COUNCIL INVESTS IN MANLY VILLAGE REVITALISATION

Work is underway to revitalise Manly Harbour Village, which is one of 10 suburban strip upgrades to be delivered as part of Brisbane City Council's \$10.5 million Village Precinct Projects.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the \$890,000 restoration would boost the seaside precinct, which was renowned for its charm and vibrant entertainment, dining and retail offerings.

"Suburban shopping precincts like Manly Harbour Village are the beating hearts of neighbourhoods and places where people can connect with their community and gain a sense of community pride and ownership," Cr Schrinner said.

"As part of this Village Precinct Project transformation, we're making them more attractive places to shop, dine and relax in with improvements including new street furniture, lush greenery and art installations.

"These upgrades are more than just a facelift; they're about supporting businesses through COVID-19 by increasing foot traffic and luring in new visitors to an area, with retailers telling us they've boosted business."

Construction on the Manly Harbour Village Precinct Project is underway and is expected to be complete by the end of 2021.

Coordinating the vigil is a collaborative effort, with many of our local organisations and people playing a part including the Rotary Club of Wynnum Manly, Winnam Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders Corporation, Scope Club of Wynnum, BABI Youth and Family Service, Wynnum Police, Councillor Peter Cumming and Bayside East Zonta Club.

We heard from Zoe Sullivan and Jo Jackson, both domestic violence survivors. The vigil was attended by people from many different walks of life, both young and old, united in support of all those who have experienced the devastating effects of domestic violence.

VIBRANT SMALL BUSINESSES

CRAFT BEER AND ARTISAN LIQUOR LICENSES

The Palaszczuk Government recognises that the thriving artisan liquor industry is supporting thousands of jobs across our state. That's why we have introduced a special new license to support the industry and enable the artisan liquor business to flourish. We are lucky to have one of these businesses in our local area — Hudsons Brewery on Gibbs St. If you haven't been there yet, I strongly recommend stopping by!

The new Artisan Liquor license is now live for applications. We have already seen 13 brand new producers and 34 existing businesses apply for the license. Benefits of the new licence include: no limit to how much of their own product can be sold on their premises; an option to showcase and sell samples of their product at promotional events such as farmer's markets; and the ability to sell their product as takeaway, including online.

Sadly, the indomitable Miss Handley OAM has passed away. Miss Handley was a much-loved local pioneer and educator of young



women in the Bayside. She was an innovative trailblazer, enriching young girls' worlds by introducing them to ideas and ideals, and exposing them to cultural pursuits. 

ALL ABOUT ARTHRITIS IN CATS

We are very used to considering the possibility of arthritis occurring in our ageing dogs but what about our feline friends? Ageing cats can develop arthritis which can lead to decreased mobility and pain.

The symptoms of arthritis in cats:

- · overall stiffness or lameness in one or more joints
- swelling of joints
- lethargy
- decreased activity
- toileting in unusual places
- reluctance to jump on or off furniture or climb stairs
- increased vocalisation
- matted coat, especially around the hindquarters


What treatment is available for arthritic cats?

 Your vet may prescribe pain medications for your cat. It is recommended that blood tests to check kidney and liver function be performed prior to starting some pain medications.

- There are a variety of options for pain relief including liquid medications administered orally or transdermal medications which can be applied to the skin in less co-operative patients!
- Nutritional supplements. The use of products including Seaflex and Antinol can help to improve your cat's joint health.

What can I do to help my arthritic cat?

- Provide a blanket or bed for them to sleep on.
- Some (not all!) cats will allow some gentle massage which helps to relieve the muscle tension which can occur as the result of sore joints.
- Keep your cat well groomed arthritic cats are not always able to self-groom and may develop matted fur.
- Ensure litter trays are low sided and easy to access and food and water bowls are provided at a height which your cat can easily reach.
- Make sure your cat is not carrying extra weight. An overweight cat has a greater load to carry around on already sore joints.



Have a chat with your vet to develop a management plan if you suspect that your cat is becoming arthritic.





FEDERAL BUDGET 2021-22 — WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU?

FUEL SECURITY PACKAGE LOCKS IN THE AMPOL REFINERY LYTTON

As part of the Budget, the Morrison Government announced a fuel security package, enforcing its commitment to the refining sector.

This package locks in the future of our refining sector at the Ampol refinery in Lytton, which is one of only two refineries across the country supporting the operation.

I was joined by the Prime Minister and Minister for Energy and Emissions Reduction The Hon Angus Taylor MP for the announcement at the Lytton refinery. Having our fuel security on shore and localised to areas which can best deliver, means we are protecting 550 local jobs in Bonner, giving certainty to key industries, and bolstering our national security.

MINISTER FOR WOMEN'S SAFETY VISITS BONNER

Recently, Minister for Women's Safety and Minister for Families and Social Services, Senator the Hon Anne Ruston visited the Bonner electorate to bring attention at a local level to our Government's agenda when it comes to women's safety ahead of the delivery of the Budget.

The Senator's visit was timely as the month of May marked Queensland Domestic and Family Violence Prevention Month. As part of the visit, I hosted a pre-Budget Women in Business breakfast event at the Wynnum Golf Club where I was able to sponsor six students from Brisbane Bayside State College, Moreton Bay College and Wynnum High to come along and hear from Senator Ruston.

Following this, the Senator and I attended a roundtable I had convened at Beyond DV's centre. During Treasurer Josh Frydenberg's Budget delivery speech, he reiterated the urgency of domestic violence response and prevention, with this year's Budget containing a historic \$1 billion for women's safety measures.

The visit provided a meaningful opportunity for Senator Ruston and I to hear from survivors of domestic violence and listen the needs of the community when it comes to women's safety.

LOCAL ARTISTS BOND THROUGH SHARED TRAGEDY

Natalie Lynch of Manly West and Donna Butler of Birkdale first met in December 2020, in a coffee shop in Manly at a function organised by First Light Widowed Association. Upon meeting they soon discovered that as well as being young widows, both shared a passion for art.

Brisbane-born Natalie has lived in the bayside area since she married a 'southsider' in 1986. She worked at Wynnum High School and Moreton Bay College as an art teacher before starting her own business teaching art classes and art therapy to adults.

"I started Studio Yellow as a direct response to the tragedy of losing my husband to suicide in 2009," explained Natalie.

"His passing made me realise how vital it is for us all to nurture our mental health. After years of teaching children and teenagers, I now teach adults how to find the confidence they need to dabble in art and enjoy the healing benefits of a creative hobby."

Donna only returned home to Queensland in January 2020. Born in Mackay, Donna moved to England in November 1998 and was married soon after. Donna spent 12 years in the UK followed by 10 years in Asia, Singapore and Hong Kong, but after her husband was diagnosed with incurable cancer, they decided it was important that Donna and their children move back to Australia.

"We knew I would need the support of my family to get through the months ahead," said Donna.

"My energy is now focused on healing myself and others by making Donna Butler Art, which allows the imagination to find its own path. Natalie's friendship at this time in my life has been an inspiration."





WORLD-CLASS OLYMPIC WINTER TRAINING FACILITY OPENS AT SLEEMAN SPORTS COMPLEX

A new world-class Olympic winter training facility has opened at the Sleeman Sports Complex in Chandler.

The Geoff Henke Olympic Winter Training Centre is the Southern Hemisphere's only all-year outdoor water ski ramp, elevating the aspirations of athletes for generations to come.

The Commonwealth Government contributed \$5.3 million towards construction of the \$6.5 million facility, in collaboration with the Queensland Government, the Australian Olympic Committee and the Olympic Winter Institute of Australia.

Federal Member for Bonner Ross Vasta MP said he was thrilled to see the opening of the centre, with Bonner becoming home to these athletes ahead of the 2022 Winter Olympics.

"To compete on a world stage, our Australian athletes need to be at the top of their game. With this new centre, athletes now have access to the facilities they need, that previously never existed in this part of the world," Mr Vasta said.

"The idea for this facility has been more than a decade in the making. All levels of Government have worked together to deliver

on Geoff Henke's incredible vision for this centre and ensure the ongoing support of our athletes.

"This will well and truly be a game-changer for the future of Australian winter sport and the generations of elite athletes to come."

Minister for Sport, Richard Colbeck, said "The Morrison Government is right behind the bid to bring the 2032 Summer Olympics and Paralympics to Brisbane, but right now we're delivering a world-class facility to our Aussie Winter Olympians".

"Australia has long enjoyed success in aerial ski disciplines, from Alisa Camplin's historic Olympic gold medal in 2002, through to the success this year of aerial ski world champion Laura Peel and Crystal Globe winner Matt Graham, in the moguls," Minister Colbeck said.

The facility boasts varying levels of difficulty making it a fitting training venue for athletes eager to hone their skills and one day represent Australia on the world stage.

Athletes can reach speeds of more than 70km/h and launch up to 17m above the water from the top of the 37m ramp. It allows trainees to test and perfect manoeuvres safely before transitioning to snow.

JUNE FISHING ON MORETON BAY WITH SPERO

BY SPERO KARTANOS

June is upon us and apart from the cold nights and early mornings, the days are normally glorious with calm winds and beautiful sunrises and sunsets, and the fishing is very good!

The tiger squid will slow a little in the shallows but the good news is the ugly ones (i.e. cuttlefish) and arrow squid start coming into the bay. These are a little different to catching tiger squid as they tend to be in the deeper water, anywhere from 20 to 35ft wide of Ormiston all the way to St Helena, and I for one love the taste of cuttlefish. Only one problem: they are the messiest of all to bring on the boat as they have the capacity to hold water and are able to squirt the ink forwards and backwards, so your chance of getting inked is very high. A couple of things that will help is a stainless steel pot with a lid to put them in as you catch them, and a round large stainless steel tray to clean them in.

The method I use is the same jigs as we use to catch the tigers, but add a ball sinker above the jig to get to the bottom and then just raise it a foot or two. Drifting is the way I fish for them, and the other thing is cuttlefish grab the jig from the middle and sometimes are hard to hook, so the razor jigs from Jarvis Walker are worth having on the boat as they have prongs on the back as well. Of course the arrow squid are in the same area and depth; they're tender and sweet, and are great for stuffing, but please don't remove the skin and if possible clean them in sea water.

The school mackerel will be throughout the bay and once you find them. anchor up and float out pillies but be careful as this is the best way to get stitches or a hook through some part of your body.


Winter whiting will be in full swing, especially around the Amity Banks, Fisherman's Gutter and around the eastern banks at the Rous Channel.

The squire and snapper started in the bay last month and June is a great month for these beautiful tasting fish around the Bay Islands and artificial reefs.

TORTA BISCOTTO GELATO RECIPE

INGREDIENTS (SERVES 6)

- 2 litre tub of stracciatella gelato (choc chip) or any other gelato flavour you like
- 250g flour
- 125g butter
- 100g icing sugar

- 15g cocoa powder
- 62g whole eggs
- 12g egg yolk
- 4g baking powder

METHOD

COOKIE BASE/TOP

- 1. Start by mixing butter, icing sugar, eggs and yolks, flour, cocoa powder, baking powder in a bowl until you have a soft dough.
- 2. Put the mixture in the fridge for three hours.
- 3. Remove from the fridge. Roll the dough with a "mattarello" (rolling pin), then make two discs (the same size) 2mm thick.
- 4. Use a fork to poke holes in the dough, then place in the oven on a baking tray lined with baking paper at 250 degrees for five minutes
- 5. When cold, put one cookie base on the bottom, then fill with the gelato, and cover with the second cookie disc.
- 6. Put it in the freezer for 15 minutes to set, then enjoy!



THE HISTORY OF TINGALPA'S TWO HOTELS

FROM JILL GREENHILL, WYNNUM MANLY HISTORICAL SOCIETY INC.



The Royal Mail Hotel, Tingalpa, 1908.

Tingalpa hotel number 1.

This hotel was located at the junction of Old Cleveland Road and Mt Gravatt — Capalaba Road, Capalaba. Surveyor, David Warner in 1863 set out the "Town of Tingalpa" on the northern bank of Tingalpa Creek, where the track from Brisbane to Cleveland (Old Cleveland Road) met the track from Ipswich to Cleveland (Mt Gravatt — Capalaba Road) in Capalaba.

This was in the days when Cleveland, and not Brisbane, was being considered as the location for the Port for Queensland. This location was chosen for the Town of Tingalpa as here, there was a shallow ford to allow easier crossing of Tingalpa Creek. The roads can still be traced out today.

Here, in the mid 1860's James Murray was operating an unlicensed "grog-shanty" on the corner of Old Cleveland Road and the Ipswich track. In 1872 Robert Murray applied for, "a country publican's license to be able to sell fermented and spirituous liquors in premises, at the Tingalpa Hotel at the Tingalpa Creek crossing." (Brisbane Courier 30.05.1872).

The ford over the Tingalpa creek was replaced with a bridge in 1874.

This spurred on the development and settlement of the lands south of the Creek. Tingalpa Hotel was advertised for sale on 15 August 1873. In 1877 Farmer William Jarvis took out the license for the Capalaba Hotel, built on the southern bank of the creek in Capalaba. The Township of "Old Tingalpa" on the northern bank of Tingalpa Creek never developed as intended and became known as Capalaba West. The name 'Town of Tingalpa' was abolished 1948.

Tingalpa hotel number 2.

The Royal Mail Hotel was located on the corner of Old Cleveland Road and Wynnum Road.

Joseph and Mary Kendrick opened a store on Old Cleveland Road at the junction of Lytton Road (Wynnum Road) in 1862. In 1867 Mary was the Post Mistress. Liquor was sold on the side, as in many small stores of that day. In 1870, Mrs Kendrick was charged with selling four glasses of rum ("Queenslander" 31.12.1870).

Joseph Kendrick obtained the first license of the Royal Mail Hotel in 1871 and it is presumed that he built the hotel. Due to ill-health Joseph sold the hotel to George Waldock in 1873. But George died in 1874 and his widow, Mercy Waldock was still holding the license in 1880. In the 1890s when Wilhelm Helmholz was licensee, the hotel provided sustenance for the patrons of the nearby Tingalpa races.



The Royal Mail Hotel, Tingalpa, 1871.

In 1908, the name "Half Way House" was used to describe the location of the Royal Mail Hotel due to its being considered to be half way between Brisbane and Cleveland. The local stage coaches carrying people, mail and luggage rested here.

When Mr E Harding was manager, in 1909 the hotel underwent massive renovations and in the local press the hotel was reported to be "greatly improved and a credit to the district".

Even after the days of stagecoaches delivering mail, the Hotel still retained "Royal Mail" in its name. There have been many owners, many renovations and re-buildings but the Hotel still trades on the original site today.

A refurbished Cobb and Co stage coach was mounted outside the hotel in 2011 but unfortunately this was set alight in 2017. However, there is no evidence to support the mail or passenger contracts being held by Cobb and Co for the service from Brisbane to Cleveland. The contracts were always held by local operators.

After the opening of the railway from Brisbane to Cleveland in 1889, mail and passenger road transport decreased which would have affected the takings of roadside hotels. Today the hotel is known as the Tingalpa Hotel.


While in the depths of despair, Tara began listening to the tug of her

PORT LENDS A HAND DURING VOLUNTEER WEEK

Our communities are built on the generosity of volunteers and charitable organisations who support those in need.

According to Volunteering Australia, almost six million volunteers dedicate over 600 million hours to help others. Whichever way you look at it, it's an incredible contribution to benefit others.

Held 17 to 23 May this year, National Volunteer Week is Australia's largest annual celebration of volunteers. Port of Brisbane sought to recognise the occasion by getting out into the community with a special program of volunteering activities.

PORT TIDINGS LATEST NEWS FROM THE PORT OF BRISBANE

JUNE 2021



Port of Brisbane is Queensland's largest multi-cargo port, handling 95% of the state's containers and motor vehicles and approximately 50% of its agricultural products.

Over 70 businesses are located within the port precinct, employing thousands of people. We're also an active member of the local and regional community, supporting not-for-profit and community organisations and playing our part in protecting and enhancing the natural environment.

TRADE

Improved growing conditions in the Darlings Downs, Southern Downs, Western Downs, and Northern New South Wales has led to a significant volume of export grain coming into the Port. We've also seen an increase in wheat, chickpeas and sorghum, which will be exported to North East Asia and the Indian sub-continent.

This season's cotton harvest is now in full swing with Cotton Australia forecasting national production to reach over 2.5 million bales; a significant increase on the 600,000 bales produced across Australia last season.

COMMUNITY

Port of Brisbane has proudly launched its first Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), sharing the news with the port community at our annual National Reconciliation Week event in May. We have a long and proud history of actively supporting the community in which we operate, and our RAP is arguably the most important next step on our journey.

We were honoured to have renowned Quandamooka artist, Delvene Cockatoo-Collins, create an artwork to support our RAP. Titled "Journey through the bay to the river", it's a representation of the journey from the southern parts of Quandamooka Waters to the mouth of the Brisbane River.

Our National Reconciliation Week celebration was attended by over 100 people from across the Port as well as respected local Elders and Indigenous representatives and some of our community partners. We thank all who attended for their support.

ENVIRONMENT

Conservation Volunteers Australia received a Commonwealth grant to improve native habitat around Lucinda Lake at the Port.

Completed in May, the works included treating weeds and planting native vegetation.

The works were supported by B4C – a long-term partner of the Port who has also undertaken habitat and water quality improvement projects at the lake.

Lucinda Lake attracts native wildlife including water birds, small mammals and reptiles. There is public access to the Lake, which offers an undercover seating area to observe the wildlife.

NEW FIREFIGHTERS BOOST QFES CAPABILITY

Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) ranks were boosted following a firefighter recruit graduation at the Queensland Combined Emergency Services Academy in Lytton today.

Representing the Minister for Fire and Emergency Services Mark Ryan MP at the recently held ceremony, Member for Lytton Joan Pease MP, said the graduates would be deployed to regions across Queensland to take up their role as frontline responders to emergency and disaster events.

"It is great to see another 12 firefighters joining QFES' ranks ready to make a difference to Queensland communities," Ms Pease said.

"All recruits have undertaken an intense 80-day training program where they completed specialised training units for live fire behaviour, bushfire training, road crash rescue, technical rescue and hazardous materials management.

"QFES expects the highest standards from its firefighters and these graduates have shown they are dedicated and committed to gaining the skills and knowledge necessary to perform this important role.

"When they take up their positions in communities around Queensland, they will be relied upon to act when disasters and emergencies strike.

In completing the course, firefighters were presented with a Certificate II in Public Safety (Firefighting and Emergency Operations).

QFES Deputy Commissioner Mark Roche said the firefighter training course prepared graduates to lead their communities when disasters and emergencies occurred.

"They will now embark on their new career, supporting their local communities with fire and emergency responses and educating them in prevention and preparedness activities, which helps to build a more resilient Queensland." Mr Roche said.

LAWYER'S HISTORICAL CONNECTION TO WYNNUM

Shortly after opening the Wynnum office of DBL Solicitors in 2014, local lawyer Mark Lillicrap discovered a connection with Wynnum, dating back generations.

"Wynnum has always felt very special to me. I have worked my entire career in the eastern suburbs of Brisbane. I often had found myself spending time in Wynnum, even before opening an office here," said Mark.

"It was when I opened the Wynnum office of our law firm that a family member brought to my attention an old newspaper article published after the death of my great-grandmother. That article was from late 1978. It wrote of the passing of my great-grandmother, Kate Steen (nee Crimmin), reporting that she was the first white child to be born in Wynnum.

Brushing your teeth twice a day and flossing between your teeth daily will remove most of the dental plaque in your mouth. However, every person is different, so it is important to discuss the best oral healthcare routine for your personal situation with your dentist who can advise on special techniques and prescribe additional products if required.

If it's been longer than six months since you've last seen your dentist and you have diabetes, you're in a higher-risk group for an increased risk of oral health issues. It is important to continue with regular



oral examinations to allow your dentist to assist you to prevent problems occurring or be able to treat them at an earlier stage, which results in better outcomes. Remember to mention your medical history to your dentist so they can recommend a maintenance and treatment plan that is individual to your needs.
