We invite the community to warmly welcome our guests to join us in supporting these teams. Come witness the excitement first-hand as we celebrate grassroots football at its finest!





FINANCIAL LITERACY IN SCHOOLS


What is a budget? What is superannuation? How do interest rates work? How do you read a pay slip? What is a credit score? How to save, invest and live within your means should and must be taught to our children in schools. That is why I introduced a motion calling on the Federal Government to make Financial Literacy as a compulsory part of the national curriculum.

It is alarming to see that 86% of Australians don't know or understand their monthly expenses; that we rank 5th highest in the world for household debt out of all OECD nations; and that collectively, Australian's have over \$17 billion of personal credit card debt. Simply put, these are not the habits or the mindset we want our children or grandchildren to have.

We need to ensure our children are equipped with the skills they need to be confident in making smart personal financial decisions that benefit them and their future, and Financial Literacy in schools is the first step to achieving this. Financial Literacy in schools will not only set up our next generation to be financial resilient but will also help ensure that our children are in control of their own money. It will also help to reduce depression and anxiety due to financial stress and help decrease rates of homelessness, especially amongst women.

Setting goals to save for a house, making sure you are paid the correct rate, knowing how to fill out a tax return, it is time we see these necessary life skills taught in the classroom and that Financial Literacy becomes a compulsory part of the national curriculum.



My first memory of meeting Peter was in May 1994. My family and I had returned to the Bayside and moved into our newly built home at Wynnum North. We were outside when Peter came to introduce himself as our new Councillor. He said words to the effect of, "This is an impressive house!" I replied, "So are the people who live here."

Over the year we have crossed paths with my involvement with St Peter's Church, Wynnum/Manly Chamber of Commerce, and other community events we have both attended. In recent times, I became the co-ordinator of St Pete's Pantry, set up by St Peter's previous priest Rev Donna Petersen. The Pantry has now been operating three years. It received DGR status in 2021 and we wish to thank Peter for his great support for the pantry since its inception.

St Peter's Pantry and myself personally, will greatly miss your outstanding work and commitment in our community.

He's been a great representative for the area. Through changes in State and Federal, he's been a constant. It highlights the importance of local government dealing with local issues. That's what's kept him in office for so long – he never forgot that.





WHAT IS CANINE PARVOVIRUS?

We have recently seen some cases of parvovirus in the local area. It is critically important that dogs be kept up to date with vaccinations to prevent infection with this deadly disease.

WHAT IS PARVOVIRUS?

Parvovirus is a highly contagious gastrointestinal virus that can affect dogs of all ages. Unvaccinated dogs and puppies under four months of age are most at risk. Parvovirus spreads by direct contact between dogs and contact with contaminated faeces. The virus can live on kennel surfaces, food and water bowls, collars and leashes and the clothing of people in contact with infected dogs. It can survive in the environment for long periods and can be spread on the fur and feet of dogs and contaminated shoes, cages and other objects to infect other locations.

SIGNS OF PARVOVIRUS

Parvovirus causes signs including lethargy, loss of appetite, high fevers, vomiting and severe bloody diarrhoea. There is no specific treatment for the virus – dogs need to be hospitalised for supportive therapy consisting of intravenous fluids to combat electrolyte, fluid and protein loss, medications to control vomiting and antibiotics to prevent secondary infection. Parvovirus can acutely affect animals, and dogs

may die despite intensive treatment.

PREVENTION

Puppies are born with some immunity from their mother's milk but need vaccinations to ensure they develop their own immune response as the protective antibodies from the milk wear off. We recommend a course of three vaccinations given at 6-8

weeks, 10 - 12 weeks and 14 - 16 weeks of age. Puppies should be kept away from other dogs of unknown vaccination status and areas where lots of dogs congregate due to the risk of environmental contamination with the virus.

Adult dogs should be vaccinated a year after their final puppy vaccination. Following this first adult vaccination, dogs generally develop good immunity to the disease. Further vaccinations may be recommended yearly to three yearly, depending on the vaccine used – have a chat with your vet to decide the best course of vaccination for your dog.


Around 1800 Australians are waiting for a lifesaving organ donation, and more than 14,000

CAN YOU GET SICK FROM THE 'FLU' VACCINE?

It's that time of year again, where we all huddle up indoors sharing our germs. Already in the southern states we have seen significant spikes in the number of Influenza cases compared to the same time in previous years. We are likely in store for a nasty 'Flu' season this year.




We encourage all individuals > 6months of age to get the flu vaccine to help keep them well. Influenza is a viral illness that causes upper respiratory tract

symptoms like sore throat, high fever, body aches, runny nose and nasal congestion, cough and shortness of breath. It not uncommonly will cause complications like pneumonia, with many patients who get influenza requiring admission to hospital or the Intensive Care Unit.

Thankfully we have a safe vaccine available to help protect us from Influenza or at least make its symptoms more mild. The 'Flu' Vaccine is an INACTIVATED vaccine and so YOU CAN'T get sick from it. The reason why people think you can is because we give it in 'Flu' season. So there are lots of 'Flu-like' illnesses floating around, and so you could easily be 'brewing' an illness on the day of your vaccination. Of course if you develop symptoms of a flu-like illness, you will want to blame it on the 'Flu' Vaccine, when in actual fact it was just unlucky...you would have got that illness whether you had had the 'Flu' Vaccine or not.

Further to this, it takes 10 days for the vaccine to be fully effective, so you could still pick up Influenza in the time it takes for the vaccine to be effective. While you absolutely can't get 'sick' from the flu vaccine, it certainly doesn't make you invincible.

There are hundreds of other viral illnesses around over the winter that we don't have vaccines to protect against, and so it is still vitally important that you take measures to keep yourself well over winter such as regular hand washing, staying away from sick people and staying home if you yourself are sick. The 'Flu' Vaccine is available now through our practice or local pharmacies. We encourage all to book an appointment to receive one.

OYSTERS BACK FROM THE BRINK THANKS TO RESTORATION

New scientific findings show that 3 million new oysters are living on oyster baskets built by volunteers along Brisbane's coastline.

A team of Griffith University marine scientists analysed all types of animals living on the structures placed in the Port of Brisbane, and found that along with oysters and other shellfish, another 4.5 million animals, such as crabs, live on and among the oysters.

Lead researcher Marina Richardson, an expert in shellfish biology and ecology, said that although oysters were historically plentiful in Moreton Bay, the populations were now "functionally extinct".

"The benefits of restoring oyster populations in these shallow seas are enormous," she said.

"Oyster reefs disappeared before living memory and were the kidneys of our waterways," Richardson said.

"The primary cause was the destruction of reefs for lime-burning and unregulated and unsustainable harvesting following European arrival in the 1800s, so by the early 1900s, the oyster industry was in a state of collapse. "Declining water quality and the removal of habitats that included old shells and hard substrates when whole reefs were removed and burned prevented reefs from naturally recovering, and therefore required intervention."

The Griffith research team worked with fishing conservation charity OzFish to create the new oyster reefs at a 19-hectare site in 5-metre deep water at the Port of Brisbane near the mouth of the river.

OzFish's Robbie Porter, a Senior Project Officer in shellfish restoration, spent years trialling the best way to attract natural recruitment of shellfish onto created structures, and came up with the idea of robust oyster baskets, or ROBs.

"We thought for years that the baskets seemed to be working, but we wanted a scientific assessment and invited the Griffith University team to verify just how many shellfish and other animals were there," he said.

Together, the teams found that the 4,000 deployed ROBs recruited oysters well, were very stable, inexpensive, portable and easy to deploy, and formed sturdy clumps of oysters in about 12 months. Dr Chantal Lanctôt oversaw the census and said the team was astounded by the diversity and abundance of fauna.

"This is hands-on science that requires a good eye for identifying animals of all types and sizes. Given the team's massive efforts, it was fantastic to see just how well the ROBs are working," Dr Lanctôt said.

Professor Rod Connolly helped calculate the projectwide benefits. As Director of Griffith's Coastal and Marine Research Centre, he has examined shellfish restoration sites around the world.

"This comprehensive census of life on the oyster baskets provides a solid basis for estimating current success," Professor Connolly said.

"It also underpins how future restoration efforts can help our coastal waters recover and thrive again."

Richardson said the initial results of this oyster reef restoration project would return vital ecosystem services such as water filtration and the establishment of habitats and foraging grounds for fish and invertebrates.

"Restoration is generally expensive, and it's why a lot of restoration is unable to be scaled up," Richardson said.

"Because ROBs don't rely on hatchery-produced spat, their use can be widespread."

With the initial results showing great success of the ROBs restoring oyster reefs, the team said the next stage of the project would be large-scale active restoration, which would require working further with Marine Park authorities and existing legislation to deploy to ROBs to other locations.

MY LOCAL MEMORIES: FROM SLATES TO SMOKY HOLES

We didn't write on paper when I started school in the 1950s: we wrote on slates with slate pencils made of a softer form of slate. Work was erased using sponges. Slate was considered easier for beginners than pen and messy ink. Ballpoint pens existed, but I can't remember when we started using them in school. I remember using pen and ink and often 'blotted my copybook'. Each desk had a hole for an inkwell located where two could share. Ink and kids are not a good mix, resulting in inky handprints, spills, and blots on books and clothes. Eventually, we transitioned to pencils and ballpoint pens, but the holes in desks remained.



The desks also had a shelf where students could store books. Smoking was

still a common practice. Some teachers smoked, but students would get into big trouble (e.g., the cane) if caught smoking. (Actually, people don't smoke. The cigarettes smoke – the people are just the suckers.) One day some boys in the back row showed off by smoking in class. They took puffs when the teacher was not looking, then held the cigarettes below the desk, out of sight. The smoke rose; the teacher got suspicious and moved closer. To avoid detection, the smokers threw their cigarettes into the shelf under their desks. Unfortunately, their books, papers and other flammable objects on the shelf caught fire, and smoke chimneyed out of the hole in the top of the desk. The more those boys tried to cover up their antics, the more they were exposed. 'Where there is smoke, there is fire' – or at least naughty boys.

Queensland is still worlds away from a healthy rental market

Obscenely tight rental conditions continue in Queensland according to the latest Residential Vacancy Rate Report released by the Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ).

The REIQ report covers more than a decade of quarterly vacancy rates for 50 local government areas (LGAs) and sub regions in Queensland, with the March 2023 quarter showing sustained historically tight rental conditions and mostly minor fluctuations from the previous quarter.

Of the 50 regions, 11 remained at the same rate, 13 grew slightly tighter, while the majority of 26 relaxed slightly, indicating improved but still limited rental options.

This saw the state-wide vacancy rate rise marginally from 0.8 per cent in the December 2022 quarter, to 0.9 per cent in the March 2023 quarter, still well short of the ideal 2.6 - 3.5% healthy rate.

Interestingly, the vacancy rate climbed

slightly in most of Queensland's tourism centres and coastal regions. A standout was Noosa which shot up substantially from 1.2 per cent to 2.3 per cent, just shy of the healthy rate, while neighbouring Gympie region also rose from 0.7 per cent to 1.1 per cent.

Mount Isa tipped into a healthy 2.6 per cent rate for the first time since the onset of the pandemic, while Gladstone held the highest rate of the regional centres at 1.8 percent.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said while the March quarter results offered some rental market relief, most of the state was a long way off from being out of the woods.

"Queensland is still worlds away from a healthy rental market and a grossly insufficient level of housing supply is squarely to blame," Ms Mercorella said.

"When we're witnessing these very tight vacancy rates persisting right across the state, it's highlighting the importance of ensuring that we keep levels of property investment up so that we can maintain rooves over the heads of our growing population.

"We desperately need more rental properties but investors are not being encouraged to put their savings into property – on the contrary, often they're being deterred and punished."

Ms Mercorella said that despite the heavy reliance on private investors in the rental space, dangerous behaviour towards investors was continuing.

"Alarmingly, talk of rent control and imposing greater restrictions on the owners of rental properties is being touted as the solution to the rental crisis," she said.

"Making investment less appealing and demonising investors is not the right solution. We should be focussed on the underlying cause of the rental crisis and increasing housing supply, including social housing.

"Queensland spends the least per capita on social housing and even with the Housing Investment Fund it will only rise to second last. This under investment reached its nadir from 2015 onwards and has had a direct correlation with the crisis today.

"We're about to embark on the phase two rental reforms, and just as in phase one, the REIQ will be advocating strongly for fair and balanced residential tenancies legislation in Queensland that support all stakeholders involved in rental relationships," she said.

"It's a delicate balancing act making sure that the laws provide adequate protections for tenants and also that they allow a certain amount of flexibility and freedom to property owners to ensure that they are prepared to keep providing their property as a private rental."

BMD hauls historic church to new home at Iona College

The former Baptist Church located at 168 Bay Terrace in Wynnum Central has been safely relocated to its new home at Iona College in Lindum.

It marks a key milestone in Australia's largest privately owned civil contractor, the BMD Group's return to Wynnum to build its national headquarters in the heart of the bayside suburb.

Moving the more than 100-year-old structure was a significant task undertaken by a professional house remover and requiring a pilot driver, police escort and wide load approval.

The relocation involved staged delivery with the entries to the building removed and loaded on the first trailer, followed by the roof being lifted off the main building, and craned onto a second truck.

In the early hours of the morning, the

two trucks moved under escort from Bay Terrace to Iona College over a 4.5 kilometre commute which took four hours, while ensuring minimal disruption to the community.

The building is being reassembled in its new position at Iona College where over the coming months it will be restored and once again become a valued building for use within the school community.

BMD's CEO Scott Power said the relocation was a crucial milestone that made it possible for BMD to progress with construction of its new head office.

"BMD has deep history in the Wynnum Manly community, with my father Mick Power AM living in the area since he was two, then founding and growing our business in the suburb since 1979," Mr Power said. "The church is now at home at lona and will be restored to its former glory and brought back to life in service of the community," Father Michael said.

"It marks an important part of our community history being kept alive here at lona and we will be ensuring that it is lovingly brought back to life and to be enjoyed by the whole community for generations to come.

"The partnership between BMD and Iona is a long and personal one, and we give thanks to them for their commitment, vision and love of our local area. We feel blessed to be a part of this local area," Father Michael said.

The move isn't the first time the church has been moved. In 1930, it was moved from its original home on Edith Street to Bay Terrace and in the early 2000s the

BEHIND THE LENS: REDLANDS CAMERA CLUB PHOTOGRAPHER PROFILE

A lifetime love of natural history led me to begin recording in the late '70s what I saw through the medium of photography.

During the last 20 years, I have a developed a strong interest in pelagic (seabirds), not just those who frequent our shoreline, but those that spend almost their entire lives in the "Big Blue Paddock", only coming to land on some isolated island or remote shore to nest and continue the species.

The great Southern Ocean, that wild expanse of ocean between Australia and Antarctic continents, is home to an amazing array of seabirds – from the well-known Albatross species with wingspans of up to three metres, to the tiny Storm Petrel with wingspans measured in centimetres.

I had the privilege of traversing part of that Southern Ocean in 2018 and visited a number of islands situated therein. These islands are collectively known as the Subantarctic Islands of Australia and New Zealand.

But it wasn't just about birds. I also sought to understand the complex yet fragile ecology of this special place in our world. While man has exploited and nearly destroyed some of these fragile ecosystems in the past, the work and commitment of the Australian and New

Zealand governments recently in restoring these remote sanctuaries by removing the introduced species, is commended.

This is a win for the unique species that rely on these islands to breed.

The home to the species that live there, some temporarily, is a dangerous and harsh environment, but at times can show a beauty not seen elsewhere on our planet.

MORETON BAY IS SWIMMING WITH CUTTLEFISH THIS MONTH!

The cold has arrived, and so have the cuttlefish in big numbers! They are always so much fun to catch close to home.

This month, find the cuttlefish around the eastern side of Wellington Point and King and Green Islands. All you need is a whiting rod, a couple of squid jigs with some orange in the body, a ball sinker above, and a drift in the 20 to 28-ft mark. Drop the jig to the bottom, lift it about a foot off the bottom, and wait for the tug. But be aware you will miss lots of cuttlefish as they tend to take the jigs around the middle rather than from the back where the prongs are. It's still fun, anyway. You can try the razorback squid jigs with prongs on their backs, but I tend to use my all-time favourites like the Daiwa nude in the prawn pattern in red and orange and the Yamashita pilchard colours (the macula red works as well).

If you don't like Indian ink on your boat, 'cuttlefishing' is not for you! Their ink is ten times thicker than squid ink, and they hold water in to be able to squirt much longer than squid, so be prepared. A long net helps rather than a short one near the boat, and the best tip I can give you is the 30-second mould cleaner from Bunnings. It gets the ink off in seconds and is the best thing I discovered many years ago.

The arrow squid should also turn up in the same area but in the shallows. The tiger squid is in good numbers since the water was cleaned up last month; they are fun to catch, as you can see them coming to get the jig.

So put on a shirt you don't mind getting inked, have a bottle of 30-second cleaner handy, and get out there and get a few cephalopods. They're one of the tastiest treats from the sea, and they are right at our doorstep.

In a scoop net, I picked up a fully formed cuttlefish smaller than a five-cent piece. It was fully formed with all the patterns, and I found it fascinating.

Till next month, good fishing, and be careful with westerly winds. For weekly

WYNNUM ARTIST A FINALIST IN NATIONAL ART PRIZE

Jo Higgins, a Wynnum Artist, winner of the 2019 Wynnum Manly Yacht Club art competition and supply school teacher at Redlands Christian College, was selected as one of only 38 finalists nationwide for the annual Gallipoli Memorial Club's Gallipoli \$20,000 art prize in Sydney.

The Gallipoli Memorial Club (www.gallipoli.com.au) was started by a group of Gallipoli veterans in 1916. The art prize was announced in 2005 by then Prime Minister John Howard and is open to artists in Australia, New Zealand and Turkey. An equivalent annual art competition is also held in Turkey.

Art pieces are selected and judged against the club's creed, "to preserve the special qualities of loyalty, respect, love of Country, courage and comradeship which were personified by the heroes of the Gallipoli campaign and bequeathed to all humanity as a foundation of perpetual peace and universal freedom".

Jo's painting is entitled "If a Tree could Talk".

"When I walk past the descendant of the original Lone Pine at the school's entrance, I imagine what that tree would have witnessed as the battle loomed and thought...if only it could have warned our brave troops of what lay waiting," explained Jo.

"For me, that tree represents a silent voice that keeps the past ever present. Like many Australians, I had family who served in Gallipoli, Egypt and France in WW1, so Anzac Day is important to me and my family. I was thrilled to be selected as part of this remembrance."

SLOW COOKED OCTOPUS IN TOMATO SAUCE PASTA RECIPE

FROM SPERO KARTANOS

Check out this deliciously simple recipe from local fisherman Spero Kartanos, who knows his seafood! It's a dish that highlights the fresh octopus, with a focus on flavour and minimal ingredients, cooked low and slow.

INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 cup of olive oil
- 1 small onion, brown or white, chopped
- 6 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1kg of small, cleaned octopus (or squid)
- 400g tomato pulp/tinned tomatoes
- 300ml red wine
- 2 tbsp tomato paste

- 4 bay leaves fresh or dried
- A handful of freshly chopped parsley
- 1 tsp chilli flakes (optional)
- Salt and pepper to season
- Additional chopped parsley to garnish
- Cooked pasta (you choose the type) to serve

METHOD

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large heavy-based pot, like a Dutch oven or a heavy casserole dish.
- 2. Add the garlic and onion and stir gently over a medium heat for a few minutes, then add the octopus to the pot, along with the tomatoes, red wine, parsley, tomato paste, bay leaves and chilli (if using).
- 3. Cook on a very low heat, covered, for 1.5 to 2 hours, stirring occasionally, until the octopus/squid is tender. Smaller squid will take less time to cook.
- 4. Once the octopus is tender, season with salt and pepper, then serve over pasta and garnish with chopped parsley.



Latest news from the Port of Brisbane June 2023



Trade

At the end of April, the Port's year-to-date tonnages for bulk seed and grain exports reached 2.2 million tonnes, surpassing the record volumes achieved for the full FY22 year of 2.03 million tonnes.

Wheat has been the dominate commodity again this year with over 1.5 million tonnes exported to 15 different countries. Year-todate sorghum tonnages have also surpassed FY22 volumes with just under 500,000 tonnes recorded, the majority shipped to China.

It is pleasing to see our world-class exporters achieving such high volumes with favourable growing conditions.

Community

Over 60 applications were received from community and not-for-profit groups across the Bayside, Brisbane and SEQ region for our annual \$100,000 Community Grant Program. All applicants will be notified of the outcome in July.

We held our annual National Reconciliation Week event for the port community on Wednesday 31 May to recognise Australia's Indigenous culture and reconciliation journey.

Our people rolled up their sleeves for National Volunteer Week in May to support our community partners. 26 employees completed 216 hours of volunteer work to support The Smith Family, Drought Angels and the Moreton Bay Environmental Education Centre.

The Brisbane International Cruise Terminal celebrated its first 12 months of operation on Friday 2 June! Since opening, the BICT has welcomed 138 vessels with almost 650,000 passengers travelling through the facility. It's also provided a much-needed economic boost post-COVID, with every ship visit contributing almost \$1 million to the Queensland economy.

The cruise season starts in October every year. And with 195 vessels currently scheduled to call at the BICT for the 2023/24 cruise season, the future of cruising in Brisbane is bright!

OUR LOST PLACES: BISHOP ISLAND'S GLAMOROUS PAST

FROM THE WYNNUM MANLY HISTORICAL SOCIETY INC.

Moreton Bay Settlement was set up in 1824 to house convicts, those second-time offenders from Sydney. Until free settlement was allowed in 1842, the government of New South Wales did little to improve navigation of the Brisbane River. There was a sand/mud bar across the river entrance, a rocky bar near Lytton and heavy shoals in the Hamilton Reach.

Free settlers arrived in 1842. Ships were moored in Moreton Bay. Only shallow-drafted lighters could enter the mouth of the river at high tide. One hundred pounds (£100) was reserved in the supplementary estimates of New South Wales for a proper survey of the river aiming to remove any natural object that impeded navigation. However, no work was attempted until after the separation of Queensland from New South Wales in 1859.

The first channel – the "West or Francis Channel" – ran due northwards from the river mouth following the floor of a creek bed. Captain Thomas Francis used the dredge "Lytton" to excavate the channel. The second "Old Bar Cutting" or "Koopa Channel", completed in 1883, was much straighter, easier to navigate and could accommodate larger vessels.

Building of the third and final cutting, accommodating even larger vessels, commenced in 1908 and was completed by 1912. This is the "Bar Cutting", formed by the dredge, "Hercules", captained by Captain Bishop.

Captain Alan Fitzroy Bishop (1857 – 1950) was born in the County of Essex, England. His father, Francis William, was a Merchants' Clerk, and his grandfather was Mayor of Colchester for seven years. Alan lived in a large house, and his ambition was to become a soldier. Family fortunes changed. The family moved to London and lived with their grandparents. Money was short, and Alan found a clerical job in Cheapside. High spirits and mischievous ways brought about his dismissal. At fourteen years of age, he signed up as an apprentice for four years on the barque "Pacific". The cargo was carried around the world.

Alan spent much time travelling between the Australian and New Zealand coast ports until he was attracted by the lure of the North Queensland goldfields, but with little success.

After positions on the vessels sailing from Flying Fish Point, Dungeness, Keppel Bay and Curtis Island, he reached the Brisbane River in the early 1890s. He became the dredge master of the "Sampson", and his early work involved laying the dredged material from the Brisbane River onto the northern bank area, now occupied by the Royal Queensland Golf Course.

But the mouth of the river was still shallow and precarious for shipping. So in 1909 the "Bar Cutting" was excavated using the dredge "Hercules". The spoil was dumped on a small sandbank to the southern side of the river mouth.

By 1912 an artificial island had grown 10 - 12 feet (2 metres) above high water and 32 acres (17 hectares) in size. First known as "Hercules Bank", then "Dredge Island", the final gazetted name was "Bishop Island". Soon vegetation appeared.

Stripped of their sellable parts, hulks were sunk on the island's western side to prevent erosion. The SS Bingera in 1926, and Qld Government's steam yacht, Lucinda in 1937, were amongst the 15 wrecks dumped there.

In the 1930s, Jim Crouch from Bulimba leased the island and floated buildings down the river – a kiosk, a house and a dance pavilion to develop his "pleasure island".

Bishop Island had fulfilled Captain Bishop's dream of becoming a "pleasure resort". Private boats and tourist operators visited for public events, such as sand garden competitions, carnivals and treasure hunts. Jim Crouch purchased "The Gippsland" from Sydney (NSW) to transport people.

In October 1950, Bishop Island was found to be eroding, and the centre was sinking. A wall was constructed using rock from the Kangaroo Point quarry. The Port of Brisbane used the island since 1976. As the Port reclaimed land in early 2000, Bishop Island became part of the mainland. The island is no more.

A bridge linking Whyte Island and Fisherman Islands was dedicated to the memory of Captain Bishop in 2000. A second Captain Bishop bridge has been added to cope with the daily traffic to and from the port.




