#### How about a creative challenge - are you up for it?

Art My Word is a fundraiser for the Macleay Island Community Library that has evolved into a celebration of art, storytelling and community.

The Art My Word Experience is now in its third year and hosts three creative components: Art My Word for visual artists, Art My Story for writers, and Art My Photo for photographers.

Art My Word for 2D and 3D artists is now open for visual artists to participate. Each registering artist will receive a 'lucky dip' book, no longer in circulation at the library. ## CHICKS IN THE STICKS: AN EVENT FOR ADVENTUROUS WOMEN OF ALL AGES

The most popular women's mountain biking event in Australia, Chicks in the Sticks, will return this year to Karingal Scout Camp at Mt Cotton on 20 August.

Women of all ages and mountain biking capabilities will hit up the specially-created trails at Karingal Scout Camp in a colourful and plucky celebration of adventure-loving women.

The racing chicks often get dressed up in crazy costumes to ride, chat, eat, drink and even camp overnight in beautiful surroundings and a supportive atmosphere.

Run by the local and largest mountain biking club in Australia, RATS, the event has drawn in hundreds of women each year since the event's inception in 2015. RATS also has the largest membership of women of any mountain biking club in Australia.

RATS President, Lonnie Toia, said that the event has been so successful because it allows a diverse group of adventurous and spirited women to 'spread their wings', even if they are 'coming out of their shells' for the first time.

"Some of the chicks who attend Chicks in the Sticks are racing more seriously, while others are having fun in teams or as individuals and are socialising and drinking coffee in between laps

"There's no pressure to race hard; the aim of this fun event is to build confidence and have a lot of fun in the dirt whether you're new to the sport or an old hand," he said.

"And I think that's why it has been the biggest female mountain biking event in Australia for a long time. It's totally inclusive of women from all backgrounds and is also a great day out for the whole family."

The event has multiple race categories with different race lengths and difficulties, including:

- Chicken Run (A Grade/experienced individuals)
- Free Range (B Grade/confident riders individuals)
- Have a Crack (Newly-hatched MTB individual riders)
- Queens of the Coop (optional 50 and above individual riders)
- Battery Hens (individual E-bike riders)
- Clipped Wings (for brave, single-speed individuals)
- Hard-Boiled Double Yolkers (experienced teams of two, relay style)
- Soft-Boiled Double Yolkers (newly-hatched teams of two, relay style)
- Junior Double Yolkers (11-15 year of teams of two)
- Chicken Nuggets (5-10 years, 20-minute modified course)
- Chick-a-Dees (10-15 years, 30-minute enduro modified course)

Mr Toia said the race is even more remarkable because it is run by a group of volunteers who put in lots of time to make sure women are encouraged to participate in a lesser-known, but incredibly fun and rewarding sport.

"It's amazing how many women feedback about how this sport has helped change their lives, gave them confidence, helped them meet other great women and got them back into nature and a healthy lifestyle. We'd like more women to experience the benefits of mountain biking and this event is a great way to encourage that," he said.

#### **ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR CONCESSIONS?**

Around 2,889 eligible Redlanders are yet to claim the increased concession energy rebate of \$1,072. Have you checked with your energy supplier? At the heart of this year's budget is providing national cost of living pressures relief that is impacting Queensland families. Queenslanders will pay less for electricity in 2023–24, with households now receiving on their bills one of the following: a \$550 Cost of Living Rebate on electricity bills for all other Queensland households OR a \$700 Cost of Living Rebate on electricity bills for vulnerable households, plus a further \$372 under the Queensland Electricity Rebate Scheme, bringing total rebates to \$1,072. 








What was the last book you read? I, Alex Cross by James Patterson. Highly recommended, a really good crime thriller.


The last TV show or movie you watched? The Defendants, an excellent serialised drama about the use and misuse of power at the highest level in different countries.

## **ALL ABOUT EAR INFECTIONS IN DOGS**

Ear infections are extremely common in dogs. The most common signs of an ear infection are head shaking, ear scratching, odour and discharge from the ear canals and red, inflamed skin in the ear canal.

#### **CAUSES OF EAR INFECTION**

There are a number of causes of ear infections. These include:

- The shape of the ear and ear canal dogs with lots of fur in their ear canals (e.g. Poodles and Poodle crosses, Schnauzers), dogs with heavy, long ears (e.g. Cocker Spaniels, Cavalier King Charles Spaniels) or very narrow ear canals (e.g. Shar Peis, French bulldogs, Pugs) predispose dogs to infection.
- Allergies are a very common cause of ear infections inflamed, itchy skin lining the ear canal is more readily infected with secondary bacteria or yeasts. Allergies may be environmental (such as pollens, moulds, grass) or food related.
- Environmental conditions can predispose to infections hot, humid weather provides a perfect environment for ear infections.

#### TREATMENT

Treatment of ear infections includes addressing both the initiating cause and resolving secondary infections.

- If your dog has furry ears it may be useful to pluck the fur from the canals.
- Your vet may suggest cleaning your dog's
   ears under sedation or anaesthetic to remove discharge. This
   also allows a more thorough examination of the ear canal and
   assessment of the health of the ear drum.
- Medication may be dispensed based on the infectious organisms (yeast and bacteria most commonly) present. Your vet can take a sample from your dog's ear and examine the material under a microscope.
- Controlling itch and inflammation is important to prevent further irritation and self-trauma.






#### **PREVENTION**

- Regular ear flushing with an appropriate product can reduce discharge and decrease the risk of secondary infection.
- Controlling allergies can be useful in reducing the frequency of ear infections. There are good options in both tablet and injectable form for ongoing allergy relief — have a chat with your vet to decide the best plan for your dog.

## THE SOUND OF WAVES BY THE BAYSIDE

My understanding of sound transmission pretty well stops at two jam tins on a tightly-stretched length of string, so having a conversation with someone whose passion is communicating through invisible airwaves was bound to be educational.

Ralf Finke is the President of the Bayside District Amateur Radio Society Inc. (BDARS), a Redland-based organisation that boasts a membership of about 80, regular coffee and club meetings, radio connection competitions and training to certification level for the interested but — like me — uninformed.

Ralf says that while amateur radio seems to be mainly a mature maleoriented interest the society welcomes women members, as well as young folk.

"Our club runs on-air meetings (Jamborees of the Air) with Scouts and Girl Guide groups from our area, so they can communicate with other groups around the world — and the response is always really enthusiastic," Ralf says. This special event will again take place in October.

"When we're broadcasting from a public place such as a park or open public area, we are often approached by people who express surprise that amateur broadcasting is still a really popular hobby. It has a lot of things to recommend it; It's not gender or age specific, it's portable and

it's very economical — you can pay up to five thousand dollars for a top of the range radio or do what I did initially — pick up a second-hand twenty-dollar handset. You can opt for a short wave mantle set to just listen in, or you can join the conversation with a pocket-sized two-way radio — a "walkie-talkie" once you have obtained your license.

Ralf says that to accommodate members' lifestyles, meetings are staggered throughout the month, held on week days and evenings and also on Saturday afternoons.

For members who like a bit of an edge to their broadcasting there are frequent contests, arranged by world-wide groups such as the Wireless Institute of Australia (WIA) and run by the individual clubs. The contests can be local, Australia-wide or global and the winner is the Operator or Club who generally reaches the greatest distance and makes the most contacts with other competitors in a set time.

"Contestants can be out in the field, at their clubhouse or at their homes," Ralf says. "On one particular contest held each year, the rules specify that the contesting Club, needs to operate within a certain distance of a registered lighthouse or a lightship."

An interesting fact; broadcasting over or near salt water intensifies the radio's broadcast range and allows the signal to travel further. Another interesting fact for the non-cognoscenti is that globally-accessible HF

(high frequency), on which most competitions are run, can be split into different modes; AM (amplitude modulation) and SSB (Single Side Band) for voice, as well as Digital and CW (carrier wave) for transmitting in Morse Code. Ralf says that CW is still a very popular pastime; the group has six members proficient in Morse Code.

The BDARS group meets at the Redland Museum in Smith St. Cleveland and as Ralf says: "To join, you don't need any prior knowledge, training or equipment — you just have to be interested in giving it a try!" Sounds good to me.





## TRIUMPHAL ENTRY OF THE STRAWBERRY QUEENS!





Hard on the heels of the coronation the Redlands Coast is seeking retired queens; several, in fact.

Redland Museum is hoping to contact as many former Strawberry Queens as possible for a celebratory high tea — *Strawberry Festival, Queens and Dreams* — to be held on August 20. The high tea precedes the RedFest Redlands Coast Festival, in its triumphal return after three years of COVID lockdown.

The first Strawberry Festival was held in 1953, a one-off event to raise money for the Capalaba School of Arts Hall. A regional glut of strawberries saw the Festival revived in 1958 and 1959.

A move to the Redland Show Grounds in 1965 allowed the Festival to expand into a major event, now known as RedFest Redlands Coast Festival, a celebration of music, food and culture which draws in crowds from all over south-east Queensland. Its value as a fundraiser was remembered and in the days before the government took on financial responsibility for the ambulance service the Strawberry Queen Quest and the chocolate wheel raised money for the Queensland Ambulance Transport Brigade (now the Queensland Ambulance Service). Local women were encouraged to compete for the adjudicated title of Strawberry Queen. Strawberries, of course, take centre stage; this is the place to assuage any lingering yearnings for Ekka-style cream-topped strawberry ice creams.

Jan Banks and her late husband lan were there at the beginning. Ian was on the QATB benefit committee for 18 years working for the Festival and Quest; when he took on the huge task of running the Queen Quest for five years Jan was his willing assistant. Jan remembers it as a very busy but fulfilling time.

"The Strawberry Queen Quest supported a really worthy cause. It was wonderful for the Redlands, as all these different clubs and organisations who had sponsored a talented entrant worked hard holding many fundraising functions — street stalls, dances, car rallies, barbecues, car washes and chocolate wheels," she says.

"Then there would be the Strawberry Ball to prepare for, the hall to decorate, the float to build and decorate, the fun of the procession and the judging and the Strawberry Festival itself. They were very happy days and it really brought the community together."

The last Strawberry Queen was crowned in 2000 and this year, to honour the contribution to the community by the Queens and their supporters, Redland Museum's exhibition space will house displays of Strawberry Queen gowns, memorabilia, videos and photographs. The highlight of the celebration is a regal high tea, where guests can share memories and conversations with as many Strawberry Queens as can be mustered. Jan Banks will be an organiser and treasured guest.



"I am looking forward to seeing a new mentality, meeting new people and seeing new places!" she says.

## REIQ welcomes pause in interest rate hikes

With inflation moderating, productivity levels falling, job vacancies declining, household savings eroding, and business insolvencies increasing, the REIQ says today's pause on the cash rate was a sensible decision given mixed economic signals.

Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) Chief Operating Officer Dean Milton said business owners, mortgage holders, aspiring home owners, and renters who hoped the new financial year would bring interest rate reprieve would be nicely surprised.

"In our view, there were enough economic factors at play to warrant a stop or at least a pause to the steep tightening cycle, so this comes as welcome news," Mr Milton said.

"With 12 rises and only two pauses since May last year, pressure continues to mount on businesses, the economy is weakening, and households with little savings left are wondering what else they can scrape by without.

"Small businesses are also coming under pressure with a raft of cost increases this financial year including electricity prices going up by 25% across the state, and the additional Superannuation Guarantee of 0.5%.

"Given small business is a major employer in Queensland, if they begin to struggle and lay off staff, this again has a flow-on effect to the broader housing market."

Mr Milton said the interest rate tightening cycle was also hurting construction of new builds that will be required to ease the housing crisis.



"There has been a 30% decline in loans for new builds during the last 12 months of the hiking cycle which are now at are their lowest levels since the end of the mining boom a decade ago," he said.

"With business insolvencies on the rise, this is a welcome pause to give developers a chance to catch up and restore cash flow."





"Each year, our older students take care of the younger ones. They calm their nerves and help them to enjoy this special opportunity to perform."



# FROM THE SAND HILLS TO THE BLUE HOLE, WHITING ARE BITING

BY SPERO KARTANOS

#### Local fisherman Spero Kartanos shares his tips for finding the best fresh feed of fish this month in Moreton Bay.

The weather in August should be great — apart from the westerly winds this time of year — and the fishing should be good with plenty of all our local species in abundance.

The whiting should now have moved throughout the small boat channel, the Rous Channel, Amity Banks, the Sand Hills and the Blue Hole, so there's no excuse not to get a feed for most families!

Bait-wise, my favourites are blood worms, beach worms, peeled small prawns and strips of squid, and a paternoster rig works the best. Another tip: a good run in the tide is best.

School mackerel will be in the bay, especially the small boat channel towards the Rous entrance. They're usually undersized this time of year, but there will be plenty of bigger fish mixed in. Wait another few weeks; come September, it should a cracker month for school mackerel. Try using floating pillies or diving boards with spoons.

The squid and cuttlefish numbers tend to slow down a little in August, but judging by the results in July, there could be a bumper season ahead for these cephalopods in the bay. For jigs, I'm finding the dull colours work best on cloudy days and the bright colours on sunny days. I've included a picture of the three best jigs.

The snapper season has been closed since July 15 and restarts in the bay on August 15, but there's plenty of other fish to catch until then.

A thank you to all my readers — it has been great to help you to catch a few more fish, and it has been lots of fun reading your emails about your catches.

So get out there on beautiful Moreton Bay, catch a fish and remember to be safe and be careful in strong westerly winds. It feels nice and calm close to shore, and you don't see the whitecaps until you turn to come home, so it's better to put off a day's fishing than put yourself and others at risk.

# SIMPLE AND VERSATILE BROWN RICE SALAD RECIPE

If you're struggling to up your vegetable intake, here's an easy to assemble salad that packs a flavourful punch and makes a perfect side or a light main meal. Leave out any vegetables you don't like, and add the ones you do.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 2 cups cooked brown rice (microwave rice is easy and quick)
- . 1 large continental cucumber, diced
- 3 tomatoes, de-seeded, diced
- 1 red and 1 green capsicum, diced (sweet mini capsicums are great too)
- 1 red onion, finely chopped
- 1 small tin of baby corn kernels
- · Handful of olives, pitted

- ½ cup of chopped fresh parsley, flat leaf or curly
- 1/4 cup of crumbled feta or goat's cheese
- Finely sliced chilli (optional; as much as you like)
- Juice of one large lemon
- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1 clove of garlic, crushed
- 2 cups of loosely packed fresh baby spinach leaves
- Salt and pepper to taste

#### **METHOD**

- 1. In a large mixing bowl, combine the cooked rice, cucumber, tomatoes, capsicums, red onion, parsley, corn, baby spinach, olives, chilli (if using), and feta or goat's cheese. Toss (be gentle!) to combine.
- 2. In a small jar with a lid, combine the lemon juice, olive oil, minced garlic, salt, and pepper to make the dressing. Give it a good shake (put some music on, this is a good opportunity to dance).
- 3. Pour the dressing over the rice mixture and toss until everything is well coated.
- 4. Taste and adjust the salt and pepper; add more lemon juice if it needs more zing.
- 5. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and pop it in the fridge for at least half an hour so the flavours can develop.
- 6. Serve chilled and enjoy!

Additions: To bulk up the salad, add grilled chicken strips, pan fried halloumi or tofu, cooked prawns or squid, even roast lamb and beef. You can also substitute the rice with cooked pasta.



# AUSTRALIA'S BIGGEST COMMUNITY-DRIVEN SHELLFISH RESTORATION PROJECT GOES INTO OVERDRIVE IN MORETON BAY

More than 2,000 Robust Oyster Baskets destined to grow into new oyster reefs have been strategically dropped into Moreton Bay as part of the biggest community-driven shellfish reef restoration project in Australia.

Local OzFish volunteers recently deployed 2,265 Robust Oyster Baskets, lovingly called ROBs, onto the restoration site, taking the total number to an incredible 6,465 since the project launched nearly two years ago.

The ROBs are made from degradable steel mesh filled with recycled oyster shell that volunteers help clean at the shell recycling centre at the Port of Brisbane. The shells are collected from local restaurant, bars and wholesalers and recycled by volunteers.

All up there were more than 2.7 million shells in the baskets dropped into the water recently, bringing the total of shells deployed to just under 7.8 million for the project.

The baskets take about two years to degrade, which gives the oysters and other shellfish time to clump together, leaving only a solid structure of oyster shells and living shellfish.

They were loaded onto a barge to be placed into a 19.6-hectare site which was graciously donated to OzFish for restoration by the Port of Brisbane.

Marine creatures in Moreton Bay are facing a housing crisis of their own after a staggering 96% of shellfish reef habitat has been destroyed in the past 150 years, leaving them functionally extinct.

OzFish's Central Moreton Chapter refuses to stand by idly. The results from a study conducted by Griffith University on the previously deployed ROBs are nothing short of astonishing. Each ROB creates 626 new homes for shellfish, as well as providing shelter for a remarkable 1120 other animals including crabs, worms, prawns and other creatures.

This incredible achievement amounts to more than 11 million new animals now thriving on the site, showcasing a massive increase in biodiversity.

Furthermore, OzFish has already successfully restored 10 hectares of shellfish reefs. As a result, volunteers have contributed to the generation of 2,500 tonnes of additional harvestable fish for Moreton Bay, year after year, forever.

"Together, we are making a significant impact on the health and sustainability of our oceans," said Robbie Porter, OzFish Senior Special Projects Officer - Shellfish Revolution.

"Each restored hectare produces an additional 2.5 tonnes of harvestable fish every year for Moreton Bay.

"I believe this is the best shellfish restoration project in Australia without question. Queensland should be very proud of what we're achieving.

"We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the exceptional OzFish Central Moreton Chapter volunteers for their tireless dedication in supporting this work. Without their time and ingenuity, this project wouldn't be possible."
