"There are quite a few dance groups around, and people enjoy really getting into the swing with clothes from the '30s and '40s," says Stephen Phoenix, a long-time Big Band member.

"The women lead the fashion stakes, but we occasionally have men turn up in peaked caps, braces and knickerbockers – it all adds to the atmosphere and the fun."

The Big Band is one of the music groups under the aegis of the Redland City Bands, which also includes the Concert Band, the Beginner Concert Band, the Wind Ensemble and the Smith Street Jazz Band.

"A number of musicians in the Beginner Concert Band are experienced musicians who are trying their hand – and perhaps their embouchure – at a new instrument," Stephen says.

As for brass, woodwind and rhythm players, the Big Band is certainly the place to settle into. A 22-piece band under the direction of Dr. David Salisbury, it boasts seven saxophones, three trombones, five trumpets and a rhythm section that would get the shyest dancer onto the floor.

RESTORING THE PAST: A MOTORCYCLE'S TWO-YEAR TRANSFORMATION

Restoring old motorcycles can be a challenging business, particularly when you aren't a motorcycle petrolhead, there are no extant workshop manuals and every photographic reference of (allegedly) the same bike has different features. That didn't stop John Heselwood and Ralph Gofton from embarking on a two-year restoration of a 1920's Indian Scout and achieving a breathtakingly good result.

John and Ralph are both members of the workshop restoration team at Redland Museum. They inherited the bike's restoration as a task no-one had been willing to undertake since it was donated to the museum in September 2017 by Mary Lee and her daughter June. The bike had belonged to Ray Lee, Mary's husband and June's father, who kept it going and rode it until he was well into his 90s. John had extensive experience in restoring vintage cars and Ralph was an innocent abroad in the world of mechanics.

"What we both knew about motorcycle restoration could have been written on the back of a postage stamp with a carpenter's pencil," John laughs, "but we put our heads together and got on with it. We stripped it down in a day then followed the restoration procedure; save what you can, find out what you need and then source it.

"Everything on the bike needed restoration. There was no such thing as a workshop manual so we started with the luggage rack."

Like house restoration, when stripping off the wallpaper reveals a myriad unexpected faults, taking off the paint revealed etching primer that had to be ground off, in turn revealing extensive metal pitting over the whole rack. The pair developed a hybrid metal/fibreglass filler that did the job - after repeated filling and sanding – and then moved on to the monumental job of saving the frame.

"We each took home bits and pieces to work on; it took each of us about a hundred hours to get the frame back to where it should be. Then we moved on to the mudguards and had to deal with the same metal pitting as we had on the rack.

"The tank was one step worse; it had pinholes that had to be silver soldered and treated internally with rust remover, cleaned several times with various solutions before a pH-altering liquid, then a special fuel tank sealant. On the original inspection we'd thought the tank was fine but then discovered we'd been looking at the oil compartment in the front of the tank!"

The world-wide hunt for spare parts and advice seemed endless; some specialist clubs were wary of these two unknown enthusiasts but an introduction to the network by and old friend of John's proved invaluable and help started to flow in.

"We found sources of reproduction parts in Sweden and Poland," says Ralph. "The parts were really expensive but they did the job. The hardest part was the magneto; we opened it to find that three components were missing, with no indication of what they were."

The pair's ongoing sleuthing paid off with tracking down a data book that had a list of part numbers and serendipitously – a few diagrams. The missing magneto parts identified, the Dynamic Duo located them – in Poland, the USA and Melbourne respectively.

Despite gathering photographs and reference material world-wide, John says that specific model identification can be a tricky business. "They were very popular in Australia but models sold here didn't always have the updates that appeared on the corresponding American model," he says.

Confused identity notwithstanding, a splendid piece of motorcycling history has been respected and preserved. Scouts continue to be a popular motorbike; they were the bike of choice for the Wall of Death riders at Coney Island and they've also had their Hollywood show pony moments.

"Think of the bike Burt Munro rode in the movie The World's Fastest Indian." says Ralph. "That could be the same model as the one on show at the museum."

John and Ralph will be giving a Floor Talk presentation of the restoration at Redland Museum on Wednesday July 24 at 10:00am; more information is at https://www.redlandmuseum.org.au/whatson/events/

One area is the use of digital channels to speed up some processes and get communication flowing effectively between Council and ratepayers, providing more information to more people and gaining more feedback.

I encourage you to have a look and consider engaging with Council online. It not only helps streamline interactions, reduce paper waste and administrative costs, but you can do it at a time that is convenient for you.

You can use Council's online customer request form to report issues such as graffiti, potholes, fallen trees, water leaks and park maintenance. You can ask a question, provide feedback, or make a suggestion. It is where you can report a missed bin collection, bin repairs and exchanges, or order a new bin. Council Library services are also available online.

You can pay bills online, such as rates notices, animal registration and infringement notices. Log in to myServices to register an animal or update your animal details, view your rates notices and request they be sent via email instead

of post, change your address, and conduct property searches.

You can also lodge a development

application online or a submission for or against an application.

Another great option is signing up to receive Council's monthly Our Redlands Coast e-newsletter about Council initiatives and events. You can also read the latest news from Council on the Redlands Coast Today website.

Signing up to Redlands Coast Alert is an important way to receive Council messaging on local disasters, flood warnings for four local roads, weather warnings and targeted alerts on planned

Don't throw away the chance to make a difference to waste costs Folks, we need to put a lid on it!

The amount of waste that Redlands Coast residents are sending to landfill is continuing to grow and, without some changes in behaviour, it is going to cost the city dearly.

It is a critical issue for Redland City Council with the cost of waste management set to rise substantially over the coming years. This is due to the Queensland Government increasing the waste levy statewide and reducing the rebate it currently provides to local governments.

Redlands Coast residents are being urged to put a lid on their household waste to mitigate costs to the community and improve environmental outcomes across the city.

Poor waste and recycling habits have already contributed to a significant rise in waste management costs for Council over the past two years.

The problem is that about 17 per cent of what is currently ending up in landfill from household red-lid bins could be recycled. The main culprits are items like cardboard and pizza boxes, junk mail, tuna cans, sushi containers and meat trays.

A further 30 per cent of what ends up in landfill is made up of garden organics and food waste.

Each city resident currently generates 682 kilograms of waste each year on average – the goal is to reduce this by 15 per cent and increase the amount of materials being recycled to 60 per cent by 2030.

These targets are Queensland Government benchmarks that have been adopted in Council's Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan 2021-2030.

The size of the waste operation is considerable, with Council contractors collecting waste from about 63,000 households across the mainland and islands each week.

More than 112,000 tonnes of waste and recyclables were handled by Council in the 2022-23 financial year alone, which goes to show the scale of the undertaking.

Lowering waste to landfill will benefit the entire community, as the costs to provide waste services are included in residential rates.

How to help

There are several ways you can reduce your waste, such as starting a backyard compost pile, getting a green waste bin, and ensuring all recyclable items from your kitchen and bathroom are placed in your yellow-lid kerbside bin. Here are three top tips:

- Get a green waste bin or take your green waste to Council's recycling and waste centres. Residents can offset the cost of a green waste bin by downsizing their 240L waste bin to a 140L waste bin at time of ordering.
- Compost your food waste at home via home composting systems. Council is currently offering a Compost Bin Subsidy program to support residents.
- Recycle the right items.

Efficiencies provide better value for ratepayers

As Redlands Coast continues to grow, Redland City Council is investigating new ways of providing better value for its ratepayers' dollars.

Economy of scale can be applied across many areas of Council as the number of residents grow, but efficiencies are also being achieved through new technology and "smarter" ways of doing things.

One practical example has been the evolution over the past five years in how Council's city operations officers deal with maintenance requests from the public.

It is estimated that the percentage of the city's maintenance work that is handled by design – meaning it is pro-actively planned and scheduled, as opposed to being reactive to customer requests - has grown from about 25 per cent five years ago, to close to 70 per cent currently.

Five years ago, Council officers printed out hundreds of customer requests daily and triaged them via pigeonholes.

Today almost 20,000 of City Operation's 30,000 work orders for the year are based on planned inspections and/or planned programs of work and are now put in by digital daily worksheets.

The change means resources can be deployed more efficiently, rather than in the ad hoc manner caused by being reactive.

City Operations has also created efficiencies in how it engages contractors to support the city's landscape and vegetation management, and bushfire mitigation services.

Earlier this year, Council signed a \$28 million contract covering the next five years for contractors to provide services including mowing, pruning, brush cutting, slashing and edging works.

Previously provided through seven separate arrangements, the new contract consolidated this to three suppliers, which simplified the procurement process, bringing efficiencies in operational areas.

Combined, the contractors and Council crews maintain more than 19,000ha of public space on its maintenance schedule - an area larger than Moreton Island

(18,600ha). They mow and slash close to 500ha of vegetated areas every week.

To further maximise efficiencies. Council crews are trained, licenced and qualified to work across the business, allowing Council to react quickly to emergencies and where the need is greatest at any point in time without having to call on a contract crew.

In another holistic initiative, the way customers interact with Council on a daily basis is also being transformed to create efficiencies.

Council is rolling out an exciting, multiyear Digital Transformation Program that will ensure residents have easier access to Council's information and digital services and the flexibility to choose when, where and how they engage with Council.

It is set to bolster Council's cyber security, enhance productivity and help increase efficiencies across the organisation, delivering cost savings and better provision of services to the community.

It will also increase the efficiencies in customers' interactions with Council using new methods that have evolved with the aim of making these experiences better, easier and more cost-effective for all

Efficiencies are also being made through the reuse and upcycling of materials.

Even small changes in this area not only provide savings within Council but also create an organisational culture that is considerate of a circular economy and enforces the notion to not be wasteful.

For example, the old coffee cart at Council's Redland Performing Arts Centre, Cleveland, was upcycled to be part of its new Encore Café.

Council's commitment to managing resources in an effective and efficient way is predicated on maintaining and, in many cases, improving its services to the community.





Pets can bring so much joy and companionship to our lives. As responsible pet owners, it is important that we give our pets a safe, happy and healthy life to the best of our abilities. The RSPCA has a list of the five freedoms essential to wellbeing, which outline the areas in which we can ensure our pets are well cared for.

FREEDOM FROM HUNGER AND THIRST

Your pet needs a complete and balanced diet appropriate for their life stage. Depending on your pet's requirements there should be a balance of protein, carbohydrates, fats, vitamins and minerals to provide the necessary daily requirements. It is important that your pet not be over or under weight as both states can cause health issues. A supply of clean, fresh water should be available at all times.

FREEDOM FROM DISCOMFORT

Your pet needs shelter from wind, rain, hot sun and colder temperatures. Smaller animals should be kept in housing that offers protection from predators. Housing should be as large and comfortable as possible, and there should be a supply of appropriate clean, dry bedding or substrate.

FREEDOM FROM PAIN AND INJURY

Pet owners are obligated to seek medical attention for their pets when necessary — this includes both treatment for injuries and illness and preventative care where possible. Animals demonstrating a loss of appetite, difficulty moving, rapid weight loss, vomiting, diarrhoea, eye/ear or nasal discharge or any lumps and bumps should be seen by a veterinarian. Prevention of disease through a parasite control and vaccination program should be discussed with your vet.

FREEDOM TO EXPRESS NORMAL BEHAVIOUR

Animals should have the opportunity to move and exercise as appropriate for their species and age.



Environmental enrichment with exercise, toys and games can help animals to demonstrate normal behaviours.

FREEDOM FROM FEAR AND DISTRESS

It is important to be aware of your pet's mental and emotional needs. Animals should not be left unattended for extended periods as they may become anxious and destructive.

Providing a home of love and understanding of your pet's physical, mental, and behavioural needs will help keep your pet happy and healthy for as long as possible and ensure the development and maintenance of the human/animal bond.

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT JUMPING JACKFRUIT!

If you read my blog, you would already know about my jackfruit escapades. If you don't read my blog, you should! But I'll forgive you for now and update you.

Quite a few years ago, I stopped at a garden on the side of a country road that had plants advertised. It was a very eclectic mix with an equally eclectic owner, and although I couldn't find anything of value to buy, I admired the large arching tree she had in the centre of the garden providing lovely, dappled shade — a jackfruit tree she told me.

Now, I was slightly naïve, having developed most of my garden love and experience in cooler climates, and it didn't occur to me to really investigate. I knew what jackfruit was, I liked it (cooked green), and I loved this tree. So off I went and acquired one.

It turns out hers was probably not the best specimen, and they don't grow like that at all, but have rather dense foliage, and, due to their propensity to develop said jackfruit (which can weigh up to 50kg!), are best kept pruned so you

can reach them at harvest time. Handily, jackfruit are cauliflorous, which means they bear their flowers (and subsequent fruit) directly off the trunk and large branches, so the heavy fruit are at least well supported. But well supported or not, you don't really want bowling balls hanging above head-high.

My little tree had a rough start to life, but this summer, it finally gave me my first jackfruit! At just under 4kg, it weighed the same as my newborn niece. I dutifully dipped my knife and hands in oil and proceeded to chop it up. The oil helps stop the latex substance that the fruits exude from sticking to everything. In hindsight, I needed more oil. I had just enough to make the knife tricky to hold but not enough to stop me from spending 10 minutes afterwards scraping chewing gum-like goo off my hands! Gross. But it was worth it. I pre-boiled the pieces and shredded them, giving me several ziplock baggies in the future for delicious sloppy jackfruit burgers (think pulled pork!). You can find the recipe on my website.




"Come on David, you've got to get a real job, get to college, be an educated man...where's this music going to take you?" The concerns of David Hudson's mother echoed those of many mothers when confronted with a passionately creative child.

But David is a born performer and you can't run away from who you are. His boyhood dreams of being an entertainer have taken David around the world but he's also graduated as a teacher and has added a Doctorate of Culture, Music and Art to his impressive CV.

"I grew up in a musical family and music's always been a part of my life," says David. "Dad was a guitarist and singer and as a kid I learned guitar, drums, cornet, clarinet and Yigi Yigi (Didgeridoo) I make my own now, I've got about 80 in my personal collection."

The music was always an inspiration. Amongst other achievements, David is co-founder of Tjapukai Aboriginal Dance Theatre.

"Mum grew me up on a cattle station until I was about five then it was down to the Big Smoke to get an education. After finishing school I worked on the railways, in a pest control company, played football — but Mum was my inspiration and I wanted that education."


A chance collaboration with Ernie Dingo and a later tour of America made David realise that education and entertainment could work together, and the concept of a cultural show could be a reality.

"That American trip made me realise that they were more interested in Aboriginal history and culture than most of my fellow Australians were, and that there was a real need for education — of young Indigenous folk as well as white folk. Only older Indigenous people have any understanding of what it was like to live on a mission reserve, not allowed to walk off it without an Exemption Card; I still have my mother's. Until I was five I was classified — like all our people — without citizenship."

David calls himself an edutainer, and together with his company Didge-Ralia and the Jute Theatre Company, has developed his Campfire show, this telling the story of his life set within the bigger frame of post-white settlement Indigenous history. The stage is filled with music, story-telling, songs, projection — and, of course, a live band.

David laughs; "I'm a musician, no backing tracks for this show!"

NATURALLY WONDERFUL...WITH RANGER STACEY

Nature's calendar features wonderfully wild events that automatically pop up around the same time each year masses of red crabs marching across Christmas Island, turtle nesting season at Mon Repos, and the epic migration of humpback whales

Closer to home, a natural phenomenon is about to kick off -Swooping Season! While this news may not be music to everyone's ears, it's important to understand the primary reason for this dramatic behaviour.



Magpies, plovers, and bush-stone curlews will go to extreme lengths to protect their precious offspring from potential danger. As a parent you'd do the same for your babies, right? Okay, minus the flapping of wings and clapping of beaks.

I'm a fan of magpies (and I don't mean the footy team). I enjoy their melodic songs, admire their smart black and white plumage, and marvel at their curiosity and intelligence. They're smarter than the average bird, capable of human facial recognition, but the thing I admire most about them is their dedication as parents!

Nesting season is July to December. Interestingly, magpies aren't 'born swoopers'. It's a defensive behaviour they learn after a negative interaction with people. That's why only a small percentage of magpie dads swoop.

Some target specific humans like cyclists or posties, while others aren't fussy, swooping anyone who enters the defence zone (up to a 150-metre radius of the nest). If you've ever been the target, you'll appreciate the nickname 'feathered torpedo'! This behaviour lasts around six weeks while mum takes care of eggs or chicks in the nest.

To stay safe and let these sometimes overzealous parents of the bird world raise their babies, it's pretty easy to modify our behaviour.

- Avoid the area if you can and temporarily change your route.
- Wear a hat and sunglasses or use an umbrella.
- Get off your bike and walk on by.
- Decorate your helmet and bike with spikes and a flag.



I know plovers and bush-stone curlews would also appreciate the same consideration. Remember, it won't be long before swooping season is over for yet another year.





25,000 residents go green for waste on Redlands Coast

Green is the new red on Redlands Coast – especially when it comes to kerbside bins.

Redland City Council has reached a milestone 25,000 green waste bins now in use across the city's mainland suburbs.

Mayor Jos Mitchell said it was encouraging to see so many residents taking up the green habit of separating their garden organics from general waste.

"Audits show that about one-third of waste that ends up in landfill is garden waste and Council is supporting residents to get this number down by providing a green waste service," she said.

"The green waste bins provide a convenient fortnightly kerbside collection service where the bins are emptied and the material is taken to an organics composting facility.

"It is then processed and turned back into valuable garden and landscaping material such as mulch and soil, therefore reducing waste to landfill.

"In the past 12 months, Council has collected a record 8471 tonnes of kerbside green waste, which is due to the excellent take-up rate of green bins and a wet summer.

"The green waste bins can help save time and effort by

reducing the number of visits residents need to make to Recycling and Waste Centres.

"They are also useful in helping people prepare for storm and fire season, by providing somewhere to place hedge trimmings and leaves from gutters."

Redlands Coast resident Brian Siebert said he ordered a green bin after noticing a neighbour had one.

"It is an easy and affordable way to dispose of green waste," Mr Siebert said.

"We don't have a lot of green waste as we have a small controlled garden, so the green bin comes in handy and means we no longer have to make trips to one of Council's waste centres.

"I think it's important for residents to recycle their waste correctly.

"We follow a strict recycling program as this contributes to a healthy and cleaner environment."

Green waste bins are provided with no establishment fee and an ongoing fee of \$70 per annum, which can be offset by downsizing a 240 litre waste bin to a 140 litre waste bin at the same time.

EASY VEGETARIAN CHILLI RECIPE

Are you falling short on your veggie intake? This chilli packs a punch and is loaded with nourishing vegetables. It's a big ingredient list, but this veggie chilli is very easy to make and the perfect comfort food for cold winter nights.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 large onion, finely diced
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 red, green or yellow capsicum, diced
- · 2 medium carrots, diced
- · 2 celery stalks, diced
- 1 zucchini, diced
- 1 can of black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can of kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can of pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can of diced tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- · 2 cups vegetable stock
- 1 tablespoon chilli powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon paprika (smoked or sweet)
- 1/2 teaspoon ground oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper (optional, for fire!)
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup frozen corn kernels
- Juice of 1 lime



OPTIONAL TOPPINGS TO SERVE:

- Grated cheese
- · Sour cream or Greek yoghurt
- Avocado/guacamole
- Tortilla chips

METHOD

- Heat olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the diced onion and garlic. Sauté until the onion becomes translucent, about 3 to 4 minutes
- Now add the capsicum, carrots, celery, and zucchini. Cook for another 5 minutes or until the vegetables start to soften.
- 3. Stir in the black beans, kidney beans, pinto beans, diced tomatoes, and tomato paste.
- 4. Pour in the vegetable broth, add the chilli powder, ground cumin, paprika, ground oregano, cayenne pepper (if using), salt, and pepper, and stir well to combine.
- 5. Bring the chilli to a boil, then reduce the heat to low, cover, and simmer for about 35 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 6. After 35 minutes, add the frozen corn kernels and simmer for 5 minutes
- 7. It's time to enjoy your chilli! Stir in the lime juice and serve.



EXHIBITIONS REFLECT ON REFUGEE AND IMMIGRANT EXPERIENCES

FROM REDLAND ART GALLERY

Two new art exhibitions inspired by the cultural heritage of the artists are on display at Redland Art Gallery until July 30.

Liminal by artist Sha Sarwari responds to both the experience and representation of refugees in Australia.

The full title pairs "liminal" with the Farsi written language for "Barzakh" which refers to the experience of being in limbo, a place of lingering between death and resurrection.

Sarwari's work entangles the refugee experience in language, holding both pasts and futures, alienation and acceptance, remembrance and forgetting and, ultimately, embracing its potential as a source of hope.

Language is an important element of the exhibition, with words given presence through sculptures and installations that use postcards and newspaper articles as raw materials.

The works transform these often generic and biased texts into objects that reflect Sarwari's personal journey as a refugee from Afghanistan.

Off the Pages, Between the Lines by artist Pamela See uses papercutting to engage with natural histories, historical events and cultural symbols.

The practice is applied to the history of Redlands Coast and, specifically, to recognising the contribution of Chinese immigrants to the area.

The exhibition includes *Cropped*, an installation based on woodblock prints and drawings that were produced by local participants in workshops facilitated by See.

This work, and its process, further expands the visibility of Chinese migration and labour in the region and intertwines this historical narrative with a celebration of the present-day local community.

Redland City Council Mayor Jos Mitchell said showcasing cultural heritage and experiences through art was enriching for the Redlands Coast community.

"These upcoming exhibitions provide an insight into the experiences of refugees in our country and the contribution of immigrants to our local area," she said.

LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO

WHERE THE FISH ARE BITING THIS MONTH AND THE GEAR I USE

July is upon us, and the westerlies remind us why we like summer, but the fishing is fantastic! There's plenty of whiting, school mackerel, tailor, squire and snapper, and lots of cuttlefish and arrow squid – we really can't complain; Moreton Bay is just tremendous for fishing in winter.

I've had plenty of time to clean the whiting rods and reels every time we get bad weather and to get all my favourite rigs ready for the run of winter whiting, which are starting to move back to all the usual winter haunts. Try the Rous Channel, Fisherman's Gutter, Amity Banks, Maroon Gutter and the Sand Hills at Moreton Island. Also, don't forget the Blue Hole is holding some very, very large whiting at the moment, and closer to home, the eastern side of Darcy Light is worth a try.

I receive lots of emails asking what the best rods, reels, setups, and baits are for our bay whiting. I know everyone has their own preferences, but I thought I would share what I have used and my current preferences.

My favourite rods are ultra-light 5 to 6-ft rods, but my absolute favourite is the Berkley Cherrywood ultra-light 5-ft 6-inch with any of the 1000 reels, Daiwa or Shimano, or any brand that has enough ball bearing and is well sealed to last a while.

I started off always using a running sinker, but after an old fisherman was out fishing us and explaining the benefits of a paternoster rig and keeping the hook out of the weed, I was converted and have never looked back. Hooks were the other item that I changed a few years ago, and now I use much smaller round hooks. The black magic whiting hooks KL101 — I really can't believe how good these little hooks are sometimes. They are hard to bait, especially with fat little fingers like mine, but I find you use half the bait of the long shank hooks (but I still use my red long shank as well) and that's quite a saving these days. Here is a web address to an article I wrote about trialling these hooks: http://tacklejunkie.fish/black-magic-whiting-rigs/.

Bait is the most important, and you can't beat live

blood worms, but if you're on a budget and trying to save a dollar or two, then red beach worms, peeled Water Tower Bait and Tackle

small prawns, and strips of frozen small squid are the other options that work well. The sandworm plastics are hit-and-miss; sometimes, they work really well, and other times, there's not a touch.

As for tides, my preference in the bay is plenty of run in the tide. When there are small tides and slack water the whiting don't bite as well. Drifting is by far the best way of finding them; anchoring up and using burly will hold them behind the boat.

So, get the thermals, beanies and jumpers out, stay warm, and catch plenty of fish. And remember, with westerly winds, you can't see the whitecaps from shore, and we have lost too many lives in the bay this time of year, so it's better to put off a fishing trip for another day than to have a tragedy.

YOUR BOAT SAFETY CHECKLIST REMINDER

Safety equipment for boats in Queensland

Having the right safety equipment on your boat and knowing how to use it is essential. This could save your life in an emergency. Marine Care Qld has stock of all types of safety gear and can assist if you have any questions.

What safety equipment do I need?

There are three types of safety equipment for boats registered in Queensland:

- Compulsory equipment for all registerable boats.
- Compulsory equipment for all boats operating in certain areas.
- Other equipment that's recommended you carry to meet your General Safety Obligation.

The safety equipment you're required to carry depends on the size of your boat, whether the boat needs to be registered and where you're operating.

Some boats (also known as prescribed other Queensland regulated ships) may be required to carry additional or specific types of safety equipment such as those required under the national system.

To comply with your General Safety Obligation, you should carry the appropriate safety equipment for the waters where you will be boating. This will ensure you are prepared for an emergency or unexpected events.

New (Financial) Year's Resolutions

The start of the financial year is a perfect time to make plans for the year ahead. The 2024/25 financial year brings with it some minor regulatory changes that may warrant some changes to your personal financial plans.

First up is increased superannuation contribution caps.

If you're familiar with the strategies of salary sacrificing or making personal contributions, you may already know that you are limited each year based on an annual cap (subject to your balance on 1 July of each year). These caps have now increased.

Concessional contribution caps have increased from \$27,500 to \$30,000 per annum. This cap covers superannuation guarantee payments from employers, salary sacrificed contributions, and personal contributions that you intend to claim as a tax deduction.

As the concessional contributions are increasing, so too are the non-concessional contribution caps – from \$110,000 per year to \$120,000 per year.

Superannuation guarantee rates increased

Superannuation guarantee rates have now also increased to 11.5%. This is the mandatory superannuation contribution that employers must make for salaried employees.

Marginal rates of income tax have changed.

As of 1 July 2024, the marginal rates that apply to the lower tax brackets (between \$18,201 to \$45,000 of income, and between \$45,001 to \$135,000) have reduced, and the threshold to enter the 4th marginal tax bracket has increased from \$120,000 to \$135,000.

That's a lot of numbers... but what does it mean?

It means that if you were salary sacrificing already, you may be able to salary sacrifice a little bit more while staying within the caps. Keeping in mind that your employer will also be increasing their contributions, it may be worthwhile to review your strategy.

It also means that your employer will be required to increase their regular contributions to your superannuation fund slightly.

Finally, you may be paying less tax, and as such there may be slightly less tax withheld from your regular fortnightly or monthly pay.

For the superannuation savvy investor who is keeping track,

These changes are a reminder to keep a close eye on your first few payslips to look at how much extra you might be able to contribute while maintaining the same take-home income.

Before leaping on additional contributions, superannuation fund members should still consider their previous year's contributions, especially if they've triggered the bringforward rule during the 2022-2023 or 2023-2024 financial years.

What is missing?

That's the last point – there haven't been any changes made to the more nuanced superannuation rules, such as the bringforward provision for non-concessional contributions, the ability to utilise unused concessional caps from prior years, or the First Home Super Saver Scheme. However,

the smaller changes outlined above can still provide opportunities for you to make the most of your superannuation and investments.
