LOCAL ORGANISATION PROFILE:

SOROPTIMISTS – SISTERS MAKING IT HAPPEN

Soroptimist International began in America in 1921, migrated to Australia in 1937, and in 1983 a Bayside charter was founded. A worldwide women's organisation advocating for human rights and the status of women, Soroptimist International (SI) has United Nations' recognition - which accords it a degree of global clout.

"SI has non-government organisation consultative status within the United Nations, with 24 representatives on various UN committees involved with ageing, violence against women, forced marriage, trafficking, pollution of water, rape and torture as a weapon of war, femicide, gender inequalities, equal pay, harassment in the workplace, social media, female illiteracy, food security and Indigenous Protection and Management," says SI Bayside Secretary and PR Convenor, Catherine Heiner.

"By reporting on our various projects to a data bank, our representatives can provide evidence to influence United Nations

Following its mantra of 'think globally, act locally', SI Bayside is active on the home front as well as the world stage, and is involved with such events as the Redland City Council Walk the Talk, and

Candlelight Vigil and Red Rose Rallies, both concerned with ending deaths from domestic violence.

The club supplies care packs (toiletries) and clothing packs to the local hospital for women presenting after trauma. Members are currently preparing Christmas Kindness Packs to take to aged care homes in the bayside area, too.

SI is also active in environmental and Indigenous issues and sees education as a vital part of its charter, including supplying an annual scholarship to a woman undertaking tertiary education.

"Individual members propose areas in which we can be active," says Catherine. "Our action can include lobbying by SI and its individual members, walking in demonstrations with our SI banner, supplying members as guest speakers to other organisations and supporting organisations like Maybank Accommodation and Crisis Support Service and Night Ninjas.

"We're also seeking to involve young people by inviting them to an annual International Women's Day breakfast with a guest speaker and encouraging them to take the information back to their schools."

The organisation's name is a portmanteau word from the Latin soror

meaning sister, and optima meaning best - interpreted as 'best for women'.

As one member said, "Most women are Soroptimists – they just don't know it yet."

FRENCH-THEMED CELEBRATION RAISES \$50,000 FOR BAYSIDE CHARITIES

On October 26, the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron was transformed into the French Riviera, welcoming guests to a stunning celebration of community at Celebrate for a Cause Manly.

The celebration raised \$50,000 for local charities, driving the total raised over the last seven years to an amazing \$300,000!

Guests enjoyed a mini remote control boat regatta hosted by the Wynnum Manly Radio Controlled Yacht Club, croquet on the lawn courtesy of Wynnum Croquet Club, and a menu of magnificent French flavours from the talented team at Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron at Manly.

The event, expertly styled by Style & Error, was designed around a dance floor, which heaved to the tunes of popular band Bassline Studios, bringing a cool Riviera vibe to Manly and everyone's favourite tunes to life.

The major charity partner for 2024 is Challenge DV, which received \$40,000 of funds raised from the event. This money will be used to run a pilot program for sporting organisations in the bayside, with the aim of rolling out the program nationally.

"Funding will be used to run a grassroots program for management and players at bayside sporting organisations to provide advice, training and support," said Linda Smith from Challenge DV. "The program will assist clubs to foster safe and respectful relationships across our community and educate management and players on where and how to source support."

Linda said interest in the program has been overwhelming, with Wynnum Seagulls, Wynnum Lady Bugs Netball, Wynnum Rugby and Bayside United Soccer pledging their participation at the recent launch event.

"We still have the capacity for four other clubs and would love to hear from any other bayside sporting organisations wanting to access the free support program, " said Linda.

The minor charity partners for 2024 are the Bayside Community Fund and Share the Kindness.

SUN SAFETY IN PETS

Living in Queensland, we all grow up knowing the risks of sun exposure – sunburn and the development of skin cancers are very common. Did you know that our pets are also at risk of damage from the sun? Animals may develop a skin condition called actinic (solar) dermatitis or skin cancers.



ANIMALS AT RISK

A good fur coat usually provides good protection from the sun. Dogs and cats with a lighter-coloured coat and short fur are more at risk from sun exposure. Bull terriers, Staffordshire bull terriers, Dalmatians and Greyhounds and white cats are prone to sun damage on their skin. Some dogs like to sunbathe, exposing their belly, which generally has less fur — this area is often affected by sun exposure.

WHAT DOES SUN DAMAGE LOOK LIKE?

Actinic dermatitis starts on white fur, which may become patchy, and the underlying skin becomes red and irritated. A secondary bacterial infection may occur, which results in a pimply, red rash.

Haemangiomas and haemangiosarcomas are blood vessel tumours that can develop on the less furred areas – the belly and inside of the back legs are common sites.

The ear tips and noses of white cats are common sites for the development of squamous cell carcinomas — an aggressive skin cancer. Lesions may initially appear as a non-healing scab but can progress to become very destructive, resulting in loss of underlying tissue.

TREATMENT

Skin cancer requires surgical treatment – it can be difficult as there are often multiple tumours spread across a large area. Cats with squamous cell carcinoma may be treated with a combination of surgery, radiation and chemotherapy.



Antibiotics and topical steroids may be used to control infection and inflammation associated with actinic dermatitis.

PREVENTION

The key to prevention is reducing sun exposure. If possible, pets should be kept inside through the hottest part of the day when UV rays are at their most dangerous. There are specific pet sunscreens available which may be applied to the less furred areas of the body. Sunsuits are like wet suits and are designed to protect the whole body. REMEMBRANCE DAY ON THE BAYSIDE

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1919, the Commonwealth fell silent to commemorate the first Remembrance Day.

TIPS FOR EATING HEALTHY AT CHRISTMAS AND STILL ENJOYING IT!

So, Christmas is around the corner. Christmas parties are in full swing. We've got lots of eating out, lots of catch-ups. Here are some tips to stay on track with your health goals.

1. BALANCE YOUR PLATE.

Make sure that half of your plate is filled up with the salad or vegetable option. The protein portions, such as roast ham, or meat, fish, and chicken, should make up about a quarter of your plate, keeping in mind palm size for red meat and a full hand of white meat. The last quarter of your plate can be made up of some sort of carbohydrate, including baked potato or sweet potato. Choose options that don't have as much cream or milk-based products, like a potato bake, and go for something more like a roast potato instead, but keep the portion size small; that way, you are still enjoying all the components of the meal, but in the right portions.

2. EAT WITH YOUR STOMACH - NOT YOUR EYES!

We talk a lot about mindful eating, and that definitely applies at Christmas time. Put your plate down, eat your food, wait 10 to 15 minutes and actually take a second to stop and think, 'Am I satisfied with the meal that I just ate? Or am I still actually hungry?' Aim to eat to the point of satisfaction and not to the point of being overstuffed or feeling full or sick from your food.

3. BE CAREFUL ABOUT DRINKING YOUR CALORIES.

We all know alcohol is actually quite high in calories and not very nutrient-dense, which means that you can drink or consume a lot of it, and you're still able to eat. Typically, pre-made or pre-mixed drink options contain a lot of sugar. One exception is often a seltzer, which tends to be lower in sugar. If you want to drink, try a small glass of wine that you can sip slowly and enjoy. Another good way to drink more sensibly during the festive season is to have a glass of soda water or water between each beverage. This helps to slow down your consumption of alcohol and helps with rehydration.





Latest news from the Port of Brisbane December 2024





Trade

It has been a busy period for trade during the July to September quarter.

Queensland's strong population growth continued to underpin positive import full container volumes during during the quarter, which are tracking ahead of the same period last year. Motor vehicle imports slowed during the same period, with volumes normalising after historically high levels.

While export full container volumes were lower compared to the same period last year, we are anticipating volumes of agricultural products to increase as the winter harvest starts to come through the Port following good growing conditions, particularly chickpeas and wheat.

In the bulk product sector, cement products imports and bulk grain volumes were lower than the same period last year, however volumes are anticipated to increase over the next quarter.

Community

We were proud to partner with Dunwich State School and others to help deliver the Quandamooka Jarjums Camp on Minjerribah (North Stradbroke Island). This was our 9th year sponsoring the camp which connects Indigenous students from Minjerribah and across the Bayside with First Nations culture.

We were the major partner for UQ Ventures' 2024 Innovation Challenge. Over 120 students developed innovative solutions to tackle some of the most pressing issues facing Australia's oceans and marine ecosystems, with the top six teams presenting their ideas at the Pitch Showcase event in October.

Brisbane International Cruise Terminal

The Brisbane International Cruise Terminal is getting ready for a busy summer season, with over 150 cruise calls from 13 lines expected during the 2024/25 season.

Over the winter, we increased the amount of onsite parking, added shading to outdoor seating, increased the taxi rank capacity, and collaborated with renowned Quandamooka artist, Delvene Cockatoo-Collins, to deliver a striking new 660m-long 660m long artwork titled From Land to Sea.

Onsite car parking is in demand, so if you're intending to park and cruise, please book car parking in advance via the Wilson Parking website (www.wilsonparking.com.au).

Port of Brisbane is Queensland's largest multi-cargo port. In 2023/24, approximately \$72 billion in international trade was handled through the Port including around 95% of the state's containers and motor vehicles and 50% of its agricultural exports, while the Brisbane International Cruise Terminal is helping to grow Queensland's tourism industry.

The Port of Brisbane is currently in the early stages of considering the future requirements of its shipping channel. The proposed 25-year **Channel Enhancement Project**, which has officially received 'Coordinated Project' status from the Queensland Government, aims to improve efficiency, reduce vessel emissions, and ensure the shipping channel servicing the port caters for the future needs of the global shipping market.







Wynnum Manly Property Market Update

The Wynnum-Manly property market is booming, driven by strong buyer demand, low inventory, and sustained interest in bayside living.

Over the past few years, the area has experienced rapid growth, with median house prices in Wynnum reaching around \$1.22 million (up 20 per cent in the last 12 months) and in Manly around \$1.59 million (up 33 per cent) in 2024. This represents significant year-on-year increases, partly due to limited listings and a notable influx of new residents into Brisbane, who are increasingly drawn to the scenic bayside lifestyle and proximity to Moreton Bay.

For units, the median prices are also climbing, with Wynnum's median unit price reaching approximately \$708,000, which is up 13 per cent, and Manly's around \$800,000 (up 10 per cent). These price points have been supported by interest from first-time buyers leveraging recent government incentives, as well as by families from inner Brisbane suburbs relocating to enjoy the quieter, lifestyle-oriented bayside.

Demand remains particularly high for properties with bay views or close proximity to the waterfront. This demand, combined with continued interest from neighbouring Brisbane suburbs, suggests Wynnum-Manly will remain a competitive market for both buyers and investors looking for strong rental yields and future capital growth. Despite high property values, the area's lifestyle appeal and robust connectivity to Brisbane's central areas make it a resilient, high-demand region in the Queensland property landscape.

Marilyne has been the coordinator of Pete's Pantry since 2020 and achieved recognition of Pete's Pantry as an outreach provider in 2021, adding several services for the local people in need. Her great community work with Pete's Pantry and the many volunteers who work with her has provided breakfasts, supplied food and essentials, showers and laundry facilities, as well as haircuts to many needy people in this community, making Pete's Pantry an essential part of it. The club complimented Marilyne on her tireless dedication to this cause and recognised this contribution with the PHF.

Chris Hebblethwaite is a Senior Sergeant in the Police Service and a crime prevention coordinator based in Wynnum, where he is well known for his passion for community-related policing. He established a local victim response framework and built the Bayside Volunteers in Policing team. He played a substantial role in modifying the role performed by crime prevention coordinators with a focus on a real-life, victim-centric approach and has made a substantial contribution to improving the life of the Wynnum community. The daylily season has well and truly commenced and is set to continue all summer long! A fabulous, hardy ornamental plant, daylilies are actually edible* (though apparently not by cats) and not related to lilies at all. They are, however, in the same subfamily as Dianella (fun fact) and in the same family as grass trees (*Xanthorrhoea*)! Who knew?

Daylilies (*Hemerocallis* sp.) originated in Asia, where they have been cultivated for thousands of years for ornamental and medicinal purposes and since being introduced to Europe and eventually America, they have been hybridized to produce the thousands (and thousands) of different colours, shapes and styles we have today — from the simple orange and lemon through to darkest of maroons, multicoloured and ruffled petals.

The genus name Hemerocallis is derived from the Greek words 'Hemera' for day and 'Kallos' for beauty – typically because each (beautiful) bloom only lasts a day – but each stem has multiple flowers to keep the beauty coming.

When they aren't flowering, daylilies are a somewhat unassuming grassy plant that can take the place of many a strappy leaved plant in your garden design. They are unfussy in their growing conditions and fairly resistant to pests and diseases, although I do fight rust on them in one garden I manage. Depending on the severity, I either remove the affected leaves or chop the whole plant back. You can also spray with a fungicide if you so desire. As always prevention is better than cure, so make sure they are healthy, and as with growing many plants in our humid summers — keep good airflow! My husband complains that once summer hits, I never turn off our ceiling fans because I like to keep the air moving. Maybe I should get one installed in the garden for the sticky mornings before the sea breeze kicks in!

*Once again, I have not eaten them and probably don't intend to, but I'll keep it in mind for the next pandemic, or should I be in one of those fanciful situations where I am stuck on an island and only allowed to bring one plant....





GIRLS, HOW ABOUT PLAYING RUGBY WITH WYNNUM BUGS IN 2025?

DID YOU KNOW THERE ARE NEW LIFEJACKET REGULATIONS FOR QUEENSLAND?

FROM REBECCA MITCHELL, VMR RABY BAY

On 1 December 2024 new lifejacket laws came into effect*. Lifejackets must be worn when:

- Boating alone or only with children under 12 years on an open boat less than 4.8 metres in length whilst underway.
- People boating between sunset and sunrise on an open boat less than 4.8 metres in length whilst underway.
- People crossing a designated coastal bar on an open boat and on an open area (the deck) of a ship of any length.
- Children one year or more and under 12 years on an open boat or an open area (the deck) of a ship of any length whilst underway.

The current standard for lifejackets is AS4758. Lifejackets/PFDs manufactured to AS1512, AS1499 and AS2260 are now outdated. The cut-off date for replacement is 1 September 2025. For more information go to https://www.msg.gld.gov.au/safety/life-jackets

*Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Legislation Amendment Regulation 2024

Do you know the VHF channels commonly used in Moreton Bay? The most commonly used are listed below.

- 16: The main distress frequency, this channel is used for distress calls, urgency calls and calling. It is monitored 24/7 by Maritime Safety Queensland and volunteer marine rescue stations.
- **20:** VHF Repeater working channel at Tangalooma with coverage of northern Moreton Bay.
- 21: VHF Repeater working channel at northern Moreton Bay and offshore.
- 67: Secondary distress frequency.
- 72: Working channel Northern Moreton Bay.
- 73: Working channel Central Moreton Bay, preferred for logon at VMR Raby Bay.
- 77: Working channel.
- 81: VHF Repeater Northern Moreton Bay.
- 82: VHF Repeater Southern Moreton Bay.
- 83: VHF Repeater South Passage Bar and surrounds.



When crossing shipping channels, monitor VHF 16 or:

- 12: Brisbane VTS covering main shipping channels between Point Cartwright at Mooloolaba and Brett's Wharf at Hamilton Reach on the Brisbane River.
- 13: Brisbane River upstream from Brett's Wharf and Southern Moreton Bay Islands.

Theatre has been a feature of Australia Day at Redland Museum since 2008 when Theatre Genesis staged the popular classic Dick Diamond's *Reedy River*. Theatre Genesis has undergone various iterations since then, but the core group of actors, now members of the museum's embedded company, Theatre Redlands (TR), will bring the magic back to the stage in 2025 with an Australian double feature.

John Cundill's *The Eulogy*, directed by TR's Raymond Noonan, is a deftly crafted piece that dovetails the personal and the public in a crisp two-hander. In a dynamic mother and son encounter, Russell is writing a eulogy for his terminally ill mother who, as well as being the subject of the eulogy, takes on the role of being its editor. Disagreements over style lead to disagreements over shared memories — and relentlessly,

painfully, coverings are stripped away from dark family secrets. Who remembers the Fitzgerald Inquiry...?

The second piece, directed and adapted from Lillian M. Pyke's *Camp Kiddies* by Jan Nary, follows the life of a family when their father's new employment takes them from Melbourne suburbia to a bush camp, established for the construction of Queensland's north-reaching railway line. Set in the early 1900s, *Training Wheels*, adapted as a radio play, features some of John Warner's evocative railway songs to help make the journey truly memorable.

PRAWN, MANGO AND AVOCADO CREAM BRUSCHETTA RECIPE

Christmas brunch can be simple, yet fancy - just add the freshest Queensland prawns, juicy mango and ripe avocado!

INGREDIENTS

- 15-20 Queensland prawns, peeled and deveined (allow two to three per serve, depending on the size of your bread)
- · 2 ripe avocados
- · 1 small mango, diced
- 1 handful of cherry tomatoes, chopped or halved
- · 2 tablespoons freshly squeezed lime juice
- · Salt and pepper, to taste

- Sliced baguette rounds or sliced sourdough loaf (for larger serves, use sliced sourdough, for smaller serves, use baguette rounds)
- Cream cheese (for spreading on bread)
- Olive oil for toasting the bread
- A handful of mixed micro herbs for garnish or whatever in-season herbs you have on hand, e.g. chives, watercress, chopped basil.



METHOD

- 1. In a bowl, mash the avocado flesh with a fork until it's smooth. Add a squeeze of lime juice, and a pinch of salt and pepper to taste. Mix until it's creamy.
- 2. Lightly brush the baguette slices with olive oil and toast them in a frying pan over medium heat until they're golden. Remove from heat. Spread with cream cheese.
- Spread the avocado cream on each piece of toast, then top with a fresh prawn/s, diced mango and a few cherry tomato pieces. Garnish with herbs and add an extra squeeze of lime juice if you'd like more 'zing'.

LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO

DROP A LINE — HERE'S WHERE YOU'LL FIND THE BEST FISH THIS CHRISTMAS

Christmas is getting very close, and the festive season is approaching, which means school holidays and family days out on the bay, so please keep an eye on the weather warnings and predictions. It's safer to say, "We are not going out on the bay today" than having an accident on the water in bad weather. BOM forecasts are fantastic most of the time for the bay, and they are the ones that I follow.

Fishing is pretty good this time of year, even with all the extra traffic on the water. There should be whiting and squid over the banks in the bay, and hopefully, the spotty mackerel will make an appearance. My favourite thing this time of year is fishing for Moreton Bay squire/snapper, and you don't have to go far to catch really nice fish (one of the best-tasting fish in the ocean). They don't have to be giants; to me, a 35cm to 40cm squire is as good as it gets! Yes, catching the 65cm and 80cm fish is fun, but I prefer the 40 to 60cm squire for a good table-eating fish.

The fun is also catching these fish on fairly light lines, and as for baits, I have never mastered the plastics for squire. I use a 5.0 to 6.0 red snapper hook on a running rig with a ball sinker (just to get to the bottom), which for me is heaven, and my preferred bait is whole small whiting, garfish, and any small fish and whiting heads. Grinner, mullet and bonito fillets are always worth a try, too — I suggest you burley while fishing for squire, it always helps.

I have always used Alvey reels in the past, but my fingers and thumb always got a pounding, so these days I find bait runner reels fantastic. Penn, Shimano and Daiwa are my favourites; the best size for the bay is the 4000 to 5000 range, with 15lb to 20lb lines, and I prefer any green colour for bay fishing. Tortue and Penn are my favourites. As for mono lines, I don't like the new rope lines at all — there's no stretch.

The areas I tend to fish close to home are near Green Island on the eastern side in around 18 to

20-ft depth, St Helena on the eastern side (just out from the dredging zones of the past and Mud Island outside the sunken reef), and Peel



Island of course — especially when the weather forecasters can't make up their minds. So then you can fish the Lazaret Gutter side, the hole in the wall on the eastern corner at south-west rocks, or the western side on the sunken rock wall — and you can easily get out of any kind of wind. You just need a run in the tide, and I prefer the run out, but I have also caught plenty of fish with the incoming tide. The incoming tide tends to make the water a little clearer, which saves you catching catfish and sharks when the water is on the dirty side, and there are plenty of sharks in the bay this time of year.

I hope you all get a fresh fish for dinner over the holidays! Enjoy the holidays, keep safe, and thank you for all the feedback throughout the year. Merry Christmas to you all, and a safe New Year.
