
If you're like Maggie and love trying new things and meeting new people, there's plenty to keep you entertained close to home. Why not try something new this year?

GAMBLING COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

There will be four rounds of the Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF) in 2022, with a super-charged first round where applicants can apply for up to \$150 000.

SCHOOL FUNDING

The State Government provided funds for renovations and builds across 6 local schools this year. Wynnum State School, Wynnum West State School, Manly West State School and Wondall Heights State School completed upgrades in 2021, while Darling Point Special School and Manly State School will start work on new learning centres in 2022.

3 schools – Wynnum State High, Manly State School, and Wynnum West State School – also receive organic waste program grants to start in-school composting systems.

BUSINESS

The Business Support Grant was run in the second half of 2021 to help businesses recover from COVID-19 lockdowns, with more than \$280 million awarded to businesses throughout Queensland ...

YOUNG PARENTS' GROUP PROVIDES VALUABLE SUPPORT

FROM BABI YOUTH & FAMILY SERVICE

BABI Youth & Family Service hosts a Young Parents' Group every Thursday morning at Wynnum from 10am to 11:30am. This program was created due to a growing need from young parents in our community who have been feeling isolated and alone.

This group aims to provide a safe, supportive and welcoming space for parents under the age of 25.

"Young parents have many barriers to accessing support, including the social stigma around young parenthood," explained BABI's Catriona Kucks.

"Being welcomed into a space, with no judgement, allows parents to respond positively to our youth workers and reduces the anxiety of making new connections. Young people can meet other parents from the community and be able to share experiences and challenges with like-minded people."

Parents attending the group have the opportunity to talk to experienced, educated and compassionate workers who can assist with referrals to other services if required. The group is there for what each individual requires – whether it's to make new friends, to get advice from peers, or to receive information about other services that may assist them in different areas.


Parents can come along to allow their children to interact with other children while they have a tea or coffee and snacks with other parents.

VOLUNTEER GRANTS SUPPORT 30 COMMUNITY GROUPS IN BONNER

The Morrison Government's 2021 Volunteer Grants has seen 30 of Bonner's community groups awarded a total of \$116,768 in funding to support the role they play in our area as we move forward out of the pandemic. Funding awarded to Bayside community groups include, Wynnum and District Horse and Pony Club, Wynnum Christian Community Church, Wynnum Manly District Cricket Club, Sailability Bayside, Care Kits for Kids, Bayside Creeks Catchment Group and Bayside Sea Scouts.



These organisations have been provided grants of \$1,000 to \$5,000 to help with training and retention of volunteers, strengthening of participation in volunteering, supporting organisational activities and funding technologies like laptops to assist in the delivery of services. I look forward to visiting these organisations, thanking our volunteers for their contribution, and seeing how this funding has made a difference.

I recently checked out the major renovations underway at Moreton Bay Trailer Boat Club where they are upgrading their restaurant and bar to keep up with their growing membership. YOUNG LOCAL ENTREPRENEUR SUPPORTS ROSIES

It was a chance encounter at a market that inspired 12-year-old Mackenzie Robinson to start a local candle business, Kenzie's Candles.

"We were coming home from a camping trip and stopped at a market, and I saw a stall selling candles and thought it looked really cool," Mackenzie said.

"I like candles, they are very nice and comforting to have around the house."

The Year 7 student has sold candles through her Instagram account @kenzies.candles since August last year and hand pours everything in her parents' kitchen.

The young entrepreneur's mother Kylie said operating the business had helped Mackenzie to understand budgeting.

"It's good for her to learn to manage the expenses, look after stock control, and make sure she has enough put away to cover the cost of new items," she said.

Not only does Mackenzie look after the business side of things, but she also has included an element of social enterprise into her model, with \$1 from every sale going to support Rosies – Friends on the Street, a Queensland-based charity that supports those who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, or socially isolated in the local community.

"I was a bit surprised that Mackenzie wanted to start a business, but I was not at all surprised when she said that she wanted to donate money to Rosies," Kylie said.

"She has always been a very caring person and had learned about Rosies through her Year 6 teacher Ms Carroll.

"Ms Carroll is a Rosies volunteer and had a big impact on a lot of the girls in the class – she shared about her experiences volunteering and they made care packages for those in need," said Kylie.

Yvette Carroll built a module called *The Pursuit of Happiness: Is it within everyone's reach?* which focused on whether the world was equal for all and looked at some of the factors that prevent people from happiness.

"It was really important to me that the students defined what happiness is to them and then we

looked at some of the things that plague society and often swept under the rug – things like racism, inequality, homelessness, etc," Yvette said.

One of the outreach locations for Rosies is just a 15-minute drive from the school where Yvette teaches, and by sharing stories from members of their local community, she felt like things were put into perspective and opened the eyes of the Year 6 students.

"Prior to teaching the unit I think a lot of the kids thought homelessness didn't happen in Australia. That it was a problem in places like America, not here, but the local stories helped them see it was happening in their backyard."

Yvette, who is also a team leader with Rosies, has been volunteering since December of 2019 and speaks fondly of her experiences with the organisation.

"I really enjoy it and love the connection, each month I get to sit alongside someone that the rest of society ignores. Sitting alongside and talking to the patrons gives you a dose of perspective – some



of the most intelligent conversations I've ever had have been with our patrons on outreach."


It is through sharing experiences like this with the students that inspired Mackenzie to tack on support of Rosies to her business model.

LIGHT UP MANLY

There were hundreds of young children and their parents in the Park which was great to see!

Some primary schools had been involved in making small lanterns which had been placed in the park. Children were allowed to take their lanterns home after the event The lantern maker had constructed and lit up larger lanterns around the perimeter of the Park. The main event for the night was the Official Opening of the creative lighting projections on the new foreshore plaza. There are four series of projection artworks, each made of four projected designs telling the stories of Manly. The idea is to switch the series on a regular basis.

If you haven't been down to see the foreshore plaza, it really is worth a look. I regard it as another tourist attraction for Wynnum Manly!

AUSTRALIA DAY CELEBRATIONS

I am pleased to advise that the Wynnum Manly Australia Day Breakfast will be held again this month at Bandstand Park, Manly. It will start at 7am until 12Noon on Wednesday, 26 January 2022.

As usual, entertainment will include a kid's show, a bush band, and a covers band – all on the Bandstand at Bandstand Park. There is also a Children's Colouring-In Competition (entry forms are available from my office) and the Scope Club Australia Day Awards.

The event is funded mainly through the SIF (Suburban Improvement Fund) which comes through Council's Budget but is controlled by me. Supplementary funding is allocated by the Wynnum Manly Leagues Club and the Wynnum RSL. Local Service Clubs volunteer on the day as well: Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly, Rotary Club of Port of Brisbane, Scope Club, Bay Belles CWA, Red Cross, Quota Club, Wynnum Scouts and Wynnum Vikings AFL Club.

E-SCOOTER TRIALS

A 6 month trial of the E-Scooters in Wynnum Manly and Deagon Wards started on 1 December 2021. The scooters have operated from 2018 in various wards across the city. More than 1.1Million trips have been achieved in 2021- 22 (up to 23 November).

The orange scooters are supplied by Neuron and the purple scooters are supplied by Beam.

Each company can supply a maximum of 100 scooters in Wynnum Manly.

Both Neuron & Beam have limited the maximum speed of their scooters to 15KMPH along the Esplanade. The maximum speed is 25KMPH in other locations.

The scooters are high tech. An App needs to be downloaded onto your mobile phone to use the scooter. The App includes areas where the scooter can be used and where it should be parked.

The scooters have been heavily used by the general public. I urge everyone to send in emails both for and against the scooters right through until the six month trial concludes on 1st June 2022.

I urge all users to leave their scooters in an approved parking area at the end of their ride and to park them neatly. Also be thoughtful of pedestrians and make plenty of use of the bell on the scooter to warn pedestrians of your approach.

If you have any concerns with the orange scooters, please contact Neuron Customer Support Team. They have a 24/7 customer support that any member of the public can contact (e.g. to report any misparked e-scooters or any other questions or concerns).

Wynnum Manly Leagues Club made a net income of \$4,278,182. This is up four fold from \$1,067,447 last year. However, CEO Craig Thomas said that this was a figure inflated by the valuation of houses owned by the Club. He preferred the normal Club earnings net profit of \$2.6Million. This was still an all-time record and up 244%.

Bayside Football Club reported a Net Operating Profit of \$45,112.00

Wynnum Golf Club reported a net profit of \$45,720.00

IS A 'CAR DETAIL' ONE OF YOUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS?

Dr Dale Garred, GP at Manly Village Medical Centre, reminds us not to forget about a skin check when considering our health goals this New Year.

New Year resolutions have been one of the most searched topics on New Year's Eve for many years. Though at first the resolutions we consider may be frivolous, (I'd personally like to be able to do the splits by December), with more thought however, especially with a pandemic in the haze, they turn more serious, with many resolving to be 'healthier' or to 'look after themselves better'. As a result, many patients attend their GP Practice in the early parts of the new year for their '100 000km full service' – keen to get their blood pressure checked, or maybe a blood test.

Did you know though, that Queensland is still considered to be the 'Skin Cancer Capital of the World'? So right up there with heart troubles and elevated cholesterol, Skin Cancer is a significant cause of ill health in our community and as such it is so important that we don't forget the 'exterior detail' (aka skin check) in addition to the 'grease and oil change' this new year.

GPs have the knowledge and skills to perform skin checks. They can also discuss with you your individual skin cancer risk and provide advice on how often you require a skin check in order to prevent or detect Skin Cancer early.

Skin Cancer occurs when particular types of cells in certain layers of the skin change (become abnormal) in response to exposure to UV radiation (sun) over time. Anyone can develop skin cancer, irrespective of your age, skin type or whether you have ever been sunburnt. Some types of skin cancer can even be life threatening, though prognosis can be significantly improved with early detection.



If you would like your 'exterior detail', as part of your New Year Health Goals, or if you are concerned about any spots on your skin, phone your GP and ask for an appointment for a full skin check on top of your general appointments this new year.





Travelling with pets, whether for a day trip or an extended holiday, is becoming more common than ever before. Here are some tips to help ensure that everyone can enjoy the trip!

TRAVEL SAFE

- Your pet should be well restrained in the car to prevent accidents. This means a well fitted harness and seatbelt or a crate for smaller dogs and cats.
- Keep a water bottle and bowl handy to ensure your pet stays well hydrated – when you stop for refreshments give them a drink too!
- A collar and lead should be kept on at all times when out of the car, especially in unfamiliar environments where sometimes even the best trained dog may be too distracted to listen to recall commands.
- Calming products or sedatives as required for anxious travellers.

CLEANING PRODUCTS

- Wet wipes
- Hand sanitiser
- Poo bags
- Puppy pads
- Towels
- Grooming supplies shampoo, brushes

FOOD

- Now is not the time to try new food keep a supply of your pet's usual diet (especially if they are on a specific diet for medical needs).
- Keep a supply of dry food in a sealed container readily accessible.
- Wet food in cans or pouches.
- Treats.

MEDICINE AND FIRST AID

- A pet first aid kit is a valuable tool there are commercially available kits for dogs and cats. At the very least a supply of saline, betadine and a few bandages may come in handy!
- Medications make sure you have a supply of any prescription medications your pet needs.
- Vaccination records caravan parks and other facilities will often require you to show proof that your pet is up to date with their vaccinations.
- Vet contact details it's a good idea to have both your regular vet's contact details and an idea of the location of vet clinics in the area you are travelling to.

LOCAL WOMAN WITH TERMINAL ILLNESS GIVES BACK

Despite her terminal illness, Gumdale woman Jo Boon is determined to not let her diagnosis of Motor Neurone Disease (MND) define her. To help others going through their MND journey, Jo and her family recently held a gala fundraiser and raised more than they thought was possible!

The Boons presented a cheque to MND Queensland with the final fundraising amount revealed to be an incredible \$51,000 that will help change many lives.

Passionate is just one word that describes Jo and her family in their efforts to increase awareness of the disease that will sadly steal her ability to speak, move, swallow and eventually breathe.

Since being diagnosed in October 2019, Jo has fiercely campaigned to share her story of 'rebellious hope*' and has done much to raise awareness of the impacts of MND before it robs her ability to speak, stating it is a cruel disease that 'silences the storytellers'.

In an effort to give back and gather an audience for her to share her story, Jo took on the task of throwing a gala to raise funds for MND Queensland, who provide specialised supports to families impacted by this terminal illness. MND affects over 2,000 Australians and on average two more people are diagnosed daily and sadly two people die every day from MND. The average life expectancy is just 2.5 years from diagnosis, which explains Jo's urgency to share her voice now.

In her speech, Jo said she knows it "may be too late for her", with no known cure yet found for MND, but she is now selflessly advocating for others so that they do not have the suffer with the same impacts.

We asked Jo what motivated her to put on the event and she said "from day one I wanted to do something to give back". She was particularly motivated to get involved when she learned that people diagnosed with MND after the age of 65 don't qualify for the NDIS.

"I saw red and then I felt guilty. I want to give back to all of my friends...I don't think it's fair that you work all your life and you get a disease that's got no cure and then no help," said Jo.

The family initially set out to raise \$10,000 for the charity, and were overwhelmed with generosity as it grew to \$51,000. MND Queensland's CEO, Ian Landreth said that the funds will go a long way to providing specialised support services for clients regardless of age and it could not be possible without the Boon family's perseverance to create awareness.

"We are very grateful to Jo and the Boon family. The gala was amazing

and it was so much more than a fundraising event... it was a 'Life Event'. People learned about MND, they laughed and cried and had a magical evening thanks to Peter and Jo and their amazing family and friends," Mr Landreth said.

Christian explained that three things were important for all mariners to think about before leaving harbour:

- 1. Do you have all the right safety gear? Check the MSQ website to see what flares, EPIRBs and other safety equipment must be carried. Even vessels that don't require registration such as kayaks or small tinnies should consider safety gear.
- 2. Is your boat in good shape? Service your motor regularly, check that your battery is in good condition, make sure your fuel isn't stale and all your electrics (such as starter motor, lights and radio) have been tested.
- 3. Are you prepared for the conditions? Always check the weather forecast for the area of the Bay you're heading for, carry sufficient water, and add a First Aid kit to your boat.

"We're always available on weekends to help provide advice at the Coast Guard station," Christian advised. "You can turn in your old flares and buy replacement ones, talk to us about our on-water Marine Assist scheme, and we even sell ice!"

The new intake of volunteers at Brisbane Coast Guard have spent the last few months completing their training and are ready to help boaties over the summer. For Christian's D Roster crew, they've already been putting their skills to work with a recent 'double tow', where two boats needed help in the same area simultaneously.

WAITOA: FROM THE TORRES STRAIT TO MANLY HARBOUR

This fascinating new publication brings to life the story of the veteran sailing lugger now moored at Manly Harbour.

The story of *Waitoa*, the veteran Torres Strait sailing lugger tied up at a prominent berth in Manly boat harbour, is told in a new book featuring the maritime life of Queensland.

Arnie Duffield, the "last man standing" from the halcyon days of the sailing luggers and the pearling industry in Torres Strait, has published his memoirs at the age of 95.

He recalls his time as owner of the lugger when she was the nameship of his company, Waitoa Pearling:

"I have a few mementoes of *Waitoa*. There is a picture of the boat weighted down a bit with three tonnes of pearl shells in her stern-sheets, and a large model of her in my sitting room today that was made by an employee, an Islander who used plans drawn up by a shipwright on Thursday Island – all featured with pictures in the book. Waitoa was originally part of the Cleveland Pearling Company. All their boats' names were with a 'W'. They also had the *Waikato, Waikeri* and *Waimate*.

"We acquired *Waitoa* as part of a flotilla boats used by a pearl cultivation enterprise, started with Japanese investors in 1960, with a laboratory at Escape River near the tip of Cape York. As time went on she became a ferry for Islanders working at Escape River to

travel back and forth to TI. When an oil spill wiped out the cultivation business in 1970 we returned this lugger and few others to fishing for pearl shells, called mother-of-pearl, in the Torres Strait."

The Arnie Duffield memoir includes his time doing war work at Evans Deakin in the 1940s after evacuation from TI to Brisbane, aged 16, repairing allied submarines and Liberty ships, seven days a week – then later finding time to operate ferries on Moreton Bay for a Duffield family company at Bulimba.

Several Torres Strait luggers were constructed in Brisbane including two commissioned by Arnie and his brother Jim in 1954.

The book, an authentic story from tumultuous times, is about pearls from the sea, the boats, the dangers of deep-sea diving, war on Australia's doorstep, threats to the environment, and the diverse people of the Strait.

It is replete with yarns, about crocodiles or sharks, drunks, bad weather at sea, a near-drowning, a mercy dash in a fast boat to save a downed pilot, and a few close shaves on bush air-strips.

While it is presented as more a memento than a blockbuster, the diverting personal history is woven into the strong historical background and contains details and information of heritage significance, especially about the searraft.

After more than 70 years in the far North Arnie moved into retirement on the Sunshine Coast living near family.

Arnie: Pearls and Luggers in the Torres Strait has been co-written with Lee Duffield, a cousin and former journalist and academic.

The book is available online through Xlibris.com, and at selected bookshops including the newsagency and bookshop at the Manly 7 Day Market arcade, the Queensland Maritime Museum and the State Library of Queensland shop on Southbank.

WHERE THE FISH ARE JUMPING THIS JANUARY

Happy New Year to all our readers, and a happy and healthy 2022!

Well, if you have a boat and kids on school holidays, all you would be waiting for is good weather to get out on the bay to catch a fish or two. January is a bit hit and miss with lots of windy and rainy days, but also some dead-calm ones.

Thousands of boats are normally out with lots of families catching fresh fish for the table. Popular spots include the western side of the islands from Tangalooma to the Sand Hills at Moreton Island, and from Amity to One Mile, and of course, Horseshoe Bay, which the northerly winds turn into Queen Street Mall on a Friday night. It's great to see so many boats on the bay.

This month, fishing is normally very good with plenty of whiting for all. The Small Boat Channel, the Rous, the Sand Hills, Moreton Island and Amity Banks will have enough whiting for everyone.

The school mackerel are hit and miss this time of the year as we wait for the spotty mackerel to show up, but if you put some time into having a troll between east of the Hope Banks and the entrance to the Small Boat Channel and the start of the Chain Banks, you have a good chance of getting a couple of nice fish. While trolling keep an eye out for feeding turns to indicate spotty mackerel or tuna feeding on a bait ball on the surface. Trolling is okay, but a chrome slug cast into the outside of a feeding school and a fast retrieve will get you a fish.

January is tiger squid season and as the water clears a little more they should front up at Green Island, but they seem to start at the weed banks at the Small Boat Channel and all through the Rous and Amity Banks. The weed banks at the western side of Moreton Island will also be producing plenty of squid, especially an hour each side of the tide, and dawn and dusk.

Snapper and squire and some really nice sweetlip are also around. Try near the shallow ground around the Bay Islands and the artificial reefs.

VALE BRUCE FLEMING, AN ORIGINAL MARINE RESCUE HERO

CONTRIBUTED BY BRISBANE COAST GUARD

Bruce Fleming, the founding father of Brisbane Coast Guard, has passed away in Robina Hospital after a long illness. His wife Judy Fleming and his son Steve were by his bed at the end.

On 8th November, 1972, Bruce Fleming and six fishermen mates were enjoying a break at the Moreton Bay Trailer Boat Club when a ship's radio alerted them to a serious boating accident near Amity on North Stradbroke Island. There was no volunteer marine rescue organisation in Moreton Bay at the time, so Bruce and his six mates jumped into their boats and raced across to Amity to help. They managed to save two people, although a third person drowned.

Following this tragedy, Bruce Fleming and his six mates vowed to establish a local rescue service in Moreton Bay, using their own vessels and their own time. Others soon joined 'The Magnificent Seven', and in the following year they applied to join the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association. In 1973 Bruce Fleming and his team were recognised as 'QF2' – the second Coast Guard unit in Queensland, now more commonly known as Brisbane Coast Guard.

At first, QF2 operated from a caravan on the Wynnum waterfront. By 1979 their rescue activities had outgrown this tiny space and needed

larger premises. The Port of Brisbane Authority offered to lease them land on Norfolk Point, near the mouth of Manly Boat Harbour. Bruce Fleming and his team built the current Coast Guard base there with their own hands, using their own equipment, and with great community support. The current base was officially opened in 1979.

Since then, Brisbane Coast Guard has assisted many thousands of boaties in distress, worked with the Water Police on many hundreds of Search and Rescue operations, and saved countless lives at sea. It has expanded its reach, establishing a secondary base in Redland Bay (now an independent Flotilla called QF7 Redland Bay Coast Guard) and increasing the size of its fleet of vessels to nine so it can operate in all types of in-shore and off-shore waters.

Bruce Fleming continued to serve as a Coast Guard volunteer through all this expansion. He continued as a crewman and radio watchkeeper on his regular duty roster at Manly, to regularly attend monthly Flotilla General Meetings, and to be involved in Flotilla activities and fundraising events until his recent illness.

Bruce Fleming was loved by his colleagues at QF2, and had many friends throughout Coast Guard and in the local boating community.

Bruce Fleming was honoured by Coast Guard with a Distinguished Service Award in 2014, and by the Federal Government with The National Medal and Bar.

Bruce Fleming embodied the finest traditions of Coast Guard Service. As the founding father of QF2, he'll be sadly missed by his shipmates. We all wish his noble soul "Fair Winds and Following Seas".

EASY BREEZY SUMMER WHITEBAIT ON A PLATE RECIPE

FROM SPERO KARTANOS

Who better to ask for a sizzling whitebait recipe than local fisherman Spero Kartanos? He's been cooking these crispy little bites for years, and his recipe is perfection! For the freshest meal, why not try Spero's tips for catching your own fish?

Here is one of my all-time favourite meals: whitebait or bluebait from Moreton Bay. These fish are dusted in flour, then deep fried in light olive oil. My Mum and Dad ate this dish often, and it's one I love.

These little critters are in good supply in the summer months, but January/February are the best.

Catch them at night in a boat with a spotlight on, or even try your luck on a jetty where there is a light. These little fish tend to school up, especially if there are some predators chasing them or trying to eat them, so a butterfly mesh net on a long handle will normally get you enough for a meal, and they are so tasty (Water Tower Bait and Tackle at Manly carry these nets).

METHOD

- 1. Put your whitebait in a plastic bag with some flour and give it a gentle shake.
- 2. Remove the fish from the bag and put them in a colander to get rid of the excess flour.
- 3. Heat a frying pan with a couple of centimetres of light olive oil. It should be hot enough to sizzle when you dip a chip in it.
- 4. Add your fish to the hot pan, and deep fry your fish in batches until it's crispy and cooked through.
- 5. Put your cooked fish on a paper towel to remove any excess oil.
- 6. Serve straight away with a squeeze of lemon and aioli on the side. Chili jam will also make this a memorable dish.





A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE PLACE WE CALL COOCHIE

Board the ferry at Victoria Point for a seven-minute ride to the island of Coochiemudlo. Here is a minute island, only five square kilometres in size.

Evidence of at least 25,000 years of Aboriginal occupation is acknowledged by the presence of traces of shell middens and stone mortars.

The spiritual significance of the iron-rich red ochre cliffs, on island's south western flank, visible from the mainland, gave the name Goochi-mudlo (red earth/stone) in the Jandai language of the Quandamooka people.

The first European to step onto the island on 19 July 1799 was Lieutenant Matthew Flinders, during his voyage of exploration in the "Norfolk", to find navigable rivers north of Sydney.

Flinders had sailed into Moreton Bay but did not discover the Brisbane River. He referred to Coochie as the Sixth Island. A re-enactment of his landing is celebrated annually on the Sunday nearest to 19 July, at Norfolk Beach, on the east side of the island. This beach was named in 1977 and gazetted in 1982. A stone monument to record Flinders' landing can be found there.

Government Surveyor, Robert Dixon, named the island "Innis Island" in 1840, in honour of Lieutenant Innis, who had recently explored southern Moreton Bay. This name stayed in place until the 1880s. The island's name then reverted to the original Aboriginal name, but was anglicized as Coochiemudlo.

The island was granted to the Queensland Acclimatization Society in 1868. The Society's task was to import plants that could have commercial potential, and to conduct experiments to determine if they could be adapted to Queensland's tropical and subtropical climate. The grant was declined.

In the 1880s bullock teams were swum over from the mainland to drag the felled trees down to the sea for use in the construction of wharves in Brisbane. The Moreton Bay Oyster Company took oysters from beds surrounding the island.

Interest was aroused again 1887 in developing the potential of the island. The western side of the island was subdivided into one-acre lots for the future growth of bananas, passionfruit, grapes, paw paws, pineapples, tomatoes, vegetables and custard apples.

The first auction of this crown land was on 24 January 1888. Ninety allotments were advertised but no one showed any interest in settling on the island.

In 1896 Henry Wright and his son Norman set up camp. They left "this god forsaken place" in about 1900. The sandflies and mosquitoes were intolerable. Norman Wright went on to build Norman Wright and Sons, a nationally respected boat building firm.

The land, though subdivided, was unoccupied and was exploited for timber and for grazing of cattle, swum across from the Victoria Point farms. Prior to WW1, Mr Morcom cleared the southwest corner and built the first farmhouse. But the project was not viable. Phillip Forrest purchased this farmhouse in 1919 and offered

Doug Morton and Eric Gardon, both ex WW1 survivors, the opportunity to share-farm the property.

Doug Morton stayed there for 40 years and made a success of the venture. He married Mary Colburn in 1921 and Mary was the only female on the island for the next 12 years. Doug was the initiator of the tourist industry in the 1930s. He built several jetties and the golf course in the southwest corner of the island. The Mortons left the island in 1966 when they felt the place was too crowded.

During WWII the island was home to the 42 and 43 Landing Craft Companies who trained there, then served with distinction in New Guinea and Bougainvillea in 1945. Trainees included Sir Frank Packer, Sir Ninian Stephen and Sir Nigel Bowen.

The farming era was over by the late 1950s when many of the leases were bought and subdivided by two real estate agents. Alfred Grant bought land to the east and Richard Marsh to the north and west. But the subdivisions were small, only suitable for holiday cottages. So, in the 1960s, sales were few with only 20 people living on the island by 1970.

Infrastructure development increased rapidly in the 1970s. A new concrete jetty was built in 1971. The island was connected to the town water supply. A community hall was built in 1973. Electricity was connected in 1978. There was a regular ferry service. The vehicular barge came in 1987. Unfortunately, connection to underground sewage was not available until 2006. But the level of permanent residency rose.

A land management plan was drawn up to preserve the foreshore and prevent the building of waterfront houses. This "Emerald Fringe" gives the island an air of mystery. The society of the island is now diverse, ranging from permanent and temporary residents, retirees, professionals, artists, writers and trades people. Community groups include a Progress Association, an Art Group and Life Saving Volunteers. Sporting facilities exist for golf, tennis, croquet and bowls.

For the past 15 years SAILS at Bayside has provided opportunities through sailing and kayaking for young people at risk, and their families and their carers, to overcome difficulties, reach their potential and engage fully in community life.

SAILS is a community outreach of several southern Moreton Bay Anglican Parishes. Their sailing and kayaking activities support organisations like BABI and Silky Oaks, as they work with young people not receptive to traditional programs.

On-water activities are held for children in out-of-home care, school groups with specific needs, and in recent years, refugees through the Qld Program of Assistance to Survivors of Torture & Trauma (QPASTT).


SAILS operates four catamarans, 14 kayaks, and a safety boat. Funding for maintenance and operations comes from fundraising activities (BBQs, trivia nights etc.), monthly public sailing and kayaking events at Wynnum or Cleveland, donations, and occasional grants.

Covid-19 has significantly impacted on finances. In addition to covering operating and maintenance costs, SAILS will need to relocate its purpose-built catamaran shed in the next year or so when the current site is no longer available.

SAILS' leaders and volunteers are resilient and resourceful and take these challenges head-on because of their commitment to their participants and the proven success of their activities.

SAILS at Bayside welcomes help - both financial and volunteering (and it's fun to boot!).


