## **POP-UP LETS YOU DANCE, CONNECT AND CELEBRATE AGEING!**

Pro-ageing dance captain Dr Anja Ali-Haapala is on a mission to smash ageing stereotypes through dance. After 15 years of dance teaching, performance and academic research, Anja is making moves in the field of dance and ageing.

"It's really exciting to see an increase in dancing opportunities for over 50s, but I've noticed that they rarely have much exposure. So the stereotypes of young dancers and frail old people persist," she said.

Enter *Gone Frolicking*, a pop-up dance event for diverse over 50s that's touring south-east Queensland. It's a vibrant, pop music-loving atmosphere that prioritises safe dancing, social connection and a bit of sass on the dance floor. "We socialise as much as we dance," said Anja.

The event kicks off with a meet and mingle session over tea and coffee, setting the tone for a morning of community and camaraderie. The group learns an original piece of low-impact choreography to a pop song from the '70s or '80s, culminating in a group performance. A light morning tea follows, giving everyone a chance to recharge and bask in their fabulousness.

Anja is known in the artistic community for her enthusiastic and inclusive approach to dance. Her workshops are not about technical perfection, but about having fun, playing with artistic expression, and connecting with like-minded people.

Participants can expect a supportive environment where the emphasis is on fun and connection. Whether you danced when you were younger or never had the chance, *Gone Frolicking* promises a memorable morning full of laughter, music, and new friendships.

Actually, it's all about running, keeping fit and having a good time – but it's a catchy name, people notice it and remember it and don't get too disappointed when they discover that the beer's really just a marketing ploy.

Alexandra (Al) Lowson and her husband Verne were prompted to start the free running club by the number of individuals and couples that they saw running along the Wynnum foreshore. Both keen runners, they thought that gathering some like-minded folk together could be a lot of fun.

"Verne represented Zimbabwe as a sprinter when he was younger, then took up ultra marathon running," Al says. "My passion was always for cycling, I resisted running initially – too boring, too hard – but took it up about 10 years ago and haven't looked back since; I love it."

Al says that they had no idea how popular the club would prove. Their youngest runner is eight and the just-retired oldest runner is 82.

"We welcome all ages and all paces, from beginners to really competitive runners, and all you need are good running shoes and cool clothing. We have two night-time runs and a Sunday morning run every week, usually along the Wynnum Esplanade, but occasionally at Southbank followed by a swim, and after a big event we may have a social evening."

#### HAVE YOUR SAY ON WYNNUM BUILDING HEIGHTS

Brisbane City Council's Suburban Renewal Precincts Program is in full swing. The Lord Mayor expects 400,000 people to move into Brisbane in the coming years.

In a recent press release, Lord Mayor Schrinner said: "We're striking a balance by choosing tall over sprawl; encouraging more homes in well-located areas."

"Wynnum's CBD is the second precinct to be identified as part of the plan. The focus area for the precinct will span from Berrima Street to Clara Street and along Tingal Road and

Bay Terrace, encompassing Wynnum Central Station and the core parts of Bride Street, Charlotte Street, Florence Street and Edith Street," the Lord Mayor said.

Brisbane Council will begin its community consultation phase in 2025. To date, they have yet to finalise dates with respect to stakeholder engagement. I encourage all residents to have their say in 2025 about far-reaching planning decisions that will shape our Bayside community.

## **ART THERAPY HELPS PEOPLE TO FLOURISH THROUGH DEEP CREATIVITY**

Art therapy is an amazing mode of expression when used to encourage positivity and create a sense of inspiration and 'flourishing' within. With its ability to provide a safe and creative space for clients to explore and express their inner worlds, thoughts and ideas in a deep and profound way, without the pressure of needing to verbally or linguistically describe or dig deep into things, art therapy is there for us all.

While most of us probably know what art therapy is, what exactly does 'flourishing' mean? Psychologist Martin Seligman describes flourishing as a representation of the highest level of psychological wellbeing, encompassing aspects such as positive emotions, engagement, relationships, meaning, and accomplishment. If you are familiar with the game The Sims, flourishing would be akin to the state of 'inspiration', you know, with all the sparkly stuff around us.

As art therapy clients engage in a state of flow while creating art pieces, they are able to relax and simply create. The reflection of the finished art work can bring a sense of success and accomplishment, showing clients that, 'Yes They Can', and 'Yes They Did'.

Art therapy workshops are an amazing way to build relationships between people, creating a feeling of support and engagement, and is a great way to help in building a community and sense of belonging. Using the ideas of positive psychology, focusing on achievements and positive virtues, the sense of self is uplifted. With clients focusing on things they can do and have done, and all the things right with their world, and with this the sense of flourishing is sparked and fuelled.

Art therapy also helps to add meaning and connection with experiences, adding a sense of control over a world and a feeling of acceptance and even gratitude. So even when delving into the depths of pain or

trauma, or any other 'negative' experiences or emotions, clients are able to release and let go, to express and explore and to come to terms with where they are at in life and how they can move forward. All of these positive actions contribute to a feeling of purpose, meaning and fulfillment, leading to the state of flourishing.

So, let's all get our art smocks on and get our fingers dirty while we engage in some art, and get sparkly and inspired!



## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT PARVOVIRUS IN DOGS AND CATS

There have a been a number of reports in the last couple of months of increased cases of both canine and feline parvovirus (also known as panleucopaenia in cats). Puppies and kittens are most at risk of contracting these diseases, and the treatment can be expensive. Infection with these serious diseases may result in



death. Prevention is the best approach – it is time to make sure that your dogs and cats are up to date with their vaccinations.

#### **VACCINATION PROTOCOLS**

Your vet can advise you on the appropriate vaccination protocol for your pets. A course of vaccinations administered to puppies and kittens is essential to provide the best possible protection. Young animals are born with maternal antibodies – these are antibodies that pass from mother to offspring in the uterus, which provide them with some protection from diseases while their own body matures to a stage where it can mount an immune response. Vaccination after the period of maternal antibody protection is essential to ensure ongoing immunity – puppies and kittens then develop their own protective antibodies to disease, which provides ongoing protection.

Adult dogs and cats should be vaccinated regularly (yearly to three yearly) as advised by your veterinarian to maintain immunity.

#### SIGNS OF PARVOVIRUS

The most common symptoms of parvovirus include:

- Fever
- Lethargy
- Vomiting
- Diarrhoea, often bloody
- Loss of appetite
- Dehydration
- Abdominal pain

If your pet is demonstrating any of these signs it is important to seek veterinary attention.

#### **PREVENTING DISEASE**

• Vaccination is the most effective means of protecting your pet from these deadly diseases.

- Parvovirus is extremely contagious and can persist in the environment for extended periods. Avoid areas where large numbers of animals congregate (off-lead parks, beaches etc.) and prevent your pets coming in contact with other animals' faeces.
- Puppies and kittens should not be in contact with unvaccinated animals.
- Disinfection of environments where diseased animals have lived is essential contact your vet for advice on the best options.

## WHAT ARE 'DIET' DRUGS, AND HOW DO THEY WORK?

#### Nothing takes the place of good common sense eating and exercise. These sustainable lifestyle changes need to be the framework of every weight loss goal.

Lately, however, many people who may have never before considered taking a medication to help lose weight are now wondering if they should try one. But which one?



Firstly, what is my 'ideal' weight - what would I like to get to? And what is

my short-term goal? Usually, we recommend an initial five to 10 per cent starting body weight loss (e.g. for a 100kg person, they would plan to lose five to 10kg in three to six months).

Secondly, do I mind taking a tablet each day? Or would I prefer a small injection, either daily or once weekly? What fits with my lifestyle?

Thirdly, what can I afford? Remember, weight loss medications are not covered by the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme.

Most weight loss medications target appetite, so people don't feel as hungry and, after eating, feel fuller sooner. Some medications cause side effects such as nausea, and the dose needs to be increased slowly as the person becomes more used to it.

These medications are generally taken for at least 18 months but can be taken safely for longer periods of time. The main concern with rapid weight loss is loss of muscle mass. It is vitally important that someone using these medications is exercising appropriately so they can maintain their muscle mass and lose adipose (fat) mass.

## LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT KEEP CALM AND STAY SHADY!

BY KAT PEARSON, GIRL IN THE GREEN

I'm writing this in early December, although it will be January now you're reading it, and I'm sure it hasn't gotten any cooler! The humidity levels are so high I expect I wouldn't look significantly different had I just climbed out of the pool (except perhaps less red in the face). If you can find a breeze and a shady spot to sit (very still) though, summer days are rather enjoyable. The best shady spot to sit, in my opinion, is under a tree. Although cliché, trees really are nature's air conditioners, and if your garden lacks any greenery over two feet tall, then I have a tree for you!

Native gardenias, *Atractocarpus fitzalanii*, are loosely related to gardenias (same family, Rubiaceae) and grow naturally in coastal and dry rainforest regions of northern Queensland. They boast big glossy leaves, fragrant white star-shaped flowers, and (in theory) edible fruit – at the very least, they're decorative when they turn yellow.

The trees are reasonably speedy growers if you want to grow some shade quickly and are a good size for a suburban block. They can grow to around six metres tall and three metres wide but are easily pruned to keep them more compact. They naturally have a bushy habit, so I find removing some of the lower branches improves their shape and 'shade tree' qualities.

I have yet to see one suffer any pests or diseases, and once established, they will grow quite happily unattended. Brisbane City Council also have them listed on their 'approved street tree' list – so if your house doesn't have a street tree, consider asking the council for one!

P.S.: If you are keen to get one for your garden, it's best to wait a few months until it's slightly cooler before planting. If not, make sure you keep the water up to your new baby until the heat has gone!

Straight off the plane and onto the stage is pretty well how it happened for two very recent bayside arrivals. ## **SPARKLING SUMMER RASPBERRY AND PINEAPPLE PUNCH RECIPE**

Sunny, warm January days call for cool drinks, and this non-alcoholic punch starring fresh fruit with a fizzy twist is refreshing, making it a perfect summer treat for the whole family.



#### **INGREDIENTS (SERVES 2-3)**

- 1 orange, freshly juiced (about 1/2 cup)
- 1/2 cup fresh pineapple juice
- 1/4 cup fresh raspberry puree (about 1 cup raspberries blended and strained)
- 1 lime, freshly juiced (about 2 tablespoons)
- 1 teaspoon of honey or agave syrup (optional, for extra sweetness)
- 1 cup of chilled sparkling water or ginger beer
- Ice cubes
- a sprig of rosemary and extra whole raspberries to garnish each drink (optional)

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Blend the fresh raspberries until they are smooth in a food processor, then strain through a fine-mesh sieve to remove the seeds. Set the puree aside.
- 2. In a large jug, combine orange juice, pineapple juice, lime juice, and honey/agave syrup (if using) and stir to mix.
- 3. Fill glasses with ice cubes and pour the juice mixture evenly into each glass, filling the glass to about two-thirds full. Slowly add the sparkling water or ginger beer to top off the drink.
- 4. Garnish each glass with rosemary sprigs and extra whole raspberries, and serve immediately to enjoy the fizz!

## Queensland real estate set to 'spring'

FROM THE REAL ESTATE INSTITUTE OF QLD

#### Queensland's rapidly rising residential property prices stabilised over the September 2024 quarter (July – September 2024), as a wave of spring sales began settling.

The latest median sales results released by the Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) today, reveals a modest 0.26% increase in Queensland's median house prices for the quarter, lifting to \$772,000.

While annual house price growth remains impressive across the state, some regions saw slight quarter-on-quarter dips, suggesting a slowdown rather than a halt in price growth.

The Gold Coast, Brisbane, and Cairns were among the house markets showing signs of stabilisation, while regional areas like Mackay (8.83%), Noosa (7.37%), Townsville (6%) and Gladstone (4.93%) experienced the most significant quarterly gains.

Noosa held onto the crown for Queensland's most expensive market, with a remarkable quarterly median house price of \$1.42 million, surpassing Brisbane (\$1.187m), the Gold Coast (\$1.092m) and the Sunshine Coast (\$1.049m), which also posted million-

#### dollar-medians.

In Greater Brisbane (\$870K), prices continued their steady ascent, with Redlands reaching a median of \$900,000, Moreton Bay at \$820,000, and Ipswich maintaining its reputation for value for money at \$695,000.

Median days on market continue to drop, with Queensland houses now selling in 21 days. The longest annual median days on market were Bundaberg (47 days), Moreton Bay (38) and Rockhampton (29). The fastest were Townsville (13), Mackay (13), and Fraser Coast (14.5).

Meanwhile, units continue to perform strongly while remaining comparatively much more affordable, rising 2.79% over the quarter across Queensland to \$627,000.

Queensland units are now selling in a rapid 18 days. The longest annual days on market for units were in Bundaberg (45 days), Townsville and Fraser Coast (both 29 days). The fastest were ties between Sunshine Coast, Noosa and Cairns (all 13 days), and Brisbane and Toowoomba (both 14 days).



REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella said while prices may not be soaring as high as they have in recent years, the steady market reflects sustained demand and resilience in the state.

"The September quarter results demonstrate a stabilisation in Queensland's residential property market, which is a positive sign of the market finding its rhythm after a period of rapid price escalation," Ms Mercorella said.



## WHAT ARE ROBS, AND HOW ARE THEY HELPING MARINE LIFE?

For those interested in shellfish and marine ecosystems, OzFish is proud to share a little update about what is happening to help the environment. Let's start with ROBs (Robust Oyster Baskets).

ROBs are a ground-breaking advancement in the restoration of shellfish reefs and a vital ecosystem component. These innovative structures provide homes for countless marine creatures and play a crucial role in filtering our waters, enhancing biodiversity, and fostering sustainable food sources for fish populations.

By facilitating the transfer of used oyster shells to OzFish sites, the ROBs enable volunteers to participate in reef restoration efforts without the need for heavy machinery, making the process accessible to all.



Constructed from degradable steel mesh, the ROBs are filled with recycled oyster shells that dedicated volunteers clean at shell recycling centres. This sustainable approach not only repurposes waste but also contributes actively to environmental conservation.

The steel mesh is designed to degrade over two years, allowing ample time for oysters and other shellfish to clump together and establish their communities before the structure completely rusts away. What remains after this degradation process is a robust assembly of oyster shells and living shellfish, creating a new habitat for marine life.

## **TIPS FOR CROSSING THE SOUTH PASSAGE BAR**

#### The three big things to consider when crossing a coastal bar are wind, swell, and tide.

For most trailer boats, a wind speed up to about 10 knots is very comfortable for fishing offshore, especially if it is a typical summer easterly.

In winter, the dominant breeze is from the south-west, making coastal bars more pleasant and fishing conditions more enjoyable.

After Christmas is typically the start of the swell season, and anyone considering crossing the bar should take into account swell height and its direction. A challenging day would be an easterly swell coming straight in on to the bar of around 1.5 metres or more. Swells travel at 12 knots around coastal bars and faster when they are off an intense weather system, so be wary on the bigger swell days.

An incoming tide is preferable as the sea is more passive when swells and tidal flow are travelling from the same direction. Higher in the tide cycle gives more depth under the boat and minimises risk.

Conversely, crossing a coastal bar on the outgoing tide is where incoming swells and the outgoing tide oppose each other, increasing the level of risk during crossing, particularly in a small boat.

Lifejackets are now compulsory when crossing all designated coastal bars in Queensland. Make sure yours is suited to the size and weight of the person wearing it and if inflatable, it is within its service date.

It is also a good idea to log on with VMR Raby Bay on VHF channel 83 before and after crossing. The radio room is open from 5:00am to 8:00pm every day.

Keeping the engine trimmed in and maintaining a low planing speed is a good approach heading out, aiming for the deepest water or the area of least surf break.



Don't forget to mark some waypoints as a guide for the run home later.

Coming home, the engine should be slightly trimmed up. Aim for the safest entry point and maintain a speed slightly higher than the swell speed so you don't get caught by a wave travelling behind.

Remember: if in doubt, don't go out.

## What are dental implants? Dental implants are a long-lasting, cost-effective way to replace a missing tooth or multiple teeth and restore aesthetics and chewing function.

After three months, we perform a test to ensure the implant has been accepted by the body, and then we place teeth on the implant/s.

Am I a suitable candidate for a dental implant? If you have one or more missing teeth, a dental implant might be an option to consider. We always recommend a consultation to discuss your options with our experienced dentists, as not everyone will be able to have a dental implant.
