



• 1st Prize: \$15,000


2nd Prize: \$3,000


#### CAN YOU HELP?

## **ALL ABOUT MALASSEZIA INFECTION IN DOGS AND CATS**

Malassezia is a particular species of yeast which is commonly found on the skin and ears of dogs and cats. Overgrowth of Malassezia can occur when the environment of the ear canal changes. Inflammation of the ear canal results in increased moisture and secretions in the



ear, which allow the yeast to multiply. Allergic skin disease, chronic wetting of the ears (common in dogs who like to swim) and humid environmental conditions can all lead to Malassezia overgrowth.

#### WHAT ARE THE SIGNS?

Signs of Malassezia overgrowth include:

 Increased wax/discharge in the ear canals. This is commonly dark brown (like vegemite) but may be any colour and texture.

- Odour often a "musty" odour may be detected.
- · Head shaking or scratching ears.
- Swollen, inflamed pinna (ear flap).
- Pain.

#### **HOW IS IT DIAGNOSED?**

Your vet will examine your pet's ears — your pet may have red, inflamed ear canals, swelling of the ear canal wall, dark discharge and increased odour to the ear.

Cytology is required to diagnose an ear infection. Your vet will take a sample of the discharge and examine the material under a microscope. Pets may also have bacterial infections simultaneous with a Malassezia infection and correct diagnosis is important to ensure that effective treatment may be prescribed.

#### **HOW IS MALASSEZIA OTITIS TREATED?**

Your vet will prescribe an appropriate medicated ear treatment for your pet. This may be a twice daily, once daily or longer-acting treatment depending on the infection present, and how co-operative your pet is with having their ears handled!

Regular cleaning of the ears with an appropriate ear cleaner can help reduce wax and debris from accumulating in the ear canal and reduce the incidence of ear infections.

Severe ear infections may require ongoing preventative treatment with a medicated formula – your vet will discuss the best plan for your pet

Treatment of underlying conditions such as allergic dermatitis will also help reduce the occurrence of ear infections.

## **LET'S TALK ABOUT RSV VACCINES**

Respiratory syncytial virus, or RSV, has been talked about a lot more recently. It's one of the yearly viral infections that makes the rounds in cold weather. For most people, it causes mild cold-like symptoms, but in infants, immunocompromised people, people with chronic health conditions and the elderly, it can cause severe illness, leading to hospitalisation and even death. Thankfully, over the last few years, we have had vaccines released specifically to target RSV and reduce the risk of illness for high-risk people.



Because the vaccines are new, many eligible people aren't aware of them.

If you are over 60 with chronic health conditions or over 75, you should see your doctor to discuss whether getting an RSV vaccine is appropriate.

The other important group who should be getting RSV vaccines is pregnant women, as the government currently funds an RSV vaccine between 28-26 weeks of pregnancy to help newborns have immediate protection. RSV has been a leading cause of ICU admissions for infants, but we have seen these numbers drop significantly since the vaccine was introduced. Some high-risk newborns are recommended to have a dose at birth – this should be discussed with your doctor.

## **FASHION FUNDRAISER FOR HEAD AND NECK CANCER AWARENESS**

Head and neck cancer was unknown to me until I was diagnosed. Though it encompasses over 11 different cancer types, awareness remains low. About 10 to 11 years ago, I noticed my gums on the upper left side became puffy and started bleeding. Multiple dentists dismissed it as Periodontitis, but treatments had no effect. Over three years, the gum issue worsened, and a significant gap developed between the two teeth.

In 2019, just before my wedding, a dentist flagged the enlarging gap and urged me to seek urgent specialist attention. Due to timing, I postponed the appointment, but after returning from our honeymoon, I saw a dentist at the Indigenous Health Centre, Yulu Burri Ba. They took initial X-rays, prompting a referral for more detailed scans and biopsies. A private specialist performed a biopsy, initially suggesting a benign lesion. However, during a follow-up, I was devastated to hear it was cancer.

The diagnosis was squamous cell carcinoma (SCC). I was referred to the Maxillofacial team. The urgency was clear: surgery was scheduled for March 18. The operation lasted 11.5 hours, removing nine teeth, part of my upper jaw, a neck dissection, and a fibula graft for reconstructing my jaw. The tumour was larger than initially thought, and I received four units of blood during surgery.

Post-surgery, I faced multiple subsequent procedures, including additional surgeries for complications from implants and radiation therapy. Despite challenges, survival was the goal – and I was fortunate to be saved.

#### **KEY FACTS:**

- · No screening tests exist for head and neck cancer.
- · Early detection saves lives and enables less invasive treatment.
- Over 5,300 Australians are diagnosed annually; 70% are men.
- · Causes include tobacco, alcohol, and HPV.
- Symptoms to watch for (lasting over two to three weeks): mouth ulcers, lumps, ear pain, hoarse voice.

If you notice symptoms, seek urgent medical advice. Awareness and early detection are critical.

I am passionate about raising awareness for HANCA (Head and Neck Cancer Australia) and generating much-needed funds to support their ongoing efforts in helping patients and their families, as well as conducting research. Currently, no pre-screening can be done, and quite often, by the time Head and Neck Cancer is found, the results can be life-changing.

In November, I will be embarking on a four-day trek through the Three Capes in Tasmania to raise money and awareness. One of the first fundraisers I am hosting is a Fashion Parade on July 27 for World Head and Neck Cancer Day at the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron.

Why is my fashion parade different from others, you ask? My models are family members of head and neck cancer patients, along with one lady who is a survivor like me — and our local member.



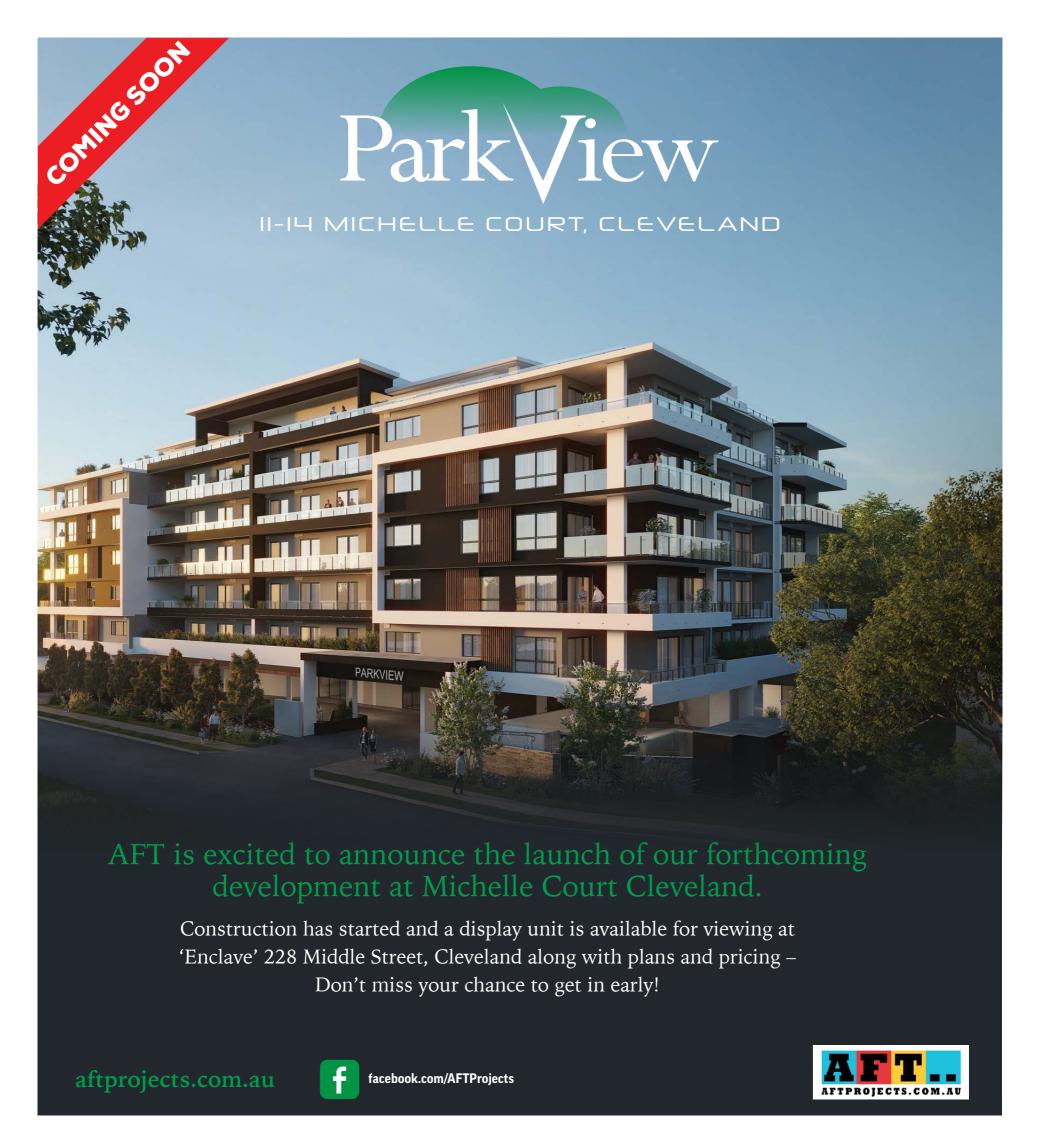

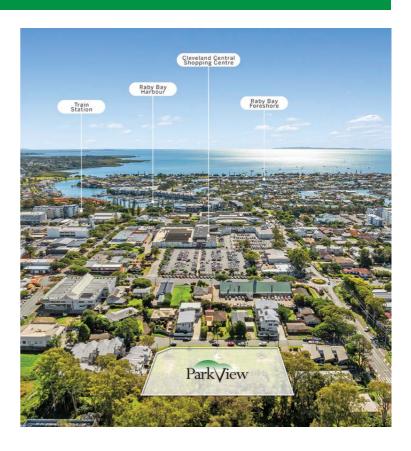

## **EDIBLE GREEN TREES IN YOUR WINTER GARDEN**

Did you eat green trees growing up? The seemingly number one hated childhood food was broccoli. I can't remember what I really thought of it as a child, but now I LOVE broccoli, Brussels sprouts (roasted in lots of oil with bacon), cauliflower (smothered in cheese or roasted with spices), and even kale, mostly, though I can't get onto the kale chips thing.

Now, why have I derailed my broccoli conversation to a bunch of other brassicas? Because they're all the same! Ok, they're not exactly the same; they have all been bred and selected over hundreds (thousands?) of years to be special in their own way, but they are all actually the same species - Brassica oleracea.

Usually, when I think of varieties of the same species, I'm thinking of different coloured flowers or maybe a slightly different growth habit. The difference in Brassica oleracea varieties is huge! They range from the tight, unopened flower head of a broccoli to the balls of leaves up the stalk of a Brussels sprout plant to the swollen base of kohlrabi!

Brassicas are a cooler climate crop, so in the subtropics, we tend to grow them in winter. Brussels sprouts are tricky because they really need a good frost to make them sweet, but lots of the other brassicas are great to put in your winter garden. I've even had fun growing cabbages! Winter is also when the pesky white cabbage butterfly is less active. Although personally, I think they look lovely flitting about the garden; they lay their eggs on brassicas, and the newly hatched caterpillars will decimate your crop in seconds! You can try fake butterflies, or use products such as DiPel® (an organic spray), but netting to prevent butterfly access is usually the most successful

If you do give Brassicas a go, don't forget the whole plant is edible. Pluck some leaves off while you wait for broccoli heads - they are great in pasta sauce, and if the caterpillars got to them and they have a few holes - who cares!



## JULY COMMUNITY UPDATE: COAST GUARD BRISBANE, QF2, MANLY

Hello again, Baysiders! Despite an unusually cold start to winter, QF2 has been kept busy with breakdowns and vessel maintenance.

On Sunday, June 8, at 22:30, we received a phone call from Brisbane Water Police activating us to attend to a 41-foot 9-tonne yacht with sail damage and a broken down engine that left them drifting at 4 knots, with a request for a tow back to Rivergate Marina from East of Moreton Island. Our crew in our rescue vessel CG22 endured a 13.5-hour trip over 120 nautical miles in choppy seas and a cold 20-knot westerly wind, towing usually being a slow process, with a typical speed of around 7 knots. The crew had to go the long way around the top of Moreton Island for the return trip due to being close to low tide, making crossing the bar too dangerous to attempt. Estimated fuel use was around 350 litres – that's nearly \$600 at \$1.70 per litre! This really brings home the benefit of having Marine Assist membership at only \$80 for a year.

As I mentioned in my last article in the June issue, you may be aware that the Queensland Government has established a new single-service marine rescue organisation, Marine Rescue Queensland (MRQ). While a few units across the state have begun the transition, no Coast Guard flotillas have yet transitioned, including QF2. That means, for now, we remain entirely reliant on the generous support of the recreational boating community to keep our vessels on the water and provide critical lifesaving services 24/7, 365 days a year.

Government funding for our operations is minimal, and programs like Marine Assist are vital to cover the substantial costs involved in maintaining and running our rescue fleet. For just \$80 per year, Marine Assist offers outstanding value to the boating community. Your membership has the following benefits:

- Ensures 100% of the towing cost is included in your membership — no further donation is expected (though always appreciated).

If you haven't renewed your membership because you believed we had transitioned to MRQ, please know that we haven't yet, and we still need your support.

We anticipate the transition to MRQ will begin sometime in late 2025 or 2026, but until that time, our ability to save lives on the water depends on your continued backing. Thank you again for your ongoing support.

## STEP BACK IN TIME AND VISIT THE GUMDALE HISTORICAL MUSEUM

The Gumdale Historical Museum was originally a tin-shingle one-room shed on a property on Greencamp Road. It had been a storage shed, a garage, a hay shed, a small animal abattoir, and a home for a Depression-era family. The shed was carefully disassembled, with each part numbered, and then reassembled at its present site. A small group of dedicated volunteers devoted a significant amount of their time and expertise to ensure that this snapshot of a past era was not lost.

The museum has been officially named Laggan House, after the family who first lived in it.

On display in the museum are items from the Depression years and earlier, through to the 1940s. One interesting item is an 1870 kerosene tin watering can, which was handmade by a gold miner in Tenterfield.

The interior of the museum displays everyday items from that era. There are too many items to list, so you need to come along for a look. We are sure you will have memories of the same types of items being used by your grandma or grandpa. The outside displays include a tool

shed, a laundry area with a copper, and a thunderbox toilet. Everything is displayed in a true-to-life setting.

Volunteers will be on-site on open days to give you a guided tour and answer any questions you may have. There is a quiz for the children where they can learn about everyday items from the past and a fantastic book for sale titled "From Saplings and Kero Tins: A Peek at Gumdale's Past."

Several times a year, one of the open days is dedicated to a special display in keeping with the era. Some of the past displays have included puzzles, games, toys, and dolls appropriate to the era; a military memorabilia display before Anzac Day; a vintage clothing display; a display of vintage and antique clocks, radios, and gramophones, and a volunteer dress-up day.

The museum is located at 737 New Cleveland Road, on the grounds of the Gumdale Progress Hall, with parking on site. Admission is \$2 for adults, \$1 for children or concessions, and \$5 for a family. The museum is open on the first Saturday of each month (except December and January) from 10:30am to 12:30pm. See you there!

## HOLDEN OUT FOR A CURE: CLASSICS TO REV IT UP FOR CHARITY

Drivers on the bayside on the morning of Sunday July 13 may notice a sudden upsurge in the number of schmick and shiny FJ and FX Holdens on the road. They'll probably be on their way to the Holden Out for a Cure All Holden Day at Cleveland Showgrounds, where close to 200 of Australia's classic cars will be on display.

Les Ross, President of the FX-FJ Holden Club of Queensland Inc., who has been involved in the club for 35 years, says that the club has a long history of fundraising for the Queensland Cancer Council.



"This event started back in the 1990s then folded for a while due to COVID and other concerns. In 2019 I thought it would be good to revive it as a one-off memorial event for several members who'd died — some from cancer — so the Redland Branch of the Cancer Council of Queensland was the obvious beneficiary," he says. "It's been running ever since and in one year at least we understand that we were the Cancer Council's biggest fundraiser."

Les says that about 200 cars are expected to enter and is hopeful of a turn up of up to 600 visitors.

"As Australia's first car Holdens attract a lot of interest," says Les, who's the proud owner of a 1962 EJ.

"The Holdens on display will range from 1948 to 2017, which was when the last Holden rolled off the production line. Some blokes may use their car as a daily run-about, but in the main they're classic special-interest cars that get a lot of love and care."

Added attractions to the cars will be food stalls, access to the Redlands Coast Museum, and a memorabilia auction to be held at midday.

"The wife of a late member has donated his collection that includes Holden jigsaw puzzles and framed prints," says Les. "We don't have a professional auctioneer, but we've organised a lot of 'spotters' and blokes who'll scream out a bit!"

## **CAMPAIGN TO KEEP CASH GAINS SUPPORT AND REWARDS SENIORS**

FROM NATIONAL SENIORS AUSTRALIA

Since its inception last year, the National Seniors Australia (NSA) Keep Cash campaign continues to gain support from thousands of Australians who want to keep cash as a viable payment option alongside cards and digital transactions.

Campaign supporters have proudly worn "Keep Cash" t-shirts and displayed "Keep Cash" stickers in a public show of support. Retailers have also come on board, displaying "We Accept Cash" stickers in windows or at point of sale.

"While NSA acknowledges the inevitability of a mostly digital society, it's important to consider the needs of those who rely on cash, particularly seniors," NSA Chief Executive Officer Chris Grice said.

"Reports show around 7% of Australians use cash for 80%+ of transactions. When retailers refuse cash, it not only inconveniences customers but can also lead to genuine hardship for those who rely on cash."

As cash use declines, so does the number of access points available to withdraw it. Since 2017, the number of bank owned ATMs across Australia

has dropped by more than 8,000 machines or almost 60%.

"ATM and bank closures impact people who are less inclined to bank online or travel to another branch. In regional areas, travelling to another branch may not be feasible. Closures need to be considered with older people in mind, to ensure they can access cash, transfer money, and pay for groceries and bills just as they always have," Mr Grice said.

"Not all seniors are comfortable using debit or credit cards, or banking online, because they're not tech savvy; they're fearful of potential scams and cash is what they've always known.

"Doing any business online comes with problems and risks. In emergency situations and during outages, when electronic systems crash, cash plays a vital role, offering security and stability. It really is a case of use it or lose it!"

"By reinforcing the importance of maintaining cash, especially for older people and others who may be less comfortable with digital alternatives, NSA continues to advocate for inclusive systems that cater to all Australians." Mr Grice said.



## WYNNUM MANLY ROTARY HELPS WESTERN QUEENSLAND FLOOD VICTIMS

Jim Byrne, a very active and involved member of the Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly, is a native of Thargomindah in far western Queensland. Jim was dismayed at the extent of the devastation caused by the recent floods and was determined to assist in whatever way he could. Another member, Kai Eberspaecher, also has business and personal connections in the area and was keen to help by giving to the community through 'virtual purchases' at local shops, the Council Flood appeal, and the Rotary Disaster Fund. Together, they are making a great contribution to the flood recovery effort.

Jim joined the project team established by the two Rotary Districts covering western Queensland to implement a three-pronged approach to a multi-phase response to this disaster:

- 1. Phase 1: Immediate Financial Assistance
- 2. Phase 2: Coordination of Essential Goods
- 3. Phase 3: Mental Health Support

Approximately 133 households were affected by this event, and the Bulloo Shire Council launched a fundraising campaign to provide immediate assistance to residents in replacing items such as clothing,

furniture, and appliances lost. The Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly made an immediate donation of \$1000 to this campaign and contributed another \$4000 to the Rotary Fund for ongoing assistance.

Cash payments to residents and Phase 2 of the response are underway. In addition, Andersen's Carpets has made a very generous donation of carpets to local businesses and is installing them. The Rotary Fund will match Andersen's donation so that they will have at least half of their flooring costs donated.

Helping businesses survive and providing residents with a helping hand will help keep the town alive.

## **BOOK REVIEW - THE WOMEN BY KRISTIN HANNAH**

#### WHAT THE EXPERTS SAID:

"Women can be heroes. When 20-year-old nursing student Frances 'Frankie' McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Coronado Island (off San Diego, California) and sheltered by her wealthy conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path."

#### **MY THOUGHTS:**

The first half of the book focuses on Frankie's time in Vietnam: the formation of life-long friendships and loves and rapidly acquiring trauma and surgical nursing expertise in impossible circumstances — "Damn it, McGrath! We don't have time for fear. You're good enough. Do it!" As an ex-nurse, I found her rapid climb to competence in the face of extreme casualties and conditions enthralling, and I really enjoyed this part of the book.

It also traces the authentic historical detail of the war – in-country and in 'the real world' – particularly as attitudes supportive of it in the USA began to change. This was all set to a 'soundtrack' of familiar '60s music, e.g. Doors, Beach Boys, Turtles, and descriptions of contemporary clothing – these may bring back memories for readers of a similar age in the '60s.

Frankie's return to real life added trauma to trauma. She had left hoping to make her family (particularly her father) and her country proud. But she was treated like a pariah, and the dissonance between her pride in 'making a real difference' and the denial from both her family and the veterans' associations from which she sought help that she'd even been to Vietnam contributed to her unravelling. (Her father had told friends Frankie had been studying in Florence for two years, and the veterans' support groups flatly stated 'there were no women in Vietnam').

Following is a very long journey of healing, interspersed with major setbacks — not unusual for thousands of vets facing abuse and denial of

their needs on their return. PTSD was not formally recognised as a distinct mental health disorder until 1980, though it began to come into use in the 1970s in response to the very large number of very damaged Vietnam vets.

The research behind this book ensures the experiences of nurses and soldiers in Vietnam are authentically recounted, however the plot twists hint at a Netflix series in the making. I would have stopped short of the final plot twist, but

for all that, I found it an enlightening and gripping read, and was pleased to hear the women's perspective on experience in Vietnam during the war and stateside. BTW, did you know the Vietnamese call the 'Vietnam War' the 'America War'?



## DELICIOUSLY CREAMY SEAFOOD MACARONI RECIPE

Here's a simple and quick macaroni recipe using fresh fish and herbs. Substitute the snapper or barramundi for salmon or chopped squid, or if seafood isn't your thing, add a handful of sliced spicy fried chorizo for a sizzling winter-warmer meal.

#### **INGREDIENTS (SERVES 4)**

- 400g dried macaroni pasta
- 350g barramundi or snapper fillets (skin off, bones removed)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 small brown onion, finely diced
- 1 cup of cooking cream
- 1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese
- The zest of 1 lemon
- The juice of 1/2 lemon
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Fresh parsley or dill, chopped to garnish



#### **METHOD**

- 1. Bring a large pot of salted water to the boil. Follow the packet directions and cook the macaroni until al dente. Drain and set aside.
- 2. While the pasta is cooking, heat one tablespoon of olive oil in a large frying pan over medium heat and add your barramundi or snapper. Cook the fish for 3 to 4 minutes on each side or until just cooked through. Flake the fish into large chunks and set it aside. Keep the frying pan handy for the next step (don't wash it yet!).
- 3. Now make the sauce. In the frying pan over medium heat, add a tablespoon of olive oil and sauté the onion for about 3 minutes, then add the garlic and cook for 1 minute more (don't let the garlic burn). Pour in the cream and bring the mixture to a gentle simmer. Stir in the parmesan, lemon zest, and juice, then season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Add the cooked macaroni and the fish to the frying pan. Stir gently to combine and warm through (about 2 minutes). Garnish with fresh herbs and extra parmesan if desired.



#### **LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO**

## **JULY FISHING IS SENSATIONAL, BUT WATCH THE WESTERLIES!**

July is one of our better months for fishing in the bay, but the only thing to watch out for is the westerly winds. Now that I've gone back to a smaller boat, I'll be keeping an eye out so I don't get into trouble.

As many of you might remember, there have been a few accidents and drownings in the past, and they nearly always happen in the winter months with small boats capsizing close to the bay islands. So, please – just because it looks flat from the land, remember you have to come back into the wind and waves on the way home. It's better to postpone a trip and be safe than risk your life and that of others.

The school mackerel should be in good numbers close in, with tailor and bonito as well, and lots of small mackerel are about this time of year. I have found over the years that if you find where they are, floating pillies gets you the bigger fish, especially off Ormiston and Wellington Point.

The cuttlefish and arrows started last month and should be in good numbers from



Ormiston to St Helena in 23 to 30-ft depth. Drifting with a jig just off the bottom with a ball sinker above the jig is the best way to catch them, and if you get inked, remember the 30 Seconds cleaner from Bunnings removes the ink in seconds. My other tip is to get yourself a \$10 stainless steel pot with a lid from Kmart to put your cuttlefish in. It doesn't stain and is easy to clean, which means less mess on your boat.

Whiting will be all over the bay from Chain Banks to Amity Banks and Fisherman's Gutter and close in off Wynnum just wide of Darcy Light.

July is also a good month for snapper and squire, and last year, the spoil grounds and Mt. Cotton Reach were producing good fish.

Rug up, keep warm, and good fishing!


