UNITED AT 50: CELEBRATING BAYSIDE'S FOOTBALL LEGACY

For five decades, Bayside United Football Club has woven itself into the fabric of sporting and community history in Lota and the wider bayside community. This year, the club celebrates 50 vears of football.

In 1954, the Lota Recreation Club was formed by Horrie Stephens and Bert Taylor at Cox Park, operating for nine years until folding in 1963. In 1971/1972, the Wondall United Soccer club was formed. and games were played at Cox Park.

In 1974, due to the increasing number of players across the bayside district, the Bayside United Football Club was created separately from Wondall United. The club acquired a lease on the land at Andrew Street, Lota, which became the Don Randall Oval, named after a local alderman.

Club volunteers fundraised tirelessly to purchase the original clubhouse (even selling \$1 bricks). In 1987, the club received a state grant of \$6,700 to build a new amenities block with two change rooms and toilets, and in 1992, a further grant was received to finish building the clubhouse and more land works.

Club members were passionate about the club, providing loans


and acting as guarantors to enable the completion of works. The clubhouse was officially opened in 1994. Di and Jo Byrne, Bruce and Donna Larkin, Herb and Bev Pontaks, John and Mariyke Lopez, and Paul and Marie Lascilles became honorary foundation life members.





50 CENT FARES FROM AUGUST 5

The Queensland Government understands that many Baysiders are struggling financially. That's why we are working hard to reduce the cost of living

From August 5, the cost of Translink public transport services across Queensland will be slashed to only 50 cents, no matter where you live or how far you travel.

Taking pressure off household budgets, as well as easing traffic congestion, is one of our key priorities. Whether you are a student catching public transport to get to school or an office worker heading into the City, all Baysiders will pay only 50 cents per trip.

This initiative is just one of many cost of living relief measures we are delivering for Bayside families.



MASSIVE \$1300 BILL RELIEF

Every Baysider will see \$1300 slashed from their energy bill, with \$1000 upfront from the Queensland Government and an additional \$300 from the Federal Government.

It means many Baysiders may not have to pay a cent for their energy bills until March 2025.

Additionally, Bayside small businesses will receive \$650 off their bill.

Of course, this financial help to Baysiders is only possible because we're making multinational mining companies pay their fair share and because we kept energy assets in public hands.



20% OFF YOUR CAR REGO

More good news for Baysiders. The Queensland Government is taking 20% off your car and ute rego from August 5. For most, this means a saving of \$85 on a standard four-cylinder car.

This reduction will apply to the registration fee and the traffic improvement fee for all light vehicles, including trailers, regardless of whether they are for personal or commercial purposes.

This new initiative is in addition to a freeze on motor vehicle registration fees in 2024-2025. It's just another way we are helping to reduce the cost of living for Baysiders.






ALL ABOUT HEARTWORM DISEASE IN DOGS AND CATS

Heartworm disease is a serious condition caused by the parasitic worm Dirofilaria immitis, which is spread between animals by mosquitoes. Recent testing by the RSPCA has discovered heartworm infection in 5% of tested pets with Moreton Bay, Cairns, Ipswich, Mackay and Townsville having more cases than other parts of Queensland.

Heartworm larvae are injected into dogs and cats when an infected mosquito has a blood meal. These tiny larvae spread through the blood, eventually ending up in the heart and blood vessels where they grow into adult worms. These adult worms produce more larvae which travel in the bloodstream where they are ingested by mosquitoes thus continuing the cycle. Animals affected by heartworm disease develop heart failure as the adult worms block the blood vessels around the heart.

SIGNS OF HEARTWORM DISEASE

The clinical signs of heartworm disease in dogs include shortness of breath, reduced exercise tolerance, decreased appetite, lethargy,

weight loss and a persistent cough. Dogs that are developing heart failure as a result of their infection may show other signs such as a swollen belly due to ascites (fluid accumulation in the abdomen).

Cats tend to be more subtle in their clinical signs – some will develop a cough and lethargy while other animals may show no signs before becoming very acutely ill.

PREVENTION OF HEARTWORM DISEASE

Dogs and cats should start heartworm prevention from six to eight weeks of age. There are a range of preventative medication options available including oral tablets/chews, top spot medications or injectable medications. Your vet will be able to advise on the most appropriate product for your pet.

Preventing mosquito bites can also reduce the likelihood of your pet acquiring an infection. Keeping dogs and cats indoors at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are more active and eliminating stagnant water



sources from around your property to reduce mosquito breeding areas can be helpful.

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE NEW RSV VACCINES

RSV or (Respiratory Syncitial Virus) is a viral illness (a bit like influenza or rhinovirus) that infects the respiratory tract (nose/throat/lungs). Symptoms include excessive coughing, fever, a runny or stuffy nose and wheezing or difficulty breathing. Most people who get RSV have a mild illness and recover in about two weeks, however, some vulnerable people, such as infants under 12 months, adults > 65 years of age or individuals with other chronic health conditions may



get very sick and take much longer to recover. Many of these people might end up in hospital because of RSV, or even in ICU requiring ventilator support.

Two RSV vaccines have recently been approved for use in Australia:

- 1. "Beyfortus" this vaccine is funded under the National Immunisation Program Schedule (NIP) for children under eight months old who were born after the 1st of February. Children born in Queensland from April will be offered this vaccine at birth, but if missed can get a catch up vaccine through their GP up until eight months of age. NB: This vaccine is NOT currently available for private purchase for children > eight months old.
- 2. "Arexvy" this vaccine is NOT funded under the NIP. It is available for private purchase (~\$350) and is recommended for adults only (those > 75 years old or those > 60 years old with other chronic medical conditions).

Both vaccines are a single dose vaccine and provide about one to two years of protection against RSV.



It is not very often that I would include personal anecdotes in these articles...however I feel so privileged to have been a part of two of the trials that led to the successful approval of the latest RSV vaccines. I couldn't be more excited that we are FINALLY able to offer these vaccines in our surgery. I received an RSV vaccine (or placebo) in two of my four pregnancies. I participated in these trials in the hope that I might get the vaccine (rather than placebo) so that my unborn baby might have a fighting chance against RSV in those fragile first months of life. That is how important these vaccines are!

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT SUNSHINE, LOLLIPOPS AND MARIGOLDS

Surely most people are aware of common marigolds. Be they French or African, they have that distinctive, if not exactly pleasant, scent and are a mainstay in grandma gardens. And whilst those countries are quite, quite different, I'll forgive you for not knowing the subtleties of two plants. For the record, the French (Tagetes patula) are generally a shorter and a more compact plant, perfect for in and around your veggie patch (where they are reputed to repel many a bug), and the African (T. erecta) are taller and have more stately blooms.

But have you heard of Mexican marigolds — a.k.a passionfruit marigold or tree marigold? Unlike the annual French/African marigolds (which coincidently also actually come from Mexico — yay for common names), T. lemmonii is a perennial shrub and reaches heights of up to two metres!

During its peak flowering season (winter) it is smothered in open daisy-like flowers about the size of a 20-cent piece and the colour of pure sunshine. It is also likely to have a dusting of bees

during the day as they buzz about their business. And the LEAVES! Well, the leaves smell just like passionfruit (hence the name!). My plant is right by my driveway, and I brush against it every day as I come and go, releasing its lingering fruity scent. And because it's the leaves that smell, the smell is all year round, even when the flowers have disappeared and all that's left is the pretty lacy foliage.

I highly recommend you search for a plant; I've seen them in local nurseries and even at the big green shed. They also germinate really easily from seeds (as do most marigolds). I've had a few self-seed from mine, but not to the extent that you would consider it weedy or a contender for taking over your garden (that award goes to my cosmos).

They are tolerant of dry dusty soils, and apart from a decent cut back after they finish their main flower (which helps keep them tidy), they are very low maintenance. Full sun is best to maximise those sunshine blooms, but they'll happily do well in part shade too.

I love gardening, and growing my own food and plants in general. I've been working on our current garden in subtropical



Brisbane for the last five years but have been gardening for much longer in all sorts of places. I'm an ex-engineer, recently turned horticulturist (life's too short not to work in something you love!). I grow edibles and ornamentals in an often wild, rambling jungle, filled with birds and bugs, including a handful of pet chooks and a dog (though to be honest you're more likely to find him inside on the couch). THE HISTORY OF WYNNUM BOWLS CLUB AS IT CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

Wynnum Bowls Club was formed after a public meeting convened in the Old Town Hall (which is now the Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre) in Tingal Road, Wynnum, on August 21st, 1924. Seventeen residents attended this meeting and decided to form a bowls club in Wynnum. Ten gentlemen were elected as foundation members.

The first task of the new committee was to select a suitable site for the green. An area of one acre, one rod and 20 perches was decided on, at a cost of £269pound 7/- shillings and 7p pence.

Constructing the green was carried out by excavating the bottom green with a horse-drawn drag shovel. Progress did not go as well as expected, and 20 months elapsed before play was permitted on the newly laid green on April 10th, 1926. The total cost of laying this eight-rink green was £1,200.

Next came the purchase of a suitable clubhouse, and the Wynnum Town Council came to the rescue by selling a small cottage they owned, located near the current croquet fields, for £100. This cottage was relocated and became the club's first pavilion.

The official opening took place on Saturday, April 10th, 1926, with 300-plus guests attending. Mr J Johnson, President of the Q.B.A, performed the opening.

In September 1930, the Wynnum Ladies Bowling Club was formed.

Then, in 1932, an adjoining block of land and a cottage on Carnation Street were purchased to become the greenkeeper's cottage. In 1933, an extension to the old clubhouse, at a cost of £1,700, greatly improved the space available for social functions.

Another 10 years went by before further extensions were made in the form of a half green in the far corner of Bridge Street, nicknamed "Siberia". However, it was not until 1945 that play commenced on this new half green.

The next major step in the club's development was the erection of a new clubhouse on the present site. A tender for £7,132 was accepted

in November 1954, and at the end of June 1955, the official opening of the new clubhouse was performed by the President of the R.Q.B.A., Mr J.S. Hargreaves.

After completion of the new clubhouse, the original but extended pavilion was sold to the Wynnum District Tennis Association for £600.

In 1958, the club decided to extend the top half green to a full-size green. The total cost of this extension work was £17,000, and the new green was finally opened on June 4th, 1960.

The decision to purchase the house on Carnation Street in 1969 was made at a cost of \$21,000. This decision facilitated further major improvements and extensions to the clubhouse, which were carried out in 1972 at a cost of \$35,000.

In 1977, the members decided that a new bar would be installed in keeping with the new clubhouse at a cost of \$20,000

In 1979, the club decided to purchase the house in Bridge Street for \$22,000, giving it a total ground area of approximately two acres and ensuring it would not be built out by any further developments.

The club decided to build a new brick soil shed between the two houses it had purchased in 1980 at a cost of \$14,000. When the decision was made to convert the men's dressing room to a modern kitchen in 1981. Wynnum Bowls Club boasted a kitchen second to none in the district.

However, one of the largest projects undertaken by the club was in 1982, when the decision was made to construct a new full-size green between Bridge and Carnation Streets, running parallel and in line with the bottom green. The construction of this green was carried out at a cost of \$60,000 and was completed in October 1983. This gave the club two full-size greens and one small green of three rinks.

The club decided to extend and renovate in 1993. Construction began on March 8th, 1993, and the official opening was held on November 6th, 1993. When completed, the refurbished clubhouse provided 50% more floor space, a new bar, a new cold room, two sets of restrooms

for men and women, two offices, a shower, a locker room, and a second lounge to house the gaming machines.

In 1993, the club applied for gaming machines and installed a computer system. The gaming machine approval did not come through until August 1993, and the computer system software package to handle memberships, gaming machine reports and analysis, accounts payable, and the general ledger was up and running by January 1994.

The automatic sprinkler system was laid in early 1996, and the awning running down the front of the clubhouse was erected in 1999.

The lights facilitating night play were erected in 2004 and have recently been upgraded.

With the advent of COVID-19, the club took the opportunity to upgrade all of the beer taps, repaint the clubhouse interior, and install four new poker machines in 2022. Then, in 2023, the solar panels were refurbished to provide the club with some financial relief in relation to the cost of power.

Now, 2024 is our centennial year, and the club has received approval for a grant to replace virtually all the furniture in the clubhouse.

The club has other plans, but most of them will not come to fruition until 2025 or later.

The Wynnum Manly Football Club is planning for one of their biggest days of the year, when the Wynnum Manly Seagulls take on the Brisbane Tigers in round 21 of the Queensland Cup on August 25 at Kougari Oval.

Prior to the match, a 40-year 1984 Premiership Reunion will be held inside the Wynnum Manly Leagues Club to coincide with Paul Green Medal Day. Players from the premiership-winning team will be in attendance to chat about their memories of this incredible time in the club's history. The lunch will incorporate an auction and raffles, with half the funds raised to be directed to chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE) research through the Australian Sports Brain Bank, in remembrance of Seagulls legend Paul Green.

After winning the first premiership in 1982, the Seagulls missed the finals finishing a disappointing fifth in 1983. The club was desperate to turn things around for the 1984 season and was just about to get the best news any club could receive.

One of the biggest rugby league stories was just about to unfold, with Queensland captain and soon-to-be Australian captain Wally Lewis signing with the Seagulls for the 1984 season.

Once Lewis had signed with the club, Wynnum Manly had assembled arguably one of the best club sides ever seen in the Brisbane Rugby League competition and were able to win every possible trophy including the Winfield State League, Presidents Cup and the Grand Final.

The 1984 Grand Final team was not just one of the best sides in Queensland; it was one of the best sides in the world. The QRL president and former senator Ron McAuliffe wanted to challenge Sydney Rugby League premiers Canterbury Bulldogs in a BRL versus NSWRL Grand Final, however they declined the invitation.

The 1984 side contained nine Queensland players and four Internationals. This side is known as the best team Wynnum Manly assembled to date.

The 1984 grand final team included:

We have generations of one family that have dealt with us and stay with us because we're a local family and we understand community needs.

"Keith's delighted to see the local acceptance the Laneway refurbishment has created and he looks forward to his son Scott Anderson, now Principal of

State of the Market: Record Prices in Greater Brisbane and Wynnum Manly

As the new financial year begins, let's take look at some of the current market trends in Brisbane, and more importantly, on our bayside.

Despite the chilly conditions, buyers are turning out in greater numbers, with the latest Raine & Horne June data indicating a 16% increase in groups attending open for inspections. This increase in buyer activity, along with a tight supply of new listings and over 80,000 new migrants to Brisbane each year, continues to drive the current market. The forecast is for Brisbane to continue to hold a strong position nationally.

The greater Brisbane market has hit a record home price, firming itself as the second most expensive capital city to buy a dwelling, after the median hit \$840,000. Prices have jumped 14.14% compared to this same time last year, according to the latest PropTrack Home Price Index

released on 1st July, 2024.

Comparably, we have seen even greater growth to our Wynnum and Manly marketplace, with Wynnum now having a median sale price of \$1,150,000 for a home (up 17.9%) and \$650,000 for a unit (up 7.9%). Manly is one of the strongest and most tightly held marketplaces in all of Brisbane, seeing a staggering increase of 44.7% to the house market, with a median sale price of \$1,592,000 and units are up 5.9%. with a median of \$765.000*.

The majority of buyers in the marketplace are owner occupiers. We've seen a selection of people purchase their first homes, thanks to the QGOV increase to the first home concession threshold on transfer (stamp) duty from \$500,000 to \$700,000. Also, the continuation of local residents upgrading from their current homes while remaining in our area. Another strong entry into our

area is coming from our east Brisbane neighbours in Coorparoo, Morningside, Carina and surrounding suburbs. Many young families are moving to the bayside to enjoy the lifestyle and to attend our great local schools.

Properties with bay views, as well as walking distance to waterfront are still in great demand – both the money and the desire are there.

For many, this raises the questions: When do I sell? When should I purchase?

We do know that supply and demand continue to drive this market, which is the strongest we have ever seen. The number of properties on the market will only increase your competition as a seller and narrow the pool of potential buyers. In response, this is a fantastic opportunity to sell!

Do you, as a buyer, hold off on making a



purchase until interest rates have dropped so you can lock in the lower rate? The question is: What is the duration of the wait? And are real estate values going to keep rising, eliminating any potential savings from a lower interest rate, while we wait for interest rates to (potentially) decline? Being inside the market is unquestionably preferable than watching from outside of it.

BUSH TO BAY: FORGOTTEN SPIEGELTENT COMES TO WYNNUM

FROM WYNNUM FRINGE

The Augathella Spiegeltent, previously located in outback Augathella, has now made the 800km trip to its new home on Bay Terrace, Wynnum.

The relocation is the brainchild of Tom Oliver, founder of the Wynnum Fringe – Queensland's trailblazing bayside arts festival. He is reviving this forgotten piece of Queensland's cultural history and giving it new life, and at the same time, giving arts and community organisations in Brisbane a new place to call home!

At the same time, a ground breaking community crowdfund is underway to make this relocation and refurbishment happen. The campaign seeks to raise \$500,000 to restore the run-down Spiegeltent from the regional town of Augathella to provide a new semi-permanent performance venue for the Brisbane region and other parts of Australia. The first milestone of \$100,000 was raised in just three weeks.

Tom said the crowdfunding campaign was an urgent response to the national live entertainment crisis which has seen several major festival cancellations and high-profile venue closures over the past 12 months.

"This project will provide a much-needed platform to nurture emerging talent, bring communities together, increase capacity-building across the sector and create year-round jobs for creative workers," Tom said. "It not only revitalises a forgotten gem in Queensland's cultural history but gives the Brisbane region a new live performance venue of similar capacity to the recently shuttered The Zoo."

ABOUT THE SPIEGELTENT

Designed by world famous fourth-generation Belgian tent-building family The Klessens, The Augathella Spiegeltent was originally commissioned in 2008 by the Queensland Government as part of Queensland's 150th anniversary celebrations. It toured across the state before settling in Augathella, nine hours' drive west of Brisbane. The venue was a community function and entertainment centre until it fell into disrepair many years ago and now deemed not useable by The Murweh Shire Council.

With its uniquely Queensland design, blending traditional 19th century Belgian construction techniques with a quintessential Australian shearing shed aesthetic, The Augathella Spiegeltent is regarded as Australia's first Spiegeltent of its kind.

WHY BRING A SPIEGELTENT TO WYNNUM?

"I remember thinking in 2021, gosh we need a professional venue of our own out here in Wynnum," explained Tom. "Imagine if Wynnum became the 'off-broadway' of Brisbane, and a Spiegeltent in suburbia created shows that then toured to London or New York. It could happen."

In early 2023, Tom's parents were on a regional driving trip and stopped for lunch in Augathella, some 748 km west of Brisbane. There sat a seemingly abandoned Spiegeltent. It was the start of an idea.

In late 2023, Mayor Zorro (of Murweh Shire Council) and Tom agreed that Wynnum Fringe would acquire this piece of history from the town, rename it 'The Augathella', and celebrate the regional Queensland town wherever it plays in the world.

HOW CAN YOU CONTRIBUTE?

Tom says Wynnum Fringe has been creating shows and experiences in similar Spiegeltents for the past three years, and now we have an opportunity to create an engine room of our own for a Queensland-made product to get up and tour the world.

"We invite crowdfund donors to come on this epic journey with us and be part of this historymaking creative venture. Donations over \$1,000 secure a name on the floorboards of The Augathella Spiegeltent, the literal foundation of the venue," said Tom.

CHICKEN STUFFED WITH PUMPKIN AND GOAT CHEESE RECIPE

Here's a scrumptious recipe that combines succulent chicken, creamy goat cheese, and sweet roasted pumpkin, all topped with a hint of thyme and curry. Perfect for a cosy dinner or a special occasion, this recipe is sure to impress. Let's cook!

INGREDIENTS TO SERVE 4

- Olive oil
- 4 x chicken marylands (skin on)
- 2 cups of pumpkin, cut into cubes of approximately 5cm
- 150g goat cheese

- 1 large onion, chopped
- · 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tablespoon of thyme leaves, chopped
- Salt and pepper
- 1 tablespoon curry powder

METHOD

- Put the pumpkin on a tray lined with baking paper, drizzle with olive oil, salt and pepper, and bake for around 40 minutes at 180°C, or until it's tender. Remove from the oven to cool slightly. Leave the oven on; you'll need it again soon.
- 2. Add a tablespoon of olive oil in a medium frypan and fry the onion over a medium heat until it's translucent. Add the garlic and thyme, then fry for another minute (careful, don't burn the garlic!).
- 3. In a bowl, mash the pumpkin with a fork. Add the goat cheese and the onion/garlic/thyme mixture and combine well. Season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Now it's time to stuff your chicken. Gently ease the skin along one side of the chicken maryland to create a loose pocket between the flesh and the skin. Stuff the pumpkin mixture under the skin.
- 5. Place the chicken on a baking tray lined with baking paper, skin side up.
- 6. In a small bowl, combine three tablespoons of olive oil and a pinch of salt and pepper with the curry powder and mix well. Drizzle or brush the mixture over the chicken.
- 7. Bake for 55 minutes, or until the chicken is cooked through and the skin is golden brown.



Optional swaps: If you find goat cheese too strong, substitute it with ricotta or feta cheese. Sweet potato can be used instead of pumpkin. Serve with cauliflower puree, mashed potato or sweet potato.



LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO

SQUID-TACULAR WINTER FISHING FOR THE FAMILY ON MORETON BAY

Winter fishing for arrow squid and cuttlefish is still one of the best reasons to have fun with the family on the water, especially for the kids, who love catching some very tasty octopods.

Everyone loves squid rings or calamari rings (same thing) to eat, deep fried in batter, stuffed, or any way you like to eat them. There will be plenty in the bay this month, so go out and catch a few east of Ormiston all the way down to Mud Island. You'll find them at a depth of 20 to 35-ft, just off the bottom. The easiest way to fish for them is to use a ball sinker on top of your squid jigs, drop them to the bottom and jig slowly.

Cleaning and preparing squid is a contentious issue. People have been fed white rings with the skin off and soaked to make them soft...blah, blah, blah! I never soften them; I never take the skin off, as I reckon that tastes best. The problem with squid is that it is either overcooked or undercooked, and you need to find the correct balance of cooking. You either need to cook it quickly or slowly — anything in between makes it chewy.

As for gear, a light fishing rod (whiting rod) is ideal with a small spinning reel, a 10 to 12-lb line and a few quality




jigs. Use a long net to scoop them in — a great idea is to leave the squid in the net for a couple of minutes so they release any water they hold. If they don't have any water, they can't mix the ink to shoot out (but we all cop an inking somewhere along the line). The silly stories about holding them in the water to release all the ink are not true; they only mix a drop or two with water to shoot out, and the ink sacks hold lots of ink, so just remember: no water, no spurting ink!

Yamashita and Daiwa jigs are probably the best around. The mullet/whiting colour and the red head/white body work well, but there are days you just need to try different colours. Oranges and pinks are a must in your squid jig tackle box, and 3.0 to 3.5 are my favourites.

So get out there on the bay, get inked, and enjoy one of the tastiest foods of the ocean.



ARE MY TEETH WEARING AWAY?

FROM DENTAL ON CAMBRIDGE

Dental erosion, or tooth erosion, is a common issue for many patients that can occur at any age. It differs from the more commonly known issue of tooth decay, which is caused by bacteria. It occurs when part of the enamel surface of your teeth is dissolved and softened by contact with acids. These acids could come from your stomach, caused by gastric reflux, excessive vomiting in some conditions such as bulimia, and reduced saliva production. Acid can also come from food and drinks, such as fruit juices, soft drinks (including sugar-free drinks), sports drinks, energy drinks and alcohol such as wine, champagne, spirits with mixers, and beer.

Dental erosion occurs in two stages. First, contact with acids starts to weaken and soften the enamel on the outside of the teeth. Then, these softened teeth surfaces are worn away by eating and chewing.

If you have dental erosion, your teeth may be discoloured, become sensitive to hot and cold, look shorter due to wearing away, chip or break easily, and have sharp edges. Dental erosion occurs most frequently on the biting surfaces and inside surfaces of your teeth. The acid wears away the enamel on teeth, exposing the dentine underneath, which is a yellowish-brown colour. It can also wear away teeth around existing fillings, making them seem raised.

Dental erosion is something your dentist can continue to monitor at your six-monthly examination and clean. Treatment varies depending on your individual circumstances and could include some simple tweaks such as limiting your exposure to acidic foods and drinks, using a straw to reduce the contact with your teeth, rinsing your mouth with water after having these foods and drinks, discussing acid reflux treatment with your GP, chewing sugar-free gum to increase your saliva production and cutting down on alcohol. It may also need more intensive intervention with your dentist, including topical application of fluoride or a remineralising treatment.

If not treated early, dental erosion can cause gradual loss of the tooth surface and unfortunately once the enamel is gone, it can't grow back. If this occurs, the treatment is more than likely going to be fillings, crowns, root canal treatment or extractions.
