

#### What a busy start of the year it has been as I get around our amazing community, visiting the islands, our emergency services and volunteers who make our region the great place it is.





# **Farmhouse** restoration revealed

The first stage of Birkdale Community Precinct is taking shape following completion of restoration works on the Willards Farm Homestead and outbuildings.

Redland City Council expects to provide opportunities for the community to see the restoration once all works, including landscaping, are completed.

The circa 1870s farming property is a key hub of the 62 ha precinct, which will become an exciting intergenerational community destination.

Willards Farm Food Hub will celebrate farming heritage and include a classic Victorian garden with space for outdoor food markets.

Designed for and by the Redlands Coast community, Birkdale Community Precinct will feature a total of seven hubs, including Cultural, Innovation, Entertainment, Communications, Conservation and Recreation, Resilience and Adventure Sports spaces.



## Mayor's message **Evolving** precincts

Redlands is a unique part of the world and we have the opportunity to develop exciting precincts within our community.

The balance of valuing our natural assets and providing engagement and value for our growing community is important - and planned precincts can play a role in achieving that.

These spaces are planned to help create more livable neighbourhoods, boost our tourism credentials, stimulate the local economy, enhance conservation outcomes and deliver a variety of new experiences for residents.

Among the projects Redland City Council currently has under way is the Birkdale Community Precinct (BCP), a city-shaping community development planned to showcase the very best of Redlands Coast.

Situated off Old Cleveland Road East in the growing northern corridor, and featuring experience hubs, BCP will be the largest community precinct ever delivered by Council. The masterplan can be found on Council's website.

A catalyst of the 62 hectare development will be the historic Willards Farm Homestead and outbuildings, which are being restored by Council to showcase the farming history

Council is also progressing plans for the Redlands Coast Eco Precinct in Capalaba which will feature Council's premier



environmental education hub, the popular IndigiScapes Centre, and RSPCA Queensland's new state-of-the-art Wildlife Hospital and Centre of Excellence.

Once completed, the precinct will become the largest ecotourism attraction on Redlands Coast and will help showcase our environmental protection and conservation practices to a wider audience, plus improve the care of injured local wildlife.

# Focus on creating ecotourism precinct

The Redlands Coast Eco Precinct is on track to become a leading south east Queensland ecotourism attraction.

The precinct at Redland Bay and Runnymede roads, Capalaba, will become the home of RSPCA Queensland's purposebuilt Wildlife Hospital and Centre of Excellence – expected to cost in excess of \$20 million.

The 16.7 ha site already features Redland City Council's environment centre IndigiScapes as its centrepiece. It is also home to community disability support organisation Myhorizon's main facility.

Late last year Council announced it would provide a 1 ha site directly north of the IndigiScapes Native Nursery to RSPCA Queensland for the wildlife hospital project.

Council has proposed several million dollars worth of supporting infrastructure, including car parks, walkways, road connections, pedestrian mobility enhancements and landscaping, with a strong focus on all-abilities access to ensure inclusivity and accessibility.

The IndigiScapes outdoor play space will also be enhanced with a significant upgrade, encouraging visitors to explore and connect with nature.

The precinct is expected to bring significant environmental and community benefits to the city through its educational and practical focus on caring for habitat and wildlife.

# **Transforming gateway to Redlands Coast**

Construction on the multimillion-dollar Capalaba Town Centre Revitalisation Project is on track to start this year following relocation of Capalaba Library in late 2024.

The \$250 million project is set to transform the 1.55 ha site into the urban heart of Capalaba, creating a day/night economy and bringing much-needed infrastructure and connectivity to the area.

Redland City Council is working with subsidiary company Redland Investment Corporation (RIC) and preferred development partner Shayher Group to deliver the masterplanned precinct.

Stage one includes a new Council library and customer service centre,



contemporary arts facility and three levels of office space.

The precinct will also include a community hall, an enhanced entertainment and dining precinct featuring a village green with a large

screen, an employment hub, new retail and commercial areas and a mixed-use residential development.

To facilitate the project, Capalaba Library and Customer Service Centre has been temporarily moved from Noeleen St to Capalaba Central Shopping Centre. Library books and other resources, programs and events remain available, along with over-the-counter rates payments and pet registrations.

The new venue offers study spaces, bookable meeting rooms, public computers and printers, plus dedicated areas for teenagers and children.

Council adopted the Capalaba Centre Master Plan in 2010, identifying key potential for creating a vibrant gateway into Redlands Coast.

# **RPAC continues Cleveland revitalisation**

A refurbishment of the Redland Performing Arts Centre (RPAC) forecourt is the latest project transforming Cleveland as part of a 20-year Central Business District revitalisation program.

The Cleveland Centre Master Plan project was adopted by Redland City Council to drive new customers, business and investment to the CBD through to the year 2031.

The master plan describes Cleveland as a focus for community life and civic activity, highlighted by a rich mix of shops, offices, pedestrian and cyclist-friendly streets plus a diverse network of parks and plazas providing connection to the Raby Bay harbour restaurants and cafes.

Late last year Council upgraded its Visitor Information Centre, moving it closer to the heart of the CBD. It also commissioned artwork to transform the Cleveland Library wall fronting Middle Street forecourt. The 4.6m high by 16.8m long Quandamooka First Nations mural was designed by well-known Redlands Coast artists Sandra and Shara Delaney.

Council continues its commitment to the CBD with a number of capital works projects slated in the 2024-2025 Budget.

Along with the work at RPAC, a building renewal project at Cleveland Library is expected to cost \$1.04 million and there are planned upgrades of corporate accommodation in the Cleveland office building. Funding has been allocated for the city's muchloved community facilities, including pedestrian lighting around Raby Bay Harbour and Bloomfield Street.







### Waterfront project delivers new recreational boat ramp

Redevelopment of Weinam Creek Priority Development Area continued in 2024 as Redland City Council and Redland Investment Corporation (RIC) work together to deliver a vibrant gateway to the Southern Moreton Bay Islands (SMBI).

The waterfront precinct at Redland Bay reached an important milestone late last year with the opening of a new, three-lane recreational boat ramp and floating pontoon.

Repositioning the ramp to the southern end of Weinam Creek was designed to alleviate parking pressures and assist traffic

flow. Emergency services first-responder vessels now have exclusive access to the old ramp off Banana Street.


Earlier in the year, Council announced Consolidated Properties Group (CPG) as the preferred development partner to deliver the precinct's multi-storey car park and a retail precinct.

To be completed in stages over the next two to three years, the PDA will also deliver travel and transport upgrades, an activated foreshore with more open space, rejuvenated parks, restaurants, cafes and improved road infrastructure to reduce traffic congestion.



# WHAT NOT TO FEED YOUR PETS

As we enjoy the increased socialising and festivities over summer, there are lots of opportunities for indulging in delicious treats. It is very important to ensure that your pets are not sharing in foods which may make them ill.

#### **FOODS TO BE AVOIDED**

**Avocado** – this is of main concern in birds where cardiovascular damage can occur. Ingestion of avocadoes may cause vomiting and diarrhoea in household pets.



**Chocolate, coffee and caffeine** – the compound methylxanthine found in cacao seeds can cause vomiting, diarrhoea, cardiovascular disease, seizures and can be fatal in large amounts.

**Grapes and raisins** – these fruits can cause kidney failure in cats and dogs.

**Macadamia nuts** – macadamia nuts can cause weakness, depression, vomiting and tremors. Affected animals may appear to be developing paralysis. Ingestion of the whole nut (including the shell) can cause intestinal obstruction.

**Milk and dairy** – most pets are not able to digest lactose so may develop diarrhoea if ingesting milk, cheese and other dairy products.

**Onions, garlic and chives –** these vegetables can cause gastrointestinal irritation and red blood cell damage.

**Xylitol** – the artificial sweetener is often found in chewing gum, lollies, toothpaste and fat reduced forms of products such as peanut butter. Xylitol causes an increase in insulin which leads to low blood sugar and vomiting, lethargy and liver failure may occur.



**Yeast dough** – uncooked dough can rise and cause gas to accumulate in the stomach leading to bloat. The fermentation process undergone by yeast results in the production of ethanol as a by-product, which may lead to alcohol intoxication.

If your pet has eaten a food from the above list and is showing signs of illness it is important to contact your vet for advice on treatment. It's safest to feed your pet only known safe foods to avoid any issues.

All urban public transport services in the Redlands are now enabled for customers to use their credit card, debit card, smartphone, or smart watch to pay for their journey.

Redlands public transport users now have full access to Smart Ticketing on all Transdev buses and Southern Moreton Bay Island (SMBI) ferry services, enabling customers to use the new ways to pay.

Sealink's SMBI ferries were activated on the same day, completing the roll out of Smart Ticketing on all SEQ public transport ferry services.

With Smart Ticketing already available on all SEQ trains, the activation of the technology on bus and ferry services in the Redlands means all urban public transport services in the region are now offering the new payment system for their customers.

# **A ROARING SUCCESS**

BY KAT PEARSON, GIRL IN THE GREEN

This year, I am getting my best crop of dragonfruit ever! They've been in the ground for maybe three years; I got one fruit the first year, two the second and this year I'm lined up for over 10! Although, (in my opinion) they are somewhat ugly climbing cactus plants, with spikes prone to rambling up a tree or through your neighbour's hedge, dragonfruit produce enormous, beautiful blooms and subsequently, refreshing fruit. Due to their inclination to run up trees, they can be a bit of a pest and you might see them untamed in older gardens hanging from trees and rocky cliffs.

Dragonfruit (also known as pitaya) come from Mexico and Central America. As mentioned earlier, they are part of the cactus (Cactaceae) family and different colours are different species in the *Selenicereus* genus (plus all the cultivars!). Despite being a cactus, they are a tropical plant and do like regular water, especially in hot weather. They still need well drained soil, but will happily accept some compost, and of course, love full sun.

They are a night-blooming cactus and each flower only lasts a night, opening late afternoon and closing up the following morning. As with most night-blooming flowers, they are typically pollinated by moths, but bees will sneak their way in there in the early morning too. Some varieties are self-pollinating, while others require a buddy. Most of the flowers are white (quite common in night bloomers — they're easier to see in the dark by their pollinators!) but there are a few varieties with coloured petals.

I have a common white flesh variety and a pink flesh one. Hands down the pink flesh is tastier; the white one is almost grainy, and it's probably only the spines on the plant that are keeping me from binning it (protection from predators of all kinds, haha!). The fruit is best fully ripe, popped in the fridge till cold and enjoyed with a squeeze of fresh lime — delicious on a hot summer's day. Be warned — the pink ones may have a similar effect to eating too much beetroot at your other end. Gave me guite the surprise once!

I love gardening, growing my own food and plants in general. I've been working on our current garden in subtropical



Brisbane for the last six-plus years, but have been gardening for much, much longer in all sorts of places. I'm an exengineer, recently turned horticulturist (life's too short not to work in something you love!). I grow edibles and ornamentals in an often wild, rambling jungle, filled with birds and bugs, including a handful of pet chooks and a brand new puppy (who likes to chase said chickens, and is not averse to helping me dig a hole!).

# I HAVE AN UNSIGHTLY LUMP. CAN IT BE FIXED?

Unfortunately, many of us are born with or develop unsightly moles, skin lesions or lumps. Can they be fixed? The truth is some can and others cannot.

Common lesions which can be removed are:

 Compound naevi (Moles) or hairy naevus are usually elevated unsightly pigmented non-cancerous (benign) skin lesions. They frequently occur on the face, often called beauty spots.

Some people treasure them, while others regard them as cosmetically unacceptable and prefer to have them removed. For a good cosmetic result, choose a qualified plastic or specialist skin reconstructive surgeon. Remember, straight line scars stand out and are unsightly, so choose wisely.

- Skin tags frequently appear around areas of friction like the armpits, neck flank and thighs. They are simple to remove if small, often without anaesthesia. Do not freeze them with cryotherapy!
- Sebaceous cysts occur anywhere, and it is recommended they be removed early. If left they will gradually enlarge and — not

infrequently — get infected. This results in a nasty abscess, which antibiotics will not cure. Why? The antibiotic cannot get into the cyst contents to kill the pathogen. Controlled trials have shown that early treatment, with complete excision under antibiotic cover, is effective. Ask your GP for a referral to a surgeon experienced at



this procedure. This reduces the period of pain with immediate relief and instantly cures the problem in one hit.

Drainage of the abscess is not acceptable as it requires repetitive dressings and discomfort for three to four weeks with all the complications of antibiotic therapy – then you will still need the cyst removed at a later date!

An experienced surgeon is instantly able to diagnose and manage these common lesions and differentiate these lumps from a hernia. There is no need waste your or taxpayers' money having ultrasounds – it does not alter the management!

# **WOMEN AMBULANCE DRIVERS STARTING TOUR AT RPAC!**

Written by celebrated playwright Katy Forde, with music by Aleathea Monsour, the show throws into glorious light a largely forgotten part of women's WW1 history – the establishment and operation of a front-line hospital in warravaged and desperate Serbia – complete with its own ambulance service.

Katy says that her interest was sparked by a plaque on The Mansions in Brisbane dedicated to Dr Lilian Cooper, Queensland's first female surgeon.

"I started researching. It was really hard to find stuff, but it was so exciting. Lilian Cooper and her lifetime partner, Miss Josephine Bedford, had unsuccessfully offered their services to the armed forces, so they turned to the volunteer-run Scottish Women's Hospitals, which had set up war-time city hospitals staffed by female medicos from around the world.

"They didn't expect to be working in the first front-line hospital run by women, but that's where they ended up, carrying out care and surgery under bombardment. Sydney-born doctor Agnes Bennett was the Commanding Officer, Dr Lillian Cooper was Chief Surgeon."

Women and suffragette movements from around the world supported them wholeheartedly, and the women managed to obtain a fleet of Model T Fords and



convert them to ambulances, operated under the management of Josephine Bedford. Their hospital boasted an X-ray unit and an amazing level of hygiene; the Army hospitals began sending their surgeons there for training and wounded soldiers bribed ambulance drivers to take them to the Bennett Unit.

Love and conflict, history and humour, an all-woman show (even the Serbian General) woven through with live music from the award-winning all-girl band *Vix and the Slick Chix.*

# GET RECYCLING WITH CONTAINER EXCHANGE POINTS IN YOUR LOCAL PARK

Trials of an initiative that allows residents to recycle their used drink containers in public areas have been expanded to incorporate more parks, reserves and open spaces across the Redlands Coast mainland.

Mayor Jos Mitchell said Container Exchange Points were helping to reduce litter and improve recycling in these areas while also making it easier for the community to cash in on the 10-cent refund offered through the Containers for Change scheme.

"There are so many benefits to this initiative and we are grateful to be working with Container Exchange (COEX) – the not-for-profit that runs Queensland's container refund scheme – to trial recycling exchange points in some of our most popular public spaces," the Mayor said.

"The trial was launched in select areas of Cleveland earlier this year to assist Council with meeting some of its recycling goals and to reduce the frequency and volume of recyclable bottles either being left in public spaces or lost to landfill through general waste bins.

"Since then, four new suburbs have been added to the pilot – Mount Cotton, Victoria Point, Capalaba and Wellington Point – more than doubling the number of exchange points available on the mainland.

"The main public areas in the five participating suburbs experience

some of the highest footfall on Redlands Coast, particularly during the holiday season, so we know these exchange points will make a positive difference for our community.

Container Exchange Points are attached to the outside of Council bins and contain six slots for depositing empty recyclable drink containers such as glass bottles or aluminum cans. Containers placed in the receptacles can be collected by members of the public and cashed in at any Containers for Change refund point, where each bottle and can recycled earns a 10-cent refund.





# **QUICK AND EASY SUMMER QUINOA SALAD RECIPE**

- 1/4 cup fresh mint, chopped
- 1 avocado, diced
- 1/2 cup feta cheese, crumbled

#### **DRESSING**

- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 3 tbsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp white wine vinegar
- 1 tsp Dijon mustard

- 1 garlic clove, finely minced
- ¼ tsp salt
- ¼ tsp black pepper



#### METHOD

- 1. In a medium saucepan, combine quinoa and water and bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to low, cover, and simmer for 8 minutes or until water is absorbed. Fluff with a fork and set it aside to cool.
- 2. Place the tomatoes, kale, cucumber, capsicum, red onion, parsley, and mint in a large bowl.
- 3. In a small bowl or jar with a lid, combine the olive oil, lemon juice, Dijon mustard, vinegar, garlic, salt, and pepper and give it a shake.
- 4. Add the cooked quinoa to the bowl of vegetables and toss to combine. Add the dressing and mix
- 5. Top with avocado, sprinkle with feta cheese and serve immediately.

This month, a slice of paradise on the Redlands Coast turns 25 years old! Redlands IndigiScapes Centre at Capalaba officially opened in February 2000.

Many other significant events happened in 2000. Fun fact: it was a leap year and the first century year since 1600 to have a February 29. For me personally, my first baby girl came into the world, and it was the height of the iconic kids' television show *Totally Wild* when more than 300,000 viewers tuned in each weekday afternoon to learn about the natural environment. Major global events dominated the news...who can forget the Y2K bug that had us all wondering what would happen as 1999 ticked over into the new year, the Sydney Summer Olympic Games, and the first residential crew arrived at The International Space Station.

Closer to home on the Redlands Coast, a new 14.5-hectare native landscapes sanctuary had locals buzzing. Since opening a quarter of a century ago, hundreds of thousands of people have come to connect with nature, marvel at the 400-plus-year-old tallowwood tree, learn about the local environment, volunteer, and make memories to last a lifetime.

The centre has been an important meeting place for community and environment groups and was groundbreaking as Australia's first native garden demonstration centre, inspiring and encouraging us to use endemic plant species in our own backyards.

The centre re-launched in 2020 following a spectacular makeover. Today, the heart of IndigiScapes continues to beat strong...people still come for a fix of nature, to recycle and choose native plants for home gardens, enjoy food with a native flavour twist and discover something new on walking trails.

Over the past 25 years, IndigiScapes has blossomed and evolved, but some things have remained the same...the passion for nature and sustainable living and the giant old tallowwood tree that keeps growing more gnarly each year.

The exhibition will run until Sunday February 23.



# FEBRUARY'S CATCH: MACKEREL, WHITING AND SQUID TOP THE CHARTS

Well, my call last month announcing the arrival date of the spotty mackerel proved pretty accurate! A few fishermen had caught some in early January, but you should see them throughout the bay over the next few weeks and months, hopefully in good numbers. It doesn't matter if they're in big or small schools - just follow the turns fluttering above the feeding schools to catch a few. The only problem (but fantastic for the bay) was the amount of baby school mackerel and spotty mackerel in January, and this won't change much in February. That means you'll have to catch and release lots of small ones to get to a few bigger fish, but it will be fun, especially in the Rous Channel in the shallower water.

During February, whiting and squid should be plentiful. The tiger squid will be very aggressive and attack the squid jigs with purpose this time of year, so it's fun to watch, catch, and put on

the dinner table. I get many emails about getting inked as you bring the squid onto the boat. I have found



one of the best ways to avoid this is when you lift the squid out of the water, hold them between the body and the head and turn them upside down they will release all the water so they can't mix the ink with water to spurt it out.

If you're after some lovely tasting whitebait, try a light on the back of the boat at the western side of Green Island, use a butterfly net, and you should
