# Get out your diaries and blast the group chat. The bayside's biggest arts festival is back and is a must-see this November/December.

Wynnum Fringe is back from November 15 to December 3. Fresh from accepting the most prestigious award – the Gold Matilda – in the Queensland Arts Industry Awards, Tom Oliver and the Fringe team are committing to another three years of arts in the bayside.

As you may know, the Festival began as a Covid recovery effort in 2020 to employ artists and bring the community together. In three short years, the event has grown from three days to three weeks.

Last year Wynnum Fringe welcomed 36,000 patrons across ticketed and free activations, and the goal this year is to increase that by at least 50%.

This year's lineup will be announced at a special local launch event on September 26; tickets for this event are now on sale. Head to wynnumfringe.com before they disappear. 

# **NEVER THE BRIDESMAID...ALWAYS THE BRIDE**

Local actor Jill Tuckwood seems destined for the role of stage bride. She has played the poignant, wordless Ghost Bride in two Theatre Redlands Hallowe'en productions (*When the Darkness Moves* and *Through the Dark Door*) and is now rehearsing TR's forthcoming play, *There Goes the Bride*, directed by Ray Noonan. This time around, she has lines.

"Having a speaking role is a bit outside my comfort zone," she says. "I'm used to being in the band, playing alto sax or clarinet or working backstage. Being the Ghost Bride required focus and feeling but learning lines will be a whole new challenge!"

Jill's *Bride*, while being the title role, is perhaps one of the more low-key characters in this classic comedy by John Chapman and Ray Cooney, who have written some of Britain's most popular stage comedies. Surrounded by a family which includes a father who seems to be losing his wits – and his stiff British sense of propriety, a grandfather who slides effortlessly between reality and somewhere else, a grandmother who is the ultimate matriarch, an increasingly outraged father-in-law-to-be (perhaps); an intrusive bra model who might be her father's lover – or not – and a mother who's trying to hold it all together, poor dear Judy the Bride just wants to get married...Good luck with that.

Ray Noonan, a Theatre Redland's principal, actor and director, selected the play for its cleverly-dialogued comedy.

"These are hard times; everybody needs to forget their troubles for a few hours and have a good laugh," he says. "While it was written in the mid-seventies it embodies the classic sit-com device of unfolding a series of human foibles and inviting us to have a good laugh at ourselves."





# **UNDERSTANDING EYE PROBLEMS IN DOGS**

Dogs are prone to a number of different conditions affecting their eyes.

### **CONJUNCTIVITIS**

Conjunctivitis is often triggered by allergies.

Signs of conjunctivitis:

- Green or yellow discharge
- Squinting/holding the eye closed
- Scratching or rubbing at the eye
- · Red sclera (the white part of the eye) and red, swollen eyelids

Treatment of conjunctivitis includes cleaning away any discharge from the eye and an appropriate medication as dispensed by your vet.

### CHERRY EYE (PROLAPSED THIRD EYELID GLAND)

Cherry eye is more commonly seen in brachycephalic (short nosed) dogs such as French and English bulldogs and pugs.

Signs of cherry eye:



• The tear gland prolapses from behind the third eyelid causing a ball of pink tissue (which may resemble a cherry) to protrude at the inner corner of the eye

Treatment of cherry eye may sometimes be achieved with antiinflammatory medication but in the long term surgical intervention may be required.

#### **GLAUCOMA**

Glaucoma is the term for increased fluid pressure within the eye.

Signs of glaucoma:

- A "blue and red" eye the cornea (outer covering of the eyeball) becomes blue and the sclera (white of the eye) becomes red
- The globe can appear swollen
- Marked eye pain can occur rapidly

Treatment of glaucoma requires medication to reduce the pressure in the eye and assist drainage of fluid from the globe. Uncontrolled glaucoma may require removal the entire globe as the condition is very painful if not resolved.

# ECTROPION (DROOPY EYELIDS) OR ENTROPION (EYELIDS ROLLING IN)

These conditions are due to a dog's conformation so are more commonly seen in particular breeds.

Surgical correction is usually required.

#### **CORNEAL ULCERATION**

Corneal ulceration occurs as the result of an injury to the cornea or due to degenerative change in the cornea.

Signs of ulceration:

• Squinting • Excessive tearing • Cloudiness of the cornea

Treatment of corneal ulceration includes pain relief and antibiotic medications. More severe injuries may require surgery.

Eye issues can occur very acutely in dogs and become very serious in a short period of time. If you notice any issues with your dog's eyes it is important to seek veterinary attention so the appropriate treatment can be commenced.

# LET'S TALK ABOUT WOMEN'S HEALTH

### September 4 to 8 is Jean Hailes Women's Health Week, and I would like to take this opportunity to discuss the topic of contraception.

Contraception does more than prevent unwanted pregnancy. It can be used in many situations to manage common female health issues.

Iron deficiency (anaemia) can happen when one has persistently heavy periods. Contraception can reduce period loss by preventing ovulation and thinning of the uterus lining. Combined with an iron supplement, they are used effectively together to manage iron deficiency.

Oral contraception can also reduce sebum production and improve Acne.

Endometriosis can cause painful cramps and heavy period bleeding. Contraception can be used to control periods and suppress the symptoms of endometriosis.

Oral contraception, specifically the brands that contain drospirenone, has been used to manage periodrelated conditions such as Premenstrual syndrome (PMS) and Premenstrual dysphoric disorder (PMDD). It is still unclear why some women suffer more from these conditions, but it is thought to be due to the complex interaction between certain chemicals in the brain and progesterone. Oral contraception helps by preventing ovulation. In addition, a light period with fewer cramps also improves the overall mood.

# **LOCAL SPITFIRE PILOT JOHN SHOESMITH TURNS 100**

### World War II pilot Warrant Officer (retired) John Shoesmith celebrated his 100th birthday in Wynnum on August 9, 2023.

Mr Shoesmith flew a clutch of 'classic warbirds' including the CAC Boomerang and Supermarine Spitfire for the Royal Australian Air Force during the War.

Enlisting during the dark days of early 1942, Mr Shoesmith was selected for pilot training – and what followed was intensive training, progressing from the classroom to cockpit.

Upon receiving his Wings, Warrant Officer Shoesmith moved through several flying Squadrons, culminating in active service flying Spitfires in 452 and 79 Squadrons.

"I received no instruction before my first flight in a Spitfire – but there was a training manual on the cockpit seat," he said.

What followed was active service in what is now Indonesia, as the Allied forces pushed the enemy back.

A key role of the Spitfire – and one that it was not initially designed for – was ground attack.

"It took great skill to dive bomb a bridge and drop 250 pound bombs whilst under fire," said Mr Shoesmith.

At the conclusion of the War, Mr Shoesmith, like many of his generation, returned to civilian and family life.

But he continued to hold strong memories of flying the Spitfire – undoubtedly one the most well-loved

aircraft aviation history.

"It was the best plane I flew, and it had such a surge of power at maximum throttle," he said with a twinkle in his eye.

In later years he maintained his passion for the aircraft and 'kept his eye in', tackling missions on the Microsoft Flight Simulator computer game with Spitfire add-in.

Group Captain Dennis Tan, Senior Australian Defence Force Officer at RAAF Base Amberley, Queensland, represented Air Force for an early birthday celebration at Mr Shoesmith's home on August 8, presenting him with some Air Force mementos.

These included a framed image of one of 100 Squadron's flying Spitfires, based at Temora New South Wales, signed by Commanding Officer Jason Easthope.

The 100 Squadron is a historical squadron which was re-formed in 2021 to coincide with the Air Force centenary and maintains and operates heritage aircraft.

Himself a pilot, Group Captain Tan considered it a special honour to be able to present the mementos to Mr Shoesmith, and 'talk flying' with a fellow aviator.

"All the aircraft that Warrant Officer Shoesmith flew would be considered 'classic warbirds' these days, and what an amazing collection of aircraft to have in a pilot's logbook," Group Captain Tan said.

"It is a very special honour for me to spend some time with one of our veterans who has flown them."

The current Commanding Officer of Mr Shoesmith's old unit, 79 Squadron, noted the importance of remembering those who had gone before in his unit.

"The 79 Squadron has been formed for times of conflict and those who served in the unit during these times did so with courage and resilience," Wing Commander Grant Taylor said.

"It is a joyous occasion for the current members of 79 Squadron to wish John a happy 100th birthday as one of the men who faced the enemy at a time when Australia needed it the most.

"The skills John demonstrated against the enemy

during World War II are now being taught to the future generation of fighter pilots, continuing a legacy which underpins the need for high quality training in high quality people."

Today, 79 Squadron forms part of 78 Wing of the Air Combat Group and is headquartered at RAAF Base Pearce, Western Australia.

The Squadron operates BAE Hawk 127 aircraft and has the mission of training and graduating aircrew for follow-on conversion to fast jet aircraft.

The Squadron also supports Australian Defence Force operational training.

# **ORCHIDS AREN'T AWKWARD...COME AND MEET THEM**

Many gardeners avoid orchids because they see them as exotic, demanding and expensive. According to the treasurer of the Redland Orchid Society, Bruce Prebble, nothing could be further from the truth.

"Any hobby can be as expensive as you make it; you can pay a thousand dollars for an orchid or pick up an Australian beauty for twenty dollars; they'll both give you the same amount of pleasure."

The society promotes orchid growing and has an active "citizen science" role of researching, photographing and cataloguing local species. Bruce, who is one of the organisers of the society's biannual charity fundraising shows, has been in love with orchids since his youth; a passion he may have inherited.

"I used to work in the Cape York Aurukun community and I remember the first time I saw native orchids growing wild in trees; they just took my breath away," he says. "I later discovered that my grandparents were passionate orchid growers and I share their love of this very special flower."

For many of us, our first encounter with orchids was the showy catalea, the corsage presented by a hopeful beau to his date for a dance. As wonderful as they are, the world of orchids has many others less flamboyant but just as lovely.

"Orchids are captivating by their beauty and their complexity and by the way they've adapted to microclimates and specific pollinators –

like the Madagascar orchid that can be pollinated only by a nocturnal moth with an exceptionally long proboscis," he says. "Growers can hybridise them but there are many naturally occurring hybrids – forty to fifty thousand – including our Queensland emblem, the Cape York dendrobium."

Bruce says that much of the public perception of orchids as difficult "prima donnas" comes from lack of knowledge.

"Many first-timers treat orchids like other flowers; they plant them in soil and water them frequently – that can kill them with over-love. If you have them in a greenhouse and they don't like it they may need just a different place in the greenhouse or if they want rainforest conditions, if you grow them in the open with occasional water they'll find their own way. Growing orchids isn't daunting – after a while it becomes second nature."

Folk wanting to learn more about the secret life of orchids can learn from fellow enthusiasts in the Redlands Orchid Society, which will be holding its annual Spring Charity Show on Saturday October 7 at the Redlands Multi-Sports Club, Judy Holt Park, Randall and Bailey Roads, Birkdale. The show, which raises money for the Redlands Hospital Auxiliary, will run from 8:30 am to 3:00 pm and features orchid displays and sales – and potting demonstrations, for those of us who are still tempted to cram them into soil.







# LOCAL PHOTOGRAPHER PROFILE: MARGARET DUNCAN

# WHAT IS DEMAND METERING AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

In today's energy-conscious world, optimising electricity consumption is crucial for both homeowners and businesses. To achieve this, power companies are adopting advanced technologies such as demand metering. Demand metering - or time-of-use metering as it is sometimes referred to - allows your energy retailer to charge a premium for electricity used during peak periods.

Over the past few months, a considerable number of homeowners across the bayside have found their properties have been switched to demand metering. Many of these homeowners have not had a proper explanation of what demand tariffs are or how they work - leaving confusion when their bills arrive.

Put simply, with demand metering - power consumed during the "peak" incurs a surcharge. With some retailers this can be upwards of an additional 15c per kilowatt hour on top of the standard usage tariff. Demand meters or next generation digital meters allow consumption data to be sent in real time to the energy retailer and therefore, usage during the peak period is then broken down on your bill.

At Goodhew Electrical and Solar, we've spoken to a number of homeowners who have been switched over to demand metering,

many of whom were not informed by their power company of the implications to their bill. Many of these customers are paying up to 45c per kilowatt hour for electricity consumed between 4PM and 9PM. For a standard working household – this means that the majority of usage in the evening after occupants return from work or school falls within the peak period.

The move to demand metering, coupled with the ever increasing wholesale power price and low solar feed-in tariff has left many households with bill shock. This is a timely reminder for homeowners to go through their bill line-by-line and not hesitate to query any charges or tariffs that have changed.

Our team is often asked how to offset demand pricing and reduce household electricity bills. # Green shoots emerge in Queensland's rental vacancy rates

#### FROM THE REAL ESTATE INSTITUTE OF QLD

The Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) says consecutive lifts in the state's quarterly residential vacancy rate is a promising sign that rental conditions are improving.

The REIQ Residential Vacancy Rate Report for the June 2023 Quarter covers 50 local government areas (LGAs) and sub regions in Queensland, and comes as the state-wide vacancy rate rose to 1.0% for the first time since December 2021.

While the vacancy rate remains 'tight' (0 - 2.5%) across the vast majority of Queensland, over the June quarter it relaxed in 38 regions, held steady in three, and tightened in nine.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said the movement over the quarter showed that we are crawling towards healthier rates across most of the state.

"We're starting to see some early signs of the rental market starting to soften just ever so slightly, with vacancy rates showing small increases in the majority of regions," Ms Mercorella said. "It was too early to call in the March quarter, which also saw a slight lift, but now with back-to-back, quarter on quarter improvement, we can see some promising green shoots.

"There is still a long way to go for Queensland's rental market to reach healthy rates, but these results are a step in the right direction with a little more movement and increasing opportunity and choice for renters wanting to get into the market.

"This is consistent with what real estate agents on the ground are telling us. They say there's more rental housing stock freeing up, particularly in higher price point suburbs which have probably hit the peak of rent increases.

"Necessity is the mother of invention, and because people have been unable to find the type of rental property they are looking for, in the area they're looking for, and something that works within their budget restraints, they are thinking outside of the box, adapting, and finding alternative solutions. "These alternative arrangements include moving back in with parents where possible, moving in with other tenants in a co-tenancy instead of sole tenancy, and looking for units or townhouses instead of a freestanding home, or casting their net wider by looking at nearby localities with greater supply."

Most improvements in vacancy rates were limited to a slight lift of 0.1-0.2 per cent which was the case across Greater Brisbane, including Brisbane LGA (1.0%), Ipswich (1.1%), Logan (1.0%), Moreton Bay (0.9%), Caboolture (1.1%), Pine Rivers (1.0%), Redcliffe (0.8%), Redland (1.3%) and Mainland (0.8%).

The exception in Greater Brisbane was Redland's Bay Islands where demand for 'island living' continues to weaken – rising to its highest-ever vacancy rate of 6.3 per cent.

# Latest news from the Port of Brisbane Sept 2023



#### Trade

During 2022/23, the Port's overall trade reached 33.59 million tonnes, a 4.8% increase on the previous year. Container volumes also increased, with a record 1.56 million containers (TEUs – twenty-foot equivalent containers) handled through the Port.

The Port recorded strong agricultural export volumes after another year of excellent growing conditions throughout much of our trade hinterland. Exports of grains like wheat and sorghum continued to be very strong. A record 2.7 million tonnes of bulk grain exports were shipped to global markets during the year.

#### Community

Congratulations to the recipients of our 2023/24 Community Grant Funding, with 12 community organisations sharing in \$100,000. This year marks 10 years of our Community Grant Program, with 81 local and regional organisations sharing in over \$1 million of grant funding since 2013. The list of recipients is on our website.

# A QUICK HISTORY OF TINGALPA PIONEERS' CEMETERY AND CHAPEL

Nestled behind a white picket fence at 1341 Wynnum Road is the Tingalpa Pioneers' Cemetery and Chapel. Dating back to 1868, the "Bush Cathedral" was erected by the pioneers and has seen approximately 300 burials.

Demolished by a cyclone in 1885, the chapel was rebuilt by the community using timber recovered from the original building. As the population of the Manly area increased, the Tingalpa chapel suffered from lack of patronage in the 1900s, and it was decommissioned and left to deteriorate. The chapel subsequently received a new lease of life thanks to the Friends of Tingalpa Cemetery Heritage Group, who rescued the chapel and ensured the site was heritage listed in 1998.



The beautifully restored gothic chapel boasts arched doorways, high cathedral ceilings and silky oak pews plus a bell in the gabled belfry. It is now used for civil ceremonies and events. With seating for approximately 50 guests, the chapel and outdoor areas are available for hire.

The one-acre of cemetery grounds, including the Circle of Life outdoor seating area, is now in pristine condition.

Decoration Day is traditionally a ritual carried out by families gathering in the cemetery grounds for a work day and picnic, honouring their ancestors. In recent decades, Decoration Day activities have focused less on graveyard maintenance and more on social activities. It is now a fete-fun style event for fundraising, the key to the preservation of the area.

The annual Decoration Day at Tingalpa Cemetery will be held on Saturday October 7, 2023 from 9:00 am to midday. This marks the 155th anniversary of consecration of the cemetery and the chapel. The event will feature food trucks, a sausage sizzle, book sale, live local music, raffles prizes and market stalls. Everyone is welcome to attend and entry is free, with parking available nearby at Smith's Chips' carpark on the day.

I know it's a fishing column, but when the whales are in, and you see the size of them as they go past your boat, and you realise that the calf is as big as your old bay cruiser, it's pretty amazing! Especially to see Mum being so protective; it's one of the best sights in the bay this time of year. And, how lucky are we to see them just east of Green Island and Wellington Point and around Peel Island? Looking at records, the next four weeks are when

most whales come in to rest before the long journey to the South Pole, so if you get a chance during the school holidays, it's worth a look around the bay to see these magnificent mammals.

The school mackerel season is at its peak this month, and you should start to catch them all through the bay from close in at Manly Harbour, last leads, to King and Green Islands, all the way to Ormiston and east to the Naval Banks. So, there's no excuse for not getting a good feed; you can troll to find them, anchor up, drop some pillies on ganged hooks, and wait.

The whiting should be in the small boat channel and the Rous this time of year, and the Sand Hills at Moreton should also be firing, along with Amity Banks, close in at Darcy Light. The area between the shallows in front of Wynnum Creek out towards St Helena has also been good over the years, and the snapper and squire/sweet lip should be looking for us. Since the opening of the snapper season in mid-August, there are always plenty of snapper and squire in the bay to keep us all happy in September. My favourite areas to find them are around the shallow grounds around all the Bay Islands.

## **NUT-CRUSTED BAKED FISH RECIPE**

Here's a quick and easy fish recipe that adds extra crunch and flavour to your catch of the day. Serves 4.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 4 firm pieces of fish Barramundi is excellent for this
- 1 cup of your favourite mixed nuts (e.g. almonds, pecans, walnuts, macadamias, or use just one nut variety), finely chopped
- 1/4 cup breadcrumbs
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley, finely chopped
- 1-2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 2 tablespoons honey or maple syrup
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Lemon wedges to serve
- Chopped fresh herbs for garnish (optional)

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Preheat your oven to 200°C, then line a flat baking tray with greaseproof paper.
- 2. Combine the mixed nuts, breadcrumbs, and parsley in a bowl, then season with a pinch of salt and black pepper.
- 3. Now coat the fish. Start by patting the fish dry with a paper towel, then brush each fillet with a layer of Dijon mustard on the top. This is important as it helps the nut mixture stick to the fish.
- 4. Press the nut, parsley and breadcrumb mixture onto the mustard-coated side of each fish fillet to create an even layer of nuts.
- 5. Drizzle honey (or maple syrup) and olive oil over the fish. The olive oil will help to create a crusty crust!
- 6. Place the fish on the baking tray, nut-crust side up and bake for 10-15 minutes or until cooked through.

Serve with lemon wedges, and garnish with whatever herbs you have on hand - dill works well with this recipe.

# **SAILABILITY BAYSIDE: SAILING FOR 20 YEARS AT MANLY**

#### This year was the 20th anniversary for Sailability Bayside, who provide sailing experiences for people with disability at Manly Harbour in Brisbane.

Sailing for people with disability arrived in Australia in the late 1990s, with the first club in Queensland starting at the Southport Yacht Club in the year 2000. The Cerebral Palsy League (CPL) saw that this activity was a suitable outlet for their clientele and soon became involved.

As the activity grew in popularity, CPL sought a suitable location in the Brisbane region and the Multihull Yacht Club at Manly accepted the challenge to participate in the venture. The group in company with Sailability Queensland sought support from local community groups with the result that Lions MacGregor, Lions Capalaba and the Wynnum Manly Rotary Club joined in to purchase three Hansa sailing dinghies so operations could begin.

The beginning was rather testing as there were many obstacles to overcome where people with little or limited mobility had to be placed into boats which then had to be launched into the waters of the Manly Harbour. An old boat trailer was subsequently modified for this operation, with an electric winch located on the shore used to launch and retrieve the boats as required. A person also had to be stationed in the actual water during these movements to raise and lower the centreboard of the boats so they could access the trailer. This particular job was easily filled in the warmer months however it was not as popular when the weather was cold.

This sailing activity then quickly grew from five clients initially to some 30 within a short time and thoughts turned to the purchase of a yacht to accommodate the increasing numbers. A seven-metre Payne daysailer named Faith was subsequently purchased for this purpose, though it was still hard work changing people in and out of the dinghies using the trailer method.

It was not until 2010 that negotiations with the State Government resulted in a state-of-the-art pontoon being installed at the site that dramatically changed the way that people could be readily hoisted in and out of dinghies without their being taken from the water. This addition was a boon to disabled sailing at Manly Harbour and numbers of clients as well as volunteers increased accordingly, so that in recent times 70 to 80 people enjoy the feeling of being out on the water in a small boat on sailing days.

The anniversary of 20 years was recently celebrated at the same site, now held by the Darling Point Sailing Squadron, where more than 200

people attended in support of the Sailability Bayside operation. From this gathering, it is obvious that sailing for people with disability is assured into the future.


