The Mater Chicks in Pink 2024 Redlands Fun Run will start and end at the Cleveland Point Lighthouse, incorporating a 3km and 5km walk/run to raise awareness and funds supporting women with breast cancer.

Jo Kesur, local mum and secretary of the Redlands Volunteer Branch of Cancer Council Qld, has had her own personal journey with breast cancer and kicked the Redlands event off in 2022. Jo's diagnosis in 2019 revealed an invasive carcinoma, a hormone-based subtype of breast cancer. Having undergone surgery, Jo now undergoes monthly hormone blocker injections at Mater Private Hospital Redland as a precautionary measure to minimise the risk of cancer recurrence.

Each year, the Redlands Fun Run event has grown. It welcomes families, friends, sporting enthusiasts, fur babies and supporters to join the movement.

Avoid the city crowds and meet at the Cleveland Point Lighthouse in your pink gear and get ready to walk or run — there is a course to suit all fitness levels. The local Redlands Volunteer Branch of Cancer Council Qld will be hosting a BBQ breakfast and will offer sweet treats and pink merchandise for sale. You can also satisfy your caffeine cravings and indulge in a coffee.

In the week of March 10th, the Cleveland Point Lighthouse will be illuminated in pink as a tribute to the brave women who are courageously battling breast cancer. This symbolic gesture holds particular significance in the hearts of the Redlands community, where the impact of breast cancer has touched the lives of numerous families.

Join the sea of pink and help raise more than \$1.75M to support women with breast cancer. Funds will be invested in personalised, practical support services, equipment and potentially life-saving breast cancer research at Mater Health.

LEARNING TO PACK AN AXE AT 13 AXES, CLEVELAND

There's always excitement about doing something for the first time, whether it's bungee jumping or wearing false eyelashes, so when a mate told me that an axe-throwing centre had opened in the Redlands, the obvious response was, let's give it a go!

We ended up as a threesome, Jackie, Doug and I, all of us first-timers. Carving a Sunday roast was probably the only experience any of us had of aiming a sharp object at something with the intention of actually cutting into it, but we were keen. The frisson started as soon as we walked into the 13 Axes to be greeted by Jason Lake, who, with his wife Sammi, runs 13 Axes and the newly established Rage Room next door. (For more on the Rage Room, turn to page 29).

Jason's been running 13 Axes for nearly four years since a COVID-triggered job loss prompted him to build his own business.

When I later asked Jason what had attracted him specifically to axe throwing, he grinned and responded, "Did you enjoy yourself today?"

There's the answer – it's simply enjoyable. And it's not just Jason and Jackie and Doug and I who get a buzz out of it; Jason's clientele come from all walks of life and all ages – from 12 years old to a sprightly 99.

The axes used aren't the domestic woodpile species; they're specially designed and made competitive throwing axes. While your first impression might be that it's a dangerous way to have fun, Jason says that they haven't had an accident in all the time they've been operating.

"Everyone has to go through a safety talk and demonstration; the only times we've needed sticking plasters for minor wounds has been when - despite being told not to test the sharpness of the blade - a client can't resist the temptation of running their thumb lightly down the edge to check it. Not good for the customer - and the indoor astroturf is really hard to clean."

Some videos compare axe-throwing to playing darts but Jason says that golfing skills are closer; the ability to let your implement do the work rather than trying to push it through the air.

"Relax, chill out a bit and don't get frustrated when you miss - that'll just make it harder," he says.

Right. Training talk, coaching and demonstration done, now it's time to line up and take a turn. Jason makes it look so easy; position, focus, throw then a second's silence before a gratifying THUNK as the axe hits the bullseye. Doug's our first contender and he's a natural; didn't get the bullseye but after a few goes he did get the THUNK – and soon progressed to bullseye status. Jackie took a few more tries before getting to frequent THUNK and bullseye level, but she was obviously at home with the process.

I'd expected to do well, being blessed with sturdy Viking DNA. My position, focus and throw felt convincing, but the end result—with a few exceptions—was a CLUNK followed by an axe-falling-into-the-woodshavings sound. Jason was quick with a positive response.



"Look on it as great exercise," he enthused. "Every time you walk up and down, you've walked seven metres; every time you pick up the axe, that's a squat. You know, some people come here for the physio benefits."

Whatever the benefits, we left in high spirits, well-pleased with ourselves and planning a return visit. I, for one, am determined to become a mistress of the THUNK but in the meantime I'll wear my Axe Throwing Champion Badge as an encouragement award.

What's your favourite food? Anything really. I LOVE blueberries, bananas, apple, cabbage, mango, carrots ... so many!


What's your worst habit? I do sometimes yell (bark) a lot. My humans say it's for no reason, but I have my reasons. Apparently, my bark is quite shrill.



THE DANGERS OF CANE TOAD POISONING IN DOGS AND CATS

With the very wet summer we have experienced there has been a huge increase in the numbers of cane toads around. These jumpy creatures prove a great temptation to our dogs and cats with their exciting movement. Cane toads possess glands around their neck containing hallucinogenic toxic compounds which are expressed when they feel threatened. Dogs or cats biting or licking the toads absorb the toxin through the mucus membranes of their mouths. Poisoning can be rapid and severe, in some cases resulting in the death of the affected animal.

Signs of toad poisoning:

- Frothing and drooling large volumes of sticky or foamy saliva may be produced
- Red gums
- Muscle spasms or tremors
- Increased heart rate
- Seizures
- Death

Cats may show the above signs along with weak limbs and a trance-like stare.

Treatment of toad poisoning:

- Use a soft, wet cloth to gently and thoroughly clean the pet's mouth and gums. Rinse the cloth frequently to remove toxic material.
- Avoid using a hose to rinse the mouth as animals may aspirate the water into their lungs.
- Contact your vet for further advice. If tremors or seizures develop seek veterinary attention urgently.





PREVENTION OF TOAD POISONING


The most effective method of preventing toad poisoning is preventing access to the toads. The more common times of toad poisoning tend to be at dawn and dusk, but they may be active at other times. Keeping your pet confined within the house or a secure kennel at night may be required. It is also important to check outdoor water bowls regularly as toads may often be found residing in these water sources.



Canine Hydrotherapy, Remedial Massage & Laser Therapy

But Mum's sense of humour was somehow lacking, and she had no appreciation for our passion for scientific experiments!


May says that the contributors have chosen a wide range of subjects and styles to engage with the theme, showing our relationship and connection to the flora and fauna of country, cloud formations and

The first 10-week program is now underway, featuring a variety of nutritious dishes as well as some sweet treats, so students can learn and master a range of life skills, as well as learning about kitchen safety and hygiene.

Classes are led by Blue Tongue Pantry's Allan Groat, who has 35 years' experience as a chef in Australia and abroad. Allan also runs classes for the general public, and has experience running cooking programs for young adults with special needs.



WHO GETS THE PET IF WE SEPARATE?

Many people classify their beloved pet as part of their family – and rightly so! However, when it comes to family law in Queensland, all pets are classified as property. This means that the Court will approach the issue in the same way as it would when deciding the distribution of all other property of the relationship.

Legal ownership does not determine who will retain ownership of the pet in separation matters. The court will consider:

- 1. The pet's Council registration and microchip;
- 2. Who paid for the pet;
- 3. Was one party the main caregiver of the pet;
- 4. Who has the accommodation best suited for the pet; and
- 5. All other matters in relation to its care.

In a 2018 case of Gaynor & Tseh, the applicant sought an interim order that the parties pet dog be returned to him. Justice Cronin held that the dog could only be categorised as a chattel and that there was no logical reason why it was urgent for the Court to intervene to 'protect property'. Consequently, no interim orders were made regarding the pet.

In 2020, the case of Davenport v Davenport considered whether separating couples can have custody of their pets. Judge Tonkin found that there were no powers under the Family Law Act to allow a Court to make a shared custody order for a pet.

If you have been unable to reach an agreement following separation through negotiation and mediation regarding your pet, you are able to make an application for property orders which include your pet.



More Supply Would Render Reforms Redundant

FROM THE REAL ESTATE INSTITUTE OF QLD

The Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) says more legislative reform, announced by the State Government, doesn't address the rental market pressures that have been primarily caused by a lack of new social housing and private rental supply.

While the detail remains yet to be seen, the State Government has so far released a package of reforms including:

- Rent relief through a financial aid support package
- Portable bond scheme
- Rental sector Code of Conduct
- Installing modifications to rental properties
- Prohibiting the acceptance of rental offers higher than the listed price
- Attaching once 12-monthly rent increase limits to the property not the tenancy

REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said the problems the State Government keeps trying to solve through constant legislative reform, were symptoms of a market with dire supply levels, which continues to be the elephant in the room.

"For the fifth time in four years, the State Government has decided to tighten rental legislation in a way that is squeezing the life out of investing in real estate in Queensland," Ms Mercorella said.

"With this round of reform, they're creating an administrative nightmare with portable bonds, and potentially opening the door to tenants making modifications to rental properties without the consent of the owner.

"Our position is that current laws governing modifications are appropriate – tenants require the consent of the property owner

and the owner cannot act unreasonably

– but by introducing a 'free-for-all', there
could be costly consequences for property
owners

"We've been working closely with QDN (Queensland Disability Network) on an appropriate framework to apply in the case of a modification being required for accessibility reasons."

Ms Mercorella said some of the legislative reforms appeared to be more for show than of real substance.

"We already have strict legislation surrounding rent bidding in Queensland, which requires a listing price be advertised and prevents real estate professionals from asking for offers above and beyond that," she said.

"What this reform proposes to do, is to prevent rental applicants from offering more for a property to create a competitive edge. This practice has emerged due to the very tight rental market.

"If you fix supply, history shows that affordability stays in check because people aren't compelled to offer more to increase their chances of success among a big pool of applicants. A focus on supply would render most of these reforms redundant.

"As the peak professional body for real estate professionals we would be supportive of a Code of Conduct being developed in close consultation with the REIQ and drawing from our existing Best Practice Guidelines that we promote to the real estate profession."

Tara says that revising the available spaces, inside and outside the Museum, will make this year's Fiesta even bigger than usual.



UNLEASH YOUR FURY: THE THERAPEUTIC POWER OF RAGE ROOMS

If axe throwing isn't novel enough to take your interest, you could try a visit to the adjoining Rage Rooms at 13 Axes, Cleveland.

Rage Rooms are a comparatively new offering in the field of "quirky things to do at the weekend" and they offer the opportunity to let off steam in a safe environment. You pay your money, and in return, you're kitted out in PPE - full body and face cover - handed a hefty fibreglass core pickaxe handle and a crate of end-of-life crockery, keyboards and appliances, and escorted into a small, enclosed room with a single pedestal table. Each room has full CCTV that is monitored during the session for safety reasons and a small viewing window but once the door's closed, you can empty the contents of your crate onto the table and, well, smash them to pieces with your stick.

Sammi Lake, who operates the Rage Rooms, says that since they started, the public uptake has been remarkable.

"We opened in January, not knowing what the social acceptance - or resistance - would be. We sold out our first weekend. The business is proving to be busiest at weekends, and we've had to increase our stock to meet demand," she says. "In our first four weeks, we've had nearly two hundred customers, most of whom -1'd estimate about seventy per cent – are women."

A recent import from Japan, Rage Rooms aren't a replacement for therapy, but they seem to be meeting a need for quick-release venting - or doing something quirky and legal with a group of friends.

Churchill Fellow and Accredited Mental Health Social Worker Margi Bennett has more than 30 years' experience in her profession. She says that while there are varied opinions on the benefits of Rage Rooms research is ongoing.

"There have been concerns expressed that it could inculcate an attitude of resolving anger with violence, but Rage Rooms can cater for releasing everyday levels of frustration or feelings of being powerless," she says.

Margi points out that anger, properly controlled and used, can be a positive means of motivation and change.

"Negative emotions can be managed by a number of strategies such as hard physical action, counselling, therapy, physical exercise, relaxation and meditation. Many people benefit from learning to shift their body's reactions to emotional distress.'

Sammi says that feedback from customers has been universally positive, with "amazing", "refreshing" and "wonderful" being frequent descriptions.

"We're taught from an early age that it's naughty to break things, so it's really funny to have a group of adults decide to break the rules knowing that they won't get into trouble. They're the ones who leave laughing. I've had customers say that it's as relaxing as having a massage, and most folks leave with a grin from ear to ear."

Sammi says that some customers have used the experience to release the pain of bereavement,


and some, recovering from a broken relationship, have employed the technique of writing significant words onto a piece of crockery before consigning it to the pile.

"Interestingly, broken computer keyboards are frequently the favourite item for high school students," she says. "If a teenager has been subjected to cyber-bullying, it seems to be a helpful response to add to other interventions. The feedback from parents has been really gratifying."

For any customers with reservations about destroying useful objects, Sammi is quick to point out that the items they supply are op shop rejects on their way to landfill that are purchased, repurposed, and then given to local art workers for the creation of mosaics and multi-media artworks and installations. Some pieces don't even make it into the Rage Room.

"Sometimes people find pieces in their crate of items that they really like, which is even better," she says. "That china shepherdess with a chip off the base may find itself living a new life on a new mantelpiece!"

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT: BANANAS — IT'S TIME TO SPLIT!

Horticulturist and gardening enthusiast Kat Pearson talks about bananas this month and explores the good, the bad, and the ugly side of this fruit.

"They'll be fine; I'll keep them under control." Even when I know it's a bad idea, and I suspect I'll regret it later, I'm always the optimist. But now my bananas must go! Just like the heliconias, which turned my side passage into a jungle, and the native raspberry, which turned the back garden into a prickly nightmare (and still gave me no fruit!). The bananas have become too big and too unwieldy, and even though they didn't succumb to the storms over Christmas, their very precarious lean is the cause of much anxiety.

They've done well; I've had three bunches in about a year and a half, but, as the voice in my head told me at the time, bananas are really not suited to the middle of an ornamental garden bed. Mine are also five metres tall, because I had to have lady fingers and I couldn't find a dwarf cultivar. It has become rather perilous to

harvest a 40kg bunch of bananas from heights higher than my ladder, amongst a myriad of other 'precious plants'. It's been a relationship-building exercise with my husband; let's just say that!

If you do want to grow bananas, here are some tips:


- They are hungry and thirsty.
- They don't like wind. The lush tropical vibe you envision easily becomes derelict ratty leaves if you don't protect them. When they are top-heavy with a bunch of bananas, they are easily knocked down in storms.
- They should be kept to clumps of three: the main fruit-bearing stalk, a slightly smaller stalk, and a small pup in third place. Chop out any other suckers as far below the soil level as you can.
- Once you harvest your bunch, that stalk will die.
 Instead of climbing a ladder, you can fell the whole stalk in one go assuming you haven't planted a multitude of 'precious plants' below.

I love gardening, growing my own food and plants in general. I've been working on our current garden in subtropical Brisbane for the





SUPER CHEESY SPINACH AND BACON COB LOAF RECIPE

This is a super-cheesy dish, but in a good way! If you're hosting a hungry crowd, you can't beat a baked cob loaf. This all-in-one dip and bread delight is simple to make and easy to serve.

INGREDIENTS

For the cob loaf:

- 1 round cob loaf (sourdough or white)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil

For the filling:

- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- · 1 cup bacon, chopped
- 1 cup frozen spinach, thawed and drained
- 1 cup grated mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 2 large garlic gloves, minced
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- Salt and pepper to taste

METHOD

- Preheat your oven to 180°C.
- Heat a non-stick frying pan over medium heat, add the olive oil, and fry the bacon until crispy. Remove from the pan and let the bacon cool.
- 3. Using a small serrated bread knife, cut a circular hole in the top of the cob loaf to create a bread lid. Set the lid aside.
- 4. Hollow out the centre of your loaf by removing chunks of bread, leaving a thick crust around the edges. Keep the bread you removed for serving with the dip later. Take a step back, and admire your craftsmanship.
- 5. In a large bowl, combine the chopped cooked bacon, thawed and drained spinach, mozzarella cheese, cheddar cheese, mayonnaise, sour cream, minced garlic, onion powder, salt and pepper. Mix until it's thoroughly combined.
- Brush the inside of the hollowed-out cob loaf with olive oil and spoon the filling mixture inside the loaf.
- 7. Place the filled cob loaf on a baking sheet and put the bread lid back on top of the loaf. Bake for 20 minutes, or until the cheese is melted and bubbling.
- 8. Remove from the oven. Tear the crunchy bread lid into smaller pieces and serve alongside the reserved bread from step 4.

Hot tip: Mozzarella and cheddar cheese can be substituted with any kind of cheese that melts well – such as Gruyere or Emmental – and you can add vegetables such as chopped broccoli or finely diced capsicum, and garnish with herbs like chives or parsley.

THE CALM AFTER THE STORMS — AUTUMN FISHING IN MORETON BAY

The weather in autumn should see fewer storms and winds, so let's hope we have some nice crisp and calm autumn days with great fishing.

The school mackerel should be as good as ever this year, and autumn and winter have historically been the best months for them. I'm expecting a bumper year catching these nice eating fish. The area wide of the Huybers Light to the Hope Banks beacon is worth a try. There will be some very big fish, and you could also get lucky and pick up a sizeable spotty mackerel that might have stayed behind.

The water temperature will have cooled, but there might still be a few spotty schools in the northern bay, plus plenty of Watson Bonito this time of year, smashing bait fish all through the bay. If you want to chase these good eating and good bait fish, use a small chrome slug; they are fun to catch — good eating for some or great snapper bait for others.

The whiting will slow down a little after the initial run of very big fish at the end of summer. There's

been less of them in the usual whiting hot spots around the Rous Channel, Pelican Banks and the Small

Water Tower Bait and Tackle

Boat Channel over the last few weeks. Remember, the Maroon Banks and some of Amity Banks are green zones.

I'm still waiting for the tiger squid to show up. It's probably been the worst season for them around the southern and western parts of the bay. The only parts they've shown up in were the western side of Moreton and Amity. Let's hope they venture closer to home with less rain and clean water.

There were some lovely snapper and squire and sweet lip in the bay in the last month of summer and with the start of March, it should improve around the shallow Bay Islands and artificial reefs.

As we get further into autumn, the weather should settle, and the fishing should be perfect. There's nothing like dead calm days out in Moreton Bay. Good fishing!

A GRIM START TO 2024

Coast Guard volunteers in Redlands and Moreton Bay have reported a busy - and tragic - start to

Between Boxing Day and New Year's Day, four people died in local waters.

There haven't been so many deaths in one month since November 2013, when three people died in local waters. In the same year, ten people drowned in Queensland. Records indicate none of them were wearing life jackets.

As a result of those deaths, Queensland law now requires all boats to carry life jackets for all passengers and crew. In addition, everyone must wear a life jacket when crossing a coastal bar in an open boat less than 4.8m in length, and children under 12 in a moving, open boat less than 4.8m in length must wear a life jacket at all times. So must everyone aboard a jet ski.

The Coast Guard urges everyone to wear a life jacket while out boating. It's a little uncomfortable, but tragedy strikes without warning, and it's difficult putting on a life jacket once you're in the water.

Coast Guard also recommends boat owners join Coast Guard's Marine Assist breakdown service. This provides free assistance and towing back to port in the event of trouble at sea.

"Boat owners never think they'll break down," said Coast Guard skipper John Lucchi. "But over 40 recreational vessels called us for help since the start of this year. A tow back to port can be expensive. But with Marine Assist membership, it's free. That's not only a safety matter, it's also peace of mind."
