

Baysiders the Lindum Station upgrade is full steam ahead and in January the station will close to the public to build new platforms, new footbridge and lift and many other features. Closing the station is the safest option for all customers. I know that this will cause some inconvenience, however the end results will be an outstanding new station that provides full accessibility for all customers.

To ensure everyone is prepared for this closure, Queensland Rail has been on station engaging with customers and is developing an Alternative Transport Plan to meet the needs of all customers.

Queensland Rail will continue to engage with customers throughout the project.

Morningside and Buranda Stations on the Cleveland line are also receiving significant upgrades and will be closed during these works.

# **ALL ABOUT TICK PARALYSIS**

The warmer months have seen an increase in the number of cases of tick paralysis seen at vet hospitals across Brisbane. Tick paralysis is caused by the paralysis tick, Ixodes holocyclus and can rapidly cause extremely serious clinical signs. Tick paralysis can be fatal if not recognised and treated



Tick paralysis is the result of a neurotoxin released by the tick as it feeds on your pet's blood. The toxin blocks the neuromuscular junction, which means that messages sent by the nerves cannot get through to the muscles. Common signs of tick paralysis include:

- Loss of coordination in the back legs ("wobbliness"), which progresses to include the front – legs;
- · Change or loss of vocalisation a husky-sounding bark or meow may develop;
- · Coughing;
- Gagging and vomiting;
- Loss of appetite;
- Increased respiratory effort. Severe cases of tick paralysis can result in respiratory paralysis and require the patient to be ventilated.

Ticks can be carried and spread by marsupials without developing signs of tick paralysis. Possums and bandicoots are common culprits, and there are large numbers of them in our suburbs and backyards, which means that even dogs and cats that don't leave your yard may be exposed to ticks.

Prevention is the best way to ensure your pet stays safe. Daily tick searches are important - thoroughly checking your pet's coat, including inside the ears, under the lips, between the toes and around the genitals, can help you locate and remove ticks before they cause a problem. There are a number of products available for both dogs and cats to help control paralysis ticks. Have a chat with your vet about the best choice of product for your pet.

# POINT LOOKOUT SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB: SERVING WHILE THEY SURF

People come to volunteering through many different paths – for Matt ("Emu") Robinson it was more of a lifestyle choice than sheer altruism. Matt, now president of the Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Club on Minjerribah, started with the club as a 13-year-old Nipper.

"The family had always lived in the Redlands near the Bay and surfing was just a part of life in summertime," he says.

"Straddie was a regular holiday spot – we actually moved there for several years when I was a teenager – and the Point Lookout Club has always been my home base."

The club, which was founded in 1947, now boasts around 500 members. In the summer weekends senior members are a reassuring presence on Minjerribah's two most popular surfing beaches, Main Beach and Cylinder Beach. Matt says that the club has some unique features that put extra demands on its resources.

"We're one of the few clubs that actually patrol two beaches, which puts a real demand on our resources, both volunteers and equipment," he says.

"We run weekend patrols, from the September school holidays to the Monday of the May Day long weekend. That means a nine-hour commitment for eight to 12 alternating life savers on both beaches every Saturday and Sunday through summer. That's a big ask!"

Matt says that surf lifesaving, like many volunteer-driven organisations, took a dive in membership during the worst of the COVID epidemic.

"Volunteer numbers seem to picking up again but despite probably having the highest number of volunteers in the 16 to 30-year-old age bracket we're always needful of more recruits. Some find themselves with family and other life commitments that pull them away. Some lose the physical ability to do actual rescue work but we're always quick to point out that there are ways of volunteering other than battling a rough surf."



Because of its remoteness the Point Lookout club has a radio room facility that needs operators — and because it doesn't have the financial support of a big club house with gambling facilities it needs people to throw themselves into the vital task of fundraising.

"Anyone who wants to get involved in volunteering with a spectacular view is more than welcome," Matt says. "The majority of our members aren't Island locals — they do a weekend commute from the mainland with the option of staying overnight in our clubhouse dormitory — dinner and breakfast provided, of course."

And the cherry on the cake is getting to wear the red and yellow quartered cap, which is good for a smile of recognition and appreciation anywhere in Australia.



# DO YOU KNOW ABOUT CORONARY ARTERY CALCIUM SCORES?

Heart attack and stroke are some of Australia's biggest killers. Wonderfully, in medicine, we have many tools available to us to help assess a patient's risk of developing cardiovascular disease (i.e. angina, heart attack) and stroke.

All patients over the age of 45 (who are not already at high risk of developing cardiovascular disease) should have their absolute Cardiovascular Risk calculated by their GP. Doctors use a Cardiovascular (CVD) Risk Calculator Tool, which uses your blood pressure and cholesterol scores to calculate your risk of developing cardiovascular disease.



Unfortunately, no tool is without its pitfalls, and occasionally, the CVD Risk Calculator may UNDERESTIMATE risk for certain populations, such as in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples or in other individuals with known risk-enhancing factors that are not fully captured in the algorithm (e.g. family history, alcohol intake, weight).

For patients who are deemed to be at low to moderate risk of cardiovascular disease using the CVD Risk Calculator, their doctor may decide to order a Coronary Artery Calcium Score for the purpose of confirming or reclassifying a patient's risk.

A Coronary Artery Calcium Score uses a CT scan to measure the amount of calcified plaque (cholesterol deposit) inside the walls of the heart's arteries (blood vessels). A collection of calcium in the walls of your heart's arteries can mean that there's a build-up of plaque (cholesterol). This could increase your risk of a heart attack. So even though your risk might be low according to the initial CVD Risk Calculator, you may be reclassified as high risk if your Coronary Artery Calcium Score is elevated. We encourage high-risk patients to aggressively treat their modifiable risk factors, e.g. cholesterol scores, with diet and medication.



#### **PITFALLS**

- If you are already deemed to be at high risk of Cardiovascular Disease, there is no need to get a Coronary Artery Calcium Score.
- A CT Calcium Score only checks for calcified plague in the heart's arteries.
- If you have elevated cholesterol, these deposits may NOT be calcified, so your CT Calcium score may still be low, even though you do have 'blockages' in your heart's arteries.
- If you have elevated cholesterol, you may have plaque build-up in other important arteries, such as the ones leading to the brain, the kidneys and the lower limbs, so cholesterol management may still be recommended even if your Coronary Artery Calcium Score is low.



# TAKE A SEAT AND CHAT: CONVERSATION TABLES IN THE BAYSIDE

Sit N Chat is a not-for-profit innovative initiative that is making a significant impact on the community by fostering meaningful connections and improving people's well-being. Volunteers chat with people at markets, events and door-to-door, and now Brisbane City Council has unveiled two new Sit N Chat conversation tables on the Wynnum Waterfront at Darling Point and Lota Park.

The tables are marked with a large orange plate on the tabletop's surface that reads: "Anyone who sits at this table is open to have a conversation with anyone else who sits at this table".

Sit N Chat has successfully created a space for individuals to engage in open and authentic dialogue — now everyone can volunteer their time by sitting at a table.

The table concept is the brainchild of Craig Moore and Clair Molyneux, co-founders of Sit N Chat. Social isolation and loneliness can be harmful to both mental and physical health and is considered a significant health impact on our society. An estimated one in three (33%) Australians reported an episode of loneliness. Sit N Chat is helping people in the community by tackling social isolation and loneliness.

In today's fast-paced world, many individuals feel disconnected from their neighbours and communities. Sit N Chat's conversation tables provide an opportunity for people to come together, share their stories, and build lasting relationships by providing a platform for face-to-face

conversations, combating feelings of isolation and creating a sense of belonging.

At a standard public table where two or more people are already seated, most will sit at another table, but the conversation table gives you permission to join in. Engaging in conversations with individuals from diverse backgrounds allows participants to gain new perspectives and broaden their horizons. These conversations encourage empathy, understanding, and tolerance, fostering a more inclusive and cohesive community.

Craig has also approached Queensland Rail with the concept of a chatty carriage on its trains. Sit N Chat is hoping to place conversation tables in public spaces, like parks, schools, and retirement villages all over the country. Imagine conversation tables in high schools where the grade 12s could run their own conversations with younger students, before school and at lunch times, encouraging a stronger sense of unity.

Sit N Chat started in 2022 and now local companies are helping out, too. Century 21 Wynnum recently supplied promotional bags with two-for-one coffees and meals from local businesses. The Cave has helped print 5000 safety cards listing all food banks, emergency numbers and charity contact details.

In addition to being a duty officer at the Manly Coast Guard base, and taking part in Search and Rescue operations with Water Police, Paul also acts as security officer for the base and uses his trade skills as a carpenter to assist with ongoing repairs to the building.

Mr Burchell was declared a 'Brisbane Community Hero' and interviewed before a large crowd of festival-goers at a ceremony in Manly's Bayside Park. His interview was broadcast on ABC Radio.

Paul also received a VIP invitation to attend all future Brisbane Festival events.







# MY MEMORIES: IF IT CAN GO WRONG, IT WILL!

This month Ross takes his storytelling a little further afield, recalling a very interesting trip to the desert!

I went to Alice Springs for work and stayed for a few days to see the sights. A friend lent us a 4WD to visit the Finke Gorge (about four hours west of Alice Springs). We parked at the end of the road, explored the gorge, and returned to the vehicle to head back to Alice Springs. When I put the keys in the ignition, the engine immobilizer malfunctioned: it locked us in, sounded the alarm, and would not start. It was late in the day, but one group was still in the gorge, and they took us to a ranger station. All attempts to start the engine failed (we were well out of mobile phone range).

A ranger gave us a lift to Hermannsburg Indigenous community, and from there we made our way back to Alice Springs late at night, dodging wild horses and other animals on the road.

I returned the next day with the owner of the 4WD who had been advised by a mechanic to try the spare key (in the middle of the desert, the immobilizer rejected the key which had always previously worked!). The immobilizer was now working but the starter engine failed. The cost to retrieve a vehicle from the gorge was \$1,500 so in a very confined space, we clutch-started the 4WD and I drove it back to Alice Springs (over exceptionally large rocks and soft, sandy riverbeds) without stopping the engine.

On the way we stopped for a late lunch, and concerned that the engine might not start again, we left the keys in the ignition and the engine running with a group of local youths milling around while we went inside the café for lunch. Driving back to Alice Springs, a tyre blew out and we replaced it (even though it took two of us about 20 minutes to remove the tight wheel nuts), all with the engine running and the keys in the ignition.




It was stressful at the time but a great adventure to look back on. Finke Gorge is well worth a visit but not the place to break down. The 4WD manual said that if the immobilizer failed "phone the dealer". That's a great help out in the desert!



# HOOKED ON OCTOBER: MORETON BAY'S BEST FISHING SPOTS

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos gave us the scoop on the best fishing spots in Moreton Bay this month.

The end of the year is fast approaching (it's only 12 weeks or so to Christmas!), and like last year, hopefully, October starts with a bang and gives us lots of fish and great weather.



This month, the whiting will be in the bay from the Rous and Small Boat Channel to the Chain Banks (generally on the Maroon side). The Blue Hole and Sand Hills at Moreton Island should also give us some nice whiting.

School mackerel should be close from the Hope Banks to Wellington Point and Ormiston. Hopefully, the water stays clean without too much storm and wind to muddy it up. The school mackerel seem to go off the bite with the big tides.

Snapper/squire and sweetlip should be in good numbers around the shallow reefs around the Bay Islands and the artificial reefs. I like the outgoing tides around the shallow reefs, and Mt Cotton reach in the Rous Channel is an area that produces good fish this time of year.

With October comes the warmer water and more pelagic action on the surface – let's hope, like last year, the spotties come back in the bay. November is better, but it's still worth keeping your eyes open for surface action.

Sand crab season should be well and truly on, so a couple of crab pots will get you a feed of these tasty critters.

Some whales running late for their migration south might be the bonus when going out in the bay this time of year, so keep your eyes wide open!

## SIMPLE SWEET AND SAVOURY WATERMELON AND FETA SALAD RECIPE

Here's a sweet and savoury salad that's perfect for a picnic in the park or brunch by the bay.

#### **INGREDIENTS (SERVES 2)**

#### CVI VD

- 2 cups of cubed watermelon
- 1/2 cup of cucumber, sliced
- · A small red onion, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup of feta cheese, crumbled (goat's cheese is also a good alternative to feta)
- · A handful of fresh mint leaves, chopped
- Basil to garnish (optional)


#### DRESSING

- 4 tbsp of extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tbsp of balsamic vinegar
- 1 tbsp of honey
- Salt and pepper to season

#### **METHOD**

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the watermelon, cucumber, red onion, feta and mint leaves.
- 2. Now make the dressing. In a small bowl or a jar with a lid, mix together the extra-virgin olive oil, balsamic vinegar, and honey until thoroughly combined. Season with a pinch of salt and pepper. Add extra balsamic vinegar if you like a bit more acidity.
- 3. Drizzle the dressing over the watermelon, cucumber, red onion, feta cheese and mint, then gently toss.
- 4. Now it's time to chill! Pop your salad in the fridge for about half an hour to let the flavours mingle, then serve chilled (add your basil garnish now if you're using it) and enjoy.

# WHOLE BODY CONNECTION TO THE MOUTH

#### FROM DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE

Every year in Dental Health Week dentists work together with the Australian Dental Association (ADA) to educate patients on critical health information. This year, the focus is on highlighting the connection between whole body health and the mouth. In previous articles, we've discussed the links between oral health and diet, diabetes, pregnancy, and physical health. There is also a connection between oral health and heart disease, Alzheimer's, lung conditions and inflammatory bowel disease (IBD).

Research is showing that bacteria from the mouth, can travel to other sites within the body, with inflammation in the mouth also increasing inflammation throughout a patient's body. Here is a short summary of the connection between oral health and these additional health conditions.

**Heart Disease:** Bacteria from the mouth can impact cardiovascular health by transporting bacteria through the bloodstream potentially causing inflammation in the heart.

**Alzheimers** Research has shown that periodontal pathogens have been found in the brain, triggering an inflammatory response that may contribute to a neurodegenerative process.

**Lung Conditions:** Oral bacteria can be aspirated into the respiratory tract, causing or exacerbating lung infections and conditions.


**Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD):** An imbalance of bacterial composition within the gut, partly due to bacteria transmission from the mouth, can contribute to gut inflammation and the development or exacerbation of the symptoms of IBD.

The ADA found that "65% of Australians identified that they did not know there was a link between their mouth and their body, while one in five Australians are still only brushing once a day, and 75% identified that they rarely or never floss". These findings are not surprising, with the substantial increase in periodontitis incidence and dental cavities, both of which arise from an excess of bacteria in the mouth.



Unfortunately, the link between oral health and general health is underappreciated. It is especially imperative in our younger generations, as big oral health problems as a child or teen means this opens the door to greater risk of all kinds of health problems into adult life. Prevention, as always is the best possible care for children's and adults' teeth. The importance of the six-monthly routine examination and clean is often underrated, and too often forgotten or pushed back. This gives your dentist an opportunity to help you stay on top of your oral hygiene and work with you to prevent small problems developing into larger ones.
