POINT LOOKOUT SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB: SERVING WHILE THEY SURF

People come to volunteering through many different paths - for Matt ("Emu") Robinson it was more of a lifestyle choice than sheer altruism. Matt, now president of the Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Club on Minjerribah, started with the club as a 13-year-old Nipper.

"The family had always lived in the Redlands near the Bay and surfing was just a part of life in summertime," he says.

"Straddie was a regular holiday spot - we actually moved there for several years when I was a teenager - and the Point Lookout Club has always been my home base."

The club, which was founded in 1947, now boasts around 500 members. In the summer weekends senior members are a reassuring presence on Minjerribah's two most popular surfing beaches, Main Beach and Cylinder Beach. Matt says that the club has some unique features that put extra demands on its resources.

"We're one of the few clubs that actually patrol two beaches, which puts a real demand on our resources, both volunteers and equipment," he says.

"We run weekend patrols, from the September school holidays to the Monday of the May Day long weekend. That means a nine-hour commitment for eight to 12 alternating life savers on both beaches every Saturday and Sunday through summer. That's a big ask!"

Matt says that surf lifesaving, like many volunteer-driven organisations, took a dive in membership during the worst of the COVID epidemic.

"Volunteer numbers seem to picking up again but despite probably having the highest number of volunteers in the 16 to 30-year-old age bracket we're always needful of more recruits. Some find themselves with family and other life commitments that pull them away. Some lose the physical ability to do actual rescue work but we're always quick to point out that there are ways of volunteering other than battling a rough surf."

Because of its remoteness the Point Lookout club has a radio room facility that needs operators - and because it doesn't have the financial support of a big club house with gambling facilities it needs people to throw themselves into the vital task of fundraising.

"Anyone who wants to get involved in volunteering with a spectacular view is more than welcome," Matt says. "The majority of our members



aren't Island locals - they do a weekend commute from the mainland with the option of staying overnight in our clubhouse dormitory dinner and breakfast provided, of course."

And the cherry on the cake is getting to wear the red and yellow quartered cap, which is good for a smile of recognition and appreciation anywhere in Australia.

HIT THE BEACH FOR 40TH GAGE ROADS STRADDIE INVITATIONAL

The Gage Roads Straddie Invitational, celebrating its 40th anniversary, claims to be the longestrunning teams surf event in the world. It started life in 1983 as the Straddie August Assault. It was initiated mainly to help businesses on Minjerribah during winter months, when the island's tourist numbers dropped. This year's event will take place on October 20 to 22.

Excellent surfs ensured highly successful events and the ensuing media coverage established the event as an ongoing attraction. Competitors are drawn from Noosa to Coffs Harbour and 16 clubs will compete this year.

The wide range of categories ensures broad participation possibilities, with categories for male, female and age classifications, individual surfers and tag team events. The judging is undertaken by a panel of professional judges. Key judging criteria are; Commitment and Degree of Difficulty, Innovative and Progressive Manoeuvres, Combination of Major Manoeuvres, Variety of Manoeuvres, Speed, Power and Flow.

Secretary of the Point Lookout Boardriders (PLB), Daniel Hatchman, says the club is expecting an impressive

"The event is always well-catered and Sunday afternoon awards presentation will be held at the Stradbroke Island Beach Hotel so we'd urge people to get behind their favourite club, embrace the community spirit and get over here for a weekend of high-octane surfing action!"

Curtis Ewing was the power surfer for PLB in the Tag Team Final last year and came in clutch in the last minute with a big score to secure the win for Point Lookout Boardriders.

WE'RE DOUBLING THE APPLIANCE 'CLIMATE SMART SAVERS PROGRAM'

We're doubling the Climate Smart Savers Program! The \$22 million program will be increase to \$44 million. This program is part of the Palaszczuk government's continued plans to ease cost of living pressures for Queensland families by providing discounts on a range of eligible appliances. It's estimated that making the change from two to 4 Star appliances will save households hundreds on their electricity bills each year, in addition to the government rebates. The initial \$22 million cashback offer was flooded with over 10,000 applications already received and the government is rapidly working through the approvals process. This comes on top of electricity bill rebates of \$550 and \$1072 for senior and concession card holders as part of the Palaszczuk Government's push to ease cost of living pressures for Queenslanders. WHY IS MY DOG ITCHY?

BY DR SAM JONES - MY LOCAL VET, CAPALABA

Allergic skin disease is the most common cause of itchiness in dogs seen at My Local Vet. There are four categories:

- 1. Flea allergy dermatitis (FAD) some dogs develop an allergy to the flea saliva and this means they may only require a single flea bite to cause severe itchiness and fur loss.
- 2. Food allergy this is often associated with sensitisation to animal proteins such as chicken, beef or lamb. The way to identify if your dog has a food allergy is to do a "food trial" using a specifically formulated dog food. Your veterinarian can guide you to the most appropriate food for this.
- Contact allergy some dogs will develop inflamed skin when they come in contact with an allergen
 in their environment. Contact allergy is often suspected when a dog develops skin disease exclusively
 on their paws, face and belly as these are the areas of the body most commonly in contact with their
 surrounds.
- 4. Atopy think of atopy like hay fever for dogs. However, instead of causing itchy eyes and sneezing, atopic dogs often develop itchy skin and ear infections. These ear infections are due to allergens in the environment (including the air) causing spontaneous inflammation of the ear canals which inevitably leads to overgrowth of bacteria or yeast in the ears. Every spring we see a wave of new atopy cases walk through our door due to the increased plant reproductive activity (pollens and grasses).

Allergy is not the only cause of itchiness in dogs. If your dog is itchy it's important to discuss this with your veterinarian so they can identify the cause and give your pooch the relief they desperately deserve!

The last tv show or movie you watched? Top Gun Maverick (again!).


Is there anything you'd like to see happen in the local area?



STEAMING AHEAD WITH AFTER-SCHOOL INTERACTIVE EDUCATION

The basis of early education used to be the 3Rs – reading, writing and 'rithmetic – but the current trend is for STEAM; science, technology, engineering, art and maths – and what an exciting mix it is.

Jodee Engeman is Community Programs and Partnership Leader for libraries in the Redlands and one of the projects in her very special toy box is STEAM Zone, an after-school interactive education project designed for young students, from six to 12 years old — and their lucky parents. The one-hour sessions cover a range of topics and learning media, from iPads to coloured pencils to dabbling in dirt and are designed supplement school curricula by exciting interest, prompting questions and stimulating imagination.

Jodee worked as a teacher in the Redlands for 25 years, for 10 of those years as a teacher/librarian. She's passionate about reviving the STEAM Zone project, which, like so many community undertakings, suffered from COVID lockdowns.

"STEAM Zone was up and running but COVID, with its closures and limited attendance numbers, really had an impact. Now that things are levelling out we're back into the program with a vengeance and it's proving even more popular than we'd anticipated," she says.

Some of the pursuits focus on a single module, some combine different topics. The afternoon's activity could be making a basic catapult from elastic bands and lollypop sticks, with a prize for the longest shot (carefully supervised, of course) or learning the elements of architectural engineering by building plastic click-in skyscrapers and bridges. Art and biological science link arms in the Living Fairy Garden project, where students build a tiny garden then populate it with coloured-in fairies (an activity equally popular with boys and girls).

Technology and art come to the fore in a computer program that involves colouring in a provided picture then animating it via a computer program; maths is well served by accessing colourful, animated computer programs that are real favourites with the students. Coding, grown from such historical roots as Morse Code and the Enigma machine, finds a modern-day expression in students programming the movements of little robot bugs. The sky, it seems is the limit.

STEAM Zones run from 3.30pm to 4.30pm at Council libraries at Victoria Point (Tuesdays), Capalaba (Wednesdays) and Cleveland (Thursdays). Parents are required to stay with their children for the session – and in truth, it would probably be hard to tear them away.





Queensland property continues to shine on

FROM THE REAL ESTATE INSTITUTE OF QUEENSLAND

Queensland property keeps proving itself to be a shining performer, according to quarterly median sales results released by the Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ).

The June 2023 quarter (April – June 2023) revealed that many of the Sunshine State's property markets remain in an enviable position, with statewide median house prices rising by 4.62 per cent over the quarter, and median unit prices lifting 3 per cent.

Taking a broader view and comparing Queensland's annual figures, the state saw substantial year on year growth of 5.26 per cent for houses, and 6.91 per cent for units.

Some regional property markets are running particularly hot with double digit annual growth seen in Bundaberg (15.19% for houses, 15.45% for units), and Toowoomba (10.75% for houses, 12.5% for units).

Fraser Coast and Ipswich were also standout annual growth performers, with Fraser Coast houses up 10.71 per cent and units up 17.73 per cent, and Ipswich houses up 11.34 per cent and units up 13.69 per cent.

Queensland's annual median house price reached \$650,000, while capital city Brisbane's annual median sale price dipped back below the \$1 million mark to \$985,000.

Meanwhile Queensland's annual median unit price remained just under half a million dollars (\$495,000), but reached a record \$510,000 in Brisbane – still practically half the price of Brisbane's median house.

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said contrary to commentary that property prices would go 'belly up', the data showed overall Queensland property is delivering sustainable growth.

"The dust has settled and we've returned to a much more stable sales market, with steady growth for owners and more time for buyers, and that's a great market to be in," she said.

"Interestingly, units are leading the way in annual growth in many of the state's major markets, particularly outpacing house growth in Greater Brisbane and the tourism centres.



"It's unsurprising that buyers are increasingly recognising the value and appeal of apartments, particularly those wanting to get out of the strained rental market and on to the property ladder.

"Over the past couple of years, the divide between house and unit prices in Brisbane has never been bigger, with units presenting a relative 'bargain' entry point and opportunity to live closer to the action."

Ms Mercorella said immigration to the southeast corner would continue to be a primary driver for property growth, particularly with the Olympics on the horizon.

"While these results are somewhat surprising given rising interest rates, Queensland's market is buoyed by population growth and a lack of listings hitting the market," she said.

"It's slim pickings for buyers hoping to secure a slice of the Sunshine State, and this creates competition and puts upward pressure on prices.

"But buyers have regained some time, with the typical time to sell a house expanding out to 29 days compared to a year ago, and for units its now 25 days, closer to a normal campaign period.

"The buyer mentality has now swung from FOMO (fear of missing out) to FOMM (fear of making a mistake), and accordingly we've seen the return of conditional contracts again."

We've asked Phoenix Group's Wendy Ziegenfusz to give us a rundown on the organisation's purpose, goals and plans for the future.



What is the Phoenix Group, and what does it offer?

Phoenix Group supports individuals with intellectual disability from 18 years of age and above. Phoenix offers Supported Individual Living in homes and supports all aspects of community participation.

Phoenix now offers several programs from its new Hub. Activities include arts and crafts sessions, a robust music session, hydrotherapy in a heated pool and a weekly cooking class where participants help prepare a meal to enjoy.

How long has the Phoenix Group been operating?

Phoenix Lifestyle Support Association was first incorporated in February 1999, and became operational in December 1999.

Who are the people behind the Phoenix Group?

President: Percy Ziegenfusz. Vice President: Johann Kaa. Secretary: Donna Eade. Treasurer: Joyce Murray. Board Members: George and Catherine Santagiuliana, Rohan Torney and Ari Elliott Leinonen.

Are you pleased with the building that has been designed and built at the Redlands Business Park?

It's absolutely fantastic; Phoenix could not have picked a better location and builder.

Greg Bell helped us immensely, not only with the design of the building, but his support in getting all the necessary documentation through council was crucial. Without his support, this project would not have succeeded. His brother, Steven Bell, who constructed our Hub, was exceptional to work with. His consultation over all aspects of the build was great. No request went unanswered; the collaboration between him and the Board made this a very enjoyable experience with very little stress. Our heartfelt thanks go to Greg and Steve, who believe in and support our work within the community.

What are you hoping to achieve moving forward?

We hope to continue what Ron and Joyce Murray started – that is to provide quality care for people with intellectual disabilities, not only in their homes but in the wider community and now at our Hub. We are a small boutique organisation, and our mantra is quality, not quantity.

Although we hold many activities for the participants in the Hub - two pool sessions per day, arts and crafts, cooking, etc. - there is an emphasis on inclusiveness,

and all participants are supported one-on-one.

We are hoping to build our numbers in the arts and crafts area and have made the decision to allow other participants to utilise our Hub - the only stipulation being they must be individually supported.



CREATING TECH-SAVVY SENIORS: BRISBANE SENIORS ONLINE

FROM THE VOLUNTEERS AT BRISBANE SENIORS ONLINE

Brisbane Seniors Online is seeking new volunteer mentors and new learners in the Redlands.

Brisbane Seniors Online has been operating in the greater-Brisbane and Redlands areas for over 20 years. The not-for-profit community group provides home computer tuition to seniors and over 50s using empathetic male and female volunteer mentors. Learners are taught the use of devices such as desktop computers, laptops, Apple devices, Android and smart phones.

With the closure of bank branches and shopfronts, there is a greater need to do financial and other transactions online. Other government bodies that are now discouraging clients from contacting them by phone or by visiting branches are those tasks related to Medicare and Centrelink.

With the proliferation of scams, identity theft and fraud, vulnerable seniors often require assistance to identify these and minimise risk. Brisbane Seniors Online is there to help in home visits for a very affordable annual fee. Losses from scams have reached record levels with Australian Competition and Consumer Commission data showing Australians lost \$3.1 billion in 2022 – up 80 per cent on 2021.

Whilst computer classes have benefits, one-on-one home tuition is more conducive to faster more confident learning as tuition is provided on what a learner needs to know and what they want to learn using their own equipment and at a pace that suits them. More mentors are required, and new learners over 50 are also welcome to apply to receive home tuition. An affordable annual fee of \$20 joining (one off fee) and \$45 a year gives learners 12 hours of home lessons and ongoing support for the balance of their membership year.

Learners who may have family and friends spread across Australia and other parts of the world can be



shown how to use email, social media and video communication to stay in touch, chat online and exchange photographs. Other advantages of having technological skills are being able to undertake research, make travel and accommodation bookings, catch up on TV programs missed and stream movies.

Currently, Brisbane Seniors Online has a shortage of mentors in the Redlands area. Empathic volunteer mentors are required to assist in helping over 50s become confident to use emerging technology and the internet safely. The average age of learners is 74, and the organisation's philosophy is that it is never too late to learn emerging technology.

IT'S SENIORS MONTH, SO DISCOVER YOUR BENEFITS AS A SENIOR

CONTRIBUTED BY NATIONAL SENIORS

Being a senior in Australia comes with its perks, but many are unaware of the range of concessions, rebates, and discounts available to them. These benefits can differ based on age, location, and work status. To simplify this, National Seniors Australia has created a user-friendly Concessions Calculator designed to simplify the process of discovering the concessions available to you.

Whether you're newly retired or have been enjoying retirement for some time, this tool can help you maximise your savings by identifying eligible concessions based on your state and any concession cards you possess.

Your starting point should be obtaining an Age Pension card, State or Territory Seniors Card, or Commonwealth Seniors Health Card. These cards offer various concessions, making them essential for retirees.

For example, In Queensland, you can get a State Government Seniors card if you're 65 years or older and working fewer than 35 hours a week in paid employment. That card gives you a gas and electricity rebate, public transport concessions, and a reduced rate for car registration.

You can also join National Seniors for only \$49.50 and gain access to an array of retail and service discounts. In an economy with 6% inflation, every bit helps when you're a retiree. If you're asset-rich but pension-ineligible, look into the Commonwealth Seniors Health Card. This grants access to subsidised medicines and other concessions, based on an income test. If you're a self-funded retiree above the pension age of 67, you should put in an application and see if you're eligible, because the CSHC is not automatically issued.



Don't forget about other perks, like the Australia Post concession that allows Seniors Card holders to purchase stamps at a reduced rate.


THE WAY WE SEE: A PHOTOGRAPHIC EXHIBITION



SIMPLE SWEET AND SAVOURY WATERMELON AND FETA SALAD RECIPE

Here's a sweet and savoury salad that's perfect for a picnic in the park or brunch by the bay.

INGREDIENTS (SERVES 2)

SALAD

- 2 cups of cubed watermelon
- 1/2 cup of cucumber, sliced
- · A small red onion, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup of feta cheese, crumbled (goat's cheese is also a good alternative to feta)
- A handful of fresh mint leaves, chopped
- Basil to garnish (optional)

DRESSING

- 4 tbsp of extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tbsp of balsamic vinegar
- 1 tbsp of honey
- · Salt and pepper to season

METHOD

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the watermelon, cucumber, red onion, feta and mint leaves.
- 2. Now make the dressing. In a small bowl or a jar with a lid, mix together the extra-virgin olive oil, balsamic vinegar, and honey until thoroughly combined. Season with a pinch of salt and pepper. Add extra balsamic vinegar if you like a bit more acidity.
- 3. Drizzle the dressing over the watermelon, cucumber, red onion, feta cheese and mint, then gently toss.
- 4. Now it's time to chill! Pop your salad in the fridge for about half an hour to let the flavours mingle, then serve chilled (add your basil garnish now if you're using it) and enjoy.





HOOKED ON OCTOBER: MORETON BAY'S BEST FISHING SPOTS

Local fisherman Spero Kartanos gave us the scoop on the best fishing spots in Moreton Bay this month.

The end of the year is fast approaching (it's only 12 weeks or so to Christmas!), and like last year, hopefully, October starts with a bang and gives us lots of fish and great weather.



This month, the whiting will be in the bay from the Rous and Small Boat Channel to the Chain Banks (generally on the Maroon side). The Blue Hole and Sand Hills at Moreton Island should also give us some nice whiting.

School mackerel should be close from the Hope Banks to Wellington Point and Ormiston. Hopefully, the water stays clean without too much storm and wind to muddy it up. The school mackerel seem to go off the bite with the big tides.

Snapper/squire and sweetlip should be in good numbers around the shallow reefs around the Bay Islands and the artificial reefs. I like the outgoing tides around the shallow reefs, and Mt Cotton reach in the Rous Channel is an area that produces good fish this time of year.

With October comes the warmer water and more pelagic action on the surface - let's hope, like last year, the spotties come back in the bay. November is better, but it's still worth keeping your eyes open for surface action.

Sand crab season should be well and truly on, so a couple of crab pots will get you a feed of these tasty critters.







WHOLE BODY CONNECTION TO THE MOUTH

FROM DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE

Every year in Dental Health Week dentists work together with the Australian Dental Association (ADA) to educate patients on critical health information. This year, the focus is on highlighting the connection between whole body health and the mouth. In previous articles, we've discussed the links between oral health and diet, diabetes, pregnancy, and physical health. There is also a connection between oral health and heart disease, Alzheimer's, lung conditions and inflammatory bowel disease (IBD).

Research is showing that bacteria from the mouth, can travel to other sites within the body, with inflammation in the mouth also increasing inflammation throughout a patient's body. Here is a short summary of the connection between oral health and these additional health conditions.

Heart Disease: Bacteria from the mouth can impact cardiovascular health by transporting bacteria through the bloodstream potentially causing inflammation in the heart.

Alzheimers Research has shown that periodontal pathogens have been found in the brain, triggering an inflammatory response that may contribute to a neurodegenerative process.

Lung Conditions: Oral bacteria can be aspirated into the respiratory tract, causing or exacerbating lung infections and conditions.

Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD): An imbalance of bacterial composition within the gut, partly due to bacteria transmission from the mouth, can contribute to gut inflammation and the development or exacerbation of the symptoms of IBD.

The ADA found that "65% of Australians identified that they did not know there was a link between their mouth and their body, while one in five Australians are still only brushing once a day, and 75% identified that they rarely or never floss". These findings are not surprising, with the substantial increase in periodontitis incidence and dental cavities, both of which arise from an excess of bacteria in the mouth.



Unfortunately, the link between oral health and general health is underappreciated. It is especially imperative in our younger generations, as big oral health problems as a child or teen means this opens the door to greater risk of all kinds of health problems into adult life. Prevention, as always is the best possible care for children's and adults' teeth. The importance of the six-monthly routine examination and clean is often underrated, and too often forgotten or pushed back. This gives your dentist an opportunity to help you stay on top of your oral hygiene and work with you to prevent small problems developing into larger ones. Entering the property market

When I was growing up, our home was where we felt safe and loved. It was a single-story brick and tile house in Manly West, on a sloping block walking distance from my primary school. According to the internet records, it was purchased by my parents in the 70's for about \$35,000.

Time marches on. According to Realestate.com, the median value for a home in Manly West is now \$910,000. Based on this, that original \$35,000 purchase price from the 70's is barely 4% of this. The Queensland Government suggests aiming for a deposit of 5-10% of the purchase value when looking to purchase a home. Median prices of homes in the Redlands range from \$720,000 in Alexandra Hills to \$1,170,000 in Ormiston (for a house), putting the minimum suggested 5% deposit at between \$36,000 and \$59,000.

This can feel like an insurmountable hurdle for first home buyers. Therefore, it's important to have a plan and to take every advantage that is available. One of the lesser known strategies to get over this first hurdle is to use the First Home Super Saver (FHSS) scheme . There are two excellent reasons to consider this: tax savings, and investment returns.

Step one is to make the decision and commit to start saving for a property deposit. Let's consider two alternatives - saving money in a bank account, or the FHSS. Let's also assume that the individual saving money is making a gross (before tax) income of \$70,000 per year, and is aiming to save \$6,550 each year.

To save this money in a bank account, that individual would need to earn \$10,000 and pay approximately \$3,450 in income tax and Medicare levy to bank that amount of savings. Earning 4% on that, they may get an additional \$260 or so, but would then have to pay income tax on that also. Overall after 1 year, they would accumulate about \$6,720 (after tax).

The FHSS allows an individual to access funds that have been voluntarily contributed to a superannuation fund in order to buy their first home. This includes making voluntary salary sacrifice contributions to a super fund.

In our example above, the individual salary sacrificing \$10,000 to their superannuation fund under this scheme would pay only \$1,500 in contributions tax. They would effectively save \$8,500 for the first year, a tax saving of almost \$2,000. Individuals are able to undertake this scheme to save up to \$15,000 in any financial year, up to a total of \$50,000 of contributions

across all years. In addition to contributed amounts, they will also earn a rate of interest determined by the ATO called the "Shortfall Interest Charge". For the October - December 2023 quarter, this rate is 7.15%.

As with any tax or superannuation strategy, there are provisions and eligibility requirements. To find out more about the
