

VIETNAM VETERANS' DAY, AUGUST 18, 2022 COMMEMORATION

On August 18, we commemorate Vietnam Veterans' Day on the anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan in 1966. We remember the sacrifices of those who died and say "thank you" to almost 60,000 Australians who served during the 10 years of our involvement in the Vietnam War.

We remember and pay tribute to our five local soldiers lost in this war; their names are listed on the memorial at Richard Russel Park, Manly.

Private Ian W Kingston, 20, of Nambour, Queensland. He was a bank officer when called up in October 1968. The rifleman private with 6RAR was killed in action in Bien Hoa Province on September 3, 1969.

9 RAR Private Raymond Charles Kermode 21, of Hemmant QLD, was a tailor's cutter when he was called up in February 1966. Raymond was killed in a contact with the enemy in a bunker system in Long Khan Province on July 19 1969, at the age of 21.

4RAR Private Joseph Ramsey, aged 22, originally from Catrine, Scotland, was a carpenter before being called up for National Service on April 17 1967. He sailed with the Battalion for South Vietnam in May 1968. During Operation GOODWOOD in Bien Hoa Province on January 31 1969, 10 Platoon contacted an enemy force in a bunker system, and during the firefight, Joe was killed.

1RAR Private Christopher Robert Nisbet from Brisbane, QLD. He was known as "cowboy" or "wild eyes" by his mates. Christopher was killed in action from enemy contact in Bien Hoa on May 14 1968, at the age of 20. He is lovingly remembered by his wife Barb and daughter Chris.

6 RAR Private Kenneth Howard Gant, known as "Kenny", Gant was born on January 6 1945, in Brisbane. He grew up on the family

property at Belmont and attended school locally. Later, he went to work as a butcher. Gant was popular in town. He was a good singer, entertaining at local parties, and his friends gave him the nickname "Bing". Gant was called up for service on June 30 1965. He was killed in action on August 18, 1966.

We invite the local community to commemorate Vietnam Veterans' Day at our service at Manly Memorial, Richard Russell Park, Manly, at 11am.

Refreshments will follow at the Manly Lota RSL Sub-Branch hall at 184 Melville Terrace, Manly.

HYDROGEN SUPERHIGHWAY

A Bayside public service station will be the site of Australia's first hydrogen refuelling facility.


Last month I attended the sod turning at the Port of Brisbane's BP Truckstop, which is set to become a state-of-the-art refuelling stop for all hydrogen power vehicles (including marine vessels). When



complete, the facility will be powered by solar energy and will be able to refill a hydrogen car in three to five minutes.

Establishing a hydrogen supply chain creates opportunities right through from research and development, production, storage and distribution as well as hydrogen vehicle manufacturing, meaning skilled jobs for the future for Queenslanders.

This station will be a critical link on the east coast hydrogen superhighway, and I'm thrilled that Lytton will play a key role in Queensland's move towards an emissions-free future.



GRANTS FORUM

COST OF LIVING SAVINGS WEBSITE

Queensland households will receive a \$175 Cost of Living rebate on their electricity bill. This rebate is available to residents who are charged separately for electricity (e.g. not as part of a rent agreement) and will appear as a credit on the next full-cycle bill.

The Queensland Government has also launched the Smart Savings Concessions and Rebates website to help residents find savings that they are eligible for. The easy-to-use website lists all available concessions and rebates, from public transport and housing to cultural and recreational experiences.

BUDGET

The Bayside is set to benefit from education and infrastructure funding in the 2022 - 23Queensland Budget.

Lindum Station Precinct will receive a further \$7 million to deliver upgrades to signalisation at Kianawah Road level crossing. This builds on the \$40 million already committed to the accessibility upgrade and additional 70 spaces



to the park 'n' ride facilities. These important safety upgrades will benefit local drivers, commuters, people walking and riding bikes.

\$15 million has been allocated to upgrade fuel storage facilities at Port of Brisbane. The construction of a new section of wharf deck and pipelines to connect the Lytton Fuel Import Terminal to the Port of Brisbane wharf deck will support more than 260 construction jobs.

Our local schools will benefit from a record education investment, with Wondall Heights State School, Darling Point Special School, Manly State School and Moreton Bay Education Centre to receive new buildings and facilities and all schools to share in over \$1 million for important maintenance works.

And Y-Care's Wynnum Neighbourhood and Community Centre will also receive increased funding to ensure that those in our community who need a hand, a friendly face or a cuppa will have a place to go.

PETER CUMMING'S LOCAL AREA UPDATE

COUNCILLOR FOR WYNNUM MANLY WARD

There are some major issues facing Wynnum Manly residents.

27 STOREY BUILDING

As most people would be aware, local developers Ham Brothers have lodged a Development Application (DA) for a 27 Storey predominantly unit complex near the corner of Charlotte Street & Bay Terrace, Wynnum.

This is in contrast to the height limit under the Neighbourhood Plan which is 9 storeys.

Please let me know what you think.

I believe that Council planners are likely to refuse the DA, but I am concerned what may happen if the Developers appeal.

The Council does have a habit of refusing DA's then back downing on Appeal.

SAND AND MUD ALONG THE FORESHORE

A local resident has raised with me the possibility of getting sand from Port of Brisbane dredging and placing it along the Foreshore.

Would you go swimming if there were more sandy beaches along the Esplanade?

This decision would require considerable input from State Government Departments as Waterloo Bay off Wynnum/Manly is part of the Moreton Bay Marine Park.

I'm sure that the environmental experts within the Department will have a view on whether sand should be allowed or whether mud, glorious mud, is better for the environment than sand.

Are there any marine environment experts out there who would have a view of this vexed issue?

E-SCOOTERS TRIAL HAS BEEN EXTENDED FOR ANOTHER SIX MONTHS

The Brisbane City Council have extended the trial for E-Scooter contractors, Neuron (orange coloured scooters) and Beam (purple coloured scooters) for another six months.

Now I know that a lot of people don't like the E-Scooters but in contrast, a lot more people are using them than complaining about them.

So the average usage is 3.33 trips for each rider.

As you can see, thousands of people have used the E-Scooters. The State Government's Minister for Transport & Main Roads, Mark Bailey has introduced further requirements for the Scooters.

Minister Bailey advised the following:

"Through stakeholder engagement, it was identified that the location of parking and speeds were the biggest issues for the community. The action plan aims to develop a simple and effective parking scheme to ensure our footpaths are safe for everyone, without barriers.

"We'll also be increasing the penalties for high-risk offences to ensure e-scooter riders are aware of the consequences of unsafe riding.

This will include speeding, using a mobile phone while riding and riding on prohibited roads."

Minister Bailey said the new penalties followed the announcement of 12 km/h speed limits on footpaths.

"Earlier this year we announced that speeds would be halved to 12 kilometres per hour on footpaths which was a really important step in reducing dangerous, high-speed interactions between pedestrians and riders.

"This was a quick win and pushes us in the right direction to support our transition to larger regulatory reform." Minister Bailey said, "Queensland Police were supporting the reforms through behaviour blitzes, to ensure e-scooter riders are complying with rules and regulation.

"They will be focusing on the urban areas of Brisbane where e-scooter use is particularly high, so I ask everyone do the right thing – not just when Police are around, but every time you get behind the handlebars."

Council will be working with the Queensland Government on these initiatives.

GRANTS SEMINAR

The annual Grants Seminar run by State Member, Joan Pease and myself is all set to be held on the Thursday, 11th August upstairs at the Wynnum RSL (174 Tingal Road, Wynnum) from 6.30pm-8.30pm.

We will have Council staff talking about Council Grants, State Government staff talking about State Grants and private groups addressing their own Grants. Groups like the Port of Brisbane Corporation and Wynnum Manly Leagues Club to name a few have also been asked to speak at this seminar.

I hope to see as many people as possible at this popular seminar.

Every community group needs a Grant Officer who is always looking for a way to access funds for their organisation.



ALL ABOUT PET DENTAL HEALTH

August is pet dental health month. Did you know that over 80% of dogs and cats over the age of three years have some degree of dental disease? The most common form of dental disease is referred to as periodontal disease. Periodontal disease is infection and inflammation of the periodontium, which are the tissues surrounding the tooth. The disease starts with gingivitis (inflammation of the gums) and if untreated, can progress to infection of the tooth socket, destruction of bone and eventual tooth loss.

How do I know if my pet has dental disease?

- Halitosis (the dreaded "doggy breath") can be a sign that there are bacteria accumulating in your pet's mouth, and there may be tartar and gingivitis which need treatment.
- Discolouration of the teeth and gums.
- Difficulty picking up or chewing food pets may drop food or preferentially choose softer foods.

• Swelling under the neck or sides of the face may indicate swollen lymph nodes or tooth root infections.

What can I do at home to keep my pet's mouth healthy?

- Check your pet's mouth at least weekly. It is useful to get puppies and kittens used to having their mouths opened at a young age, so they are comfortable with being handled around the face.
- Some dogs and cats can be trained to have their teeth brushed. There are specialised toothbrushes and pet-friendly toothpastes available.
- Provide treats that encourage chewing there are a variety of options available. Dental chews such as Oravet and Greenies can be useful.
- Fresh, raw bones are helpful for some pets it is important to choose appropriate-sized bones for your pet. Your vet can suggest bones that may be suitable for your furry friend



- Use dental gels or wipes to clean your pet's mouth.
- Have your pet's teeth checked by your vet every six months. This allows for early identification and treatment of any issues which may be occurring.



IS SITTING TOO MUCH BAD FOR YOUR HEALTH?

The humble chair has been around for centuries. Early Egyptian and Chinese cultures used it as a symbol of great authority, with only kings, dignitaries or the very wealthy able to afford one. Not until the 1880s did chairs become common in American households. Even then, they were only used for sitting down to eat dinner.

Before computers and advances in machinery, much of the workforce was involved in manual tasks which involved walking, carrying bulky objects, and operating hand tools. With the advent of modern technology, a lot of these tasks are now done sitting at a desk in front of a computer. Australian statistics show that 68.5% of the workforce are either

sedentary or have very low levels of activity. Essentially, we go to work and sit for eight hours, and that is having serious effects on our health.

Sedentary occupations can lead to chronic conditions such as obesity, diabetes, hypertension and even early mortality. Other common risks associated with desk-bound workers are repetitive strain injuries and musculoskeletal issues such as neck and back pain. These risks can be reduced by buying quality chairs, using sit-to-stand desks and regular exercise. When people are sitting for prolonged periods of time, it can cause muscles to shorten and joints to become stiff, reducing range of motion. This can lead to a vicious cycle of increased pain and even less movement.

There are some simple changes to your lifestyle, and in particular, work habits that can negate a lot of these problems:

- 1. Get off your bus or train a stop earlier to increase walking before and after work.
- 2. At lunchtime take a walk around the block or walk and talk on the phone.





- 3. When getting up to use the printer/fax etc., do an extra lap or two of the floor you're on to stretch out.
- 4. Every hour or two get up and perform a stretching/mobility routine focusing on the hip flexors, glutes and posture muscles of the middle back.

WE WILL REMEMBER THEM: VIETNAM VETERANS' DAY AT WYNNUM RSL

FROM WYNNUM RSL

A war rages on in a distant land, a land weathered by monsoonal rains and thick jungles, harbouring an enemy like no other.

More than 60,000 Australians served in the Vietnam War for almost nine years, the longest conflict of the 20th century, ranging from 1962 to 1973. During this time, a small platoon of Australian and New Zealand troops took part in the most defining battle of the war, The Battle of Long Tan.

On the 18th of August 1966, a brutal campaign roared on in the fields of a decimated rubber plantation in heavy rain against an enemy that outnumbered them 10 to one. Despite being surrounded and despite the heavy artillery fire,

the Allies pushed back. Supplies ran low, and the thick fog shrouded the troops from reinforcements; the gunfire and thunder rang throughout the day. As the sun eventually disappeared beyond the horizon, the sounds of silence filtered through the air. The battle was over, and we had won. Acts of extraordinary heroism were evident on this day and throughout the entirety of the Vietnam War.

During this conflict, Australian troops fought fiercely alongside our American Allies to triumph over the enemy. However, such a victory did not come without loss: 3000 returned injured, and 521 Australians gave their lives. Our nation will never forget the bravery and spirit of our soldiers during this time. We honour and respect their courage.



GET THE MOST BANG FOR YOUR BUCK FROM YOUR POWER COMPANY

FROM GOODHEW ELECTRICAL AND SOLAR

There's no doubt that you've heard recent media reports talking about the energy 'crisis' currently grappling the nation. In May, the Australian Energy Market Operator warned of an increase to the wholesale power price in Queensland. Due to this, energy retailers across the Energex network have passed on substantial rate increases, most of which came into effect on July 1.

In South-East Queensland, we are lucky enough to benefit from a deregulated energy market which allows us the freedom to shop around and choose from over 30 energy retailers. Unlike our regional counterparts who are limited in choice to just one retailer; in SEQ it's easy to change retailers or negotiate a better, fairer deal.

At Goodhew Electrical and Solar, we often get asked which electricity retailer has the best deal. This is a difficult question to answer as it depends on so many things, so our recommendation is to visit the Government's Energy Made Easy website to see what deal is right for the customer. If you've received a letter from your retailer notifying you of an increase to your electricity supply rates and usage tariff, you may benefit from visiting www.energymadeeasy.gov.au.

READ YOUR ELECTRICITY BILL

If you haven't received any notification from your retailer, the best way to check for any changes to your rates / tariff pricing is to read your

latest electricity bill. Firstly, your bill will break down your grid usage. Most houses have at least two tarifs. The main tariff with the highest usage will be your normal power that is on 24/7: this is charged at a higher rate than the other tariffs. Your bill should show the kilowatthours used (kWh) and the cost per unit (\$). If you have a second tariff (i.e. a night-time or 18-hour tariff for your hot water system or pool, this will be shown in the same way on your statement of charges.

The next area to look at is the breakdown of your supply charges. These are the daily fees that your electricity retailer charges you for supplying power to your premises. Depending on the retailer, this can include a daily supply charge - usually around \$1/day; and metering charges - usually a few cents per day.

COMPARE YOUR RATES WITH OTHER RETAILERS

Once you've found what your current rates are, you can compare these to other retailers. Calculate how much each retailer will charge you in daily supply/metering fees and what their tariff rates are. Most people will look for the lowest tariffs and don't realise that the daily supply charges are a lot higher. If you have solar, you should see which retailer is offering the best feed-in tariff. Try using a government-owned comparison site to compare offerings while avoiding those pesky spam emails and phone calls.

CHAT TO YOUR EXISTING RETAILER

Once you've done your research, speak to your existing retailer and ask them to give you their best rate. If you're a long-term customer, you may be able to negotiate a good deal with them.



REIQ readies agents for new rental laws

The Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) expects the ripple effect of the most significant rental legislative reforms in more than a decade will start to be felt by the community, with less than three months until the new laws come into effect on 1 October 2022.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said the State peak body was readying property managers for the changes to the legislation governing residential tenancies in Queensland so they were prepared to help property owners and tenants navigate the new legislative landscape.

Ms Mercorella said one of the more damaging legislative changes was the removal of the right for property owners to end a periodic tenancy simply by providing notice.

"When these laws were passed, we warned they could effectively spell the end of periodic tenancies in Queensland," Ms Mercorella said.

"Our best practice advice for property managers is to start talking to their clients now about the risk of a 'neverending tenancy' if they don't transition periodic tenancies to fixed-term tenancies ahead of the new laws. "We wouldn't be surprised if periodic leases become extremely rare if not extinct in Queensland, which is a shame given the flexibility it offers both tenants and lessors."

Ms Mercorella said property managers were also preparing for a potential influx of tenants seeking approval for pets, given owners could only decline if they can establish prescribed grounds.

"We recognise that pets are often a beloved family member, but equally appreciate that not all property owners feel comfortable with the potential risk of pet damage to their property and its value," she said.

"Previously property owners could choose to simply say 'no' to pets in their property, but with these new laws, property owners will have limited grounds to refuse a pet request.

"While it's a silver lining that property owners will gain the ability to impose certain conditions in relation to the approval of a pet in their property, and be able to seek compensation for damage caused by pets, only time will tell if this change will shrink the rental pool if investors tap out." She said heavy-handed legislative reform that disrupts the delicate balance of contractual rights between tenants and property owners can have unintended consequences for the entire rental market.

"While we understand that there needs to be protections available for tenants, finding the right balance is important, because we do heavily rely on private investors when it comes to housing Queenslanders."

How to tell if your hot water system is on its last legs

We've already noticed that bath weather has set in! Although the winter season is excellent for lengthy, hot baths, it's also the absolute worst time to run out of hot water. But how can you tell if your hot water system is on its last legs?

Why is my hot water system leaking?

If water is leaking or pooling around the tank or continually dripping from the tap or expansion valve, it could be a clear sign that the system is wearing out.

When is my hot water system too old for repairs?

If your storage hot water system is more than ten years old or your instant unit is more than 20 years old, it's quite possible it's getting too old for repairs to be viable.

Why do I keep running out of hot water?

One possibility is that there could be a leak in the tank, which would cause hot water to escape and leave you with less hot water. Or there could be an issue with the heating element, thermostat, or gas burner. Another possible reason you might be running out of hot water is that the tank/unit is too small for your household needs. If your tank is too small, it might not be able to store/produce enough hot water to meet your requirements, upgrading to a larger unit is probably on the cards.

Why has my hot water heater started to make so much noise?

Ongoing noises from the hot water heater such as groaning, popping, or banging, can be an indication that it's wearing out.

Why does the gas hot water system pilot light keep going out?

There are a few reasons why the gas hot water system pilot light might keep going out. One is that there's something blocking the pilot light, such as dirt or insects. Another possibility is that there's a problem with the thermocouple, which would prevent the pilot light from staying lit. If you notice any of these signs, it's probably time to start looking for a new hot water system.

Where to concentrate your renovations (PART 2)

With lending for renovations reaching a record high of over \$600 million in Australia, representing almost three times the level we saw prior to the pandemic, it's clear many of us have shifted our focus to improving our homes.

In my last column, I outlined some of the key things to consider before undertaking a home renovation including the risk of overcapitalising, timing, budget, and keeping your potential future buyer in mind. Now in this follow-up column, I'll tackle the all-important question of where to concentrate your renovations.

Depending on who you ask, and what your motivations for the renovation are, there are umpteen ways to answer this. However, if you're renovating for net gain, not all renovations are equal and differ significantly in their contribution to the overall increased value of your home.

VALUE WITHOUT BREAKING THE BANK

Start by thinking about where the 'quick wins' could be – in other words, where can you make home improvements with minimal effort (and expense) for maximum effect. This means focusing on cosmetic renovations in highly visible and regularly utilised areas (rather than the laundry).

For example, internal renovations which add appeal with minimal cost include small scale cosmetic improvements such as a fresh coat of paint, new carpets or floor coverings, updating fixtures (such as lighting or window treatment), and updating cabinetry and handles. This surface retouching can remove signs of ageing and wear and tear that are part and parcel of living in a home, and make your property feel like new.

Curb appeal can account for up to 10% of your property's value, so giving your property's street façade a facelift can help attract potential buyers and achieve a better return

on your investment. This could include new exterior paint, and the opportunity to modernise your property with a colour refresh. Other easy exterior renovations to consider include modernising lighting, improving front fencing, and landscaping and gardening in the front yard. As with everything exterior, first impressions count and are often lasting impressions.

ROOM TO RENOVATE

However, just doing minor alterations will often not net a return big enough to cover the capital injection and selling costs. So, if you're wanting to make some bigger scale improvements, start by considering what might be the biggest bug bear or obstacle for prospective buyers to make an offer on your property – or in other words, where is the most room for improvement?

Generally, it's agreed that money is well spent on overhauling worn and outdated kitchens or bathrooms. The old adage that 'the kitchen is the heart of the home' still rings true. But be careful, otherwise you'll watch your total budget be swallowed whole. Put simply, kitchens are expensive. Splashbacks, soft-close drawers, breakfast bars, butler's pantries, integrated appliances - It's incredibly easy to go overboard, and that's why it's key to remain laser focused on your objective and budget. Also don't bite off more than you can chew, since cutting too many corners simply isn't worth it, so it's probably best to choose to either tackle the kitchen or the bathroom, rather than both.

A NOTE ABOUT NEUTRAL

When renovating for sale your mantra should be less is more and neutral is best. You might love bright feature walls, beachy-themes, black accents, or Portuguese tiles, but not everyone will share your tastes. If it's your forever home, then obviously go ahead and do the renovations to



align with your personal taste. However, if it's an investment property or a shorter-term home, you really want to be careful about any style decisions that could be polarising. To be safe, take emotion out of it and stay objective by choosing practical, neutral styles so you're appealing to a broader audience when it comes time to sell.

MAINTENANCE

Lastly, consider the upkeep and longevity of your renovations, which will potentially weigh on buyer's minds. If you've put in a pool or elaborate garden, for example, this may appeal to families but be seen as a maintenance chore for an elderly couple. If you've renovated the kitchen or bathroom with penny round tiles, marble, or copper, while trendy now, this could be viewed as a cleaning nightmare for the prospective buyer.

Remember a few refreshing cosmetic upgrades could make a big difference to the price you may ultimately achieve for your property. 



AUGUST FISHING – BRAVING THE COLD FOR A SEAFOOD BOUNTY

The weather in August is hit and miss with cold and blustery westerlies and then some dead calm days, but the fishing should be excellent.

Plenty of local species will be in abundance. The whiting will be all throughout the Small Boat Channel, Rous Channel and Amity Banks, the Sand Hills and the Blue Hole, so there's no excuse not to get a feed for most families! Bait-wise, my favourites are blood worms, beach worms, peeled small prawns, and squid strips, with the easiest rig being the paternoster. This works best and creates fewer tangles; my tip is to get a good run in the tide.

School mackerel should also be abundant in the bay, especially in the Small Boat Channel towards the Rous entrance. This time of year, there will be lots of undersized fish, but there will be some really nice ones in between. There are also a few tailor in the bay this month, so try floating pillies or trolling diving boards with spoons or smith jigs, and you should catch a few.

The squid and cuttlefish are still in good numbers

in the deeper water east of the mainland, and some will have moved into the weed banks, but I'm finding the dull jig colours work best on cloudy days and the bright colours best on sunny days.

The snapper season re-starts in the bay on the 15th of August, and if it's as good as it was before the four-week closure, we are in for some good squire and snapper fishing. Cuttlefish heads, any whole little fish and grinner fillets (and of course whiting whole or heads) are the best baits.

On a serious note, this time of year, in the past, we have lost too many lives as a result of drownings in the bay due to strong westerly winds. Please, if you have a small boat, be careful – just because you can't see the whitecaps from shore does not mean it's safe to go out. Also, this is the first 12 months of having the newly-installed BOM weather beacon on Hope Banks, so there's no

excuse for not knowing the wind strength and direction. Keep safe and good fishing!

Wynnum resident and mum of a young liver recipient, Tarra Stevens, is calling on the local community to get behind this year's DonateLife Week campaign and help save the lives of those on the transplant waitlist.

Tarra knows only too well how life-changing organ and tissue donation is to those in need.

The mum of little Levi, who is now three years post-liver transplant, is so thankful for Levi's new liver that she's been out pounding the pavement and has signed up around ten coffee shops to participate in DonateLife's Register in two sips campaign.

The campaign aims to spread the organ and tissue donation message through biodegradable stickers on local café takeaway cups throughout Australia.

"Without a new liver, Levi wouldn't be here today," Tarra said. "His donor and donor family made the decision to donate their loved one's organs that saved my son's life. "The doctors tried everything they could to control Levi's genetic disorder, but a transplant was the only solution for him to be able to live."

There are currently 1,750 Australians waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant, with more than 13,000 Aussies on dialysis who may one day benefit from a kidney transplant.

"It's important for people to register to be organ and tissue donors because there are numerous people currently on the transplant waiting list, and organ and tissue donation can save and change multiple lives," Tarra said. "You can be a real-life hero."

You can join the "Register in two sips" campaign by emailing your coffee shop name and the number of stickers you would need for seven days' worth of takeaway coffee to donatelife@health.qld.gov.au.

If you haven't yet registered as an organ and tissue donor, it only takes one minute through donatelife.gov.au, your MyGov account, or the Medicare Express Plus app.

OZFISH ON FRONTLINE OF RESTORING MORETON BAY TO HEALTH

FROM OZFISH CENTRAL MORETON BAY CHAPTER

The OzFish Central Moreton Bay Chapter of volunteer recreational fishers is enhancing water quality, rejuvenating aquatic life, improving fishing and seagrass habitat, and slowly returning Moreton Bay to its former glory through a first-of-itskind shellfish reef restoration project.

The group is delivering on its ambition to restore more than 100 hectares of shellfish reef in the Bay – providing a healthy ecosystem and sustainable legacy for generations to come.

OzFish is Australia's fishing conservation charity – dedicated to empowering recreational anglers and communities to take control of the health of their local rivers, lakes and estuaries. This creates environments in which native fish can survive and thrive, ensuring Aussies can continue to enjoy their favourite fishing spots.

The restoration of shellfish reefs is vitally important as they play a key role in marine ecosystems but unfortunately an estimated 95 per cent of Australia's shellfish reefs are functionally extinct.

Fish and other aquatic life rely on shellfish reefs for habitat, providing places where they can shelter, breed, and source food. They are also a natural filter, improving water clarity and promoting the growth of seagrass.

The OzFish Central Moreton Bay Chapter is collecting used oyster shells, sterilising them, putting them in innovative Robust Oyster Buckets (ROBs) and placing them at strategic points approved for restoration. The shells are currently collected at a 19.4 hectare location donated by the Port of Brisbane. Every oyster shell that is recycled and returned to the Bay can provide a home 10 or more baby oysters.

Local people and businesses can easily get involved in supporting this effort to restore Moreton Bay's shellfish reefs.

Spearheading the project is local rec fisher, Robbie Porter.

"This is important work and its success relies on the ongoing support of the local community," said Robbie.

"People and businesses have really been getting behind it, through donating used shells or helping at the Moreton Bay Shellfish Recycling Centre, and we can make a real difference to the health of Moreton Bay.

"ROB Building working bees are scheduled twice a month, for the community to come and help clean the shells and build the ROBs. You can volunteer at one of these days online."

REDLAND MUSEUM'S NEW DISPLAY ELECTRIFIES HISTORY

Redland Museum has a new display in the Agricultural Pavilion about the connection of electricity in the Redlands.

The display showcases the tremendous social change in the lives of all the people in the area now covered by Redland City when the electric power was connected by the public power authority, the City Electric Light Company.

The first areas connected were Cleveland and Redland Bay in the 1930s, and some of the last were the Bay Islands in the 1980s, which led to residential development and continues to the present day.

Items on display were given by early farming families, which they used, such as the gas generator for lighting in their homes, a small Southern Cross low voltage lighting generator together with a collection of portable lanterns, some still used today but only a very few cases.

For people at the time, it was a dramatic moment when the lights came on. With the flick of a switch, people could now work, read and do other activities at night.


Electricity changed the lives of families from the moment they got up in the morning until when they went to bed. Electrification and its many applications made possible in all walks of life were profoundly significant. People had power for major innovations such as refrigerators to keep food fresh and appliances such as irons, stoves and clothes washers which made life easier than the physically hard work needed up to then. It also made life safer, for example, coloured lights instead of dangerous candles on Christmas trees. As more and more people turned to electricity, older forms of lighting like candles and oil lamps became used only for emergencies such as during blackouts.

WONDERFULLY RICH LAMB SHANK RAGU PASTA RECIPE

This is a perfect Sunday lunch or dinner recipe that slow cooks in the oven to create a rich and delicious pasta sauce. Serve it with a simple green salad, or crusty bread to soak up the sauce. SERVES 4

INGREDIENTS

- 4 large lamb shanks
- 3 cups of red wine
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- Sprig of rosemary
- 4 tbsp tomato paste

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 3 x 400g tins of whole tomatoes
- 4 cups of chicken stock
- Salt and pepper to taste1 cup of frozen or fresh peas
- 1 x 500g packet of dried pasta of your choice – fettucine works well with this
- sauce, or use penne like we have done.
- Grated parmesan or pecorino cheese to serve.

- METHOD
- 1. Preheat your oven to 180°c (or 160°c fan forced).
- 2. Heat the oil in a large heavy oven-proof pot (big enough to hold all your lamb shanks) at a medium to high heat a dutch oven with a lid is ideal.
- 3. Brown the lamb shanks on all sides you may need to do this in batches.
- 4. Pour the wine over the lamb shanks, then the tomatoes and chicken stock.
- 5. Add the garlic, tomato paste, rosemary to the pot and stir to combine.
- 6. Bring to a simmer, then place the pot, with a lid on (or cover tightly with two layers of tin foil) in the oven.
- 7. Cook for 3 hours in the oven, or until the lamb shank meat starts to fall off the bone.
- 8. Remove pot from oven, take out lamb shanks and strip the meat from the bones. Keep the meat aside (cover with tin foil to keep warm) for later and discard the bones.

- 9. Put the pot with your sauce on the stovetop, and simmer gently, uncovered over medium to low heat, until it is reduced (about 20 minutes) so you have a thick sauce.
- 10. While your sauce is reducing, boil a large saucepan of salted water and cook your pasta as per the packet instructions.
- 11. Return the lamb shank meat to the sauce, and add a cup of fresh or frozen peas. Heat through for 1 2 minutes. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 12. Combine the sauce with your cooked pasta, give it a dusting of freshly grated cheese, and serve immediately.

Don't be afraid of the amount of wine in this recipe – it cooks down slowly to create a beautifully rich flavour. Likewise the omission of the usual celery/carrot/onion mix – this ragu is all about getting maximum flavour by slowly cooking the shank bone in the sauce. If you'd like to substitute the wine, use extra chicken stock, a tablespoon of brown sugar, and a dash of red wine vinegar instead.



QUEENSPORT AQUARIUM: DREAMWORLD OF THE 1880s

While trying to explain the changes seen in marine organisms between different generations, Gerard Krefft, in the New South Wales Advertiser of 15 May 1875, commented that "there was no locality on the face of the globe as favourable as Port Jackson for aquatic studies. . .but we have no public aquarium".

Sir Henry Parkes opened The Royal Aquarium at Fletcher's Cove, Bondi, on Wednesday, 28 September 1887. The design of the park, costing £30,000, was based on the Royal Aquarium in Brighton, England, which opened in 1872.

Mr Charles Anderson, the originator, and manager of the Royal Bondi Aquarium company, travelled to Brisbane in March 1889 to search for a suitable location for an aquarium in Queensland. Sandgate was considered. However, eleven acres of land were purchased in Hemmant Reserve, on the bank of the river. A partnership was set up between John Dunmore Campbell, Robert Philip, John Luckmann, Henry Hardwicke and Charles Anderson from Sydney and construction of the Queensport Aquarium began.

In the local press, the description of the building, the grounds and the amusements read very much like the former original press reports for the Bondi Aquarium in Sydney: a large skate rink, a double-storied pavilion, a switchback railway, aquarium tanks, and grottos. There would be first-class lawn tennis, cricket, and other grounds. Amusements, such as concerts and other select forms of entertainment would be provided in the evenings on the pavilion's upper floor. The lower floor would house six aquarium tanks around the walls. Surrounding the pavilion, amusements would abound. There would be merry-go-rounds, a switchback railway, a seal tank and picnic areas set amongst landscaped gardens with flowers. Wild animals would live there, too, tigers, seals and baboons.

In 1888, Mr Charles Higgins, a "large powerful man", owned a menagerie at Toombul where he bred tigers. He moved his menagerie into Brisbane Town and set up at the corner of George and Turbot Streets. He would be seen walking down Queen Street carrying a couple of tiger cubs. One day there was a commotion when a large tiger "Jimmy" escaped from his cage and mauled the attendant. Local residents were not happy and demanded the menagerie be sold. Monty Browne, a theatrical agent, purchased the animals for the Bondi Aquarium. But after a few months, the animals were still in Queensland. Five tigers, a cheetah, a panther, five dingoes, several monkeys and several snakes were then relocated to Queensport Aquarium.

Roads were rough, and bridges were few, so the main access to this new amusement park was by boat. The Company purchased three steamers, the SS Alice, the SS Natone and the SS Woolwich, to transport the crowds from Campbell's Wharf in the city. The new single railway track to Cleveland was completed by 1889, with Hemmant station fairly close by.

Public opening day was on Saturday, 7 August 1889. Massive crowds surged onto the steamer SS Natone in Brisbane Town. In fact,

two persons fell off the wharf into the Brisbane River in the chaos.

Another catastrophe occurred in April 1891. An elderly man, Stephen Popham, was riding on the switchback railway. He overbalanced and fell off as the carriage was ascending an incline. He died half an hour later.

But the Queensport Aquarium was a great success, a new phenomenon never experienced in Brisbane. The crowds continued to visit in their thousands. There were twilight river cruises. The Aquarium had an electricity supply by the end of 1889, so when lit up in the evenings, the amusement park presented a spectacular sight.

A great flood came in 1891, and the Aquarium was flooded, fences were swept away, animals escaped, and the landscaped gardens were devastated. Water from the Brisbane River backed up in Aquarium Passage, and many residents of Hemmant moved to higher ground.

In 1892, high winds blew the switchback railway into the river during a tremendous storm.

The 1890s were depression years, and Queensport Aquarium could

not rise to its former glory. Another flood impacted the site in 1893. The central two-storey pavilion did survive but not much else. The pavilion hall was used for dances, meetings and concerts until 1901. But the original company became insolvent.

This site, along with others, was considered for a new plague hospital in 1900 but then rejected as being considered too close to the meat works.

In March 1901, this notice appeared in the press, advising an auction sale:

"A large building, The Aquarium Pavilion, . . . built of Oregon pine and hardwood, roofed with best galvanized iron. Cost £2,000 to build. By order of the Mortgagees."

Today, there is a light industrial building on the former site of the Queensport Aquarium in Aquarium Avenue, Hemmant.

The Royal Aquarium at Bondi burnt down in 1891 but was rebuilt in the same year. The site became 'Wonderland City' in 1906.
