HELENA ISLAND COMMUNITY

St Helena Island's prison ruins conjure up stories of escapes from desperate prisoners and the hardships endured by their confines over 65 years. But what about the prison warders, their wives and children, who also lived out their lives on the beautiful but isolated island?

New research on the St Helena Penal Establishment is uncovering this previously unspoken social history. On St Helena Island, dormitory style barracks housed the majority of warders, but the 14 warders most envied were those that were allocated a married cottage, allowing their family to join them permanently on St Helena.

It seems the foundations of life – love, death and marriage – were a core part of this small warder community. Exploring documents related to these three areas has been the entry point into finding the connections between families and the place they inhabited. New discoveries show eight more deaths and six burials of warders' children in the island cemetery than have been previously realised, as the headstones are long gone.

To date, five young women, the daughters of warders and trade instructors living with their families on St Helena, are known to have met their future husband amongst the ranks of the St Helena warders. Within the families, 25 children are confirmed as having been born on the island, but gaps in our research mean another 50 are on the 'potential' list.

Piecing together St Helena's families is painstaking, a combination of focussed research and the luck of meeting ancestors with memories and family lore to share. If you have a familial connection with the warders of St Helena Island, please get in touch, so we can repopulate the island's history with the stories of forgotten families.

FISHING THE BAY WITH SPERO

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos shares his knowledge of Moreton Bay to help you bring home a bounty of seafood this month.

What a year so far, AFL finals in Queensland and Melbourne Cup with no people, bring on 2021! At least the fishing has not changed with plenty of fish in the Bay and a great start to the sand crab season, so as the song goes, forget your worries and go catch a fish for dinner.

Whiting are in big numbers in the Small Boat Channel – as they are every year at this time, with plenty of fisherman (and the little ones) catching a nice bag of fish - but please handscale your whiting and don't drag them at a great rate of knots in a bag to scale them. I'm pretty sure you don't need to pulverize the flesh to soften them, and they will be firmer and nicer to eat (just my opinion).

School mackerel will be hit and miss this time of year as the water warms; they are around all year in the Bay these days, but be prepared to not find them as prevalent as they have been. Closer in is where they seem to congregate in November. To the north of the Lazaret Gutter is a good spot to

find them, and Halco lures (3-inch) are the way to go and Smith jigs in chrome and white have been working very well, so let's hope the spotty mackerel decide to enter the Bay this year in bigger numbers than in the last two years.

The crabbing season is in full swing and from all reports in October, November should be firing up with plenty in the Bay, close in both sides of the leads at the boat harbor, and close in around the Bay Islands, with plenty of bull sharks in the same area.

I love this time of year for snapper and squire in the artificial reefs and shallow reefs around the Bay Islands, and as the weather is warmer it's much easier to get up pre-dawn and to fish in the late afternoon without freezing your fingers and toes off, and there will be plenty of fish around .

The whale season was a little disappointing with only a few in the Bay, but for the ones that we managed to see, it was an absolute joy - let's hope 2021 is better with a few big pods like we saw in 2018.

PENNE AMATRICIANA RECIPE

CONTRIBUTED BY THE MANLY HOTEL

This is an easy to make recipe that's a real crowd-pleaser. Slow cooking the sauce really intensifies the flavour, so consider making this in a slow cooker. SERVES 8, GENEROUSLY!



INGREDIENTS

- 100ml extra virgin olive oil
- 2kg diced bacon or lardons
- 2kg crushed tomatoes
- 2 red onions, finely diced
- 50g garlic cloves, finely chopped • 1kg dried penne pasta

METHOD

- · Fry onions and garlic in olive oil until onions are clear.
- Separately, fry off the bacon and drain the liquid, then add to the onions.
- In a blender or with hand blender, blitz together wine, rosemary and oregano, until herbs are finely chopped. Then combine into onion mixture thoroughly.
- Cook down for 15 to 30 minutes, until the wine is reduced by half, and the alcohol content is burnt off.
- · Add tomatoes and chilli paste and mix thoroughly.
- Bring to the boil and simmer on a very low heat for 6 to 8 hours, stirring occasionally.
- Season as required with salt and pepper.
- · Cook pasta as per packet instructions, in salted boiling water.

To serve, drain the pasta and toss through the heated sauce. Garnish with fresh chopped parsley and/or parmesan cheese

THE BEAUTIFICATION OF AN ICONIC TRAIN STATION

Wynnum Central Train Station has been identified by Wynnum Manly Events Incorporated (WMEI) as needing beautification as the rear facades of a number of old unsightly buildings back onto the station, and this is the rail gateway to Wynnum Central and the foreshore.

A proposal was presented by WMEI to Joan Pease MP and Cr Peter Cumming to fund a mural to cover some of this rear facade interface. WMEI prepared a number of artwork submissions and in consultation with Joan and Peter, came up with the final artwork for the mural.

The building owners have been very supportive of the endeavour and allowed us to apply the mural on a frame to the rear of the buildings. Queensland Rail has permitted access via the rail line land to repair and install the mural which will be erected after four years in late November.

The outcome will be an inspiring snapshot of imagery of the Wynnum foreshore, showing its unique allure and telling the story of Wynnum Manly's point of difference in being "Brisbane's Seaside" (WMEI's trademark tag line).

It is hoped that the success of this initial project will lead to further reactivation of the rear facades facing the Wynnum Central Station making it a postcard station project for Brisbane. Hopefully we can continue the project.

You may have also seen the *Wynnum–Brisbane's Seaside* bumper stickers on cars, which was part of the 2013 brand update collateral, with the colour band also installed on the Manly Water Tower.



INTERNATIONALLY-ACCLAIMED Local Artist on Show

International exhibiting Wynnum artist Graham W. Smith has mounted a solo exhibition entitled Wynnum & Beyond at the Wynnum Library from October 12 until November 30.

Graham, who is a Fellow of Royal Queensland Art Society and a Master Pastellist, was invited to exhibit in at the 2018 and 2019 Fabriano in Aquarello exhibitions in Fabriano, Italy, along with artists from 70 countries displaying over 1400 watercolours. In 2018 Graham completed 50 works while in Italy including a commission.

Graham's new exhibition will feature oils, acrylics, pastels and watercolours depicting local scenes, and also works from Italy, Thailand and around Australia.

A well-known identity in the art world, Graham has appeared on local television via the program Arts Masterclass. He also hosted a two-minute twice weekly arts segment on BayFM radio in 2009 and was a monthly columnist for the Australian Artist magazine for five years, with his last article published in March 2020. In 2000 Government House Queensland commissioned Graham to paint six watercolours for their permanent collection. Last year Graham donated 10 paintings to St. Vincent's Hospital at Kangaroo Point, and donated artworks to Vinnies Boutique in Edith St, Wynnum.

Having created over 3000 paintings and hundreds of plein air sketches, Graham often donates his time for demonstrations to charitable entities to give back to the community.
