APPLICATION LODGED FOR EXCITING NEW COMMUNITY ASSET

The Bayside Woodturners and Woodcrafters Club, affectionately known as the Bayside Woodies, has planned a new building to replace the old Girl Guide Hut on its Council lease in Harman Street, Manly. The application for redevelopment has been lodged.

The club was established in 1989, and initially, members met in garages before taking over the present lease at Harman Reserve. The existing workshop buildings were added earlier this century to cater to membership growth, but more space is needed.

Bayside Woodies is known as a friendly and welcoming club catering to men and women over 14 years, with members practising wood turning, box making, musical instrument construction and restoration, pyrography, scroll saw work and toy making.

The club is active in the community, supporting district kindergartens with toys and other wooden activity pieces.

With over 165 members and growing, the club needs a new clubhouse and meeting room. The present hut is used for the

library and some woodwork activities but is no longer suitable as a meeting area; it is old and has asbestos walls, so extending it is not possible. Presently, the workshop is used for meetings. This takes up valuable workspace and requires machinery, chairs, and tables to be constantly moved about.

Over the past 18 months, the committee and members have worked towards getting council approval for the new building. Council representatives have been involved from the beginning, and Councillors Alex Givney and Lisa Atwood have been hugely supportive of the venture. Local residents have also been consulted and are supportive.

The new building has been designed to blend in with existing houses and will have access for people with any mobility issues. It will be entirely environmentally friendly.

"It's been a long time in the making with a group of members doing a lot of hard work. It will be a tremendous asset not only to the club and but also for the community and Council," said club president Chris May. "The club is very hopeful of approval success. Once achieved, a



building application will be lodged. Then the fun of fundraising begins, as it will cost \$300,000-plus."

REMEMBRANCE DAY AT THE ARMISTICE CENTENARY WAR MEMORIAL

During the Great War of 1914-18, more than 500 Riflemen who were members of the Queensland Rifle Association (QRA) made the supreme sacrifice to protect our freedom and way of life. These men came from the cities, towns and pastoral communities of Queensland. Sadly, many of their names were lost forever when the central Brisbane building housing the Honour Rolls was demolished in the 1970s.

As Australia prepared to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Armistice, the QRA decided to establish at the Belmont Shooting Complex a new memorial honouring these 500 Riflemen. It was envisaged that this new memorial would also provide a commemorative site for use by people from the local communities to honour their families and friends and to educate the next generation of young Australians on aspects of our military history.

In addition to formal ceremonies, the memorial's peaceful bushland setting allows for quiet contemplation. The site is guarded by a memorial gate and flanking walls. The memorial itself consists of a central stone, surrounded by 11 plinths, with a further two plinths on either side of the central memorial stone. Each plinth has been adopted by a shooting club or association to acknowledge the past sacrifices of their members in defence of the nation. A flagpole was erected next to the central memorial stone. The national flag flies constantly as a silent sentinel over the memorial and is illuminated at night. A manicured lawn area completes the solemn yet uplifting ambience of the memorial.

The Armistice Centenary War Memorial has been consecrated and accepted as a registered National Memorial.

The Remembrance Day service will commence at 10:30am, Monday, 11 November 2024, at the Belmont Shooting Complex at 1485 Old Cleveland Road, Belmont. Guests should be assembled by 10:15am. Seating is limited, so you may wish to bring a folding chair, and an umbrella and sunscreen.

After the service, you are invited to move to the QRA Café area, where refreshments will be served. The QRA Museum will be open for visitors. It has a significant historical collection of the contribution of Queenslanders to Australia's war efforts.





BAYSIDE MUMS GET SOCIAL TO BEAT LONELINESS AND ISOLATION

Moving from New Zealand to Wynnum was an eye-opener for Kirsty Foster. With a husband in the air force she was no stranger to moving and with three boys in kindergarten and playgroups, establishing a circle of friends had never been a problem – but now things were different.

"As your children get older and more independent you don't have the contact with other parents that you once had, particularly when you're in a new city — and COVID restrictions didn't help!"

Kirsty tackled the feeling of isolation by setting up a Social Mum's Facebook group. Within a day she had 200 members and it just kept growing, to the extent that it ceased to be a hobby and became a fulltime job.

"There was obviously a demand for it so I turned it into a 'side hustle'

— then I gave up teaching and it became a fulltime job, and very
quickly grew into a family business," she says.

"It's understandable when you look at the research indicating that one in three Australians are lonely - it's an epidemic. The membership grew to the extent that we couldn't do it on our own. I was getting a lot of interest from mums in the Redlands and I thought that franchising - what we now call 'friendchising' - would be a good idea.

"Social Mum's Club organises social events and outings for mums of all ages and cultures and we're supported by local businesses that recognise the value of looking after mums and supporting the club," says Kirsty.

"Most of our events are free, there's no membership fee or age restrictions. We organise outings to suit working mums, mums with

babies and mums with older children. We have grandmothers and young mothers in the group and a lot of lasting friendships and support networks have grown from club contacts.

"We now have a south-east Queensland membership of 13,000 – and with our new Redland business we're expecting that number to grow!"

Talia Read is the owner of the Redlands franchise. After decades of a career at the top end of fundraising, sales, business management and marketing, recently having her second child dropped Talia into an isolated space. She knew no other mature mothers with toddlers, eighteen months of maternity leave had distanced her from her work colleagues and her high-level personal work skills were sorely under-utilised.

"I met Kirsty at a dinner and the concept of her Social Mum's Club really caught my imagination," she says. "Being part of a team, getting to use my professional skills again, having a purpose outside home and family, the flexibility of working as a franchisee — it was a perfect fit."

The evidence certainly points that way. In four weeks, the existing 2,000 Redlands membership has grown by 100 and Talia has expanded the core of enthusiastic business partners.

"It's such a warm and welcoming community," says Talia. "If you see me out and about please come and say hello!"

AMPLIFYING THE VOICES OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE

Sometimes, to young people particularly, it can feel that politicians are making life-changing decisions a world away... in Canberra. That's why I decided to participate in the 2024 Raise Our Voice Australia Campaign, to amplify the voices of young people and show that the perspectives of Bonner youth are heard and important.

As part of the ROVA Campaign, high schoolers across Australia were asked "What do you want your community to look like in the next 10 years, and what can the next parliament do to achieve it?"

This year, I read a speech by Bonner local year 11 student, Araminta.

Araminta's vision is simple, she wants our community to be a place where mental health is openly discussed and where everyone feels supported. Her 90-second statement was a personal story, sharing her struggle with mental health, and is a powerful reminder of the challenges many young Australians face.

I found her story particularly touching in light of the Bonner Youth Mental Health Forum, which I hosted in May this year. The forum highlighted the importance of early intervention, and remembering to check in on your mates.

The statistics she shared are alarming: 38.8% of Australians aged 16 to 24 have experienced a mental health disorder in the past year, and suicide is the leading cause of death among young Australians.

As Araminta wrote, "These are not just figures, not just numbers, these are people, these are children, with real lives, and real struggles. They are our classmates, our friends, our family."

With young people as switched on as Araminta, I think we can rest assured that the next generation is ready to lead the charge in creating a more supportive community.

Thank you, Araminta, for your courage and commitment to highlighting the importance of mental health.

INSECT BITES IN PETS

Dogs can be bitten and stung by a number of different insects – in some cases the bite may cause minor irritation only but some animals may develop a severe reaction which requires veterinary attention.

FLEAS

Flea bites cause itching which may result in hair loss and self-trauma, leading to the development of wounds and secondary infection. Flea infestation can be diagnosed by finding live fleas or flea dirt in the fur.

There are a number of different options available for preventing flea infestation including oral, top spot or injectable medications.

MOSQUITOES

Mosquitoes and sandflies are common in our bayside suburbs and our pets are just as sensitive as us when it comes to being bitten. Mosquito bites can cause raised, red lesions ("itchy bites") most often in poorly furred regions such as the ears, belly and groin. Cats may develop a hypersensitivity to mosquito bites and demonstrate severe raised pink lesions commonly affecting the nose and paw pads.

Apply a pet friendly mosquito repellent to your pets if they are outside at dawn and dusk when these insects are most likely to be active. Keep your yard free of stagnant water sources to reduce mosquito breeding sites.

Mosquitoes are also responsible for spreading heartworm disease so it is essential that your pet be on regular preventative medication to avoid contracting this potentially deadly disease.

BEES, WASPS AND ANTS

Flying insects such as bees and wasps may cause painful stings and a variety of ant species have painful bites. Sudden pain, limping, localised swelling and redness at the site are common signs of stings and bites. If a sting is visible it should be removed and an ice pack may be applied to the affected site.

Some animals may experience an allergic reaction as a result of a bite from these insects. Signs including facial swelling, hives, difficulty breathing, intense itching and vomiting and diarrhoea indicate a serious reaction that needs veterinary attention.

Keeping your yard free of obvious nests can reduce the risk of bites and stings. Avoid walking through areas where there is a large amount of clover and stay on pathways to avoid brushing against flowering plants where bees may be active.

LET'S TALK MENOPAUSE

Menopause is the spectre that hangs over women of a certain age. On one hand, it's a relief – no more periods! On the other, it's a minefield of unexpected symptoms. Brain fog, hot flushes, joint aches, night sweats, mood changes, loss of libido, dryness...any and all of them could happen.

Many women don't even realise when menopause starts — all they know is one day they're sitting at work, covered in sweat, angry for no reason and unable to concentrate, and they have no idea how they got there.



Menopause is defined as the last menstrual cycle, and most people

know they've reached it when they have no periods for 12 months. Perimenopause is the time prior to that, where menstrual cycles can become irregular and women can suffer the same symptoms of menopause.

The average age of menopause is 50, but can occur any time after 40. The symptoms of menopause can be debilitating, and unfortunately, many women don't know that they can be treatable, leaving them suffering unnecessarily. On top of that, there can be benefits for long-term health, particularly for women who go through early menopause.

If you notice your periods have become irregular, or you are suffering any symptoms like the ones above or any others you think may be menopause, you should talk to your doctor about your treatment options.



DRIZZLE BOY — A NEW LEVEL OF THEATRE COMES TO RPAC

Autism takes its proud place centre stage in Queensland Theatre's production of Drizzle Boy. Winner of the 2023 Premier's Play Award and the first Australian play to focus on autism, this radical three-hander boasts an autistic playwright, Ryan Enniss and an autistic actor, Daniel R. Nixon in the lead role.

Despite his widespread and impressive career in theatre, director Dan Evans says the experience was a steep learning curve - for everyone.

"I feel privileged to have directed this production," says Dan. "Ryan was adamant that a neurodivergent play should have a neurodivergent actor playing the role of Drizzle Boy and I was determined that the character, navigating his way through life and relationships, should never have to explain himself; I wanted to bring the audience into his world, to experience the constant need to adapt that neurodivergent people live with."

On top of the demands of working with the development and decisions demanded by a premiere production, Dan set himself to

understand the special skills, protocols and language necessary for working with such important and sensitive issues.

"I had to expand my creative thesaurus in the best possible way - filtering the language of theatre through a lens of compassion and patience," he says. "Autism isn't a graduated scale, it's a colour palette; if you've met one autistic person, you've met one autistic person. I was nervous about what was appropriate for the actors but they gave me the best advice; if you don't know, just ask. The conversation IS the work. Ray and Daniel taught me life-changing skills; the main one is to really listen."

His research was extensive and thorough. As well as consulting with specialist university professors, autism associations, parents, teachers and supporters and the specialist disability arts organisation, Indelibility Arts, he enlisted the skills of respected dramaturg Saffron Benner to work with him and Ryan in fine-tuning the script.

"Ryan is the fastest writer I've ever met; within

24 hours he'd developed a new version of the script and added 54 new scenes - it was an amazing experience!"

"Working on Drizzle Boy has taught me so much. I needed to make sure that the writer and the cast could fly - it just meant paving the runway a little differently."

I know not everyone likes snakes ... in fact many people are terrified at the mere thought of these graceful, rippling reptiles. However, I believe it helps if we try to understand them. For me, the sight of a snake is fascinating!

These cold-blooded creatures with shiny, scaly streamlined bodies have cool features and adaptations. If you can't bring yourself to look at a real snake, photos are a wonderful way to admire how the scales fit intricately together along the body...pure perfection!

Imagine having the ability to visualise your surroundings by 'tasting the air'

with a simple flick of the forked tongue. Or swallowing a meal that's more than 75 per cent larger than your head!

Love them or loathe them, snakes are an integral part of nature's food chain. It is thanks to snakes that rats and mice aren't scurrying out of control.

For almost 40 years I've had close encounters with many snakes while filming educational segments for *Totally Wild* and other programs, and it's always been under controlled conditions, featuring relatively relaxed 'ambassador' snakes – such as Ben, Shaggy and Stretch. Over the decades I've been bitten twice by nonvenomous snakes – I admit, not pleasant. But trust me, there are no hard feelings, just a healthy respect for their natural instincts.

Snake awareness is part of our Aussie culture. They inhabit a range of environments, including urban settings. There's a good chance a carpet python may be living the quiet life near you!

Most snakes will try to avoid humans. Statistics reveal that 90 per cent of snake bite incidents occur when a person attempts to corner, catch, or kill it.

So, my message is simple – if you come across a snake, try not to panic and simply leave it alone. Never assume the identity of a species based on colour, size or pattern, and if it's in your house, call a local snake catcher. For an injured snake or other reptile, Redlands 24-hour Wildlife Rescue Service is a phone call away (3833 4031).

Until next time ... Stay Wild and safe around snakes!



LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT

EAT YOUR GREENS! (PART 2)


Welcome back to part two of leafy green alternatives. To recap, my fresh alternatives to lettuce (that tolerate our hot humid climate better and won't bolt within a week of planting) are Okinawa spinach (Gynura bicolor) and Brazillian spinach (Alternanthera sissoo). Although there are other greens you can eat raw, I'll admit there aren't any more I'm a big fan of. But there is one more green I couldn't live without in the garden: sweet potato leaves! (Ipomoea batatas).

Unlike actual potato plants (Solanum tuberosum), which are entirely unrelated, you can eat all parts of the plant. The leaves are edible raw, but I prefer them lightly stir-fried. They are healthy, full of calcium and vitamins and delicious stir-fried with a bit of chillli, garlic and kecap manis (sweet soy sauce). Sweet potatoes make an excellent (vigorous!) ground cover. I have it growing in my front yard as a living mulch to protect my soil, suppress weeds, and provide a place for the chooks to dig that leaves less obvious holes in the yard. If you don't have the space for it to take over, try growing it in a raised bed or large pot. You might not get the best tuber harvest, but the leaves are worth it. I'll admit I had visions of going out to 'bandicoot' sweet potatoes from the yard whenever I had a hot chip craving, but it's rather dirty work, and they aren't that easy to find off the cuff, as they can grow quite deep!

Speaking of stir-frying with garlic.... Garlic is a little tricky in a humid climate, and there are cultivars that grow better here, but as a quick addition to any stir fry, salad, or curry, why not grow society garlic? (Tulbaghia violacea) You know, the one with pretty purple flowers that the council plants on median strips. Yep, it's edible and tastes like garlic. As a bonus, it's also not related to garlic and onions (Allium sp.), so it's a great alternative for people who can't eat them.

SUMMER STORM SAFETY ON MORETON BAY

As the weather heats up, so do the chances of storms on the water. Boating during the warmer months can be a lot of fun, but it's important to prioritise safety and avoid dangerous situations. Here are some tips for staying safe during summer storms.

Tell someone where you will be going and when to expect you back. If you change your plans, keep them up to date. VMR Raby Bay offers a free log-on service. The radio room is open from 5:00am to 8:00pm every day. Log-on by radio VHF channels 73, 77, 81, 82, 83, intercom at the base, QR code app or phone 3821

Stay informed. Before heading out, check the marine weather forecast. http://www.bom.gov.au/qld/ forecasts/moreton-bay.shtml

Pay attention to strong weather warnings and updates. Consider signing up for BOM alerts on your phone. Many mobile apps can provide real-time weather alerts.

Plan your route. Always have a plan. Choose a route that allows for a quick return to shore if conditions worsen. Familiarise yourself with nearby safe havens. Make sure you have a marine chart of the surrounding area in case you need to seek shelter. Beacon to Beacon is now available to download and print for free. https://www.msg.qld.gov.au/Beacon-to-Beacon-Guides/Moreton-Bay-guides

Equip your vessel. Ensure your boat is equipped with essential safety gear, including life jackets, a first-aid kit, and a working VHF radio. https://www.msq.qld.gov.au/safety/safety-equipment-recreational-ships

If things go wrong, a reliable means of communication can be life-saving. There are mobile phone blackspots in the bay. If you are not confident using your radio, VMR Raby Bay offers a free Know Your Marine Radio course. Call 3821 2244 to book.

Monitor conditions. Keep an eye on changing weather. Dark clouds and sudden wind shifts can signal an approaching storm.

Act quickly. If a storm is imminent, head back to shore or to a 'safe-haven' immediately. Avoid waiting out the storm on the water, as lightning can pose serious risks.

By prioritising safety and being prepared, you can enjoy summer boating while minimising the dangers posed by unpredictable storms.

HARRIERS AND HARES OUT AND ABOUT IN THE NIGHT!

Running through forests at night, using torches to search for a sign, seeking to follow a nearly hidden trail – it sounds like a spy thriller or an undercover police chase but it's probably just a bunch of people having fun.

The Redlands Hash House Harriers was formed years ago and it's still going strong. Hashing developed in 1938 in Malaysia and was revived at the end of WW2 as a way for members of the military to keep fit and maintain the bonds already created. To overcome any awkwardness of casual sporting association between officers and enlisted men no-one's real names were used; every member was granted – or inflicted – with a nickname, a custom that still exists.

Member Sid Steele, whose Hash name is Ned Kelly (he used to be a bank manager) shared some of the more presentable club names, which include Poo Bear, Captain Bligh, Drillit and MauMau; each one has a story attached.

A Hash takes place every Monday night. A member, designated as the Hare, measures out and marks a trail, usually between Capalaba and Redland Bay. The trail may be marked in chalk or powdered gypsum and includes certain symbols that give information about the direction to take. Members who are Harriers – originally hunting dogs – meet at a designated spot, pay their \$8 fee, then set out on the Hash, walking or running, depending on their level of fitness.

"It's really about enjoying ourselves with friends - and maybe staying fit too," says Sid. "There are no age restrictions - our members range in age from 20 to 80 - and we usually have between 25 and 35 participants. Sometimes parents run with kiddies in prams. The Hare is responsible for providing a meal at

the end of a run. There is a drink stop during the run and we have a designated member following the pack to make sure no-one gets hurt or left behind. It's really a great night out."

REPAIR CAFÉ: MAKE AND MEND MAKES AMENDS

This, regrettably, is the throw-away age. Increased ability in exploitation of resources, production of consumer goods and their accessibility has seen the transition from "make and mend" to "throw it away and buy another one", a trend that Repair Cafés – started in the Netherlands 15 years ago - are pushing against.

Louise Yearn is the curator of the Wynnum Repair Café, which pops up for two hours every month at the Waterloo Bay Leisure Centre (renowned for its Devonshire Teas). Volunteer 'fixers', with skills that cover a wide variety of needs, make themselves available to repair items brought into them and, when appropriate, show the item owner how to do the repairs. Louise points out that even with such a limited window of time, 'make and mend' can have an impact.

"We keep a monthly tally of what we've kept out of landfill," she says. "Last month, we saved 10 items of clothing and a hundred and 47 kilos of hard goods. Our mantra is: if you can carry it in we'll probably be able to fix it!"

Household goods given a new lease of life include such items as lamps, toasters, clocks; knives, scissors and garden tools that need sharpening; music boxes, power tools, pieces of furniture – items that owners may deem too expensive to replace or repair commercially but with life left in them. Louise says the fixers are from all walks of life.

"Many are retired professionals. Electrical goods are always repaired by a qualified electrician; for safety reasons, that's one area where we can't teach the owner how to do their own future repairs. It may be something as basic as sewing on a button or rethreading elastic through a skirt waistband.

"We're always on the lookout for fixers," she says. "It's amazing the number of people who think that they have no skills to pass on who turn out to have a wealth of ability they've never recognised.





"As well as volunteers we'd love to see the beginning of new Repair Cafés in other areas. Perhaps there's a café somewhere in the Redlands that would be happy to host a team of fixers – and their customers – for a short time each month. It really adds excitement to a lunchtime snack or a cuppa!"

ZINGY POTATO SALAD WITH A YOGHURT MUSTARD DRESSING RECIPE



Forget the usual mayonnaise-heavy potato salads and try this ultra-light, zingy salad that swaps out mayo for Greek yoghurt. Mixing mustard and lemon juice with yoghurt and freshly cracked black pepper really elevates this dish, and with barbecue season in full swing, it's a perfect accompaniment to grilled meat. Leftovers also make a fantastic sandwich filling!

INGREDIENTS

- 500g potatoes, cut into bite-sized cubes
- 1 cup of Greek yoghurt
- 2-3 tablespoons of your favourite mustard whole grain or English work well
- The juice of half a small lemon
- A handful of fresh dill, chopped

- A handful of baby pickled cucumbers, chopped
- ½ a red onion, finely sliced
- 3 hard-boiled eggs, quartered
- Salt and freshly cracked black pepper to taste

METHOD

- 1. Bring a large pot of water to the boil. Put the potatoes in the pot and cook for around 4-5 minutes, checking regularly to see if they're cooked through. Take them off the boil and drain once they're tender, but not falling apart. Let the potatoes cool.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix the yoghurt, dill, lemon juice and mustard together. Season with salt and pepper. Taste the mixture and add more mustard or lemon juice if you prefer a stronger flavour.
- 3. Add the potatoes to the bowl, then the pickled cucumbers, red onion and eggs. Stir gently with a wooden spoon to combine. Keep refrigerated and serve chilled.

Optional extras: Stir in a large tin of tuna (drained) or shredded cooked BBQ chicken to turn this into a meal on its own.

LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO

GET YOUR POTS READY — THE BAY IS CRAWLING WITH CRABS!

The weather has warmed up nicely, and it's time to get the crab pots in the water, as there will be plenty of crabs around. You'll be able to tell it's a peak time for crabs because there will be many more crab pots to dodge on the way to your favourite fishing spots, and some folks just drop them anywhere – even in the channels where all the boats have to travel!

You'll find crabs all over the bay, from close to the foreshore and the islands of Green, St Helena and Mud, and all the way in the deep and fast-running water on the eastern side of the Hope Banks and Amity Banks. I personally love to eat crab, but I hate the mess I have to put up with when there are crab pots on the boat, so I'm happy to buy some from the pro-fishermen. Fresh-boiled crabs and chilli crab will be on my menu over the coming summer months.

The whiting fishing will be as good as it gets this month, so try the Rous and Chain Banks, Amity

Banks and Fisherman's Gutter. Squid strips and blood worms top my list for baits, but I have been trying to save a few dollars, and have been salting frozen pippies, which is working a treat and is very economical, and I find the paternoster rig works the best.

The school mackerel are having a break close in, but there are plenty in the shipping channels. I am hoping the spotty mackerel season starts this year as the water is warming up nicely, but we need it to warm to around 74 — the ideal temperature for the spotties to come into the bay. My concern is that it does not get too hot like last year, when the spotties bypassed the bay. All we can do is get the spinning gear and chrome slugs ready and hope for a good season.

The squire and snapper season does not stop because it's summer, and this year should be a very good one, with Mt Cotton Reach in the Rous Channel and Harries artificial reef being two of the best spots

at the moment, and the close-in drop-offs near the islands. Whole whiting is by far the best bait, or whiting heads.



Until next month, good fishing and good luck in the Melbourne Cup (Zardozi is my long-range tip).


P.S.: What a great month October was for whale watching in Moreton Bay. It was one of the best for many, many years!
