REDLANDS CLUBS TO BENEFIT FROM MEGA \$20K COMMUNITY RAFFLE!

Bayside Community Fund (BCF) announced its first Community Raffle, designed to benefit not-for-profit organisations and clubs in the Redlands and Wynnum Manly areas.

Community Bank Victoria Point and Wynnum Manly branches of Bendigo Bank have donated \$20,000 in cash, to be raffled as three cash prizes, with tickets to be sold by non-profit local clubs. All proceeds from tickets sales will be kept by the clubs.

"We are proud to enable local community groups to raise funds for themselves without the expenses of prizes and raffle tickets," explained BCF chairman Michael Sarquis. "Being able to make 100 per cent profit from ticket sales will make a tangible difference to many groups in our area."

The raffle will be drawn mid-June, when one lucky person will win a \$15,000 Bendigo Bank savings account. Second prize is a \$3,000 Bendigo Bank savings account, and third prize is a \$2,000 Bendigo Bank savings account.

"We are fortunate to have the Community Bank Victoria Point and Wynnum Manly branches of Bendigo Bank sponsor this raffle for the prizes and raffle tickets," Michael said.

Bendigo Bank's Community Development Manager for the Victoria Point and Wynnum Manly branches, Mr JJ Cowley, said the idea for the Community Raffle came from a Bendigo Bank branch in Western Australia where an initial community raffle saw organisations raise \$67,000, growing to \$123,000 by the third raffle.

"Bendigo Bank's Community Bank model is to invest 80 per cent of profits into the community, and if we can invest \$20,000 (plus costs) into the BCF's Community Raffle, it will allow local organisations to raise three to five times that amount," said Mr Cowley.

Consider the fundraising possibilities with tickets selling at \$5 each. If an organisation has 50 members who sell 10 tickets each, that organisation will profit by \$2,500. With more members or more ticket sales, that profit will increase.

Tickets will be on sale from early March to May 30, and it's easy for local organisations and clubs to get involved. Simply register an expression of interest online by scanning the QR code on this page, and you will be contacted to collect raffle tickets, advertising posters and complete some basic paperwork. Local hockey, rugby league, touch and union clubs along with dance clubs,

Zonta, P&Cs, RSLs and a choir have already registered their interest.

"We want as many groups in our community to participate in the Community Raffle so everyone can share in the profits of this fundraising opportunity," Michael said.

NO ONE'S FEELING BLUE AT THE REDLANDS COAST BLUES FESTIVAL!

The Redlands Coast Blues Festival had its origins in 2014 when a former councillor, disappointed that the local regional park wasn't used for any major events, decided that a music festival would do well. He approached the Capalaba Rotary Club and the blues festival was born, continuing as a popular annual event peaking at 10,000 plus visitors in 2020 - until it was flooded out in 2022, which saw its demise for the following two years.

"With Council and Rotary Club support we redeveloped and rebadged the event, and this year on the fifth of April we'll be celebrating its return at the Redland Showgrounds," says a spokesperson from the festival reignite team.

The festival will open in full swing with food stalls, a bar, stage performances and roving players. There will be events for children (who can attend free of charge) including face painting and a petting zoo. Purchase of a ticket will allow free entry to the popular Redland Museum.

In a first for the event the program will feature an acclaimed headline act from Sydney, Ray Beadle, who - in the festival's words - "will light up the stage!"

Ray's distinctive style has made him a favourite with blues and music fans. A first-class guitarist, singer/songwriter and all-round performer, Ray's talents have been recognised in the Chain Blues Awards with Best Album, Best Song, and Best Male Artist. His life as a musician started at the age of nine and for the next two decades he played with – and learned from – some of the best in the blues genre, including a three-month residency with the house band in BB King's Memphis club.

Other performers include Mojo Webb, BlueSkillet Rovers, Shade Hadie, Shotgun Sam, Dezzie D and the Stingrayz Official Band, The Honey Sliders, Blues Arcadia, Shotgun Sam & His World Famous Blues Band, and Dezzie D and the Stingrayz.

The day of non-stop blues music, flavoured with rock 'n' roll, jazz, soul, boogie and country - what's not to love? - lifts off at 11:30am and runs until 9:00pm on Saturday April 5 at Redland Showgrounds. 

"It's so good to see the community functioning like this, not tied to their mobile phones, making contacts the way we should. If anyone is tempted to give it a try just come along – or you're missing out on a great evening!"

Brisbane Metro network extension



Council continues to partner and work together with Brisbane City Council and the Queensland Government to deliver a fast

and efficient bus route that will connect Capalaba to Greater Brisbane. Federal funding will make this a reality much faster, in anticipation of an estimated 17 per cent population growth in the Redlands by 2046.

- Better connected public transport
- Reduced congestion
- Shorter commutes

Sport and recreation upgrades



Australian Government investment in quality sport and recreation infrastructure will support local jobs, attract major events, and provide more opportunities for community participation in sport. Council is asking candidates to commit to:

\$5 million – William Taylor Memorial Sports Precinct (Thorneside), clubhouse upgrades

\$5 million – Keith Surridge Sports Precinct (Alexandra Hills), clubhouse upgrades and a new amenities block



ALL ABOUT CONTACT ALLERGIES IN PETS

The very wet spring and summer we have experienced has seen our gardens and lawns absolutely blooming with flowers and seeds. This has led to an increase in the incidence of contact allergies in our pets.



WHAT IS A CONTACT ALLERGY?

A contact allergy occurs when an animal develops dermatitis as a result of contact with an irritant. Common causes of contact allergies are:

- Grass Kikuyu, Buffalo and Couch
- Succulent groundcovers Rhoeo, Moses-in-a-boat, Wandering Jew
- · Topical medications, including shampoos and lotions

- Carpet

- Fertiliser

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF CONTACT ALLERGY?

Contact allergies generally manifest as severe itching within four to 72 hours after contact with the offending allergen. Animals develop a red, itchy rash that may affect the muzzle, armpits, elbows, belly, groin, scrotum, perineum and paws – basically the underside of the animal. Chronic exposure to the allergen may result in inflammation, leading to hyperpigmentation (darkening) and thickening of the skin. A scaly, scabby or sometimes pustular rash may occur.

HOW IS A CONTACT ALLERGY DIAGNOSED?

Pet owners may notice that their dog or cat is itchy after being in certain environments or around products within the house and yard. A dermatologist can perform skin testing to diagnose specific allergies.

HOW IS CONTACT ALLERGY TREATED?

Ideally, if the allergen can be identified and the pet can avoid exposure, then contact allergies may be controlled. This is not always effective or practical, particularly in instances of grass or carpet allergy where daily exposure is inevitable. Protective clothing

may be used to limit contact with the offending allergen. Regular washing of pets to remove irritants may help reduce the symptoms. Omega fatty acids in the diet and topical moisturising treatments can help to improve your pet's skin barrier health, which can reduce the penetration of allergens.

Your vet will be able to discuss a range of options for medical treatment of contact allergies.

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT

WHAT'S THE BUZZ?

I'm sure everyone knows the European honeybee – the ones that sting you (and then die!) and are responsible for the jars of honey in the pantry. Honeybees were introduced to Australia in the early 1820s by European settlers who imported many a plant and animal to make Oz feel like home. But Australia has around 2000 species of native bees all of our own!

During summer, I wake up to the sound of our native blue-banded bees, Amegilla cingulate, buzzing in my blue ginger flowers *Dichorisandra thyrsiflora* (not actually a ginger at all, but well worth growing). I've noticed these bees around my garden in other flowers, but the blue ginger is a magnet for them, and the tubular shape of the flowers amplifies the buzz sound, so I know when they're about.

If you haven't seen a blue-banded bee, they are a bit chunkier than a honeybee, have a tan, hairy body and iridescent blue stripes on their bottoms. If you get up close, you can also see their really long tongues, which help them get nectar and pollen from deep in the flower.

Like many of our native bees, these guys are specialists in 'buzz pollination'. Basically, they get into a flower and shake their booty (technically, they vibrate their flight muscles, which are in their thorax or the middle bit, but that sounds less cute). Buzz pollination is really helpful to some plants that have their pollen tucked away in anthers with tiny openings too small for insects to get in. One well known plant that likes buzz pollination is the tomato. The wind is often enough to shake some of the pollen free, but buzz pollination is the next level.

Blue-banded bees are solitary bees and don't live in hives, although they often live near each other, like a little village. Females nest in clay soil or soft sandstone and the guys hang out overnight on plant stems, clamping on with their jaws. These bees are only active in the warmer months and die as the weather cools, but overwintered eggs hatch when it warms up and the cycle starts again!

SHOULD I USE SANITISING SOLUTIONS ON MY SKIN?

In my article on why we have skin (published before Christmas), we learnt that our skin "is covered with friendly symbiotic bacteria to protect us from nasty pathogens" and "there is no need for antiseptics that would kill the good bugs and leave us vulnerable".

In the last 15 to 20 years, our TV screens have been splattered with advertisements claiming certain products "kill 99.9 per cent of germs". This may be true, BUT...is it good for our health? The answer is NO. So, why not? Let's explore this.

Do not be fooled by anyone – we do NOT LIVE IN A 'STERILE' WORLD. Yet the pharmaceutical and chemical industries – for financial gain - have been advertising to convince us that the world is sterile. This has resulted in a generation of people believing something that is NOT true. Bacteria, fungi, parasites, viruses, etc., frequently referred to as 'germs', exist everywhere. This is normal flora, and occurs in the soil, on surfaces, in the air...EVERYWHERE, including inside and outside of our bodies.

Ninety-nine per cent of these 'germs' work in a symbiotic way for the benefit of all life, including that of humans. Further, they can never be eradicated; they are essential to nature's cycle.

Whenever antiseptics/sanitisers/chemicals are splashed around or misused, the 99.9 per cent of good, protective, friendly organisms (germs) that inhabit our skin and gut (and even the soil), are killed. Like any army, if you weaken the number of protective soldiers, you open the door for the enemy. Nasty pathogens that invade the body via the

skin or gut can cause infections and/or death, whatever age you are. DO NOT use antiseptics on yourself or around your home.

There is a limited place and use for specific antiseptics in special, appropriate circumstances by the medical profession - whenever the normal protection lining of the skin or gut is artificially broken either by injury or, for example, in the operating theatre.

So, what's the answer? Only use soap and water to wash the skin, NOT antiseptics. And why soap? Because the skin produces oils of one kind or another to maintain the hairs that grow everywhere on our skin and cause odour.

DON'T TRASH THE OPPORTUNITY TO DO THE RIGHT THING

FROM REDLAND CITY COUNCIL

The start of the year often marks the time for a good old cleanup around the house.

Whether you're attacking the garden or that hoarder's paradise known as the back shed, Redland City Council would like to remind you to dispose of your unwanted items correctly.

Mayor Jos Mitchell said the correct thing to do was to separate your waste into the right kerbside bins or dispose of your waste at one of the city's eight recycling and waste centres, which residents can access free of charge.

"Unfortunately, not everyone does the right thing and Council has to spend thousands of ratepayer dollars each year to clean up illegally dumped waste," the Mayor said.

"In some cases, Council then has to repair natural areas and infrastructure damaged by the dumping."

Council actively monitors areas for illegal waste dumping. Any evidence gathered may be used to commence enforcement action.

Between 1 July and 31 December 2024, Council has received 197 complaints of littering and illegal dumping.

Offences can result in fines of between \$322 and \$12,097. Serious offences may result in court prosecution, higher penalties (up to

\$161,300 for an individual; up to \$806,500 for a corporation) and a conviction recorded against the offender.

The Mayor said one of the common types of illegally dumped waste was green waste.

Mainland residents who find they have excess green waste can order a green waste bin from Council by phoning 3829 8999 or you can order online.

"Illegal dumping, including green waste, can have a serious environmental impact by spreading pests and weeds; blocking stormwater drains and natural water courses; and creating breeding grounds for flies, mosquitoes and rats," the Mayor said.

To report illegal dumping, phone Council on 3829 8999, or report it via the Queensland Government's Department of Environment and Science online Illegal Dumping Reporting form.

Environmental damage that illegal dumping can lead to:

 Introduction of pest plants that can out-compete native plant species.



- Infestation, contamination and blocking of watercourses.
- Introduction of pest animals or diseases into new areas, such as fire ants and myrtle rust.
- Blocking of forest tracks and fire trails in natural areas, risking the lives of firefighters and the public.
- An increase in bush fire fuel loads or ignition sources.
- Attracting wildlife to roadsides to feed on organic waste, and increasing the likelihood they will be hit by cars.


Sarah says that one of the reasons for the show's success is the quality of the performers and that they really enjoy working together.



The original installer did not use cheap products by any means. However, upon further investigation, it became evident that the company was not a New Energy Tech Approved Seller. Instead, they relied exclusively on subcontractors for the installation—a decision that ultimately proved disastrous for the unsuspecting homeowner.

The cost to rectify both the system and the roof exceeded \$8,000. When added to the original cost of the system, the so-called "cheap" solar installation turned out to be significantly more expensive than if the homeowner had chosen a reputable company like Goodhew Electrical and Solar from the start.

HEY PRESTO! PESTO CHICKEN WITH MACADAMIA NUT RECIPE

Bursting with fresh, punchy flavours, this chicken recipe is quick and easy with its deliciously herby, nutty, and citrusy take on classic pesto chicken. Serve it with a big green salad, as filling in a super-sandwich, or mix it through your favourite cooked pasta.

INGREDIENTS

PESTO

- 1 cup of fresh basil leaves
- 1/2 cup of baby spinach (optional, for extra green goodness!)
- 1/4 cup of roasted, unsalted macadamia nuts
- 1/2 cup of grated Parmesan cheese

CHICKEN

- 4 large skinless chicken breasts
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- · Salt and pepper

- 2 peeled garlic cloves, minced
- 2 tbsp of lemon juice
- The zest of 1 lemon
- 1/3 cup of extra virgin olive oil
- Salt and pepper to season
- 1/2 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1/2 cup sun-dried tomatoes, chopped
- · Fresh basil leaves to garnish


METHOD

- First, make the pesto. In a food processor, blend basil, spinach, macadamia nuts, Parmesan, garlic, lemon juice, and lemon zest. Drizzle in the olive oil while blending until it's smooth. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Set the pesto aside.
- 2. Season the chicken breast on each side with salt and pepper. Heat the olive oil in a pan with a lid over medium-high heat and sear the chicken for 5 to 7 minutes on each side, until it's golden brown and cooked through.



- 3. Turn the heat down to low, spread a generous layer of pesto over each chicken breast, and add cherry tomatoes and sun-dried tomatoes to the pan. Cover the pan with its lid, and let it simmer gently for 2 minutes to let the flavours combine. Remove the chicken from the heat and place it on a cutting board, then let it rest for 2 minutes.
- 4. Slice the chicken into 4 to 5cm strips. Return the chicken to the pan and mix through the pesto. Garnish with basil leaves, and your meal is made!

The March Fair will be held on Sunday March 30, from 8:30am to 1:30pm at 120-126 Shore Street North, Cleveland.





HIDDEN DISABILITIES SUNFLOWER INITIATIVE IN BLOOM ACROSS COUNCIL

Redland City Council has been blooming with sunflowers since adopting an internationally recognised program to support people in the community living with non-visible disabilities.

Mayor Jos Mitchell said the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower initiative was implemented in Council in February 2024 and there were now more than 370 Council employees trained and participating in the program.

"By wearing white sunflower lanyards or pins, Council employees show those with a non-visible disability that they are there to provide support and extra help if needed," the Mayor said.

"The initiative encourages greater inclusivity, acceptance and understanding of people living with disabilities such as dementia, vision and hearing impairment and chronic illnesses."

Under the initiative, individuals can also choose to wear a green sunflower lanyard, wristband or badge if they want to voluntarily disclose to others that they have a hidden disability and may require extra assistance when completing a task or activity.

The initiative was rolled out at Council's Visitor Information Centre, Customer Service Centres, Redland Art Gallery, Libraries and Redland Performing Arts Centre, and then expanded through Council.

Council held a group training session on Russell Island with the city's Community Champions to welcome them into being part of the initiative.

"The initiative has been fully embraced across Council," the Mayor said.

"In August last year, Council's customer service centres took out a major industry award in recognition of their commitment to the initiative, winning the Diversity and Inclusion award in the Employee Experience Initiative of the Year category at the Queensland Auscontact State Excellence Awards."

CIRCLE OF MEN VOLUNTEERS BRING COMPANIONSHIP TO SENIORS

In today's post-COVID world, loneliness and isolation are growing concerns, particularly for older men living in aged care facilities across Australia. With limited social interactions and the loss of mobility, health, and personal networks, many men face a future of solitude.

Circle of Men, a not-for-profit charity established in 2005, is making a difference in the Redlands area by offering a weekly companionship and support program designed to break through the barriers of isolation. Dedicated male volunteers visit selected aged care facilities, providing much-needed social engagement and emotional support.

Each session, led by an experienced volunteer facilitator, begins with a heartfelt "How are you going?" check-in. This simple question often opens the door to discussions about grief, depression, anger, and loss — issues that many elderly men struggle with in silence. But Circle of Men is about more than just serious conversations; it's about camaraderie, laughter, and shared memories. Jokes are exchanged, stories from the past come to life, and sometimes, familiar songs fill the room with warmth and nostalgia.

For 90 minutes each week, these sessions foster genuine friendships and provide a sense of belonging. Volunteers create a space where residents feel heard, valued, and connected to a supportive community.

LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO

THE WHITING ARE BITING, AND THE PRAWNS ARE PLENTIFUL THIS MONTH!

Gee, it's already the third month of the year! Time flies when you're getting old, but fishingwise, March brings the whiting, prawns, and squid, and hopefully, we'll see the spotty mackerel tearing the bay apart!

So, where are the fish this month?

The whiting should be plentiful from Chain Banks through to the Rous and Amity Banks. The tiger squid should be hanging around the same areas, and I always use a squid jig out the back of the boat when I'm fishing for whiting. Take a look at the photo for the squid jigs I use that work best in the bay.

Prawning is good north and south of the river, so if you can throw a cast net (I can't!), follow the thousands of boats, get in between them, and the prawns should be in the bucket.

Spotty mackerel should be throughout the bay, so look for the diving turns and have your chrome slug ready, and maybe you'll hook a couple. Schoolies



keep-on keeping-on these days, which is great - they're in the bay all year round, so a trolled spoon should get



you a few around Hope Banks and north of Peel

Sweet lip and snapper will be around the Bay Islands and artificial reefs, and some patience always pays off.

Well begun is half done

Trying to get finances organised can be daunting. Where do you even start from? Also, what if you get stuck along the way? see if you're still getting value from subscription services. Or it could be to look at your superannuation statement to see how the balance looks compared to last year.

Every task you get through is one less you have left to do. If you've made a budget that is roughed out, you've come further than someone who doesn't control their spending

at all. If you've looked at your superannuation fund once, you have a better idea of your wealth than someone who doesn't look at all.
