The event also marked the eighth birthday of the Capalaba branch and the second birthday of the Wynnum Manly branch. These groups meet regularly to encourage mutual support and companionship, providing social and educational opportunities for women in their senior years. OWN also hosts monthly guest speaker events and social outings, making it a fun and engaging experience for everyone involved.



COMMUNITY SAFETY - THANK YOU FOR YOUR FEEDBACK

I would like to thank immensely all Baysiders who took part in my Community Safety Survey last month. Your responses were honest, insightful and important in ensuring that community safety



measures represent the needs of local residents here on our Bayside.

I am pleased to announce that the Strengthening Community Safety Bill 2023 has now passed Parliament and will assist in maintaining a high standard of community safety, whilst breaking the cycle of youth

As part of these important community safety reforms, there will be further investment in addressing the complex causes of youth crime.

A new investment of \$332 million will help boost police resources and support community safety.

In addition, there will be a significant funding boost for the Queensland Police Service including a new \$25 million injection for high visibility police patrols and \$17 million for expanded joint flying squads.

Everyone on our Bayside deserves to feel safe, and I am confident these tough new measures will ensure that youth crime is tackled

HYDROGEN SKILLS OF THE FUTURE START IN WYNNUM



It's no secret that clean, green Hydrogen is an important part of Queensland's move to a clean energy future, so I am very excited to announce that one of our very own Bayside high schools will be taking the lead in equipping our Lytton students with the skills they need to thrive in a booming emerging hydrogen industry when they graduate!

Wynnum State High School is one of 32 schools across the State that will be offering students the opportunity to get involved in a new Queensland Government Hydrogen Gateway to Industry Skills program.

The program will be aimed at equipping students with the knowledge and skills required to pursue careers in the emerging hydrogen sector.

The program will be delivered at the school and cover a range of topics related to hydrogen production, storage, transport and use. The curriculum will be delivered in partnership with industry experts and will include hands-on learning experiences and industry placements to give students a real-world understanding of the sector.

This is a fantastic opportunity for students of Wynnum State High School, and offers incredible career prospectives for young people of the Bayside. It builds on the success of the launch of the Hydrogen Gateway to Industry Skills program in 2022, where across all 11 industries, nearly 31,000 Queensland students participated in the program.

Our Bayside is fast becoming a centrepiece for the renewable energy revolution currently occurring in Queensland. With several projects underway, including the development of a hydrogen refuelling station in Lytton, this is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to produce local skilled workers who can drive the sector's growth, both in our Bayside community and across the State.

By equipping Bayside young people with the skills and knowledge required to pursue careers in the hydrogen industry, the program will not only benefit students but will also help to address the skills shortage facing the sector.

It will position Queensland as a leader in the hydrogen industry and pave the way for a sustainable and prosperous future.





I would like to wish all Wynnum Manly residents a very hoppy Easter. While Easter eggs and hot cross buns are nice, Easter is about more than sweet treats. To quote the Cardinal Basil Hume; 'the great gift of Easter is hope'. I hope everyone has time to relax, time to spend with family and friends, and time to enjoy some egg-cellent chocolate.

GEORGE CLAYTON PARK

I'm excited to share more details about the George Clayton Park upgrade, which will make this well-loved Wynnum park more inclusive and accessible.

Clayton's Cove will receive a fleet of new ships, as well as some exciting new structures and features.

The premier vessel, a huge man-of-war, will provide daring play for older children. The pride of the fleet will be flanked by a smaller ship for younger children.

Brisbane City Council consulted with Darling Point Special School to include some sensory and accessibility elements.

While the timber boardwalk will be replaced with concrete to make it easier for users with mobility aids, the new pathway will use interesting tactile components like bumps, hills, and tactile ground textures.

A Perspex light wall and bronze sculptures of sea animals at wheelchair height will complete the sensory pathway.

New to the park will be a fossil dig pit, a treasure chest and crocodile skull under the lighthouse, and a treasure map theme stencilled into the pathway.

I'm pleased to report that many parts of the existing playground will be recycled, either for use in the new playground or at other spaces around Brisbane.

George Clayton Park will be closed from mid-April, with the new playground to be completed by the end of June.



THE IMPORTANCE OF VACCINATIONS FOR CATS

BY DR NICKY THOMAS, WYNNUM MANLY VETERINARY HOSPITAL

Vaccination helps to control and prevent infectious disease in our pets. Kittens are born with some protective antibodies acquired from their mother's milk but need to be vaccinated to mount their own immune response. We recommend a course of three vaccines given at six to eight weeks, 12 weeks and 16 weeks of age. Adult cats should be vaccinated yearly to best protect against disease, especially if they are in contact with other cats. Feline boarding facilities generally require that cats be up to date with their yearly vaccinations before they stay.

WHICH DISEASES CAN WE VACCINATE AGAINST?

- Feline enteritis (Panleucopaenia/Feline parvovirus) causes severe gastrointestinal signs of vomiting and bloody diarrhoea. Pregnant cats infected with the virus may miscarry or give birth to kittens with brain damage. The virus is highly contagious and may spread readily in the environment.
- Feline respiratory virus (cat flu) is a combination of highly contagious viruses including herpesvirus (rhinotracheitis) and calicivirus. These viruses cause sneezing, coughing, runny eyes, nasal discharge, inappetence and tongue ulcers. The fatality rate is low but the virus may persist for long periods an recur when the cat is stressed.
- Feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV) is the feline equivalent of HIV a disease which affects the cat's immune system leaving it susceptible to other diseases. FIV is most often spread by bites from infected cats.

Chat to your vet to discuss your cat's vaccination requirements so that they are best protected against infectious diseases.

A PAIN IN THE EAR

Most of us have had at least one or two ear infections in our lives. They can be painful, affect our hearing and drive us nuts! Here are a few key things to know about what ear infections are and how to help them.

The ear is divided into two sections. The outer ear is the part you can see plus the ear canal down to the tympanic membrane, and the middle ear is the part behind the tympanic membrane. There are two types of ear infections- outer ear infections "swimmer's ear" (otitis externa) and middle ear infections (otitis media).



Otitis externa is often associated with swimming and is common in school aged children. Possible symptoms are ear pain, red/hot ear, blocked feeling or discharge from the ear. It is most commonly treated with ear drops, keeping the ear dry and using paracetamol or ibuprofen for pain. You can help prevent otitis externa by using ear drops after swimming.

Middle ear infections usually occur in younger children. When they have a cold the germs travel up the tube that connects the nose and ears and can become trapped causing the infection. Because children this age are prone to colds it can be common for them to have multiple infections a year. Symptoms may be fever, pulling/rubbing ears, discharge from the ear or poor feeding. Otitis media can be tricky to diagnose — especially in small ears. Sometimes your doctor may need to see you again to get a better look. Most cases will only need pain relief with paracetamol and ibuprofen. Your child may or may not need antibiotics — this depends on the case and should be discussed at your appointment.

If you think you or your child may have an ear infection the best thing to do is see a doctor for treatment.

THE HISTORY OF THE LITTLE CHURCH ON THE HILL

Between 1820 and 1840, the number of Catholics in Australia increased at a far greater rate than the number of Protestants. In 1846, Rev John Dunmore Lang travelled to Britain to recruit suitably qualified Protestants as free settlers for "Cooksland" with the promise of gifts of land.

Thomas Sands and his family arrived in Brisbane on the first immigrant ship, the "Artemisia", in 1847. However, no land was forthcoming. The new settlers lived in Fortitude Valley. Thomas set up meetings in his home for those of the Baptist faith.

Joseph Sands, the grandson of Thomas Sands, was employed as Shire Clerk and Engineer of Wynnum in 1907. He also invited the local Baptists into his home, the Shire Clerk's Cottage, for the first meetings. The cottage still stands on Tingal Road.

The Wynnum and Manly Baptist Mission declared its foundation day on 5 November 1910, and the first public service was held a month later in the shire hall. An early preacher, Mr Harbottle, the proprietor of a bicycle repair shop in Brisbane city, peddled nineteen kilometres to Wynnum, then returned to the city after the service. Joe Sands was secretary and treasurer of the Mission.

By 1912, the Mission was seeking a suitable piece of land to build a place for worship. Three blocks were purchased for £60. Two blocks were on Edith Street and one block behind on Florence Street. The Florence Street block was sold for a profit. Edith Street had been gravelled by then, and there were a few gas streetlights.

Tenders were called for a small square building. Fencing and lining of the church were excluded to be able to afford to pay for seating. A loan was negotiated with the Brisbane Permanent Building and Banking Company. The Baptist Association of Queensland underwrote the debt.

The community was invited to the stump-capping ceremony, held on 5 October 1912, when confidential sums of money were placed under the loose metal stump caps (the caps prevented termites from

entering the timber of the building). In total, £38 was collected quite generous for those times - and this allowed for the lining of the front and back walls of the new building.

The church was opened and dedicated on 21 December 1912. In six months, the number of children attending the Sunday School rose from seven to 25 pupils, with Joe Sands as the superintendent. By 1915 there were 70 pupils.

The church was still operating as a Baptist Association of the Queensland Mission, and the elders wished to upgrade to a Church Fellowship. A constitution was drawn up and submitted. The church became recognised as the Baptist Church in Wynnum on 25 January 1914, with 11 founding members (eighty years later, in 1994, a lectern was presented to the church bearing the names of those founding members). By July 1918, the church became an independent establishment.

As the church grew in members, the building needed to grow in size. The original square "butterbox" building was extended at the rear in 1916 by W Rice and Sons. In 1925 a substantial hall was attached at the rear costing £450; the contract being with Mr W E Cowell. This was an unlined building but was very functional.

Wynnum was developing as a commercial centre, and Bay Terrace had become the main thoroughfare. Church elders desired a more prominent location in the town, but land on Bay Terrace was too expensive. The church was on a backstreet (Edith Street).

In 1930, generous immigrants, Mr and Mrs Humphries, although Presbyterians, offered the church two valuable plots of land on the corner of Bay Terrace and Clara Street. This was exactly the type of location the church had been seeking but could never afford. The offer was gladly accepted by the congregation. But one condition was attached to the offer: the site was to remain the permanent site for the Wynnum Baptist Church.

After considering costs, the decision was made to move the old

church to the new site rather than build a new church. A contract was given to local removalists, Guyomar and Wright. Plant and tools available to removalists in the 1930s were still remarkably primitive. The prime mover was an old truck with solid rubber tyres. The stumps of the old building were loaded, too, to keep the truck's wheels on the ground and maintain the necessary traction.

The hall to the rear was unfixed, and the hall and the church were moved in two separate journeys and re-joined at the new site. The frontage on Bay Terrace was remodelled to enhance the appearance by adding two side porches for entry. The help from the church congregation was amazing. The electric light, the plumbing works and the painting were all donated.

This new situation for the church was perfect. On a Sunday evening, people stopped and listened in the darkness outside. Many entered, attracted by the bright lights and the singing.

The property directly behind the church, on the corner of Akonna Street and Clara Street, belonging to the McNulty family, was placed onto the market ln 1963 at the reasonable price of $\mathfrak{L}6,500$. The proceeds of the Jubilee Fund were redirected to buying this strategic site.

For some years, before the new brick church was built, the house on this new land was used as part of the Sunday School. The new brick church was opened on 28 June 1975. The building cost $\mathfrak{L}70,000$, and three church members voluntarily paid the costs of seating and carpeting.

By 2006, yet again, the elders realised that the premises for worship were too small for the number in the congregation. A larger area of land on Kianawah Road, Lindum, was acquired, with plenty of room

for parking. The opening ceremonies for the new buildings were held on 8 March 2006.

After much controversy, the building of 1912 (moved to Bay Terrace in 1930) was left behind. The land and church were sold to BMD to build its new headquarters.

Any day now, the remains of the original 1912 parts of the church building on Bay Terrace are to be relocated to the grounds of lona College in Lindum, and the construction of the new five-storey BMD building will commence on the Bay Terrace site.

Time for a broader approach to fight inflation

In yet another blow to borrowers, the RBA rose the cash rate by 25 basis points from 3.35% to 3.6%, in the tenth interest rate rise since May 2022 – an approach the REIQ says is putting a serious dent in confidence.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said, "While we were forewarned that we would see another cash rate rise, it's concerning that it is happening at such a rapid-fire pace with ten out of ten consecutive rises and little impact to inflation.

"You've got to be wondering when the RBA might stop and think whether this approach is still the right course of action, because while they are aiming to reduce inflation via these consistent rate hikes, it's clearly not working."

Ms Mercorella noted the RBA had stated

inflation was largely being driven by supply side matters.

"Energy costs, lack of new land supply and natural disaster impacts are all large contributors to inflation," she said. "Interest rate increases do nothing to address the cost-of-living crisis that these factors are driving.

"It cannot be left to mortgage holders to do all the heavy lifting to fix our economic woes.

"It's time for all levels of government to address the productivity constraints on the economy that are actually meaningfully driving inflation. New roads, dams, increased land supply and natural-disaster proofing key infrastructure all need to be addressed urgently," Ms Mercorella said.

By investing in infrastructure this will reduce

the cost of doing business and therefore help moderate inflation growth,

Ms Mercorella acknowledged the pain being felt by mortgage holders.

"Around 80% of Australian mortgage holders have variable loans, which is one of the highest percentages in the world. As a result, our economy is particularly susceptible to rate increases."

But Ms Mercorella warned that mortgage holders weren't the only people who would be affected by the RBA's action, noting that there are much broader implications for all of us

"There's no doubt that mortgage holders will feel a direct impact. But it's important to understand that increasing interest rates have an impact on all of us. Whether you are a renter or running a business, we're

all going to feel the pain of these continual interest rate hikes.

"The number of first home buyers taking out loans in Queensland in January was the lowest in a decade, highlighting the difficulty that this group is now having entering the market. Meanwhile, loans for owner occupiers were below pre-COVID levels, highlighting the negative impact the messaging around rate increases is having on both buyers and sellers alike."

Ms Mercorella said that "while the conduct of the RBA has justifiably provoked the ire of the community, the reality is that the RBA can only act within the constrained limits of its charter and its objectives".

"It's time for governments to step up and play their role to address the issues the RBA is grappling with."

WHERE TO FIND YOUR EASTER SEAFOOD IN MORETON BAY

Happy Easter to you all. It feels like we have been celebrating Easter since January 1st when hot cross buns started appearing. Okay, let's not go there!

April is usually a great month for fishing on the bay. Last year it was wet and rainy, and the water became muddy, so let's hope we get good rain (but no floods) so we can catch some fresh fish.

Whiting should be in good numbers in the Rous Channel, Fisherman's Gutter, Maroon Gutter, and Hole. Amity Banks and the Sand Hills should have plenty as well. Hopefully, the water stays clear because the tiger squid should be in the same weed banks as the whiting. The only problem this year is that thousands of big green sea toads are killing our squid jigs.

School mackerel will be in the area from Hope Banks and across to Peel, so trolling with a diving board and a 3-inch spoon will be a good way to catch a few. Alternatively, you can try drifting close to the beacons with floating pillies – that's also fun.



Squire, snapper, and sweet lip are also worth targeting around the bay's shallow reefs and artificial structures.

Let's hope the weather stays fine and the seas calm so everyone can enjoy the holidays. Good luck to all the sailors competing in the Brisbane to Gladstone yacht race.

VOLUNTEERS DEPLOY ONE MILLION OYSTER SHELLS

FROM OZFISH UNLIMITED

Queensland recreational fishers have delivered the biggest ever single day of habitat restoration in Moreton Bay, deploying more than one million recycled oyster shells to help restore shellfish reefs.

More than 200 members and supporters of OzFish Unlimited, Australia's only recreational fishing charity, dedicated over 2,900 hours to collecting and cleaning used oyster shells and constructing 765 mini reefs known as Robust Oyster Baskets using in excess of 16.5 tonnes of shells.

This latest deployment has the potential to be transformational for Moreton Bay, where shellfish reefs were once plentiful and contributed to vibrant fisheries and clear water. Two hundred years of dredging, overharvesting and poor water quality mean they are now considered functionally extinct.

The one million recycled shells, collected from restaurants and businesses across Brisbane by volunteers, have the potential to become home to more than 1.5 million living oysters. In addition, the

habitat they create will be able to support tonnes of fish and nearly 750,000 invertebrates, including crabs, shrimp, worms, and snails.

Robbie Porter, OzFish Special Projects Officer for Shellfish Restoration, believes the community spirit shown by recreational fishers can help revitalise what has been lost in Moreton Bay.

"This was our biggest day yet returning shellfish to Moreton Bay, and it was only possible because of the incredible effort of our members and volunteers. They did a power of work, including using their own vehicles to collect the shells, dedicating their time to cleaning the shells, designing the mini reefs and spending more hours on the water to return them to the bay," Mr Porter said.

"I'd like to thank everybody, from our members through to the many project partners and local businesses in South East Queensland who have helped. We want to keep it up as there is so much more to be restored."

The project is the largest community-driven shellfish restoration program in Australia, and it is leading the way for anglers in other states inspired by their work who are seeking to replicate its success.

"We're beginning to make a dent, and it's just the beginning," said Mr Porter. "What's really exciting is the sea life that begins to establish onto the reef; we can see they are doing exactly what we had hoped."

Shellfish reef restoration has never been undertaken on this scale and speed in Moreton Bay before.

OzFish's restoration efforts in Moreton Bay are part of its Shellfish Revolution, supported by the charity's major partner BCF — Boating, Camping, Fishing. The project is also supported by Healthy Land & Water through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare and Fish Habitat Restoration programs, Port of Brisbane, the Turner Family Foundation and Tackle Tactics.

THE NOSTALGIA AND BEAUTY OF ANTIQUE WEDDING DRESSES

"Wedding Belles" is the theme of a new textile display at Redland Museum. Whether you've never been to a wedding or have attended hundreds, you can't help but admire the uniqueness of each couple's celebration.

People who love weddings have their favourite part, and for many, it's the attire of the happy couple. The bride's wedding dress draws much attention, but the groom is not to be outdone.

This new display at Redland Museum features beautiful and fragile wedding gowns, including a grey silk taffeta gown from the 1860s that must be protected and can only be displayed for short periods. It is contained in a special archival box, using many sheets of acid-free paper created by Dr Michael Marendy in 2001. Michael is now one of the top textile conservators in Queensland.

On one of the gowns is a gold locket that belonged to a daughter in the Sherrin family, who were one of the first families to settle in Cleveland in 1860.

An unusual silk wedding gown from 1938 features fringing and a design reminiscent of the Flapper era.

The featured groom's black dinner suit belonged to Mr Salmon, who owned the Pink Shop at Ormiston and built many beautiful timber items for the Anglican Church at Ormiston. The suit was donated by his daughter, Kath McNeilly OAM.



SAVOURY BAKED EGGS IN PASTRY RECIPE

Tired of eggs on toast? Here's a delicious alternative that's easy to make with a few simple ingredients.

INGREDIENTS

- Butter
- Eggs
- Plain flour
- Lyys
- Frozen puff pastry sheets
- Salt and pepper
- · Herbs to garnish

METHOD

- 1. Grease a cupcake or muffin tin with butter and preheat your oven to 180°C.
- Remove a puff pastry sheet from the freezer and let it thaw just enough so that you can mould it into the cupcake tin without it cracking.
- 3. On a floured surface, lay the pastry out flat, and using a knife or a cookie cutter, cut the pastry into squares large enough to cover the base and sides of each section of your tin.
- 4. Press the pastry into the tin to create a shell, leaving a slight overhang around the edges. Prick the pastry base a few times with a fork.
- 5. Bake for 10 minutes in the oven.
- 6. Remove from the oven, and crack an egg (or two) into the pastry shells.
- 7. Return to the oven and bake for a further 10 minutes, or until the eggs are cooked through.
- 8. Season with salt and pepper, garnish with herbs chives, parsley, dill, or basil are all great and serve immediately.




NOTES AND TIPS:

- The amount of pastry and eggs you use will depend on how many servings you're making.
- Add a sprinkle of cheese or some chopped cherry tomatoes and bacon to your eggs before baking to add extra flavour.
- Serve with a leafy green side salad and chili jam to balance out the richness of the eggs and pastry.


