WATER BILL TOO HIGH? TRY THESE LEAK DETECTION TIPS

The BPD Way!

Is your water bill higher than usual? If you've got a leak, it pays to detect it immediately.

First, check all the fixtures in the house to ensure they are working without leaking. This includes flushing toilets, running washing machines, and dishwashers, etc. Once this check is complete and your fixtures are turned off, the water meter can be observed to see if its dials are ticking over. If they are, this could indicate a leak. If the dials on the water meter remain completely still and the water meter is not ticking over, this would suggest no leak is present.

Check your taps to ensure they are not dripping. Check for toilet leaks by placing toilet paper on the back of the toilet bowl to ensure no water is running from the cistern into the toilet bowl when the toilet is not in use.

Other signs that you have a leak include:

- Constant wet areas in the lawn or garden look for puddles or boggy soil.
- Damp spots on the walls or ceiling, peeling paint, discolouration, warping or flaking plaster.
- Areas of mould growth pay special attention to walls adjoining wet areas like the bathroom, laundry or kitchen.

- Unusual growth is there one tree or plant or one section of your garden that grows much faster than anywhere else?
- Cracking walls or foundations, as constant exposure to water from a leaking pipe can damage your home structurally over time.
- Warped or expanding cabinetry in bathrooms, laundries and kitchens.
- · Sudden and ongoing low water pressure.
- · Damp carpets.
- · A musty smell inside the house.







WHAT IS CUSHING'S DISEASE (HYPERADRENOCORTICISM)?

Cushing's disease is caused by an overproduction of the hormone cortisol. Cortisol is produced by the adrenal glands which are located close to the kidneys. The adrenal glands are stimulated to produce cortisol by the pituitary gland which is located in the base of the brain.

CLINICAL SIGNS

Cushing's disease is more commonly seen in middle aged to older dogs and only rarely in cats. The signs of Cushing's disease may include:

- Increased drinking and urination
- Increased appetite
- A "pot belly" appearance may develop
- Lethargy and weakness due to muscle breakdown

- Panting
- Fur loss
- Skin changes such as hyperpigmentation, thinning skin and recurrent skin infections

DIAGNOSIS

Diagnosis of Cushing's disease may be challenging, especially in early stages of the disease. A number of tests may be required to definitively diagnose Cushing's disease including:

- · Complete blood count
- Biochemistry there are a number of changes in liver enzymes which may alert your vet to the possibility of Cushing's disease

- · Urinalysis urine is often very dilute and higher in protein
- ACTH stimulation test which requires two blood tests performed one hour apart
- Low dose dexamethasone suppression test, which is a series of three blood tests performed over an eight-hour period
- · Radiographs, abdominal ultrasounds and CT scans may be recommended to determine whether the disease is a result of the adrenal gland or the pituitary gland becoming abnormal

TREATMENT

Treatment of Cushing's disease is based on



controlling the cortisol overproduction. There are medications which may be prescribed to reduce the adrenal gland's cortisol output, or in some cases surgery may be required. Your vet will discuss the best option for your pet.





FLU VACCINATION, AND WHY SHOULD I GET IT?

Flu, or influenza, is a respiratory illness causing fever, cough, nasal congestion, headache, body aches and fatigue. It spreads when an infected person coughs or sneezes, but a person can be infectious from 24 hours before they have symptoms.

Whilst most cases of flu are not severe, it can cause or worsen other health problems, such as pneumonia and COPD. It can even increase the risk of heart attack and stroke.



- People aged over 65 years
- · People with certain medical conditions
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- · Pregnant women
- · Children aged six months to five years

Flu viruses change/mutate often, so each year, the vaccine is updated with the strains that were circulating in the Northern Hemisphere during their winter the previous year. The vaccine does not contain live viruses, so you can't get flu from the vaccine. You may, however, get some mild symptoms such as lethargy and headache, which is a sign your immune system is responding.

Flu vaccination reduces your risk of contracting influenza and passing it onto others. The risk of having severe illness is mitigated as your immune system can recognise the invading virus earlier, and mount a quick response with antibodies.





So far this year, there have been over 12,000 reported cases of flu in Queensland. The QLD government is covering the cost of flu vaccines for ALL people (who don't already belong to one of the higher-risk groups).

The flu vaccine can be given at the same time as other vaccines, such as Covid-19 and Shingles vaccines.





WYNNUM OPTOMETRIST DELIVERS EYE CARE TO NORTHERN UGANDA

Sarah Warlow, a local optometrist who works at Clacher and Hook Optometrists on Bay Terrace, Wynnum, recently returned from a two-week eye outreach in Northern Uganda.

Sarah saw over 250 people for assessment of glasses and eye disease in a region called Kitgum, where many do not have access to eye care. An inability to obtain corrective glasses and cataracts are the leading causes of blindness and low vision in Uganda.

Sarah held outreaches in remote villages with a team of Ugandan health professionals from Yotkom Hospital. This not-for-profit hospital was founded eight years ago by Sarah's father, Dr Andrew Wright, and is run by Yotkom Uganda, an organisation that provides quality and accessible health care to the people of Uganda. Dr Wright also worked for many years as a general practitioner at Wynnum's Baywest Medical Centre prior to embarking on his amazing work in Africa.

The father and daughter team visited schools in the region, and Sarah was able to provide vision screening, eye health assessments, and glasses to many students who had never had their eyes tested.

Thanks to the generosity of patients from Clacher and Hook Optometrists who brought in their pre-loved glasses, and donated lenses from CR Labs, an Australian lens manufacturing company, they were able to give out over 120 pairs of glasses to people in need. The smiles on their faces and the gratitude expressed by the community recipients were extraordinary.

As part of her eye outreach clinics, Sarah compiled a list of patients with visual impairment due to cataracts. Yotkom Uganda is seeking to raise funds for these operations, which cost just \$100 per patient for the sight-restoring surgery performed by an ophthalmologist in the neighbouring city of Gulu. Clacher and Hook Optometrists are so proud of Sarah and her incredible efforts in effecting positive change in the lives of the Ugandan people, and how she has used her clinical expertise and unwavering passion to make this happen.

Clacher and Hook Optometrists have generously donated \$400 to Yotkom, which will be used to provide cataract surgeries for those identified through Sarah's outreach clinics.



What do I need to know about installing an EV charger at home?

Tips for getting the right solution for your electrical vehicle

If you're thinking about buying a Tesla or any other Electrical Vehicle (EV), the next question that may occur to you is how to charge the vehicle at your home.

And while you certainly can charge an EV through your standard wall outlet, it's much faster to charge your car using a manufacturer or third party EV charger.

Let's take a look at the various types of EV charger available, and what you should consider when installing one in your home.

What to think about when choosing an EV charger

Of course, it's much cheaper to charge your EV at home overnight than it is when you're "out and about". That's because currently, public EV charging infrastructure is expensive to use. And having a home charger will allow you to use solar panels to reduce your costs even further.

To ensure you don't suffer from "range

anxiety", remember that the maximum size outlet is limited to 20 amps for residential homes. While you can go up to 40 amps, this is only available on an off-peak tariff — which may only give you five to six km of driving overnight.

What size EV charger can I install in my home?

There are three basic tiers of EV charging to consider:

- Utilise one circuit for the electric car, which won't knock off a power circuit elsewhere in your home
- · Install a large dedicated circuit, or
- Upgrade to 3-phase power with a large charger.

Comparing hybrid vehicle charging to fully electric cars

The main difference between hybrid cars and fully electric vehicles is their battery size. Plugin hybrid cars have a much bigger battery, which means you might not need to install a very large charger at home.

What electrical protection is needed for your Electric Vehicle?

Storms are commonplace in South East Queensland's summers — and you certainly don't want your electrical vehicle destroyed by a lightning strike on your home. Even if the car is only damaged, who wants to be without an EV for weeks while it's repaired? Fortunately, there are some steps you can take to protect it.

Install surge protection

For protection against lightning strikes during storms, install surge protection on the circuit you'll use for your EV. This needn't be pricey – in fact, surge protection costs around \$600-\$1,200.

Upgrade your home's switchboard

Have your electrician check that your current switchboard is sufficient before installing an EV charger.

Install heat alarms

We've all seen the nightmare stories of EVs bursting into flames while being charged. Unfortunately, in Queensland you cannot

install smoke alarms in a garage. Instead, ask your electrician about heat alarms, which detect the presence of emissions in the space.

Upgrade to three phase power

Because you'll only achieve around 40 to 50 km of range per hour of charging, you may want to consider installing three phase power at your home. Your EV will charge much faster – plus you can put the car onto an off-peak tariff to save money.

Property, Nature and Human Behaviour

As winter follows summer, human behaviour tends to follow similar cycles. But what cycles, in particular, affect the property market? I don't hold qualifications in psychology or economics — all I can say is after a decade of selling properties, you get to see both first-hand. However, we are usually amongst the trees, so to help zoom out a little to see the forest, I've collaborated with Stacey Beaumont (Phd Business). And yes, we have a limited word count — so it will be in a nutshell!

The HTW (Herron Todd White) clock has Brisbane at nine o'clock, which indicates a rising house market.

Several factors are fuelling this, the main typically being:

 Sentiment around interest rates and the feeling that we are around the high tide mark of this interest rate cycle. Most borrowers feel there's a rate cut on the horizon, as opposed to when we felt a dip in early to mid-2022 when we were just at the beginning of the rate increases.

- One of the main drivers of the strong demand for property in South-East Queensland/Brisbane/Wynnum-Manly has been inter-state immigration, which was trending in our favour before COVID, based on ABS statistics, and then went through the roof in 2021. I thought the shift was interesting due to the inter-suburb migration, notably people selling in places like Camp Hill/ Bulimba/Balmoral, etc. Wynnum hadn't been high on peoples' lists for five or ten years; however, that has steadily changed – it's The Great Wynnum Awakening.
- The ascension driver, where renters who have saved a deposit have a huge incentive to purchase. Firstly, rents have been going up like (almost) never before; townhouse owners or entry-level homeowners then upgrade to the next category of house, which

is likely in the \$900k to \$1.2m range. Then homeowners gear up into the next bracket – it may be a four or five-bedroom home, fairly modern, closer to the water, with a pool, possibly in the \$1.5m to \$1.8m range, and so forth.

- Of course, there is the 2032 Olympics in the background of all this activity, and the word on the street is that the 'ramp up' could likely accelerate approximately four years prior to the start of the Olympics. This is anecdotal; however, it plays a part in the thinking behind purchasing decisions, which rightly or wrongly have self-fulfilling characteristics.
- Balancing factors include inflation, which increased to 7.8% at its peak in December 2022 and pushed the value of houses upwards. This also means people have less disposable income to spend. However, inflation appears to be steadily dropping and is currently 3.6%, according to the latest ABS statistics.

 And then to cap it all off, what we think may happen usually not only doesn't, but the opposite...or unforeseen events come into play along the way.

STEAMY WINTER VEGGIE SOUP RECIPE

Snuggle up with this bone-warming vegetable soup recipe.

WINTER VEGGIE SOUP

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 carrots, peeled and diced
- · 2 stalks celery, diced
- 1 parsnip, peeled and diced
- 1 large white potato, peeled and diced

- 1 small sweet potato, peeled and diced
- 6 cups vegetable or chicken broth
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- · Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup kale or spinach, chopped
- Grated cheese for garnish (optional)

METHOD

- 1. Heat the oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add chopped onions and garlic, and sauté until soft and translucent (about 3 to 4 minutes).
- 2. Add carrots, celery, parsnip, potato, and sweet potato to the pot. Cook for another 3 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Pour in the vegetable or chicken broth and add dried thyme, salt, and pepper. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat and let it simmer for about 20 to 25 minutes, or until the vegetables are tender.
- 4. Add the chopped kale or spinach to the soup and cook for 3 minutes.
- 5. Taste the soup and add salt and pepper if needed. Garnish with grated cheese.

Trade

Over the three months to end-April, the container sector has remained ahead of the same period in 2023, with volumes underpinned by stronger than expected import volumes. Motor vehicle imports remain strong, although volumes are anticipated to start to normalise as manufacturers continue to catch up on back-orders.

While export full containers remain flat over the same period, higher volumes of processed beef and cotton exports are anticipated over the next few months due to better seasonal conditions.

Brisbane International Cruise Terminal

The Brisbane International Cruise Terminal (BICT) had a fantastic summer season with 125 cruise ships calling in Brisbane between October 2023 to March 2024.

There's still plenty of action during the cooler months, with almost 40 calls scheduled for Brisbane's winter season between April to September, led by our homeporter Pacific Encounter.

The BICT also celebrates its second birthday in June! We're looking forward to seeing many passengers off on their winter cruise.

Community

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT LEMON TREE VERY PRETTY

Ah, the backyard lemon tree (Citrus limon), found all over the suburbs in varying forms and levels of health.

These days, with smaller courtyards and even balcony gardens, many opt for a potted variety such as "Lots A Lemons", which is a Meyer lemon (Citrus \times meyeri) and technically a cross between a mandarin and a lemon – I'm not a purist though, so we'll let that slide.

If you are lucky enough to have space for an inground specimen, you might have a Eureka (thick-skinned, long fruiting season) or a Lisbon (hardier tree but thorny and a relatively shorter fruiting season). Many are grafted to produce a smaller tree and a hardy root system. Should you not have looked after it, the rootstock may have taken over and you could even have a knobbly bush lemon!

Many a garden talkback radio program has discussed the "what's wrong with my lemon tree" quandary. Google (or my website) should give you a variety of common problems and their fixes, but the key to avoiding most of them is having a

healthy tree to start with. Luckily, caring for lemon trees (and most other citrus) is largely the same.

Citrus are big feeders, so fertilise regularly. I give mine a handful of organic chicken pellets once a month (ish — hey, I'm a busy girl!). They like free-draining soil (no wet feet please), but a deep soaking is greatly appreciated when it's been dry. And as always, don't forget to mulch! The dead variety, not living. Citrus has shallow roots and a weak constitution when faced with competition, so keep ground covers (including grass) out past the edge of the leaf canopy.

If a regular ol' lemon tree is a little too ordinary for you, there are lots of others you could try — what about a Buddah's hand (Citrus medica var. sarcodactylis) or a variegated Eureka lemon or even a Japanese Yuzu (Citrus junos)?

If you're interested in learning more about looking after your soil and growing healthy plants, I'm talking at the Redlands Organic Growers Inc (ROGI) meeting on the 13th June – come say 'hello'!



MAJOR SEARCH AND RESCUE EXERCISE WILL SAVE LIVES

Brisbane Water Police ran a major Search and Rescue (SAR) exercise in Moreton Bay recently, using new software.

The 'target' was a theoretical light aircraft crash outside the Port, with passengers reported in the water.

Water Police immediately tasked a dozen Coast Guard and Volunteer Marine Rescue (VMR) boats from all over Moreton Bay and the Redlands, plus several Water Police vessels, to rush to the area and search for survivors.

The search was controlled by Maritime SAR Coordinator Sergeant Caffery from the Whyte Island Water Police headquarters, assisted by Senior Constable Fox and other officers, using new software installed by Furuno Australia. Sergeant Caffery's team was joined by volunteers from Coast Guard, VMR and the new Marine Rescue Queensland organisation, who were keen to observe the new software in action.

Within 20 minutes of the SAR being initiated, Sergeant Caffery and his team had rescue vessels at the location of the crash, and began employing them into a line search. Water Police initially used their SARMAP Water Modelling Software to reveal where tides and currents in the area would move survivors and wreckage from the crash site. They then added the new TimeZero Fleet software to the picture on their big screen. This showed where vessels in the search fleet should position themselves for best results. That picture was then transmitted to all vessels engaged in the SAR.

The effect was a near-perfect coverage of the search area, which would have resulted in a quick recovery of all survivors.

Water Police and Coast Guard volunteers were very happy with the results of this major exercise, which will result in lives saved next time there's a real SAR.
