WYNNUM AND MANLY ROTARY CLUB HELP PNG LANDSLIDE VICTIMS

FROM THE ROTARY CLUB OF WYNNUM AND MANLY

The Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly has sprung into action to provide funds to help the people of Papua New Guinea affected by the landslide at Mulitaka in Enga Province on May 24, 2024. The landslide has cost many lives and destroyed properties.

Gabriel Andandi, originally from PNG (not far from where the landslide happened), is a member of the Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly. Gabriel gave Rotary members a detailed description of the landslide and its effect on the community of Mulitaka. He explained that after the major landslide occurred in Mulitaka, as of June 7, 2024, only 12 bodies had been recovered, but it was estimated that 670 lives had been lost because all the homes in the community had been buried.

President Mick Matthews said that club members had been shocked by this event and that its board approved a donation of \$2,000 from club funds but wanted to allow the community to contribute as well.

A function at Cedar & Pine at Wynnum was subsequently arranged, and guests — along with the support of Cedar and Pine, who donated the venue and made a substantial donation — raised over \$2,500.

These funds will be provided to Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS), which will assist in the recovery period with food, water and other items needed, such as clothing, bedding and shelter, and work in partnership with local authorities and the PNG Government. Rotary District 9620 has established a Rotary Australasia World Community Service (RAWCS) project to manage operations and donations.



NOTHING LASTS FOREVER. INCLUDING FLEXI HOSES!

The BPD Way!

We've all heard the saying, "Nothing lasts forever," and this is especially true for the flexible hoses in our homes. These seemingly insignificant items are one of the leading causes of water damage in Australian homes. While your insurance might cover the repairs, it won't replace sentimental items, or prevent the stress and inconvenience of water damage. This is why checking and replacing your flexible hoses regularly is not just important, it's crucial!

It's easy to overlook, but a braided flexible hose has the potential to unleash a disaster. A burst hose can release a deluge of water, wreaking havoc in your home within hours, destroying belongings and creating chaos.

So, what is a flexible hose? Often called a "flexi hose," this rubber pipe, wrapped in stainless steel, connects appliances like sinks, toilets, and washing machines. They typically cost around \$10. However, they have a lifespan of just five to 10 years, and ignoring a damaged or faulty hose can lead to flooding. A

burst hose can dump the equivalent of a suburban swimming pool of water into your home within 24 hours!

Imagine returning from work or vacation to find your home flooded. Water can quickly spread from a second-floor bathroom to other areas, soaking floors, ceilings, and furniture and potentially damaging your neighbours' homes.

If you're planning a holiday, take a moment to check those flexi hoses. It's a good idea to turn off your home's water at the mains while you're away for extra peace of mind.

To check if your hoses need replacing, look under your sinks. Check for expiry date tags; if one's expired or missing, it's time to call a professional plumber. Check for any kinks and dark marks. This should be part of your regular home maintenance.

It's also a good idea not to store chemicals in cupboards that have flexi hoses.



Never attempt to install these hoses yourself. By hiring a qualified plumber and keeping harsh chemicals away from them, you can prevent premature wear and ensure your home's safety.

IMPORTANT ELECTION INFORMATION

The Queensland State Election is on Saturday, 26 October. You must be on the electoral roll to be eligible to vote. The electoral roll closes on Saturday 5 October. Early voting is from Monday 14 October to Friday 25 October from 8am to 6pm (excluding the weekend). Early voting will take place at St Peter's Anglican Church in Wynnum (Bride Street entrance). Postal voting applications close on Monday 14 October at 7pm. I will provide all Lytton electorate households with a postal vote application (please look out for one in your letterbox from October 1). Voting is compulsory. PUBLIC TRANSPORT PATRONAGE UP 14.5%

The introduction of 50 cent fares on all public transport has seen a big increase in patronage within the first month. The total number of trips was 14.5% higher than during the same period recorded last year. Already, thousands of Bayside commuters are saving up to \$50 per week. I encourage all Baysiders to make the switch to public transport, where possible. You can reduce local traffic congestion, help the environment, and take pressure off your household budget. The cost is 50 cents per trip – please remember to tap on and tap off.



STANDING UP FOR THE BAYSIDE

Since 2015, I've worked hard to ensure our Bayside gets its fair share of government funding and investment. This includes over \$45million in direct community, business, education, and sporting grants. I've also secured major investments like Darling Point Special School, Manly State School Build, Wynnum Community Health Centre (Gundu Pa) and major upgrades to Lindum Station. But there's still more to do. I hope to continue to serve the Bayside to protect and help build our community's future.



COST OF LIVING RELIEF

Every Baysider is seeing \$1300 slashed from their energy bill, with \$1000 upfront from the Queensland Government and an additional \$300 from the Federal Government. It means many Baysiders may not have to pay a cent for their energy bills until March 2025. Of course, this financial help to Baysiders is only possible because we're making multinational mining companies pay their fair share and because we kept energy assets in public hands. Other Queensland Government Cost-of-Living Relief measures include 50 cent public transport fares, \$200 Fairplay Vouchers for kids' sport, and \$200 off your car rego.



REBUILDING LOCAL HEALTH SERVICES: YOUR **FEEDBACK NEEDED**

Rebuilding Bayside health services (since the LNP closed the Wynnum Hospital when they were last in government) remains my top priority. I'm getting strong community feedback about the need to expand services at the Wynnum Community Health Centre (Gundu Pa). I want to hear from you about what you think we may need locally - such as new primary care services, including an x-ray machine, dialysis/renal chairs, chemotherapy services, or even improved waiting room facilities. Look out for my "Bayside Health Survey" I'll be putting out soon.



LINDUM STATION UPDATE

Construction at Lindum Station continues to press ahead. These works at the station include a footbridge with lift access, improved accessible parking and a new station office and facilities. I know how dangerous this intersection in Lindum is - and I've been fighting to get it fixed for a long time. These major upgrades, in conjunction with BCC's reconfiguration of the intersection and the installation of traffic lights, will ensure a safe and accessible trip for all commuters.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ITCHING AND ALLERGIES IN CATS

BY DR NICKY THOMAS, WYNNUM MANLY VETERINARY HOSPITAL

Itching and allergies in cats occur commonly and can be frustrating to manage and treat. Itchy cats will often demonstrate persistent scratching and chewing, which can result in open wounds and pain, in addition to the irritation caused by the itch.

What are the most common causes of itching?

Itching in cats is commonly caused by external parasites such as fleas and mites, allergies and the fungal infection ringworm. Cats will show signs of itching, including scratching, licking, or chewing on the affected area. The skin may become red and inflamed with fur loss and scabbing secondary to self-trauma or secondary infection.

What are the most common types of allergies in cats?

The most common allergies in cats are flea allergy dermatitis, food allergy and atopic dermatitis. Secondary infection with bacteria or yeast can increase the level of itching.

Flea allergy dermatitis is caused by flea saliva — one bite from a
flea is enough to trigger a reaction in affected animals. Regular
use of a flea control product on all pets in the house, and
treatment of infected environments with regular pest control
can reduce the risk of flea allergy.

- Food allergy is the result of a reaction to protein, carbohydrates
 or preservatives in food. Your vet will advise you on options for
 hypoallergenic or anallergenic foods for your cat to try. These
 foods often contain "novel" proteins these are proteins which
 your cat has not been exposed to previously so is less likely to
 have a reaction to.
- Atopic dermatitis is similar to hay fever in people cats may be allergic to pollen, dust mites and mould spores. Veterinary dermatologists can test your cat for allergens and develop a vaccine to desensitise against allergens.

How do we treat allergies in cats?

Treatment of allergic skin disease in cats includes aiming to reduce exposure to allergens and reducing itching. There are topical, oral and injectable treatments that may be utilised to control your itchy cat's signs. Your vet will be able to help you develop the appropriate treatment plan for your pet.

DOES MY CHILD HAVE ADHD?

Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD previously called ADD) is a neurodevelopmental condition. ADHD is NOT the same as Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), but the two conditions can coexist.

The brain of a patient with ADHD is wired just a little differently resulting in these patients having trouble with executive functioning.

Executive functioning is a set of cognitive processes and mental skills that help individuals to plan, monitor and successfully execute their goals.



- Self-control (regulation)
- Flexible thinking
- Inhibition



Working memory

Trouble with executive function makes it hard to focus, follow directions and handle emotions. As such, patients with ADHD have symptoms that can be grouped into two core categories. Children with ADHD may display symptoms from one OR both categories.

- **1. Hyperactivity/impulsivity** e.g. fidgeting, difficulty remaining seated, restless, difficulty playing quietly, excessive talking, difficulty taking turns, interrupting.
- 2. Inattention It can be difficult to distinguish between ADHD symptoms and normal "kid behavior". Certainly, my four children would display all of these symptoms at various times. I would consider ADHD as a possible cause for these traits IF:



- The symptoms appear ALL the time (rather than just in some situations)
- The patient displays MOST of the symptoms (rather than just SOME of the symptoms)
- The symptoms EFFECT FUNCTION on a DAILY basis (e.g. performance in school or harmony in the home)

It is very difficult to diagnose ADHD before the age of four, but If you are worried that your child might have signs of ADHD, you should see your GP. If your GP also suspects ADHD they may refer you for a formal assessment and diagnosis by a specialised paediatrician or paediatric psychiatrist.

SLOW FASHION: WHEN FROCKING DOWN MEANS FROCKING UP

Qualifications in agricultural science, ABC rural reporting and journalism may seem an unlikely background for a woman driving a revolution in fashion but that's Jane Milburn's story. Founder of Textile Beat, Jane's work aligns with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals. Her initiative in the "slow clothing" movement won Jane a 2019 Churchill Fellowship investigating ways of being more hands-on with our clothes to help reduce textile waste and enhance wellbeing.

"We need to take agency over what we wear," she says. "We are all conditioned by big fashion to strive for a certain look, to be in fashion — when in fact that's impossible, because it keeps being changed and we'll never catch up. Planned obsolescence started with the fashion industry, and because we wear clothes, it's immediately obvious whether we're in or out of the fashion club. We need to jump off the treadmill and do our own thing, create our own style by experimenting and playing with clothing."

Jane says that while domestic science classes may be a thing of the past, we could all benefit from learning life skills, how to make and mend and restyle clothes.

"Some people may feel that they're too busy; that it's so much easier to order online and wait for delivery," she says. "That's a shame because we're being de-skilled; making and creating things by hand is an essential part of our psycho-social makeup."

Jane observes that there are many parallels between slow food and slow fashion and that concern about the future welfare of the environment depends largely on our food and fabric consumption patterns.

"Slow fashion reflects many permaculture values," she says. "The '60s saw a wave of concern about food ingredients, production methods and environmental contamination. We should be as concerned about fabrics and make every purchase a considered decision. So many issues are layered into this; clothes, food, the environment, social manipulation, exploitation of garment workers...it's a big issue!

"Sixty per cent of our clothes are synthetics made of plastic. We're better off buying natural fibres like cotton and wool; even though their production is not perfect, they're improving. There have been processes developed to reconstitute potato greens, orange peel, milk, and banana skins into fabric, but as part of the food system, it's better that they stay on the farm as fertilisers and soil improvers.

"The first step for change is to unhook ourselves from the concept of having to look a certain way to be acceptable; basically, that's a lot of baloney."

At Point Lookout Hall on Wednesday, October 9, at 10:30am, Jane will hold a 90-minute talk and discussion about the options and choices for purchasing clothes.







LOCAL STUDENTS TEAM UP WITH BUSINESS LEADERS TO CREATE TRACTION

FROM THE PORT OF BRISBANE

Business leaders from across south-east Queensland have teamed up with students for the annual TRACTION CEO Bike Build at the Port of Brisbane.

A local charity who believes everyone deserves the chance to build their own future, TRACTION ran its sixth consecutive CEO Bike Build, raising funds for its mentoring programs for young people.

Students from Wynnum State High School in the bayside as well as Park Ridge State High School and Arcadia College were partnered with 23 executives and given three hours to build a bicycle as part of the hands-on mentoring program.

In addition to the Bike Build event, Wynnum State High School Students participated in a nine-week Bike Build Program earlier this year, sponsored by Port of Brisbane.

Daniel Burley, who heads up the Port's Infrastructure team, was one of the executives put to work.

"We love getting young people out to the Port for a hands-on experience, so partnering with TRACTION over the last four years has been a fantastic fit. 



LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT

EAT YOUR GREENS! (PART 1)

BY KAT PEARSON, GIRL IN THE GREEN

If you've been around edible gardening talks in Brisbane, you may have heard many "spinach alternative" suggestions — those leafy greens that tolerate our hot and humid summers better than more traditional lettuces. There are heaps of options out there, but as always, just because they are edible doesn't mean they taste good. Some of them are gross. But like everyone else, I'm going to share my top list of the leafy greens I voluntarily and even preferably eat from my garden over summer. I also want to give you a little info on growing each of them (and I tend to ramble), so I'll split this topic over two months!

A lot of the leafy green alternatives have higher levels of oxalates or oxalic acid. It's a natural compound that your body can process, but if you consume too much, it's not fabulous for your kidneys, so it's generally recommended to lightly cook them, which breaks them down. That being said, I've heard lots of people tell me they've eaten such and such every day since they were a kid and are fine, so I think a lot of it comes down to predisposition and erring on the side of caution. Personal choice. The problem is that cooked greens are not always what you want in summer — a replacement for silverbeet in your soup is great, but what about crisp, fresh summer delights?

Now, I should point out that I am not a salad fan. If it's full of roast pumpkin, feta, nuts and bacon, sure, but your typical lettuce, carrot, tomato, cucumber garden salad...c'mon peeps, I'm not a rabbit! I do, however, like a few crunchy fresh green leaves to add to my taco or burger, so I still have a handful of recommendations of leaves that can be eaten raw without any worries.

First up, Okinawa spinach (Gynura bicolor). Some people tell me they find this a bit slimy and prefer Malabar spinach (Basella alba), so it must be personal, but I picked out EVERY TINY LITTLE SLIMY MALABAR SPINACH LEAF from my last dish and ripped the plant out after I tried it. Disgusting. Back to Okinawa spinach: it's a low, sprawling plant that looks infinitely better with regular pruning and grows ridiculously easily from a cutting. I find part shade keeps it looking nicer, but it will tolerate full sun with water. The underside of the leaf is a beautiful purple colour and if you let it flower, the nectar-rich orange pompom flowers attract all the butterflies. Its close relative, longevity spinach (Gynura procumbens), is also ok to eat, but the leaves are a bit hairier and plain green.

Next up, Brazilian spinach (Alternanthera sissoo). This little guy has CRUNCH. It is quite drought-hardy, too, and loves full sun, although tastes MUCH better if you water it. It's also a low-growing plant but is quite compact, making a very low-maintenance ground cover perfect for edges, even in ornamental gardens.

VERY COOL TOMATO GAZPACHO RECIPE



This cool tomato soup is utterly refreshing, incredibly easy to make, and is a sensational entrée or a colourful addition to a brunch buffet. Get creative by serving the soup in crystal glasses or colourful glass bowls.

INGREDIENTS

- 6 ripe tomatoes, roughly chopped
- 1 continental cucumber, peeled and chopped
- 1 small red capsicum, cored and chopped
- 1 small green capsicum, cored and chopped
- 1 small red onion, chopped
- 1 garlic clove, finely minced
- 3 cups tomato juice (or cold water for a lighter version)

- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- Salt and freshly cracked black pepper to taste
- Garnish: diced continental cucumber, tomato, fresh basil leaves



METHOD

- 1. Place the tomatoes, cucumber, capsicums, onion, and garlic in a blender or food processor. Pulse until smooth.
- 2. Pour in the tomato juice, olive oil, red wine vinegar, and lemon juice. Blend the mixture again until it's combined.
- 3. Add the salt and pepper to taste. Now's the time to adjust the acidity by adding more vinegar or lemon juice.
- 4. Put the gazpacho in a large bowl, cover it, and pop it in the fridge to chill for at least two hours or until it's very cold (this intensifies the flavour!).
- 5. Ladle your soup into pretty glasses or bowls and garnish with basil, chopped cucumber and tomato.

FREE MARINE RADIO COURSE COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE

CONTRIBUTED BY VMR RABY BAY

How well do you know your marine radio? Do you know what channels to use when out in Moreton Bay or offshore? Do you know how to use it in an emergency? Did you know you need a marine radio licence to operate a VHF marine radio? These are all the questions and more answered in the free Know Your Marine Radio course, run by the volunteers at the Volunteer Marine Rescue (VMR) Raby Bay.

For a number of years, experienced radio operators have trained hundreds of boaties on the use of their marine radios, even by visiting boating and yachting clubs to run in-house sessions. VMR Raby Bay runs these sessions for free but is happy to accept any donations to help in the running of the VMR Raby Bay base.

The course helps participants understand VHF Marine Radios and provides hands-on training for those undertaking the marine radio exam through the Australian Maritime College (AMC). James and Lou are the principal deliverers of the course. Lou invigilates the exams at the VMR Raby Bay base at Cleveland on behalf of the AMC in Launceston, Tasmania.

"Whether you are going out for a few hours fishing in the bay, a day's fishing offshore or a round-the-world sailing adventure, your marine radio is one of the most important safety items you have on board," said Lou. "The skipper should know all aspects of radio usage and be able to instruct any crew or passengers on the basics of using the radio in case the skipper becomes incapacitated."

James and Lou are not only experienced radio operators, taking their turns in the VMR Raby Bay radio room, but also experienced boaties and VMR boat crew coxswains, and both have completed accredited search and rescue courses.

"As part of the constant contact with the boating public, either on a rescue boat or through the radio room, we can give many real-life examples of the importance of using a marine radio," said James.



"From the time of the Titanic through the invention of international flights, radios have been and continue to be the primary communication tool of operators of boats and planes. While many people believe the mobile phone is all they need, depending on your phone, your carrier or the distance from a tower, the phone can be next to useless. A properly set up marine radio could be your only lifeline in a marine emergency."

BABI'S GET SET FOR WORK PROGRAM — AN ALTERNATIVE PATHWAY TO SCHOOL

FORM BABI YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICE, WYNNUM

BABI Youth and Family Service has delivered its Get Set for Work program for over seven years.

The program works with young people who have disengaged from school or have finished school and are not sure what the next steps are. They participate in Certificate II in Skills for Work and Vocational Pathways whilst receiving one-on-one support from a youth worker to get job-ready and find the next step in their education or employment pathway. Alongside this are activities that encourage learning whilst having fun, such as sailing, trampolining, a visit to the local fire station, guest speakers, and the opportunity to complete a first-aid certificate.

There have been some amazing outcomes from this program, with young people finding employment in industries like construction, hairdressing, beauty, hospitality and retail. Others have gone on to study at TAFE or other training organisations in community services, nursing, youth work and childcare or complete years 11 and 12 through alternative pathways. These are not the only positive outcomes — there have been young people who were socially isolated and made new friends, and people with low self-esteem and confidence but finished the course with newfound positivity and confidence in their abilities.

School is not for everyone, and the BABI staff understand and respect people's individuality and diversity. The Get Set for Work program runs four times a year within the school terms, with an orientation week to get to know the staff and space they will be working in, with

NATURALLY WONDERFUL ... WITH RANGER STACEY

I love this time of year as daylight hours increase and local backyard birds perform their early morning symphony to inform us it's time to rise and shine.

With spring well and truly upon us, have you noticed the arrival of a new generation of feathered friends?

It's baby bird season ... an exciting time in nature's calendar! The season when nests are carefully constructed, eggs are laid and incubated, and tiny chicks hatch, grow and eventually fledge. Generally, this all happens without a hitch, but sometimes a baby bird is found on the ground - alone.

For wildlife officers, one of the most common wildlife questions is, "What should I do if I find a baby bird, with no sight of mum or dad?"

The answer depends on a few things. If the youngster is visibly injured, a trip to the nearest vet is the best thing you can do to give it a second chance at life.

But for a bird with no obvious injuries, check out the plumage! A baby

bird with no feathers or fluffy down needs its parents. So, get creative and make a makeshift nest. Then pop it in a tree or shrub, as high as you can reach. Walk away, watch, and wait out of sight for up to half an hour to see if a parent appears ... 99 per cent of the time mum or dad will return.



If the baby bird is a little older with feathers but not yet able to fly, it's a fledgling. The advice is similar - place it gently in a tree, wait and watch. After about 30 minutes, if the parents don't appear, a trip to the vet is the way to go.

If the chick is a plover or a curlew, they live on the ground and their parents will be close by. Look out for them and leave the chick alone.

Remember, we don't want to remove a perfectly healthy chick from its family unnecessarily - that's like kidnapping (or chick-napping). If in doubt, contact Redlands 24-hour Wildlife Rescue Service for advice.







OCTOBER'S SEAFOOD BASKET IS FULL OF WHITING AND MACKEREL!

There are plenty of days in October when the winds are strong, but there are also those beautiful calm days when fishing is fun for the whole family, so take advantage of them!



This time of the year, the whiting usually are prolific in the Small Boat Channel, the Rous Channel, the Sand Hills and Blue Hole, close in north-east of Darcy Light and on the northern side of the leads at a 6 to 8-ft depth.

The school mackerel will be in close and all the way through to the Naval Banks and east of Ormiston. I recommend trying the Rainbow Channel and the basin at Peel this time of year, but we are lucky to have good fish this close in.

There's also plenty of squire and snapper around this time of year, close to Green, St Helena, Mud and Peel Islands, and the artificial reefs – just find the drop-offs and burly up some scraps, and you should attract a few good fish.

For the family going out for a swim and wanting to enjoy the bay, the whales and calves are on the move, so it's worth spending the time to look for them anywhere from Green Island, to the artificial reef to Peel Island, around Peel and then back to Ormiston — that's the triangle they have been seen in, and they are worth finding; they are magnificent creatures.


