BOOST FOR LOCAL TOURISM AND HOSPITALITY PLAYERS

The Commonwealth and Queensland Governments have reached an agreement to further target \$70m from the State and Federal Governments' \$600m support package to boost support for Queensland's major tourism and hospitality businesses who continue to face significant hardship.

The jointly-funded \$70 million package includes:

- Tourism and Hospitality Sector Hardship Program \$40 million to provide a second round of grants to small, medium, and large employing tourism and hospitality businesses that received an initial grant from round one of the program.
- Iconic Tourism Grants \$30 million for grants of up to \$4m to ensure that major tourism enterprises remain viable and are ready to scale up as visitation returns.

Federal Member for Bonner Ross Vasta MP said this funding agreement delivers positive outcomes for local businesses during a time when Queensland is closed off internationally and domestically from New South Wales and Victorian markets.

"Bonner is home to some of the sunshine state's most breathtaking tourism gems including Moreton Island which is home to Tangalooma Island Resort," Mr Vasta said.

"We are in an incredibly fortunate position here in Queensland to have the freedom to travel across the state and support our local tourism and hospitality businesses who have been working tirelessly during this time so we can continue making special memories with our friends, families and loved ones.

Treasurer Josh Frydenberg said this package comes on top of the Morrison Government's more than \$30.2 billion in direct economic support to Queensland households and businesses since the start of the pandemic.

Cocktails for a Cause – Manly 2021 (CFCmanly), is a collaboration between four bayside small business owners, with the aim of raising over 70,000 for bayside charity BABI Youth and Mental Health Services.

Now in its fourth year and with more than \$65,000 in funds raised, CFCmanly has become the largest charity event on Brisbane's bayside, with 1000 guests expected to attend this year. CFCmanly directs 100% of profits to a different charity each year. In 2021 the charity unanimously voted as most worthy for support was BABI. The goal is to raise \$70,000 to fund a new drop-in service for young people and their families at times of crisis. Families need immediate support, not waiting lists.

This year's fundraiser will see guests fulfil their dreams of travel with a Havana Dreaming themed lawn glowing with festoon lights, roaming entrainment, a vibrant live big band and aromas from a Cuban-inspired delicious food market (main meal) and of course, stunning cocktails!

PETER CUMMING'S LOCAL AREA UPDATE

COUNCILLOR FOR WYNNUM MANLY WARD

LINDUM LEVEL CROSSING

It is great to see the Council, State and Federal Governments cooperating over the upgrade of the Lindum Level Crossing. The initial safety improvements works to be completed before end of the year will involve:

- Installation of a new median island on the northern approach to the intersection;
- Extension of the median island on Lindum Road; and
- New pavement and road line marking.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN THE AREA

A new Development Application for 29 units in a 9 storey building has been received by Council for 98 Berrima Street, Wynnum. It appears to comply with what the Neighbourhood Plan allows.

Meanwhile in Manly, the new unit complex at 191 Stratton Terrace is expected to start construction soon. There will be 43 apartments across four storeys. Parking in Manly will be more difficult as parking onsite will no longer be available.

SPORTING NEWS

Wynnum Manly Seagulls Intrust Super Cup fell agonisingly short of the Premiership again this season. Wynnum Manly lost the final 16-10 against Norths at Redcliffe. Wynnum have won Brisbane top grade Premierships on 6 occasions – 1982, 1984, 1986, 1995, 2011 and 2012. The last two were state-wide competitions. Wynnum Manly were runners up in 2019 and 2021. The competition was abandoned in 2020 due to COVID.

DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE'S CHRISTMAS DONATION APPEAL

Dental on Cambridge is a family-owned practice on Cambridge Parade in Manly, and is always looking for ways to give back to the local community.

In the lead up to Christmas, Dental on Cambridge will be partnering with the local BABI Youth and Family Service in Wynnum, a non-profit organisation that provides integral services to the bayside community by responding to the needs of young people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

Christmas is often a difficult time of year for BABI's service users, so in preparation for the season of giving, Dental on Cambridge will be donating (as well as collecting) luxury toiletries during the month of November at their practice.

"The practice is often approached for donations by larger organisations across Brisbane, but we really want to be able to focus our charitable efforts within our local community," said Dental on Cambridge's Chantelle Ritchie.

"While any donation will be warmly accepted, we're asking the community to purchase an additional product that they would normally purchase for themselves, or items that they would purchase as a gift for a friend."

Examples of suitable products include body wash, nice soaps, shampoo and conditioner, deodorant/body spray, hand towels, soaps, body lotion, perfume, razors, shaving cream, hair styling products, face masks, nail clippers, and hair accessories like brushes, combs and hair ties.

Items for young men are often overlooked, so any male-specific items would be fantastic.

In December, the Dental on Cambridge team will collate the donated items together into hampers, along with their own donations of toothbrushes, flossers, and toothpaste for each hamper, wrapping, ribbons and cards to be able to prepare the gifts for delivery in time for Christmas.

The Chamber now has a focus on place-making and destination marketing for the Manly Harbour Village and harbourside precinct. With the recent announcement of Manly as the 2032 Olympic sailing venue, there are many exciting new initiatives on the horizon.

The Chamber expresses its gratitude to David Farley for his invested time, knowledge and pure passion for the Manly Harbour Village business community, and warmly welcomes Peta Prestidge in her new role.

During the AGM, Juliann Star, owner of Ebb+Flow Boutique and a local trader for nearly 20 years, was also welcomed to the Chamber

SCHOOL FACILITY UPGRADES



There is so much work going on around our fabulous Bayside schools and it's not just in the classrooms! Six schools are earmarked for upgrades and in some instances brand new learning centres.

Wynnum State School students will enjoy more sun-safe play thanks to a \$400 000 outdoor play area upgrade due for completion this month, while Wondall Heights State School has a budget of \$300 000 to upgrade their Outside School Hours Care (OSHC)

Wynnum West State School completed the upgrade of their juniors' amenities building in September and Manly West State School is also on the home stretch of their male and female toilet block refurbishments.

Larger projects are underway for Darling Point Special School and Manly State School which include new learning centres.

Darling Point will see 28 new learning spaces, a manual arts room, multi-purpose room and student and staff amenities blocks are part of a \$14 million build with work due to begin January 2022.

Manly State School's \$10 million learning centre will include a three-story building with seven learning spaces, a music general learning area, and student and staff amenities with work projceted to begin December 2021.

When refrigeration mechanic Lauren Campbell started her apprenticeship at AG Coombs, she was their first female apprentice. She was awarded the Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year award for her work in promoting the industry to other young women.

Ms Dixon was recognised for her efforts in addressing mental health and wellness issues, as well as her work transitioning to online learning during 2020, saving countless apprenticeships and careers.

I send my biggest congratulations to both women - you should be very proud of yourselves.





How long have the Community Grants been in operation at Wynnum Manly Leagues Club?

WYNNUM MANLY BRIDGE CLUB SCORES NEW SYSTEM

The Wynnum Manly Bridge Club has modernised its scoring system thanks to a grant from the Lord Mayor's Community Fund.

Previously, games were scored by players on a paper sheet that remained with the cards played. The cards, and the sheet, moved from table to table in a round-robin style tournament. Under COVID restrictions, the sheets posed a risk of transmitting the virus.

Fortunately, the club was given 12 second-hand scoring devices called Bridgemates, which remain on each table. This reduces the risk of transmission. Also, the devices automatically calculate the scores, removing the risk of players recording incorrect scores.

However, to make the Bridgemates operational, the club needed to purchase a laptop computer and a server that allows the devices to "talk" to the scoring program in the laptop. That program calculates the tournament winners, saving many hours of time once spent by club volunteers. The \$800 grant was sufficient to buy the laptop and largely cover the cost of the server.


The club is grateful to Councillor Peter Cumming for his support with the grant. He has also been instrumental in the club securing a permanent playing venue at the Council's Municipal Hall in Bay Terrace.

Additionally, using a \$2660 grant from the Wynnum Manly Leagues Club, the club recently bought 12 new Bridgemates, which will allow the club to run larger tournaments for its 80 members.





LOCAL FIRM SENDS 800KG MEDI-AID PACKAGE TO CUBA

Recently the owner of Tingalpa-based engineering company Prior Industries Australia Pty Ltd and Chair of the Australia-Cuba Business Council, Kim Prior, sent over \$75,000 worth of medical aid to the island nation of Cuba in response to the humanitarian crisis caused by COVID-19.

The 800Kg aid package consisted of some 26,000 needles, basic medical supplies including wound dressings, bandages and vitamins particularly perinatal vitamins and supplements for children impacted as a result of shortages that have swept the country in the last 12 months.

According to Australia-Cuba Business Council Chair Kim Prior, "this is an important act of good will by Australians to the Cuban plight as Cuba has done much to assist other countries throughout the pandemic."

The small island nation has shown stunning international goodwill and resilience during the pandemic, while itself suffering severe economic hardship as a result of the ongoing pandemic and continuing sanctions from the United States.

The country dispatched some 2000 doctors and nurses worldwide last year to assist with the pandemic and has developed three COVID-19 vaccines – Abdala, Soberana 02 and Soberana Plus – to combat the virus.

Cuba itself closed its international borders to all non-residents in March 2020 and has since maintained one of the tightest lockdowns in the world to prevent the spread of the virus.

While those restrictions helped to ease the spread during the first wave the measures have crippled the country economically with an estimated loss of \$30 billion to the gross domestic product last year.

The restrictions have also failed to contain the more contagious Delta variant, with nearly half a million cases occurring since June this year.

The staggering increase in numbers has put



immense strain on Cuba's hospital system that, while well-staffed, has had difficulty obtaining the medical resources needed to meet such a catastrophic increase in numbers.

"Whilst having world's best doctors in place is exceptional and we are fortunate in Cuba to have them," says Cuba's Ambassador Ariel Lorenzo. "The shortages make the jobs of those doctors extremely difficult."

"Putting together an aid package for Cuba was an easy decision to make not only because of the economic predicament of the country but also as an act of goodwill for a country that did much



to help other, less well-resourced countries," said Kim Prior.

The Australia-Cuba Business Council is a non-partisan, not-for-profit member organisation established to work on behalf of its members to assist in the creation of successful partnerships between Australia and Cuba.

FATHER WINS APPLICATION AGAINST ANTI-VAXXER MUM

It was only a matter of time post the COVID-19 era that the issue of vaccinations would be before the Family Court.

In the recent case of Makinen & Taube [2021] FCCA 1878, the Court heard a father's application to have sole parental responsibility for decisions regarding immunisations and vaccinations for the parties' two children aged 12 and eight. The mother opposed any vaccination and relied on literature which reported on the harm that vaccinations can bring to children.

The father won his application with the Court ruling that the mother's opposition to vaccination was based on genuine but unreasonably held beliefs.

The Judge in this case outlined the differing attitudes between the mother and the father which rendered it highly improbable they could, after a consultation process, reach a joint decision about vaccines. For that reason, the Judge believed that if no order were made specific to parental responsibility concerning vaccinations, by default, the children would not be vaccinated against any disease.

Orders were made for the father to have sole parental responsibility regarding decisions concerning vaccinations in accordance with the national immunisation program or as recommended by the children's GP.

Ultimately, in any parenting decision, the primary consideration is the child's best interests. The Court will always determine each matter on its own facts.

FROM LOTA STATE SCHOOL


Lota State School recently held its inaugural Science Fair, where each class from Prep to Year 6 visited the fair and took part in a huge variety of activities.

WHITING IS THE CATCH OF THE MONTH FOR NOVEMBER

November is a good month for many reasons: Christmas is around the corner and the Melbourne Cup is on (my tip is The Chosen One) and the whiting are in good numbers in the bay.

So, when the weather is good there is no better excuse to go out and catch some nice Moreton Bay whiting fillets for the family, and by all accounts, most families enjoy the sweet tasting fillets. Eat them tempura style, grilled in a nice pasta linguini, or any way you like to cook these lovely fish. My favourite has to be light Japanese tempura batter and shoestring chips, all cooked in light olive oil with home-made chilli jam and aioli, but for the family to be happy you must learn to fillet so there are no bones left.

Whiting are really easy to catch and they tend to be in the same areas each year – in actual fact I think there's more these days than in the olden days! Find them around the Sand Hills and on the western side of Moreton Island, Fisherman's Gutter, and all the gutters throughout the Rous Channel area, Chain Banks, and all the surrounding sandbanks.

Also check out the Amity Banks shallows in Horseshoe Bay, and south to Pelican Bank, the northern side of the Brisbane River, Sandgate, Redcliffe, Bribie, and all the way to the 'pin.

In the summer months, I find the whiting are up in the shallow banks throughout the bay in 4 to 6 ft of depth, and a sign I always look for is feeding dugongs – nine times out of 10 the whiting follow the herds to eat whatever the dugongs dig up eating the sea grass.

I find them on the bite better when there is a good run in the tide, drifting with the good old faithful paternoster rig. Anchored up I do like the running sinker rig, especially in the fast-running currents down the 'pin and the rivers, but up in the bay paternoster is the way to go.

Bait is simple, and the best by far is live blood worms, but frozen beach worms, strips of squid, peeled prawns and pipis and live yabbies should all catch you a bucket of whiting.

As for rods and reels (especially for the young), I recommend ultralight rods, and the 1000 size reels are very good. Like most older fisherman, I remember hand line was all that was once used, which was a bit of a pain on a windy day if three or four people had hand lines going all over the place.


I always used long shank hooks, all brown in the stone age, and then the red long shanks were introduced, which made sense seeing we mostly used red blood worms or cured red beach worms. But I have to say I was put onto the black magic circle-type 1.0 whiting hooks and can't believe how good they are, the only trouble is my little fat fingers sometimes find it hard to put the bait on, so every now and then I revert back to the red long shank.

November is hit and miss with some glassy conditions or howling winds, so wait for the good and safe days to go get a bucket of whiting, the kids love it! One last thing on the whiting fishing: I know it's easier to scale by dragging them in a net behind a boat but it really does soften the flesh; I think scaling by hand gives you firmer fillets.

'Til next month good fishing.

GROUNDED VESSEL SPARKS STORMY OVERNIGHT RESCUE

Storms were brewing late one night when the Coast Guard emergency phone rang. A 10-metre cruiser with engine troubles had run aground on Moreton Island south of Tangalooma and was in danger of being battered apart.

Skipper Allan Tennent called in a boat crew, and shortly after midnight Brisbane Coast Guard's large command vessel CG29 left harbour. After a lumpy crossing to Tangalooma, the crew quickly located the troubled boat but were now faced with the challenge of safely recovering the boat and its occupants in the middle of blustery storm cells.

"We deployed our tender to drag a tow rope across, but with breaking seas and a strong current, it took some time to get the line in place and secured," Allan explained. "The cruiser only had small deck cleats to secure the line to, so we had to use gentle towing pressure and rocking from the swells to ease it free."

Once the vessel was under tow, there were still challenges for the crew. Thirty-knot rain squalls buffeted both vessels, causing a tow line to snap. A new line held for the rest of the six-hour tow back to Manly. With day breaking, the tired crew were able to deliver the disabled vessel and its relieved passengers to safe ground.

"The owner had recently purchased the boat, and was sailing on a shake-out trip even though the forecasts were poor," Allan added. "While we're always available to help people in trouble, if the weather conditions are marginal we urge people to reconsider their trips."

DELICIOUS 'IT'S ALMOST SUMMER' PRAWN SALAD RECIPE

SERVES 2

Warmer weather calls for lighter meals, and this salad is perfect for brunch, lunch or dinner.

- 300g of cooked peeled prawns

- 1 thinly sliced red onion
- 2 cups of rocket, or any mixed salad leaves
- 1/4 cup of chopped or sliced almonds

Dressing

- 1/4 cup Greek yoghurt
- 2 tsp mustard
- 1 tsp white vinegar
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 2 tbsp fresh chopped chives and parsley

In a large bowl, assemble all the salad ingredients.

In a small jar, combine all dressing ingredients, put on the lid, and give it a good shake. If the dressing is too thick, add a dash of milk. Pour the dressing over the salad and gently combine.

Serve the salad on its own, or with crusty bread for a more substantial meal. For an extrasummery meal, add some chopped mango to the mix.

He was the son of a Sicilian migrant who came to the North Queensland cane fields in 1922 in the hope of a better future for his family. He was a role model for his family and others around him.

He taught us the value of service to the public, rather than service to one's self, and he illustrated this perfectly during his distinguished legal career. Angelo's unwavering passion to keep giving back to the community didn't stop once he left the Supreme Court bench.

He threw himself into doing work for the less privileged, especially for the Aboriginal Legal Service, where he was a powerful advocate for indigenous Australians.

Angelo was known by all to be an exceptional advocate, with a sense of fairness.

He undoubtedly made an impact in the courtroom. He was a shrewd advocate and highly respected by his peers. Both as a Judge and as a Barrister, he savoured justice – whether that was in The High Court of Australia or the smallest tribunal in Queensland.

Whilst known by many for his courage and resilience, Angelo was also a man of great faith, and the love of his family was second only to his love of God.

Angelo Vasta leaves a profound and unique legacy and his contribution to the law in Queensland will live on.





WHAT IS ROOT CANAL OR ENDODONTIC TREATMENT?

FROM DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE

Teeth are made up of two anatomical parts: the crown and the root. The crown of a tooth is the top part that is exposed and visible above the gum (gingiva). It is covered with enamel, which protects the underlying dentine. The root of a tooth descends below the gum line, into the jawbone, anchoring the tooth in the mouth. Different types of teeth have a different number of roots and root formations.

Typically, incisors will have one root whereas molars may have three or four. Teeth are vital organs of the body. The living tissue in the centre of the crown is called the pulp which is enriched with nerves and blood vessels and this is where the tooth gets its nutrients to remain healthy.

When the nerve degenerates or is affected by bacteria your dentist may recommend removing the affected nerve and blood vessels to prevent further pain and damage to the bone underneath the tooth. This procedure is known as root canal treatment and is often recommended to attempt to save teeth from further damage or extraction.

The procedure consists mainly of removing the affected pulp of the tooth as well as cleaning out any bacteria on the inside of the tooth then covering it with a protective seal. In essence, the root canal-treated seeks to preserve the healthy parts of the tooth. By removing the infected regions, it can save the original tooth, hence avoiding extraction and permanent tooth loss.


Often root canal-treated teeth, especially back chewing teeth, also require a crown to be placed over the tooth to enhance the strength and longevity of the tooth. In fact, root canal-treated teeth that are protected with a crown have a 6 x longer lifespan than root canal-treated teeth that do not have a crown.¹

A dental crown is a custom-made, permanent restoration. Before insertion, a dental crown looks like a hollow, tooth-shaped 'cap' which is cemented onto an existing natural tooth (or onto a dental implant). Dental crowns are made out of ceramic (porcelain) which is a very strong and aesthetic material. They are seamlessly matched to the shape and colour of your existing teeth. Dental crowns will look, function and feel just like a natural tooth.

The best way to care for your teeth before or after root canal treatment is to ensure that you carefully schedule and keep your six monthly routine examinations and cleans with your dentist to keep your teeth for the long term! Call us now on 3348 6661 or book online www.dentaloncambridge.com
