

SEAGULLS DEVASTATED BY LOSS OF CLUB LEGEND PAUL GREEN



BMD Wynnum Manly Seagulls have been left devastated by the sudden death of club legend Paul Green.

The 49-year-old dual premiership coach passed away at his Wynnum home in August.

The news has left everyone connected with the Seagulls in a deep state of shock.

"The Wynnum Manly Seagulls are deeply saddened by the sudden passing of club legend

Paul Green," Seagulls Chairman and Acting CEO Tom Solah said.

"As a former player and dual premiership coach he will always hold a special place in the hearts of the Seagulls club, its players and supporters.

"Paul and his family have been stalwarts of rugby league on the bayside for decades and his love and commitment to the club has never wavered. As recently as two weeks ago he assisted with



the process to appoint the Seagulls new coach, Matthew Head, for 2023.

"Our thoughts are with his family, and particularly wife Amanda and children Emerson and Jed, at this incredibly sad and difficult time."

Green is the only coach in Seagulls history to win back-to-back premierships after securing the 2011 and 2012 titles, a feat which helped propel him into the NRL coaching ranks. The former NRL and Queensland Maroons playmaker went on to claim a premiership as an assistant with the Sydney Roosters in 2013 before a long and successful stint in North Queensland where he helped deliver the Cowboys their maiden title in 2015.

Today the club offers a range of learn-to-sail courses designed for juniors and adults, as well as Sunday afternoon racing for off-thebeach sailing dinghies and skiffs.



TRAFFIC PROJECTS UPDATE

Earlier this year I reported that nearly three quarters of a million dollars had been allocated to traffic projects in the 2022-23 Brisbane City Council Budget. I have received more information about these projects.

New Lindum Road, Wynnum West

I'm pleased to announce that works to ease congestion at the corner of New Lindum Road and Wynnum Road in Wynnum West will commence in early September. Vehicles queue at this intersection, especially in the afternoon peak.

The works will involve widening the road, reconstructing the bus stop on the southern end of the road, and new asphalt and line markings.

The project will take approximately six weeks to complete and is part of Council's Congestion Busting Projects, which aims to reduce travel times, enhance safety, and improve the overall road user experience.

Kamarin Street, Manly West

Local Area Traffic Management (LATM) will be carried out throughout Kamarin Street Precinct. LATM, which is also known as traffic calming, includes installing devices to decrease traffic in suburban streets and moderate vehicle speed to create a safe environment for residents. LATM schemes are normally carried out over an entire area rather than just a single street to ensure that traffic issues are not transferred to other local streets.

\$284,000 has been allocated to this project. I will roll out further information as I receive it.

Residents living in the area have been consulted.

Tingal Road, Wynnum

A further \$81,000 was allocated to Suburban Corridor Modernisation on Tingal Road. This project aims to increase safety for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians who use this busy main road, and includes installation of devices like signage, line-markings, traffic islands, pedestrian refuge islands and bike lanes.

GRANTS FORUM WRAP UP

Thank you to everyone who attended the Bayside Grants Forum last month. We had a record turn-out, with 63 people attending. Thank you also to the presenters from Queensland Community Fund, Sport and Rec, Port of Brisbane, Wynnum Manly Leagues Club, Ampol and Brisbane City Council who came along to share information with the crowd.

"Our event is about celebrating community and friendships with a purpose. Our ever-growing team of volunteers are committed to our simple shared vision, which makes the event and its surrounding program such a success," said Tracey.





TICKS ARE A THREAT ALL YEAR ROUND – BUT WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Ticks can be found year round in Southeast Queensland with most cases seen from winter until late spring. Cats and dogs will be exposed to paralysis ticks when they travel through areas frequented by bandicoots and possums. These small marsupials tend to be fairly resistant to the effects of the tick toxin and are commonly found in backyards and local scrub areas. Ticks will fall from native animals into the grass and then attach to dogs and cats when they brush past.

What do ticks look like?

Ticks can appear like small skin lumps or skin tags – it is not unusual for people to try to remove a skin tag under the mistaken belief that there is a tick attached to their pet!

Ticks are eight-legged arthropods. One of the distinctive features of paralysis ticks is the colour of their legs – the front and back pairs tend to be dark brown while the middle two pairs are a lighter tan/beige colour.

The body of ticks vary from white-ish to grey/brown depending on whether they have fed on the host's blood.

Another defining feature of a paralysis tick is that the attachment site becomes red and raised creating what is referred to as a crater. It is often this lump in the skin which leads to the discovery of a tick's location.

What are the symptoms of tick paralysis?

Early symptoms of tick paralysis include lethargy, a reduced appetite and occasional vomiting. As tick paralysis progresses more severe signs can be seen. These may include:

- Change in bark/meow
- Loss of blink reflex if the tick is attached near an eye
- Difficulty breathing or rapid breathing
- Change in heart rate and rhythm
- Excessive drooling
- Wobbly gait
- Reluctance to move
- Complete paralysis

If you notice any of the above symptoms it is important to have your pet checked by a vet as soon as possible.

Tick prevention

There are a number of different preventatives available. These include top spots, oral chews and tick collars. Have a chat with your vet to discuss the best option to keep your pet safe from these dangerous parasites.

BRISBANE COAST GUARD SKIPPER RECOVERS 40FT YACHT

Brisbane Coast Guard skipper Paul Burchell completed an impressive recovery of a 40ft yacht in Manly recently.

The yacht's engine overheated and she lost steering when coming into the Manly leads on the way home. Her skipper requested Coast Guard's help getting into his narrow berth in Wynnum Manly Yacht Club. He also requested we put his yacht into the berth stern first.

Paul Burchell took a crew aboard Coast Guard's 8m rescue vessel CG-22 and went out to assist. He towed the yacht into the Manly Boat Harbour swing basin. Then, while switching from a short tow to a rafting-up position, he turned CG-22 through 180 degrees and tied up to the yacht's bow — so he could push the yacht backwards and slot her into her berth stern first.

After 15 years serving with Coast Guard, and conducting over 450 rescues, this writer has never seen another Coast Guard skipper perform this manoeuvre so neatly.

Despite a very narrow manoeuvring space at Wynnum Manly Yacht Club, and a pesky gusting wind, Paul put the yacht into its berth without a fault. His crew were very impressed.

TO BE GRATEFUL OR UNGRATEFUL?

In today's fast-paced world, there are many things that we have to get our heads around in order to show up and take care of ourselves. The impacts on one's mental health can be felt and seen with multiple roles and hats that we wear. At times we can feel overwhelmed and exhausted by our lives. When we feel this way, what self-care strategies can we use to help us when in need?



Recently I was reading a book written by Louise Hay called The Gift of Gratitude. Gratitude is important as it can help people to refocus on what they have instead of what they lack. Trying to shift our thinking patterns on a regular basis can assist us in being more positive and appreciative.

Gratitude can be practised by:

Keeping a gratitude journal. Write down on a regular basis your thoughts about one or several things/ events/people you are grateful for.

Mindfulness. Incorporates being in the present moment, paying attention to your senses, and noticing what is happening with your senses (sight/touch/hearing/taste/smell). An example could include walking around the Manly Esplanade and noticing what is externally happening in the present moment.

Sharing your thoughts with others. Talking to people about your thoughts of being grateful. An example could include over dinner, each participant individually saying what happened that day that they are grateful for.

Prayer. People who are religious can use prayer to express their gratitude.



Focusing on trying to stay grateful with our thoughts can be difficult, but if we practice regularly, people will often see a benefit. This practice can help to build resilience when times get tough. Begin by asking yourself what is one thing you are grateful for today.

COMMUNITY CHALLENGED TO LIVE IN CARS FOR ONE NIGHT TO HELP BRISBANE'S HOMELESS WOMEN

Nina Schrinner, the Lady Mayoress of Brisbane, has launched the Live Like Her Challenge, an event where participants will live in their car to raise funds and awareness for women over 55 who are experiencing homelessness.

The challenge is being organised and run by The Forgotten Women, a Brisbane-based charity committed to providing homes to homeless women over 55 years of age.

The Forgotten Women Patron Nina Schrinner called on people to join The Forgotten Women's Live Like Her Challenge to support Australia's fastest growing homeless population.

"It's heart-breaking that, in greater Brisbane, more than 700 women over the age of 55 don't have a safe and secure place to sleep at night, and this figure is predicted to more than double by 2036," Mrs Schrinner said.

"Women are living in cars, couch surfing and physically hiding due to the terrifying threat of family and domestic violence. These could be our mothers, aunts, sisters and daughters and we have a duty to help them."

Mrs Schrinner pointed to Brisbane's rising inflation rate and increasing cost of living pressures as an additional source of hardship for vulnerable people in the community.

"It's the perfect storm of rising costs, lack of employment, limited superannuation and a lack of affordable housing options that's driving many women into severe hardship," she said.

"These are the women who fought for equal pay, superannuation and equal opportunity for future generations of women, but in their hour of need they feel forgotten, and that's exactly why I'm calling on our community to show their support by joining the challenge."

The Live Like Her Challenge will be held at a secure venue in Eagle Farm on September 8 where participants will live in their car for one night helping fund The Forgotten Women's mission to provide fit-for-purpose housing for Brisbane's hidden homeless.

The Forgotten Women Founder Teresa Reed said the charity currently provided housing for 89 women over the age of 55.

"The Live Like Her Challenge will help this vulnerable demographic be seen, heard, loved, and most importantly supported through ensuring that homelessness is but a chapter in these women's lives," Ms Reed said.

"Along with providing housing, the right support is key as these women may be tackling many issues including dementia, chronic disease, frailty, elders' rights, knowledge of legal avenues in cases of elder abuse, and more.

"We want these women to be able to live with dignity and age securely in place, as every person deserves."

Registrations for the Live Like Her Challenge are open to the entire community, however organisers are also calling on business owners and community leaders to step up and take part.

Construction commences on 191 Stratton

Construction on the \$50 million apartment project kicked off in early August, despite the headwinds in the construction industry.

What do you do when you are not sure about the future? Some people batten down the hatches, others play it conservatively, and some come out to play!

Within developer circles, now's the time to start buying again. Many of these seasoned buyers have put their acquisitions on hold over the last 12 to 18 months, with the market being too hot and profit margins squeezed. Now, as every second or third potential buyer is sitting in the bleachers waiting to see what will happen, the more confident buyers – developer and non-developer – are moving forward with the house or land they want. Previously they may have settled for a home that fell short of their ideal criteria – we saw a lot of this up until late last year into early this year.

Cashed-up buyers, and buyers with lower gearing requirements (particularly those with five to 10-year purchasing horizons), have not been fazed by the interest rate question. In fact, it's been a similar scenario to the Tesla driver of late: as the fuel prices rise, the effect has been negligible.

Will the great crash occur in our local property market? Perhaps we may be more likely to see a slow and steady market for the next five-plus years (and that's guesswork at best). Current sales for the last quarter still incorporate the healthy increase that we saw over the last 12-month period.

International immigration may soon increase and create more demand for property. We have the second runway at the airport ready to go. If the airport activity ramps up, that's when the bayside suburbs may see more Bulimba/Hawthorne buyers scoot over our way to quieter waters.

News flash: property prices have already dropped – Tom Panos

According to a recent article by real estate industry veteran and Australasia's number one real estate coach and trainer Tom Panos, "Property prices have already dropped. They may soften further but there are no signs there will be distress selling".

He goes on to explain the problem with data is that it lags by up to three to four months, meaning by the time the data is collected and analysed, the market has moved again. Or put another way, markets move faster than economists, and most real estate commentary comes from economists using lagged data.

Panos bases his views on the week-to-week information he collects directly from agents, as the agents are the first to see the change in buyer behaviour. Open homes with 50 to 100 buyer groups are a thing for the history books, being replaced with a high degree of nervousness from buyers placing conservative offers below the price guide. Take the median property price for Brisbane from June to July which reportedly dropped by only 0.1%. A comforting statistic maybe, however what it doesn't show is the massive increase in the Days On Market, with many properties still on the market at 60 or 90 days. Vendors are being challenged to accept less than they would have achieved in the previous market. Buyers are factoring in further interest rate rises, and the prospect that they may not be able to borrow as much as they could have three or six months ago when the rates were lower.

Vendors need to consider their own personal goals and aspirations and make decisions based on quality information. Experienced agents that have seen the highs and lows of real estate markets are there to assist you with making these big decisions. As agents we have an obligation to provide all information to our clients which in a downward market is sometimes uncomfortable and confronting, particularly when we are discussing someone's most valuable asset. The last thing you want your agent to do is have "Happy Ears" and avoid having the challenging discussions that need to be had for Vendors to make an informed decision. Some vendors will choose not to sell and hold on to their property, and others will adjust their expectations and make the decision to sell and thus satisfy the reason why they wanted to sell originally.

PORT of BRISBANE Here for the future

Port of Brisbane is Queensland's largest multi-cargo port, handling 95% of the state's containers and motor vehicles, and approximately 50% of its agricultural exports.

To see a mum being so protective of her calf is one of the best sights in the bay this time of year, and how lucky are we to see them just east of Green Island, Wellington Point and around Peel Island?

Looking at past records of whale sightings, the next four weeks are when you'll see them come in to rest before the long journey to the South Pole. If you get a chance during the school holidays, it's worth a look to see these magnificent mammals in the bay – just remember the rules about getting too close (and it's the same rules in the bay for dolphins) – so enjoy them, it's an experience you will never forget.

I suppose we better mention the fishing – it's now spring, probably the best weather of the year for fishing in this part of the world. The school mackerel will be throughout the bay from close in at the Manly Harbour last leads, to King Island to Green, and all the way to Ormiston and east to the Naval Banks. Paravaning with 3-inch Halco spoons is the best way to go, and if you need advice on how to rig, Water Tower Bait & Tackle have all my drawings of how to set up. If you prefer, floating a pilly on ganged hooks will also get you a fish, and there are plenty around in September!

The whiting are normally in excellent quantities this time of year in the Rous Channel and Small Boat Passage; drifting with a paternoster rig with blood worms, sand worms, or squid strips should get you a feed.

Snapper season reopened in mid-August, so a fish on any of the artificial reefs or Bay Island drop-offs is worth a try as the sweet lip should also start showing up. Bait-wise, use flesh baits, or my favourite – whiting heads.



Enjoy the bay this September, soak up the warmer weather and get fishing!


Redlands Hockey offers our members numerous opportunities to play at the representative level across junior, senior and masters

FAREWELL TO AN HISTORIC MANLY ICON

Many readers would be familiar with St. Paul's Anglican Church at 99 Ernest Street, Manly. Some may have been baptised there, attended Sunday School there, been confirmed there, married there, and attended numerous funeral services of relatives and friends over the years.

Many folks will be saddened to know that St. Paul's days in Ernest Street are numbered – in 2023, it is scheduled to relocate, with the property being bought by the Education Department in June 2022, to enable the adjacent primary school to expand its premises.

The church has a long history spanning 132 years, from 1890 to 2022. In November 2014, the church celebrated its centenary.

Services were initially held from 1890 to 1899 at the Board Hall in Glenora Street, Wynnum, until the five lots of land in Ernest Street were purchased from a parishioner, Harrie Lineker, on 9th March 1912. The timber church (later the hall) was built in three months and was originally painted dark green.

Until its demolition, it was pale grey. Until 1964 it was the church, but with the advent of the present church in 1964, it developed into a social hub where concerts, parties, quiz and trivia nights were held. In addition to this, it served as a venue for a multitude of classes, clubs, dance and sporting groups to use. It continued to do this until the end.

The property is large, comprising the 1914 hall, the 1964 church and the Rectory, a modern two-storey brick residence constructed in 1978. The Rectory will also be demolished, but the church building will be retained to be used by Manly State School as a music centre.

The property had eight large gardens, one being the Memorial Garden, which opened in July 2006. There was 23 folk represented here, 11 of whose ashes were either interred or scattered over the bromeliads, coleuses, durantas, ferns, geraniums, lilies and roses which flourished here. The Memorial Garden will be relocated to the Edwin Marsden Tooth Memorial Home at 162 Oceana Terrace, Manly. This is known to most local folk as Lota House.



These are the physical details, but the most important feature of St. Paul's was its outreach to the local community. This began in 1914 when the hall was built and continues to the present day. Father Frederick Wilson, the Rector from 1952 to 1980, always considered outreach into the wider community a very important part of the church's mission. Five outreaches during the early days were Anglicare, the Bible Society Walkathon, Superwalk, 40 Hour Famine and jumble sales, initiated by Valerie Cook. For various reasons, these have lapsed over the years. However, there were eight outreaches still in operation until the end.

One of St. Paul's most important outreaches to the local community was SAILS, the acronym for Sailing Adventures in Life Skills. Its aim was to attend to the spiritual and social needs of young folk in the Wynnum-Manly community. Regular sailing days were organised, and the fleet of six vessels was housed in the area behind the Rectory. Canon Keith Colbert initiated this outreach in November 2006. Three other churches were involved: St.Peter's in Wynnum, St. George's in Birkdale and St. Paul's in Cleveland.

Another important outreach to the community involved the Mission to Seafarers Centre, housed on Port Drive at Fisherman Islands since 1965. The centre offers fellowship, hospitality and a welcoming Christian atmosphere to seafarers from all over the world. Since 1998 the centre has distributed free beanies to the seafarers, many of whom work in icy climates. Over 1,600 of these beanies have come from St. Paul's.

Of great assistance in these present times of hardship was the parish pantry. This offered food and drink to the needy folk of the area. It was very well patronised. A similar outreach was the assistance given to the needy by Rosies, which operated from one of the front rooms in the hall. This free service was also well patronised and greatly appreciated.

In addition to these four, St.Paul's ran garage sales. These sales were organised by parishioner Valerie Cook and were an excellent way of making contact with local folk, who loved the chance of browsing and collecting a bargain.

There were also six other outreaches into the wider community and overseas: Mothers Union, Nils, BCA, BMF, ABM, and Operation Christmas Child.

Yes, St. Paul's has had a great connection with the community for 132 years. Its departure will be a great loss to Manly, historically, socially and spiritually.

The deconsecration service was held at 2pm on Sunday, 12th June 2022. It was conducted by Bishop Jeremy Greaves, assisted by Rector Cameron Freese, who was once a parishioner at St. Paul's.

It's a shame that this era has come to an end. In 2013 a very detailed history book of St. Paul's was produced by parishioner Sandra Davis with the assistance of 45 interested people. It is called *Here At The Edge of The Sea* and presents a very clear picture of life at St. Paul's in Ernest Street over 132 years.

REDLAND MUSEUM TEAMS UP WITH BAYSIDE DISTRICT Amateur Radio Society (Bdars)

Redland Museum is extending its community reach in a new relationship with BDARS. In October 2021, following a suggestion by Redland City Councillor Paul Bishop, an approach was made by BDARS to Redland Museum, to consider the possibility of moving their operations into the museum. Cr. Bishop saw the synergies between the two groups.

BDARS have operated for some years on a temporary basis within the State Emergency Service (SES) Cleveland premises, and they have been seeking a more established home.

BDARS is centred in the bayside area of Brisbane, with a current membership of around 75 that comprises amateur radio operators and electronics experimenters. The Society was formed in 1989, with membership open to all – both licensed amateur operators and those interested in electronics generally.

Amateur radio is a popular technical hobby. BDARS use designated radio frequencies for non-commercial exchange of messages and wireless experimentation. Self-training amateur radio is the only hobby governed by international treaty. In Australia, it is regulated by the ACMA (Australian Communications and Media Authority).

BDARS conducts classes and mentoring programs for new members to gain their radio license and/or to upgrade their current license. An in-house examiner conducts necessary Amateur Radio Examinations. BDARS owns a significant remote amateur radio facility on a leased private property on the crest of Mount Cotton.

The Society will conduct a general meeting on the first Monday evening monthly and a training lecture session on the third Monday evening monthly within the museum event room. A "hands-on" training facility will be constructed by BDARS on the verandah (built-in) at the back of the museum workshop. These meetings commenced in July.

BDARS will be able to assist with maintaining/developing the museum radio collection, and will construct/operate a historic "Radio Demonstration Display" (perhaps with restored WWII gear) within the museum. This will become a significant attraction within the museum for our visitors with demonstrations on our open days, etc. BDARS participating with demonstrations at our "Switched Onto Science" Day on 08 August, Redlands City Ekka public holiday.

Following extensive discussion and work, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was formulated to provide the basis for BDARS

to become established within the museum. This document was approved by the members of both bodies thus enabling a Licence to Occupy agreement to be signed off by 30 June 2022.

Detailed planning is now proceeding for the design of the new facilities and BDARS are preparing a submission for a funding grant via the Queensland Community Benefit Fund.

Both Redland Museum and BDARS are excited at the prospect of this partnership developing, and the enhanced opportunities for facilities and the exciting new attraction for our visitors.

MORETON BAY COLLEGE UNVEILS PRE-PREP REDEVELOPMENT

The commencement of The Moreton Bay Colleges' Pre-Prep Precinct redevelopment was marked on Friday 8th July with a Turning of the Soil Ceremony held on site.

Pre-Prep is available to girls and boys turning four before 30 June and is a stepping stone to Prep at Moreton Bay Boys' College, or Moreton Bay College.

RESEARCH INTO NEW CANCER TREATMENTS TO GIVE CHILDREN HOPE

Local charity Richie's Rainbow is not taking "no" for an answer!

Dr Wayne Nicholls, one of Queensland's top paediatric oncologists says the beautiful children he was unable to save have motivated him to rally for more research and treatment options for childhood cancer, in partnership with Richie's Rainbow Foundation.

Director of the Oncology Services Group at the Queensland Children's Hospital Dr Wayne Nicholls said he had "lots of nice ghosts" in the little Queenslanders he couldn't cure.

It's because of them that he is advocating for more to be done for children with high-risk diseases, looking at new novel methods of treatment based on the biological and genetic aspects of tumours and the patients.

"I can tell stories all day long of kids who had terrible cancers but despite that were amazing people and they're really special to me," Dr Nicholls said.

"I'd like to have them with us rather than not with us.

"So my whole drive is to make a world where we can keep those kids, where we can cure those kids."

One of those patients is bayside resident Richie Walsh who died at age 9 in September last year from Rhabdomyosarcoma, a rare type of sarcoma.

Dr Nicholls will join Richie's parents Lisa and Karl Walsh to discuss shortfalls in treatment options with Queensland Health.

Dr Nicholls said while significant advances had been made in treating Leukaemia, the most common type of childhood cancer, little progress had been made with the cure rates of rarer cancers such as sarcoma and high-grade brain tumours outside of Medulloblastoma.

He is hopeful that big advances can be made with treatments, including targeted therapies, for more rare childhood cancers.

But it will take lots of resources and support from governments.

Dr Nicholls said research into cancers with big numbers- such as breast cancer, prostate cancer and melanoma- attracted resources from many pharmaceutical companies because breakthroughs in those areas meant greater profits.

"But children's cancer, because it's rare, most drug companies don't have much interest in treating those cancers because they're never going to make much money from it," Dr Nicholls said.

"And so there's a sort of systemic disadvantage for children with cancer in terms of novel therapies."

Research endeavours including immunotherapy are underway in Queensland with announcements in the field expected later this year.

Richie's parents hope adequate funding for research will eventually prevent other families from enduring the heartache they did in losing their funny and strong "little dude".

"We've just gone through 18 months of pure torture, our boy went through horrendous and toxic chemo and radiation and we lost him anyway," Ms Walsh said.

"We need kinder and effective treatments that will cure kids and give them a better outcome.

"Because even the children who survive, they end up with lifelong health problems including digestive issues, growth, infertility."

Ms Walsh said her family was channelling the grief into making changes.

They've created the Richie's Rainbow Foundation to provide educational resources and support to families and health professionals who are faced with a cancer diagnosis.

They are also on a mission to raise awareness of childhood cancer and raise much-needed funds for research into childhood sarcomas.

Representatives from Queensland Health and the Queensland Children's Hospital have met with the Walsh family.

"We are always willing to meet with patients, families, and any other healthcare system stakeholder to discuss ways we can improve the health and wellbeing of Queenslanders," a Queensland Health spokesman said.

WALNUT TACO RECIPE

A taco without meat that tastes fantastic? It does exist. This makes a sensationally fresh snack or light meal, and substituting meat for walnuts and adding a rainbow of veggies means these tacos are packed with healthy fats and nutrients.

WALNUT TACO FILLING

- 2 cups of natural walnuts
- 1 tsp of cumin
- 1 tsp of finely chopped coriander

OPTIONAL: TO SERVE

- Sliced avocado
- · Thinly sliced chilli
- Tinned black beans

YOGHURT DRIZZLE SAUCE

- 1/2 cup of natural Greek yoghurt
- Juice of half a lime

WRAP 'EM UP OR SERVE AS A TACO BOWL

Lettuce leaves, taco shells or pita bread all work well as a vessel for the ingredients. You can also use a bowl to serve this salad-style.

• 1/2 tsp garlic powder

2 tbsp of olive oil

· Pinch of salt

1 tsp paprika powder

• Tinned or fresh corn kernels

Diced tomato and capsicum

METHOD

- 1. Make the walnut mince by combining all ingredients in a food processor and pulse until you have a mince-like consistency. Don't pulse for too long you want the walnut mix to have a chunky texture, but be moist. If it's not moist enough, add a teaspoon of water or more olive oil. Set aside.
- 2. Combine all ingredients for the yoghurt drizzle in a bowl and whisk to combine.
- 3. Prepare any additional ingredients you're adding to your tacos like tomato, beans, cheese etc. in separate bowls.
- 4. Assemble your tacos by layering the walnut mixture and your salad/additional toppings in a lettuce cup, taco shell or pita bread.
- 5. Drizzle with yoghurt sauce to serve.

HAVE YOU BUMPED YOUR CHECK-UP DOWN THE TO-DO LIST?
