ORMISTON COLLEGE STUDENTS UNDERGO CLIP FOR A CURE

For almost a decade, Year 12 girls at Ormiston College have donated their hair for wigs to help those with hair loss from cancer treatment. The Chop, as the annual fundraiser is known, has collected over \$100,000 in donations for Mater Chicks in Pink, supporting women living with breast cancer, since the inaugural campaign in 2015.



Cognisant of men's health issues and inspired by their female peers, the Year 12 boys at Ormiston College sought to initiate their own fundraising campaign and have launched The Clip in support of the Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia this year. Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia, and it is estimated that one in six males will be diagnosed by the time they are 85.

On Wednesday, 7 June 2023, 17 students gathered, having a buzz cut and raising \$12,000 in funds for prostate cancer research, awareness and support services. Hair clippings will be donated to Sustainable Salons and used to create hair booms to help rid our oceans of oil spills that endanger bird and marine life.

The Ormiston College Service Leadership Committee, who coordinated the initiative, warmly welcomed Jason Castle, community engagement manager for the Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia, to the event to receive the cheque for \$12,000 on behalf of the foundation.

IT'S ALL IN THE TEXTURE OF THE TEXTILE...

An exhibition of textile art pieces and an introduction to creating beauty out of fabric and thread will be featured at the Redland Art Gallery in July.

Connected by Thread is a celebration of the SmartArts Creative Textile group's 20th anniversary. The current collective grew from an original group of three, each of whom had won prizes in a challenge at Bayside Stitchcraft at Ross Court, Cleveland. This grew into a more structured group of seven and membership now stands at nearly twenty.



The exhibition, which will run from 15th July to 5th September, comprises 18 works; at least one entry from each of the group members and two collaborative works to which each artist has contributed a separate component. Marj Long, a member of SmartArts, says that one of the collaborative works is a display of each member's self-portrait.

"The portraits will be hung close together, all the same size but totally different applications," she says. "The other collaborative work is a grouping of more than four hundred Artist Trading Cards (ATCs) that form the number twenty for our anniversary. ATCs are only 64mm x 89mm; they are usually textile based and include many different techniques and themes. We hope both collaborative displays will be of interest to visitors."

The crafts incorporated in the artworks include collage, 3D creations, batik and eco-dying, embroidery, appliqué, beading, free machine stitching/thread painting, lace making and felting. For those who find the various techniques enticing – but baffling – a participatory workshop will be held on July 20th, when some of the arcane mysteries will be unfolded for participants.

Each participant will be given a kit to work with then guided through the various creative techniques. Lynne Williams, one of the three original members, will give a floor talk after the workshop.

Note: the workshop is fully booked but the gallery is running a wait list for late applications.



COMMUNITY UPDATE

COST OF LIVING RELIEF ON ITS WAY!

At the heart of this year's budget is providing national cost of living pressures relief that is impacting Queensland families. It is the largest household relief package anywhere in the nation. Queenslanders will pay less for electricity in 2023-24, with households receiving one of the following: a \$550 Cost of Living Rebate on electricity bills for all other Queensland households OR a \$700 Cost of Living Rebate on electricity bills for vulnerable households, plus a further \$372 under the Queensland Electricity Rebate Scheme, bringing total rebates to \$1,072. \$80M MORE FOR **CLEVELAND REDLAND BAY ROAD**

In exciting news, last week's budget secured a further \$80M to continue the duplication of Cleveland Redland Bay Road from Anita Street to Giles Road Redland Bay in Stage Two of the road plans. This builds on the construction work that is underway for the Stage One \$110M duplication from Magnolia Parade, Victoria Point to Anita Street. There are a lot of road works underway right across the Redlands, so thank you to locals for their patience while these important projects are being delivered and for the disruptions they cause.





REDLAND HOSPITAL **CONTINUING TO EXPAND**

Healthcare for Queenslanders is at the centre of our budget in new hospital infrastructure and more nurses, doctors and allied healthcare staff. Our Redland Hospital Stage 2 Expansion will kick off with a \$150M investment in a new mental health facility. With the old carpark and demolition of the existing mental health facility, we will unlock the front of the hospital site for more new buildings. ADCO Constructions is underway on work for the \$62M Redland Hospital Stage 1 Expansion that includes 37 new beds and ICU. We've also got Hutchinson Builders going gangbusters on the \$25M new 28 bed ward. This investment will see an increase of 40% in bed capacity at Redland Hospital.

FREE KINDY FOR LITTLE REDLANDERS

We're making kindergarten free for all Queensland families from 1 January 2024. We want to make sure all our little ones get the best possible start to learning! This \$645M investment will help every Queensland child get a great start and support parents in returning to work. Free kindergarten is set to save families around \$4,600 per year, putting money back in family's pockets where it's needed. And at Russell Island State School we're delivering Kindy in the School and we're supporting Bay Island Early Learning on Macleay Island to deliver programs for our little ones on islands too.







ALL ABOUT ARTHRITIS IN CATS AND DOGS

Arthritis is a degenerative disease which causes inflammation of the joints. Approximately 25% of dogs are diagnosed with arthritis in their lifetime with as many as 60% showing changes on x-rays. In one study a huge 90% of cats over the age of 12 years showed radiographic signs of arthritis.

TYPES OF ARTHRITIS

There are two forms of arthritis – primary and secondary. Primary arthritis is due to ageing - years of wear and tear on the joints. Secondary arthritis is the result of an external event or force on joints - injury or conformation (poor joint alignment) which have damaged the joint cartilage. There are also some immune conditions which cause arthritis.





cure. The goals of treatment are to relieve the pain and discomfort associated with the condition, minimizing further joint damage and degeneration and restoring the functionality of joints as much as There are a number of factors involved in treatment including:

- Managing weight your vet may recommend a weight loss diet for your pet as overweight animals put more strain on their joints.
- Maintaining an appropriate exercise program - low impact exercise such as gentle leash walks or swimming to keep joints moving.
- Joint supplements to support healthy cartilage there are a range of different products with ingredients such as polysulphated glycoaminoglycans, glucosamine and chondroitin sulfate.

Hearing Loss and Dementia – The Link Explained

As a Masters Qualified Audiologist and founder of A Better Ear, I'm passionate about helping people maintain good hearing health. Today, I'd like to discuss an important topic: the link between hearing loss and dementia, and how early intervention can make a difference.

According to the Lancet Commission's 2020 report on dementia prevention, intervention, and care, hearing aids can have a protective effect against developing dementia. While 60% of dementia cases occur regardless of lifestyle changes, the remaining 40% can be influenced by modifiable risk factors, with hearing loss being the most significant. Yes, you read that right!

On average, it takes people up to ten years from when they first notice their hearing loss to when they decide to seek assistance. The Lancet report highlights the importance of early intervention, as hearing aids can have a protective effect against late-life onset dementia. Receiving a timely diagnosis and treatment can better prepare individuals for hearing rehabilitation and allow them to consider the impact of hearing loss on their lives.

Untreated hearing loss can lead to reduced social connectedness, increased feelings of isolation, frustration, and depression. Loss of social support and integration are high-risk factors for early mortality, even more so than smoking or heavy drinking. Each day begins in a warm and welcoming environment, with each classroom forming its own mini-community within our small Coolnwynpin team. We are very proud of our most recent grant of \$20,000 to increase the tree canopy for wildlife as part of the Queen's Jubilee project.

We value the very close relationships we have with students, parents, families and staff. We are all working for the same goal; to secure the best education for every student. These positive relationships and community partnerships promote a connection to our local area that is unique. A serious culture of improvement and lifelong learning exists across our whole school. When I walk into each room I am delighted to hear and see that students are learning and having fun.

COOLY AND THE COOL KIDS

Our Coolnwynpin Koala helps with behaviour and social skills. Standing at 7 feet high, Cooly is a big piece of the fun at our school. We celebrate Cooly's birthday every year on



May 3rd, which happens to coincide with International Koala Day. Cooly is in charge of posting home our school postcards that promote our rules and reward excellent behaviour. You can't keep a good koala down and he is a favourite on our Facebook page. Cooly is the star of our book about leaving Kindy and coming to Prep that is available for all Redland Early Childhood Education Centres.

At Coolnwynpin State School we develop our Prep students to have a love of learning, appreciate the environment and a deep understanding of who they are. We use their inquisitive qualities to enhance important life skills by working, playing and investigating together. Our Preps think and solve problems to become independent, using oral language, physical skills and early learning behaviours through play. This is the grounding they need to be successful students in later years.

We are in the final stages of enrolling students into Prep for 2024. If your child is born between July 1st 2018 and June 30th 2019 they can begin Prep with us next year. Parents and caregivers who have not yet enrolled should contact us on 3906 4333 immediately to ensure a placement.

STRONG EXPERIENCED LEADERSHIP

The Leadership Team at Coolnwynpin is diverse and very experienced. With over 100 years of combined teaching and leadership experience in state schools across Queensland, our team is united and determined to work supportively with our staff, families, community and students to promote positivity and excellence.



OUR GREEN CREDENTIALS

The LED school sign on Ney Road is made from recycled aluminium and 100% powered by solar energy. This sign is the first of it's kind in Queensland and it means that there is no cost to the environment in the day-to-day promotion of our school.

Chickens are our waste reduction super heroes. We have a flock of chickens, and while they support students who need help with regulation, they also reduce our waste. Every left-over crust and apple core goes down to the girls who happily turn them into eggs. We also have composting facilities for things that chickens are not allowed to eat.

The Coolnwynpin Orchard has over 40 fruit trees. 20 citrus varieties that allow us to produce oranges, mandarins, limes and lemons for 8 months of the year. On top of this are olives, apples, feijoa, macadamia, mulberry, custard apples, pomegranate, avocados, bananas and more. Our students learn that fruit doesn't come from Aisle 1 — it grows on trees. This is a huge life lesson. Watering the garden is also a highly therapeutic activity and supports students, parents and staff who volunteer.



Native bees live in a hive hidden within the bush tucker garden. Year 1 are the official bee keepers and have embedded our stingless friends into their scientific learning.

We have two species of wallaby that live on site, microbats, possums, koala and a wide variety of birdlife that nest in the grounds.

The Donald Simpson Centre, in Bloomfield Street Cleveland, has been assessed as providing \$2,026,587 in value to the Redlands community in 2022.

"This is calculated by Neighbourhood Centres Queensland using a method devised by Deloitte Access Economics and using data on operational aspects provided by the centre," explained Board Chairman Tony Christinson.

Mr Christinson said that this value was largely based on 250 hours per week contributed by volunteers.

"Volunteers are the backbone of our centre, making it possible for us to contribute to the quality of life of members and visitors through social connections and managing social isolation," he said. Centre Chief Executive Officer, Thomas Jithin, said, "During 2022, our visiting numbers were still growing after reductions that occurred during the Covid period, but numbers have grown significantly in 2023".

The Donald Simpson Centre was purpose-built in 1987 as a centre for seniors using funds from three levels of government and community fundraising. It is currently unfunded and operates on its own resources.

The centre has over 2000 members and supports over 40 activities, theatrical shows, educational and other entertainment events, and its popular cafeteria.

Interest rate rises: burden the young, boost the old

The Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) says extraordinary data released by PEXA showing one in four property sales in the eastern states last year were mortgage free, indicates interest rate rises are impacting younger Australians the most.

"The Federal and State Governments now need to engage in the heavy lifting to assist the RBA with inflation control, otherwise we may see a generation locked out of home ownership permanently."

SWITCH ON TO SCIENCE AT REDLAND MUSEUM!

FROM REDLAND MUSEUM

With spy technology taking centre stage in the media Switch on to Science, held at the Redland Museum in conjunction with National Science Week, is sure to be of interest.

Switch on to Science is an annual event where museum volunteers operate and demonstrate a wide variety of working vintage equipment and talk about the science and technology principles that make them work. An introduction to radio communications, including amateur radio and the workings of crystal sets — the earliest form of radio receivers — will be part of the day's activities.

Participants will learn Morse code, play with the oldest telephones and switchboards and be taught to send messages on a telegraph machine.

The museum's science coordinator, Ross Bower, says the simplicity of early machines is an ideal introduction to later, more sophisticated technology.

"Working vintage machines are perfect for demonstrating the basic principle of science because they are much simpler than modern machines, and it is easier to understand how they function," he says. "Also, they are lots of fun to watch and to play with. Everyone will be encouraged to try operating the old equipment and to explore the development of technology over the years. The aim is simply to learn while having fun, to challenge the curious of all ages and get people to think about the science in our everyday surroundings."

Ross says that while intended mainly for young people, Switch on to Science will offer plenty to interest and entertain parents and grandparents — and for some it will revive memories of long-gone technology and the wonder it generated.

As well as the communications aspect of science visitors will see what kitchens were like 100 years ago, learn how clothes were washed before machines, buy lollies at an old style lolly shop, use a treadle sewing machine, make a scarf on a knitting machine, try their hand at spinning wool, learn to write with a slate and a copybook, operate a 100-year old silent movie projector, play music on a music box and a player piano, see germs under a microscope, play with windup toys, make their own rope, churn butter from cream, and much, much more.

Switch on to Science will be held from 10:00am to 2:00pm on Monday

CHARLOTTE CARTER



DICK CIJFFERS JOURNEYS ON

The Redlands has lost one of its most colourful characters with the recent death of Dick Cijffers. A life-long adventurer and travel agent, what Dick didn't know about travel probably hasn't been discovered yet and there are many people whose most memorable holidays were advised and arranged by Dick.

Dick had a truly remarkable life and career, one that he built from scratch through his unwavering passion for travel and adventure. He grew up and was educated in South Africa before travelling to the UK at the age of 21, where he found his calling in the travel industry as a Tour Leader with Penn Overland and Trafalgar Tours. After escorting 12 tours from London to Kathmandu, he founded his own tour company, Capricorn Overland Tours, based in London.

Dick emigrated to Australia in 1987 and settled in Queensland, where he formed Journeys Worldwide and managed the company for over 30 years.

Dick was also a prominent media figure, cohosting hugely popular talk back radio shows on 612 4QR (ABC), 4BC and Bay FM. His deep love and knowledge for Southern Africa, India, Sri Lanka and travel in general were also recognised when he became a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society in London in 1977.

Dick's weekly half-hour talkback show on 612 4QR was a front-line favourite with listeners and it was usual for the switchboard to be jammed with waiting callers well before his 11.30am start time. His knowledge was encyclopaedic. One caller wanted to go skiing in India; Dick was not only

able to supply her with ski lodge options but also with information about which lodges hired ski gear. His skill at negotiating difficult overseas political barriers was legend and his store of anecdotes — some, sadly, not suitable for broadcast — was inexhaustible. His zebra-striped car was unforgettable and some will recall his occasional escapade of dressing up in a gorilla costume and handing out brochures on the streets of Brisbane

Dick will be remembered fondly by his family, friends, listeners and clients, for his wonderful personality and his dedicated service to the travel industry and the many unforgettable journeys he helped create. He was certainly always up for an adventure and his legacy will be felt for many years to come. Thoughts are with Dick's family and loved ones at this difficult time.

Many elderly live on their own but have the desire to be independent and not call on their friends or relatives to drive them. By using community transport services like STAR, they are able to maintain their independence. They feel they are not inconveniencing anyone. Not only do I drive them to their doctor's appointments, but I also take them to the shops, to the hairdresser, swimming pool, or even to have a coffee with a friend. They truly enjoy their outings. It keeps them connected to their friends and family.

What does preparation for your volunteer role require?

Since I drive my own vehicle, I need to make sure my car is meeting all of STAR's safety regulations. For example, it needs to be less than 10 years old, regularly serviced etc. As a driver, I complete CPR training every year and First Aid training every couple of years. Thankfully, STAR looks after all the cost and organisation of all the training for all the drivers. I also get reimbursed for the mileage as per the ATO rate.

BIRKDALE HALL – BREATHING LIFE INTO THE PAST

Eighty years ago, on the 14th August 1943, the Birkdale School of Arts Hall was declared the first permanent Australian Women's Land Army camp in the Redlands. The date will be celebrated on Sunday 13th August with a discussion forum revisiting *The Other Diggers*.

The Other Diggers, a stage play about the Australian Women's Land Army, recently completed a highly successful run at Redland Museum. An imagined glimpse of two years in the lives of a team of Land Army girls, the production generated such a level of enthusiasm and interest that Theatre Redlands has decided to hold a public forum about the Land Army, the play and its background — appropriately, at the Birkdale Hall. Writer Jan Nary said that the story was a significant strand of women's history that had been allowed to fade from history.

"Just like the Australian women suffragists, the Land Army women have a story that very few people know," she says. "The almost universal response has been; why aren't we taught this?"

Jan says the play is a work in progress and that there is probably more information that is waiting to be found.

"Researching this show has brought two wonderful women to us, former Land Army women who are keepers of stories and memories that must be preserved. Auria Nixon and Elsie Stiller are in their nineties but they've both shared with us a wealth of narrative that is archival gold. If there is more to collect, out there in the Redlands, we want to gather it up. We're hopeful that this forum will provide an opportunity."

Facilitated by Cr. Paul Bishop, the afternoon will feature extracts from *The Other Diggers* and talks from people involved in various Land Army projects, including ABC TV's *Landline's* Courtney Wilson; author Pamela Rushby; Lorraine Newton and Judith Butler (both keepers of their individual mother's Land Army records) and Jan Nary.

The forum will also present an opportunity to collect local information relevant to the Redlands and the end of WW2, especially from those who worked in communications and coding, radar and local centres such as Willard's Farm.

Australia's Biggest Morning Tea is held throughout Australia each year and is the Cancer Council Australia's most popular and successful fundraising event for cancer research.





REVISITING THE LAND; A LAND VETERAN'S MEMORIES

For Elsie Stiller, attending a stage play about the Australian Women's Land Army was a trip down memory lane. Elsie, who is 96, was a VIP at The Other Diggers, presented by Theatre Redlands and the Redland Museum.

Elsie was 17 when she joined the Land Army in 1943. She had grown up in a rural township near Miles, 300km west of Brisbane, left school at the age of 12 and worked on neighbouring properties as a domestic help and farm hand

"My younger sister Jean and I went out to work — a bit of everything — then this Land Army work turned up. My friend Mona asked Jean and I if we would join up with her and Mum said; 'Alright, you can go for twelve months — and behave yourselves.' So off we went to Chinchilla and signed up."

In a few months letters of acceptance arrived and the trio were on a train to their first placement at Stanthorpe, living in tents with 12 other Land Army girls. Elsie remembers their supervisor, Matron Maddox. "We were governed; she was stern – 12 teenage girls, she had to be!"

Elsie worked in a variety of places with a variety of produce.

"Stanthorpe was fruit," Elsie recalls. "We had to harvest the fruit – pears and apples and peaches – grade them and pack them into the crates that we'd made – at the cost of many black fingernails. We could eat at much of the fruit as we wanted – delicious! Jean was picking vegetables.

"At Callide and Wowan it was cotton – them there cotton fields! – where they paid threepence a pound. Mona was the 'top picker' making $\mathfrak E8$ in one week. The most I was paid was $\mathfrak E7$. I'd had experience picking cotton for our neighbours but some of the city girls didn't like it; it was backbreaking work and really hard on your fingers.

"After Wowan it was off to Woombye for more vegetables and fruit work. We trudged up and down the hill twice a day but the bosses were lovely and we stayed in their house."

There was a light side to the experience; weekly letters home to the family, books to read in the evening and singing on the truck rides (the parody It's the Wrong Way to Tickle Mary was a favourite) to the weekend dances, where Elsie first learned to dance.

"I enjoyed dancing but disappointingly, some of the boys were too drunk to dance properly – but I knew how to handle them," Elsie grins.

At the end of a year, as promised, she and Jean returned to the family home but they were offered a job at a Toowoomba rest home where Elsie worked for five years until she returned to her home town as a married woman.

Elsie's delight in seeing the play was equalled by the universal delight of everyone at having her there. Kya Munro, the youngest cast member who plays the role of 16-year-old Elspeth, presented Elsie with flowers. Elsie recalls the Land Army time with real fondness.

"It was all hard work but I really enjoyed it."

A BUMPER SNAPPER/SQUIRE SEASON IS HERE!

July is an excellent time of the year for fishing in the bay, but I have to admit I'm not too fond of the cold mornings, and I'm so happy the fish are on the bite all day in Moreton Bay. When I was young, my father would get me up at 3am to go fishing in Victoria, on a jetty, a rock wall, or on his homemade boat. That experience turned me off early morning fishing for life, and I also had to recite the times' tables on the way there.

So wait until the sun rises to go fishing! The whiting in July are usually in the Rous Channel on the Maroon side, as are the school mackerel. While fishing for whiting, a floating pillie at the back is a good way to get a mackerel. Also, try the Rainbow Channel around the Amity area — this time last year, they were thick in the water, and judging by the small ones around in May, I think it will be a good season again.

Cuttlefish and arrow squid will be along the deeper water east from Ormiston all the way to St Helena, mixed in with plenty of arrow squid. Drop a ball sinker on top of a jig a few feet off the bottom while drifting, and you should catch some.

The snapper/squire season has been great so far, and July should be the pick of the months. The Bay Island drop-offs and the artificial reefs in the bay are worth a try. Big bait or live small fish are the best for the snapper, whiting heads being my favourite.

So, keep your winter woollies on until the sun rises, and again, be careful and stay safe in the strong westerly winds in the bay when they arrive.

CLASSIC HOMEMADE PEA AND HAM SOUP RECIPE

When it comes to warming winter comfort food that goes a long way, you can't beat a fresh pot of pea and ham soup on a chilly day.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups of dried green split peas
- 500-750g smoked ham hock or meaty ham bone
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 medium carrots, peeled and diced
- · 2 celery stalks, diced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced with a garlic crusher or the back of a knife
- 8 cups of chicken stock

- 2 bay leaves, fresh or dried
- 1 tsp dried thyme
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- · 2 small potatoes, sliced in half
- Freshly chopped parsley to garnish and crusty bread to serve

METHOD

- 1. Rinse your split peas in water, drain, then set aside for later.
- In a large pot, heat the olive oil over medium heat then add the chopped onion, carrots, celery, and minced garlic. Sauté until all ingredients are soft and tender, for about five to seven minutes.
- 3. Add the ham hock or bone to your pot, then add the chicken stock and bring to a simmer.
- Once simmering, turn the heat down to low and add the split peas, bay leaves, potatoes and thyme, then stir to combine.
- Cover and simmer for one to two hours, until the split peas are soft (mushy peas are good!) and the meat falling off the ham bone.
- Take the ham hock or bone out of the pot and let it cool, slightly. Remove the meat from the bone and chop it up, then put it back in the pot.
- 7. Season with salt and pepper to taste, and your soup is now ready to eat!

Note: If the soup is too thick, you can add more stock or water to thin it out. This is more likely to happen with left-overs — be prepared for your soup to thicken in the fridge once it cools!

It is important to have a fund that matches what is important to you, and is consistent with how you feel you want to invest your savings.

There's rules and benefits to superannuation. Remember: the purpose of superannuation is to provide for retirement, so the primary rules are that you cannot access or use the funds for yourself until after you do retire. The benefits are that you get taxed less on superannuation investments than you do by investing personally depending on what your personal tax rate is. Once you retire, there may be zero to pay on superannuation investments.

That's right – superannuation is the only legal tax-free investment structure available in Australia.
