





December 2021 and ended 30 November 2022. Almost 54,000 e-scooters trips were taken during this period, largely along the waterfront but also from train stations and more broadly across residential areas of Wynnum Manly.

Given its popularity, Brisbane City Council administration has decided that the e-mobility service will become permanent. The e-scooters are a fun and easy way of getting around, but I



urge all users to be thoughtful of the general public when using footpaths and parking.

Additionally, the Queensland State Government introduced a package of e-scooter safety initiatives on 1 November 2022 including 12km/hour footpath speed limits for e-scooters, drink riding offences, increased fines, and greater enforcement powers for the Queensland Police Service.



HELPING YOUR DOG TO LOSE WEIGHT

New Year's resolutions for a lot of people often involve improving their health. It's a good time to make sure that our pets are also in the best condition they can be. Obesity in pets is becoming increasingly common and can lead to a number of health issues including heart disease and diabetes. If you suspect that your furry friend is a becoming a little bit too cuddly, here are some things you can do to help get them back into shape.

- Feed your pet a good quality, balanced diet in the appropriate amount for their age and activity levels.
- Make sure that everyone involved in feeding your pet is on the same page use a measuring cup to ensure that food is accurately rationed!
- Avoid giving excessive treats throughout the day. Or, if treats are being fed, reduce the amount of food at meal times.
- Feed multiple, smaller meals throughout the day this gives your pet more time to burn off the calories.

- Use non-food rewards when training. Some pets will be happy with tummy rubs, verbal praise or a toy in place of calorie dense training treats. For animals who are very food motivated you can use some of their daily meal as treats a few pieces of kibble can work well.
- Help your pet move more. For dogs this may be increasing the length and frequency of walks, playing games of fetch or taking them swimming. Cats can be encouraged to play using toys such as fishing line toys or a ball with a bell inside.
- Offer healthy treats such as carrots, apples or blueberries. During summer months a small piece of meat frozen inside an ice cube doubles as both a treat and an easy way to stay cool!
- Plan monthly weigh-ins and don't be discouraged if the numbers don't change rapidly any changes you are implementing are improving your pet's quality of life.
- A full health check with your vet is a good place to start any lifestyle modification. Animals who are consistently not losing weight despite an appropriate diet and exercise may have underlying health issues which can be detected with blood tests.



Fixers enjoy the challenge and satisfaction of returning an item to working order, fixing a broken

toy, or repairing a piece of clothing. They also provide advice on the repair and maintenance of household items.

Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre provides the workroom facility where repairs are undertaken and sell its famous Devonshire Teas to provide the café aspect.

During nine Repair Cafés, fixers and volunteers dedicated 300 hours to preventing 160 repairable items from going to landfill, weighing a total of 450 kgs.

The next Repair Cafés will operate on Saturday 11th February, 11th March and 15th April at the Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre, Wynnum.



AGREEMENT PROGRESSES CAPALABA REVITALISATION PROJECT

FROM REDLAND CITY COUNCIL

Redland City Council has partnered with global powerhouse Shayher Group to deliver an exciting community precinct in Capalaba Town Centre.

Redland City Mayor Karen Williams said Council had signed a development agreement with Redland Investment Corporation (RIC) and Shayher Group to revitalise the principal activity centre to be the commercial, entertainment, cultural and civic heart of Capalaba.

"The agreement for the commercial hub of Capalaba will see delivery of a \$250 million project that incorporates exemplar public spaces including community assets such as a new library, customer service centre, arts centre and community hall," Cr Williams said.

"This will be complemented with a renewed public realm that is activated and innovative, using best practice architecture and subtropical design.

Cr Williams said Shayher Group had extensive experience delivering mixed-use developments such as the Brisbane Quarter precinct, redeveloping the former CSIRO site in Indooroopilly and developing the former Government landholdings in Northshore Hamilton.

Redland City Council engaged RIC to implement Council's vision for a vibrant Capalaba Town Centre.

RIC Chief Executive Officer Peter Kelley said they ran an extensive Expression of Interest campaign calling for proponents from the private sector.

"The Capalaba Centre Master Plan, adopted by Council in 2010, identified key areas of need at Capalaba, which holds tremendous potential as the entry into Redlands Coast," Mr Kelley said.

"The key areas included an active town square, a need to improve pedestrian movement and repositioning Capalaba as a primary employment, transit, and mixed-use development centre.

"Shayher Group presented an exciting and dynamic proposal that will bring much-needed infrastructure and improve connectivity, creating a mixed-use precinct in Capalaba."

Shayher Group Managing Director John Lin said they were proud to be part of the landmark project.

"We envision bringing the Redlands Coast community together by accommodating major employment and community facilities, complemented by an innovative and high-quality public realm and village green," Mr Lin said. Division 8 Councillor Tracey Huges said she supported plans to revitalise the area.

"Capalaba is home to a growing number of families, so it's important this project protects the local community feel of the area while also delivering much-needed activation," Cr Huges said. "This project will breathe new life into Capalaba and boost the local economy."

The next stages of the Capalaba Town Centre Revitalisation Project will include detailed design and development applications in 2023.

How to get your application approved

As many are aware, Queensland is currently in the grip of a rental crisis where there are more tenants than there are properties available. This results in a lot of stress for those out there currently trying to find a new home.

As a property manager, it means we are receiving applications from many people who would be wonderful tenants, but we only have one property available for them to apply for and can only approve one application. The common question we are getting at our inspections is, "why aren't I getting approved for a property? I've been submitting a lot of applications, and I'm just not getting mine across the line." So I thought I would share with our community some tips that may be helpful.

 Ensure your application is completed in full. Many real estates accept online applications using the same or similar platforms that tenants may have used before, so sometimes tenants forget to update their details and the details of their current employer and current reference for their current agent, and this wastes the property manager's time trying to get references that are no longer current, or those referees ignore our requests.

- 2. Let your references know that you are applying for properties and ask if they can respond to the request for a reference as quickly as possible and treat the request urgently. If we have multiple applications for a property, as soon as we have completed one application, we submit it to the owner, and we continue processing the others, but if the owner approves the first one submitted, then the other applicants are missing out simply because their referees did not respond.
- 3. Check that you can afford the property one of the first criteria a property manager checks is the rentto-income ratio, where we do not want the rent to exceed more than 35% of the tenant's net weekly income. Otherwise, this would place the tenant under

financial stress and unable to meet their weekly rent commitment.

- 4. If you have pets on your application, include photos of your adorable four-legged family members and references if possible.
- 5. Be prepared to pay the bond and first two weeks' rent within 24 hours of having your application approved. If you cannot afford this financial commitment, you may miss out on the property, and it goes to another applicant.
- 6. Call the agent after you have submitted your application to confirm they have received it and ask if they can let you know if they need any other information as part of processing your application.

I hope these tips have been helpful to you, and I wish you all the best with finding your new home.

REIQ applauds new housing accord

The state peak body for real estate professionals, the Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) has welcomed the wide range of initiatives announced in the Federal Budget which puts housing front and centre of the national agenda.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said the Budget demonstrated a clear commitment to collaboration and an encouraging focus on addressing the supply issues at the heart of the crisis.

"The REIQ has always acknowledged that we can't rely on just one level of government to tackle housing affordability and address the serious housing supply shortage we face," Ms Mercorella said.

"That's why this budget, which includes buy-in from all levels of government on planning reform and housing targets, funds to accelerate the delivery of more social and affordable housing supply, support for pathways to ownership, incentives to downsize, and innovative ways to encourage institutional investment in developments, is incredibly encouraging.

"These initiatives complement the Queensland State Government's Housing Investment Fund for new housing supply, and it's great to see both state and federal governments are unified in their commitment to solve housing supply and affordability issues.

"We desperately need more housing in Queensland, due to pressures such as decreased household population, with the average household now sitting at only 2.5 persons per dwelling.

"Concerningly, it's also been identified that our state has a shrinking rental pool, with 55,000 fewer properties on the permanent rental market than the historical trend projected, as well as reduced listings on the sales market.

"This shortfall tells us that there has never been a more important time to encourage and recognise the critical role private investors play in housing Queenslanders – with around 36% of people living in our state renting their homes, and the vast majority of that housing provided by mum and dad investors."



Ms Mercorella said the REIQ welcomed the establishment of the National Housing Supply and Affordability Council to review barriers to institutional investment and innovative financing models, and independently advise the Government on housing policy.

"At the Housing Summit, the REIQ took the opportunity to advocate for innovative ways to deliver increased housing supply, such as amending taxation rules to stimulate build-to-rent developments – specifically with vulnerable groups in mind," she said.

"We believe there's a real appetite for more build-to-rent in our community – we all recognise that it's a model that would offer more certainty for our state's large renting population.

"However, in order to deliver increased housing supply to those who need it most, we urge the State and Local Governments to work with the Federal Government to ensure that the right settings and policies are in place to facilitate these much-needed developments."

ALCOHOL: HOW MUCH IS TOO MUCH?

As we emerge on the other side of holidays, maybe a little bleary eyed or with belts loosened, I'm sure many of us are turning our minds to New Year's resolutions. For some that may mean more exercise or less food but for others it will mean trying to cut back on drinking.

The Australian Alcohol guidelines currently recommend that healthy men and women should drink no more than 10 standard drinks a week and no more than four standard drinks on any one day. This doesn't mean 10 glasses of wine or four cans of beer, it refers to 10 grams of pure alcohol in whatever volume it takes. Most full strength beers and most standard pours



of wine will contain more than one standard drink. Most people unknowingly exceed the recommended amount weekly or monthly depending on their lifestyle.

Exceeding this amount doesn't mean you are an alcoholic in the same way that eating more than your daily recommended calories doesn't mean you have an eating disorder. What matters more is your pattern of behaviour and what drives you to consume alcohol. Reliance on alcohol can be influenced by many factors and develop for many reasons but can have serious health consequences. These include liver disease, increased risk of certain cancers, dementia and increased injury risk. Alcohol is the most easily accessed harmful drug in Australia.

If you are concerned that your alcohol use is excessive or are worried about its effects on your health please see your GP to discuss your concerns. There are easily accessed tests and services that can assist in your alcohol journey and more options than just rehabilitation which your GP can help with.

WHEN THE WEATHER PLAYS NICE, FISHING IS FUN FOR THE FAMILY

Happy New Year to one and all, and may you all have another great fishing year. I can't complain about 2022 – plenty of fish and whales in the bay; the only sad part was that we lost too many good friends who were way too young. I'll be thinking of them every time I'm out in the bay.

So, all we need this month will be for the weather to play its part. With plenty of families waiting for the right conditions to get a fish, here's where to go. Whiting should be plentiful in the bay around Chain Banks, Rous Channel, Maroon Gutter, Amity Banks and, of course, the Sand Hills and all along the western side of Moreton Island and the Blue Hole. The tiger squid should also be in good numbers, so while you're fishing for whiting, a squid jig on a float behind the boat will generally provide you with entrée before the main meal.

Squire, snapper and sweet lip will be around all the shallow reefs and all the artificial reefs, and floating out a pilly might get you a mackerel or two. The school mackerel will be around, but hopefully, so will the spotty mackerel, so trolling a spoon on a diving board or cast and retrieving with chrome slugs while they are feeding on the surface is the way to catch them. Just remember, no wire on the spoons or chrome slugs in the bay, they don't like it at all.

Sand crabs will also be in good numbers, so watch all the crab pots in the bay – you don't want them around your prop.

Enjoy the bay, be careful with all the boat traffic, and keep a close eye on the weather. The family will want to go out more often if they catch a fish in calm seas!

MANGO, BANANA AND COCONUT OVERNIGHT OATS RECIPE

Too hot to cook? Here's a low fuss, no-cook breakfast recipe that's perfect for sunny summer mornings.

INGREDIENTS (ONE SERVE)

- 1/2 cup of rolled oats
- ½ cup milk whole, skim or nut milk whatever you love
- 2 tbsp chia seeds

- 3 tbsp Greek yoghurt (coconut yoghurt also tastes great)
- Half a small banana, sliced
- Half a small mango, diced
- Dried coconut pieces to serve

METHOD

- 1. In a mason jar or a glass, combine the chia seeds and the oats.
- 2. Add the milk, then stir the oats and chia seed mixture through.
- 3. Add a layer of banana slices, followed by the yoghurt, then add the chopped mango.
- 4. Cover the jar/glass with its lid or cling film and leave in the fridge overnight.
- 5. Serve with dried coconut slices.

If you've got a sweet tooth, stir a dash of maple syrup or honey into the milk, and swap out the Greek yoghurt for a flavoured sweeter version. You can also make mini serves of overnight oats in small vases or shot glasses to add to a breakfast buffet.

HOW DOES NITROUS OXIDE WORK AT THE DENTIST?

How does it work?

The nitrous oxide slows down your nervous system to make you feel relaxed. You may feel light-headed, tingly, or even heaviness in your arms or legs. Ultimately, it assists patients to feel calm and comfortable throughout any treatment, whether this be through a general check and clean, or longer appointments for fillings, crowns or implants.

What are the benefits to the patient?

Nitrous oxide is a safe and effective method of mild sedation, which means that patients can be supported in their local dental practice to access treatment they may otherwise be unable to access or need to go to a specialist dentist to have routine procedures completed under general anaesthetic. The gas provides quick onset relief for patients, and once the treatment is stopped, the effects wear off quickly for the patient. Unlike some other sedation, nitrous oxide allows patients to feel relaxed but they can also continue to communicate with their dentist.

Can any dentist provide Nitrous Oxide?

The ability to provide onsite nitrous oxide at a dental practice can only be provided by dentists who have undergone specific training to be able to administer the treatment safely and effectively. As with any type of medical treatment, there may be side effects to be aware of. Most patients do not experience any adverse reactions, however part of the training for dentists is know how to support and manage any effects of the gas in the practice. As with any treatment, any risks and side effects should be discussed in detail before commencing.



Who can use nitrous oxide?

The treatment has been effective for any patients that feel anxious or fearful, patients with special healthcare needs, patients with severe gag reflexes that interfere with accessing treatment, and children that may need to undergo longer treatment for fillings or crowns.
