#### LINDUM STATION ACCESSIBILITY UPGRADE



Baysiders, the Lindum Station Accessibility Upgrade is full steam ahead. In January 2024, the station will close to the public to build new platforms, a new footbridge with lift access and many other outstanding accessibility features.

To ensure all customers are prepared for this closure, Queensland Rail and the Department of Transport and Main Roads have developed an Alternative Transport Plan.

Shuttle Bus 229 will operate between Lindum and Wynnum North stations, with a stop at North Road opposite Iona College. The fully accessible Shuttle will operate every 10-15 minutes during peak periods (7-9 AM and 3-4 PM on weekdays), and in-line with train arrivals at Wynnum North Station during off-peak periods.

Customers can also utilise the existing Bus Route 224 from Sibley Road, and Wynnum North and Hemmant Stations will also continue operations during the upgrade.

The Bayside Community Fund Gala Awards night was a huge success. With over 10,000 nominations received it was evident that our community loves and supports our local small businesses.







### **ALL ABOUT URINARY DISEASE IN CATS**

Feline lower urinary tract disease (FLUTD) describes a group of conditions which affect the bladder and urethra. FLUTD can occur in cats of any age but is usually seen in middle aged, overweight and indoor cats. Stress is a common contributor to development of disease.

#### **CLINICAL SIGNS**

Some of the common signs of FLUTD include:

- Straining to urinate
- · Passing small amounts of urine
- Frequent or prolonged attempts to urinate
- Vocalising when urinating
- Licking of the genital area
- Urinating outside of the litter tray
- Blood in the urine



Male cats are at risk of urethral obstruction – they may demonstrate any of the signs above and pass little to no urine. They often become increasingly distressed and very unwell. Urethral obstruction is a medical emergency which requires immediate veterinary attention.

### **DIAGNOSIS**

The diagnosis of FLUTD is often based on the clinical signs. Your vet will likely want to perform a Urinalysis – this is an examination of the urine to check for infection, blood or crystals. Radiographs and ultrasounds may also be required for diagnosis.

#### **CAUSES OF FLUTD**

Urolithiasis – minerals in the urine can form stones, also known as uroliths. These can cause irritation and inflammation of the bladder wall and lodge in the narrow urethra causing obstruction. Treatment of stones may include a specialised diet and in some cases surgery may be required to remove large stones from the bladder.

- · Urinary tract infection bacterial infection may cause signs of FLUTD. Infection can be associated with the presence of uroliths or underlying health conditions such as diabetes. Treatment of infection is usually antibiotics.
- Urethral obstruction small stones lodged in the urethra are removed with the use of a urinary catheter and flushing. Sick cats will require IV fluids and may remain in hospital for a number of days until they are able to pass urine. Repeated episodes of urethral obstruction may require a surgical procedure called a perineal urethrostomy.
- · Idiopathic cystitis is a very common cause of FLUTD. The cause of idiopathic cystitis is often not identified although stress is known to contribute to development of the condition. Feeding a specifically formulated wet food diet and reducing stress may help reduce the incidence of idiopathic cystitis.

If you suspect that your cat is experiencing issues with their urination it is important to seek veterinary attention.

### WHAT TO DO IF YOU RUN OUT OF MEDICATION

Medicines are usually dispensed by the chemist in one month lots, and quite recently, a number of drugs have been allowed to be dispensed in two month lots, with enough repeats to last six months or even in some cases, 12 months before you have to get a new prescription from your doctor.

In theory this allows you plenty of time to get to the pharmacy to buy your medicine, and plenty of time to book your appointment with the doctor pending the script running out.

Now and again, one gets caught short, and finds no tablets left in the blister pack or the bottle, and no repeats left, and no available appointments at the required short notice with your doctor to remedy the situation.

First, don't panic! Know your medicines and what they are for (your doctor can provide a neat print-out of your medication summary, annotated with the reasons for the medicines in the first place — do ask)

If missing a dose of your medication is life-threatening, for example insulin for insulin dependent diabetes, then the pharmacist knows to issue the drug even without a script, on the promise of one as soon as possible.

Assuming that you will get an appointment – even a phone appointment – within a couple of days, many medications can be 'eked out' temporarily.

Additionally:

- Anticholesterol medication can be missed for a short while without noticeable ill effect.
- Antihypertensives can be taken at half dose for a couple of days to tide you over, with due attention to non-drug measures for blood pressure control – exercise and no alcohol or smoking.
- Antidepressants of some classes similarly can be eked out, but for some a sudden withdrawal has unpleasant effects. A half dose for a couple of days is better than sudden withdrawal.
- Anti-inflammatory agents for the treatment of arthritis can be briefly substituted with over-the-counter ibuprofen and paracetamol in many cases.
- Proton-pump inhibitors such as Nexium and Pariet will also be missed if skipped. Temporary partial treatment of your reflux symptoms can be with antacids over the counter, while paying particular attention to avoiding any dietary triggers for your symptoms.
- Laxatives can be helped along with dietary management old-fashioned pear juice, prunes, pineapple, even liquorice.
- If you are suddenly without your contraceptive pill, use other methods of contraception until you are reinstated. You can expect a withdrawal bleed when the pill is stopped. There is definitely no need to panic!

Many other medications for regular use can be substituted with over-the-counter products, which of course may not be as effective, but will be better than nothing in the short term.



Do ask your doctor for a medication summary, and for advice on what you can manage without and how, for a short time, should it become necessary.

Of course we cannot control our inherited or predisposed conditions, and modern medical treatment has come a long way in lessening their effects.

However, many of our medications are for 'lifestyle' diseases, which in an ideal world we would not need, because we would eat with attention to cholesterol, fat and proper nutrition, we would have had a lifetime of regular exercise, and of course manage our stress and our environment.

As mentioned above, the trained pharmacist will dispense medication on a promise in urgent cases, and many of our cases are not so urgent after all.





### Interest rates dashing buyer hopes and slowing new supply

The Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) says November's interest rate rise would be begrudgingly weathered by most mortgagees as savings buffers rebuild and purse strings are strained towards Christmas.

As predicted by the major banks, the cash rate has been lifted 0.25 basis points to 4.35 per cent in what will be the Reserve Bank of Australia's (RBA) 13th rate hike this cycle, the first since June this year, and the highest level since November 2011.

REIQ COO Dean Milton said mortgaged households have largely adjusted their budgets to accommodate the fastest rising interest rates in a generation.

"While we've reached the 13th rate hike this cycle, there has been no material uptick in distressed loans, and most mortgagees have managed to grin and bear it," Mr Milton said.

"This is a positive indication that existing mortgage holders have shown preparedness and a level of resilience to rising interest rates.

"However, there are warning signs about the impact rising interest rates have on the medium to long term outlook – with first home buyers dropping off and building approvals collapsing," he said.

"This means that the dream of home ownership may be slipping further out of reach with every cash rate rise, and new housing supply is struggling to get off the ground.

"First home buyer activity was down 16% in the 12 months to April and there appears to be no desire from the Queensland State Government to arrest this trend.

"We also know that building approvals are nowhere near where they need to be in Queensland, with 33,755 new dwellings approved across the state, falling well short of the 40,000 or more per annum we need just to meet SEQ demands according to HIA," he said.

"This dismal approval rate matches that of the 1980's, when there was practically half of today's population to cater for

"Further, loans for construction of new builds are at record lows in Queensland signalling a kink in the pipeline of future new housing supply.

"In that respect, rising interest rates certainly do no favours for helping bolster our home ownership rates and helping bridge the gap between the sheer demand for housing and the shortage of supply.

"Both things which would go a long way towards easing the housing crisis."

Mr Milton said it was young borrowers and those on lower incomes who were bearing the brunt of rising interest rates the most.

"Spending is being driven by 55+ Australians who are a cohort that is largely mortgage free and less likely to be negatively impacted by increases to interest rates – on the contrary, their savings are boosted by it," Mr Milton said.

"Inflation is also linked to the large increases in electricity, government infrastructure spend, and fuel prices, which are not influenced by interest rate movements."




### **VALE RIC JAMES**

Wynnum Manly Yacht Club's (WMYC) oldest club member, Richard (Ric) James, passed away on 7 November 2023 at the age of 95. Ric had been a member of WMYC since 1986, and continued sailing his boat *Thanet* well into his 90s.

Ric was a qualified naval achitect, and worked as a consulting naval architect in Queensland during his 45-year career.

Ric designed more than 150 vessels, including Quiksilver's legendary MV *Indies Trader* (a diving and survey vessel), state government ships, the Stradbroke Island ferry, and many small tugs and barges operating in Queensland, the Northern Territory, and the South Pacific. Ric also designed the 'yellow submarine' glass-bottom vessels used for reef sightseeing, and the renowned *South Passage* sail training schooner — often seen in the waters of Moreton Bay — which has gone on to train thousands of young sailors.

Ric designed and built his own boat, *Thanet*, over 30 years ago for coastal cruising and the shallows of Moreton Bay. Ric maintained *Thanet's* secret weapon was her lifting keel, which always provided a little extra speed when going downwind.

### WHO WANTS FRESH SAND CRABS FOR CHRISTMAS?

It's the first week of summer; and let's hope the weather settles and conditions are great for fishing!

Looking back over the years, there are weeks in December when conditions seem unsettled, and big storms are the norm, so let's hope we get the rain without the hail (if we get any at all over at Manly West).

Water Tower Bait and Tackle

Whiting, mackerel, reef fish and lots of sand crabs should be on the menu in December, and all we need is the weather to play its part so we can get on the bay to catch a few.

If the crabbing is as good in December as in November, there will be plenty of crabs on the diner tables over Christmas, and the same for whiting. Now is a good time to catch them around the Chain Banks and Rous Channel areas, and they should be good sizes, too.

The snapper and squire will be close around the island drop-offs, so it's worth a fish, especially during the last run-out tides. We'll be waiting with bated breath to see if the spotty mackerel come into the bay again this year in more significant numbers, and we hope at least there will be a few school mackerel swimming around the Hope Banks.

So get the rods and reels cleaned up, have a few chrome slugs at the ready, along with a few spoons and diving boards to tow behind the boat, and keep your eyes wide open for weather changes and the amount of extra traffic on the water. Stay safe, catch some fish, and have a merry and safe Christmas. I hope to be reporting good fishing news in 2024!





This year Tingalpa State School celebrated its 150th anniversary. The school was established on 1 August 1873, making it the oldest schools in the Bayside area. "We are proud to have generations of families receive their education at our school. Many parents and grandparents of current students were once themselves members of Tingalpa State School and our motto 'Strive to Excel' along with the Tingalpa State School crest of a tree is recognised by the Tingalpa community as symbolising the history and heritage of our school and its community," said Mrs Donna O'Keeffe, Principal of Tingalpa State School.

History shows that Tingalpa has always been a place of community. For the Quandamooka people, the traditional custodians of the Tingalpa area, this area provided a wealth of food, around the many

freshwater billabongs and the creek. It became known as a meeting and gathering place, it was our original community. This sense of a community gathering place lives on today at Tingalpa State School, as it is the heart of the community.

Celebrations began in Term 2 when students and staff worked with local ceramic artist, Maria Barry, to create a 150th anniversary ceramic mural. The mural was gifted to the community by the school, TSS P&C and Member for Lytton, Joan Pease.

Tingalpa State School looks forward to embracing the next chapter of its journey, confident that the values it was built upon will continue to guide and shape the lives of its students for years to come.

### MY LOCAL MEMORIES: ROGER, MESSAGE RECEIVED AND UNDERSTOOD

### Do people train dogs to fetch, or do dogs train people to throw?

My brother, John, had a young, exuberant boxer dog called Roger. Shortly after Lyn and I were married we visited John and his family who were holidaying in Caloundra. We went fishing early one freezing winter morning in Pumicestone Passage in a dinghy with an outboard motor - John, Lyn, and me. Roger wanted to come, and John relented. We were catching bream on mullet gut for bait until Roger decided that eating mullet gut topped watching fishing. Obviously if Roger got what he wanted, our fishing trip would be over.

No matter what we tried, Roger would do anything to get at that bait and his antics made fishing difficult. There happened to be a sandbank close by so, in desperation, John dropped Roger on the sandbank, and we continued fishing and kept an eye on Roger. That worked for a while, Roger was close, visible, and unable to go anywhere, while we were catching fish. It was not long before Roger started to howl and tried to swim to us. He wasn't a good swimmer, so we picked him up, dragged him into the boat whereupon he devoured the mullet gut. ### Latest news from the Port of Brisbane Dec 2023





#### Trade

The Port's container trade during the first quarter of FY24 has been mixed, with export containers tracking slightly ahead against the same period last year, while import volumes are lower, impacted by current economic conditions

On-going high numbers of cotton, agricultural seeds and a resurgence of beef have attributed to strong export volumes. However, with a hot and dry summer forecast, agricultural seed container exports are anticipated to decline. Imports of household items, building materials and electrical goods are trending down after several years of historically high volumes.

### Community

We are proud to have launched our 'Innovate' Reconciliation Action Plan, taking the next steps in our reconciliation journey at the Port.

We proudly supported the Wynnum Fringe Festival for the third year running through our Community Partnerships Program, helping to celebrate the vibrant arts and cultural experiences the festival brings to the Bayside.

### SANTA'S PEPPERMINT CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE RECIPE

Here's a Christmas cookie recipe with a festive flavour, thanks to the addition of crushed candy canes and festive hundreds and thousands!

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- . 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup white sugar (granulated sugar)
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- · 2 large eggs

- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 cups plain flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cooking salt
- 1 1/2 cups chocolate chips
- 1/4 cup hundreds and thousands
- 1/2 cup crushed candy canes (a food processor is handy for this)

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Preheat your oven 175°C. Line a baking tray with baking paper.
- 2. In a large bowl, using an electric beater, cream together the softened butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar until light and fluffy.
- 3. Now beat in the eggs one at a time, then add the vanilla extract and mix until smooth.
- 4. In a separate bowl, mix the flour, baking soda, baking powder, and salt.
- 5. Slowly add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, mixing until just combined. Be careful not to overmix.
- 6. Carefully fold in the chocolate chips until evenly distributed in the cookie dough.
- 7. Mix in the hundreds and thousands and crushed candy canes to add a Christmas twist to your cookies. The candy canes will give a delightful peppermint flavour!

- 8. Scoop tablespoons of cookie dough onto the prepared baking sheets, leaving space between each one. You can make the cookies as small or large as you want, just adjust the cooking time (see point 9 below).
- 9. Bake in the preheated oven for 10-12 minutes or until the edges are golden brown\*. They'll still be soft in the centre, which is how they should be! \*They may need longer or shorter cooking time, depending on the size you've made your cookies.
- 10. Cool your cookies on the baking tray for a few minutes, then move them to a wire rack to cool completely.

This recipe makes between 35 and 50 cookies, depending on the size of each cookie

### THE ROLE OF YOUR DENTIST IN A DEMENTIA DIAGNOSIS

FROM DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE

Currently, in Australia, over 400,000 Australians are living with Dementia\*. This area of healthcare presents many challenges, both for the person being diagnosed and their loved ones and carers.

Dementia is a broad term used to describe specific neurodegenerative diseases such as Alzheimer's, and diseases that have neurodegenerative changes present such as Parkinson's and Huntington's.

Many people or their carers wouldn't immediately think of their dentist as a professional to consult when they've been given a Dementia diagnosis. However, this is a critical time for dental health.

It is also critical to establish a baseline of your oral health to support proper management of future oral health needs. For example, a comprehensive examination and Orthopantomagram x-ray (OPG) can assist with planning for changes to oral hygiene when the primary responsibility changes from the individual to their loved ones or carers.


As the person's Dementia progresses, it's important to maintain regular six-monthly checkups to ensure that any oral pain can be detected and treated, as the impact on the individual and their behaviour can be quite severe — especially if they're unable to remember that they have pain or symptoms such as sensitivity to hot or cold, or pain when chewing. These symptoms can occur without loved ones or carers present, meaning that all too often, they go untreated. Untreated infections can have a severe impact



on a person's overall health and wellbeing and can lead to widespread infection and sometimes even sepsis. Additionally, bacteria from oral infections can also be inhaled into the lungs, leading to aspiration pneumonia.

If you've recently been diagnosed, or a loved one has, consider booking in with your current dentist to start planning for your oral health and wellbeing now and into the future.
