

COMMUNITY PROFILE: REPAIR CAFÉ BRISBANE BAYSIDE

What is a Repair Café? The name's a giveaway, but it's certainly a fairly new concept.

A Repair Café is a place you can go to for a cup of coffee or tea and at the same time get your broken things fixed. Simple really!

Getting an item fixed saves it from becoming landfill, extends its life, and can save you money as well. Part of the fun is that, instead of simply dropping off your item to be fixed, you participate in the repair at the Repair Café (if you can).

The idea was the brainchild of Martine Potsma, a Dutch lady, who in 2009 set up the first Repair Café in Amsterdam. Since then, Repair Cafés have popped up all over the world (check out https://www.repaircafe.org/bezoeken), including two not that far away: one at The Gabba and one at Sandgate (on Facebook here: https://www.facebook.com/repaircaferp).

Following a trial late last year, Repair Café Brisbane Bayside will commence operation in February at the Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre at 241 Tingal Road, Wynnum. It will be open once a month, on alternate Saturdays and Sundays, for two hours. During that time, the Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre volunteers will be serving their famous Devonshire Teas to satisfy the café aspect of the project.

WYNNUM WOLVES FC ENTERS ITS SECOND CENTURY

FROM WYNNUM WOLVES FC

This year will see the Wynnum Wolves Football Club enter into its second century of playing football in the bayside after closing out its centenary year in style before the festive break.

The club held its final event of the 2021 centenary season at Majestic Cinemas in Wynnum in December, where current and past members and local dignitaries gathered for the launch of the club's centenary book – 100 Years of Football at Wynnum – and to celebrate a successful milestone year.

Wynnum is one of only a handful of Queensland clubs to have reached the 100-year milestone, and the book reveals the club's 1975 women's team was the first Australian women's team to win a trophy from an overseas tour for women's football. The side travelled to New Zealand to play for the Union Travel Trophy against other women's teams in Auckland and brought home the silverware.

Founded in 1921 by John Hutchinson—a former Wynnum councillor—Wynnum has long been known as the "battlers of Brisbane football". The club has endured through name revisions, colour changes, home ground changes, floods, relegation, promotion, petty officialdom and more. Its success is thanks to the passion of the many wonderfully dedicated people who have helped to





make the club what it is today: a genuine football village. More than 900 players from juniors through to masters will play for Wynnum Wolves FC in 2022.



Active School Travel (ATS)

Congratulations to another two Wynnum Manly Ward schools; Wondall Heights State School and Manly State School who have taken up the offer from Council to conduct an Active School Travel (AST) program for their students.

This adds to the already established programs at Manly West State School and Lota State School.

The AST program is a successful avenue to help alleviate traffic congestion around local primary schools, at no cost.

The program encourages students, parents, carers and teachers to leave the car at home and actively travel to school. Since 2004, 166 schools and more than 121,000 students have participated in the Active School Travel (AST) program.

In 2020 our AST schools achieved the following

- 18,000 students from 37 schools engaged with the program
- 2 in 5 families left the car at home
- on average, 40% of students actively travelled, with some schools reporting up to 70% of their students actively travelling to school
- walking trips increased from 14% to 32%, which equates to almost 4500 more walking trips per week from students in the first year of the program.



100th, 105th and 110th birthday letters can be arranged from Her Majesty The Queen, Governor-General of Australia, Prime Minister of Australia, Governor of Queensland, and Premier of Queensland, as well as 60th, 65th, 70th (Diamond) anniversary letters.

If you would like to arrange a letter, please provide a birth certificate or marriage certificate to my office and allow for up to 4 weeks for the letter to arrive.



Also, whether you are a local resident, community group, or business, if you provide your email address, I will keep you up to date with grants and other opportunities through my monthly newsletter.

In November, I reconvened the Bayside Mental Health Working Group and invited Brisbane South PHN, in partnership with Feros Care to present social prescribing, an internationally recognised approach to youth mental health. With loneliness and isolation being known risk factors in multiple youth issues, the team presented a prototype for 14-25 years old's.

I am pleased to confirm consultation with local youth has since commenced on the Bayside. This is evidence of our local community groups coming together for the common goal of filling mental health service gaps on the Bayside.

The Bonner Youth Advisory Council (BYAC) is looking forward to another big year and I invite all our local schools to be apart of it. This program provides students with the chance to meet with myself and other community leaders.

As part of the visit, we were led on a tour of the organisations fertiliser plant at Gibson Island. We met with workers to learn about how this agreement would support the scaling up of the domestic manufacturing and supply of AdBlue. This agreement is another important part of our Government's strategy to build supply chain resilience.

LOOKING AFTER SOMEONE WITH COVID AT HOME



So you've just tested positive for Covid, or someone who lives with you has. Now what?

Being prepared reduces anxiety and makes a difficult situation easier. Many, if not all of us, will be facing this situation over the coming months.

- Keep calm and isolate, for a minimum of seven days. Make arrangements for groceries and medications to be dropped off outside your door. If you don't have anyone to assist with this, you can call the Community Recovery Hotline on 1800 173 349 to arrange non-contact delivery as well as social support.
- 2. Notify people with whom you've been in recent contact.
- 3. Plan for who can look after your children, pets, or people in your care, if you have to go to hospital.
- 4. Look after yourself plenty of rest, fluids (non-alcoholic), and fresh air and sunshine in your own backyard if possible. Given many people's diets are lacking in vitamins, it's advisable to take vitamin C, vitamin D and zinc.
- 5. Monitor your symptoms with a diary check your temperature twice daily, and learn how to check your own pulse and breathing rate. If you can, get a pulse oximeter to measure your oxygen levels.
- 6. Check in by phone with your doctor if your symptoms are worse than a regular cold, or if you have risk factors for severe illness, ring your GP, or your local respiratory clinic. They will be able to advise you if any other medication is needed.

LEARNING TO READ YOUR CAT

BY DR NICKY THOMAS, WYNNUM MANLY VETERINARY HOSPITAL



Have you ever wondered what your cat is thinking or feeling? Cats use their bodies in a variety of ways to communicate their moods – learning to identify their emotions through observation of their body language

can help to improve your understanding of your cat's behaviour. A combination of the position of ears, eyes, body and tail can give you some clues about their state of mind.

HAPPY AND RELAXED

A cat feeling happy and relaxed will often look sleepy — their muscles are loose and their head still.

- Ears relaxed in a normal posture, not flattened or angled back.
- Eyes pupils will be normal size and eyelids may droop.
- Body a relaxed cat may lie on its side, exposing its belly. If in a sitting position, they will have a straight back and their head will be held up.
- Tail extended and flat, fairly still, fur lying flat.

PLAYFUL

A playful cat may demonstrate this by instigating play – this may be stalking you or looking for a toy and beginning to play.

- Ears held up, pointing forward.
- Eyes a playful cat will often watch you intently and have dilated nunils
- Body playful cats like to stalk; they may be in a crouched position ready to pounce!
- Tail the tail is held down just before pouncing. A cat in a playful mood may raise or flick their tail and some younger cats and kittens will even chase their own tail.

SCARED OR WORRIED

An anxious cat will often hide and avoid contact. They may develop the "Halloween cat" posture of arched back and raised tail. Some frightened cats will show their teeth and hiss.

 Ears – may flick back and forth rapidly. Ears may be held down, point sideways or lie flat.

- Eyes nervous cats are very watchful. Eyes will be held open and pupils widely dilated.
- Body arched back with fur standing on end.

There are a number of other ways which cats can communicate.

These include:

- Rubbing against a person or object. Rubbing against a person may indicate affection while rubbing against furniture and other items is used to distribute their scent.
- Kneading this behaviour is a remnant of kitten behaviour which is used to help milk letdown, and often indicates contentment.
- Vocalising noisy cats are often seeking attention (or food!).
- Purring a purring cat is usually contented and relaxed.



ARE ECONOMY ENERGY TARIFFS REALLY ALL THAT ECONOMIC?

FROM GOODHEW ELECTRICAL AND SOLAR


Many Queenslanders share the belief that economy tariffs are great for appliances like hot water systems and pool pumps that don't need a constant supply of power. But as more Australian households switch to solar, these tariffs are no longer the most economic option.

WHAT IS AN ENERGY TARIFF?

Put simply, an energy tariff is the rate you pay for power. In Queensland there are a range of tariffs for homes, businesses and farms and can differ based on the energy distributor. The most common tariffs include Tariff 11 – general supply; Tariff 31 – 8hr time of use; and, Tariff 33 – 18hr time of use.

HOW DO ECONOMY TARIFFS WORK?

Most homes use T31 for their hot water system which allows for 8-hours of electricity per day between 9pm and 5am. The average tariff rate for T31 is currently 14c/kW. Pool pumps, heats pumps etc. are usually situated on T33 which allows for up to 18hrs of electricity per day and exclude the hours between 6pm and 9pm. It is important to note that times when power is switched off and the duration can vary from day to day at the discretion of the energy distributor.



HOW CAN I SAVE MORE MONEY?

If you have solar, then by switching your T31 and T33 tariff appliances over to T11 and utilising timers during the day, you will ensure you're making the most out of your solar and cut your economy tariffs altogether. This is because the average feed-in tariff in Queensland is currently 6.6c/kW with many retailers sitting around the 4c/kW mark. This is set to continue decreasing as more Queensland homes opt to install solar. For the home depicted in the graphic above, by switching the hot water system to T11 and installing a timer so that it heats between 10AM and 1PM will save the homeowner approximately \$183.45 per quarter. Similarly, if the pool pump is switched from T33 to a timer on T11 the savings are even greater at approximately \$148.51 per quarter.



MY MEMORIES OF THE WYNNUM MANLY FORESHORE

When I was a child my grandparents - Nan and Da - lived in a modest red and white house right on the corner of 1 Charlotte Street and the Esplanade just across from the water.

One of my most beautiful memories of the time I spent at Wynnum was when Da and I walked along the foreshore to the jetty (now in Bayside Park) built by convict labour in a bygone century. I remember him taking my hand and leading me up the jetty saying hello to fisherman until we reached the end where we would stop for a moment and look out to St Helena Island – that grand but sad place across the water.

Of equal joy were the afternoons spent on the swings across from Nan and Da's house. I loved the swings because Da was a great pusher and I remember that feeling of almost flying. But whatever other childhood memories I have of Wynnum I think my greatest was the foreshore itself.

And it was on the foreshore that I got one of my first lessons in civic responsibility. Nan and Da used to encourage both my brother and I to pick up litter from the foreshore every afternoon.

I vividly remember them going out in the mud in the afternoon to pick up old fishing lines and soft drink cans and other pieces of muck

showing us how the rubbish blew into the sea if it was dropped recklessly on the shore, and telling us about the damage it could cause to the fish and birdlife.

As I write this in front of me is a picture of my beloved Da and Nanna taken outside of 1 Charlotte Street on their Golden Wedding Anniversary on the 4 February 1982. It would be their last.

Whatever changes have taken place between now and then there is something about that foreshore that makes it very much my spiritual home.

While many thoughts of how to mark their time on earth presented themselves I did have to remember that at the end of the day my Nan and Da were quiet people who would not have liked a lot of fanfare. I do however think that what would honour their memory most would be to do that simple act of community responsibility that they took upon themselves every day - a walk of the foreshore to pick up litter.

And so if you love the Esplanade of Wynnum as much as I do, then, in the name of my Nan and Da look around you when next time you visit and check it for litter. All being well there will be nothing to pick up but if there is -I think you know what to do.

FEBRUARY FISHING TIPS FOR A GREAT DAY ON THE BAY

Bait and Tackle

BY SPERO KARTANOS

What a washout January was with cyclone Seth sticking around longer and longer than we really wanted! I wrote this last year (well, we have had everything from downpours measuring over 300mm at Manly, and we had 73-knot-plus winds, Covid spreading all over the world; all we need now is the locusts - but I shouldn't joke, I saw a news bulletin where they actually had them down south) so it seems this year nothing has changed.

I really hope February goes back to normal with spotty mackerel coming into the bay, along with whitebait, blue bait in the thousands, whiting and squid in abundance, and snapper taking our bait with a great scream of the reel. Jokes aside, it's a good month for all the tasty morsels that are in Moreton Bay.

Find whiting on the Chain Banks all the way through to the Rous and the Sand Hills at Moreton

Island, and plenty of tiger squid in the same areas. School mackerel will be around Hope Banks and Peel Island to Amity Banks, Rainbow Channel and the western side of Moreton. The spotty mackerel will be smashing schools of bait on the surface.

Crabbing will be at its peak with plenty of sand crabs and mud crabs with all this run off from the rivers and creeks, and of course prawns will be in abundance for those who can throw a cast net (that leaves me out, but hopefully some friends drop off a kilo or two).

Use a few squid jigs in the red and orange colours for the squid, throw a few chrome slugs at the spotty mackerel, try paternoster rigs for the whiting, and diving boards and spoons for the schoolies. For snapper, use a few running rigs with 5.0 red hooks, and a butterfly net for the whitebait, and you should be able to put a feed on the table.

Until next month, good fishing!



SIMPLE SUMMER THAI BEEF SALAD RECIPE

Full of flavour, easy on your time, this Thai beef salad makes a great summertime lunch or dinner. Swap the beef for firm tofu for a vegetarian option.

Serves 4

SALAD

- 400g beef eye fillet steak
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 2 cups rocket
- Handful coriander leaves
- Handful Thai basil
- ½ cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- · 2 cucumbers, cut into long thin sticks
- 1 red onion, thinly sliced

DRESSING

- ¼ cup of roasted peanuts, roughly chopped
- 2 tbsp fish sauce
- · Juice of half a lime
- 1 tbsp brown sugar
- 1 long red chilli (add more if you like heat), seeded and finely chopped
- 2 tbsp water

METHOD

- Pre-heat your BBQ to a high heat and get your steaks ready by drizzling with olive oil, and season with salt and pepper.
 Alternatively, cook your steak in a very hot frying pan.
- 2. Cook the steak to your liking medium rare works well for this dish and once cooked, wrap it in aluminium foil and set aside to rest (approximately 10 minutes).
- Combine all dressing ingredients in a small bowl and mix thoroughly. You can use a food processor to save time here, just pulse a few times to combine.
- 4. Thinly slice the steak into strips.
- 5. Assemble all the salad ingredients, add the steak, and drizzle with dressing.

This is delicious as a standalone salad, but it also works well as a filling for rice paper rolls. Add whatever fresh veggies and fruits you have — mango, apple, capsicum and fennel bulb, will all make this dish sing.
