LITTLE SHOP IS A ROCKIN' BIG HORROR OF A MUSICAL!

Savoyards Musical Comedy Society Inc is bringing Little Shop of Horrors to the Star Theatre, Manly, from 5th to 12th March.

The story follows Seymour, a shy, clumsy florist shop worker who accidentally raises a plant that feeds on human blood and flesh. The music, composed by Alan Menken in the style of early 1960s rock and roll, doo-wop and early Motown, includes several well-known tunes, including Skid Row (Downtown), Somewhere that's Green and Suddenly, Seymour.

Commonly referred to as "Little Shop", it is widely recognised for the 1986 motion picture, however more recently has been revived off-Broadway. Savoyards' Director Taylor Davidson is thrilled to be part of her first Savoyards production, bringing Little Shop to the stage.

"I was excited at the prospect of directing something challenging," said Taylor.

"I think this show represents a lot of interesting opportunities with puppets, special effects and ways to tell the story, and you don't always get to do that in musical theatre!

"I think the idea of a horror musical is so fun, and you get to do both the scary stuff and the classic 'boppy' numbers."

Savoyards first-time Musical Director Hayley Marsh is keen to be on the other side of the stage.

"I love Little Shop and have been in it, helped produce it, and seen it many times, but have never music-directed it, so when Savs put the call out seeking music directors I jumped at the chance," said Hayley.

"Plus, hearing Taylor was going to direct – we've worked together before on many projects and make a

"It's a high-quality show with a great book and music that doesn't take itself too seriously. Shows are so serious these days! Come enjoy some comedy."

It was great to join Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner to officially turn on the lights at Chelsea Road and Rickertt Road recently. This jointly funded road upgrade between the Federal Government and the Brisbane City Council will ease congestion and improve the liveability of Bayside residents. With over 25,000 vehicles using Rickertt Road daily, I was pleased to support the project with \$6 million of Federal Government funding which includes a new pedestrian and cycle bridge over the watercourse at Lota Creek, as well a 2.5-metre-wide shared pedestrian and cycle path, widening of the lanes and signalisation at the intersection of Chelsea Road and Rickertt Road.

This upgrade is a great example of the Federal Government and the Brisbane City Council working together to deliver first class projects that help locals get home sooner and safer.

I really enjoy working alongside Ian and the Ocean Crusaders team who are a passionate and innovative foundation based here on the Bayside.

DID YOU KNOW THERE'S A FREE LOCAL MEDIATION SERVICE?

Did you know that there is a free and local mediation service in Wynnum? Bayside Community Legal Service (BCLS) has an independent mediation service that consists of a panel of approximately 25 mediators. Unlike other services, we currently have short wait times!

The BCLS mediation service is available to assist with a range of legal issues such as property settlement, parenting matters, neighbourhood disputes, peace and good behaviour matters and debt issues.

The purpose of mediation is to try and settle disputes without the need to go to court. The mediator assists with facilitating discussion and resolution of issues between the parties.

Our office is conveniently located in the Wynnum Community Centre. Further, we have adapted our services during Covid-19 and our mediators are able to provide virtual mediations as an option as well. Therefore, in addition to in-person mediations, our mediations can be done online through Skype, Zoom or Microsoft Teams.

TWO PETERS RIDE 900KM FOR RARE OVARIAN CANCER RESEARCH

Wynnum local Peter Smith (retired ATC) is teaming up with good friend Peter Reaburn (Honorary Adjunct Professor of Sport and Exercise Science, Bond University) to ride 900km over nine days from Canberra to Melbourne.

The epic charity ride to raise funds for ovarian cancer research will begin at Parliament House in Canberra on April 30, with a scheduled arrival at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on May 8.

The two Peters are longtime friends, first meeting in 1977 on the beach at Coolangatta while competing against each other in the Queensland Surf Life Saving Titles. They went on to study Human Movement Studies together at the University of Queensland, shared a house, surfed together, played rugby and touch football together, and went to each other's weddings.

Peter Reaburn's wife, Claire, was diagnosed at 53-years-of-age with Juvenile Granulosa Cell Tumour (JGCT), a rare ovarian cancer that typically affects younger females. Claire is the oldest female in the world to have JGCT. The youngest was diagnosed in Australia at age 11 months. Overall, 94% of patients with JGCT are under 30-years-of-age.

There is no cure for JGCT, nor is there research to help understand the disease. Clinicians are prescribing treatments based on "best guess" rather than facts. Funding for this vital research is needed.

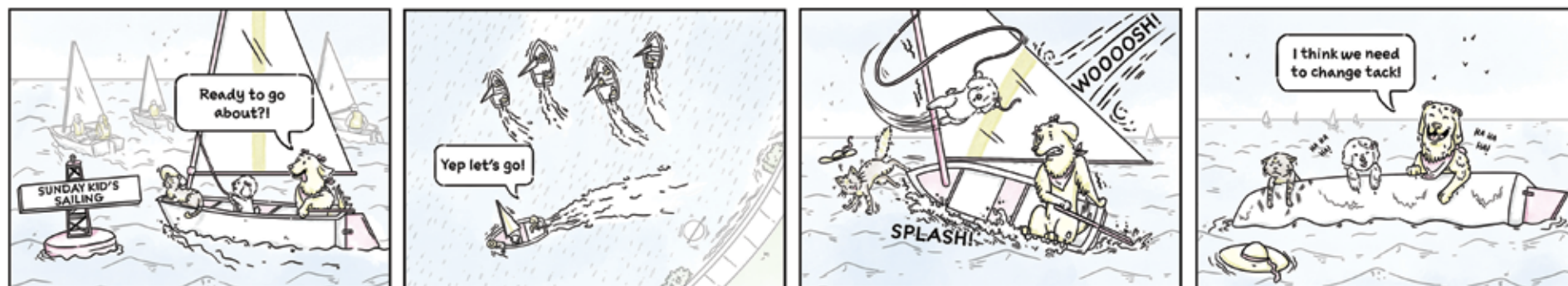

A NEW TICK-BORNE DISEASE IS AFFECTING DOGS

There has been a recent case in Mt Isa of a dog being infected with the bacteria Ehrlichia canis. This bacteria is spread between dogs by the brown dog tick and the disease it causes – “Ehrlichiosis” – has been

seen increasingly commonly in the Northern Territory, the Kimberley and Pilbara regions of Western Australia and northern parts of South Australia.

Ticks infected with Ehrlichia spread the bacteria between dogs when they attach to feed. All three life stages of the tick – larva, nymph and adult – are capable of injecting the bacteria into a dog. Dogs travelling between the states can result in the spread of the disease to other dogs.

CLINICAL SIGNS OF EHRLICHIOSIS

There are three different phases of infection – acute, subclinical and chronic.

The clinical signs commonly seen are fever, lethargy, swollen lymph nodes, anorexia, weight loss, eye and nose discharges and bleeding disorders. The condition can affect dogs for an extended period of time and in some cases can result in disease occurring in the spleen, liver and brain.

The combination of a history of travel to or from the NT, WA or SA, evidence of infestation with the brown dog tick and the development of the above clinical signs may lead your veterinarian to suspect Ehrlichiosis.

PREVENTION

The best means of controlling this disease is preventing tick attachment to your dog. Daily checks of your pet to remove any ticks which may have attached and avoiding bush or scrubby areas can help prevent exposure.

When travelling to affected states it is advised that two types of tick prevention are used – tick killing treatments such as NexGard or Bravecto (as recommended for reducing the risk of tick paralysis from

the other common species of tick) in combination with a tick repelling treatment (a tick collar or top spot such as Advantix) to prevent tick attachment is the best way to prevent your pet becoming infected with the bacteria.

WHAT IS AN STI, AND WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW?

As a GP who is passionate about Preventive Health, STI screening is one of my favourite topics to discuss with all patients.

I often wonder if it is the stigma surrounding a sexual health check that hinders patients from discussing their sexual health with their GPs. Today in the form of Q & As, I am going to shine some light on STI screening and maybe more patients will start seeing it as a different kind of "skin check".



1. What does a STI screen check for and why do I need it when I have no symptoms?

STI screen checks for blood borne viruses such as HIV, Syphilis, Hepatitis B and Hepatitis C. It also checks for STI such as Chlamydia and Gonorrhoea.

STIs are usually asymptomatic. Through early diagnosis and treatment, patients can avoid complications. Most STIs treatments are curative. Being treated also stops the infection from spreading.

2. How often should I be tested?

I recommend anyone sexually active to get tested annually and perhaps even up to 4 times a year if they have a change in partner or other risk factors.

3. What is involved in the check, and do I need to show you my "bits"?

It usually involves a history about your sexual history, and it is not necessary to examine you unless there is a rash or discharge we need to look at.

STI screen usually involves both blood and urine tests.

4. Is a STI screen confidential? If I get tested positive, does it mean my details get sent to a communicable disease centre?

Like all visits to the GP, a sexual health check is confidential. It means we won't share your information or anything you tell us with anyone else unless you give us permission.

Most STIs in Queensland are notifiable. If a patient tested positive, we will need to inform the Queensland Health public health unit. However, the information is de-identified.



5. After a sexual health check, when will I expect to get my results?

The results are usually available after 1-2 days and I usually recommend having a phone consult to discuss the results.

Clean Air Wynnum is a group of citizen scientists, concerned about our health – especially the health of our lungs and the environment – and the quality of the air we breathe. The groups has no joining fees, dues or sponsorship, and has been meeting monthly for seven years.

Our aims are to educate ourselves by hosting guest speakers on health, government policy and the impact on our health from roads, industrial and residential development. We seek to improve the lives and health of our families, especially our children and grandchildren.

Your experience and concerns are important to us in helping to build a picture of our area as a living, changing community. We need your help to get clean air.

Thanks to a Commonwealth Government grant, 10 Purple Air monitors have been purchased. They measure particulate matter (PM), which is invisible to the naked eye but settles permanently in the lungs, can cause major health issues, and severely impact those with respiratory ailments.

Monitors are small, discrete, require Wi-Fi access and continuous, low power. Results can be viewed in real time at <https://www2.purpleair.com/> showing the air quality (AQ) where we live and work.

The group meets at 3.00pm on the second Wednesday of each month at Wynnum Library, Florence Street, close to Wynnum Central train station. The library is air-conditioned, wheelchair accessible and has undercover parking. BCC Covid rules apply.

Whimsical Tales from The Mad Hatters Bookshop – celebrating our young writing community.

What do you get when a group of young aspiring writers are asked to write their best magical, fantastical short stories?

Local literacy advocate and bookshop owner Laura Norris invited members of the Wynnum Manly community aged between 7-14 to submit stories or poems for the chance to be published in the second official anthology from The Mad Hatters Bookshop. *Whimsical Tales from The Mad Hatters Bookshop* is the result, a collection of 17 stories and poems written by young local authors.

“Being able to provide an opportunity for young folks in the community to explore the avenue of fiction and find their writing voice in such an uncertain time has been such a privilege,” said Laura.

“I was extremely impressed with the calibre of writing and I hope readers are hooked by the stories written by our local authors—their unique interests, diverse viewpoints and the immense joy that shines through the writing.”

Some of the young authors published in the collection agreed to share their experiences of finding the unexpected wonder in words.

Siblings Charlise and Reece Davies (pictured) were both featured in the anthology, and while they wrote their stories independently, they often exchanged ideas during the writing process.

Charlise’s story, *The Dragon Temple*, was inspired by the *Wings of Fire* series by Tui T. Sutherland, which inspired her love of dragons. Incorporated into Reece’s story, *The Gem Bees*, is his interest in elements and minerals of the world.

The concept and imagery in Rosella Taylor’s story, *Apocalypt*, was inspired by a visual prompt in an English class – images of castles, hot air balloons against a dusky sky, and horses caught mid-run pieced together the scene of a tiny figure, dwarfed but confident in front of an enormous castle.

Charlise said that having her story published in *Whimsical Tales* was “one of the biggest accomplishments of [her] life so far” and that both she and her brother were excited that both their stories were accepted into the book. Rosella said she was “super happy” to be published in the book, and hopes to see her writing featured in other publications one day.

Live music will feature throughout the event presented by a number of popular local bands and musicians.

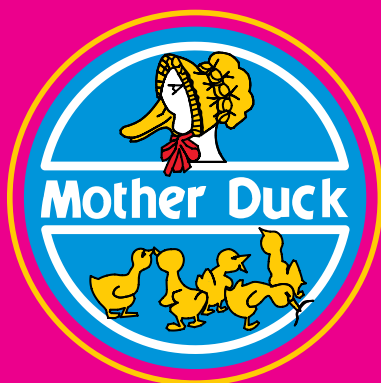

THE K.M. SMITH STORY – WHO WAS KATE MARY FARRELL?

FROM K.M SMITH FUNERAL DIRECTORS

Kate Mary Farrell was born in Dublin in 1846 and immigrated to Australia aboard the Fiery Star in 1864 at the age of 18. Also arriving in Australia the same year on the vessel the Salamander, sailing from London, was 20-year-old infantryman John Smith.

Kate and John met in the North Queensland town of Somerset, where they were married and reportedly went on to have the first white child born in the region.

After moving to Sydney due to ill health, John, Kate and their then six children moved to the thriving settlement of Brisbane.

In 1877 John set up shop as a cabinet maker, and as it was not uncommon for the time, he did work as a carpenter and coffin maker. In 1883 John purchased the undertaking business of William Walsh and thus the funeral business of K.M.Smith began.

Alas, John became ill and died a few months later in 1886 at just 42-years-of-age. At a time when it was often unusual for a woman to attend a funeral much less work in the industry, Kate learnt the necessary skills to continue the business and became Brisbane's first female funeral director.

Kate continued to guide her business through a World War and the Great Depression. She died on June 13, 1932 and is buried in Toowong Cemetery with her husband.

More than a century later, the business is still trading as K.M.Smith Funeral Directors with her great-grandchildren directors and her great-great-grandchild chairman of the board.

With fourteen branches in Brisbane, Wynnum is one of the longest established sites having been in Bay Terrace since 1996.

85-TONNE LUXURY YACHT HAULED OFF THE BEACH

Howling westerly winds caught many boaties by surprise recently, however one particular vessel set new records for Brisbane Coast Guard.

Responding to reports of a large luxury yacht aground on Tangalooma, our command vessel CG29 arrived on scene around 4am to find a 26-metre boat on the shoreline. After securing the largest tow line to the boat, Flotilla Commander Craig Bowen was able to gently coax the monster boat off the beach.

"We needed to slowly work the yacht off the sand," Craig explained. "If we pulled too fast we'd risk damaging their boat more."

Once the boat was free, there was a risk that the boat's stern drive had been damaged by the grounding.

"The only way to confirm damage is to lift the boat out of the water, which is no easy task for a vessel

weighing 85 tonnes," Craig said.

The boat owner asked for the vessel to return to the manufacturer at the Coomera Boat Works to use their boat lift, a distance of 60 nautical miles each way. Complicating the tow, the vicious westerly winds had swung to the south, resulting in a very choppy and wet ride for the Coast Guard crew. The mammoth 17-hour tow operation involved a crew changeover while underway, which added an extra hazard for the weary Coast Guard team.

"I'm proud of the work our crews did, it shows that no matter the size of the boat our Coast Guard crews can help you," Craig said as CG29 returned to harbour late that evening.

THE FISH ARE ON THE MARCH THIS MONTH, SO GET FISHING!

The rains in February came and went, and in between the howling windy days we have had some dead calm days, and the fishing has been very good. Hopefully this month it will be great to see more of the lovely glassed-out days that fisherman love.

On the fish front, whiting will be as good as ever in the Small Boat Channel and the Rous Channel, especially on the Maroon Bank side, Amity Banks and Maroon Hole – the bonus is the tiger squid will be everywhere in the same areas, so a jig floating off the back of the boat is a good idea. The only problem at the Amity Banks are the horrible sea toads – last year they were smashing the squid jigs (especially anything with red on them) so hopefully this year they will have moved on.

The school mackerel should be spread throughout the bay, so a diving board and a spoon out from the last leads between Manly and King and Green Islands, Hope Banks, past the Naval Bank to the Peel Basin and over to the Rous, should pick you up a few schoolies.

I am finding the spoons with a yellow or gold reflectors work the best, but I'd also recommend trying the Smith jigs in white and chrome, and Kimberly spoons on rainy and cloudy days will work pretty well. I'm still hoping like crazy that the spotty mackerel make an appearance this month.

March also marks the arrival of mack tuna/bonito, and normally they're in their thousands throughout the bay, so a small chrome slug (about 35 grams) and plenty of casts should get you one or two. Some days you can cast a thousand times for zero result, but hopefully there will be some spotty mackerel in the mix.

Crabbing and prawning is in full swing in March, so wherever there are 200 boats on top of each other is where the prawns will be. I was taken to Nudgee last year and it was fun to see that many boats with so many people casting and catching lots of prawns.

Till next month good fishing, and keep safe out on the water.

MOVEMENT FOR LIFE

Dr Wayne Gibbon, Lead Radiologist at ClinRad, looks at the importance of maintaining body fitness and an effective skeleton as we age.

Recently, I came out of sporting retirement to start playing Walking Football. When I finished playing a game, at the same indoor centre, there was another similar group of mixed age, mixed gender individuals playing a racquet sport I had never before witnessed. They were playing pickleball.

I had not heard of the game until previously when a patient, whose shoulder I was injecting, asked if they could play pickleball that weekend. I cannot remember my answer but as this patient was playing apparently unhindered on the court in front of me then I suppose the answer must have been “yes”.

It is often quoted that the current youth generation will be the first in history, without intervening war, to have a life expectancy less than their parents due to the effects of obesity and diabetes. Participation in sport across all ages is a potential major weapon in combating diabetes and cardiovascular disease.

Similarly, many years ago I wrote a letter to “The Lancet” showing that the bone density hips in professional footballers was twice that



of the general population. If females all played walking football (or sports such as pickleball) before reaching menopause and continued thereafter, would osteoporosis be reduced and the rate of hip fracture and resulting serious life consequences be significantly decreased?

The public health benefits of sporting participation are not solely physical for it is well recognized that mental health is similarly improved. However, the ability to participate in sport may be greatly limited by time-related effects on the spine, joints, muscles and tendons.

The reality, of course is that the need for a functioning skeleton in an ageing population is not just sport related. Increased longevity and the need for an income well past traditional retirement age means that the same requirement is true for occupational health.

THE ARSONIST'S SIZZLING SCALLOPS RECIPE

Smokin' Manly restaurant The Arsonist is famous for its wood-fired dishes and innovative flavours. Here's the restaurant's popular recipe for baked scallops, perfect as an entrée or as part of a tapas selection.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 dozen of the best scallops in their half shells
- 1 tablespoon of gochujang*
- A pinch of Murray River pink salt

3. Cook on a BBQ, or bake in an oven at 200 degrees celsius until butter is melted and the scallop is gently cooked through. This should take approximately 3 to 5 minutes.
4. Serve immediately, garnished with fresh chopped parsley.

A PROJECT UNDERTAKEN BY REDLANDS CAMERA CLUB MEMBERS

Over eight million shipping containers move through Australia's ports each year – that's a staggering number, so what happens to them after their life as a cargo container is finished?

A shipping container's first 10-12 years will be spent at sea; beyond that they have a lifespan of another 15 years or longer without any maintenance. Some will have sustained physical dents and damage from corrosion while others will be in reasonable condition. What happens to them?

The concept of the Redlands Camera Club's recent project is to show the story of how shipping containers are recycled after their working life has finished. With so many containers being decommissioned it has led to the huge growth of a container recycling industry in Australia.

Re-used and renovated containers can be used in so many ways that are only limited by the new owner's imagination. Repurposing can include storage, road transport, work spaces, laboratories, pop-up shops, schools, emergency hospitals, portable toilets, underground shelters, creative studios, homes, home extensions and even swimming pools!

They can certainly provide creative, unique and affordable repurposing that has a very positive environmental outcome. In addition to the energy savings, owners can also modify the container even further to become more sustainable with solar panels, smart gadgets and putting in a waste compost system.

The final project includes 20 individual photos which were captured by club members at various locations on the same day on 25th September of 2021. This project will be exhibited by the club at the end of 2022.

LATEST NEWS FROM THE PORT OF BRISBANE



Port of Brisbane is Queensland's largest multi-cargo port, handling 95% of the state's containers and motor vehicles, and approximately 50% of its agricultural exports. Based locally at Lytton, Ocean Crusaders is on a mission to clean up the Brisbane River. Its Automatic River Cleaner is powered by the sun, working 24/7 to collect litter from the river, stopping it from going into Moreton Bay. It's working upstream from the Brisbane International Cruise Terminal.



ST HELENA, FORMERLY “THE HELL HOLE OF THE PACIFIC”

St Helena Island, only 4km from the mouth of the Brisbane River and clearly visible from Wynnum and Manly, was the most notorious of islands in the bay.

The island is composed of a broad flat platform of mud and sand which sits on a bed of old coral, as do Green Island and King Island. Originally the local Aboriginal tribes named the island Noogoon (place of the flying fox) due to the roosting of the flying foxes on the island.

In 1799 European explorer Lieutenant Matthew Flinders named this green island Green Island No. 2 during the initial exploration within Moreton Bay. He aimed to find the mouth of an inland river. He did not land on Noogoon, nor did he find an inland river.

Eulope, the Turrwan (or chieftain) of the Nunakal clan of the Quandamooka (Moreton Bay) people, resisted the European intruders when they arrived at Amity Point on North Stradbroke Island. As Eulope's physical stature was similar to that of the French Emperor Napoleon Bonaparte, Eulope became known among the British military as “Napoleon”. As the fable goes, in 1827, Napoleon of Stradbroke Island “borrowed” a steel axe in Dunwich and was exiled to Noogoon for his crime. Henceforth, the island became known as St Helena, the name of the exile home of Napoleon Bonaparte.

In 1866 the island was chosen as a perfect site for a Queensland quarantine station. Prisoners from the hulk Proserpine, moored at the mouth of the Brisbane River, were rowed daily to work at the site, and two buildings were completed.

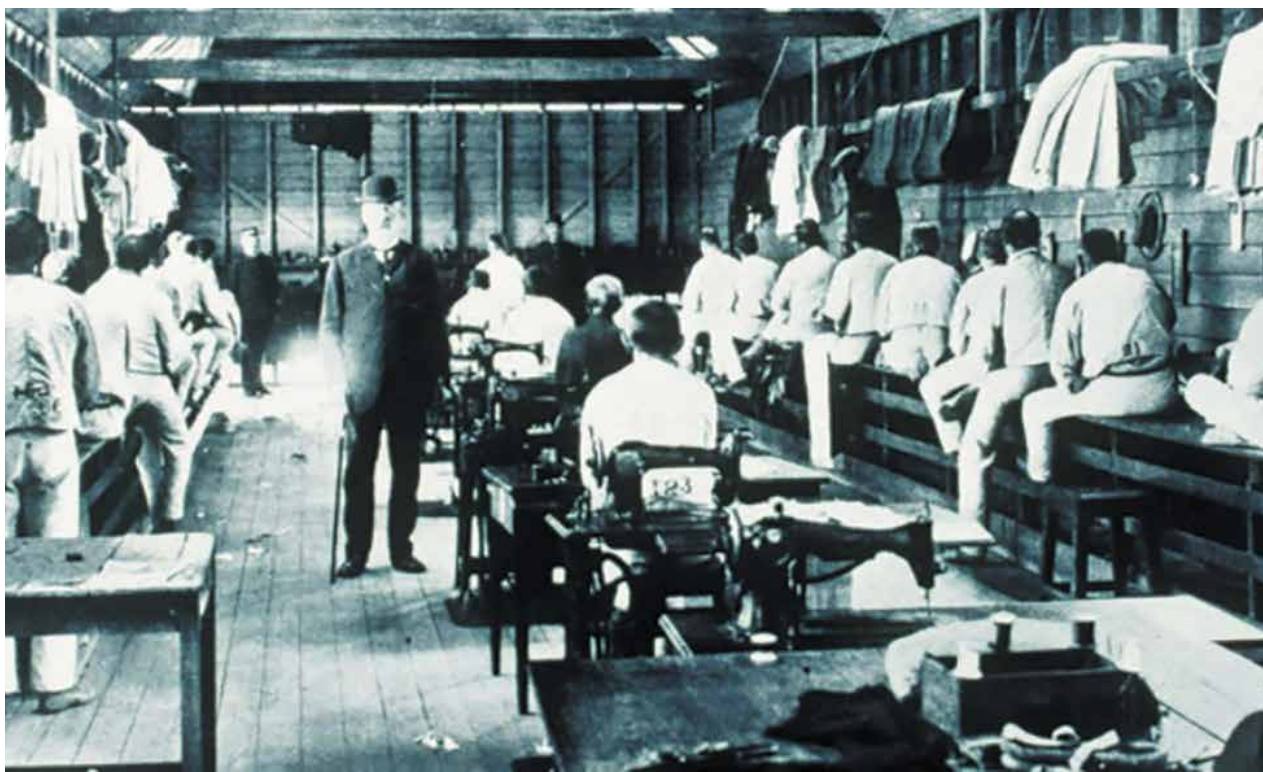
Due to the massive overcrowding of the Brisbane Goal in Petrie Terrace at that time, new buildings on St Helena were modified for use as a goal.

More buildings were constructed on the island, made of timber, others of the soft beach stone, quarried from the southern flats of the island. Bricks were moulded from island clay mixes. A lime kiln was built in 1896 to burn coral and make lime.

On the 14th of May 1867, the Governor of Queensland signed a proclamation declaring the island “a place whereat offenders under the order of hard labour may be detained”. St Helena became Queensland's showpiece prison. John MacDonald was the first Superintendent with a staff of five and a military guard of 12 officers. Opening with 60 prisoners, the number of inmates soon increased to 140, rising to 300 persons by 1869.

The early prison years were the toughest, with severe punishments involving the lash and the dreaded dark underground cells. Very few prisoners escaped; only three disappeared without a trace. Two were drowned or taken by sharks.

The Leaders of the Shearers' Strike in 1891 were imprisoned on St Helena. And the leader of the shearers, William Hamilton, served three years in goal on the island. In 1915 William Hamilton became

President of the Queensland Legislative Council and visited the island in a vastly different capacity.

By 1900 the St Helena Establishment accommodated 330 prisoners and operated as a self-sufficient unit. The prisoners were taught carpentry, boot making, tailoring, tinsmithing, bread making, and butchery. Vegetables thrived in the rich soil. The sugar mill crushed locally grown sugar. The most successful outcomes were the sugar cane, the growing of olives, and the prize-winning Ayrshire dairy herd, introduced in 1892.

Though once an example of a most successful prison institution, by 1920, problems were arising. The prison was ageing. There was the danger of fire. The buildings were of 19th-century design and did not accommodate new ideas in prison reform. Families of the warders had been moved to the mainland by 1890, which caused dissatisfaction amongst the staff.

The hardened prisoners were moved to Boggo Road Gaol, built in 1889. By 1920 St Helena was a prison farm. The few remaining prisoners slowly dismantled the ageing buildings. Suitable building materials were taken over to the mainland for recycling. Only a few of the original buildings remain. The cattle were auctioned off on the 22nd of May 1931. The last prisoner left the island on the 15th of June 1933.

On the 1st of December 1933, the island was opened to the general public for recreation under the auspices of Brisbane City Council. A

passenger service was established from Wynnum Jetty. However, these were the Depression years, and the venture failed, closing in

1934. The island was handed back to the State Government in 1939 and leased as a dairy farm until 1973. 4IP Radio Ipswich leased part of North Point to build a radio station in 1974.

The island was gazetted as a National Park on the 1st of October 1978, then as a historical area on the 7th of October 1979. The first Park Ranger was appointed in 1981.

Coral dredging commenced on the eastern side of the island in 1983. The barges of coral were taken via the Brisbane River to the processing plant at Darra. Following much public protest, this work ceased in 1988. The island was added to the Queensland Heritage Register in 1992.

In October 1986, a new, long jetty was opened on the southwestern point. A horse-drawn wagon conveyed visitors up the hill to view the remains until 1996 when the local Rotary Club took over with their diesel-powered train. This service could not be run at a profit and closed in 2002. The Queensland Prison and Penal Historical Association was formed in 2004 to provide tour guides, compile research, and promote the island.

Today the island is under the care of the State Government's Parks and Wildlife Department, with the park warden operating out of Fort Lytton. Some excellent tours depart from Many Boat Harbour.

WORK STARTS ON NEXT STAGE OF ISLAND COASTAL WALK

FROM REDLAND CITY COUNCIL

Work has begun on Stage 2 of the Minjerribah Panorama Coastal Walk at Point Lookout (Mulumba) on North Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah).

Mayor Karen Williams said this stage would include roadway and bus stop upgrades, continuation of the pedestrian pathway from Frenchmans Stairs to Point Lookout Village, completion of the renewal of the stairway to Frenchmans Beach, renewed picnic areas, and parking on the southern side of Mooloomba Road.

“The benefits of this walkway to locals and visitors alike is enormous,” she said.

“The first stage of this fabulous project saw a new, scenic walkway built between Snapper Street and Frenchmans Stairs, delivered in partnership with the Queensland Government, which provided \$1 million under the Unite and Recover Community Stimulus Package.

“Stage 2 of the project was also developed with the support of the Queensland Government and will see the continuation of the pathway – incorporating boardwalks and trails – to Point Lookout Village, which will complete the walkway link that locals requested during community consultation on the project.”

Cr Williams said that in addition to renewed picnic areas and facilities along the route and new parking, Stage 2 would also see installation of wayfinding and interpretive signage, developed in consultation with Quandamooka Yoolooburrabee Aboriginal Corporation to promote the area’s Indigenous cultural heritage values.

“This panoramic walk is a great addition to the island community and, while work is underway, traffic controls will be in place to help ensure vehicle and pedestrian safety as well as access to nearby properties,” she said.

Stage 2 of the project has received State Government funding through the South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program.

Division 2 Councillor Peter Mitchell said the timely continuation of the project reflected Council’s investment in the community and recognition of the growing popularity of Minjerribah as a tourist destination.

“With many people choosing to visit the island for day trips and longer stays, accessible ‘walk’ experiences like this make memorable moments for visitors of all ages and abilities,” he said.

“For our Minjerribah businesses recovering from the economic impacts of the pandemic, this project is a great boost.

“For our local flora and fauna, and cultural heritage, the sustainably and sensitively designed walkway brings additional protections that will help preserve these important values now and into the future.

“A few disruptions are expected during construction, but the immediate and longer-term inter-generational benefits for locals and the wider Redlands Coast community make them worth it.”

STOP, LOOK AND ADMIRE OUR LOCAL NATURAL WONDERS

When we walk along the Wynnum boardwalk, or down past the mangroves at Lota, or drift further down to Toondah Harbour, we often walk without acknowledging the environment our steps take us past. We should stop, look and admire.

Research coming from the University of Queensland has come up with the startling conclusion that only 15% of all coastal regions remain intact. The data behind this extensive research concludes that almost all of the intact coastal regions are located in Canada, Russia and Greenland.

Not surprising that these areas have the lowest anthropogenic pressure with their coast lines being so remote and cold. Australia comes in at the second level with coastal regions that remain “relatively” intact.

But if you go to the detailed research paper, on page 20 is a map of Australia that has most of the coastline in red (<20% intact) and tiny bits

of blue (>80% intact). The blue bits are in the Gulf and scattered along the Great Australian Bight.

Such a graphic visual of the state of our coastline screams out loud to protect what remains. But it is as if no one is listening as new proposals are raised to “develop” what remains of our mangroves, sea grass and mud flats.

Why is it that we are unable to leave something for future generations, why is the rush to destroy our environment so imbedded in politics as the only economic outcome? As a nation we can do better, we can protect for the future and enjoy today.

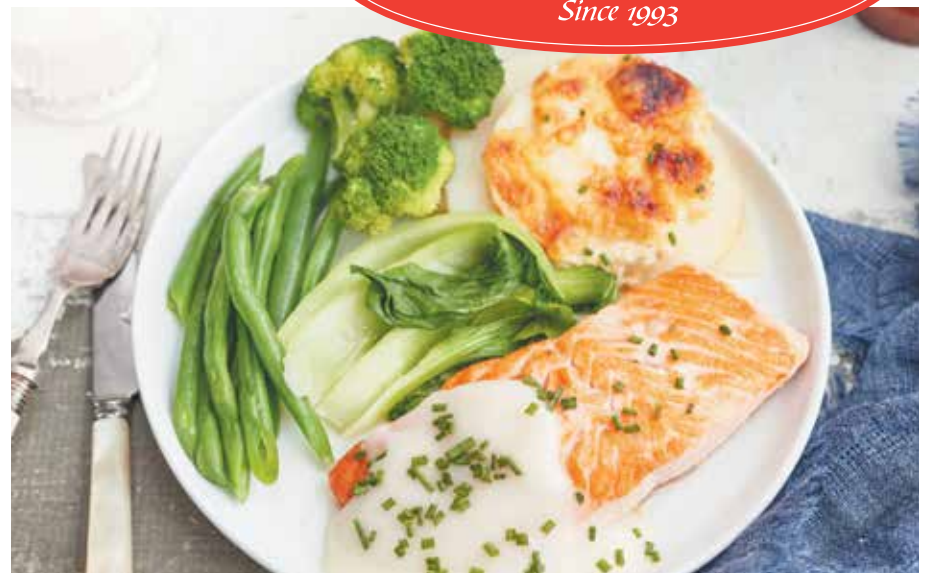
