"We discovered this space during the festival with its polished floors and a bar to boot," Wynnum Fringe festival founder Tom Oliver explained.


"We're so keen for locals and visitors to experience world-class entertainment all year round in the bayside."

QUALITY WOODEN TOYS FOR CHARITY, MADE LOCALLY: MUD FLAT TOYS

In 1996, two builders, the late Graham Schmith and the late Fred Cash, started the Toy Factory, which became Mud Flat Toys. Their main aim was to produce quality wooden toys. The project had the backing of the Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly.

After rather humble beginnings in a double garage at Lota House nursing home, we moved to a larger factory at 180 Youngs Road Hemmant, then to 126 Rickertt Road, Ransome in December 2014. Now we are at 12 Thorne St Wynnum, where Career Employment Australia purchased our premises, and they pay for our overheads.

We make about 33 different toys, including three different cots, high chairs, tables and chairs, aeroplanes, train engines, fire engines and various trucks, and make up to 280 toys each year.

At Christmas time, we distribute all these toys to various charities.

We also distribute toys to women and kids' shelters at Silky Oaks and Babi, Redlands Community Centre, Salvation Army and Gateway Community Group. We also donate our toys at Christmas to children's hospitals, orphanages and any other facility that deals with underprivileged children. Around Easter time, we make kits for kids with cancer and Camp Quality. These kits allow the children to make 25 planes, 25 boats and 25 cars. We also sell some toys throughout the year, which enables us to purchase consumables such as sandpaper, screws and nails.

Timber comes to us in various ways – film sets, shorts from staircase companies, and western red cedar from door and louvre companies. All this comes free. Timber also comes from suburban footpath collections. We also make a lightweight folding timber table, which is ideal for camping and caravanning.


While we are registered as a 'Men's Shed', we operate quite differently, not as much as a social gathering, our main aim is to produce toys. All our work is carried out by retired volunteers who come from all walks of life. We regularly had 10 men to make our painted wooden toys, but numbers are dropping, and we are

now down to four men. Steve Marcussen from our village is our resident spray painter who also assembles the toys after they are painted and lacquered. Brian Horton, also from our village, does maintenance on our machinery and equipment, and he also assembles lots of toys after they have been spray-painted and lacquered. Our workday is Wednesday.

HORSE POWERED LIFE LESSONS AT BLUE TONGUE ADVENTURE

Blue Tongue Adventure's newest disability support program has been wildly popular with participants, as they get the chance to work with horses while learning valuable social and emotional skills along the way.

Once a week, the Blue Tongue crew heads to Gumdale's Kurshonbrooke Lodge for their equineassisted learning program, 'The Stable', under the expert guidance of experienced teacher and equestrian coach, Shonel Balsillie.

Blue Tongue Coordinator Sam Franklin-Wangman said the first 10-week unit is focused on friendships. "It's a really beautiful program; our crew is learning so much about relationships, communication, and emotions. Working with horses helps them to understand people's reactions," she said.

"For example, if you are loud and not respecting a space, a horse will feel that energy and shy away from you. But if you come in open, kind and accepting, horses are willing to come to you. It's the same for our interactions with our family and friends."

Ms Franklin-Wangman said the participants are involved in a diverse range of learning experiences.

"Each session opens with a grounding and gratitude exercise, and there's also time to sit down and work through topics such as feeling overwhelmed, and how to process those feelings," she said.

The Stable is just one of many disability programs on offer every week through Blue Tongue Adventure at Wynnum. There are also woodwork and art workshops, cooking programs, social events, and much more – all designed with young adults in mind.

Are you a commuter who rides a bike? Then have you heard about the great new bike enclosure at Manly Station?

The enclosure has space for up to 40 bikes and 24/7 security cameras for customer and bicycle safety. It's also constructed out of steel mesh, to allow for better surveillance.

Customers can book a space by registering online by scanning the QR code below and paying a \$50 deposit, and collecting a key from the station. It's a great system and very easy to use.



GRANTS AVAILABLE NOW

There are several **Queensland Government** grants available now for community groups and businesses.



The next round of the Gambling Community Benefit Fund will allow flood affect community groups to apply for up to \$100 000. Groups that have not been affected by natural disasters may still apply for funding up to the standard limit of \$35 000. The Disaster Recovery round will open on 16 May and close on 15 July 2022.

The Community Social Enterprise Development Grants offers funding opportunities between \$5000 - \$25 000 for projects that support new social enterprises. The grant opens 3 June and closes 15 July.

The Community Road Safety Grant is open now and closes 10 June. Not-for-profit organisations can apply for funding to deliver road safety initiatives.

Local and visiting artists will perform in the 450 patron venue.

New Development Application for Wynnum CBD

This month a DA has been lodged with the Brisbane City Council for a new building complex at 74 Charlotte Street, Wynnum.

The Application proposes a 27 storey complex with 275 apartments with food and drink outlet; function facility; health care service; office and retail shops.

The site is more than three times the height allowed under the current Wynnum Manly Neighbourhood Plan, which is part of the City Plan.

The site is the locally known 'old IGA' site and a section of land that was part of the old Wynnum Central School and sold off by the Brisbane City Council.

I welcome new developments to the area, but I question if a building of this size meets community needs.

The Centre will hold 116 spaces and 29 car spaces.

This will be the fourth childcare centre to be built in recent times.

I will be asking Council to ensure that the proposed 29 car spaces will be adequate considering the local businesses nearby and primary school 200m away.

E-Scooters

I have received the latest set of statistics on the E-Scooters. Beam operates the purple coloured scooters and Neuron the orange coloured scooter. They have been active in Wynnum Manly Ward over the last five months until the end of April.

Usage in the first month December -10504 users.

It then dropped to 8 303 in January then 3 953 in February before picking up again to 4 278 in March and 5 810 in April.

The total number of trips made was 32 848. This was generated by 9 872 unique user rides which meant the average number of trips per rider was 3.3 trips.

I am still seeking feedback from local residents as to whether the trial of the e-scooters in Wynnum Manly should be continued. The trial is due to finish on 31st May 2022.

LOCAL PARTNERSHIPS KEY TO FUNDRAISING SUCCESS

The Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly and our Days for Girls project work to provide safe, beautiful, washable, and long-lasting feminine hygiene kits for girls and women in developing countries. The program offers dignity, health, and opportunity for all, and programs like this one are saving lives, helping girls stay in school and balancing the scales for women.

It was challenging to find suitable accommodation when the Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly launched their Days for Girls (DfG) sewing project more than 18 months ago.

"The Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre came to the rescue and provided a room at the Shire Clerks Cottage where we could meet fortnightly," explained DfG Team Leader and Rotary member Di Catto.

"This provided a wonderful opportunity for local women to serve as volunteers in a safe, fun environment where they could use their skills or develop new skills as they assisted with this project.

"Our volunteers have helped make and distribute more than 1450 kits overseas. This is a huge effort as each individual kit takes eight hours to complete."

Growth in this project has created the need for a larger workspace. The Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly is pleased to partner with the Wynnum Bowls Club, which has recently come on board and provided a large room with storage to ensure the success of this ongoing project.

Thanks goes to two wonderful community businesses – The Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre and the Wynnum Bowls Club – which both stepped in to help when we really needed support!



WHAT IS KENNEL COUGH, AND HOW DOES IT AFFECT YOUR DOG?

Kennel cough is a highly contagious respiratory condition in pets which, like human coughs and colds, can be caused by a range of different bacteria and viruses. These bugs are spread through the air and lodge in the airways of dogs causing inflammation of the larynx and trachea.

CAUSES

There are a variety of bacteria and viruses which can cause kennel cough:

- Bordetella bronchiseptica
- Canine adenovirus
- Canine distemper virus
- Canine herpesvirus
- Canine parainfluenza and
- Canine reovirus

There are a number of conditions which can increase the risk of dogs developing kennel cough. These include:

- Exposure to places where large numbers of dogs congregate including off leash parks and kennels
- Exposure to dust or cigarette smoke
- Travel induced stress

SYMPTOMS

Kennel cough presents as a forceful, persistent cough. There is often a characteristic 'goose honk' sound and dogs may appear as though they are trying to cough something up – this may look like attempts to vomit. Persistent coughing may result in a dog bringing up frothy saliva or phlegm

material. Some dogs may show sneezing and a runny nose or eye discharge. Appetite and activity levels are often normal.

TREATMENT

Kennel cough is very contagious – dogs should be kept at home until a week after the clinical signs resolve. Some cases of kennel cough resolve without treatment.

If your dog has a persistent cough or seems unwell it is important that you visit your vet – untreated, complicated kennel cough can develop into pneumonia. Your vet may prescribe antibiotics, anti-inflammatories and cough syrup depending on your dog's clinical signs.

PREVENTION

A yearly vaccination, similar to the flu vaccination in people, can help to protect your dog against kennel cough. Vaccinated dogs may still develop kennel cough, but clinical signs tend to be a lot less severe than in unvaccinated animals.



SOMETIMES, THE ONLY CURE IS CHOCOLATE

BY DR DALE GARRED, MANLY VILLAGE MEDICAL

In the last two years you will likely have had your temperature checked more times than you have had done in your entire life...but why? Dr Dale Garred, GP at Manly Village Medical, explains what a fever is, when we need to worry, and what we can do about it.

Each day we are exposed to thousands of microscopic bugs in the things we touch and the air we breathe. Most of the time, unbeknown to us, our bodies quickly and easily destroy them; however, sometimes, a battle unfolds! Bug vs Body! The microorganisms use toxins as their 'weapon', while the body produces immune messengers called cytokines. Both the



toxins AND the cytokines get into the bloodstream where they can influence the body's temperature regulator in the brain.

Imagine in the brain there is a giant air conditioning unit. The standard setting (i.e. a normal body temperature) is anything between 36.0° to 37.3°. This is the temperature at which our body functions best. The toxins produced by microorganisms OR the body's own cytokines can meddle with the air-con controls and turn the set temperature up - giving us a 'fever'. In response, the body starts to try and conserve heat so that it heats up in order to reach this new 'set point', just like if you put the heater on in winter. During this phase, we shake and shiver (also known as a rigor) to generate heat. Our brain even makes us feel cold so that we get a jumper or hop under a blanket so that we 'warm-up'. Even though we feel cold, our body will feel burning hot to touch, because our 'new temperature' is much higher than the normal range.

Eventually - something (for example, Paracetamol or lbuprofen or even just other immune cells produced by our body) grabs the air-con controller in the brain and resets the temperature back to 37 degrees. The body then needs to try and cool down to reach this new setting, and so we sweat and feel cool to touch,



letting off heat to bring the internal body temperature back down. This is when we start to feel better, as the body's normal processes start functioning with ease again.

So in summary, a fever is a temperature above 38°. More often than not, when you have a fever it is safe to just sit back, relax, take some Paracetamol and Ibuprofen...and most of all eat chocolate while your body fights a battle for you. If however, you are concerned about any of your symptoms, phone your GP and ask for a telehealth appointment in the first instance so that we may decide the best way to manage your illness and determine if you require a face-to-face examination.

HOW ELECTRIC VEHICLES ARE CHANGING OUR HOMES

As more Australians switch to electric vehicles, our homes, energy use, grid reliance and storage capacity is changing.

A typical home battery stores around 10-15 kilowatt-hours of energy, whereas an electric vehicle on average has between 50 - 100kWh of storage capacity. The price per kilowatt hour of both a standard home lithium battery and an electric vehicle is comparable. Essentially, buying an Electric Vehicle is almost like paying for the battery and getting the rest of the car as a bonus.

Solar EV chargers are the next technology type. These chargers are integrated with your existing solar power system and allow your home to benefit from 'power optimisation'. These chargers intelligently monitor the power generated by your solar system and the home's consumption in real time to ensure that excess energy is being sent straight to the EV and not fed back to the grid at a lower rate.

Based on a standard 6.6kW solar system, the time taken to charge a new Hyundai Kona EV battery from 20% is approximately seven hours. The range for this vehicle, like similar EV models is 390-400km. This means the average owner who is travelling locally to work or school, can charge the vehicle using solar during the day on the weekend, and have enough range for the whole week. For a 10kW solar system, the charge time from 20% is dramatically reduced to approximately five hours.

The final technology includes Vehicle to House (V2H) or Vehicle to Grid (V2G) Chargers known as Bidirectional chargers. Bidirectional chargers allow you to use your vehicle's battery to power your home as discussed above. When integrated with



the latest smart metering technology, these chargers also afford the same benefits to that of a solar EV charger including power optimisation and minimising exported energy.

What to consider before renovating (PART 1)

Since the onset of the pandemic, we've experienced an extraordinary renovation boom. The number of loans and the amount of money spent on beautifying our homes has skyrocketed, perhaps in part because we've not been able to travel and we've been spending a lot more time at home.

As a result, the average household has about four years' worth of savings up their sleeve, and in many cases, these savings have been funneled into improving our lifestyle at home through property renovations. So, if you're thinking of undertaking a home renovation, this column will cover some key considerations to weigh up.

THE RISK OF OVERCAPITALISATION

The most important thing when planning your home renovation is to make sure you're not overcapitalising. Put simply, overcapitalisation happens when a renovation costs more than it 'makes back' in added value. It's very easy to get carried away when it comes to making improvements to our own homes – particularly if this is your potential 'forever home' rather than an investment property. However, either way, the right renovations can turn your house into a cash flow positive property or simply help you better enjoy living in your home.

Regardless of what kind of renovator you are, most of us would agree that it's best to avoid spending money on our property (whether it's the initial purchase, or spending money on improvements and renovations) that's not able to be recouped down the track if and when we eventually sell.

TIMING

The timing of your renovation is another key factor. At present, there's potentially an increased risk of overcapitalisation as interest rates rise, the sales market stabilises, and the cost of building and labour rises. Not to mention that tradespeople are still in high demand and are therefore rare as hens' teeth at the moment, meaning you'll need to do your get your ducks lined up well in advance and consider having a contingency plan for materials or trades shortages. Given you'll potentially be paying top dollar for your renovation, you may want to consider, is now the right time for the type of renovation you want to undertake?

HOW MUCH IS TOO MUCH?

Start by setting your budget. The general rule of thumb that many still use, is that cosmetic renovations shouldn't cost more than 10% of the current market value of your home. For this, a good starting point is to seek advice from an REIQ-Accredited Agency. They can provide you with a current appraisal for your property as well as solid insights for where to concentrate your renovations. An agent can also provide information on median house prices and a comprehensive sales history for the locality of your property. To help back this up, local comparisons are a valuable guide too – that is, if you can buy a completed property in the area for equal or less than the combined current value of your property plus renovation costs, it's definitely not worth the investment if your intention is to sell in the near future. In this case, adding value to your home should be based on what the market is willing to pay which is why doing your due diligence and understanding the market at the time and where it might be headed is critical.

CONSIDER THE FUTURE BUYER

What else is important to take into consideration is your future buyer. Analyse what type of buyer your



neighbourhood attracts – is it young couples, families, local or interstate investors? Factors that influence their purchasing decisions differ, but what they do share in common include affordability accessibility and local amenities. And what they look for in a property also varies – from new builds on larger blocks through to established housing with the potential for 'flipping' or good investment returns, and affordable homes for firsttime buyers. This will help target the price point you want to achieve with your home renovation, the investment you need to make, and the buyer pool looking for what you'll have to offer.

WHERE TO CONCENTRATE YOUR RENOVATIONS

Unfortunately, the cost of any improvements you make don't always automatically add to the value of your home and translate to a higher valuation. This brings me to the final question in the home renovation equation: Where to concentrate your renovations? To answer this, I need another column, so stay tuned for my next column where I'll tackle this question in detail.

Queensland vacancy rates reach record lows

Rental vacancy rates in Queensland have tightened to record lows in the first quarter of 2022 in more than half of the 50 Local Government Areas and sub regions reported on by the REIQ.

The REIQ's Residential Vacancy Report for the March 2022 quarter, released today, shows the Tablelands Region in Far North Queensland, and the Southern Downs Region along the boundary with New South Wales now top the tightest vacancy rates in the state at a miniscule 0.1%.

In regional areas such as South Burnett, Gympie and Goondiwindi, the vacancy rate has dwindled to a mere 0.2%, representing a ten-year low in each of these regions. Maryborough remained steady at 0.2% (with minimal improvement from the previous quarter at 0.1%).

Record, or equal record lows were reached this quarter in 28 of the 50 LGAs and sub regions in the report, and all but one (Redland's Bay Islands) were sitting at 1.5% or under - which is well within what the REIQ classifies as "tight" (0 – 2.5%), and far from "healthy" (2.6 – 3.5%).

Notably, Brisbane experienced the biggest drops, with Inner Brisbane's (0-5km) vacancy rate tumbling to 1.5%, Middle Brisbane (5-20km) falling to 0.9%, and Outer Brisbane also down to 0.6%. Combined, this resulted in Brisbane LGA vacancy rates slipping to 1.1% and Greater Brisbane going down to 0.7%.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said with the rental squeeze being experienced right across Queensland, now even depleting the vast rental stock in Inner Brisbane, it could signal a renewed interest in city living. "While we continue to see regional markets gradually tightening, Brisbane's vacancy rates have taken a dramatic dive this quarter, especially when looking at the 0-5km Inner Brisbane ring," Ms Mercorella said.

"This drop could reflect the return of international students as well as hospitality and entertainment workers to the inner city, or simply prospective renters focusing their search in areas where the vacancy rate is healthier and they have more options and therefore better prospects.

"Queensland has also had a steep population boost from interstate migration, with those making the shift to the Sunshine State potentially deciding to start their life in the heart of the capital city.

"Yet another factor that's added to the squeeze on rental stock during this quarter is the February flooding disaster displacing people from their homes."

Ms Mercorella said with investors selling and the dominant purchasers being owner occupiers, more homes that were previously investment properties were effectively being removed from the rental market, shrinking an already scarce base of rental supply.

"With the second stage of rental reforms looming, the last thing we need right now in the midst of a rental crisis, is legislative reform which undermines investor confidence," she said.

"With record low vacancy rates, and 36% of our population renting their homes, we can't afford to reduce the appeal of investing in Queensland. That's why we'll continue to advocate for fair and balanced legislation that maintains a level playing field for both investors and tenants."

Keeping your assets safe and protecting against elder abuse

In recent media it has been reported that a family has had to endure a five-year legal battle to protest a Will made under undue influence weeks before a family member's passing.

It has highlighted the importance of keeping your assets safe and putting safeguards in place to prevent elder abuse.

The Public Trustee and CEO, Samay Zhouand said that unfortunately, incidents like this do happen to older members of the community who are at risk of elder abuse.

"It's sad reality, but the majority of cases of financial elder abuse involve direct family members, trusted friends, caregivers, or their attorneys, when someone loses capacity," Mr Zhouand said.

Like any type of elder abuse, financial abuse can be devastating to the victims, but it is often harder to

recognise due to the nature of the relationships older Queenslanders may have with the perpetrators.

We have seen family members take advantage of mental illness, high stress situations and financial challenges to step in under the guise of protection of their parent or older person to take control of the person's finances.

"Having your affairs in order can help to protect you against financial abuse," Mr Zhouand said.

"Enduring powers of attorney and nominated person arrangements play a vital role in protecting yourself and your future."





THE NIGHT THAT ROSIES SAVED MY LIFE

FROM ROSIES, FRIENDS ON THE STREET

"Maddie saved my life." Those were the first words a patron said to a Rosies volunteer when she arrived at Emma Miller Place on a balmy winter evening. The patron, Joan*, wanted to make sure that Maddie knew how grateful she was for the extra support and encouragement Maddie gave her the previous evening.

Maddison had gone over to chat with the regular patrons who were gathered around the side of the van to catch up on all the goings on from the last time she had seen the group and noticed Joan straight away.

"She was standing off to the side of the group of regulars and it was easy to see that she was in pain," Maddison remembers. "Joan shared with me that she had major surgery the day before and was released from hospital that afternoon. She was in a significant amount of pain and was really worried about her ability to recover well outside of hospital."

The longer the two women spoke the more

concerned Maddison became about Joan. "She was very upset, often tearing up while talking, and I saw that over a short period of time she was becoming more unwell and experiencing more pain. I was quite worried about her sleeping rough in her condition," Maddison said.

"I asked Joan if we could call an ambulance for her, but she was very reluctant. She had a very negative experience when she was discharged that afternoon – they were rude, and they treated her poorly," Maddison said.

Another volunteer, Lauren, who was with Maddison and Joan said that, "We were eventually able to convince her that she needed medical support and contacted the Micah Nurse. Joan was adamant that she would not return to the hospital who had treated her unfairly and requested to be taken to the Mater".

After explaining Joan's situation to the Micah team and arranging for them to collect her and take her to hospital we waited with Joan to make sure she was alright until help arrived. While waiting for Micah, Maddison, Lauren, and a regular patron tried to keep Joan comfortable and hydrated but most of all calm and laughing.

The group sat with Joan cracking jokes, chatting, and providing reassurance for the majority of the outreach.

"It was so nice to see her have moments where she wasn't focused on her pain and was smiling and laughing," Maddison said.

Eventually, Micah arrived and helped her to the hospital for further treatment. The team would not see Joan for another four weeks, but they hoped that when they met her again, she'd be in good spirits and better health.

"It was about a month later when I saw Joan again. It was like speaking with a completely different person, she looked so well, was bright and articulate, not at all the woman I spoke to the previous month. You could see the difference in her straight away," Lauren said. Joan was so thankful for the attention and care that the team and Maddison, in particular, had shown her.

Joan recounted to another volunteer, "Maddie saved my life. I had an issue after my surgery and if she hadn't kept encouraging me to talk to Micah and get help, I don't know what would have happened if I had slept rough that night. I don't think I'd be here today without Maddie's kindness".

Little acts of courageous love like Maddison's are not uncommon among Rosies team of more than 1,400 volunteers, but every interaction is special and every patron matters. Sometimes we can forget that it's the little things that so often make the greatest difference.

MY LOCAL MEMORIES: BACKYARD LOOS

There was no sewerage in Wynnum when I was a child in the 1950s. While septic systems existed, most had a backyard toilet, often called the dunny. Rain, hail or shine we relieved ourselves by trekking up the backyard and making deposits in a can under a seat behind the privacy of the dunny door. Torches were a necessity and spiders a concern.

Once every week sanitation workers (dunny men) would come in their truck, remove the full can and replace it with an empty can so we could start again. They were busy men, not wanting to wait if someone was still in the dunny when they came to replace the can. It was embarrassing to be caught on the can by the dunny man. That was my mother's greatest fear: she would wake up with a call of nature but was afraid to go until the dunny man had been. I can remember her sending me down the road on my bike to locate the dunny truck and return with an E.T.A.

The dunny trucks dumped and buried their load in what is now a local park. When I was in about Year 9, a dunny truck tipped over in Gordon Parade while heading to the dump with a full load. In those days there were no mobile phones, and most people did not even have landlines but somehow the word got around in no time. When school got out lots of boys hurried away to see the great calamity and give a full report to the rest of us the next day. For adolescent boys it was the preeminent event of the term.

GLORIOUS WINTER DAYS MEAN FANTASTIC FISHING ON MORETON BAY

Winter is not coming – it's already here, and the fantastic fishing weather we usually enjoy in June is upon us. The early mornings are freezing cold, but those glorious sunny winter days, with the fish just waiting to be caught, make June one of the best months for fishing Moreton Bay.

So, what's on the menu? Whiting will be starting to move back towards the Chain Banks, but the bigger fish will still be around Fisherman's Gutter (they're not always easy to find), the Maroon Gutter and Hole, and also Amity Banks, especially in the shallows with a good run in the tide. Squid strips and peeled prawns work best as bait in the weed banks, but worms (blood or cured beach worms) work best in the sandy areas.

School mackerel will be in good numbers, but the babies will be in large numbers in the bay, and the bigger ones will be harder to get. Bonito and the small tailor stop the bigger mackerel from getting to the spoons, but I found floating pillies will sometimes help catch a few bigger fish. Squire and snapper will be in parts of the bay with spoiled grounds north of Harries artificial reef, Mt Cotton Reach, and the Bay Island drop-offs, producing plenty of good fish, especially an hour each side of the tide using large baits.


The cuttlefish and arrow squid will show up from east of Ormiston to St Helena around the 23 to 30ft mark. Red and silver coloured squid jigs should work best. For whatever reason, dull colours on cloudy days and bright colours on sunny days seem to be the pattern for success, but some days they will take any colour.

So rug up and keep an eye out for the westerly winds – we have previously lost too many lives this time of year, so keep an eye on the Hope Banks beacon wind forecast as it's our best for checking the westerly winds in

the middle of the southern bay. Until next time, good fishing and keep safe!

RACING FOR A GOOD CAUSE: THE PETER BEARD MEMORIAL TROPHY

On March 27th 2022 there were 30 boats racing in Race 3 of the Manly Combined Clubs series, and 23 of those boats also participated in the 10th Annual Big Lap/Peter Beard Memorial Trophy.

This sailing event raises much-needed funds for research into the rare condition Multiple System Atrophy (MSA), at the University of New South Wales.

In 2010, Pete Beard was diagnosed with MSA, passing away five years later. MSA is a rare degenerative neurological condition that affects approximately 2,500 people in Australia. There is currently no cure. Pete raised awareness by competing in the 2014 International Championship for Disabled Sailors (IFDS) in Halifax, Canada, and by donating his brain to MSA Research.

The Peter Beard Perpetual Trophy was presented at the Inaugural Big Lap Race in 2012, to recognise Pete's contribution to club sailing. Now in its 10th Year, this fundraising yacht race around Peel and Green Islands has become a tradition at the Manly Combined Series.

On the day we had 181 people on the water and raised \$1840. To date we have raised over \$22,000 in donations for the research into MSA.

In other news, local sailors also participated in the 74th Brisbane to Gladstone race.

On Good Friday there were many boats leaving their berths in Manly and heading up to Sandgate to compete in the 74th Brisbane to Gladstone vacht race.

The conditions were not as windy as predicted for the start, although that changed during the race with boats recording gale force conditions.



Kyoshi Rene says the exchange has been very beneficial, and to be granted a 5th Dan in JiJitsu and Ian a 2nd Dan, on top of the other grades over the years, is a huge compliment.

SPERO'S WINTER-WARMING SEAFOOD CHOWDER RECIPE

With years of local fishing (and home cooking) experience, it's no surprise fisherman Spero Kartanos has honed the perfect seafood chowder recipe. Here's his recipe for a delicious winter-warming chowder.

SERVES 4

INGREDIENTS

- 24 to 48 clams or pipis, ½ kg reef fish (cubed), ½ kg prawns (peeled and chopped), sand crab meat from 2 sand crabs, ½ kg Tasmanian scallops (with roe on)
- 2 tbsp butter
- 3 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 4 strips of bacon, diced
- 2 leeks, chopped
- 3 large red skin potatoes, diced
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 sticks of celery, finely chopped

METHOD

- 1. In 1 litre of water or fish stock add clams and pipis and bring to boil over high heat until they have opened. Once opened drain and keep stock for later.
- Remove clams and pipis from shells and set aside. In the same pot add the butter and the olive oil, sauté onions and celery until translucent, then add garlic, bay leaves and leeks and sauté until all soft. In the meantime, fry the diced bacon until hard and crispy and set aside (you will add this at the end).
- Add diced potatoes to the onions, leeks etc. mixture, then add thyme and sauté for 3 4 minutes. Add the wine and continue cooking until wine has evaporated.
- 4. Add clam or fish stock and cook until potatoes are soft and liquid has reduced.
- 5. Add cream, tabasco and Worcestershire, and add all the seafood and cook on low heat for 10 minutes.
- 6. Add bacon bits and top with chopped parsley and serve.

WYNNUM COMMUNITY PLACE – A PLACE FOR EVERYONE IN WYNNUM

Wynnum Community Place, located at 55 Berrima Street in Wynnum, has recently been defunded after a successful two-year pilot.

However, the Redland Community Centre Board has decided to continue delivering services to members of the Wynnum community most in need because it is the 'right thing to do' for the people of Wynnum.

Previously, Wynnum Community Place's funding from the Department of Community, Housing and Digital Economy provided emergency relief funds for essentials such as food, fuel, medical scripts, rental relief, and car registration. Wynnum Community Place has no funding and no paid staff and is facing an increasing need to support those most vulnerable in and across the Lytton region.

With the need for this service increasing across Lytton due to the high cost of food, fuel, unaffordable rents, and the housing crisis, Wynnum Community Place is doing what it can to provide assistance. The 'Place for Everyone in Wynnum' is now reaching out, seeking community and business support to continue operating.

An example of the increased need in the community is a recent Tuesday night (26 April 2022) where Wynnum Community Place provided over 70 hot meals at its weekly Tuesday community sit-down meal program – the highest amount of support issued on any one night.

The community meal program is designed to assist those most vulnerable in the Wynnum community: homeless, isolated, seniors and families doing it tough. This program is very much needed and provides, for some, the only opportunity to sit down and receive a hot, homestyle cooked meal. Thankfully the WCP community meals program is kindly funded by the Port of Brisbane, but even that funding is nearing an end.

The homeless situation in Wynnum has increased significantly over the last 12 months, with families now making up the biggest demographic seeking assistance from Homeless United. Homeless United, a homeless program that has been delivering support to those most vulnerable for five years, was also defunded in November 2022.

Families who have jobs, bonds and good financial capacity are living out of their cars. Emergency relief has been part of the service provision in Wynnum for around five years and provides free food parcels, fuel cards, assistance with budgeting and payment of utility bills, meat and vegetables via this federally funded crisis support. Thankfully (and due to the federal government funding received by Redland Community Centre), the Emergency Relief support provided at WCP will continue, albeit at a lesser rate than when state and federal funding was available.

The need for community support and homelessness is increasing, yet funding for both these high-need, necessary and vital programs has been removed.

Wynnum Community Place delivers weekly 'Changing Lanes' and community meals on Tuesday, emergency relief (Tuesday & Thursday), Meditation (Monday), AA & NA (Thursday). Additional programs and events available for the people of Wynnum include new parents' support, International Women's Day, Christmas and Back to School projects.

Wynnum was provided with the highest amount of support over any other region (Redlands, SMBI, Minjerribah, Wynnum/Manly) by both the Christmas and Backpack to School programs this financial year.

Wynnum Community Place is always looking for collaborative partnerships that align with our vision of 'Building Resilience, Community Wellbeing and Capacity'. Wynnum Community Place has been embedded in the Wynnum community since 2017 and knows the people of Wynnum and their needs extremely well.

PORT TIDINGS JUNE 2022 LATEST NEWS FROM THE PORT OF BRISBANE

PORT of BRISBANE

Port of Brisbane is Queensland's largest multi-cargo port, handling 95% of the state's containers and motor vehicles, and approximately 50% of its agricultural exports. Over 70 businesses are located within the port precinct, employing thousands of people. We're also an active member of the local and regional community, supporting not-for-profit and community organisations and playing our part in protecting and enhancing the natural environment.

TRADE

Import containerised trade through the Port during January to April 2022 decreased by 3.4% against 2021, with a total of 212,654 full twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUS). The late-February flood event and temporary closure of Brisbane's shipping channel impacted import and overall trade volumes for March.

April volumes were bolstered by the return of delayed March cargo, however on-going supply chain disruptions, particularly due to COVID-related lockdowns in overseas ports, has resulted in further vessel delays which is anticipated to impact import volumes in the short term.

COMMUNITY

Applications for PBPL's 2022/23 Community Grant Program have closed. We will notify all applicants of the outcome during July. This year, we received more than 50 applications from across Brisbane and South East Queensland, including from Bayside community organisations and registered notfor-profits. We're looking forward to the year ahead with our community grant partners.

PBPL and our long-term partner, environmental organisation Bulimba Creek Catchment Coordinating Committee (B4C), have received a major funding boost from PBPL's securityholder, IFM Investors, in the form of a \$40,000 community grant to support a bushland rehabilitation project.

The project will rehabilitate a highly degraded section of an important waterway and biodiversity corridor on Brisbane Bayside State College land. Once completed, it will provide unique learning opportunities for BBSC and other Bayside school students and education providers and improve environmental outcomes for the local wildlife and waterway corridor.

PORT DEVELOPMENT

PBPL is delivering new facilities for port customers to support their growth, with projects in our Port West Industrial Estate in Lytton and on Fisherman Island.

PBPL and global logistics and supply chain operator, MEDLOG, have signed a 30-year lease to develop a 7.3ha site on Fisherman Islands. It is supporting MEDLOG's expansion into Queensland and, when operational, will be one of the world's most automated container parks, incorporating high-end technology to deliver world-class standards in terms of operation and safety. The facility is expected to be operational by the third quarter of 2022.

BRISBANE INTERNATIONAL CRUISE **TERMINAL**

The Brisbane International Cruise Terminal (BICT) welcomed its first passengers on 2 June, with the arrival of P&O's Pacific Explorer.

Brisbane's new home for cruising is a world-class terminal, capable of handling the largest cruise ships in the world. It is located at the mouth of the river in Pinkenba, just 15 minutes from Brisbane Airport and offers over 900 onsite, paid car parking spaces. Car parking is booked via the Wilson Parking website and all parking onsite at the BICT is paid parking.

WHO CARES IF I'VE LOST A BACK TOOTH – NO ONE CAN SEE IT!




