### REDLAND RHAPSODY HITS A HIGH NOTE ON THE WORLD STAGE

The voices of Redland Rhapsody Chorus are soaring higher than ever, carrying their harmony from the Redland Performing Arts Centre all the way to the world stage.

Fresh from Ohio, USA, the talented women's a cappella group proudly brought home third place in the prestigious Sweet Adelines International Harmony Classic (AA Division). Even more impressive, they became one of only three Australian choruses ever to break the 1200 point barrier – a milestone that cements their place in history.

Redland City Mayor Jos Mitchell was quick to applaud the achievement, calling it "a stunning and well deserved result". The chorus had already proven its strength earlier in the year by winning the 2024 Sweet Adelines Region 34 Championship, which earned them the chance to compete internationally.

Looking ahead, Redland Rhapsody Chorus has been named a Program Partner in the Redlands Arts Partnership Program (RAPP) for 2026. This initiative, supported by Redland City Council and RPAC, will provide tailored opportunities to help the chorus grow creatively and connect even more deeply with the local community.

As Mayor Mitchell put it, "We can't wait to see, and hear, the harmony they bring – both on stage and in our Redlands Coast community".

The RAPP program includes two tiers: long term Companies in Residence, and Program Partners, such as Redland Rhapsody Chorus, who are supported in delivering projects and strengthening their sustainability. With fellow partners including Redland Sinfonia, Brisbane Excelsior Band, and Theatre Redlands, the future of arts on the Redlands Coast is looking bright – and full of song!

If your passion is classic old cars - or pretty well anything big with wheels - January 26th is the day to get along to Ormiston State School, where the Bayside Vehicle Restorers Club will have up to 800 vehicles lined up to look at and love.

Sponsored by RACQ Batteries, the day will feature everything from pre-1920 veterans to classic collectibles such as Ford Mustangs. Organisers are hopeful that the lineup will include standouts such as a Ferret – a military personnel carrier – and a Stanley Steamer (with a top speed of 25 kph). Cross fingers, there may even be a flyable fold-up jet...it seems the flatpack syndrome has reached everywhere!

Steve Mellish, BVRC Special Events Committee Chairman, says that diversity makes the day particularly interesting

"Quite a few of our club members belong to other specialist clubs as well, so we get quite a variety of vehicles - trucks, motorbikes, jeeps, bubble cars, Volkswagen combies, Morrises, and all sorts of stationary steam and traction engines. No matter what comes along, it'll be a spectacular day."

Steve says the vehicles' provenance is always interesting.

"Sometimes, they're handed down through the family from grandparents, or dad might have spent 20 years or more doing it up; sometimes people buy old wrecks and restore them, top to toe. One fellow in the club has spent 30 years restoring an old Talbot; he's 93 now, and he's still driving it – as well as his early Toyota Corolla.

"My story is that I grew up with my father's old Chev in the yard, which I loved. I came home from school one afternoon and it was gone - he'd sold it. That drove me to buy my own; now I've got a 1927 Chevrolet and I love it to death."



New Year's resolutions are reputed to have started in Babylon 4,000 years ago at crop planting time, traditionally including intentions of renewing loyalty to the king, paying debts and returning things you'd borrowed – like your neighbour's wheelbarrow.

Julius Caesar shifted the New Year to January in honour of Janus, the two-faced deity of transition who looked forward and backward, and in the 18th century, John Wesley strove to subdue the usually riotous celebrations into Methodist sobriety and a determination to be better people in the coming year.

Our resolutions are probably the product of things that have been chewing at us for a while; the need to lose weight, to exercise more, to quit smoking, to reduce alcohol consumption, to take up a mind-improving hobby...The opportunities are numerous, but we have to really want change to achieve them, and if we understand our motivation for seeking change, we're less likely to revert to old habits that we're comfortable with.

Psychologists have pointed out that many resolutions fail (about 90% is one assessment), because they're too big or there are too many of them, and that we may have better luck if we make them a series of smaller steps rather than an indigestible chunk.

So what are some of our neighbours intending for the brave new year?

**Lorraine, Capalaba:** No resolutions because I wouldn't keep them, but I do make little lists of parts of my life — health, creativity, career — that need attention in the coming year.

**Jim, Cleveland:** *I don't make them and people I know who do either break them or forget them – I think they're an urban myth.*

So maybe now is a good time for reflection – and for returning that wheelbarrow to the neighbour.

For the Wedding Trail showcase day, we have stylists go in and decorate the venues so that visitors can see what it would look like for a real wedding," she says.



## **LOOKING AFTER YOUR PETS IN THE SUMMER HEAT**

Summer time is well and truly upon us, and with this comes some extreme weather. From consistently hot, sunny days, to intense thunderstorms with severe wind gusts and hail (as we all experienced in November





and December) and tropical storms verging on cyclones (a la Alfred), Brisbane is prone to some very dramatic conditions. It is important to ensure that our pets are kept safe throughout these challenging weather events.

#### **HEAT STROKE**

Did you know that animals can suffer from heat stroke in temperatures as low as 24 degrees? Our furry friends do not have sweat glands, so they rely on panting and the availability of shade and shelter to stay cool.

Signs of heat stroke include:

- Seizures, dizziness, confusion, collapsing, staggering.
- · Lethargy, restlessness.
- · High body temperature and racing heart.
- · Vomiting, diarrhoea, excessive salivation.
- · Heavy panting and a change in gum colour.

How to avoid heat stroke:

- NEVER leave pets in parked cars.
- Avoid exercising your pet during the hottest part of the day.
- Do not walk pets on hot sand, concrete or
  hitumen
- Ensure your pet has a reliable supply of cool, clean water and access to shade and shelter.

### STORM SAFETY

Dogs and cats may become very frightened during storms, with some animals developing a noise phobia related to the wind and thunder which often accompany summer storms.

During a storm:

- Keep your pets inside where possible during severe weather; provide a safe, quiet space to help reduce anxiety.
- Secure all gates and doors to prevent panicked animals from escaping.
- Make sure your pet is wearing a collar and is microchipped with all details up to date.
- If your pet is extremely anxious, have a chat with your vet about medication options to help reduce their stress.
- Make sure you have food, water and medication supplies to last for at least three days in the event of severe weather.



### SHOW 'N' SHARE INITIATIVE BRINGS THE MUSEUM TO THE PEOPLE

Every month, the volunteers from the Redlands Coast Museum venture out of their display cabinets and into the heart of the community – not to show artefacts behind glass, but to bring them alive in the hands of residents of aged-care homes. The museum's Show 'n' Share program has become a highlight at local residential and respite centres, where a box of curious historical items is placed on a table, and memories begin to stir.

Armed with a themed loan-kit of artefacts (sometimes with a "challenge object" whose use is puzzling), the volunteers introduce the items and a short story. Then they sit back and watch: within minutes, a resident will lean forward, eyes lighting up, and say: "Oh yes — I remember that!" Moments later, the room is alive with recollections of childhood jobs, local places, family rituals and long-forgotten pastimes.

Memory-triggering in this way is much more than a pleasant social time. Across Australia, the condition of dementia is growing in prevalence and significance: latest data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics shows that in 2024, dementia (including Alzheimer's disease) was the leading cause of death in Australia, accounting for 9.4 per cent of all deaths — over 17,500 lives.¹ The burden is particularly heavy among older age groups, with around 95 per cent of dementia-related deaths occurring in people aged over 75.²

Research confirms that the simple act of handling familiar objects can help people living with dementia and memory loss to reconnect with their identity, share stories, and engage socially. A scoping review of "object-handling" interventions found positive effects on well-being, mood and social inclusion in people with dementia.<sup>3</sup>

The Show 'n' Share sessions embrace that approach. Volunteers present an unfamiliar object, invite comments, listen, and ask a gentle question: "Have you seen one of these before?" Soon someone exclaims, "We used these on the farm when I was a boy!" or "My mum had one just like that in her kitchen." What follows is a cascade of storytelling.

For the volunteers, it is deeply rewarding. They bring the museum to people rather than waiting for people to come to the museum, and in doing so brighten a day, spark a conversation, and validate lives. For residents, it is an opportunity to reclaim a part of their past in the present, share it with others, and feel seen. It's a chance for the museum to share the real people and the real stories with the community.

In a world where dementia is a growing challenge, initiatives like Show 'n' Share remind us of the power of memory, connection and community. The museum's monthly visits underscore the simple truth that objects carry stories — and stories carry us.

### MAKE PROPER BATTERY DISPOSAL YOUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION

Redlands Coast, we need your help to prevent fires from occurring as a result of incorrect battery disposal in household waste and recycling bins.

Across the past 12 months, a total of six battery fires were detected in Council's collection trucks, with a further two occurring at Recycling and Waste Centres.

This is putting our waste truck drivers, waste facility staff and the broader Redlands Coast community at risk.

It is also costly, with fires potentially resulting in damage to waste trucks and other waste and recycling infrastructure.

Compaction, or contact with a heat or water source, is all it takes for a lithium-ion battery to catch fire or explode.

We don't want to see someone getting injured – or worse – as a result of a battery being thrown away in a household waste or recycling bin.

That's why we're asking the community to make proper battery disposal part of their New Year's resolution for 2026.

By taking your used household batteries to dedicated drop-off points at locations such as Aldi, Woolworths, Coles, Bunnings and Battery World, you can do your part in keeping the community safe.

Residents can check their nearest battery drop-off locations on the Recycle Mate app or through the B-cycle website.

It also pays to be mindful that batteries can be found in everyday household items such as electric toothbrushes, children's toys, drills, laptops, vapes, vacuums and light-up decorations used for festive celebrations.

While waste trucks are equipped with cameras to detect incorrectly disposed items, batteries can be hard to spot when they become mixed up with other items.

Our waste truck drivers and workers at waste and recycling facilities deserve a safe working environment – and we can all contribute to this by keeping batteries out of bins.

Let's aim for a fire-free 2026.

### **INGENUITY IN MOTION: THE CREATIONS OF COR MARCUS**

Cor Marcus is a born inventor/maker/fixer of machines.

"I was fiddling with machines from the day I could walk," Cor says. "I was 12 years old when I built my first motorbike."

Cor went on to build a speedway race car, the Cor Marc Special, which won 17 of its 23 races. He then built a miniature version for his three-year-old son, as well as a three-wheeler motorbike and sidecar. For a disabled friend, he created a motorised bicycle that could go up stairs, and a bicycle-powered trishaw that can power two wheelchairs at 14km/hr.

One of Cor's more outrageous creations is a three-person bicycle; the front and rear riders pedal forwards, as in a tandem bike; the rider in the middle pedals backwards, propelling the bike to speeds of 50km/hr. His can crusher is slower, but pleasingly effective.

"At the Mt Gravatt Show, a fellow had a cancrushing machine that was steam engine driven. I asked if I could pinch a few of his ideas, and he said, 'Mate, use anything you like'. A neighbour gave me her exercise bike and using the principle of a push-along toy car, I made a bicycle-powered can crusher."

Cor, a qualified motor mechanic, machinist and welder, was born into circumstances that encouraged his inventive turn of mind.

"My father was an interstate truck driver and a self-taught mechanic," he says. "When he was home at weekends, he worked on things, and I learned a lot from him. I served my apprenticeship in post-war Holland; the war had severely reduced Holland's resources, so we had to improvise, using German car parts to repair English cars, things like that. I learned a lot about welding techniques and now I have five welders of my own."

Cor's tools, equipment and imagination are truly impressive, in both range and meticulous organisation – and they're put to good use.

"After losing power in the recent cyclone, a neighbour borrowed my generator to run her fridge; it was fine but really noisy. That gave me an idea. I thought, hang on, they've got hybrid cars, why not build a hybrid generator?"

The result was an arrangement that links a battery to a car alternator and a solar panel with a petrol motor as backup for the solar panel. Silently.

Perhaps the best-known of Cor's restorations is the vintage dentist chair on display at the Redlands Coast Museum.

"When I joined the Redlands Museum, Norm Dean found that I like to restore things, so he asked me to repair the internal cracks in the cast iron frame of the dentist chair. I took it home, and while I was working on it, listening to the ABC, a program

came on about the chair! The job's still holding up; I had to reinforce it using cup-head screws and fibreglass, and now you can't even see the cracks."

Cor's next project is still under wraps – watch this space!

### STRAP YOURSELF IN BEFORE 360 ALLSTARS BLOWS YOU AWAY!

BMX, basketball, breakdancing, acrobatics, drumming, and more – the international smash hit *360 ALLSTARS* is back at RPAC!

This is an adrenaline rush of physical theatre meets top-shelf street culture meets high intensity sports, supported and driven by spectacular lighting and a live soundtrack. The drummer keeping the pulse is Gene Peterson, who's also the director, producer, composer, and ringmaster of this high-energy urban circus.

"We've reinvented a traditional stereotype circus by replacing the conventional disciplines with contemporary street styles, so instead of acrobats we have break dancers, instead of a juggler we have a basketball freestyler, instead of a unicyclist we have a BMX rider — everything's been given a twist from the street." Gene says.

"It really is the street meets the elite because we've headhunted the world's best from each of those disciplines — world champions, world record holders, award-winning artists and athletes in a dream team cast."

Gene says the concept was born of childlike enthusiasm and the question of how many types of awesome he could get on one stage. The structure grew from building relationships across the different disciplines, finding which motions married up between a BMXer and a breakdancer, or between a cyr wheel artist and a basketball freestyler, and from trying to find natural collaborations and working as a squad. Then there's the theatricality added by the production values, with brilliant lighting, an incredible video design, and a



stunning live soundtrack performed by award-winning musicians.

I'm excited to be back at work on Redlands Coast for a brand-new year. If you're reading this while still enjoying the summer holidays, I'm secretly a little jealous.

Now is a fantastic time of year to soak up and explore nature. Although my career has always centred around wildlife, I still pinch myself when I spot something furry, feathered, spikey, or scaley in its natural habitat. With birds, there are more than 350 species on Redlands Coast — some choose to holiday here, while many are permanent residents.

The pelican is a personal feathered favourite of mine. I can't help but be amazed by this big bird with the big bill. They always look impeccable thanks to a special oil gland at the base of the tail. Pelicans preen their feathers with oil to keep them not just healthy, but waterproof. I know I'm not the only one to love pelicans, they're cool!

Some creatures aren't so popular – like mozzies! Yep, mosquitoes are a part of life particularly during summer. On a positive note, they are pollinators and part of nature's food chain. But I totally get it, that's

cold comfort when you become the victim.

Right now, Redland City Council's year-round mosquito management program is in full swing, with regular treatments that are not only effective but safe for us, other animals, and the environment.

A few fun mozzie facts to sink your teeth into...

- Female mosquitoes are responsible for biting humans and other animals.
- Heat sensors around the mouth detect warm blood inside our body.
- A mozzie can drink up to three times its body weight in blood.
- They can sniff out humans from the carbon dioxide in our breath.
- The bumps that appear on our skin from a bite is from mozzie saliva.

This mozzie season, remember to play your part at home. Keep in mind they only need a small amount of water to breed, so let's not give them the opportunity – empty any standing water from pot plant

### POWER OF SMALL - WHY YOU DON'T NEED ACREAGE TO FEED A FAMILY

Green spaces significantly drive Australian home values and buyer demand, with recent research indicating they can add a premium of over 17% to house prices and help properties sell faster. This trend is driven by buyers seeking lifestyle value, quality, and liveability benefits.

These were the key findings in recent reports, such as the October 2025 *Plant Value Report* by Domain, and *Greener Spaces Better Places*, highlighting specific metrics on how greenery impacts the Australian property market.

Redlands Organic Growers Inc (ROGI) scooped a winner at their last meeting with ABC presenter from Gardening Australia, Jerry Coleby-Williams. Jerry travelled from his Wynnum home to Redlands to present to a packed room, explaining why backyard veggie gardens are now in demand and how anyone can live sustainably on an 800-square-metre block. His own 815m² block with a lowset house was the example of 'the power of small' and proof that you don't need acreage to feed a family all year round. In fact, 100m² of good soil is sufficient.

Jerry's food growing area is 310m<sup>2</sup>, and the rest is companion planting and fruit, nut, berry bushes and trees, and he recently sold enough

marmalade to pay six weeks' mortgage payments. Basil seeds provide a good predator border, as do the spider plant and amaranth leaf, noting bugs are attracted away from food plants to the companion plants.

No words were wasted getting the message across that pesticides are the gardener's enemy.

"Over the long term, pesticides can cause soil degradation by harming beneficial microorganisms, which reduces soil fertility and its ability to retain water and nutrients. This can lead to a loss of biodiversity, soil contamination, and the persistence of harmful chemical byproducts in the soil. Long-term pesticide use can also lead to pesticide-resistant pests, creating an ecological imbalance."

Wasps, while not his favourite species, do a tremendous job in removing caterpillars, flies, and aphids, so are treated with great respect.

Jerry is no stranger to Redlands, and he adds his voice to protect flora and fauna. Jerry's message in 2020 emphasised that koalas need their native food trees and shade for resting periods, as their diet is highly specialised and they cannot survive on alternative foods like bananas.

The take-home message — train the kids early with nutritious sprouts, because every meal they help grow is a daily vote for an edible system.

### **ROCK CHOIR IS BACK IN 2026 – WILL YOU BE PART OF IT?**

"I've been calling the Redlands Coast the 'Arts Coast' because it has such a vibrant arts community and is so supportive of the arts."

Jonathon Welch should know; *Play It Forward*, his vision and legacy for the future of inclusive arts programs, has for years been drawing people in for massed choir experiences, and in February, the second Rock Choir, with support from RPAC and Redland City Council, will be launched in the Redlands.

Jonathon, a professional performer, choir master, musician, singer, and community motivator, says that the Rock Choir is the fourth iteration of the massed-choir projects in the Redlands.

"Each year, we've had nearly 200 singers from the Redlands community and surrounding areas coming to the choirs to enjoy the experience of singing and learning together. Over the years, we've developed a core of singers who keep coming back for each of the projects; about two-thirds of the singers are regulars. The choir has built a musical village, a community within a community and some really lovely friendships have developed.

"The Greatest Show choir performed recently at QPAC with the addition of singers from the Fraser Coast, Maryborough, the Darling Downs and Toowoomba. The choir performed to a packed QPAC concert hall, showcasing what's happening here in the Redlands."


Jonathon says that people are attracted through their interest in various musical styles.

"This is one for the rockers, so we'll be working on classics from INXS, AC/DC, R.E.M., Pink Floyd, Creedence Clearwater, Coldplay, Bon Jovi and Queen. The arrangements are adaptations of classic songs, and we provide rehearsal tracks for those who can't read music."

All the *Play It Forward* choirs are un-auditioned; Jonathon works with whoever turns up.

"Once they're in there's an enormous amount of training — 60 hours of rehearsal over three months," he says. "We try to give everybody the tools and the skills to sing in a choir, which is quite different from singing solo or in a small group. I work on building a choral sound, and it's very exciting to hear the improvement in the quality and standard of singing now that we have three years of skill and training. I say to the singers, give yourself time."

The choir will be joined by special guest soloist Ellen Reed (2016 *The Voice* finalist). The performances are in May; rehearsals begin early February on Thursday evenings at the Donald Simpson Centre. Registering someone as a singer could be a wonderful solution to a Christmas – or Mother's Day – gift dilemma. ### CORN & ZUCCHINI FRITTERS WITH A TANGY AVOCADO SALSA RECIPE

These fritters are an easy summer brunch option for a steamy Brissie summer. They're light, fresh, and use seasonal produce, and you don't need to run your oven in the heat!

### **INGREDIENTS (FOR 4 SERVES)**

- 3 medium zucchinis
- 1 cup corn kernels (canned is convenient, but fresh is best)
- 2 big eggs
- ½ cup of self-raising flour, sifted
- ½ cup of grated cheese (cheddar, tasty, parmesan or use a mix)
- 2 spring onions, finely chopped
- · Salt and pepper to taste
- · A dash of olive oil for frying

### **AVOCADO SALSA**

- 1 ripe avocado, diced
- 1 roma tomato, diced and de-seeded
- 1 small red onion, very finely chopped
- The juice of 1 lime
- Coriander leaves to garnish optional (so don't panic if it gives you the 'ick'!)
- ½ teaspoon of cayenne pepper for some spice optional
- Salt and pepper to taste



### **METHOD**

- 1. Using a box grater, grate the zucchini (watch your fingers!), then wrap it in a clean tea towel and squeeze out any excess water.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix the zucchini, corn, eggs, flour, cheese, and spring onions, and season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Heat a dash of olive oil in a non-stick frypan over a medium heat. Just like making pancakes, dollop circles of the mixture
- (about the size of your palm) into the pan and fry on each side for around 3 to 4 minutes, or until they're golden. Set aside, but keep the fritters warm under a tea towel (not the one you used in point 1!).
- For salsa: Gently combine the avocado, tomato, onion, lime juice, cayenne pepper and coriander (if using). Season with salt and pepper.
- Serve up the fritters while they're warm and top with the salsa.You can also add a dollop of Greek yoghurt or sour cream for extra depth of flavour.

#### WHAT THE EXPERTS SAID:

"Not all novel titles manage so very literally to describe the contents, but this one - unapologetically deadpan yet enticingly comic - absolutely does.

"Keiko has been a worry to her family all her life, bullied and friendless, her behaviour sometimes even chilling...Her salvation appears when, aged 18, she secures a job at the local convenience store and, paying conscientious attention to the training video, realises 'it was the first time anyone had ever taught me how to accomplish a normal facial expression and manner of speech'... Now part of the 'machine of society', she reckons she's at long last 'pulled off being a 'person'.

"But now Keiko is 36 years old and her family still isn't happy. Concerned that she's hurtling towards a childless middle age in a dead-end job, they hanker to 'fix' her." The Guardian.

#### **MY THOUGHTS:**

This is a quick read, and I found the main character, Keiko, intriguing, if not the story itself!

A couple of anecdotes from Keiko's childhood show her as logical in the extreme, and lacking the ability to empathise with the emotional reactions of others. On finding a dead bird in a park, while other children mourn it, she wants to take it home and cook it – like yakitori. When two boys are fighting in school and the crowd yells, "someone stop them", Keiko grabs a shovel and hits one over the head – the quickest way to stop them. While she intellectually knows (from her family's reactions) she has done something wrong, she doesn't understand why it's wrong.

The convenience store's operational manual provides a very detailed prescription for Keiko to function – one that isn't available in other jobs or in life (apart from her sister's occasional help with a script to manage awkward social interactions). So she stays there for 18 years, happy with her routines and surroundings, much to the concern of her family and society that she will be a failure as a woman

Constantly under pressure to conform, Keiko mimics and mirrors the behaviours and language styles of her convenience store colleagues. "My present self is formed almost completely of the people around me.

I am currently made up of 30% Mrs. Izumi, 30% Sugawara, 20% the manager, and the rest absorbed from my past colleagues... I think the same goes for most people."

Fitting in is a matter of survival. Following the dismissal of another convenience store worker, Keiko reflects, "...If I ever became a foreign object, I'd no doubt be eliminated in much the same way... so that's why I need to be cured". Keiko takes some desperate measures to enable her to fit, and thus lift the pressure, including her involvement with Shiraha – a totally obnoxious and shallow character, who was very uninteresting in my opinion.

### CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING TIPS

If your child is withdrawn, having meltdowns, struggling to regulate their emotions, or having trouble sleeping, their overall health may need some extra attention. Listen to your intuition – the earlier kids and teens get help for their mental wellbeing, the better their long-term outcomes as adults.

#### **Neurotransmitter Function.**

Neurotransmitters are the brain's messengers; they communicate our feelings and emotional responses.

- Dopamine gives us that rush of joy and motivation when we achieve something. If we're not feeling any pleasure or drive, dopamine might be low.
- Serotonin supports happiness and good sleep.
   One simple way to boost serotonin is by getting morning sunlight.
- GABA is the calming neurotransmitter. Without balanced levels, we can feel more anxious or restless.

Neurotransmitters are built from micronutrients-vitamins and minerals that act like Lego blocks for the brain. So, we need a nutrient-rich diet to make sure we're feeding the brain what it needs. We also need to keep the pathways free from neurotoxins and inflammation.

One essential pathway in the brain for neurotransmitter production is called the methylation pathway.

It relies on:

- Folate from leafy green vegetables
- Vitamin B12 from red meat

Important nutrients include vitamin B6, zinc, and magnesium.

Without these co-factors, the wheels get stuck and the pathway slows down, leading to low mood, irritability, sensory issues and more.



### DROP A LINE: MORETON BAY'S SWIMMING WITH FISH THIS MONTH

#### Happy New Year to all our readers, and a happy and healthy 2026!

Well, if you have a boat, January is a good time to get out on the bay to catch a fish or two. Thousands of boats will be out this month, with many families trying to catch fresh fish for the table. Busy spots are usually the western side of the islands from Tangalooma to the Sand Hills at Moreton Island, and from Amity to One Mile, and of course, Horseshoe Bay. It will be great to see so many boats on the bay.

The fishing should be good with plenty of whiting for all. Try the Small Boat Channel, the Rous, the Sand Hills at Moreton, and Amity Banks — there will be enough for everyone. The school mackerel will not be in the hundreds, but if you put some time into having a troll between east of the Hope Banks and the entrance to the Small Boat Channel (and at the start of the Chain Banks), then you might get a couple of nice fish. Hopefully, as I write this, the spotties should also be in the bay.

The tiger squid season will have started, and as the water clears a little more, they should front up at Green Island as well as around the weed banks at the Small Boat Channel, all through the Rous and Amity Banks, and in the weed banks at Moreton Island. All these areas will be producing plenty of squid, especially an hour each side of the tide, and at dawn and dusk.

For snapper and squire and some really nice sweet lip, try around Mud Island and the Lazaret Gutter at Peel. For me, the best fishing this time of year is for whitebait at Peel and Green Islands at night. All you need to catch these tasty critters is a butterfly net and a light at the back of the boat at night.

So all in all, what we want for January is great weather and no wind, and a few great weeks on the water and lots of fun. Let's hope 2026 brings health, happiness, and plenty of fish for all.

### **LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT**

### **SSSUMMER SSSNAKE BEANSSS**

We may have farewelled the year of the snake, but with the warm weather, we should be welcoming the growth of snake beans! Move over delicate French runner beans, hardcore subtropically ideal snake beans are the new favourite. They're also known as yard-long beans — and while usually they're more like 'foot-long', that still makes one snake bean worth maybe ten French beans!

While we're lucky in the subtropics and can be reasonably successful with French/green beans (*Phaseolus vulgaris*) over summer, they can suffer a little in the heat. Snake beans (*Vigna unguiculata ssp. Sesquipedalis* – how's THAT for a scientific name!), on the other hand, THRIVE in heat and humidity. They are popular in many Asian cuisines and can be blanched, stir-fried or stewed. My favourite is frying them with lots of chilli and garlic and a splash of sweet soy sauce. Like French beans, pick them while they're young and tender, and twist them gently off the tip of the vine – more beans continue to develop from that growing point. The more you pick, the more that grow. Leaving pods of any sort on a plant (and this includes peas and sweet peas) lets the seed develop and signals to the plant that its job is done and can die now! Handily, they last ok in the fridge for a few days, so pick, pick, pick!

You are unlikely to find snake bean seedlings for sale, and at any rate, they are happier grown from seed. Check online seed retailers, or if you're lucky, you might find a pack of Mr Fothergill's in your local nursery. You can get dwarf and red/purple varieties, but I think the regular green ones are the most successful. Sow seeds now, and you'll still have time for a crop before the weather cools. Push





the seeds a centimetre or two into the soil, water in, and don't water again until they have germinated (to prevent the seeds from rotting). Snake beans are enthusiastic climbers, so they need a good-sized trellis, but they aren't the kind of climber that's going to pull half your fence down, so don't fret. Mine are manageable in the veggie patch with a 1.8m climbing frame and two rickety wooden stakes.

After an attempt at retirement, he came back into the industry as a trainer and specialist strategic planner.

"Our major aim is to get more people on the water in more ways, more often, as racers or on the safety boats or just sailing for enjoyment. Establishing a strategic plan for the club triggered an approach from a group of paddlers who have found a new home. There are similar opportunities on the table... watch this space!"

The club already has a wide-ranging program of in-house and interclub race meets, special programs for young and novice sailors, single- and multi-hull events, keelboat racing, paddlers, kite/ windsurfers, and soon events for sailors with disabilities. Daniel Fitzgibbon OAM, a Paralympian multi-medallist, recently sought out Steve to offer the use of his boat and experience to train sailors with mental disability or mobility impairments. With the Olympics looming, excitement levels are rising, and there will be Cleveland Yacht Club members working as race officials. Steve says that it makes good sense for the community to get as much use from the fully-owned facility as possible, and having the club in constant use secures the future of the 121-year-old club.

Even after five years as Commodore, Steve's passion for the club is as intense as it ever was, something he says is made easier by having a supportive and stable committee and an incredibly

dedicated group of volunteers and members.

"It's not just about the competition sport side of things, it's about getting as many people as possible on the bay, connecting with nature and releasing all those stresses. It's about inclusivity; families and friends sail together, train together, and celebrate together, reinforcing our identity as a club where people belong."

### The Strength of Simplicity

As a professional financial planner, I get to hear all kinds of ideas and strategies for building wealth. One of the amazing things about seeing a financial planner is being able to receive objective outside feedback. I'm not here to bolster my client's feelings. In fact, one of the primary obligations I have is to be frank and fair to each of my clients. This means that if a client has a bad investment idea, it's part of my role to talk through why.

Don't get me wrong — a lot of the time, if someone has thought through a strategy fully, they come to me with a great understanding. Unfortunately, being too close to something can give rise to bias that pushes people towards a conclusion without thinking about the potential for things to go wrong. When it comes to wealth creation strategies, something that sounds too good to be true generally will be.

Complicated schemes promising unbelievable success with very little chance of downside risk inspire two feelings for me: 1. The strategy is not truly understood. Or 2. Something is being sold. After seeing loads of schemes, strategies, and ideas along the way, I've come to the conclusion that when it comes to building personal wealth, it's best to keep things as simple as possible and only as complicated as they need to be.

Here are some actionable ideas to keep things simple but still build wealth:

**Control spending** — Household finances need a system to be sustainable. This starts with income earned, followed by setting priorities on how to allocate the income, and finishes with a surplus to be applied to other goals. If habit and impulse creep in, it can push spending above income. This is called a cash flow deficit. It's bad. First of all, it means that there's no money left to put towards growing wealth, and secondly, it needs to be funded from somewhere — either longer-term investments or (even worse) from debt.

**Allocate the surplus** – Once spending is under control, think about the best place to allocate the surplus depending on your personal goals, priorities, and preferences. A quick run through of potential targets could be: 1. Emergency Fund (at least 3 x months of core expenses); 2. Extra debt repayments; 3. A personal investment plan; 4. Superannuation or other long-term savings.

If you can keep it simple, then do—Before adding extra complication to your system, ask the obvious question: "Will this make a difference, and is that difference worth it?" Extra bells, cogs, whistles, and gears may make a difference to the outcome of a financial strategy, but will that difference be worth it? Will it be worth the additional risk of something going wrong, the additional time and strain that it takes to keep the system running, and what would be the comparative result

if things were kept simpler? If you can't run the more complicated system yourself, how much will it cost to hire assistance from an accountant, financial planner, or real estate agent?

**Don't start without considering the finish** – The best chess players in the world don't blunder blindly into strategies. They plan at the opening, monitor and modify through the mid-game, and keep an eye on the end-game. Wealth strategies are the same. Before diving into a new scheme promising riches, think through an exit strategy. Ideally, think through a number of different outcomes: One for if things happen perfectly as planned, one for an average outcome (is it still worthwhile), and one for if something goes wrong.

Building wealth isn't difficult, but it's not simple either. Ultimately, anyone can do it, and if you need help, it is readily available.
