US COAST GUARD WELCOMES AUSSIE COLLEAGUES IN 2024

Coast Guard volunteers in Manly and other bases around Australia have been invited to visit US Coast Guard bases and renew traditional links with their American colleagues. The invitation comes from Commander Roland Zwicky, Auxiliary Sector Co-ordinator of the US Coast Guard in Hawaii.

Australia's Volunteer Coast Guard – when founded in 1961 – was originally modelled on the US Coast Guard Auxiliary, the volunteer arm of the US Coast Guard.

Commander Zwicky has always been keen to maintain and support that traditional link. He previously arranged for local Coast Guard volunteers, including Squadron Training Commodore Simon Gideon and two-time Bravery Award recipient Steve Creevey, to tour Coast Guard bases while visiting the USA.

He also arranged for other Australian volunteers (including this writer) to join US Coast Guard Auxiliary volunteers on training sessions off Waikiki Beach to observe emergency drills and the recovery of safety gear dropped by C-130 transports.

These visits foster international links and present outstanding

opportunities for local volunteers to gain international experience courtesy of the enormous resources of the US Coast Guard.

In recognition of his lengthy and continued

support of Australian volunteers, Commander Zwicky was awarded honorary life member of the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association in 2016, by National Commodore Ray Campbell.

However, these visits and training sessions were curtailed during the COVID-19 pandemic. Now, with that problem largely contained, Commander Zwicky is keen to resume fostering traditional Coast Guard links between Australia and the USA.

So, in 2024, Commander Zwicky wants to hear from Australian Coast Guard volunteers interested in touring US Coast Guard bases or observing his training sessions in Honolulu.

Here, building co-owner Christina, from The Farley family, expands on The Mall's facelift and life in Manly.

THE REFRESH HAS BEEN A BIG PROJECT. CAN YOU TELL US MORE ABOUT THE REFRESH AND THE CHANGES?

Since its construction in the 1960s, The Mall has been a focal point for Manly Harbour Village, providing groceries, everyday conveniences and a range of specialty stores. It's a much-loved landmark in our community.

In addition to addressing some maintenance issues, we wanted to 'sharpen up' the aesthetic of The Mall at a time when other exciting developments are underway in Manly Harbour Village. The renovation of The Manly Hotel, the construction of luxury apartments at 191 Stratton Terrace, the new Manly Boat House and the redeveloped Manly Harbour Boat Club are exciting developments in the area. It's great to see so many new projects in the works!

Because of The Mall's importance to the local community, we are firmly committed to keeping the character and essence of the building. By returning to the name The Mall (the centre was originally known as The Manly Mall) and incorporating the breeze-block design in new aluminium screening, we have given the nod to the centre's 1960s origins. Being able to repair the beautiful tiled floors was also a big win in preserving The Mall's character.

WHAT PART OF THE REFRESH ARE YOU MOST PLEASED WITH?

I love the unique sense of space created by opening up the ceiling, and the updated bathrooms and fresh signage have improved the centre for our traders and our community. Where possible, we've used local businesses, such as the fantastic amenities signs hand-painted by local sign writer Kylie Eastham from JT Signs (you can also spot her work at Cambridge Lane). It's been so great to keep it local.

I'm also pleased we've incorporated some large, communal-style tables. It's been wonderful to see locals adopting this space to enjoy a coffee, sample some delicious food and connect with friends and family.

CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE FARLEY FAMILY'S CONNECTION TO MANLY?

Our family are long-established locals. Dad grew up in Wynnum, and now my brother and I are raising our families on the bayside. I love that our community is multigenerational; it's pretty unique and creates a wonderful community feeling. Every time I come down Cambridge Parade and see the water and smell



the salt in the air, it evokes a wonderful feeling of childhood nostalgia — like I'm holidaying at home!

We're lucky to have the bay to enjoy right on our doorstep. In the future, I'd love to continue to help improve our local area, especially by improving the connection between the shopping centre and the foreshore. It's important to create a greener future for generations to come.

ANY FINAL WORDS ABOUT THE MALL'S REFRESH?

Thank you to our traders and community for their patience and understanding as the refresh has been underway. Spirits have remained high, and the generosity of our community has been really apparent. Wynnum Manly Historical Society



REPAIR CAFÉ BRISBANE BAYSIDE

Bring your household items in need of repair to the upcoming Repair Café, where a team of volunteers will be available to assist you in fixing them. During 2023, more than 250 items were inspected at the Repair Café, with an average 70 per cent success rate for repairs. That's around 180 items and 440kg of materials saved from landfill.

Repairs are free, however visitors to the café pay for parts and/or materials used in repairs, while donations help maintain a stock of consumables and cover other costs. Visitors watch and are encouraged to get involved with the repair, which creates an opportunity to learn how things work and how they can be fixed.

LINDUM STATION ACCESSIBILITY UPGRADE

Baysiders, the Lindum Station Accessibility Upgrade is full steam ahead. Lindum Station has now closed to the public to build new platforms, a new footbridge with lift access and many other outstanding accessibility features.

To ensure the needs of customers are met, Queensland Rail and the Department of Transport and Main Roads have developed an Alternative Transport Plan.

Shuttle Bus 229 will operate between Lindum and Wynnum North stations, with a stop at North Road opposite Iona College. The fully accessible Shuttle will operate every 10-15 minutes during peak periods (7-9 AM and 3-4 PM on weekdays), and in-line with train arrivals at Wynnum North Station during off-peak periods.

Customers can also utilise the existing Bus Route 224 from Sibley Road, and Wynnum North and Hemmant Stations will also continue operations during the upgrade.



ABOUT HYPERTHYROIDISM IN CATS

Hyperthyroidism is a common disease in cats, usually seen in middle aged to older cats.

Hyperthyroidism is an increase in the production of thyroid hormone which is produced by the thyroid glands. Thyroid hormones regulate a number of processes in the body so overproduction can result in signs in many organs.



CLINICAL SIGNS

The most common clinical signs of hyperthyroidism are:

- · weight loss despite a normal to increased appetite
- polyuria and polydipsia (urinating and drinking more)
- · vomiting and diarrhoea
- · changes in behaviour
- changes in grooming behaviour which results in an unkempt, matted or greasy coat

DIAGNOSIS OF HYPERTHYROIDISM

Your vet will perform a clinical exam on your pet — this may show signs such as a palpably enlarged thyroid gland, thin body condition, poor hair coat and an increased heart rate, sometimes with a heart murmur present. A blood test will be performed — this will check for changes in your cat's kidney and liver enzymes which may both occur with thyroid disease. A specific blood test to measure thyroid hormone levels will also be performed.


TREATMENT OF HYPERTHYROIDISM

There are a number of options for treating hyperthyroidism in cats.

Medication — tablets may be prescribed for your cat which will
be given once or twice daily depending on the formulation. Cats
which do not co-operate with oral medication may be treated with
a transdermal ointment — this is applied to the skin on the inside
of your cat's ear where it is absorbed into the bloodstream. This
medication will be required for the remainder of your cat's life and
requires regular monitoring to ensure that the dose is correct and
there are no changes occurring in other organs.

- Radioactive iodine therapy a number of specialist centres offer the option of radioactive iodine treatment. This is a single dose of medication which targets the thyroid gland specifically, preventing production of thyroid hormone.
- Surgical removal of the thyroid gland may be an option, particularly if there is a mass/tumour associated with the gland.
- Dietary therapy with specifically formulated food may help regulate thyroid function.

Your vet will discuss the best options for you and your cat to help treat this common metabolic disease.

THE BONNER UPDATE

LINDUM: GET THE FACTS

The vital safety upgrade of Lindum Level Crossing is going ahead with all three levels of government working together to deliver this project. I would particularly like to thank my state colleague, Joan Pease MP State Member for Lytton, Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner and Cr Lisa Atwood of Doboy Ward for working with me to help get locals home sooner and safer.

Due to the Federal Labor Government's 90 Day (200 Day) Infrastructure Review, major works have been delayed.

Here are the facts:

- I secured \$85 million in Federal Funding for the Lindum Level Crossing safety upgrade.
- Joan Pease MP and Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner and Cr Lisa Atwood have also secured and contributed State Government and Brisbane City Council funding to the upgrade.
- Last year, infrastructure projects across Australia (including Lindum Level Crossing Safety Upgrade) were delayed under the Federal Labor Government's 90 Day Infrastructure Review' (which turned into 200 days).
- The Brisbane City Council could not award a construction contract whilst the Federal Labor Government was reviewing this project.

- Fighting for our community, I was able to retain the \$85 million in Federal Government Funding for Lindum Level Crossing.
- I have been advised by the Lord Mayor's Office that works will be **resuming in March**.

So, what's next? ...

Now that Federal Infrastructure Review has been completed, and Federal Funding again secured, the Brisbane City Council can get on with the job and award a construction contract.

ON Y'BIKE — AND GO FOR IT!

For those of us who grew up with Miss Marple-style pushbikes, the concept of BMX racing is a bit of a quantum leap, but it's a sport that's attracting more Australian competitors every year, and some of those riders are proving to be world-class.

For the non-cognoscenti, BMX is a contraction of Bicycle Motocross; BMX bikes are designed for off-road racing and trick riding. BMX racing originated in California and soon migrated to Australia; the classic BMX racetrack is in the shape of a tight letter "M", providing three sharp corners – edged by berms, or banked turns – and a series of jumps and formidable corrugations, all of which test the ability of the rider to stay in control and keep on track without losing speed.

The Sleeman Sports Centre at Chandler will host the first round of the 2024 AusCycling BMX Racing State Series on the 24th and 25th of February in the lead-up to the BMX World Cup. Auscycling's Performance and Racing Manager Luke Madill says that the event will be an inspiring contest of skill and grit.

"It will be a contest of the international best," he says. "The number of qualifying racers determines the number of contestants each country can enter for the Olympics, so every competing country will be putting forward their best riders for this series. Add to that the individual determination of each rider to make the cut, and you get top-class sportsmanship and breathtaking spectator events."

Professional Supercross racing, open to riders 16 and older, has been around since 1980 but wasn't accepted into the Olympic pantheon until 2008.

"There are more regulations about racing at the elite Olympic level," says Luke. "Riders must be at least 19 years old, and the race starts with an eight-metre high entry ramp that really gets the racers off to a flying start."

Luke says that, as is to be expected with such a physically demanding sport, a rider's peak performance years are usually between 19 and 30 years of age.

"While some retired racers choose a career as a racing coach, many, accepting that BMX racing rarely provides for a comfortable retirement, spend their racing years preparing for a total career change when they quit the track.

"Like most sports, the more seriously you take it, the more expensive it becomes. You can get a good racing bike for about six hundred dollars, but if you want to compete in the big league, your bike will probably cost you close to eight or nine thousand."

BMX racing's popularity was given a boost when it became an Olympic sport.

"Olympic acceptance showed that, though the biggest cohort are eight to 12 year-olds, it isn't just a sport for kids — it's an elite international sport," says Luke.

"And while there are undeniably more men than women in the sport - a ratio of about two to one - the number of women is increasing, particularly in the younger age groups."

In the fight against loneliness, communities provide a powerful counteroffensive, offering a social safety net and a victory for your health. Community programmes such as volunteer organisations, sports and gym groups, religious groups, and member associations are fundamental in the fight against loneliness.

Kirsty Foster, founder and CEO of Social Mums Club, which now has almost 10,000 members and was established in the bayside, says that "the busy nature of life means that mums, who are critical to our communities, have minimal time for fun, connection, friendship and wellbeing, and so often feel lonely, deprioritised and uninspired".

She set up Social Mums Club, which consists of free online and in-person communities, to improve the lives of mums by providing community and connection in an increasingly lonely world. And she tells some compelling stories of the impact that community and connection has had for her members — in some cases being the difference between life and death.

The message is clear: be socially connected in your community and you'll find yourself having a much healthier life. Make it your goal to be more socially connected in 2024 – your health and longevity depend on it.

A RUNDOWN ON BOWEL CANCER SCREENING

BY DR ORLA BARRY, MANLY VILLAGE MEDICAL

Anyone over the age of 50 is familiar with the "gift" sent out by the government every two years - the bowel cancer screening kit. Statistically, we know less than half of the people who receive them actually complete the test, with a return rate of approximately 40%. Yes, it all seems a bit yucky, but these tests can make a huge difference.

which can indicate a bowel cancer or its precursor: polyps. them early can help prevent that process from happening or

help detect bowel cancers early before drastic treatments are required.

The test checks for traces of microscopic blood in stool, Many people have polyps, and most will be nothing to worry about, but some can transform into bowel cancers. Catching



For most people, completing the bowel cancer screening kit every two years between ages 50 and 74 will be enough to help prevent bowel cancer. The exception is people whose first degree (parents. siblings) or second degree relatives (grandparents, aunts, uncles) have been diagnosed with bowel cancer. If this is you, your recommended screening process will be different and may need to start before age 50. No matter your age, if you have a relative with bowel cancer, you will need a conversation with your GP to decide the next best step. Similarly, if you have any concerns about symptoms such as a new change in bowel habits, bleeding, abdominal pain or weight loss, please discuss these with your doctor as soon as possible.

Queensland vacancy rates barely budge over 2023

FROM THE REAL ESTATE INSTITUTE OF QLD

Rounding out a year that was characterised by a highly competitive rental market, the REIQ's latest Residential Vacancy Rate Report released in January shows incredibly tight conditions continued in Queensland over the December 2023 quarter.

Queensland's statewide vacancy rate dipped slightly over the quarter to 0.9 per cent, reflecting a fairly consistent state of affairs over the course of 2023.

Of the 50 local government areas (LGAs) and sub regions covered in the report, 22 tightened, 13 remained unchanged, and 15 relaxed (but not materially).

The vast majority of markets remained well within what the REIQ classifies as 'tight' (vacancy rates up to 2.5%), and well over half were as low as 1% or below.

It comes as property managers witness sustained demand for private rentals, and while the social housing waitlist climbed to 43,000 Queenslanders in the September

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said rental properties were still too thin on the ground to provide comfortable choice for Queensland's sizeable rental population.

"What we've seen over the course of the year, is a rental property pool that's insufficient and under incredible strain," Ms Mercorella said.

"It's not necessarily that rentals are impossible to find everywhere in our state, it's the imbalance between the sheer demand and shortage of supply of rentals at certain price points and locations that's out of kilter.

"Many are finding it's a lot less hassle to renew their existing lease than to risk re-entering the fast-moving market, especially if they are attached to their area."

Ms Mercorella said the REIQ recognised these were particularly tough conditions for the most vulnerable in our community.

"It's very concerning that families in need are

being forced to join the queues in the private rental market because there's no social housing available to them and no hope on the near horizon of getting to the top of the waitlist," she said.

"A fair proportion of the distress we are seeing can be attributed to inadequate social housing stock.

"In the year to September 2023, only 269 social houses were completed in Queensland. and we know the social housing waitlist continues to grow.

"While we welcome initiatives such as the purchase of a hotel in South Brisbane to provide housing to those in need, the built-up demand is clearly far greater than the rate of social housing delivery."

She said for those wondering what lies ahead for the private rental market in 2024, unfortunately, it was difficult to imagine a dramatic turnaround in rental availability.

The unwanted title of tightest rental market

in Queensland was shared by the top and tail of the state - Cook Shire in the north and Goondiwindi in the south – both with a virtually non-existent vacancy rate of zero percent.

Not far behind was Banana (0.2%), and Southern Downs, Maranoa, Tablelands, and Charters Towers - all at 0.3 percent. South Burnett and Mareeba both had 0.5 percent vacancies and the Central Highlands and Maryborough hit 0.6 percent.

Much of the Greater Brisbane area hovered around the 1% vacancy mark including Brisbane LGA (1.1%), Ipswich (1%), Logan (1.2%), Caboolture (1.1%), Pine Rivers (1%), and Redland (1%). Moreton Bay (0.8%) and Redland's Mainland (0.7%) were tighter still, while Redcliffe had the lowest rate in the region at 0.5 percent.

Yet again, the only 'weak' market in Queensland was seen in Redland's Bay Islands (including North Stradbroke, Russell, Macleay, Karragarra, Lamb, Coochiemudlo) at


MEN'S SHED MEMBERS LEND A HAND IN THE COMMUNITY

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT: BERRY SWEET

BY KAT PEARSON, GIRL IN THE GREEN

Wynnum local and horticulturist Kat Pearson has a passion for plants, and here she shares some lesser-known facts about the Panama berry.

As I sit and write this it's rainy and cool(er), but earlier this week it was a true summer stinker! And what's the best thing for those days? Fruit!

Sugary, sweet, refreshing. Everyone knows mangoes, nectarines, peaches, and the slightly more 'exotic' lychee but have you heard of a Panama berry? Also known as a Jamaican cherry, it's native to Mexico, the Caribbean and tropical South America.

The tree itself is quite ornamental, with graceful weeping branches, soft leaves, dainty little white flowers, and eventually the prized rosy-red fruit that has almost a metallic sheen when fully ripe. They also happen to taste just like caramelized sugar, so maybe not the most light and refreshing taste, but definitely sweet and definitely delicious.

Muntingia calabura CAN grow quite big (up to 12m), and they'll do so relatively quickly — consider yourself warned. But if you do take on the challenge, they can make a great shade tree in a large backyard, full of sweet treats for the kids — admittedly if the birds and bats don't get to them first... If you have the space for one it'd be worth it. I promise. Cotton candy in a fruit and high in vitamin C to boot. Remember eating straight from a mulberry tree? Same feel, less mess.

They respond well to pruning if you want to keep them at a more manageable size, and they're somewhat drought tolerant once established. Or, if you're like me and really truly don't have the space (because you're a plant-a-holic and simply must fit in as many plants as possible), they'll grow well in a large pot as long as you keep the water up. I also haven't lost any fruit to the birds and bats (yet) but that might just be because it's small? Or maybe because they're more interested in making a racket in the banana tree behind it...



ABOUT KAT

I love gardening, growing my own food and plants in general. I've been working on our current garden in subtropical Brisbane for the last five years but have been gardening for much longer in all sorts of places. I'm an ex-engineer, recently turned horticulturist (life's too short not to work in something you love!). I grow edibles and ornamentals in an often wild, rambling jungle, filled with birds and bugs, including a handful of pet chooks and a dog (though to be honest you're more likely to find him inside on the couch). NO-COOK WATERMELON GRANITA RECIPE

Watermelon granita is a chilled frozen treat that's perfect for hot summer days. Serve it on its own as a dessert, or in between a multi-course dinner as a palate cleanser.


INGREDIENTS

- · 4 cups of seedless watermelon, diced
- · 2/3 cup of caster sugar
- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice

- Zest of 1 lime
- Mint leaves to garnish (optional)

METHOD

- 1. Cut the watermelon into 5cm cubes, removing any seeds. Place the cubed watermelon on a baking sheet and freeze for at least two hours or until solid.
- 2. Once your watermelon is frozen, in a blender or food processor, blitz the frozen watermelon cubes, sugar, lime juice, and lime zest. Blend until smooth. Taste the mixture - if you'd like it sweeter, add more sugar and blend again.
- Pour the watermelon mixture into a shallow baking dish, spreading it evenly. Place the dish in the freezer and let it freeze for 30 minutes.
- 4. Remove the mixture from the freezer. Use a fork to scrape and fluff the partially frozen mixture, breaking up any ice crystals. Repeat this process every 30 minutes for about two to three hours, or until the granita has a light and fluffy texture.
- It's time to enjoy your granita! Scoop it into fancy cocktail glasses or pretty glass bowls and garnish with fresh mint leaves.

FEBRUARY: THE WHITING ARE BITING, BUT BEWARE THE WEATHER!

February is a month of hits and misses. Weather-wise, some days are at their best and their worst at the same time, so you need to take notice of the weather predictions. Yes, I know they are not always correct, but we need to take notice; we don't want another tragedy like the one we had at the end of December.

The good news is that the whiting will be in excellent numbers in the Small Boat Channel and the Rous Channel. Some tiger squid will also be throughout the bay, especially on the last of the incoming tide when the water is much cleaner.

School mackerel should be close in the bay, and the spotties will be around the deeper banks of Hope Banks and towards Peel. Finding them is just a matter of keeping your eyes focused on turns flying over the schools. Out from Mud Island towards the Sand Hills is also a great area for mackerel fishing, but remember there is a green zone out there.

Squire, snapper and sweet lip will also be available around the Bay Island drop-offs and the artificial reefs.



There are also plenty of sand crabs this time of year throughout the bay, so launching a crab pot or two will get you a feed of these tasty morsels.

I have been asked a few times if you should use a sea anchor when drifting for whiting, and from my experience, the faster the drift, the better the whiting bite and chase. I prefer the big tides and the fast drift for whiting fishing, and I never use a sea anchor. Let's hope the temperature of the water is not too hot, and the spotties come into the bay and stay a while.

Prawning should also be in full swing, so learn to cast the net, and you should catch some.


Have fun on the water, but keep a lookout for storms and stay safe. Happy fishing!

While he had never used a beach mat before, the participant soon became accustomed to it and was able to easily access his kayak.

It was a warm, sunny morning out on the bay, with a light breeze blowing. Participants paddled together to the nearby mangroves and caught sight of a dugong in the water. Upon returning to the park, they sat at one of the gazebos to eat morning tea. Toni, the staff member leading the activity, led everyone in a sing-along on her ukulele.

The morning was greatly enjoyed by everyone, having overcome all barriers. Nature Freedom will continue to offer the new beach mat at all their forthcoming paddles at Raby Bay so that all participants in wheelchairs can experience the beauty of the bay. Their next paddle will take place on the 24th of February.

BAYSIDE VEHICLE RESTORERS: CUSTODIANS WHO CARE FOR CARS

For most of us, at a certain age a car becomes just plain old and ready for replacement by a newer, more state-of-the-art model. For those wise enough to hang onto that same car for a decade or so longer and it becomes a collectable, desirable, valuable member of the family, drawing admiring and envying looks and getting more than its fair share of petting and care.

Members of the Bayside Vehicle Restorers Club are a testament to the seductive power of old cars; old, in this case, is being at least 30. It doesn't matter what make or type the car is, if it's 30 years old and a road vehicle it's acceptable. (Motorcycles, buses and trucks also qualify for membership.)

Club President Albert Budworthy has been seriously bitten by the old car bug; he has a 1963 MG Sedan (named Millie) and a super-elegant 1955 Bentley (Bertha) that he bought from its original owner.

"Most old cars are given names by their owners and those were the names the cars had when I bought them," he says.

Albert says that some of the 450 vehicles owned by the 200-plus members are family cars that have been retained but many of them are deceased estate discoveries or "barn finds" — vehicles that have done a lifetime's duty then been left to dream their way to rust in a farm shed. But once they've been discovered and acquired by a club member the revival starts.

"We'd welcome more young folk but most of our club members are in their senior years and sometimes they have health issues that stop them from driving," Albert says. "On the rare occasion that a club member sells a car it's usually to someone else in the club, so it sort of stays in the family."

In a club atmosphere where car transfers feel more like adoption than just hard financial transactions, it's not surprising that their upkeep is done in-house.

"Most of the members do their own repairs and maintenance," Albert says, "and there's always someone willing to give a hand or offer advice for beginners. Spare parts are often hard to source but members make their own or have them made."

Albert says that even special parts, such as the bonnet emblems that are an instant identifier for some makes (who could forget the charging ram that graced the bonnet of a Dodge?) can now be made with 3-D printing.

Albert is one of the members always ready to lend a hand with the workings of the various cars. A mechanic by trade, until he retired from the position he was the custodian of the RACQ's fleet of historic cars; his list of rebuilds includes a 1904 Rambler, a 1938 Chevrolet tow truck, a Morris Mini panel van, a 1944 Jeep, a 1976 Escort and a 1961 Land Rover. Now, just being Club President takes care of most of the hours in a day.

"We've got a terrific team on the committee and the club is a really friendly, social group, made up of couples, singles – men and women – and whole families. We run events that enable members to really get the most enjoyment out of their cars. We have a display day every year but we don't have concours; that would mean keeping the cars constantly in concours condition and we like to drive them. We have an organised monthly run of about a hundred kilometres with a stop for morning tea and a natter; it's a great way to spend a day with friends who share an interest.

"I've just recently taken Bertha for trips to Obi Obi and to a rally at Cooroy; she really enjoys a long run."

Albert points out that to take one of the grande dames onto a public road can only be done if the car has concessional registration, for which the driver has to be a member of a recognised club. Even then,

the vehicle can only take to the highway for special events such as charity runs, rallies, organised runs and the like.

Concessional registration also allows specified use for events involving immediate members of the owner's family, something Albert took advantage of recently when he donned a uniform, polished up Bertha's chrome and played chauffeur for his grandson's formal.

"We don't think of ourselves as just car owners, it's more than that," he says. "These cars are a part of history and we're lucky enough to be their custodians."

DOES YOUR GAG REFLEX STOP YOU FROM COMING TO THE DENTIST?




Everyone has a gag reflex. Essentially, it's the opposite of swallowing and exists to prevent choking. - Sitting more upright we can accommodate placing the dental chair a little more upright for your procedures if this assists with reducing your gag reflex. Some people find if they're lying too flat, their gag reflex is exaggerated.
- Nitrous Oxide this is a form of sedation that helps patients to feel more relaxed, which can also mean the relaxing of your gag reflex muscles.
- Acupuncture there are two acupuncture points that can be utilised to reduce the gag reflex.
- Modern dental technologies such as Intra-oral scanners instead of gag-inducing impression materials and quick setting filling materials
 all assist with reducing patient chair time and the opportunity for a gag reflex to take over.
