LOCAL COAST GUARD VOLUNTEERS PREPARE FOR CHRISTMAS

Manly's Coast Guard volunteers will be on duty throughout this Christmas holiday season.

Local commander Craig Bowen of Wynnum says the summer season is always the busiest for recreational boating, but it's also the storm season. Calls for Coast Guard help always increase as Christmas approaches.

He also recommends boat owners join Coast Guard's Marine Assist breakdown service. This provides assistance year-round for any vessel needing help at sea.

Coast Guard skipper John Lucchi and his colleagues have signed up new members to Marine Assist every weekend recently. "It's a smart move," says John, "because every boat breaks down sooner or later, and a commercial tow costs hundreds of dollars. But it's free if you're a member of Marine Assist. Call into our Manly base any weekend for joining details and a free tide chart."

Meanwhile, veteran Coast Guard duty officer Paul Burchell has just passed the Australian Maritime Safety Authority's mandated practical assessment and been issued with his Coxswain Grade 1, a nationally recognised Open Coxswain Certificate of Competency.

This means Paul can lawfully operate any vessel in Australia that is under 12 metres, with her owner's permission.

Paul has been a member of QF2 since 1998, and already holds the National Emergency Medal and the Queensland Flood & Cyclone

Citation for rescue work, plus the National Medal and many Coast Guard awards.

\$4 MILLION TO REBUILD CARMICHAEL PARK



WHY IS MY DOG COUGHING?

Dogs can develop a cough from many different causes. While a cough can sometimes be the result of mild airway irritation, other times, it can be the sign of a serious disease process. Below are some of the more common causes of coughs in dogs.

KENNEL COUGH

Kennel cough, or "infectious tracheobronchitis", is a common cause of coughing which may affect dogs of any age. A number of different viruses and bacteria may be implicated in this condition, some of which dogs are routinely vaccinated against. Kennel cough is very contagious and can spread readily through the air when dogs are in close contact. Affected dogs may appear to have something stuck in their throat as the inflammation of the trachea will cause a hacking cough and may result in a white, frothy fluid being expelled.

TRACHEAL COLLAPSE

Tracheal collapse occurs as a result of weakening cartilage rings in the trachea. This results in a harsh, honking cough more commonly seen in elderly smallbreed dogs, although it may also be a congenital condition. Severe cases require surgical intervention and stent placement to prevent the trachea from collapsing on itself.

ALLERGIC AIRWAY DISEASE

Dogs may develop a cough in response to environmental allergens, including pollen and moulds. Bronchitis (inflammation of the small airways) results in coughing, gagging, wheezing and a reduction in exercise tolerance. Anti-inflammatory medications such as steroids or antihistamines may be required to reduce the severity of the cough.

HEART DISEASE

Dogs with heart murmurs and congestive heart failure may develop a cough as a result of fluid congestion in the chest or an enlarged heart pushing on the larger airways. A "cardiac cough" is often quieter in volume than a respiratory cough. Medical attention is necessary for any dog with a known underlying heart condition that develops a cough.

OTHER CAUSES OF COUGHS

- Parasitic diseases, including heartworm disease, tick paralysis or lungworm infection
- Pneumonia this may be viral, bacterial or fungal in cause
- Lung cancer

These people come from all walks of life, have diverse skill sets, and, most of all, are invested in the future of the bayside and its people. They do not receive any payment or financial incentives for being on the committee.





On the ground floor, double-height glass windows reveal stainless steel fermentation tanks and a 10hl brewhouse where the beer is brewed. Climbing the stairs to the first floor, visitors can appreciate several art installations, including a 3.6-metre-high wall mural by the Queensland artist Jarad Danby.

Although the 90-seat taproom is on level one, the sense of being part of a working brewery isn't lost, as guests can look down into the brewhouse from an internal void.

The top floor panoramic roof deck seats another 90 - 100 with views of the Brisbane CBD skyline, the Glasshouse Mountains and the beautiful Redlands Coast by day, and an uninterrupted view of Straddie's iconic sunsets. Also on the top floor is an exclusive

'Brewery Caretakers Unit' with views of Moreton Bay and Russell Island, which can be booked by the night on Airbnb.

Open five days a week – Thursday through to Monday – the brewery boasts two bars with 12 taps in each, pouring six core-range Straddie beers, plus a couple of craft beer guest taps. Point Lookout Lager, Amity Pale Ale, Myora Springs Gose, Manta Dark Lager, Jumpinpin IPA, and Mid Track Session Ale with taproom-only 'Sandpit Series' beers are constantly rotating. The brewery is now pouring Sandpit Series #1 – Rock Stout and Sandpit Series #2 – Super Pale. A handpicked artisanal spirits, non-alcoholic spirits, and wine list, including Redlands Coast Distillery, Milton Rum, Lyres, and Sirromet ensures something for everyone to settle into island time.

A tapas-style selection of small and large plates makes up most of the sharing-style menu, with Neapolitan style hand-stretched pizzas and Straddie's iconic seafood completing the culinary experience.

TIS THE SEASON TO BE JOLLY, BUT NOT TOO SILLY!

'Tis the season to be jolly – yes, but hopefully not too silly! The Christmas season is a time when a lot of people's good habits slide, or when we become more aware of our not-so-good habits.

Here are five tips to help keep you healthy over the season:

 Be realistic about what you can achieve – at this time of year, it's not the best to start a weight loss program, so make your goal weight maintenance instead. It's also a time of extra stress, both financial and emotional – don't be hard on yourself if you can't do everything you'd like or are supposed to like. Instead, intentionally set aside time for yourself to de-stress and choose a few festivities you really want to get involved in.



- 2. Limit the "all-you-can-eat" mentality indulging in special foods a couple of times, like Christmas Day or New Year's eve, is not going to make any difference to your health, or "ruin your diet". But a whole month's worth of festivities can seriously set you back. Make sure you're having a healthy breakfast, and get your vegetable and fruit intake earlier in the day, so you're not "starving" by dinner.
- 3. Keep hydrated and not with alcohol! Water intake is especially important when the days are getting hotter and when there's an abundance of rich foods (read salty, fatty or sweet). Alcohol dehydrates you, and is full of empty calories. Do yourself a favour and alternate alcoholic drinks with water, or by diluting wine or spirits with iced mineral water.
- 4. Stick to that exercise program this is all the more important in maintaining fitness and circadian rhythm when you're eating differently to usual or staying up late. Never underestimate the benefits of exercise you have to use some energy in order to make some energy!



5. Wear masks when advised to do so – it's a reality we've lived with for the past couple years, but Covid is not going away. Those most at risk for severe illness are the elderly and immune-suppressed, so if you have family gatherings with people at higher risk, consider providing face masks for your guests, and avoid shared food platters. Yes, it's an inconvenience, but it's simply common sense and common courtesy.

Above all, be kind to yourself, and kindness to others will naturally flow.



Virtually nowhere to go as Queensland's vacancy rates plateau

It comes as no surprise that Queensland's tight residential vacancy rates have not shown any substantial signs of easing over the September quarter 2022, according to the Real Estate Institute of Queensland's (REIQ) latest report released today.

At the Queensland Housing Summit held last month, which highlighted the serious housing supply shortage plaguing the state, stakeholders conceded that there was no silver bullet that would solve the housing crisis overnight.

Vacancy rates are an indication of the percentage of properties that come onto the market to rent, and according to the REIQ, a healthy vacancy rate sits between 2.6 - 3.5 per cent.

In many parts of the state, the September quarter 2022 figures represent the ninth consecutive quarter of sub 1.0 percent vacancy rates, as tight conditions firmly set in.

The September quarter also showed a number of areas had plateauing vacancy rates compared to the previous quarter, and for the areas that did experience a shift, most only saw a minimal 0.1 percent movement up or down.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said it was unlikely vacancy rates would see any significant shifts in the foreseeable future due to complex supply and demand constraints. "These statistics aren't just numbers, they tell a story about how challenging it is for people struggling to find a home," Ms Mercorella said.

"While I wish I could tell these people that we can see light at the end of the tunnel for them, the sad reality is that renters could be enduring this tight market for some time.

"In Queensland, the average household size has reduced to only 2.5 persons per dwelling, which has put extra strain on our housing supply – and that's even before looking at the extraordinary external pressures from high levels of migration, and immigration to come.

"We know there are various obstacles which have been holding back our state's housing supply and pathways to home ownership. This is what needs to be rectified in order to restore some balance to the market and address the true cause of the crisis – while also finding remedies for the symptoms."

Ms Mercorella said that the State Government had identified that Queensland has 55,000 fewer rental dwellings than expected based on historical trends and forward projections.

"Some of this sizeable rental market shortfall was accounted for, but the remaining 'missing' properties were not able to be explained," she said. "We have been warning for some time now that regulatory intervention, including more onerous lending changes and tougher tenancy laws, has an impact on investment.

"Increasingly, we are also seeing investors charged at higher rates for property related fees and expenses, including stamp duty costs, higher local government fees, and mortgage repayments.

"In the face of these challenges, we are seeing some investors making the choice to exit the market and more needs to be done to retain and attract investors to the long-term rental market to pump up the rental pool and boost vacancy rates."

Out of the 50 local government areas and sub regions the REIQ reports on, 19 markets plateaued this quarter (maintaining the same vacancy rate as the previous quarter).

These included Brisbane LGA (0.8%), middle-ring Brisbane (0.7%), outer-ring Brisbane (0.6%), Ipswich (0.6%), Sunshine Coast Statistical Division (0.8%), Sunshine Coast (0.6%), Fraser Coast (0.5%), Hervey Bay (0.6%), Maryborough (0.2%), Cairns (0.5%), Gladstone (1.0%), Rockhampton (0.4%), Townsville (0.5%), Banana (0.5%), Cassowary Coast (0.8%), Goondiwindi (0.1%), Livingstone (0.4%), Southern Downs (0.1%) and Tablelands (0.2%).



Fourteen markets experienced an immaterial lift up by 0.1% over the quarter, including Greater Brisbane (0.7%), Logan (0.7%), Moreton Bay (0.5%), Caboolture (0.5%), Mainland (0.5%), Gold Coast (0.6%), Bundaberg (0.5%), Mackay (0.6%), Toowoomba (0.4%), Charter Towers (0.5%), Gympie (0.4%), Isaac (1.1%), Mareeba (0.4%), and Scenic Rim (0.6%).

While nine markets fluctuated down slightly by 0.1% over the quarter, including Redcliffe (0.4%), Maroochy Coast (0.4%), Hinterland (0.4%), Noosa (1.0%), Burdekin (0.4%), Central Highlands (0.5%), Cook (0.3%), Lockyer Valley (0.4%), and Maranoa (0.5%).

Inner city Brisbane saw a more noticeable change over the quarter, dropping to a record low of 0.8 percent – the first time this market has dropped below 1.0 percent in the past decade. This could suggest a return of workers to the CBD and a renewed demand for inner-city living post COVID-19.

A LITTLE HISTORY: WYNNUM'S ZELDA ARCADE

Zelda Arcade is on the same side of Bay Terrace as the old post office but a little further north, close to Cedar & Pine Bar.


The arcade was the second to be built in Wynnum. The first arcade was built in 1957 for Mr Woodforth, over the site of his garage, and he had a petrol pump on the edge of the footpath. The location was Woodforth Arcade, almost directly opposite Zelda Arcade, across Bay Terrace.

Zelda Arcade was built on the former premises of Real Estate Agent LP Crawford and the shop of Miss Grace Emma Waldren. At least six first-class shops were planned for this new brick building erected for Miss Pearly Fabian.

In the Herald dated 21 March 1958, Henry Roebuck announced that his store was to "Open soon in the new Zelda Arcade", selling "modern household furniture".

On Monday, 29 September 1958, LP Crawford and Co. Real Estate Agents moved back to its original location, into a new shop, in the recently completed Zelda Arcade.

Shanahan's, The Trouser Specialists, opened a menswear shop in October 1958, which diversified to include a book bar with books such as *Bridge Over the River Kwai* and *Elephant Walk*.



In June 1959, a Herald advertisement suggested a visit to George Wilcox, in Shanahan's in Zelda Arcade, for a new suit.

In 1960, Mrs FE Fuller opened an up-to-date salon for the "Mother-to-be and Baby". There was now a Singer Sewing Machine Company shop at number 3 Zelda Arcade and Waldron's Casket Agency at number 1, right next to the arcade's entrance, opening out to Bay Terrace.

The arcade was refurbished in 2021, and its name was mounted above the arcade entrance.



WHAT'S SWIMMING IN MORETON BAY FOR CHRISTMAS?

Where has the year gone! The end of 2022 is here, so let's hope the fishing is just as good in 2023.

When the winds allow us to go fishing, the bay has plenty of fish. Whether you're a fishing fanatic or a weekend/family/kids fisherman, Moreton Bay has plenty to offer. Here's a quick rundown of the species in the bay this time of year.

Whiting. It's the easiest and the best fish for the kids and the family to catch and probably the best tasting for most. You should find whiting in good numbers around the southern side of the Chain Banks, Amity Banks, the Maroon Bank side of the Rous Channel, and of course, the Sand Hills at Moreton Island and the blue hole.

In the north/easterlies, most will float around Horseshoe Bay at Peel Island – the shallows have plenty of whiting but also lots of traffic. The best bait is sand worms or blood worms and peeled small prawns and squid strips on a paternoster rig while drifting.

Squire/Snapper. December squire and snapper will be closest to Wynnum/Manly on the eastern side of

Green, Mud and St Helena Islands, and Wellington Point all around Peel Island. In particular, try Lazaret Gutter and Harry's artificial reef, Mt Cotton Reach, and in the Rous further north, Cowan Reef.

I prefer the shallow reefs close to our Bay Islands with smaller currents, and fishing in 18 to 21-ft depth makes it fun, running a rig with enough weight to get to the bottom on a 3.0 to 6.0 snapper hook. The best baits for me are small whole whiting and garfish. Whiting heads are my favourite, but squid, cuttlefish, octopus, mullet flesh and grinner fillets will catch a fish or two. I prefer a good run in the tide (especially outgoing), and you'll also find sweetlip, bream and flathead while fishing for squire.

School Mackerel. The best way to catch school mackerel is with diving boards – Yamashita, Delta or Yozuri (copies orange boards) with 3-inch spoons, trolling at 5 to 7 knots around the bay near Hope Banks, the basin at Peel Island, the Rous Channel, Rainbow Channel and deeper water at the Sand Hills and Shark Spit. At the shipping

channel and the Measured Mile Beacon, you can also float a pilly out around any of the bay markers, and when you are whiting fishing, there's always a mackerel swimming around.

Spotty Mackerel should start showing up in the next few weeks, and you can catch them trolling, but a chrome slug thrown and retrieved in a feeding school is the way to catch them.

Sand Crabs will also be in excellent numbers throughout the bay, and a pot or two should make everyone happy!

Last but not least, one of the best-tasting critters in the bay is the **Tiger Squid**, which are starting to show up in all the weed banks in the bay on the western side of Moreton Island, the Rous Channel, Small Boat Channel, Amity Banks, Rainbow Channel and Green Island. You need nice clear water and a couple of good quality squid jigs. A cast and slow retrieve should get you a squid and a face full of ink (which happens to us all).

Have fun and be careful; watch the weather and all the extra boat traffic. There are a couple of

nasties in the bay you should be cautious of – the stone fish and Moreton Bay Irukandji jellyfish we have in the bay will be in bigger numbers as the water warms up.

To all my readers, Merry Christmas, good fishing, and a happy and healthy New Year to you all! See you in 2023.

COLD SUMMERY SPINACH AND RICOTTA PESTO SALAD RECIPE

Here's the ultimate easy summer salad, versatile as a side or a main meal. it's a perfectly delicious addition to a colourful Christmas buffet! Using store-bought ravioli makes this guick and easy to throw together, and it keeps well in the fridge, so you can make it ahead of time.

SALAD INGREDIENTS

- 1 packet of spinach and ricotta ravioli or tortellini
- 1 cup of cherry tomatoes
- 1 tbsp of olive oil

- **PESTO**
- ¾ cup of parmesan cheese
- 1 cup of freshly picked basil leaves
- 1 cup of baby spinach leaves
- 1/3 cup of pine nuts
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- ½ cup of olive oil
 - · Freshly cracked black pepper and salt to taste

TO SERVE

Extra basil leaves to garnish

METHOD

- 1. Preheat your oven to 180°c.
- 2. Line a flat tray with baking paper, scatter the tomatoes on the tray, drizzle with oil, and cook for 20 minutes or until wilted and soft. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Heat a small non-stick pan to medium heat, and toss the pine nuts in the pan. Keep them moving so they don't burn, and once they're a lovely brown colour, remove them from the pan and set aside to cool.
- 4. In a food processor, blitz the basil and baby spinach leaves, parmesan cheese, garlic and pine nuts until combined.
- 5. Pour in the olive oil slowly, then season with salt and pepper and set aside.

To enable our new Lota House Chapel ministry, Diocesan Council back in May approved our request that a percentage of the proceeds of sale of our site be returned to the parish. We are grateful for Bishop John Roundhill's public statement back in April that these funds will be allocated to support our ongoing presence in Manly.

We do not live in the past, but the past very much lives in us. All that St Paul's represents, all that has been offered by those who have come before us, all that God has called us to be continues in the hearts and prayers of faithful, loving, beautiful humans known to the world as "St Paul's Manly".

PORT of BRISBANE Here for the future

Port of Brisbane is Queensland's largest multi-cargo port, handling 95% of the state's containers and motor vehicles, and approximately 50% of its agricultural exports.

Over 70 businesses are located within the port precinct, employing thousands of people. We're also an active member of the local and regional community, supporting not-for-profit and community organisations and playing our part in protecting and enhancing the natural environment.

TRADE

Motor vehicle volumes improved over the last three months with over 65,000 new vehicles imported into Brisbane, an increase of 12.5% on the same period last year.

Volumes have been constrained due to auto parts shortages in global supply chains, largely due to COVID-related shutdowns. The Federal Chamber of Automotive Industries has stated that while supply chain issues are improving, the global automotive market remains in recovery and will be for some time yet.

COMMUNITY

We're proud to have supported the Wynnum Fringe for the second year running through our Community Grant Program, helping to have celebrated the vibrant arts and cultural experiences the festival brings to the Bayside.

We are pleased to announce that The Sunlight Centre has been selected as our 2022/23 Employee Charity. Based in Morningside, The Sunlight Centre aims to support the community and their mental health through free face-toface crisis counselling for under 18s and adult workshops.

ENVIRONMENT

Our annual dredging Technical Advisory and Consultative Committee meeting was held in November, providing an update on our dredging activities to community, environment, government and port stakeholders. Port of Brisbane is required to undertake maintenance dredging of the navigational channel to ensure safe passage for commercial ships. The 2022 flood events deposited significant amounts of sediment within our channel and will be dredged as part of our upcoming campaign this summer.

A team of volunteers from the Port, B4C and the school descended on Brisbane Bayside State College last month, for a planting day as part of our work to restore a degraded waterway corridor and create an outdoor learning space. The project is supported by a \$40,000 community grant from Port of Brisbane securityholder, IFM Investors.


