# EXPLORE QUEENSLAND'S AMBULANCE HERITAGE AT WYNNUM OPEN DAY

The Queensland Ambulance Service invites the community to step back in time at the Wynnum Ambulance Museum Open Day on 18 January 2026. Located at 33-35 Tingal Road, Wynnum, this heritage-listed building offers a fascinating glimpse into the evolution of ambulance services in Queensland, from the early 1900s to today.

Families and history enthusiasts alike will enjoy free entry to explore an impressive collection of historical ambulances, medical equipment, and photographs that showcase the dedication and progress of emergency health care for more than a century. The museum's exhibits highlight the remarkable journey of paramedics and the vital role they have played in the community.

Visitors can wander through displays that bring to life the challenges and triumphs of ambulance officers across generations. For those wanting a deeper experience, group tours of 10 or more can be booked, while smaller groups may join existing tours by contacting the museum directly.

Whether you're a local resident, a student of history, or simply curious about Queensland's emergency health legacy, this is an opportunity to connect with the past and appreciate the progress that shapes the present.

# MANLY TO HOST 2026 FINN WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS & CONCERT

FROM THE ROYAL QUEENSLAND YACHT SQUADRON

The bayside community is gearing up for one of the biggest international sporting events ever to come to Manly, with the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron (RQYS) and the Australian International Finn Association securing hosting rights for the Porsche Centre Brisbane 2026 Finn World Championships in February.

For the first time in the history of the Finn Class, which dates back to 1952, the Finn World Masters will be held in the Southern Hemisphere, right here in Manly. The Finn Gold Cup, the open world championship, will also return to RQYS for the first time in 50 years – the last time being in 1976.

Three major regattas will run across February: Australian Finn Nationals (7–12 February); Finn Gold Cup World Championships (13–19); and the Finn World Masters (20–27).

More than 500 competitors and supporters from across Australia and the world are expected to compete, bringing a welcome boost to local cafés, restaurants, shops, accommodation providers, and the broader bayside economy.

RQYS has a long and celebrated connection to Finn sailing, with a history of producing elite sailors including Olympians Ron Jenyns, John Ferguson, Jake Lilley, Brendan Casey, and Olympic medallist and coach Rafa

To share the excitement with the wider community, RQYS is hosting two major public events in Manly Village and at the Manly Harbour Boat Club, including the FINNS ROCK concert, featuring the Filthy Animals, on Saturday, February 21. With top Australian musicians, the concert is expected to sell out, bringing locals and visiting sailors together for a signature bayside celebration. Tickets will be available via Ticketek.



#### **Medicare Urgent Care Clinic NOW OPEN!**

The Carina—Carindale Medicare Urgent Care Clinic is now open at 805 Old Cleveland Road, providing free urgent care for non-life-threatening injuries and illnesses. The clinic is walk-in, with no appointment or GP referral needed. This is another way the Albanese Labor Government is delivering for residents across Bonner. High-quality healthcare close to home where all you need is your Medicare card, not your credit card.

### **Delivering for Health**

Cheaper medicines are also here, from 1
January 2026 the maximum cost of PBS
medicines will be capped at \$25. There
are also 11 fully bulk billed clinics across
Bonner, helping more people see a GP
without out-of-pocket costs. Women's
healthcare has also been strengthened,
with cheaper oral contraceptives, IUDs



and menopausal hormone therapies now available under the PBS. Together with our new urgent care clinic these changes are easing pressure on households and supporting a health system that is accessible, affordable and focused on patient care.

# **AUSTRALIA DAY DRIVE: VINTAGE AND CLASSIC CARS ON DISPLAY**

If your passion is classic old cars - or pretty well anything big with wheels - January 26th is the day to get along to Ormiston State School, where the Bayside Vehicle Restorers Club will have up to 800 vehicles lined up to look at and love.

Sponsored by RACQ Batteries, the day will feature everything from pre-1920 veterans to classic collectibles such as Ford Mustangs. Organisers are hopeful that the lineup will include standouts such as a Ferret – a military personnel carrier – and a Stanley Steamer (with a top speed of 25 kph). Cross fingers, there may even be a flyable fold-up jet...it seems the flatpack syndrome has reached everywhere!

Steve Mellish, BVRC Special Events Committee Chairman, says that diversity makes the day particularly interesting.

"Quite a few of our club members belong to other specialist clubs as well, so we get quite a variety of vehicles - trucks, motorbikes, jeeps, bubble cars, Volkswagen combies, Morrises, and all sorts of stationary steam and traction engines. No matter what comes along, it'll be a spectacular day."

Steve says the vehicles' provenance is always interesting.

"Sometimes, they're handed down through the family from grandparents, or dad might have spent 20 years or more doing it up; sometimes people buy old wrecks and restore them, top to toe. One fellow in the club has spent 30 years restoring an old Talbot; he's 93 now, and he's still driving it – as well as his early Toyota Corolla.

"My story is that I grew up with my father's old Chev in the yard, which I loved. I came home from school one afternoon and it was gone - he'd sold it. That drove me to buy my own; now I've got a 1927 Chevrolet and I love it to death."

The day isn't all self-indulgence.

"A huge raffle helps cover the cost of the day, and any profit goes to Sailability, 'freedom on the water regardless of ability', one of the charities that we support," says Steve.

Steve says that the day is open to the public from 7am.

"We'll be doing breakfast for about 1400 people, so it's a good idea



# **LOOKING AFTER YOUR PETS IN THE SUMMER HEAT**

Summer time İS well truly upon with this comes some extreme weather. consistently hot. From days, to intense sunny thunderstorms severe wind austs



and hail (as we all experienced in November and December) and tropical storms verging on cyclones (a la Alfred), Brisbane is prone to some very dramatic conditions. It is important to ensure that our pets are kept safe throughout these challenging weather events.

#### **HEAT STROKE**

Did you know that animals can suffer from heat stroke in temperatures as low as 24 degrees? Our furry friends do not have sweat glands, so they rely on panting and the availability of shade and shelter to stay cool.

Signs of heat stroke include:

- Seizures, dizziness, confusion, collapsing, staggering.
- · Lethargy, restlessness.
- High body temperature and racing heart.
- Vomiting, diarrhoea, excessive salivation.
- · Heavy panting and a change in gum colour.

How to avoid heat stroke:

- NEVER leave pets in parked cars.
- Avoid exercising your pet during the hottest part of the day.
- Do not walk pets on hot sand, concrete or hitumen
- Ensure your pet has a reliable supply of cool, clean water and access to shade and shelter.

#### STORM SAFETY

Dogs and cats may become very frightened during storms, with some animals developing a noise phobia related to the wind and thunder which often accompany summer storms.

During a storm:

- Keep your pets inside where possible during severe weather; provide a safe, quiet space to help reduce anxiety.
- Secure all gates and doors to prevent panicked animals from escaping.
- Make sure your pet is wearing a collar and is microchipped with all details up to date.
- If your pet is extremely anxious, have a chat with your vet about medication options to help reduce their stress.
- Make sure you have food, water and medication supplies to last for at least three days in the event of severe weather.

# POWER OF SMALL – WHY YOU DON'T NEED ACREAGE TO FEED A FAMILY

Green spaces significantly drive Australian home values and buyer demand, with recent research indicating they can add a premium of over 17% to house prices and help properties sell faster. This trend is driven by buyers seeking lifestyle value, quality, and liveability benefits.

These were the key findings in recent reports, such as the October 2025 *Plant Value Report* by Domain, and *Greener Spaces Better Places*, highlighting specific metrics on how greenery impacts the Australian property market.

Redlands Organic Growers Inc (ROGI) scooped a winner at their last meeting with ABC presenter from Gardening Australia, Jerry Coleby-Williams. Jerry travelled from his Wynnum home to Redlands to present to a packed room, explaining why backyard veggie gardens are now in demand and how anyone can live sustainably on an 800-square-metre block. His own 815m² block with a lowset house was the example of 'the power of small' and proof that you don't need acreage to feed a family all year round. In fact, 100m² of good soil is sufficient.

Jerry's food growing area is  $310m^2$ , and the rest is companion planting and fruit, nut, berry bushes and trees, and he recently sold enough

marmalade to pay six weeks' mortgage payments. Basil seeds provide a good predator border, as do the spider plant and amaranth leaf, noting bugs are attracted away from food plants to the companion plants.

No words were wasted getting the message across that pesticides are the gardener's enemy.

"Over the long term, pesticides can cause soil degradation by harming beneficial microorganisms, which reduces soil fertility and its ability to retain water and nutrients. This can lead to a loss of biodiversity, soil contamination, and the persistence of harmful chemical byproducts in the soil. Long-term pesticide use can also lead to pesticide-resistant pests, creating an ecological imbalance".

Wasps, while not his favourite species, do a tremendous job in removing caterpillars, flies, and aphids, so are treated with great respect.

Jerry is no stranger to Redlands, and he adds his voice to protect flora and fauna. Jerry's message in 2020 emphasised that koalas need their native food trees and shade for resting periods, as their diet is highly specialised and they cannot survive on alternative foods like bananas.

The take-home message – train the kids early with nutritious sprouts, because every meal they help grow is a daily vote for an edible system.

#### WYNNUM SOCIAL HOUSING PROJECT

There's a housing crisis in Queensland, with reports of 56,000 people now on a public housing waiting list. You may have noticed big cranes in Emsworth St in Wynnum. That's because Niclin Group are busy building 50 social housing homes that got the planning green light by the previous Miles Government. It's coming along nicely – near completion and set to open soon.

I'm proud to have fought for this worthwhile project for our community. It won't solve the housing crisis in Queensland, but it will help vulnerable Baysiders, particularly women, in desperate need of housing.



#### **CONSULTATION OPEN FOR CARINA LEAGUES BUILD**

Last month, the Carina Leagues Club announced plans to build a multi-story development at the foreshore site of the old Wynnum fish markets at 1 Fox, Wynnum.

The multi-level proposal includes, a large gaming venue (80 pokie machines), a late-night entertainment complex, high-capacity dining and rooftop areas, with the venue seeking operating hours from 7am to 4am daily.

There is no doubt this site requires suitable development, which will add to the amenity of the area and benefit our community. Whilst many residents have raised concerns about the lack of parking, noise, excessive gambling, and the size of the proposed building, the best course of action is to lodge a submission directly with Brisbane City Council via https://developmenti. brisbane.qld.gov.au.



#### **BAYSIDERS ADDED IN HAIL HARDSHIP PAYMENTS**

After I wrote to the Queensland Minister for Disaster Recovery about making Bayside residents eligible to receive Disaster Hardship Payments following November's severe hailstorms, the Bayside suburbs of Lota, Manly, Manly West, Wynnum, Wynnum West were activated for targeted Personal Hardship Assistance

The income-tested support, provided under joint Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) between the Federal Government and Queensland Government is for uninsured residents who suffered property damage from the storms and subsequent power outages. I recently raised in Parliament the heartbreaking story of Tammie Thrower, a Bayside woman who spent her final months dying of cancer while facing homelessness. Despite her family, my office and frontline services doing everything possible, no safe home was found. This is not an isolated case.

According to Micah Projects, a reported 21 people with a terminal illness died whilst homeless over the last 12 months. The youngest was 27 years of age. It's very likely there are more. With more than 56,000 Queenslanders waiting for social housing, our system is failing the most vulnerable. No one should spend their final days without dignity, security and a place to call home. We must fight for change.



# MYTHS SURROUNDING THE VALUE OF MOHS SKIN CANCER SURGERY

Is Mohs surgery better than standard plastic or reconstructive surgery? In my opinion, its use is a controversial marketing tool.

Proponents state that Mohs surgery is 'tissue sparing'; only the cancer is removed, without an additional margin of 'normal skin' being taken around the cancer, which preserves all healthy skin and keeps the surgical site as small as possible.



Mohs is not more 'tissue sparing'. It is standard practice for plastic or reconstructive surgeons to remove 'only the cancer' with an appropriate margin of 1mm for BCC and 1-2mm for squamous cancers of the skin, including deep tissue clearance. So, what is the difference? Mohs takes all day and is very expensive!

The Mohs surgeon claims to minimise the extent of the resection to make closure easier. But it is standard plastic surgical practice to draw a 1-2mm clearance of the macroscopic tumour edge, which is very obvious to the skilled eye, before undertaking any cutting. So why can't a MOHS surgeon do this?

#### Mohs:

- Increases the chance of an inadequate initial resection, which will be found when the specimen is sent for frozen section.
- A pathologist will then examine the edges for complete clearance, which takes around two hours.
   A frozen section is also not the most reliable method to examine the specimen for possible residual cancer. The path report is often incorrect due to distortion, folding and the limitations of the process itself. If formalin slides are made, this delays closure for at least 24 hours.
- Necessitates an initial dressing and delay in primary closure of the skin, sometimes overnight, increasing the risk of infection.

Skin Cancer and Melanoma:

It may also interfere with primary defect flap repair surgery.

A skilled Specialist Surgeon will achieve good cosmetic removal of the cancer within 30 minutes, resulting in early discharge without the MOHS 'razzamatazz'.

It is my view that Mohs is a very expensive gimmick, because multiple and expensive procedures are added to a simple procedure. It confers no demonstrable improvement in the cure rate for skin cancer and is time-consuming.



### Blocked Drains: A Small Problem That Can Turn Messy Fast

Blocked drains are one of those household problems that are easy to ignore until they are suddenly not. What starts as a slow sink or a strange gurgling noise can quickly turn into overflowing drains, bad smells, and water where it definitely shouldn't be.

Most blockages do not happen overnight. In kitchens, grease, oils, and food scraps slowly accumulate in pipes. Bathrooms tend to cop it from hair and soap residue. Outside, leaves, dirt, and tree roots are common causes, especially after heavy rain when stormwater systems are working overtime.

The tricky thing with blocked drains is that they rarely sort themselves out. When water cannot flow properly, pressure builds up in the pipes, which can lead to cracks, broken joints, or even sewage backing up into the home. If you notice slow drainage, ongoing blockages, unpleasant smells, or water pooling outside, it is best not to put it off. Fixing the issue early is usually quicker, cleaner, and far cheaper than dealing with an emergency later on.

Blocked drains might seem minor at first, but looking after them can save a lot of trouble and keep your home running smoothly.



# CORN & ZUCCHINI FRITTERS WITH A TANGY AVOCADO SALSA RECIPE

These fritters are an easy summer brunch option for a steamy Brissie summer. They're light, fresh, and use seasonal produce, and you don't need to run your oven in the heat!

#### **INGREDIENTS (FOR 4 SERVES)**

- 3 medium zucchinis
- 1 cup corn kernels (canned is convenient, but fresh is best)
- 2 big eggs
- ½ cup of self-raising flour, sifted
- ½ cup of grated cheese (cheddar, tasty, parmesan or use a mix)
- 2 spring onions, finely chopped
- · Salt and pepper to taste
- · A dash of olive oil for frying

#### **AVOCADO SALSA**

- 1 ripe avocado, diced
- 1 roma tomato, diced and de-seeded
- 1 small red onion, very finely chopped
- The juice of 1 lime
- Coriander leaves to garnish optional (so don't panic if it gives you the 'ick'!)
- ½ teaspoon of cayenne pepper for some spice optional
- · Salt and pepper to taste




#### **METHOD**

- 1. Using a box grater, grate the zucchini (watch your fingers!), then wrap it in a clean tea towel and squeeze out any excess water.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix the zucchini, corn, eggs, flour, cheese, and spring onions, and season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Heat a dash of olive oil in a non-stick frypan over a medium heat. Just like making pancakes, dollop circles of the mixture
- (about the size of your palm) into the pan and fry on each side for around 3 to 4 minutes, or until they're golden. Set aside, but keep the fritters warm under a tea towel (not the one you used in point 1!).
- For salsa: Gently combine the avocado, tomato, onion, lime juice, cayenne pepper and coriander (if using). Season with salt and pepper.
- Serve up the fritters while they're warm and top with the salsa.You can also add a dollop of Greek yoghurt or sour cream for extra depth of flavour.





# DROP A LINE: MORETON BAY'S SWIMMING WITH FISH THIS MONTH

#### Happy New Year to all our readers, and a happy and healthy 2026!

Well, if you have a boat, January is a good time to get out on the bay to catch a fish or two. Thousands of boats will be out this month, with many families trying to catch fresh fish for the table. Busy spots are usually the western side of the islands from Tangalooma to the Sand Hills at Moreton Island, and from Amity to One Mile, and of course, Horseshoe Bay. It will be great to see so many boats on the bay.

The fishing should be good with plenty of whiting for all. Try the Small Boat Channel, the Rous, the Sand Hills at Moreton, and Amity Banks — there will be enough for everyone. The school mackerel will not be in the hundreds, but if you put some time into having a troll between east of the Hope Banks and the entrance to the Small Boat Channel (and at the start of the Chain Banks), then you might get a couple of nice fish. Hopefully, as I write this, the spotties should also be in the bay.

The tiger squid season will have started, and as the water clears a little more, they should front up at Green Island as well as around the weed banks at the Small Boat Channel, all through the Rous and Amity Banks, and in the weed banks at Moreton Island. All these areas will be producing plenty of squid, especially an hour each side of the tide, and at dawn and dusk.

For snapper and squire and some really nice sweet lip, try around Mud Island and the Lazaret Gutter at Peel. For me, the best fishing this time of year is for whitebait at Peel and Green Islands at night. All you need to catch these tasty critters is a butterfly net and a light at the back of the boat at night.

So all in all, what we want for January is great weather and no wind, and a few great weeks on the water and lots of fun. Let's hope 2026 brings health, happiness, and plenty of fish for all.

# SSSUMMER SSSNAKE BEANSSS

We may have farewelled the year of the snake, but with the warm weather, we should be welcoming the growth of snake beans! Move over delicate French runner beans, hardcore subtropically ideal snake beans are the new favourite. They're also known as yard-long beans – and while usually they're more like 'foot-long', that still makes one snake bean worth maybe ten French beans!

While we're lucky in the subtropics and can be reasonably successful with French/green beans (Phaseolus vulgaris) over summer, they can suffer a little in the heat. Snake beans (Vigna unguiculata ssp. Sesquipedalis - how's THAT for a scientific name!), on the other hand, THRIVE in heat and humidity. They are popular in many Asian cuisines and can be blanched, stirfried or stewed. My favourite is frying them with lots of chilli and garlic and a splash of sweet soy sauce. Like French beans, pick them while they're young and tender, and twist them gently off the tip of the vine – more beans continue to develop from that growing point. The more you pick, the more that grow. Leaving

pods of any sort on a plant (and this includes peas and sweet peas) lets the seed develop and signals to the plant that its job is done and can die now! Handily, they last ok in the fridge for a few days, so pick, pick, pick!

You are unlikely to find snake bean seedlings for sale, and at any rate, they are happier grown from seed. Check online seed retailers, or if you're lucky, you might find a pack of Mr Fothergill's in your local nursery. You can get dwarf and red/ purple varieties, but I think the regular green ones are the most successful. Sow seeds now, and you'll still have time for a crop before the weather cools. Push the seeds a centimetre or two into the soil, water in, and don't water again until they have germinated (to prevent the seeds from rotting). Snake beans are enthusiastic climbers, so they need a good-sized trellis, but they aren't the kind of climber that's going to pull half your fence down, so don't fret. Mine are manageable in the veggie patch with a 1.8m climbing frame and two rickety wooden stakes.

# A BOOK REVIEW – *CONVENIENCE STORE WOMAN* BY SAYAKA MURATA

#### WHAT THE EXPERTS SAID:

"Not all novel titles manage so very literally to describe the contents, but this one — unapologetically deadpan yet enticingly comic — absolutely does.

"Keiko has been a worry to her family all her life, bullied and friendless, her behaviour sometimes even chilling...Her salvation appears when, aged 18, she secures a job at the local convenience store and, paying conscientious attention to the training video, realises 'it was the first time anyone had ever taught me how to accomplish a normal facial expression and manner of speech'... Now part of the 'machine of society', she reckons she's at long last 'pulled off being a 'person'.

"But now Keiko is 36 years old and her family still isn't happy. Concerned that she's hurtling towards a childless middle age in a dead-end job, they hanker to 'fix' her." *The Guardian*.

#### **MY THOUGHTS:**

This is a quick read, and I found the main character, Keiko, intriguing, if not the story itself!

A couple of anecdotes from Keiko's childhood show her as logical in the extreme, and lacking the ability to empathise with the emotional reactions of others. On finding a dead bird in a park, while other children mourn it, she wants to take it home and cook it — like yakitori. When two boys are fighting in school and the crowd yells, "someone stop them", Keiko grabs a shovel and hits one over the head — the quickest way to stop them. While she intellectually knows (from her family's reactions) she has done something wrong, she doesn't understand why it's wrong.

The convenience store's operational manual provides a very detailed prescription for Keiko to function — one that isn't available in other jobs or in life (apart from her sister's occasional help with a script to manage awkward social interactions). So she stays there for 18 years, happy with her routines and surroundings, much to the concern of her family and society that she will be a failure as a woman.

Constantly under pressure to conform, Keiko mimics and mirrors the behaviours and language styles of her convenience store colleagues. "My present self is formed almost completely of the people around me. I am currently made up of 30% Mrs. Izumi, 30% Sugawara, 20% the manager, and the rest absorbed from my past colleagues... I think the same goes for most people."

Fitting in is a matter of survival. Following the dismissal of another

convenience store worker, Keiko reflects, "...If I ever became a foreign object, I'd no doubt be eliminated in much the same way...so that's why I need to be cured". Keiko takes some desperate measures to enable her to fit, and thus lift the pressure, including her involvement with Shiraha — a totally obnoxious and shallow character, who was very uninteresting in my opinion.



The reactions of my book club friends to the book and particularly Keiko were diverse in the extreme. Some found her charming and simple, some wondered if neurodivergence explained some of her behaviours, others felt she was psychopathic, pointing to her seeing herself as machine-like, not sure how to be human. (Please note, none of us are experts in psychology or psychiatry.)

Most were pleased we had read the book as it made for an interesting discussion, but only one found it thoroughly enjoyable. Your thoughts?

# HAILSTORM HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE FOR WYNNUM-MANLY RESIDENTS

Residents in Wynnum, Wynnum West, Manly, Manly West, Lota, Wakerley, and Gumdale are among those eligible for targeted hardship assistance following November's destructive hailstorm. The support, delivered under the joint Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA), is designed to help uninsured households recover from property damage and service disruptions.

The program offers three key measures:

- Structural Assistance Grants up to \$80,000 for uninsured, income-tested owner-occupiers to repair or replace damaged homes
- Essential Household Contents Grants income-tested assistance for those who are uninsured of up to \$1,765 for individuals and up to \$5,300 for families to replace vital items such as whitegoods.
- Essential Services Safety and Reconnection Scheme –
  up to \$5,000 per household (income-tested) for uninsured
  homeowners to restore electricity, gas, water or sewerage.

Federal Member for Bonner Kara Cook MP said many bayside families were among the hardest hit, with hailstones the size of golf balls damaging homes and cars. "These payments will be a helping hand for uninsured local families who need to undertake repairs and reconnection work," Ms Cook said.

She emphasised that severe weather events are becoming more frequent and intense, and that governments must match that intensity with recovery support. "We know the importance of getting people through tough times and will continue working with all levels of government to ensure recovery needs are met," she added.

Residents can check eligibility and apply via www.disaster.qld.gov. au or call the 24/7 Community Recovery Hotline on 1800 173 349.

This assistance aims to ensure Wynnum-Manly locals have the resources to rebuild, reconnect, and recover from one of the region's most damaging hailstorms in recent memory.
