FROM THE MANLY HOTEL

Since 1955 The Manly Hotel has been the social focal point of the Manly Harbour Village. Fancying a change after many years of hard yakka in the bakery industry, Stewart and Dulcie McDonald purchased their first hotel in Esk in 1961. The first day's takings was a whopping 1 pound and 18 shillings. Over the next nine years they operated hotels in Ipswich, Strathpine and Spring Hill before coming across the beautiful bayside suburb of Manly.

Taking over The Manly Hotel in March of 1970, the endeavour instantly became a family affair, with the McDonalds later transferring the license to their children, three of whom still hold it today – Jenny Bradley, Doug, and Sandy McDonald. In 1972, Jenny was enlisted to assist with the till reconciliation, banking and payroll – a job that she still holds to this day, 49 years later!

The introduction of Sunday trading sessions during the '70s saw more hands required in the bars. Between the two roaring sessions: 11am - 1pm, and 4pm - 6pm in those days, Jenny and her colleagues would be pre-pouring half and full nips of scotch into glasses, ready to quickly appease the hordes of thirsty customers who would spill through the doors right upon opening.

Sandy recalls their first permits to trade after 10pm were granted in the early '70s, provided customers were served a forked meal. To creatively comply with the regulations, many a meal was presented to the late-night patrons – spaghetti on a fork, for example. 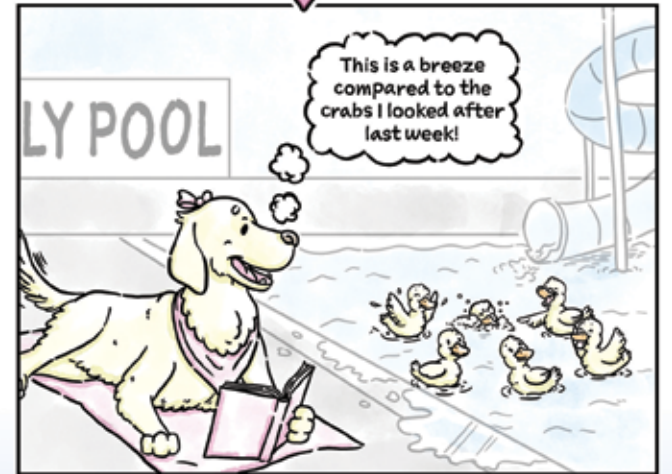
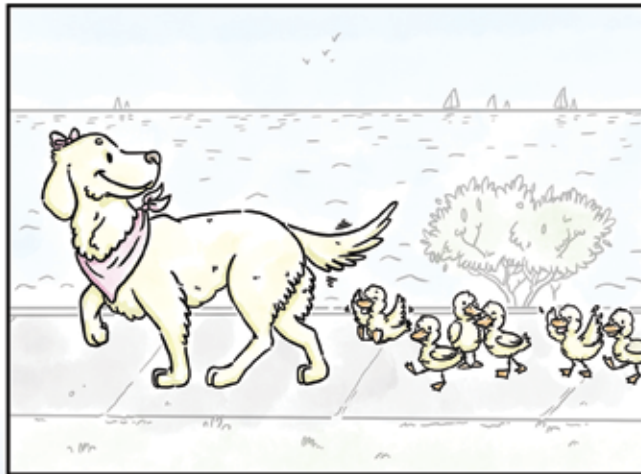

WHAT IS TICK PARALYSIS?

What is tick paralysis? Tick paralysis is a life threatening condition caused by the paralysis tick *Ixodes holocyclus* which is found along the east coast of Australia. Paralysis ticks attach to animals to feed on their blood, releasing a toxin as they feed. This toxin blocks the communication between the nerves and muscles resulting in paralysis.

Signs of tick paralysis

Clinical signs of tick paralysis usually appear within 3 - 5 days of the tick attaching and include:

- panting, noisy breathing, grunting
- coughing
- vomiting
- excessive drooling
- wobbly back legs, progressing to the front legs over time
- collapse



How is tick paralysis treated?

Treatment of patients showing clinical signs of tick paralysis requires hospitalisation and administration of tick antiserum. Depending on the severity of signs, supportive therapy including intravenous fluids, anti-nausea medication, oxygen supplementation or even ventilation may be required.

What do I do if I find a tick on my pet?

Firstly, and most importantly, keep your pet cool, quiet and relaxed. Contact your vet and arrange to have them see your pet as soon as possible. Remove the tick with tweezers or a tick hook and remember to take it with you to the vet for identification – there are a number of tick species around, not all of which cause paralysis.

How can I prevent tick paralysis in my pets?

The use of preventative oral or top spot treatments such as Nexgard, Bravecto or Revolution Plus will help to prevent tick attachment. Chat with your vet to decide the most appropriate product for your pet. Daily searches by thoroughly checking through your dog or cat's coat with your fingers will help you to find and remove ticks.

COMMUNITY UPDATE

JOAN PEASE'S COMMUNITY UPDATE, STATE MEMBER FOR LYTTON

BUDGET: SCREEN QUEENSLAND STUDIOS



Following an incredible year for Queensland film, television and games production, the Palaszczuk Government will inject a further \$71 million as part of the State's Economic Recovery Plan to continue growing Queensland's booming screen industry. The new funding announced in our State Budget will cement Queensland's reputation as a production powerhouse, create jobs, and support the state's economic recovery. Queensland's screen success is largely due to how well Queenslanders have managed the COVID pandemic, which makes filming here so attractive.

Screen Queensland Studios at Hemmant is Australia's newest and third largest studio complex. Since opening in January 2019, the studio has housed many different productions, injecting money into our local economy and creating local job opportunities. The Paramount film *Love & Monsters* was the first feature film to be produced in the studios and has since been nominated for an Academy Award and is enjoying a global Netflix release. Universal's *Young Rock*, a comedy based on the life of Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson, was filmed at the studios late 2020/21 and is now broadcasting on NBC and Foxtel in Australia. The next exciting project on the books is *Joe Exotic*, a dramatized series of the "Tiger King" story, due to commence production 12 July.

BUDGET: EDUCATION FUNDING

I'm passionate about making sure that every child has access to high quality education and the facilities that they need for success. That's why I am thrilled with the Palaszczuk Government's \$18.3b Budget commitment to Education in our State. Our local schools are set to benefit from \$10.2m dedicated to the Bayside.

This funding includes a \$6m investment in Darling Point Special School, \$2.2m to Manly State School for additional classrooms and a further \$500,000 for playground upgrades at Manly State School.

Manly West State School, Wondall Heights State School and Wynnum West State School are all receiving funding for a range of projects including OHSC, playgrounds or amenity upgrades, and a further \$850,000 has been committed for maintenance across 11 Bayside schools.



GAMBLING COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND GRANTS

The Bayside hit the jackpot with the latest distribution of Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF) grants. Various community organisations across Lytton shared in a whopping total of \$250,600 in allocated GCBF funds. Many of our local organisations received funding for important projects that enrich our Bayside community. The next round is now open and grants of up to \$35,000 are available to eligible clubs, groups and schools. COUNCIL BUDGET FOR WYNNUM MANLY WARD

On Wednesday 16 June the 2021/22 Brisbane City Council Budget was brought down. Below is a brief on some of the funds received for our community.

The big winner for our community and across Brisbane is the re-introduction of the kerbside collection.

My colleagues and I worked hard with petitions to pressure the Lord Mayor to bring this service back and I am pleased to say it has been brought back.

Kerbside Collections will commence in the Wynnum Manly Ward on the following dates:

Lota and Wynnum on 21 February 2022, Wynnum West and Manly 28 February 2022 and Manly West 7 March.

Collections in neighbouring suburbs like Hemmant and Tingalpa will also occur around the same times. Contact my office should you want dates for other suburbs, outside Wynnum Manly Ward.

Suburbs across Brisbane will incur on average a 3.75 per cent increase in their rates. In the Wynnum Manly Ward increases are as below:-

Wynnum West	4.6%	Manly	3.2%
Manly West	4.0%	Lota	3.1%
Wynnum	3.7%		

I am pleased to confirm that Wondall Road will be resurfaced. I have been lobbying for some time to have this road repaired, as well as Petersen Street, Wynnum. The other roads being repaired are:

Glenora St, Wynnum; Colina St, Wynnum; Cranleigh St, Wynnum West; Clare Ave, Wynnum West; Radford Rd, Manly West; Yaringa St Manly West; Cambridge Parade, Manly. The total cost is \$2.096M.

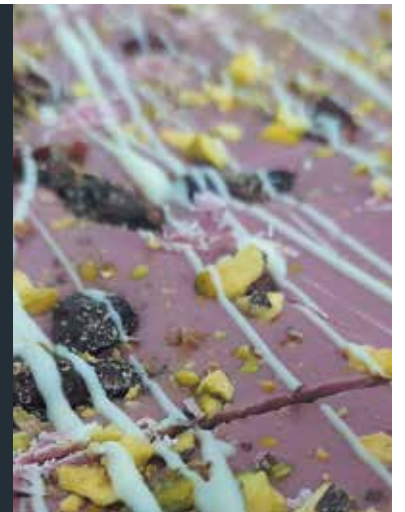

HISTORY LOST: THE LATE WYNNUM HOTEL

The late Wynnum Hotel was on the corner of Fox and Glenora Streets, Wynnum.

In the late 1870s, Joel Wilde and Matthew Adam, both hailing from England, built a hotel in the main street of the proposed Wynnum settlement. The timber building consisted of two storeys with verandahs. This was known as the Hastings Hotel, with Mary McGunn as licensee. In 1885, the name of the hotel changed to Southern Cross by licensee Pat J Byrne.

Henry George Fox purchased the hotel in May 1887. His father was a publican in Kent, England. Henry had arrived in Australia in 1874 on the Alexandra. He was a blacksmith and farrier before being a hotel keeper in German Station (Nundah).

The advertisement for the auction sale of the Wynnum Hotel, in the Brisbane Courier of Monday April 15 1887, states: "The Purchaser to take license, goodwill, stock, furniture, book debts and other effects. The hotel contains 19 rooms with detached buildings of stables, coach house, fowl house and bathing house – the whole of the buildings being in good repair. A splendid opportunity for a small capitalist to drop into a Good Business at a cheap figure".

On 6th June 1887 the hotel was officially re-named as the Wynnum Hotel. Henry Fox approached Kianawah Divisional Board to have a roadway formed in front of his hotel from King (Glenora) Street to the foot bridge over Wynnum Creek. This is Fox Street today.

Henry married Jane Fisher Williams in 1873 before leaving England. Henry died on 20 March 1899, aged 57 years and the following year, his widow Jane Fisher Fox, married Johann "John"

Friedrich Andreas Claus Kluver. Mr Kluver was a member of the Wynnum Shire Council from 1907 until his death in 1911, and Chair in 1909.

In 1910 the wooden hotel was demolished and re-built in brick by Mrs Jane (Fisher Fox) Kluver. She then leased the new hotel to Mr Forfar.

Jack Goopy, an Indian, was a chef on the SS Koopa. He heard that the hotel was for sale and his sister, Sarah, was married to James Maxwell Fisher. Goopy and Fisher took over the lease in 1912. In 1914, with the help of Bulimba Breweries, they purchased the freehold of the hotel from Mrs Kluver, who had moved to Cleveland. Jim Fisher bought out his brother-in-law, Jack Goopy, to become the sole owner of the hotel. The hotel remained within the Fisher family until 1989.

In 1921 the bar was enlarged. However major renovations were carried out in 1938. The new building won a prestigious building awards for the exterior and the interior.

James Maxwell Fisher retired in 1940 and handed the business to his son Edwin Maxwell Fisher.

In 1958 Max Fisher added an open-air beer garden and the expanded the public bar. In 1967 open-air beer garden was demolished, a new wing added and a drive-in bottle shop opened. Five cold rooms were constructed with a new state-of-the-art reticulation system that allowed beer to be drawn from taps within the bars, linked by stainless steel pipes.

The decline of hotels being the only outlet for selling drinks began in the 1970s. Sunday trading began on Easter Sunday 1970. Wynnum Manly now had 27 outlets with atmosphere, food and liquor, instead of the former three hotels.



Max Fisher died in 1982 and his two sons, John and Anthony took over the license. John was a silent partner as he was a practicing dentist. Tony ran the hotel until its sale in 1989. A new lick of paint, a new management team, a new TAB area, new café, bar and grill and new faces were to hopefully transform the Oakes Hotel as a venue for younger people.

However, new owners again took over, re-naming the building Wynnum Point Hotel.

The historic Wynnum (Point) Hotel had become a member of a consortium of the Sydney-based National Leisure and Gaming, which operated 30 pubs across New South Wales and five pubs in Queensland. The Queensland pubs went into voluntary administration in October 2011. In March 2012 developers were seeking backing for a five-storey complex to be built on the site.

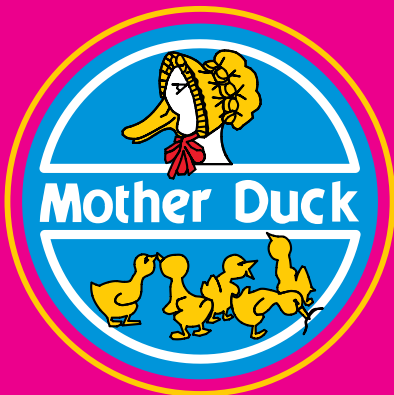

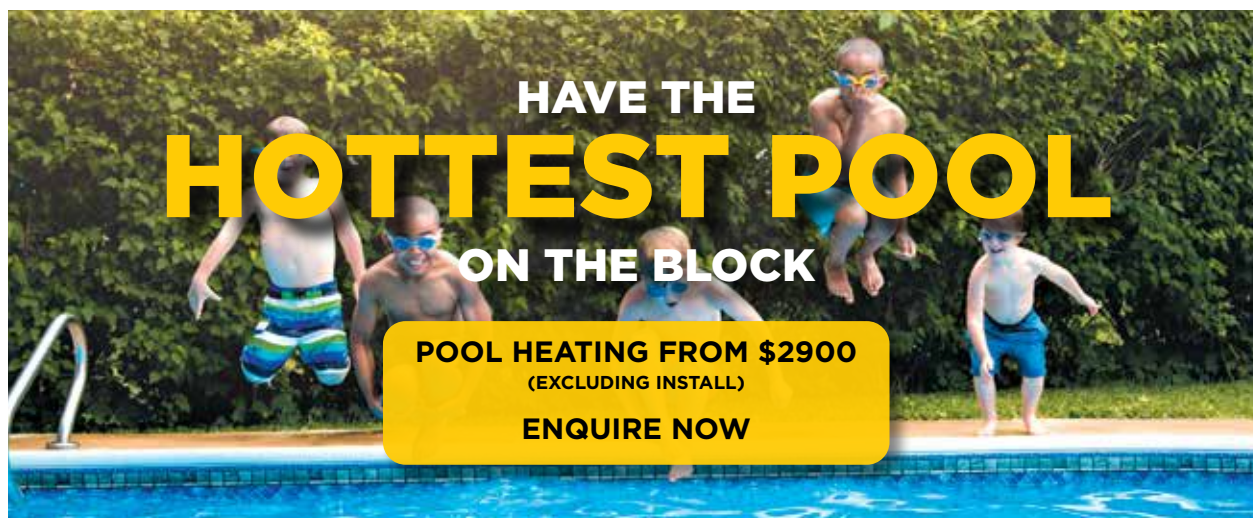

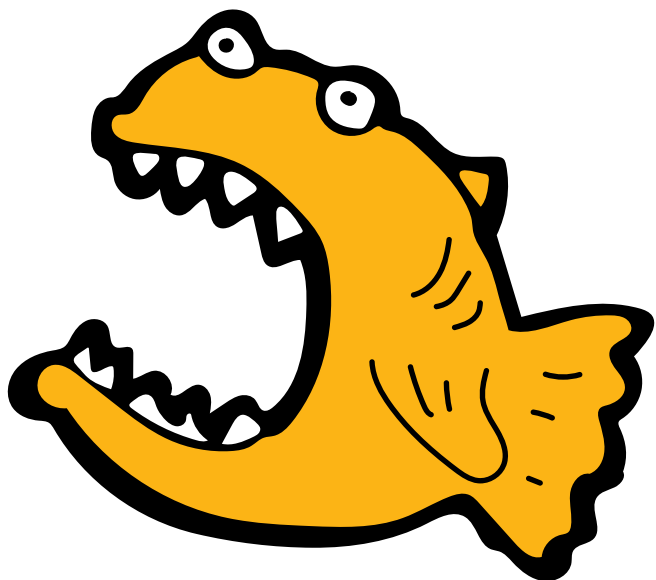
"When given the opportunity to work closely with our mentors, on a project the students are genuinely

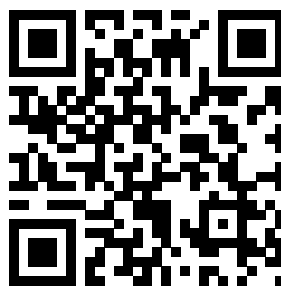

SPERO'S JULY FISHING TIPS FOR THE BAY

BY SPERO KARTANOS

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos has over 50 years' experience fishing Moreton Bay. Here are some of his tips for successful winter fishing.

Winter has arrived and the weather has settled with glorious sunrises and sunsets, and the fishing is very good this time of year with all of the Moreton Bay species in plentiful supply.

In the past few months the whiting have moved east to Fisherman's Gutter, Marron Gutter, and Amity Banks, but around July they do come back into the Small Boat Channel and the shallows of the Chain Banks.

The school mackerel are normally closer in between Green and King Islands and the Huybers Light, and out and around the Hope Banks. Try around the greens on the western side of Amity Banks, the basin at Peel, the Rainbow Channel, Shark Spit and in front of the Sand Hills as well. The Measured Mile beacon is also worth a try this month, and paravanning or floating pillies is the way to go for these fish.

The arrow squid and cuttlefish have already started to show up and July is probably one of the best months for these great tasting cephalopods. Find them in deeper water from east of Ormiston all the way through to St Helena, around 18 to 30 foot deep.

Snapper and squire have already shown up in good numbers and big fish are around all our Bay Islands and artificial reefs, so get out and get a few as the season closure starts on the 15th of July and runs until the 15th of August.

If you're like me there is no need to go out pre-dawn when it's freezing; wait until the sun rises and the warmth makes fishing even more enjoyable.

'Till next month good fishing!

PS: Please be careful this time of year with strong westerly winds making the bay from shore look beautiful, but it's quite treacherous when you have to come back into the wind in smaller vessels.

SEAFOOD CHOWDER RECIPE

FROM WYNNUM MANLY LEAGUES CLUB

There are two parts to this recipe: the white wine, garlic and fish velouté and the seafood marinara mix. (serves 4)

WHITE WINE, GARLIC AND FISH VELOUTÉ

- 25gm minced garlic
 - 1L thickened cream
 - 400ml full cream milk
 - 25gm corn-starch
 - 100ml white wine
 - 300gm barramundi diced paysanne (thin slices)
 - 25gm carrot diced brunoise*
 - 25gm celery diced brunoise
 - 25gm onion diced brunoise
 - 2 bay leaves
- *Note: Brunoise is a culinary knife cut in which the food item is first julienned and then turned a quarter turn and diced, producing cubes of about 3 millimetres or less on each side.

SEAFOOD MARINARA MIX

- 8 prawns
- 12 bay scallops
- 50gm potato diced paysanne (thin slices)
- 8 New Zealand mussels
- 100gm diced barramundi
- 100gm squid
- 25gm butter or margarine

METHOD - PART ONE

1. Sauté garlic and vegetables until pale and soft. Add diced barramundi. Cook for 3 minutes.
2. Deglaze with white wine, reduce wine by half. Add bay leaves.
3. Add the milk and thickened cream. Heat slowly to 80 degrees – DO NOT boil.
4. Make a slurry with corn-starch.
5. Add to cream stirring constantly.
6. Allow to thicken to coat a spoon.

METHOD - PART TWO

1. Boil and cook the potatoes, cool and dice.
2. Sauté all the fish in butter until ¾ cooked (about 2 minutes).
3. Add seafood and pan juices into white wine and garlic veloute and simmer for 3 minutes to finish cooking the seafood.
4. Season to taste.
5. Garnish with fresh parsley.
6. Serve in a hollowed-out sourdough cob or as is.

WILDLIFE CORRIDOR TAKES LEARNING OUTSIDE

FROM BRISBANE BAYSIDE STATE COLLEGE

As part of a new agricultural program, Brisbane Bayside State College has recruited a range of partners who have banded together to rehabilitate a local wildlife corridor.

The project forms part of a comprehensive strategy to establish a full riparian ecosystem, and a functional native environmental corridor for the Wynnum community on Brisbane Bayside State College land.

A portion of this site is part of a wildlife corridor that runs from Moreton Bay College to Iona College and is part of the Bulimba Creek Catchment. However, the site is currently overgrown, neglected and inaccessible. The project aims to revegetate this corridor with the help of B4C and the Port of Brisbane.

This space will enable students studying a range of different subjects such as Biology, Aquatic Practices, STEM, Agriculture, Technology and Geography to be exposed to authentic learning experiences and opportunities. This area will also be accessible to community groups such as Bulimba Creek Catchment Co-ordinating Committee (B4C), Moreton Bay Environmental Education Centre and Port of Brisbane for future environmental sustainability projects.

"This corridor will be a valuable resource for the community, which is why we are so excited about the partnerships we have forged

as this is an ongoing sustainability project," said Brisbane Bayside College's Lyle Fallis.

"A number of volunteers from The Port of Brisbane, Bulimba Creek Catchment Co-ordinating Committee, Bayside Creeks Catchment Group, Urban Utilities and Bayside Clean Up Crew have helped the college to kick off this new initiative."

Wayne Cameron, B4C Catchment Manager says, "The college has taken the initiative and embarked on improving the environmental

value of a strategic wildlife corridor within its grounds. The corridor links Bayside to the Brisbane River on Bulimba Creek and is also mapped as a koala area. The school will win on many counts, none less than environmental awareness and education for its staff and students".

Brisbane Bayside State College would like to thank all the volunteers who have put in the hard yards to ensure stage one of the project is a success.

PROFILE: PROBUS CLUB OF WATERLOO BAY

FROM THE PROBUS CLUB OF WATERLOO BAY

The Probus Club movement began in the UK in the 1960s when two separate clubs were created by members of Rotary Clubs — The Campus Club, formed by retired friends with professional and business backgrounds, and the Probus Club of Caterham.

Australia saw the introduction of Probus in February 1976 when the Probus Club of Hunters Hill was formed with an all-male membership under the sponsorship of the Rotary Club of Hunters Hill, Sydney. Members of the club recall that, after 15 years, the club had become “a bunch of cranky old men” and soon recognised the need to include women in the club, which has continued to grow and flourish.

Recognising a need for a Probus centre to service Australia and New Zealand, the AMP Society weighed in with a donation of \$10,000, arguing that Probus membership would extend the lives of their policyholders. We now have Probus South Pacific Limited based in Sydney with its own Board.

The Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly formed the Probus Club of Wynnum and Manly — a men’s club — in 1984. The first president was Col Piper, with vice president Leo de Lange, secretary Doug Wallace (all Rotarians) and Cliff Grimley as treasurer. This is now a mixed club.

As local interest increased, the Rotary Club then formed the Probus Club of Waterloo Bay for men and women on August 7, 1997. The first president was Jim Brittain, a Rotarian, alongside vice president Mike Sage, secretary Jann Thatcher and treasurer Cherry Bartlett.

In 2016, Rotarian and Probian Bob de Lange — Leo’s son — assisted the Probus Association of Queensland in development programs for south-eastern clubs.

IONA'S PROVENCE CENTRE NEARS COMPLETION

FROM IONA COLLEGE

Iona's new Provence Centre is nearing completion. The new centre had a staged opening on 27 June for the Queensland Rugby League Confraternity Carnival Mass and Opening Ceremony hosting over 2000 guests from schools across Queensland. On 5 August Iona will host Australian of the Year Grace Tame and will follow with the Provence Centre's official blessing and opening on 26 August.

Iona is very pleased that through Tomkins Commercial and Industrial Builders, 20% of the entire construction went to Iona affiliated families and 35% of the construction was secured locally within 10km of Lindum and the Bayside.

All of this project has been funded from within the College community and has been completed without any federal or state government funding. However, the College fully anticipates that many local schools and community groups will feel at home here as well.

Approximately 400 workers have contributed to the construction and this has benefitted our local community greatly during the pandemic.

Two significant works of art are being created for the Provence Centre. The first is an Indigenous work of art by Iona Old Boys Ambrose Killian and Matt Serrurier, which will focus on aspiration and positive relationships, and the second is a mosaic combining St Eugene, Aix-en-Provence, Iona and Moreton Bay, by Byron Bay artist, Scott Harrower Design. Both works will tell beautiful stories that will add to the richness of our community's new gathering space intertwining the past, present and future.

With a seating capacity of 2500, it is our hope that the Provence Centre is a place where the Iona and Bayside communities will gather for celebrations, commemorations, performances and sporting events as we continue to honour all who have contributed to the foundations on which Iona is built.
