In Manly village, step inside Flowers on Cambridge and take a deep breath - it's a total delight for the senses.



Bayside PCYC is looking better than ever! I recently visited the PCYC based in Lota to check out what \$558,000 in Federal funding has delivered for upgrades of their facilities.

With a growing membership base, the clubs' facilities were in urgent need of repair and this funding has enabled the upgrade of its gym kitchen, electrical, front entrance, fans and roofing to give our community an unbeatable experience. For 49 years, Bayside PCYC has been making an invaluable difference to people of all ages in our area and now they've transformed the space so it can meet needs of our community for years to come.

KEEPING UP THE MOMENTUM TO DELIVER MORE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ON THE BAYSIDE

As part of my ongoing plan to deliver more mental health services on the Bayside I reconvened the Bayside Mental Health Working Group. The over 20 local mental health and community providers in attendance heard from Brisbane South PHN Senior HR Business Partner Melissa Binks and Head of Be Someone for Someone (Initiative of Feros Care) Joanne Winwood who presented social prescribing as



an early intervention and prevention approach for youth mental health; a plan tailored to the Bayside.

Social connections are the greatest protection against depression and are proven to reduce suicidal behaviour. I look forward to continuing to work with Brisbane South PHN, Feros and the working group on this plan for our community.

REDUCING EMISSIONS, THE AUSTRALIAN WAY

The Morrison Government has unveiled our plan for Australia to achieve net zero emissions by 2050. We're taking real action and doing this the Australian way - through technology, not taxes and choices, not mandates.

RECYCLING RESPONSIBLY

As the Christmas Season is drawing upon us, I thought it might be valuable to let you know how to recycle responsibly!

Items That Can Be Recycled

- Cardboard Boxes including cereal boxes / egg cartons / cardboard coffee cups / laundry detergent boxes / long-life milk & fruit juice cartons / manilla folders /pizza boxes (grease stains are acceptable but food scraps to be removed) / removalists boxes / tissue boxes / toilet rolls
- Firm Plastic Containers & Bottles including biscuit and sushi trays / cleaning product bottles (domestic only) / coffee cups lids / disposable plastic plates & cups / margarine containers / milk, juice & cordial bottles / shampoo & conditioner bottles / soft drink bottles & cans ** / strawberry & other berry/fruit punnet containers / takeaway containers / yoghurt tubs
- Glass Bottles & Jars including beer, wine & spirit bottles ** / beverage bottles. jam jars / sauce bottles & jars / vitamin jars
- Paper including envelopes (including window style) / glossy magazines / greeting cards / junk mail & brochures / newspapers / notepaper & scrap paper / office paper (white & coloured) / paper bags / phone books / receipts / wrapping & packaging paper
- Steel & Aluminium including aerosol cans (empty) / aluminium foil (including pie trays) / food cans (aluminium or steel / soft drink cans ** / paint tins (empty & dry)
- ** Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel & liquid paperboard drink containers are eligible for the 10cent refund under the Containers for Change Program. You will be asked to remove the lids so you can recycle these separately. Lids4Kids Australia provides a recycling option for plastic lids.

NON RECYCLABLE ITEMS

Biopack cups & containers (biodegradable hard plastics) / bread clips / coffee pods / corks / crockery / pots / pans / heatproof dishes (eg. Pyrex) / drinking glasses / E-Waste (batteries / compact discs / DVD's / fluorescent tubes / kitchen appliances / food waste / garden waste (includes timber, bricks and soil) / gas bottles / helium tanks & other hazardous material / hangers (plastic & metal) / hard plastic compact disc cases / helium tanks / ink cartridges **** / light bulbs / mirrors/ window glass/ nappies / needles & syringes / polystyrene (expanded foam e.g. cups, trays, packaging) / soft plastics (bubble wrap / chip plastics, shopping bags & zip lock bags) /surgical face masks / textiles (clothing, fabric, linen & towels) / toilet paper, tissues / wax coated paper (baking paper) and wax coated boxes

*** You can return your cartridge to the supplier/manufacturer for a refill.



QUEENSLAND'S COVID-19 VACCINE PLAN TO UNITE FAMILIES

Well done Queensland - we've reached the 70% vaccination mark! Further restrictions will be lifted as further quotas are met.

When 80% of the eligible Queensland population is vaccinated, guarantine requirements will be lifted for fully vaccinated domestic travellers, and fully vaccinated international travellers may be able to home quarantine.

When 90% of eligible Queenslanders are vaccinated, there will be no entry requirements for fully vaccinated arrivals.

WYNNUM CENTRAL STATION TO BLOOM WITH NEW GARDENS

Wynnum Central station is blooming with the addition of two new gardens on the platform, which were planted and will be maintained by students at Darling Point Special School.

Member for Lytton Joan Pease said the project was a fantastic community partnership that added to the beautification of Wynnum Central station.

"I'm pleased to see the idea come to life and thank Queensland Rail for their support in helping us get off the ground," Ms Pease said.

"Queensland Rail loved the idea of this project and were happy to work with the school to make it happen. They have even supplied the planter boxes as well as soil.

"Queensland Rail aims to connect communities and this project does exactly that - it brings students to the station to brighten the day of customers.

"I can't wait to see the plants in full bloom and hope the students take as much pride in their work as I'm sure the locals will."

Darling Point Special School Principal Charmaine Driver said the project allowed students to feel engaged with the community as well as valued and supported.

"They're a highly motivated group and these students as well as their teacher, Ms Julie Bendall, are very excited about this project," Mrs Driver said.

"It fits in beautifully with the school's program because we operate a certificate in agri-food and horticulture. This provides a real-life work experience opportunity for the students to practically demonstrate the content they are learning in the classroom.

"They're really hoping commuters notice the new garden beds and say hello while they're planting and nurturing them."

Wynnum Commerce Incorporated Chairman Michael Jullyan initially planted the seed for the idea, as part of its mission to make Wynnum Central the most beautiful train station in Brisbane.

"We've already installed a mural at the station building and this is a continuation of a drive to beautify the station," Mr Jullyan said.

"We want to promote Wynnum as an end destination with fun things to do here. We are always engaging with the local community, so we asked Darling Point Special School to be involved and applied for a grant on its behalf."

Port of Brisbane Interim CEO Neil Stephens said this phase of the project was possible thanks to a \$15,000 grant from the Port of Brisbane, as part of its annual Community Grants program.

"When the opportunity came up to support Darling Point Special School and the local community through Queensland Rail, we jumped at the chance," Mr Stephens said.



"We consider ourselves very proud members of the bayside community, and this project has been a fantastic collaboration between many stakeholders all keen to make a positive difference.

TIPS FOR KEEPING YOUR PETS SAFE THIS CHRISTMAS

Christmas is such a wonderful time of year when we often celebrate with food and other festivities. It is important to make sure that all members of the family stay safe to keep the season joyful.

Here are some tips to keep your furry friend's Christmas fun and avoid spending Boxing Day at the emergency vet!

CHRISTMAS FOOD Common Christmas treats such as Christmas cake, pudding and mince pies are all toxic to dogs and cats due to the sultanas and raisins used in the recipes. Grapes are also toxic to animals. Chocolate and nuts (especially macadamia nuts) are not

suitable for dogs and cats. Leftover ham and roast meats often find their way to dog's bowls but these can cause pancreatitis.

Stock up on your pet's favourite treats so that they can safely join in the feasting — liver treats, skinless chicken and carrots are all safe options.

CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS Inquisitive puppies and cats can find Christmas decorations very tempting as chew toys.

Swallowing tinsel and other decorations can lead to foreign body obstruction (blockage of the gastrointestinal tract) which can be very serious. Keep decorations high out of reach of pets or have your Christmas tree in a room your pet doesn't use.

KEEP PETS COOL December can be really hot. Make sure to only exercise your pet in the cooler parts of the day (early morning or later in the evening).

Provide a shady place for your pet to shelter from the sun. Have multiple water bowls topped up regularly with clean, cool water. Paddle pools, cooling mats and air-conditioning can all help to keep your pet from overheating during the hot summer days.

GREATER CHILD CARE SUPPORT BROUGHT FORWARD

FROM ROSS VASTA MP

Families in Bonner will benefit from greater child care support sooner, with the increased Child Care Subsidy (CCS) for multiple children brought forward from 7 March 2022, four months earlier than first expected.

The increased subsidies were due to come into effect on 11 July 2022, but the Government has been able to work with Commonwealth agencies and service providers to make necessary technical changes sooner.

From 7 March 2022, families with two or more children aged five years and under in care will have their CCS rate increased by 30 percentage points for their second child and younger children, up to a maximum rate of 95 per cent.

A family earning \$11,000 a year with two kids in care, four days a week, will be better off by \$100 a week.

The \$10,655 annual cap will also be scrapped on 10 December 2021 and applied retrospectively for the whole 2021-22 financial year, meaning families who hit the cap before the date will receive a refund on any excess fees paid.

There are around 1,700 families in Bonner that have two or more children in care and could benefit from the increased subsidy. More than half of eligible Australian families will receive the maximum 95 per cent subsidy.

Federal Member for Bonner Ross Vasta MP said the support would be targeted at those who need it most.

"We know child care costs can really add up when you have two, three or more children in care and this package will help those families by significantly reducing out-of-pocket costs for the second child and younger children," Mr Vasta said.

"This will make a real difference in the lives of families in Bonner. The changes will also see this government's total investment in child care grow to \$11 billion a year they build on the Child Care Package we introduced in 2018 that is still keeping out-of-pocket costs low."



RECYCLERS TO BENEFIT AS NEW HEMMANT DEPOT OPENS

Claiming recycling refunds on Brisbane's bayside just became more convenient with the establishment of a new depot servicing the Containers for Change scheme.

Advanced Container Recycling has opened at 1289 Lytton Rd in Hemmant in an expansion to make drink container recycling easier for locals.

The Containers for Change scheme provides a 10-cent refund to customers returning eligible beverage containers at any registered refund point across Queensland.

More than 4.5 billion containers have been recycled across the state since the scheme began three years ago, with Queenslanders claiming over \$450 million in refunds.

The opening of Advanced Container Recyclers Hemmant will allow to customers to use the drivethrough depot to claim refunds in cash or through EFT or PayPal via the use of their scheme ID.

They will not even have to leave their vehicle, with the depot providing a full in-car service.

The container refund point will provide recycling access to residents in the suburbs of Hemmant, Lota, Lytton, Manly, Manly West, Wynnum and Wynnum West.

The depot is open seven days a week from 8am, again highlighting its convenience for customers.

The business holds deep environmental sensibilities, with all staff at their depots wearing work shirts made from 100 per cent recycled

They were recently shortlisted as a finalist in the sustainability category of the annual state-wide Change Maker Awards.

Ken Noye, the chief executive of Containers Exchange, the not-for-profit organisation that administers the Containers for Change scheme, said the new depot would be a win for locals.

"The Queensland scheme welcomes Advanced Container Recycling opening up a new drivethrough depot at Hemmant," said Mr Noye.

"The business already has a strong record servicing nearby areas, with existing depots in Capalaba and Cleveland.

"With thousands of satisfied customers at their other depots they will now bring that wealth of experience to this new venture.

"The Containers for Change scheme is continuing

its strong push to raise recycling rates in southeast Queensland for the good of the natural environment.



SAFETY IMPROVEMENT WORKS START AT LINDUM CROSSING

A series of works to improve the safety of the Kianawah Road railway crossing in Lindum kicked off in October, starting with the trial of a Queensland Rail-first boom gate at the site.

Member for Lytton Joan Pease said the trial would see a custom-made 12-metre-long boom gate installed at the level crossing.

"Safety is the highest priority and Queensland Rail has been working closely with Brisbane City Council and the Department of Transport and Main Roads to support a range of upgrades to improve the safety of this intersection," Ms Pease said.

"As the first step in these works, Queensland Rail crews will be working overnight on Sunday 24 October to replace the existing 10-metre long boom arm with a longer 12-metre model that has been custom made

"The new boom arm aims to better protect drivers and deter them from entering the crossing once activated

"Queensland Rail's current design limits boom arms to 10 metres, however recent work has seen specialist parts supplied for the custom-made 12-metre boom arm – a Queensland Rail-first.

"The new boom arm has undergone extensive testing by Queensland Rail engineers to make sure it is suitable and will extend further across the road to stop cars from inadvertently entering the crossing once it's activated."

Transport and Main Roads Minister Mark Bailey said the safety initiative complemented the multi-million dollar upgrade of Lindum train station.

"Lindum station is set to receive an accessibility face lift through the over \$500 million Station Accessibility Upgrade Program," Mr Bailey said.

"The upgrade will see the installation of an improved pedestrian overpass with lift access linking platforms, as well as upgrades to the park 'n' ride facility.

"Detailed design and planning is well underway, so I look forward to sharing more information with the community soon."

"I first attended Rosies two-and-a-half years ago," Wayne recalls. "I'd experienced the loss of a significant family member and had one setback after another. I was seeking socialisation and regular support when someone mentioned I should give Rosies a try."

Wayne was a little hesitant at first; he was looking for a safe space to engage and interact with people on a regular basis.

Wayne continued, "I live alone so it's nice to have a place to go where I can chat to people. I like spending time with the people at Rosies; it helps me to feel connected with the local community and society in general".

Nearly three years on from his first visit with Rosies, Wayne attends almost every week.

"Rosies is really about feeling connected and spending time with people," said Wayne.

"There are people who attend that are on the street, but others are people who are lonely or don't have family in the area. At first I thought it was just for people who were homeless but it's also about connection and friendship with people.

EROBIN: FASCINATING FACTS ABOUT KING ISLAND'S HISTORY

Erobin is the Aboriginal name for King Island, which is only an island at high tide.

King Island, or Erobin, is a mass of dead coral, pebbles and sand settled out from Wellington Point on a broad flat plate. When the tide is out, millions of crustaceans, tiny crabs, limpets and grey mud whelks surround the island. As the water rises, at about 2cm depth, larger crabs quickly emerge and then disappear, camouflaged by the wet

Coarse beach grass stabilises the ground above high tide where small shrubs grow. Nearer the water there are Grey Mangroves, with their vertical above-ground roots uncovered during each tide change.

When the tide is out, there is an easy walk, gentle underfoot, along a sand bar laid down in a long, narrow "s" curve which commences at Wellington Point and continues far beyond the island in a single sweep out into the bay. Scores of visitors walk out at low tide; the game is to hurry back to safety at Wellington Point, and over the last dip before the rising water covers the pathway and is swirling around one's ankles, then up to one's knees.

This island was named No. 4 Island by Lieutenant Flinders who entered and named Moreton Bay in 1799. Mud, St Helena and Green Islands were named Nos. 1, 2 and 3 accordingly. The island's outline appears on the chart of John Gray in 1824, appearing as a rather larger area than today.

In the 1860s and 1870s the multitude of visiting campers denuded the trees for their campfires. The trees died leaving the coral cay unstable. Underlying sand and stones were gradually washed away by the tides.

The first attempt to save the shrinking island is noted in the Government Gazette of February 1887 when the island was proclaimed as a "Reserve for Recreation". Later, in 1975, the island was said to be an "Environmental Park".

The island and its foreshores lie within the Moreton Bay Wetlands, which is one of the Australia's Ramsar sites, protected by the Ramsar Convention. This convention was the first modern convention designed to conserve the world's natural resources, and on 2 February 1971, the first site was declared at the small Iranian town of Ramsar. This protection is of international significance in the conservation of natural biodiversity and halting the loss of worldwide wetlands and preserving and managing those still in place.

The Ramsar site includes the offshore sand islands and surrounding mangroves, intertidal mudflats, marshes, sandflats, coral reefs and seagrass beds. Around King Island there are extensive intertidal areas that are valuable for supporting waterbirds and fauna of conservation significance, as well as providing important nursery conditions for fish and crustaceans. So the island is now titled a "Conservation Park".

just one hectare of mangroves with shore and dune vegetation, surrounded by Moreton Bay Marine Park and included within the Moreton Bay Ramsar site.

There can be no development; the location is to be maintained in its natural condition. Prickly Pear first came to Australia in 1788 and was introduced to King Island to stabilise and reduce the soil loss caused by tides and wind, but by 1920 the Pear was overrunning the natural vegetation. Introduction of the cactoblasts moth, to eat and kill off the Pear, was unsuccessful. Volunteers are slowly removing the Pear, now a declared weed, from the island. Ironically the Pear does assist in the regeneration of young native plants as visitors are temporarily kept away by the prickles. The new native seedlings do not become trampled before they have time to become established.

Infantile Paralysis (Poliomyelitis) is a disease little heard of today. In 1903 there was no known treatment. Patients were advised to live a healthy life and bathe daily in warm salt water. The Phillips family, who lived at Hamilton Heights had a young daughter, Jo, who contracted the disease. Being a sailing family, they explored the bay for somewhere to live, and decided to move to King Island. They stayed there for 16

Mr Phillips was the manager of the Brisbane branch of the Commercial Bank of Sydney. He continued working in Brisbane and travelled each day by boat to Wellington Point, took a lift to the station and then a train ride, arriving for a daily 9.00am start. Similarly, he returned home to the island around 6.00pm in the evening, often in the dark. Mother Phillips, left on the island with seven children and a maid, is known to have been a very good cook and always full of energy.

Clarrie Phillips, brother to patient Jo, was another of the family's seven children. In 1980, at the age of 89, he wrote of his memories of the time spent on the island, from December 1904 to April 1906. Here are snippets from his writings.

"We spent 16 lovely months there... Daily, the children were swimming, boating and fishing. The fish were plentiful, as were oysters and crabs and these became the stable diet of the family. There was no fresh water on the island so 'Old Mr Radford', who had a stall on the Point, was engaged to carry water over to us. At low tide he came in his trap, drawn by his faithful horse 'Duke'. The track across was fairly good as the coral pieces, pebbles and shells made a pretty good surface."

But time was not all spent in play. The older children attended school. Clarence, Cyril and Bruce, aged 13, 11 and 7 years respectively, are recorded on the Wellington Point State School roll in 1905. Their address is "Camped on King Island", and father's occupation, "Bank Manager".

Clarrie noted with amazement, when writing in the 1980s, that the island had shrunk, saying that, "...more than half of the island has disappeared. The reason for that, was the action of the local council, in the 1930s. They cut down all the surrounding mangrove trees and the land washed away. The sandspit to Wellington Point has built up very considerably over time. We used to be cut off for three hours at each high tide.

"Sleeping quarters consisted of a large marquee with a wooden floor and a bell tent for the boys. The maid had a separate tent. The dining room/kitchen was under a large cottonwood tree and was protected by a galvanized roof. There was a colonial oven and a lean-to with an open fire and a camp oven".

The whole letter is available to read in the resources room of Wynnum Manly Historical Society located in the Wynnum Community Centre (the old Wynnum Central State School building) at 105 Florence Street, Wynnum. The room is open weekdays between 10am and 12noon.


FROM THE WATERLOO BAY LEISURE CENTRE

TIPS FOR A DECEMBER SEAFOOD BOUNTY FROM THE BAY

The year is at its end and there have been plenty of fish in the bay. Not much is going to change in December, just more traffic on the water, but if you can get out on the nice calm days, I'm pretty sure you can come home with a good feed.

Whiting will close by Chain Banks, Maroon, Amity, the Rous Channel, the Sand Hills and most of the western side of Moreton Island. Drifting with a paternoster rig with blood worms, beach worms, squid strips or peeled prawns (especially when there is a good run in the tide) will get you a feed.

School mackerel will be all through the bay, especially the southern side of Hope Banks, Peel Island, and Shark Spit, so a diving board and a 3-inch spoon trolled behind the boat at around 5 to 6 knots is the best way to catch these fish.

The water will be warm enough for the spotty mackerel to come in the bay - these are much bigger fish with the females in first, followed by

the smaller males three to four weeks later let's hope it's a better season than we've had in the past few years. The best way to catch these surface-feeding fish is a chrome slug (no wire) and cast and retrieve in the feeding schools. Water Tower Bait & Tackle carry a good non-expensive chrome slug that will work very well, and you don't have to borrow money from the bank to buy a few.

Squire and snapper will also be in good numbers around the shallow reefs and all our artificial reefs. so big baits like whole whiting or garfish, or whiting heads or mullet fillets will do the trick on a running rig with just enough weight to get to the bottom.

The tiger squid season should also be starting, so a squid jig on a float wherever you are fishing for whiting should get you a feed.

I hope you all had as good a year as possible. Have a merry Christmas and a happy New Year, stay safe on the water, and good fishing!

PS: All you will need for the mackerel season ahead are chrome slugs, diving boards and Smith jigs and spoons, and squid jigs for your calamari.















RACING FOR FUN, FRIENDSHIP AND SKILLS

Do you own a yacht but have never considered racing? Maybe it is time to try!

There are many cruising boats in Manly Harbour that never go racing. There are good reasons for the owners to reconsider this.

Racing improves your sailing. Anyone can sail a boat in calm weather, but safely managing changing conditions is a thing you learn when racing.

When you race you can compare your performance with those around you. If you see a similar boat going faster than you, you begin to think about what that crew is doing differently. Trim your sails in a similar way and, hey presto, you start to go quicker. And who doesn't want to get to an anchorage faster when on a long cruise?

Over time you are forced to tackle different weather conditions in races and again learn from your fellow competitors. The racing community is wonderful at sharing ideas and explaining the reasons behind decisions. You just have to be prepared to listen and learn.

Start racing in conditions that you feel you can handle and gain confidence. Start with white sails and then learn to fly a spinnaker. The race will push you but you can choose whether to go on the water on any given day or not.

In Manly there are a range of races in which you can participate. You can start racing on short courses like WAGS (run on Wednesday afternoons by Royal Queensland) and SAGS (run on Sunday afternoon by Wynnum Manly Sailing Club) or slightly longer courses as run once a month by the Manly Combined Clubs. More information about all these races can be found on relevant websites or Facebook pages.

When you have some experience and gain confidence you may also like to participate in some of the much longer events but this is entirely up to the boat owner. Fellow racers will be keen to talk about the events in after-race debriefs at the bar. You may be invited to crew in one of the longer events on a bigger boat.

Cost may also be a factor. To participate in the shorter events you need a category 5 audit which the clubs can help you to organise. This audit ensures you have basic safely equipment - a good check for any cruiser. You will pay an entry fee to cover the costs of running the race and your crew will need Australian Sailing numbers which also provides them with insurance.

Why not have a try and meet some new people who also love sailing?

AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST SHELLFISH REEF RESTORATION

Inspired by the Billion Oyster Project in New York Harbor, Australia's largest community-driven shellfish reef restoration project has launched in Moreton Bay led by fishing conservation charity,

Over the next six years, OzFish and its team of volunteers - many of them recreational anglers - will work to re-establish 19.4 hectares of lost shellfish reef in the Bay, in an area adjacent to the Port of Brisbane.

Access to this part of the Bay for the habitat restoration was provided by the Port of Brisbane, who has also provided port land to support OzFish's shell recycling centre for over three years.

It's a milestone that's been years in the making and one that Craig Copeland, CEO of OzFish Unlimited, describes as a gamechanger for shellfish reef restoration nationally.

"We've lost more shellfish reefs across Australia

than coral reefs and we not only need people to know about it – we need the community to help in its restoration," Mr Copeland said.

"OzFish and our selfless volunteer recreational anglers have been working for more than four years, collecting the shells, and designing the ROBS and shell washing machinery."

While the next stage has commenced, the work is far from over.

From their base at the Port, OzFish will monitor and progressively place over 50,000 robust oyster baskets (ROBS) into approved areas of the Bay which will ultimately create the reef.

The ROBs are handmade by recreational fishers and filled with recycled and sterilised oyster shells, which provide the base structures for baby oysters to grow on.

With funding from the Australian and Queensland Governments, OzFish has also worked with many

partners to get the project off the ground, including the Port of Brisbane and Healthy Land & Water.

Restoring these reefs not only creates vital shellfish

habitat, but also improves water quality, rejuvenates aquatic life and improves fish productivity. Ultimately, that means a healthier Moreton Bay and better recreational fishing for the community.

OVERTURNED TRIMARAN SPARKS TWO-DAY RESCUE

FROM BRISBANE COAST GUARD

A freak wind gust in the bay turned a pleasant afternoon of sailing into a terrifying ordeal for a trimaran owner recently. The owner was preparing his vessel to enter the Manly Harbour leads when a wind gust over-turned his normally very stable trimaran, breaking the mast and spearing the jib arm into the cabin.

The sailor was quickly recovered from the water, but due to the rough weather the Brisbane Coast Guard crews were initially unable to right the vessel.

"The vessel was in reasonably shallow water near the coast, so the mast was stuck in the mud," explained Coast Guard skipper Geoff Stanhope. "Then we needed to collapse one of the outriggers so we could roll the boat the right way up."

Complicating the recovery option, the Coast Guard team were receiving multiple calls for help as the wind picked up during the day. At one stage extra crews were mobilised, and the trimaran was left to float overturned while higher priority taskings were underway.

"We really appreciate members of the public who called to notify us of the upturned boat throughout the day," Geoff added, "It's great to see mariners looking out for each other".

Coast Guard crews continued the recovery the following day, and in much calmer weather the team were able to right the boat and tow it into harbour. The owner was relieved that his boat was salvaged. He cautioned other skippers to remain vigilant in windy conditions, and added that even close to harbour unexpected conditions can catch people out.

FESTIVE FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

FROM THE ROTARY CLUB OF WYNNUM AND MANLY'S ISOLATION: KITCHEN DESTINATION COOKBOOK, CONTRIBUTOR: MICHELINE ROSE,

INGREDIENTS

- 250g whole shelled brazil nuts, 150g walnut or pecan halves and 250g stoned dates, halved
- 100g glacé pineapple
- 100g red glacé cherries, 100g green glacé cherries, 100g glacé apricots
- 3/4 cup plain flour
- 1/2 tsp baking powder and a pinch salt
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 tbsp rum or sherry

METHOD

- Grease sides and base of a large loaf tin (8in x 5in; 20cm x 13cm) or use two smaller tins. Line with two layers of greased paper. A ring tin is also good for the whole mixture.
- Place whole brazil nuts, walnuts, cherries and halved dates in large bowl. Chop pineapple and apricots into chunks and add to mixture. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt and then mix with sugar. Add to nuts and fruit. Mix thoroughly.
- Mix in beaten eggs, rum or sherry and vanilla. Spoon into prepared tin; flatten with back of a spoon.
- Bake in slow oven (150°C) for 2 to 2 1/2 hours. (Reduce cooking time to approximately 1 to 1/2 hours if using smaller tins).
- Leave in tin 10 minutes; loosen edges and turn onto a cake cooler and remove the paper. (Or brush with extra rum or sherry when cooked and cool in tin – this is what I prefer.)
- When cold, wrap in foil or glad wrap and store in the refrigerator.


