

TIME CAPSULE OPENED FOR WYNNUM STATE HIGH'S 80TH BIRTHDAY

FROM WYNNUM STATE HIGH SCHOOL

The 3rd of March 2022 marked Wynnum State High School's 80th birthday and the school received a very special birthday present - a time capsule that was sealed 40 years ago in 1982. The significance of the date of the time capsule is that it celebrates forty years on from the opening of our school in 1942. And Forty Years On is Wynnum High's school song, written in 1872 originally for the Harrow School in England. The song speaks of what the world would be like 40 years on and speaks of looking back at what was shared by students at school. So it was fitting for the students of 1982 to give this gift to the students of 2022.

The ceremony to open the time capsule coincided with our first full assembly for the year and some of the 1982 graduates attended to witness the opening.

Inside the time capsule were hundreds of artefacts including student work, teacher planning, local newspaper articles from 1982 and music mix tapes recorded on cassettes! There were also personally addressed letters to the school captains, principal and P&C president.

The time capsule contents are currently on display in the school library and are being saved electronically. The time capsule will be refilled this year and our gift to the students of 2062 will reflect the world that we live in now. When the school celebrates its 120th year, it will be opened.







Born and bred in Brisbane, The Rescue Collective is a registered charity which predominantly supports Queensland, and the Northern Rivers in NSW.

Jo-Anne O'Connor said it was a privilege to see behind the scenes at the RFDS and understand the benefits of these donations to the families who access its services.



HOW DO I KNOW IF I HAVE DIABETES?

Diabetes can be a scary and overwhelming diagnosis for some.

When someone has diabetes, their body can't maintain healthy levels of glucose (a form of sugar) in the blood. Glucose is used by the body as fuel but to access it, our body uses a special hormone called insulin, which is made in our pancreas, to convert the glucose into energy. Unhealthy levels of glucose in the blood can lead to short-term and long-term complications.



There are many different types of diabetes, but the three most common types are Type 1, Type 2 and gestational diabetes.

It is predicted that 1.8 million Australians have diabetes with about 500,000 of those being undiagnosed. Some symptoms are:

- · Feeling tired
- Increased hunger
- Headaches
- Increased thirst

- Slowly healing cuts and skin infections
- Passing more urine than usual
- Losing weight without trying (Type 1 Diabetes)

Although sometimes there are no symptoms at all, and certain groups of people should have regular screening done for Type 2 Diabetes if they:

- · Have a family member with diabetes
- Are over the age of 40
- · Are of Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, Pacific Islander or Maori descent
- · Have trouble with maintaining a healthy weight



If you have any of the symptoms above or think you might be at risk of developing diabetes, please see your General Practitioner or Nurse Practitioner. They can help you access the right help and support you on your journey to prevention and/or living well with diabetes.


AVIATION COULD HAVE AN EXCITING ELECTRIC FUTURE

The Wright Brothers put wings under the dreams of hundreds of generations in creating powered flight. Many changes have occurred since their historic flight, for example, shape, speed, and size of planes. But one thing has remained constant – their reliance on aviation fuel...until now. Electrification is coming to aviation.

Well-known for producing conventional jet engines, Rolls Royce has recently developed the "Spirit of Innovation", an all-electric aircraft that reached 532km/h and climbed 3000metres in 60 seconds in Nov 2021. In Sweden, Heart Aerospace's ES-19 is designed for short-haul flights up to 400kms, carrying up to 19 passengers. They have orders from United Airlines for 100 planes. In the US, Wright Electric have developed the BAe 146, capable of carrying 100 passengers on one-hour flights. The European company, EasyJet, has placed orders with Wright Electric. The ES-19 and BAe 146 are scheduled for commercial flights in 2026. Not to be outdone, Airbus is working on eVOTL and fixed-wing aircraft and is also the official founding partner of Air Race E – the world's first all-electric aeroplane race. The objectives of Air Race E are to create a platform to nurture innovation in electric propulsion and accelerate commercial development.

Electric aircraft have inherent advantages; they are quiet and vibration-free for a more pleasant relaxed trip for passengers. For airlines, smaller airports and shorter runways can be used, leading to greater flexibility in scheduling. Also, because of their simplicity, operation and maintenance costs for electric motors are much lower than for jet engines (about 90% saving). From the airport's perspective, it allows commercial flights without the huge costs of redeveloping runways and increased operation in noise-sensitive airports.



As battery technology improves, one innovation under development is retrofitting planes with batteries, seen as a quicker path to certification than starting anew. Long haul flights will continue to use aviation fuel for some time as current batteries are not as energy-dense as aviation fuel, but this will change in the future; how far into the future is anyone's guess. It might be much sooner than we think.













ALLSTATE TRAINERS GATHER IN MANLY

Allstate Boat Licensing and Training recently held its annual conference at the Coast Guard base in Manly, drawing dozens of trainers and instructors from all over Queensland, plus officers from Maritime Safety Queensland and Brisbane Water Police.

Darryl Greentree, founder of Allstate, called it, "The best conference in our 23-year history demonstrating our trainers' desire to be the best in the business".

Allstate was founded in 1999, with classes originally held at the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron. It was granted the registration 'Boatsafe Number 001' by Maritime Safety Queensland.

From its first office in Manly, Allstate has spread throughout Queensland. It now has 18 offices up and down the coast, and issues 10,000 boat and PWC (jet-ski) licenses annually.

"We provide training and assessing for Recreational Marine Drivers (RMD) and Personal Water Craft (PWC) Licenses in Queensland," Darryl Greentree said.

"Nearly all our theory classes are on-line these days ... it's the modern way to go. But students still attend practical classes in boat handling and marine safety on our boats before licenses are issued.

"We take our obligations seriously. We don't just tick and flick students through our courses. We screen people ... and if they don't have the knowledge, or don't understand their obligations for marine safety ... we let them know further study is required."

Mr Greentree's team in Manly has grown to be the biggest in Queensland. It is now run by Stephen Redpath, with trainers Stephen McPherson and Sean Harrison, working from Manly's Coast Guard base.

Mr Greentree said he hopes to hold the next annual Allstate conference in Cairns.

FISHING MORETON BAY THIS MONTH? YOU DON'T NEED TO GET UP EARLY!

This month local fisherman Spero Kartanos shares his tips for scoring a fresh haul of whiting, squid and mackerel.

Talk about the weather changing guickly! Soon, we will be having 11 and 12-degree mornings, which is a little chilly to get up and go fishing for me. I am so glad Moreton Bay fish eat all day when the sun is up, and it's 26 degrees. My old Dad used to get me up pre-dawn, and we had to be on the water and fishing as the sun came up. I had to recite the times' tables on the way there, so no wonder I hate going fishing pre-dawn these days!

During May, the whiting are usually very large in size and numbers, and would have moved further into the Rous Channel, especially in the Fisherman's and the Maroon Gutter and Amity Banks.

You should find squid in the same area as long as the water is clean. Last year, peeled prawns worked better as bait than anything else, followed by squid strips, but you still can't beat fresh blood worms or cured beach worms.

Whiting fishing is great family fun – as you can tell from Martha's smile (pictured) with her bucket of fish – but if this year is the same as the last, look out for the influx of sea toads. These critters love smashing squid jigs to bits in the Small Boat Channel and around Amity Banks.

School mackerel has been hit and miss with all the rain and dirty water over the last couple of months, but generally, May has been a good month for them (and a few broad mackerel as well). They should have moved across the bay, and you should be able to catch them anywhere from the Hope Banks, towards Peel and Naval Banks to Shark Spit and in front of the sandhills at Moreton Island.

And don't forget, May should also see the cuttlefish and arrow squid move close near Wellington Point to the east side of St Helena Island.

So till next month, stay safe on the water and good fishing!

BSOL: HELPING SENIORS TO AVOID SCAMS AND CYBER THREATS

Brisbane Seniors Online (BSOL) is a not-for-profit community group that has been helping seniors and over 50s with computers, emerging technology and the internet in the greater Brisbane area for 20 years.

Assistance is provided by unpaid volunteer mentors who offer tutoring in the learner's own home on their device at a pace that suits the learner. Students are taught what they need to know along with what they would like to know. BSOL believes that home tuition is more conducive to confident learning.

The organisation can also assist learners in identifying and avoiding scams and cybercrimes that have flourished during the pandemic when people have been confined to their homes. Volunteer mentoring can be a rewarding experience and assists mentors to improve their existing knowledge and skills. Brisbane Seniors Online teaches students to use Windows, Apple, android and smartphones. There is a small Linux group that operates by Zoom.

A digital photography group also meets in the Brisbane CBD and participates in photographic excursions.

New learners, as well as volunteer mentors, are currently being sought in the bayside area. Volunteer mentors joining BSOL are offered a formal induction and ongoing support through the Mentor Support group. Upskilling and training of mentors is provided from time to time.


Susan currently works part-time for an accounting and taxation firm.

WYNNUM WEST STATE SCHOOL CELEBRATES ITS 100TH YEAR

This year marks a major milestone for Wynnum West State School as it celebrates the school's 100th-year centenary on 15 May.

After lobbying the government for four years, from 1917 to 1921, Wynnum West State School was opened on 15 May 1922, with approximately 70 student enrolments in the first year. The land on which the school stands was purchased for £170 in 1918. An estimated £1142 was spent on the construction of one classroom for 60 students.

Past student and current staff member for nearly 25 years, Mrs Kerri Olsen (pictured) said, "Back in 1976, I remember my Year 5 class had 38 students in it. We had no digital devices like they do today, and our weekly music lesson consisted of songs from artists such as Neil Diamond and The Beatles being played through the loudspeaker into our classroom, which I loved!".

Mrs Olsen said one thing that hasn't changed since she was a student at Wynnum West was that the students still look forward to participating in the Interschool Sports Competition. "That was a real thrill," she said.

These days, the Interschool Sports Program offers a variety of sports and activities, including Yoga classes in which the classes are instructed by Mrs Olsen herself.

Principal Ben Turner said over the 100 years, the community has experienced many momentous changes and challenges. In 2009, Wynnum West was fortunate enough to be a part of the State Schools of Tomorrow Project, which saw dramatic changes to our infrastructure. "Our classrooms have been purpose-designed and built to incorporate flexible learning spaces and technology usage," Mr Turner said. The school now has a multipurpose hall, an outdoor basketball court, and many other facilities available for students and community use.

The last couple of years have certainly seen schools challenged with the trials and tribulations of COVID-19.

"The partnership between school staff and parents was once again called upon as we navigated how home learning would work. COVID-19 redefined how school life in the 21st Century could be

adapted, and once again, the resilience and strength of the community proved to be undeniably robust," Mr Turner said.

Today, the school has close to 400 students enrolled and takes pride in the long tradition of serving its community.

"Our community absolutely love being involved in our school. We have seen generations of families enrolled over the years, which is a real testament to the school." said Mr Turner.

"The school treasures community involvement and is proud of the individual care given to each and every student. We run a Play Group two days a



week, a Kindy and High School transition program, and hold many school events that our community are a part of."

The school will be holding a special parade on Friday 13 May, and will be open to anyone wishing to attend. Later in the year, the school will hold a day of celebration, inviting the community to enjoy a fun-filled day at school. Details regarding this day will be advertised next term via their Facebook page, website and newsletter. Happy 100 years, Wynnum West!

THE HISTORY OF THE MANLY FRUIT AND PRESERVING COMPANY

FROM THE WYNNUM MANLY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

When there is a mention of an early jam-making factory in the Manly district, J Hargreaves and Sons of "The Springs" usually comes to mind. John Hargreaves' factory first commenced producing jams in 1891.

Very few people would recall the Manly Preserving Company. A Historical Society Facebook follower sent these two pictures to the Society's Facebook page and asked for details of this company.

A small jam factory was situated in the garden of the first large brick/stone house built on Manly Hill called Wyvernleigh. Wyvernleigh was situated on Portion 78, surveyed in September 1860, and sold to Thomas Jones in November 1862. Here Thomas built his summerhouse, a cool retreat away from the family cattle property at Barambah Homestead, near Goomeri, in the Gympie Region of Queensland.

Wyvrenleigh was sold to Joseph Leuthwaite, then stayed with the Arnold family until 1909, when William Parker purchased the property. Then there were leases to various tenants, including the Anglican Church, the Harman family and the Shepherd family.

A member of the Shepherd family, when reminiscing about earlier days in a church magazine, said the family did make preserves in a shed in the garden.

This shed was mentioned by Archbishop Duhig in his announcement in 1925, printed in the Catholic Press: "His Grace the Archbishop has purchased a property a Manly for future church purposes. The property is situated at the corner of Ernest and Waterloo Streets, in the vicinity of Manly State School, and has a commanding view of the district, the bay and islands. The price of the property, which was owned by Mr. Parker, was in the vicinity of £1,800.00. There is a large brick and stone residence on the property, also the factory of the Manly Preserving Company, which is to be removed". Sydney Catholic Press (30.04.1925).

According to St John Vianney Church magazine, page 1, 7 May 2000, "Manly Parish was established in 1927, following Duhig's purchase of the land in 1926. A hall was built when Father Butler was appointed to the Parish, partly from the timber from the old jam factory, which stood on the property. Built by Mr Percy Shepherd and his assistant Mr Vince Grotty, the hall was used for dances and plays, which enabled the debt to be paid off".

An announcement was made in 1927 that Manly Fruit and Preserving Company had decided to establish a fruit preserving and canning factory at Nambour for which purpose the Olympic Hall had been purchased.

The Queenslander (1.6.1927. page 16) reported, "This building is situated in the centre of town near the railway station. The intention is to install a large new plant. Among the intended projects of the new venture, is the extraction of juice from the small oranges and lemons which hitherto have been unsalable in the markets".

This new secondary industry was established in Nambour. The Manly Preserving Company transported its whole plant to the Olympic Hall in Howard Street, Nambour. The Nambour Chronicle reported, "Not only does it save the famer a considerable amount of cases, but it also saves a considerable amount of railway freight and handling".









THE SCIENCE BEHIND PINS AND NEEDLES

I started off on an orthopaedic surgery career path in the UK and ended up as a radiologist in Queensland. I went from pinning fractured bones to putting needles into arthritic spines. Indeed, the latter is often for compression of nerves resulting in colloquial "pins and needles".

My colleagues and I at ClinRad spend much of our time trying to help patients with spine-related pain. It is an incredibly common problem in the community with many different causes. When I was a medical student and eminent orthopaedic surgeon at the Children's Hospital in Toronto, I learned that when deciding upon surgery, "it is the decision not the incision". If you do the wrong procedure for the wrong reason it does not matter how well you perform that procedure, it will not help the patient, and indeed can occasionally do harm. This maxim has always guided my own medical practice.

So what are the common causes of back pain? Although, occasionally due to a tumour, infection or an inflammatory arthritis similar to rheumatoid arthritis, the vast majority are due to acute injury or chronic wear and tear. The pain may also be due to a disc problem.

Imagine a rubber tyre filled with crabmeat lying in between the bony vertebrae (I call it crabmeat as that is actually what it looks like when you remove the disc material at time of surgery). If the tyre splits, the crabmeat escapes through it then, depending on where it emerges, it can press upon one or more nerves. If that "herniated" or "prolapsed" disc material causes severe nerve compression it can require surgery, but in most cases it simply causes inflammation, and as with anywhere else in the body inflammation causes pain.

Secondly, just as you have paired joints in your limbs... two ankles, two elbows, two hips... at the rear of each level between the spinal vertebrae you have a pair of small joints called facet joints. Just like the bigger joints in your body, you can either acutely injure them or you can develop over time wear and tear changes otherwise known as osteoarthritis. The latter usually reflects prior damage from acute injury and/or abnormal movement at those little facet joints.

Therefore, back pain will commonly arise from problems with the intervertebral discs or facets joints, and these can be inter-related where the rubber tyre deflates allowing abnormal movement and increased loading at the facet joints. Unfortunately, as those tyres deflate or the osteoarthritis facet joints become deformed, the canals the nerves pass through to get from the spine to the limbs become narrowed, and the nerves encroached upon result in pain and occasionally "pins and needles" in the arms or legs.



If your doctor thinks you have a spinal problem that merits imaging investigation and possibly CT scan guided injection(s) for symptomatic relief, radiologists can help to work out the cause of the problem, advise as to possible treatment options and, if required, perform any necessary injections.



SIMPLE SWEET POTATO AND PUMPKIN SOUP RECIPE

Autumn means shorter days and (slightly) cooler weather by the bay. A simple pot of soup makes a perfect light lunch or entrée to a hearty dinner. Pop some soup in a thermos for lunch on the go, or a picnic by the water. Add some crusty bread from your local bakery or weekend market with lashings of butter for maximum deliciousness!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 2 brown onions, chopped
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- A pinch of freshly grated nutmeg
- 4 cups of chicken stock

- 500g butternut pumpkin, diced
- 500g sweet potato, diced
- ½ tsp of chilli flakes (optional) if you'd like some heat
- Pumpkin seeds, chives, or parsley to garnish (optional)

METHOD

- Heat olive oil in a large saucepan or dutch oven over a medium heat.
- 2. Add onions and garlic and fry for a few minutes to soften.
- 3. Add the pumpkin and sweet potato, then cover with the chicken stock.
- 4. Add chilli flakes (if using) and nutmeg.
- 5. Cover the saucepan with a lid and simmer on a low heat for about 30 minutes, or until the pumpkin and sweet potato are soft.
- 6. Remove from heat and using a stick mixer, blend the soup until it's smooth. Alternatively you can use a blender, but allow your soup to cool slightly before blending.
- 7. Serve with a garnish of chopped chives or parsley, and a scattering of pumpkin seeds.
