LOCAL DOCTOR'S IMPRESSIVE COMMUNITY SERVICE

Doctor Susan Clarke's impressive medical career, helping people in remote areas around the world, began here in Wynnum.

Her family has lived locally for generations. Moss Road in Manly West is named after her grandfather. Her parents still live here, and Susan attended Wynnum West and Manly High.

After school, Susan initially studied Arts at Queensland University. But after joining her sister on a First Aid course, Susan discovered she loved medicine. Her mother, a nurse, encouraged her to pursue medical studies, and Susan graduated as a doctor in 2000.

While interning at Logan Hospital, Susan continued studying; gaining a Master's Degree in Education at QUT and completing her GP training. She then used both skills in Assam (India), spending over two years training local doctors and nurses.

Back in Australia, Susan began a PhD in Health Policy at Sydney University. Then she accepted an offer to work with Indigenous Australians in Lajamanu, a small town 557 kilometres from Katherine in the Northern Territory came up. Susan loved the life.

"It's really interesting cross-cultural work in a small community. I meet lots of people and face lots of challenges. As Covid hit, the local clinic burnt down! But the Walpiri people are lovely, and I really enjoy working with them."

Susan completed her PhD last year, meaning she's technically 'Doctor Doctor'!

She now alternates her time: spending every three months treating 600 Warlpiri people in Lajamanu, followed by three months back home treating locals at the Wynnum Manly Family Practice.

SAFETY WORK TO BEGIN AT LINDUM CROSSING!

I'm happy to share the safety upgrades to Lindum Crossing are getting underway. The first stage of the project involves significant short-term safety upgrades due to be completed by the end of the year including installation of new and extended median islands, enhanced line marking and road resurfacing through the level crossing.

This will ensure the crossing is safe for our community while more extensive planning can be undertaken for the long-term grade separation of Lindum Crossing. The second stage of upgrades will be utilising \$10 million of the \$85 million in Federal funding committed to this project.

I recently joined a Zoom meeting with all three levels of government representatives and their departmental spokespeople to discuss the stages of works that will be taking place. It was great to have everyone on board, with a shared commitment for these upgrades to get underway. Improving the safety and congestion at Lindum Crossing is the number one priority for our community.

"Wynnum has never had a Spiegeltent – let alone hosted a national production of this magnitude and size – and we've curated a three-week program of local music and comedy acts as well. I can't wait to announce that soon too!"

Wynnum CBD will continue to act as the heart of the arts festival and a pedestrian playground featuring laneway activations, food trucks, outdoor bars and free local performances on Friday 19 November and Saturday 20 November.

BASIC TRAINING STARTS FOR NEW COAST GUARD RECRUITS

The Brisbane Coast Guard 'Class of 2021' has kicked off, with induction and safety training underway for 32 new recruits.

The intake of volunteers, who come from across the local area and have very diverse backgrounds, all have one thing in common: a desire to help the Moreton Bay boating community.

The recruits will spend their first few months in training, where they will learn about the Coast Guard, become familiar with the six vessels at the station, and complete water survival skills. This includes firefighting, first aid, marine radio operation, ropes and knots, and basic boat deck skills. A practical training session in early October will include flare demonstrations, swimming and life raft activities.

"Once their basic training is complete, they will be assigned to crews to observe activities on the water," explained flotilla training officer Simon Gideon.

"Our training program then develops their skills and gives them experience so that they can work as part of the on-water rescue teams."

This year's Coast Guard intake also includes people who will operate the station's radio room, provide maintenance support to our vessels, and help with administration and fundraising.

The commitment for new recruits is quite significant, with more than eight training modules scheduled in 2021 alone. Simon added, "We're very grateful that these people, with the support of their families, have decided to put up their hands and join the Coast Guard. Support from the community ensures that we can continue to look after boaties on the bay".

UPGRADE TO THE BUSH PATH BRIDGE - LOTA

A new bridge will be installed over the water course which runs down the hill from Lota House to the Esplanade at Lota.

The bridge enables bushwalkers to get up to the look out which provides a nice view over the Bay.

Walkers can go via the bridge and the earth pathway which leads you further north up the Esplanade.

The old bridge was wooden and has deteriorated especially where it touches the ground. The new bridge is to be supplied by Wagners will be built using a fibre reinforced polymer material which has a 50 year life expectancy. White ants can't eat it.

The alternative is to follow the bitumen path from the corner of Armytage and Grace Streets straight down to the Esplanade..

Construction is expected to take 8 - 12 weeks, and be completed before Christmas.

\$600 MILLION PACKAGE TO HELP QUEENSLAND BUSINESSES

The Commonwealth and Queensland Governments have reached a 50/50 funding agreement that will see the value of the Queensland COVID-19 Business Support Grants rise from \$260 million to \$600 million.

As part of the package additional support for businesses that have had a decline in turnover of more than 30 per cent will include:

- A \$1,000 one-off grant to non-employing sole traders across Queensland
- Tiered payments based on payroll size for all businesses across
 Queensland
- A \$5,000 one-off, top-up grant to small business with payroll of less than \$1.3 million
- A \$10,000 one-off, top-up grant to medium sized business with payroll between \$1.3 million and \$10 million
- A \$25,000 one-off, top-up grant to large sized tourism and hospitality focused businesses with payroll of greater than \$10 million

Federal Treasurer Josh Frydenberg said this new business support package recognises that the impact of lockdowns is felt right across Australia.

"The Morrison Government recognises the impact that lockdowns across the country are having on businesses in Queensland," Treasurer Frydenberg said.

"This package will help to keep businesses in business and Queenslanders in jobs and builds on the almost \$30 billion in economic support the Morrison Government has provided Queensland households and businesses during the pandemic."

Queensland Treasurer and Minister for Investment Cameron Dick said the agreement would boost support, not just for businesses that have been affected by recent lockdowns, but by those that continue to suffer because of lockdowns in other jurisdictions.

"We know that across Queensland, the lack of international and interstate visitors is affecting businesses every day, especially those in tourism and hospitality," the Queensland Treasurer said.



"This dollar-for-dollar agreement with the Federal Government will see Queensland's contribution rise to \$300 million and vastly increase the scope of support available to businesses right across the state.

"From Monday 16 August, our \$5000 COVID-19 Business Support Grants program will be open to businesses across Queensland, but this agreement with the Federal Government is in addition to that and means that we will be able to extend our support even further."

SHELLFISH REEF RESTORATION SPAWNS COMMUNITY SPIRIT

This local OzFish Chapter recycles oyster shells from local restaurants to restore Central Moreton Bay to its former glory.

Approximately 660,000 Queenslanders recreationally fish each year. Some of our state's most popular pastimes are tied to the health of the surrounding waters, and with this comes a responsibility to take care of the reefs that contribute to the Queensland lifestyle.

Oysters are nature's filtration system, with a typical adult oyster able to filter over 100 litres of water every day, and shellfish reefs are complex living ecosystems. They make ideal homes and food sources for an abundance of aquatic life, contributing to the overall health of the oceans.

In fact, a great deal of early Brisbane was constructed using cement containing lime harvested from shellfish reefs in Moreton Bay. Sadly, shellfish reefs are now functionally extinct throughout most of South East Queensland. Robbie Porter, the President of Central Moreton Bay's OzFish Chapter, is on a mission to change this. "The best way to [restore shellfish reefs] is to recycle oyster shells," says Robbie.

OzFish is volunteer-run, and depends on help from the community to clean, dry, and basket recycled oyster shells, which are collected from restaurants local restaurants such as Shucks Bar and Manly Deck in Manly Harbour Village.

"We put them in a basket and take them back to where the reefs used to be. The baby spat love to attach on the shells and grow. If you have a nice, clean shell, you can have up to 30 spat growing in that one shell, and it perpetuates from there."

Getting involved is a fantastic way to play a part in giving back to the bay and helping undo some of the damage caused by overfishing, while learning all about these important ecosystems.

Where Brisbane meets the bay

VOLUNTEERS PROVIDE EXPERT ADVICE, WITHOUT THE PRICE

COVID has been tough for many bayside locals. At Bayside Community Legal Service ('BCLS'), we have recorded increased enquiries relating to domestic violence, disagreements with neighbours, debts, parenting and private car sales. Many in our community have faced these issues, having no idea where to start, what kind of problem they have and who they are supposed to talk to. They ask, do I need a social worker? Or, someone from the government? Maybe even a lawyer?

At BCLS, we provide free legal support to help navigate these problems. We couldn't do what we do without drawing on the expertise of our 75 dedicated volunteers, who come from a range of legal and professional backgrounds. Each volunteers their time to provide one-on-one advice that can help locals take the next step towards a solution.

Our advice ranges from free legal advice and mediation, through to assistance with government forms, general information and referrals

to specialised legal or social services. Our goals are to help locals understand legal jargon and explore their options. For example, if you have to go to court, we can talk to you about what to expect. If you have several options on the table, we can help you decide what the best option is. Importantly, we help locals of all genders, ethnicities, ages and backgrounds.

Luckily, COVID lockdowns have formed no barrier to helping our local community; we provide fully remote assistance to everyone, including single parents with children, the elderly, and people who require assistance and support. The resulting increased demand for our services means we are always looking for new volunteers – those legal professionals who have a commitment to community and a passion to make a difference.







GETTING TO THE HEART OF HEARTWORM DISEASE

Is your pet protected against heartworm? Recent studies have uncovered an increase in the occurrence of heartworm infection in pets with up to 34% of dogs (and up to 20% of this number of infections in cat) in Brisbane affected – and we have heard anecdotal reports of infections in pets on some of the Bay Islands.

What is heartworm?

Heartworm is a parasitic worm called Dirofilaria immitis which is spread by mosquitoes. Infected mosquitoes inject the larva when they bite cats and dogs. The tiny larvae spread through the blood stream, eventually ending up in the heart and blood vessels of the lungs where they grow into adult worms. These adult worms produce more larvae which travel in the bloodstream where they are picked up again by mosquitoes and the cycle continues.

Signs of heartworm disease

The clinical signs of heartworm disease in dogs are generally slow in onset and are a result of the adult worms in the heart



affecting blood flow. Dogs will often show shortness of breath, reduced exercise tolerance, decreased appetite, weight loss and a persistent cough. They may develop other signs of heart failure including abdominal swelling.

Cats tend to be less obvious in demonstrating clinical signs of heartworm disease – sometimes they will develop lethargy or a cough but more commonly may have sudden death from as little as one adult worm in the body.

How is heartworm disease diagnosed?

Heartworm detection in dogs is fairly straight forward – your vet should be able to run a quick heartworm test to check for the presence of worms. Cats are more difficult to diagnose as they are often infected with a smaller number of worms than dogs. Blood is often sent to a laboratory for testing.

How can heartworm disease be prevented?

There are a huge range of medications available to prevent heartworm infection in your pet. These include monthly top spots, tablets or chews or a yearly injection (for dogs only). Have a chat with your vet to decide the best product for your pet. If it has been some time since your pet has been on heartworm prevention your vet will recommend that a blood test be performed to check for the presence of heartworm before recommencing protection.



A fantastical and whimsical sub-tropical rainforest has transformed a laneway in Wynnum's town centre. Striking visuals have converted the laneway into an active space for people to experience, explore, photograph and share.

Adjacent to boutique homewares store Cultivate Design Co on Bay Terrace, the new mural is part of a Laneways Project being undertaken by the new Wynnum Commerce Inc. (WCI) business group to regenerate the lost urban spaces in Wynnum town centre. If you looked out across Moreton Bay on Sunday 18 July you may have noticed a wonderful sight, with some 50 yachts sailing across the bay. ARTISTS COLLABORATE WITH MORETON BAY COLLEGE

To commemorate the 120 Year anniversary of Moreton Bay College (MBC), the college commissioned renowned Indigenous artists Sonja and Leecee Carmichael, both Ngugi women belonging to the Quandamooka people, to collaboratively produce a bespoke cyanotype: *Girl on Country – Jundal Djara*.

"We are honoured to work with Sonja and Leecee, two exceptional artists who have shared with us the art of Quandamooka weaving and have created with us this magnificent cyanotype," said Mrs Janet Stewart, Principal, Moreton Bay College.

"It's exciting to be involved in contemporary indigenous art as it reflects our commitment toward strengthening the relationship with the local Aboriginal Community and the ongoing process of reconciliation."

The cyanotype embodies the narrative of connection to people, place and objects. Panel one encompasses the idea of place as nature using natural objects collected from around the College and woven items created by students, parents and staff. Panel two represents place, people and objects, and includes archival objects and two students. The cyanotype creation workshop, supported by Renata Buziak, was held during NAIDOC week.

"It is about documenting our weaving stories in new ways," said Sonja Carmichael. "By bringing images of our weaving into cyanotypes and using the elements required for the growth of our natural weaving fibres on country – water, sun and salt – we are able to extend our practice." I love where I live! My local bayside suburb of Lota is a slice of heaven that shields me from the hectic pace of a pandemic ridden world.

I recently joined the Bayside Wilderness Society and as a result became aware that the laws that offer our little paradise some protection from over-development etc., are being debated right now. In fact, a critical bill (National Standards and Assurances Bill) is currently before the Australian Senate as a precursor for the Federal Government handing decision making powers over to the states. This one little bill could determine what safeguards are in place to keep our special places safe. For our community that really matters.

Lota is a quiet little pocket on the foreshore of Moreton Bay with islands like sleeping giants out in the distance. There are parks with ancient trees holding on to life itself, that have guarded generations of nesting Lorikeet, Cockatoo, Corella, Gala and Boo Book owls, to name a few.

Our foreshore is host to some of the world's greatest athletes – birds that fly a round trip of 26,000km from faraway places to feed and fatten on our rich and bountiful mud flats.

Cleverly planned are our parks, which provide a green space for everyone to enjoy and escape their built environments. It's a space that allows us all to peacefully cohabite with wildlife at a respectable distance, of course. The problem is that it seems like more and more people want in, and while progress is important, it can't be at the expense of what makes our shared home so special.

As I walk along the foreshore, I reflect on other places I have visited where people are not so lucky, places where they've seen their green spaces disappear. Sadly, I wonder if this is what the future is for our community, if the nature laws are not strong enough to protect the places we love for future generations. I remind myself that what our community has cannot be taken for granted and that I am not alone in wanting to protect it. I'm making a point of talking to people about this important issue, and I am heartened by just how much people care.

Together we are strong, and if we can spread the word about this important decision, we will make our voices heard.



VALE NOELA STRATTON

BY MYRTLE BEITZ, FOUNDING MEMBER OF THE WYNNUM MANLY HISTORICAL SOCIETY INC.

Even though our paths in life have not coincided at times, I have known Noela and her family for about 80 years going back to my primary school days. I remember well being taught by Noela's father, Alby Charlton, at Manly State School; a time I will not expand on now.

The Charlton residence, on a large allotment situated behind the Masonic Hall fronting Walnut Street and backing on to Penfold Parade, allowed the keeping of poultry, pigeons and other pets, beneath a large hoop pine tree. In her youth, as one might say, Noela was quite a 'Tom Boy'. She could be seen on many occasions perched high in that tree reading a book while enjoying the sights of the surroundings. On special occasions – Australia Day, Anzac Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas/New Year, visits from foreign dignitaries and special occasions of any type – a flag would be hoisted and would be seen fluttering from the top of the Charlton's pine tree.

In 1945, with the end of WW2, this piece of material, 3-feet high and 6- feet long, (Union Jack, which Noela described as "My Flag")

was hoisted by her to fly majestically for all to see from the Charlton pine tree. The Australian flag did not become our official flag until 1953. Protocol dictated she should have referred to her flag as the Union flag. A talk given by Noela on 18 October 2012 titled My Flag tells of the antics she and her brother Eric involved themselves in that hoop pine tree, swinging from the branches. When the Australian flag was the one to be flown ,the old Union flag was showing its age.

As time went by Noela lived in London for two years. When home again, less attention was given to the tree. Noela's leisure time changed to golf, water-skiing, surfing and boating. At the age of 37, a week before Noela married Ken Stratton, she climbed that hoop pine. This sadly for her was the last time she was able to climb the tree she so loved. Noela and Ken lived away from the district where they raised their two children, Peter and Carla.

Mrs Charlton, after her husband Alby's death, sold the block of land on which the tree stood. A block of units was erected interfering with the many roots of the large pine. In about 1970 the tree was dying and had to be removed; the end of the tree, but not the end of the flag. The National Trust requested a Union Jack to fly during the 150th Anniversary Celebrations of Queensland's Old Government House. Noela attended the celebrations on 6th May 2012 and whilst there donated 'Her Flag' to Old Government House.

It was not until the death of Ken's mother, Elsie Stratton, that Ken and Noela returned to Wynnum to live at the Stratton home at 101 Carlton Terrace Manly, close to my residence at 110 Carlton Terrace.

The historical society welcomed Noela as a member in 1991 and she joined the committee in 1999. From 2000 to 2001 she took on the role of membership coordinator, and in 2002 and 2003 Noela was our president. From 2004 to 2010 she was back to handling the membership coordinator role. In 2010, Noela was awarded a Life Membership of the Wynnum Manly Historical Society Inc. Throughout the following years, Noela remained as a committee member. During this time Noela, with her cousin Averill, researched and



wrote in depth the history of the Charlton family.

Noela also found time to be president of the Queensland Ambulance Historical Society and Museum. Her love of photography resulted in an accumulation of photographs of events.

Her failing health found her forced to leave her Carlton Terrace home to be a resident at the Prinz Willam nursing home at Birkdale on her 90th birthday.

One of our committed members of the Society, Noela Stratton, at the age of 91 passed away on the night of the 3rd of August 2021.



SPERO'S SPRING FISHING AND WHALE WATCHING TIPS

September is normally a very good fishing month as we are back into the snapper/squire, and the school mackerel are back on the bite with plenty of undersized ones close in, with some bigger fish in the mix. We also get a run (in some years) of broad mackerel, especially around the basin at Peel Island. Paravaning with 3-inch spoons or drifting with floating pillies is the way to catch these great tasting pelagic fish.

The whiting will have moved back closer in off the Chain Banks, and all the way through to the Rous and the Sand Hills at Moreton. The Blue Hole should have some nice fish as well, and blood worms and peeled prawns on a paternoster rig will get you a feed.

The cuttlefish will be nearing the end of their run but the arrow squid should still be around, so the deeper water off the close-in islands will provide a nice feed.

So while the fishing will be good, September is my favourite month as the humpback whales with their babies tend to come in for a rest on the way south to Antarctica. I can't get enough of seeing these majestic mammals so close to home, and over the last few years they have been close in and as south as Peel Island, near Ormiston, and off King, Green and Mud Islands. And of course you can spot them all through the northern bay east of Tangalooma and up to Cape Moreton, so you can take the kids out to see them so close to home. There are laws about how close you can get to them and how to approach them so read up on the Queensland fisheries site before your trip (this also applies to dolphins in the bay as well).

Enjoy the bay this month. I will be posting updates on fishingmonthly.com.au under Moreton Bay reports when the whales turn up and where they are in the bay.

Till next month, good fishing, good whale watching, and keep safe!

DELICIOUSLY EASY MOROCCAN LAMB RECIPE

FROM THE ROTARY CLUB OF WYNNUM MANLY'S ISOLATION: KITCHEN DESTINATION COOKBOOK CONTRIBUTOR: TRACEY WYATT

SERVES 6

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tablespoon oil
- 1kg diced lamb
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2 x 400g can tomatoes
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 2 teaspoons ground turmeric
- 1 tablespoon lemon Juice
- 1 x 425g can chickpeas, drained and rinsed
- 2.5 cups chicken stock
- 1 cup chopped coriander
- 2 cups couscous
- · Lemon wedges and herbs to garnish

METHOD

- Heat oil in a large pan and add lamb, and garlic in batches; cook, stirring until well browned.
- Add undrained chopped tomatoes, spices, juice, chickpeas, and 1/2 cup of the stock.
 Bring to the boil and simmer, covered for 20 minutes, or until lamb is tender. Stir in coriander (though I never use this!).
- Meanwhile, heat remaining stock in a separate saucepan. Remove from heat, stir in couscous. Cover and stand for 10 minutes, fluffing with a fork occasionally.
- Serve lamb with couscous, garnish with lemon wedges and fresh herbs.



HOW DOES THE PH LEVELS IN DRINKS AFFECT YOUR TEETH?

FROM DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE

As a country Australia's consumption of commercial sugarsweetened beverages has decreased over the years, with a 14% decrease seen between 2009 and 2017, however in the same period there was a 37% increase in low sugar or 'health' type drinks such as flavoured waters, juices, coconut water and kombucha! Advertising of these alternatives to the sugar-laden beverages have worked – almost too well! Unfortunately, these alternatives also impact general health and dental health.

The sneaky component of these drinks which is often misunderstood are the pH levels or acidity of these drinks, not just the sugar contents, which can have devastating impacts on tooth enamel, through enamel demineralisation and dental erosion. Enamel demineralisation is a reduction of mineral content specifically fluoride and calcium ions. Subsequently, this weakens enamel leading to porosity and an increased risk of decay. Dental erosion is the irreversible loss of tooth structures due to acid.

Surprisingly, or not, the end pH levels of beverages are often not published by the manufacturer, and therefore not always available to the consumer. However, in 2020, Schmidt and Huang¹, completed a study which ascertained the pH levels of 177 commercially available beverages in Australia. The beverages tested ranged from soft drink, energy drink, juice, still and sparkling bottled water, flavoured water, iced tea, and coconut water to name a few.

A full table can be viewed online, but we have summarised the findings below for a few popular 'healthy choices'. In general, to avoid irreversible damage to your teeth through dental erosion, patients should limit their consumption of beverages with a pH level of less than 7.0.

Obviously, the consumption of acidic drinks is inevitable from time to time. So what can you do to try to protect your teeth from dental erosion?

- Use a straw to lessen the contact time with the teeth.
- Rinse your mouth with water after an acidic beverage.
- Consuming dairy will help neutralise the acid and leave a protective layer on the teeth.
- Waiting an hour after an acidic drink to brush the teeth as brushing right away can make things worse. Healthy saliva will remineralise the enamel within the hour after consumption of acidic beverages to its pre-existing hardened state.

If you're concerned about the state of your teeth due to your beverage of choice, it's best to get it checked by your dentist. They can recommend specific products and care routines to support your tooth enamel.
