LOCAL STUDENT GETS BRONCOS BOOST TO CONQUER CORAL

Confidence and cultural awareness have pushed Cleveland student Brianna Morrison to dive into the deep end, forging a new path in protecting Australia's endangered coral reefs. The Beyond the Broncos student from Cleveland District State High School was recently awarded the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year Award at the 2023 South East Queensland Training Awards.

Reflecting on her success, Brianna acknowledged the Beyond the Broncos Leadership Program for nurturing her cultural awareness and reigniting her confidence. "I had to make a speech when I accepted my award, and the Broncos Leadership Program really prepared me for that," Brianna said.

"I've met a lot of new people that I've become good friends with, and I've learned so many skills I can take away with me from the program as well."

Balancing marine studies with her Senior Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Ambassador role at Cleveland High School, Brianna completed her VET Marine Placement Program and now has her sights on coral reef conservation.

"My studies were on how to protect and conserve the marine environment, and that went for over a year, and I definitely want to study marine biology at university now," Brianna said.

Broncos Student Support Officer Taylor Button said she was proud of the successful marine student and what she has accomplished with confidence and public speaking since the program. "She said to me the other day how going to the leadership camp and being in the leadership program has helped her with her confidence speaking," Ms Button said.

Christine Halliwell, General Manager of Community & Government Programs at the Brisbane Broncos, said the program was important in shaping the next generation of leaders like Brianna.

"Our Beyond the Broncos Program has helped more than 216 students in the Redland City region to find their feet, re-engage with their learning and become strong leaders," Ms Halliwell said.

"The Redlands region also has the highest program attendance rate of all the regions; we're in at 90.12%."

Since its establishment in 2016, Beyond the Broncos has supported over 4,000 students, recognising the pivotal role that young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders play in shaping the next generation.

ORCHIDS AREN'T AWKWARD...COME AND MEET THEM

Many gardeners avoid orchids because they see them as exotic, demanding and expensive. According to the treasurer of the Redland Orchid Society, Bruce Prebble, nothing could be further from the truth.

"Any hobby can be as expensive as you make it; you can pay a thousand dollars for an orchid or pick up an Australian beauty for twenty dollars; they'll both give you the same amount of pleasure."

The society promotes orchid growing and has an active "citizen science" role of researching, photographing and cataloguing local species. Bruce, who is one of the organisers of the society's biannual charity fundraising shows, has been in love with orchids since his youth; a passion he may have inherited.

"I used to work in the Cape York Aurukun community and I remember the first time I saw native orchids growing wild in trees; they just took my breath away," he says. "I later discovered that my grandparents were passionate orchid growers and I share their love of this very special flower."

For many of us, our first encounter with orchids was the showy catalea, the corsage presented by a hopeful beau to his date for a dance. As wonderful as they are, the world of orchids has many others less flamboyant but just as lovely.

"Orchids are captivating by their beauty and their complexity and by the way they've adapted to microclimates and specific pollinators – like the Madagascar orchid that can be pollinated only by a nocturnal moth with an exceptionally long proboscis," he says. "Growers can hybridise them but there are many naturally occurring hybrids – forty to fifty thousand – including our Queensland emblem, the Cape York dendrobium."

Bruce says that much of the public perception of orchids as difficult "prima donnas" comes from lack of knowledge.

"Many first-timers treat orchids like other flowers; they plant them in soil and water them frequently – that can kill them with over-love. If you have them in a greenhouse and they don't like it they may need just a different place in the greenhouse or if they want rainforest conditions, if you grow them in the open with occasional water they'll find their own way. Growing orchids isn't daunting – after a while it becomes second nature."

Folk wanting to learn more about the secret life of orchids can learn from fellow enthusiasts in the Redlands Orchid Society, which will be holding its annual Spring Charity Show on Saturday October 7 at the Redlands Multi-Sports Club, Judy Holt Park, Randall and Bailey Roads, Birkdale. The show, which raises money for the Redlands

Hospital Auxiliary, will run from 8:30 am to 3:00 pm and features orchid displays and sales – and potting demonstrations, for those of us who are still tempted to cram them into soil.

NEVER THE BRIDESMAID...ALWAYS THE BRIDE

Local actor Jill Tuckwood seems destined for the role of stage bride. She has played the poignant, wordless Ghost Bride in two Theatre Redlands Hallowe'en productions (*When the Darkness Moves* and *Through the Dark Door*) and is now rehearsing TR's forthcoming play, There Goes the Bride, directed by Ray Noonan. This time around, she has lines.

"Having a speaking role is a bit outside my comfort zone," she says. "I'm used to being in the band, playing alto sax or clarinet or working backstage. Being the Ghost Bride required focus and feeling but learning lines will be a whole new challenge!"

Jill's *Bride*, while being the title role, is perhaps one of the more low-key characters in this classic comedy by John Chapman and Ray Cooney, who have written some of Britain's most popular stage comedies. Surrounded by a family which includes a father who seems to be losing his wits – and his stiff British sense of propriety, a grandfather who slides effortlessly between reality and somewhere else, a grandmother who is the ultimate matriarch, an increasingly outraged father-in-law-to-be (perhaps); an intrusive bra model who might be her father's lover – or not – and a mother who's trying to hold it all together, poor dear Judy the Bride just wants to get married...Good luck with that.

Ray Noonan, a Theatre Redland's Principal, actor and director, selected the play for its cleverly-dialogued comedy.

"These are hard times; everybody needs to forget their troubles for a few hours and have a good laugh," he says. "While it was written in the mid-seventies it embodies the classic sit-com device of unfolding a series of human foibles and inviting us to have a good laugh at ourselves."

Ray's casting includes well-loved favourites of the Redlands stage such as Chad Sherrin, Jim Gilbert and





UNDERSTANDING EYE PROBLEMS IN DOGS

Dogs are prone to a number of different conditions affecting their eyes.

CONJUNCTIVITIS

Conjunctivitis is often triggered by allergies.

Signs of conjunctivitis:

- Green or yellow discharge
- Squinting/holding the eye closed
- Scratching or rubbing at the eye
- Red sclera (the white part of the eye) and red, swollen eyelids

Treatment of conjunctivitis includes cleaning away any discharge from the eye and an appropriate medication as dispensed by your vet.

CHERRY EYE (PROLAPSED THIRD EYELID GLAND)

Cherry eye is more commonly seen in brachycephalic (short nosed) dogs such as French and English bulldogs and pugs.

Signs of cherry eye:

• The tear gland prolapses from behind the third eyelid causing a ball of pink tissue (which may resemble a cherry) to protrude at the inner corner of the eye

Treatment of cherry eye may sometimes be achieved with antiinflammatory medication but in the long term surgical intervention may be required.

GLAUCOMA

Glaucoma is the term for increased fluid pressure within the eye.

Signs of glaucoma:

- A "blue and red" eye the cornea (outer covering of the eyeball) becomes blue and the sclera (white of the eye) becomes red
- The globe can appear swollen
- Marked eye pain can occur rapidly

Treatment of glaucoma requires medication to reduce the pressure in the eye and assist drainage of fluid from the globe. Uncontrolled glaucoma may require removal the entire globe as the condition is very painful if not resolved.

ECTROPION (DROOPY EYELIDS) OR ENTROPION (EYELIDS ROLLING IN)

These conditions are due to a dog's conformation so are more commonly seen in particular breeds.

Surgical correction is usually required.

CORNEAL ULCERATION

Corneal ulceration occurs as the result of an injury to the cornea or due to degenerative change in the cornea.




Signs of ulceration:

• Squinting • Excessive tearing • Cloudiness of the cornea

Treatment of corneal ulceration includes pain relief and antibiotic medications. More severe injuries may require surgery.

Eye issues can occur very acutely in dogs and become very serious in a short period of time. If you notice any issues with your dog's eyes it is important to seek veterinary attention so the appropriate treatment can be commenced.



RISE AND SHINE – IT'S BREAKFAST TIME AT CLEVELAND STATE SCHOOL

It's often said that breakfast is the most important meal, the one that sets you up to fly into the day's mental and physical activity with a well-supplied fuel tank. That's part of the philosophy that's driving Cleveland State School's in-house free breakfast initiative – though there's more to it than that.

School mum Bec Brown, the driver behind the plan, says that the school realised that providing breakfast for students and siblings would also provide an opportunity for greater social impact.

"Inviting all students, their parents and siblings and our teachers and staff to a communal gathering - outside the regulations and restrictions of the classroom – gives us all a chance at wider social interactions," she says.

"It provides opportunities for easy conversations and good role modelling for a caring community. Having senior students, aged eleven and twelve, to help with serving and clearing away gives them firsthand experience in the social protocols needed for so many careers."

The initiative was originally inspired by the breakfast plan run by the YMCA, which provides participating schools with a refrigerator, a freezer, basic utensils and a fortnightly delivery of assorted breakfast foods – all selected with reference to the Queensland Education Department's Smart Choices – Healthy Food and Drink Strategy.

While that was a ground-breaking start Bec realised that more food supplies would be needed so she approached the Seasons IGA Cleveland principals. They had already indicated willingness to support the school and responded readily with a regular donations of fresh fruit, one thing that the YMCA scheme couldn't provide.

Shopping list in one hand and courage in the other, Bec then contacted Cleveland Central Woolworths to see if they could help with more food and kitchen utensils. The response exceeded Bec's expectations and the plan was almost ready to roll. To complete the sweep, Bec's next call was to popular local bakery Banjo's, who willingly came on board with baked products. The school breakfasts now run three mornings a week and are proving gratifyingly popular.

Bec says that there are a variety of reasons that families may skip breakfast; some students have pre-school sports commitments, time may be a problem for working parents, financial pressure or unawareness of nutritional needs may all play a part. What YMCA research has clearly demonstrated is that students work better and are less likely to be disruptive if they start the day with a good meal.

Cleveland State School Principal Rob McCullough says that the benefits of the breakfast initiative reach beyond attendance and academic achievements.

"It's important for our students to have access to an intimate, safe place that encourages a good relationship with the school and their peer group – and cross-generational interaction encourages the development of leadership qualities.

"The breakfast structure has the flexibility needed to accommodate a changing number of children," he says; "At present we have about two hundred students attending, with help from teachers, staff and parents."

Rob, who was previously the Principal of Stradbroke Island and Dunwich State Schools, says that the generosity of sponsor companies doesn't surprise him.

"Cleveland people are very generous, it's something I've noticed in every posting I've had in this region."

For Bec, the generosity sees her doing a food collection run several times a week. Perhaps the next sponsor donation will need to be a delivery van!



REDLANDS ROOFTOPS HELP BATTLE BILLS WITH NEW SEQ Solar Soaker Battery

Residents of the Redlands are set to reap the cost-of-living benefits of more cheap solar energy with the Palaszczuk Government officially starting work on Southeast Queensland's first network-connected battery.

The new 4MW battery, part of the Queensland Energy and Jobs Plan, is designed to soak up cheap solar energy from rooftops in the Redlands during the day to put downward pressure on prices in the evening.

The program is funded through a \$150 million reinvestment from public ownership dividends, meaning more money going directly back into the pockets of Queenslanders.

Work is expected to start in early 2024 at the Ormiston site next to Energex's substation on Gordon Street, with an expected completion date of mid-2024.

The battery announcement comes after the Palaszczuk Government funded the nation's largest cost of living relief package with rebates off Queensland household and small business electricity bills.

All Queensland households will automatically receive a \$550 Cost of Living Rebate on their electricity bill in 2023–24, while around 600,000 vulnerable households will benefit from a higher \$1,072 Cost of Living Rebate.

"By basing this battery here in the Redlands, where there are 43,000 solar systems, cheap solar energy can be generated, stored, and used locally to help bring down power bills," said Member for Redlands Kim Richards.

"That means more money in the pockets of those with or without rooftop solar and allows for additional solar energy to be installed in our local area over the next decade.

"This battery will act as the Redland's own super solar soaker, taking exports from rooftop solar to drive down power prices in the evenings."

According to Minister for Energy, Renewables and Hydrogen, Mick de Brenni, "Queensland has hit new world record amounts of rooftop solar with 800,000 homes and small businesses across Queensland generating over 5,000MW of cheap solar energy".


...his back view as we drove those long car trips through childhood, looking with him at what he saw beyond the windscreen.

ROLLING BACK THE YEARS AND ROLLING OUT THE MEMORIES

Time rolled back 80 years at Birkdale School of Arts Hall when more than 80 people gathered to commemorate the Hall being declared the region's first permanent Land Army Camp in August.

The afternoon's celebrations, facilitated by Cr. Paul Bishop, included excerpts from Theatre Redlands' production The Other Diggers, which recently played to capacity houses at the Redland Museum, and talks were given by folk who had been involved in and contributed to the history of the Australian Women's Land Armv.

Lorraine Newtown, whose mother Beryl Price was a member of AWLA and who donated her uniform to Redland Museum, spoke of her mother's life and extensive experiences in the service, drawing on lovinglypreserved records and photographs that her mother had kept.

Pamela Rushby, highly popular historical novelist, talked about her forthcoming book, Those Girls, which follows the lives of three young women in the Land Army. Those Girls is due for release in February 2024.

Courtney Wilson is a producer/presenter with ABC TV's Landline; in 2022, the 80th anniversary year of the AWLA's foundation, she produced a Landline segment on the Land Army which virtually "went viral" and proved universally popular. The audience was treated to a re-run of the show (still available online) with Courtney's commentary on researching it.

Jan Nary, who wrote The Other Diggers, spoke of the research and unexpected delights of creating a play about a largely unacknowledged part of our history.

Members of the audience contributed to a Q&A session and proffered more information about local Land Army narratives; Caroline Wacker shared some recollections from her Land Army mother, Nesta Benbow.

Without doubt, the stars of the show were two ninety-seven-year-old Land Army "girls"; local Elsie Stiller and Auriel Nixon, whose family brought her down from Toowoomba for the event. The real excitement began when the mothers and daughters started comparing notes, photographs and work placements; old connections were rediscovered, memories polished and contacts exchanged. Once again, the AWLA had the rafters ringing.

Theatre Redlands, which is based in Redland Museum, continues to seek out local anecdotes and memories of Redlands in WW2 on which to create future productions. Redlanders are invited to make contact through the Museum on 3286 3494.

WHAT IS DEMAND METERING AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

In today's energy-conscious world, optimising electricity consumption is crucial for both homeowners and businesses. To achieve this, power companies are adopting advanced technologies such as demand metering. Demand metering - or time-of-use metering as it is sometimes referred to - allows your energy retailer to charge a premium for electricity used during peak periods.

Over the past few months, a considerable number of homeowners across the bayside have found their properties have been switched to demand metering. Many of these homeowners have not had a proper explanation of what demand tariffs are or how they work - leaving confusion when their bills arrive.

Put simply, with demand metering - power consumed during the "peak" incurs a surcharge. With some retailers this can be upwards of an additional 15c per kilowatt hour on top of the standard usage tariff. Demand meters or next generation digital meters allow consumption data to be sent in real time to the energy retailer and therefore, usage during the peak period is then broken down on your bill.

At Goodhew Electrical and Solar, we've spoken to a number of homeowners who have been switched over to demand metering,

many of whom were not informed by their power company of the implications to their bill. Many of these customers are paying up to 45c per kilowatt hour for electricity consumed between 4PM and 9PM. For a standard working household – this means that the majority of usage in the evening after occupants return from work or school falls within the peak period.

The move to demand metering, coupled with the ever increasing wholesale power price and low solar feed-in tariff has left many households with bill shock. This is a timely reminder for homeowners to go through their bill line-by-line and not hesitate to query any charges or tariffs that have changed.

Our team is often asked how to offset demand pricing and reduce household electricity bills. The answer is simple, homeowners should seek to optimise their power consumption to reduce the evening load where possible. Things like moving large appliances including electric hot water systems and pool pumps onto timers to operate through the day. By making small changes to your habits, you can save even more money. For example, try to use the washing machine, dryer and dishwasher during the day when prices are lower. Alternatively, for homes that have a higher electricity



consumption in the evening, a battery storage system may benefit you by allowing you to store energy during the day for use in the evening peak - therefore saving you a considerable amount each quarter.



MODEL RAILWAYS: MORE THAN JUST A LITTLE LOCO

"There's more to it than just watching miniature trains run around on a track!" Roy Walsh should know, he's been involved with model railways since he emigrated to Australia in his early twenties. In his luggage were two prized Hornby locomotives.

His passion for trains is hardly surprising; the house he grew up in in Cumbria's Lakes District was next to a railway yard and one of his favourite playgrounds was the shunting yard, where mountains of coal offered endless climbing challenges to a small and energetic boy.

Now the President of the Redlands Model Railway Club, based in the Redland Museum, he has a collection of 50 locomotives and nearly 200 wagons and carriages. As well as collecting and maintaining exquisite working models, Roy says that one of the most satisfying aspects of railways in miniature is being able to create dioramas – the model landscapes that the trains run in – that remind him of the mountains and cliffs of his first home.

"Creating the landscapes for your model trains calls on a lot of different skills and taking the time to make them as close to reality as possible is really therapeutic," he says. "The secret of localising a scene is to include something that's iconic in that area, that will have people saying oh, look, I've seen that tower – this is Paris!

"Of course, you can make a diorama that's created totally out of your own imagination; there's no reason that Alice's Wonderland can't have a train running through it."

Model trains, like most working machines, have undergone changes as a result of microchip technology. Roy has seen the changes first-hand, having run a hobby shop specialising in working models, for nearly ten years in Capalaba.

"The old model trains had headlights and track lights and such which responded to the speed the train travelled – and later, were operated by remote control. Now we can use computers and iPads and mobile 'phones to control speed, lights and sound, smoke blowing out of the chimney and even the sound of firemen shovelling coal into the locomotive's firebox."

Roy says that members are more than happy to train (pardon the pun) new members in the creation of dioramas and the selection, operation and maintenance of their locomotives and trains. The club has nearly 30 members – with one lone woman member striving to keep the gender balance – but Roy says that women members are more than welcome.

OFF THE CATWALK – FASHION THROUGH THE AGES

If *Downton Abbey* and *Quant* the movie are your idea of visual bliss, you'll love the latest exhibition at Redland Museum.

"Fashion through the Ages", devised by Textile Department head Jan Banks and her team of volunteers, is a display of more than 20 articles of women's clothing, plus accessories, ranging from 1788 to the 1980s. Jan says that the concept of the exhibition grew out of the textile collection itself.

"Over the years we've accumulated a notable collection of donated garments, some with an impressive back story of their own," says Jan – who has worked in textiles for 22 years. "Two of our earliest pieces are replicas, painstakingly created from the originals, but the rest of the collection are originals."

The earliest gown is a recreation of a dress belonging to Esther Arndell, daughter of an emigrant English surgeon, who became the wife of explorer William Hovell. Another dress in the collection belonged to a descendent of one of the Whitman brothers, who finding themselves stranded in the Barcoo with a broken cart axle, became founders of Isisford in central west Queensland. A fur jacket that belonged to Lillie Maude (the wife of Brisbane's first Lord Mayor, William Jolly) is a featured garment- but Jan's favourite is perhaps a hand-beaded blue silk "flapper's" dress, so delicate that it has to be displayed laid out flat, rather than on a model.

"Originally we didn't have a designated textile area and items were displayed on models or stored throughout the Museum," Jan recalls. "The late Dorothy Templeton BEM, a founding member of the Museum, had handwritten cards for every item, then in 2000 the whole collection was computerised and housed in a new upstairs textile room until 2013, when our current hall and workroom were built."

Textile experts from the Queensland Museum had advised and trained Dorothy on the care and storage of textiles; Dorothy and the qualified curator in turn trained the volunteers. When Dorothy retired in 2009 she handed the baton to Jan, whose lifetime passion for textiles made her the automatic choice.

In the exhibition each decade is represented by at least one garment. The changes in the type and amount of fabrics used and the styles and the freedom they accorded the wearer are all indicators of prosperity, wartime austerity, depression economies, development of new fabrics and changing social attitudes. A highlight of the exhibition will be a talk and PowerPoint presentation on 23rd October given by members of the Textile Team; Jan Banks, Anne Tully, Nola McCullagh, Val Taylor, Robin Matfin and Susan Hoy.





NUT-CRUSTED BAKED FISH RECIPE

Here's a quick and easy fish recipe that adds extra crunch and flavour to your catch of the day. Serves 4.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 firm pieces of fish Barramundi is excellent for this
- 1 cup of your favourite mixed nuts (e.g. almonds, pecans, walnuts, macadamias, or use just one nut variety), finely chopped
- 1/4 cup breadcrumbs
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley, finely chopped
- 1-2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- · 2 tablespoons honey or maple syrup
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- · Salt and pepper to taste
- · Lemon wedges to serve
- · Chopped fresh herbs for garnish (optional)

METHOD

- 1. Preheat your oven to 200°C, then line a flat baking tray with greaseproof paper.
- 2. Combine the mixed nuts, breadcrumbs, and parsley in a bowl, then season with a pinch of salt and black pepper.
- 3. Now coat the fish. Start by patting the fish dry with a paper towel, then brush each fillet with a layer of Dijon mustard on the top. This is important as it helps the nut mixture stick to the fish.
- 4. Press the nut, parsley and breadcrumb mixture onto the mustard-coated side of each fish fillet to create an even layer of nuts.
- 5. Drizzle honey (or maple syrup) and olive oil over the fish. The olive oil will help to create a crusty crust!
- 6. Place the fish on the baking tray, nut-crust side up and bake for 10-15 minutes or until cooked through.

Serve with lemon wedges, and garnish with whatever herbs you have on hand - dill works well with this recipe.

SEPTEMBER FISHING: A WHALE OF A TIME!

I know it's a fishing column, but when the whales are in, and you see the size of them as they go past your boat, and you realise that the calf is as big as your old bay cruiser, it's pretty amazing! Especially to see Mum being so protective; it's one of the best sights in the bay this time of year. And, how lucky are we to see them just east of Green Island and Wellington Point and around Peel Island? Looking at records, the next four weeks are when

most whales come in to rest before the long journey to the South Pole, so if you get a chance during the school holidays, it's worth a look around the bay to see these magnificent mammals.

The school mackerel season is at its peak this month, and you should start to catch them all through the bay from close in at Manly Harbour, last leads, to King and Green Islands, all the way to Ormiston and east to the Naval Banks. So, there's no excuse for not getting a good feed; you can troll to find them, anchor up, drop some pillies on ganged hooks, and wait.

The whiting should be in the small boat channel and the Rous this time of year, and the Sand Hills at Moreton should also be firing, along with Amity Banks, close in at Darcy Light. The area between the shallows in front of Wynnum Creek out towards St Helena has also been good over the years, and the snapper and squire/sweet lip should be looking for us. Since the opening of the snapper season in mid-August, there are always plenty of snapper and squire in the bay to keep us all happy in September. My favourite areas to find them are around the shallow grounds around all the Bay Islands.

Many of us would love to grow our vegies from seed, but what seeds should be planted at this time of the year?

Redland Organic Growers Inc. (ROGI) is fortunate to have horticulturist Linda Brennan as a member to provide best practices for its budding vegetable growers. The group recently awarded Linda life membership for her willingness to inspire, educate and share her love of gardening. She said her passion for teaching organic gardening stems from her early childhood, where she learnt to grow delicious, fresh food in her very productive family garden.

Linda's philosophy embraces organic growing and biodynamic principles that not only support human health but also encourage a living, healthy garden environment.

"I believe every garden, no matter how small or large, can be a source of food and joy. Spring is a wonderful time for planting," says Linda.

LINDA'S FAVOURITES

"I love to grow beetroot at this time of the year. Detroit Dark Red is always popular but if you haven't tried Chioggia Beet, you must give it a go. This beautiful Italian heirloom variety, sometimes called Candy Stripe, is distinguished from other varieties with its unique alternating pink and white rings inside, and sweeter taste.

"Do yourself a favour and plant sweet corn. You'll need to plant at least a dozen though, as each plant fertilises the following one.

"If you have trouble growing snow peas – sometimes they will go curly – why not try growing sugar peas on your trellis instead. They have the same beautiful flavour with a little more sweetness and crunch.

"Leeks will thrive now, especially with a sprinkle of sulphur. All members of the onion family love a little sulphur."

ROGI holds bi-monthly workshops where members can gain hands-on experience using different seed treatments and planting techniques.

To make it easy, ROGI Seed Savers have put together a bulk pack of eight seeds for its members to purchase, complete with growing instructions. The pack includes a rainbow mix of cherry tomatoes, sweet corn, sprouting broccolini, a salad mix of different lettuces, basil, sugar snap peas, and the root vegetable kohl rabi. Planning for the next generation

Superannuation works fantastically well as a retirement vehicle. Once a person has met a condition of release (that is, retired and met the access rules), funds can be accessed with no tax payable. Superannuation payments can supplement or replace the age pension to support lifestyle in retirement.

Part of retirement planning should also consider the end of the retirement journey. That is, what will happen to superannuation when a member passes away (hopefully after a long and joyous retirement). Superannuation doesn't automatically form part of a person's estate. There are specific rules that govern what will happen to a superannuation account when a member passes away. Firstly, a death benefit must be paid. There is some choice surrounding the form that this can take.

To determine the best strategy, it's prudent to start by considering the possible beneficiaries.

Superannuation death benefits can only be paid to certain individuals. These are a person's spouse, their child, or someone with whom they have an interdependent relationship. If none of these people are available (or if preferred by the member), funds can also be paid to a person's estate and distributed via wishes set down in a Will. Keep in mind that this will allow the superannuation to form part of the estate,

which can be challenged. A correctly documented binding death benefit nomination accepted by a superannuation fund cannot be challenged.

There are further options to consider, such as what form the benefit should take (lump sum or a pension), and what tax consequences may apply. It can be very useful to seek some advice from a financial planner or a superannuation provider to find out more about the options that are available. For example, lump sums paid to a spouse, partner, or interdependent can be tax free, while lump sums paid to adult children (non-dependents) may have tax applied to a portion of the payment.
