



ALL ABOUT HYPOTHYROIDISM IN DOGS

WHAT IS HYPOTHYROIDISM?

Hypothyroidism is a hormonal deficiency in which there is a reduction in the production of thyroid hormone by the thyroid glands. The condition may be congenital but is more



commonly seen in middle aged to old dogs. A number of breeds have been recognised as being more likely to develop hypothyroidism — Doberman Pinschers, Tibetan Terriers and Boxers were more commonly affected according to a retrospective study of cases in the UK.

CLINICAL SIGNS

The clinical signs of hypothyroidism include:

- Animals may be easily fatigued and sleep more
- Dull attitude
- Seeking warmth
- Slow heart rate
- Weight gain without diet change
- Coat may become sparse, dry and lose shine; clipped fur may not regrow
- The skin may become hyperpigmented (darker)
- Animals may be prone to skin infections and show slow wound healing


DIAGNOSIS

Diagnosis of hypothyroidism is based on clinical signs and blood tests. Your vet may perform any or all of a T4 level, free T4 or TSH (thyroid stimulating hormone) test. Affected dogs often have an increased circulating cholesterol level.

TREATMENT

Treatment of hypothyroidism requires ongoing/ lifelong supplementation of thyroid hormone, usually in tablet form. Owners often notice an improvement in their dog's demeanour very rapidly, but skin and coat improvement may take months.

Ongoing monitoring with regular blood tests is required to ensure your dog's thyroid hormone level remains in the normal range.

LONELINESS

Loneliness, a pervasive emotion, can have profound effects on both mental and physical health. It is not just the feeling of being alone but the distress that comes from perceived social isolation. Prolonged loneliness can lead to depression, anxiety, and a decrease in self-esteem. Individuals may begin to withdraw further from social interactions, creating a vicious cycle that exacerbates the sense of isolation.

Studies have shown that the effects of loneliness can be linked to a weakened immune system, increased inflammation, and higher blood pressure. Chronic loneliness can be as harmful as smoking 15 cigarettes a day, leading to an increased risk of cardiovascular diseases and a shorter lifespan.

Furthermore, loneliness affects cognitive function. It can impair memory and decision-making abilities, contributing to conditions like dementia, particularly in older adults. The psychological stress of loneliness triggers the body's stress response, releasing cortisol and other stress hormones, which over time can damage various bodily systems.

Given these potential health risks, it is crucial to seek help if you're feeling persistently lonely. You can make an appointment with any of the GPs at Baywest Medical Centre or Manly Village Medical. They can offer support, provide resources, or refer you to counselling services that can help you rebuild social connections and improve your wellbeing.



MANLY SWIMMER TO COMPETE IN HER THIRD PARALYMPICS IN PARIS

With the Olympics just completed and Australia's amazing team results being celebrated, it's now the 'Paras' turn to shine. Queensland has strong representation in the team, including Manly swimmer Rachael Watson, or 'Rachina' as her Aussieltalian opera singing coach Matteo calls her, who will compete in her third Paralympics as a wheelchair athlete.

Rachael won gold in the 50m Freestyle in Rio, coached by Rob Hindmarsh, and then again in Tokyo, with now-retired Gary Watson as her coach — a first for Australia going back to back. (Gary is still coaching pace swimming part-time at Chandler for social swimmers.)

Rachael has been the Chandler club captain since 2017. The club boasts Olympians Bronte and Kate Campbell, Zac Stubblety-Cook, Lizzy Dekker, Ella Ramsay, and master coach Vince Raleigh.

Rachael is the current Paralympic record holder for S4 100m and 50m Freestyle and holds world and Australian records in many events.

Swim legend Dawn Fraser has mentored Rachael since 2016, and the support and results have been astounding. Mrs Gina Reinhardt has also been a great supporter of Rachael, both on the pool deck and financially through the Georgina Hope Foundation. This support

is equally shared by Olympians and Paralympians in various sports.

Rachael has a strong support team: her dad, Stuart, is with her at all sessions, as are her mum, Grace, and her brothers, Jamie and Jonny. Grandparents Dr David and Joan Clowes are avid supporters and will watch on from the Gold Coast when she swims.

Rachael is also an ambassador for Brisbane's ex-Olympic Finn class yacht fleet, which will host the World Gold Cup and World Masters in Brisbane 2026, a first for Australia. At 64, Rachael's father still sails a Finn.

Currently a student at the University of Queensland, Rachael is completing a master's degree and volunteers at the Brisbane Children's Hospital.

Rachael's competition times (subject to change) are:

- Women's 100m Freestyle S3 heats at 6.59pm on Tuesday, 3 September (Brisbane time), and final at 3.28am on Wednesday, 4 September.
- Women's 50m Freestyle S4 heats at 7.17pm Friday 6 September (Brisbane time) and final at 3.57am Saturday 7 September.

WYNNUM MANLY LEAGUES CLUB'S COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM UPDATE

In its ongoing commitment to supporting local communities, the Wynnum Manly Leagues Club has announced the latest recipients of its Community Grant Program, distributing over \$72,000 to 19 not-for-profit organisations across the region.

Since its inception in 2016, the program has provided nearly half a million dollars in funding to various community groups, reflecting the club's dedication to enhancing the wellbeing and vibrancy of the Wynnum Manly area.

The 2024 round of grants has been allocated to a wide range of initiatives, from upgrading school facilities to supporting local sports clubs, ensuring a broad impact across different sectors of the community.

We are incredibly proud of the impact our Community Grant Program continues to have on the Wynnum Manly area," said Brett Mooney, Chairman of Wynnum Manly Leagues Club.

"These grants are not just about providing financial support; they're about empowering local organisations to create lasting, positive change in our community. It's inspiring to see how each grant recipient is making a difference, and we are honoured to be a part of their journey."

Among the recipients, the Bayside United Sports and Recreation Club received \$5,500 to install security cameras, enhancing the

safety and security of their facilities. Similarly, the Tingalpa & District Kindergarten Association Inc. was granted \$2,675 for the installation of a second aluminium fence and an auto-closing gate, aimed at improving child safety.

Education was a significant focus this year, with several schools benefiting from the grants. Wynnum General Gordon Kindergarten received \$1.095 to install an outdoor water bubbler, while **Wynnum** West State School P&C Association was awarded \$5,500 for the purchase of five branded school marquees. Gumdale State School also received \$4,800 for shade tents to be used at sporting events, providing much-needed sun protection for students and spectators

In the realm of community events and programs, St Pete's Pantry was granted \$4,584.23 for a commercial fridge that is used extensively for the storage of fresh items, which are distributed to those in need. A commercial fridge is necessary for the continual operation of 'The Pantry', ensuring that perishable goods remain fresh for those who rely on this essential service.

Meanwhile, the Queensland Services Heritage Band Association **Inc.** was awarded \$5,500 to support the 2024 Bayside Carols event, ensuring the continuation of this cherished local tradition.



Local sporting clubs also benefited, with the Manly Dragon Boat Club receiving \$5,500 for the purchase of two dragon boat covers, and the Wynnum Manly Men's Shed being granted \$5,500 to acquire a tailgate lifter, further supporting their members' activities.

Additionally, Myhorizon, a local organisation that provides services to people with disabilities, received \$2,244 for the purchase of gardening equipment. This equipment will help beautify and maintain the grounds at their Adam Street facility, a space used by participants with disabilities and the wider community.



OUR LOCAL SANTA WORKSHOP IS GEARING UP FOR THE FESTIVE SEASON!

Last year, the Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly ran out of its iconic Santas due to unprecedented demand. As a result, the club has teamed up with the Wynnum Manly and Districts Men's Shed to manufacture new Rotary Santas.

The Santas have been part of the bayside Christmas spirit for over 40 years. Originally an Apex Club initiative, Rotary took over the installation of Santas as a fundraising program in 1996.

Last Christmas, 95 Santas were rented. Last year also saw the introduction of corflute Santas for commercial premises' windows, which allowed for another 18 Santas to be installed in shopfronts. The Rotary Santas are installed from Tingalpa in the north to Wynnum, Manly, and Capalaba in the south.

Many older Santas are over 30 years old and manufactured from Masonite or Burnie board. This made them heavy and difficult to install, and the reason they have been replaced.

The Rotary Club needed assistance with the replacement program, so we collaborated with The Men's Shed to manufacture new lightweight marine ply models. Bunnings Warehouse and Taubmans Paints also supported the Santa replacement program.

Over the past few months, many Rotarians, their partners and friends have been involved, in conjunction with the Men's Shed members, in the production of 80 new Santas for this festive season. It is estimated that more than 1500 volunteer hours will be put into getting the Santas ready this year.

The Santas have ascended to iconic status in the local area as new generations of children look forward to seeing them on walls, verandahs, high-rise apartments and roofs in the bayside suburbs.

All funds raised from the Santa project support the many community projects Rotary runs during the year.

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT STOP AND SMELL THE ROSES!

"A rose by any other name would smell as sweet". Unless it's an unscented rose. I have never really understood the point of them. Sure, they're pretty, but they're thorny! The only thing that makes up for rose thorns (and the black spot, sparseness and general painfulness of a rose shrub, especially here in subtropical humid Brisbane) is the SCENT. Nothing beats it. Rose-scented geraniums don't even come close. But a good smelly old-fashioned rose is heaven scent (see what I did there!).

Roses have a long history and are thought to have been originally domesticated in China (thousands of years BCE). Rosewater and rose oil were used both medicinally and as perfume (to mask the stench of life — you know, the no deodorant or plumbing thing), and Cleopatra used roses in her skincare and as an aphrodisiac to lure her lovers. Nothing much has changed, and roses are still used in herbal medicines, food, cosmetics and perfumes.

There are lots of rose species and hybrids, and some are better at some things than others –

the old hybrid Rosa x damascena makes great perfume, Rosa rugosa reputedly has the best tasting hips and petals (although all roses are edible) and hybrid tea roses arguably make the best cut flowers.

I love having roses in my garden, and while they're pretty hardy, it can be a bit of a challenge to keep them looking lush. Your best bet is to choose a rose that suits your requirements. I choose ones that a) have a great smell and b) are bred for good black spot resistance, as that seems to be my main challenge! But there are still a few tricks to keeping them in tip-top condition.

Firstly, give them space. Humidity is a killer for lots of plants, and while it won't kill your rose, it can sure leave it a diseased mess. Both pruning dense foliage out of the middle of each bush and not letting them be overgrown by other plants are crucial

Secondly, keep them well fed and give them a good drink every so often. I'm on sandy soil and

feed mine with organic pellets once a month, followed by a deep soak. If you're on clay you can probably ease off a little but don't ignore them! And finally, they love the sun. It helps keep their foliage dry and encourages good strong growth.

As a side note, if you're near the Redlands area, I recommend you check out www.littleislandorganics.com. au. Rod sells Rocky Point products (which I personally love) and delivers locally for free! Let them do the heavy lifting and leave you to the fun stuff. Use the code GITG to get \$1 off each product!

Latest news from the Port of Brisbane September 2024





Trade

Trade volumes through the Port were resilient over 2023/24, with most commodity sectors remaining consistent or increasing on prior year volumes.

The container sector was particularly strong – over 1.61 million containers were handled during 2023/24, a record volume. Import containers increased by 3% driven by regional population growth and export containers increased by 1%, with high volumes of cotton, beef and agricultural seed driven by strong demand from global markets.

Renewable import shipments continued as we saw wind, solar and battery energy storage system componentry coming over the wharves during the year for southern and southwestern Queensland renewables projects.

Community

Congratulations to the recipients of our 2024/25 Community Grant Program! This year, 11 community organisations from the Bayside out west to Warwick, will share in a total of \$100,000 funding.

This year, our team raised \$45,000 for our Employee Charity, Hummingbird House, through various fundraising efforts across initiatives including Containers for Change, scrap metal recycling, chocolate sales, raffles, BBQ's and employee giving programs. PBPL dollar-matched all funds raised.

We are very pleased to announce that the MND and Me Foundation has been chosen as the Port's 2024/25 Employee Charity.

Environment

During 2023/24, Port of Brisbane deposited over 47,000 containers to Containers for Change!

From humble beginnings, our goal was to divert 20,000 containers a year away from landfill and donate the funds raised to our Employee Charity.

The Containers for Change initiative is now in place across all Port of Brisbane locations, including the Brisbane International Cruise Terminal and onboard our flagship vessel the *TSHD Brisbane*. Over the last 12 months, through our employees and the community, it raised almost \$5,000 for charity and diverted up to 100kg per month of recyclable containers away from landfill.

Wynnum Manly's House Of Heritage: Stratford on Mountjoy Tce

'Stratford Villa', or 'Tingalpa', was built at Wynnum on Mountjoy Terrace as a home for the Mayor of Wynnum Manly in the early 1900s. The area was formerly dominated by farm land but on the cusp of development.

The front stairs lead up to the home's main entrance and upstairs rooms, which preserves the layout of the original homestead – but now thoughtfully modernised by more recent owners. Its original soul remains, however, in key features such as the heritage brick of the main upstairs chimney and the large bay windows marking the house's façade.

The house was sold to a prominent stonemason of the area, who left his mark on many of the buildings in the business centre of Wynnum/Manly. As the area evolved in the 1940s and 1950s, the house continued to be a local landmark, even acting as the location for a movie at the time, its details sadly lost to record.

After hosting two generations of the family from 1916 to 1980, it then stood silent for nine years and, as surrounding blocks were divided, ran the risk of its history also being lost. It fortunately found itself in the hands of new owners in 1989, who devoted much care to restoring and renovating the home, work that was later built on by the current owners.

The large mango trees flanking the home and camphor laurels marking its façade are believed to be over 100 years old, dating back to its early days.

The house now sits on one of the last remaining large blocks in the area not subdivided and holds heritage status for its links to the past. It holds memories and stories of many families in its over 100-year history. And now it's on the market, another lucky family will have the opportunity to enjoy it.



SIMPLY TASTY TOMATO, CHEESE AND BASIL TART RECIPE

How good are tomatoes right now? Whether you're using heirlooms, Romas, or cherry tomatoes, this deliciously easy tart is perfect for a lazy spring brunch or lunch, and the leftovers make ideal picnic food.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 or 2 sheets of frozen puff pastry, slightly thawed
- 4-5 medium-sized ripe tomatoes, sliced to about 1cm thick
- ½ a small red onion, chopped
- 1 cup fresh basil leaves, roughly chopped
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

- 1/2 cup ricotta cheese
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon balsamic vinegar
- · Fresh basil leaves to garnish
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 egg, beaten (save this for step 7)

METHOD

- 1. Preheat your oven to 200°C.
- Put the slightly thawed puff pastry on a tray lined with baking paper. Using a sharp knife, score a 2cm border around the edge of the puff pastry, being careful not to cut all the way through. This will give your tart a raised edge.
- 3. Place the sliced tomatoes on paper towels and sprinkle with salt. Let them sit for about 10 minutes to draw out any excess moisture. Pat them dry with additional paper towels.
- 4. In a medium bowl, mix together the ricotta cheese, minced garlic, and 1/2 cup of the shredded mozzarella cheese. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Spread the ricotta mixture evenly within the scored border of the puff pastry. Arrange the tomato slices over the ricotta mixture in a single layer, slightly overlapping them. Scatter the onion and chopped basil over the top of the tomatoes.
- 6. Drizzle the olive oil and balsamic vinegar over the top. Sprinkle the remaining shredded mozzarella and the grated Parmesan cheese evenly over the tart.



- 7. Brush the beaten egg along the edges of the puff pastry to give it a golden, glossy finish when baked.
- 8. Bake in the preheated oven for about 30 minutes, or until the puff pastry is golden and puffed, and the cheeses are melted and bubbly.
- 9. Garnish with fresh basil leaves and your tart is ready to serve!
