For the uninitiated, a Finn is sailed single-handed and has one sail and a rotating mast. There's only one design for a Finn, which means in competition, it all comes down to the skill of the sailor. Finn sailing is a physically and mentally demanding sport. Australia has produced many champion Finn sailors, including the legendary John Bertrand, who famously skippered Australia II in the 1983 America's Cup.

Off the water, we're looking forward to showing these international and interstate guests what we love most about the bayside: our bars, cafes and restaurants, waterfront walks, weekend markets, and our friendly village vibe. A highlight on the event calendar is the Finns Rock concert, starring The Filthy Animals, at Manly Harbour Boat Club on February 21 (find out more on page 6). INTERNATIONAL SAILING STARS HEADED TO BRISBANE FOR FINN WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS AT MANLY

Brisbane is set to welcome an exciting wave of international sailing action this February as the Porsche Centre Brisbane Finn Championships brings together the world's best Finn sailors at Manly.

The series kicks off with the Australian Finn Championships, leading into the prestigious Finn Gold Cup – the class's premier world championship – and wraps up with the Finn World Masters, which attracts over 100 sailors aged 40-plus from around the world.

Adding to the excitement, World No. 1 Alessandro Marega has just been finalised for the Gold Cup, alongside World No. 2 Peter Peet and World No. 4 Laurent Hay. Entry numbers highlight the scale of the event, with over 70 boats already entered for the Australian Titles, more than 60 for the Gold Cup, and 110-115 competitors expected for the World Masters.

Preparations are well underway, with shipping containers now arriving from Norway, Spain, New Zealand, the USA, and more boats due to arrive any day from Europe in preparation for the busy month at Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron, beginning with training with fellow competitors to sharpen performance in local waters.

While the racing will be world-class, the focus remains on ensuring competitors, families, and the local community enjoy both the sailing and the on-shore activities in and around Manly, including the Finn Rocks Filthy Animals concert on 21 February.

With ideal conditions, excellent facilities, and a well-practised volunteer team, Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron and its local community are ready to host a fantastic international event. The club encourages Brisbane locals to visit during the month and get up close with the world's best sailors in this prestigious class of sailing dinghy.

We asked local artist Garry Dolan about what an artist's life looks like and the path he took to becoming a professional creative.


"Having started oil painting at the age of 13, I decided to concentrate on art approximately 20 years ago and am an established professional artist with artwork in many permanent collections around the world.

"My artwork has been displayed across Australia and the world at sites such as the Pentagon, the Australian War Memorial, the MotoGP,







HELPING YOUNG PEOPLE FIND THEIR PATH: BABI'S LIFE-CHANGING PROGRAMS

Wynnum-based BABI has been running its Get Set for Work program for ten years and has achieved great outcomes for participants. The program runs for nine weeks, four times each year throughout the school term. It works with young people aged 15 to 19 who have disengaged from school or have completed school and are unsure of their pathway forward.

Participants not only complete a Certificate II in Skills for Work and Vocational Pathways, but also receive one-on-one support from a youth worker to achieve the goals they set for themselves. This can include obtaining



identification, getting a learner's licence, connecting with Centrelink, applying for a tax file number, linking in with other support agencies, or working towards any other personal goals.

At the end of the program, participants celebrate their achievements with a graduation ceremony attended by family and friends. The support doesn't end there – once someone has participated in the program, they continue to have access to ongoing support from youth workers at BABI.





CONJUNCTIVITIS IN DOGS AND CATS

Conjunctivitis is a condition affecting the lining of the eyes. The moist, pink tissue lining the eyelids (including the third eyelid in dogs and cats) becomes red, swollen, and uncomfortable. Pets may blink and squint frequently and develop a watery to cloudy yellow/green discharge. Further signs such as itching, hair loss around the eyes, discharge from the nose, sneezing, and coughing may develop depending on the cause of the conjunctivitis.




Infectious conjunctivitis occurs more commonly in cats than in dogs – herpesvirus and chlamydia are two viral infections that can present with signs including conjunctivitis

TREATMENT OF CONJUNCTIVITIS

Taking your pet for a vet check is important if they are showing signs of conjunctivitis, as the treatment will vary depending on the cause of the condition and whether there are other clinical signs associated.

Your vet will check your pet for the presence of any corneal ulceration. This involves placing a fluorescent dye in the eye to assess for injuries to the cornea.

Medicated drops will likely be prescribed – if there is no ulceration present, these medications will contain an anti-inflammatory to help reduce the swelling and irritation.



The eye should be kept clean and free of discharge with saline. An Elizabethan collar may be required to prevent rubbing and further trauma to the eye and surrounding tissues. Anti-histamines may be useful to help reduce irritation.

Greene Park Playground Opening


Hooked on Fun at Greene Park Playground

WOUND HEALING AFTER SURGERY

A skin defect or excision site, when surgically closed under sterile conditions, will seal itself against external pathogen invasion within two to four hours. In this way, the body protects itself from infection by skin and other pathogens.


A wound needs to have properly placed sutures tied without tension, Nylon for interrupted, not silk; or a Proline monofilament subcuticular suture.

The use of "dissolvable" sutures can have disadvantages. In the old days, when catgut sutures were used, they dissolved and disappeared within 10 to 14 days. Catgut is no longer available due to government legislation, even though it has been used safely for years. Monosyn, an artificial synthetic suture, is used instead. This material can hang around within the wound site from 140 to 360 days, causing a persistent inflammatory reaction and a red wound (i.e., it is very slow to return to a skin colour).

If patients are diabetic or have evidence of infection, perioperative antibiotics should be used to cover the surgery. Generally, antibiotic cover is not required unless there are special circumstances. However, Chloromycetin eye ointment is frequently used post-op to improve cosmetic results on the face.

A wound after six hours can be washed with soap and water. This does not increase infection rates. Occlusive (waterproof) dressings should never be used. If used, they increase the infection rate by allowing normal staphylococcal skin flora and other organisms to proliferate in the moisture produced by sweat. This gets trapped under the dressing. A good dressing to have in your first aid kit is Hyperfix or Fixamol, which allows a wound to breathe.

It is recommended that an initial compression bulky absorbent dressing be used to prevent blood contamination of clothing. It will be removed once blood oozing has stopped after four to 12 hours. Then leave the wound open to the air, wash with soap and water, and dry normally as necessary. It is not necessary to keep a wound dry!

A NEW APPROACH: BRIGHTER WARNING SIGNS FOR WYNNUM RAIL BRIDGES

Queensland Rail has painted bright red and yellow boxes on the bitumen road leading up to the notorious Wynnum rail bridges in a bid to drive down bridge strikes.

There have been 77 bridge and 271 protection beams struck on the South East Queensland (SEQ) rail network by over-height vehicles so far this year.

Following a surge in dangerous and highly disruptive bridge and protection beam strikes, Queensland Rail, the Department of Transport and Main Roads and Brisbane City Council have painted the road on approach to two frequently struck bridges to drive down incidents.

The trial, underway at rail bridges at Pine Street, Wynnum, will run for up to two years and depending on the outcomes, other frequently hit bridges could follow.

It coincides with the release of new footage showing over-height vehicles slamming into rail bridges and protection beams, sending debris flying, destroying machinery and, in one case, ripping a truck bed in two.

The road markings, similar to school-zone style warnings, clearly state "low bridge" and encourage drivers to slow down and double-check their height before approaching low-clearance rail bridges.

In 2025, between January and November, they were struck 22 times by over-height vehicles.

The painted road markings are designed to grab drivers' attention before it's too late. This initiative is in addition to clearly visible advance warning road signs, height signage, monitoring cameras, and, in some cases, protection beams.

The message is simple: know the height and load of your vehicle and plan your journey so you don't get your truck or load stuck.

Motorists face fines of \$1,335 and four demerit points for damaging rail infrastructure and if the matter goes to court, the maximum penalty for causing damage to rail infrastructure is \$13,352. Queensland Rail actively pursues individuals to recover costs.

Rail bridge strikes should immediately be reported to Queensland Rail using the telephone number on the identification plate fixed to the bridge or by calling Emergency Network Control on 1800 079 303.

COMMUNITY ORGANISATION PROFILE: SAILS AT BAYSIDE

CONTRIBUTED BY SAILS AT BAYSIDE

SAILS at Bayside (S@B) is a wonderful way to experience the pleasures of Waterloo Bay with sit-on-top Viking kayaks staffed by qualified supervisors, and experienced skippers on the Nacra 4.5-metre catamarans.

Open to the public on one Saturday per month, these days are for any member of the public, and events are advertised on the SAILS at Bayside website – but book in early as places reach their quota within 20 minutes of opening. Later applicants are automatically placed on a wait list and contacted as places become available.

S@B is an outreach of the Bayside Anglican Churches under the control of St Peter's Anglican Church, Wynnum, which is the "Parent Parish". While some volunteers may attend other churches, they and other keen sailors and kayakers within the local community subscribe to the Code of Conduct and ethics of the organisation. All volunteers hold current Blue Cards and have qualified for the Anglican Diocese of Southern Queensland's stringent Safe Ministry Check for Children. All participants are required to wear life jackets to participate (supplied). A rigid inflatable safety boat patrols the catamaran area and provides support when necessary.

Key team members carry marine VHF radios for communication, ensuring participants are assured of maximum safety at all times.

The main aim of S@B is to offer opportunities for youth at risk, their families and carers, to promote reconciliation and provide a service for the parishes and the community. S@B aims to help young people overcome difficulties, reach their potential, and actively engage in community life through sailing, teamwork, kayaking, and life skills. Closed private days are normally held mid-week twice a month.

This year marks the 20th anniversary of S@B providing sailing and kayaking activities to disadvantaged youth (including Indigenous female youth), refugees recovering from torture and trauma, and young carers (looking after siblings, parents, and grandparents), children in out-of-home care, and the general public.

The public events take place mainly at Breakwater Park, Wynnum (on the south bank of Wynnum Creek), Foreshore Park at Raby Bay in the Redlands, and at other locations in the Wynnum-Manly area for the majority of private clients.

BRISBANE CITY COUNCIL'S KERBSIDE COLLECTION DATES 2026

Brisbane City Council's annual kerbside collection is your chance to conveniently dispose of unwanted bulky items. 

A BOOK REVIEW - *BUTTER* BY ASAKO YUZUKI

MY THOUGHTS:

Butter is nothing short of a feast – rich in flavour, stuffed with tantalising recipes, and layered with meaning. It's not just a crime story with culinary trimmings; it's an incisive meditation on how appetites – literal and figurative – shape our relationships and our sense of self.

One memorable recipe is the simple dish of rice with butter and soy sauce. This humble meal recurs throughout the story, becoming a

symbol of comfort, nostalgia, and quiet rebellion – a way to reclaim pleasure in a world that often polices women's appetites. The dish's unpretentiousness highlights the beauty found in everyday rituals, and Yuzuki's sensual descriptions make you crave its warmth and simplicity, reinforcing food's central role as both sustenance and metaphor.

But the book doesn't shy away from its darker aspects. Indeed, its willingness to explore obsession, shame, longing, guilt, rejection, and the blurry boundaries between reality and illusion is what makes it so satisfying, albeit unsettling.

The novel questions traditional expectations placed on women: to be modest, restrained, and self-sacrificing. For Rika, "Japanese women are required to be self-denying, hard-working and ascetic, and in the same breath to be feminine, soft and caring towards men". Rika's boyfriend's misogynistic statements ring in her ears, "Men putting on weight is different from women putting on weight".


Through Kajii's character – unapologetically large, passionate, and defiant – Yuzuki challenges the reader to reconsider what it means to live authentically in a world that demands conformity.

The two main characters are well developed, as are their evolving and complex relationship, and the deepening relationships of Rika with her friends.

Some readers may find the pace a bit slow at times, with action suspended for periods of introspection, especially in scenes where Rika muses on her own insecurities and frustrations as she journeys towards self-acceptance. As such, if you're expecting a traditional crime thriller, while the book does involve the journalist's investigation of the murders, you might be frustrated by the novel's reflective passages.

The ending is ambiguous, leaving several threads unresolved, but for me, it adds to the book's authenticity and emotional impact. Life rarely offers perfect closure, and neither do the best stories.

I missed my book club's review of this book, but I'm told the host provided rice with butter and soy sauce for lunch.

CHICKPEA & LEMON-HERB COLD PASTA SALAD RECIPE

We're loving cold salads at the moment, and this summery version using chickpea pasta packs a protein punch. Load it up with whatever fresh veggies you have on hand.

INGREDIENTS (SERVES 4)

- 250g chickpea pasta (any short shape – you choose!)
- 4 cups of chicken stock
- 1 can (400 g) of chickpeas (or you can use canned lentils), drained and rinsed
- 1 cucumber, diced
- 1 cup of cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 small red capsicum, chopped
- 1/4 of a red onion, diced
- 1 cup of finely chopped kale leaves
- 1/4 cup fresh parsley, chopped
- A handful of fresh basil leaves
- 2 tbsp of fresh mint, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan (optional)

DRESSING

- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 3 tbsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp lemon zest
- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 1 small garlic clove, minced
- Salt and pepper to taste

METHOD

1. Boil the pasta in the chicken stock (this adds depth of flavour) and extra water if needed (add salt) until al dente. Drain, then rinse under cold water, and put it in a large bowl or container.
2. Chop the cucumber, tomatoes, capsicum, kale, onion, parsley, basil, and mint.
3. In a small bowl or jar, combine the olive oil, lemon juice, zest, mustard, garlic, salt, and pepper.
4. Add the herbs, chickpeas and veggies to the pasta, then pour over the dressing and mix well.
5. Top with grated parmesan and you're ready to eat!





LOCAL FISHING WITH SPERO

SUMMER FEASTS: GET YOUR CALAMARI NOW, FRESH FROM THE BAY!

BY SPERO KARTANOS

February is one of the best months to catch tiger squid in the bay. Find them close in at Green Island, Wellington Point, Mud (on the north-west side), and of course, throughout the weed banks from Chain Banks, Amity, the Rous Channel, the Sand Hills, and all along the western side of Moreton Island.

Tiger squid fishing is great fun for the family, and the kids love to eat them – and at this time of the year, they are ravenous!

All you need for squid fishing is a couple of good-quality squid jigs on a light rod. Jig colours vary, but a pilchard-colour jig, like NKN Yamashita or the Daiwa blood-coloured shrimp, is as good as you can get. Then it's just a matter of casting out and retrieving slowly, or if you are fishing for whiting, a jig under a float will catch them as well.

A little trick: when you catch them and lift them out of the water, grab between the head and body and turn the squid upside down so they release the water. That way, they can't mix water with ink to squirt you, and please, don't drag squid behind the boat to clean and remove the skin – it's the best-tasting part of the squid.

BUT beware... if you catch plenty of squid, sooner or later, when you bring them in, you will get inked! Another tip: if you get ink on your boat, the easiest way to clean up is "30 Seconds" cleaner from Bunnings – it makes squid ink disappear without rubbing, but don't let kids use it, and don't get it in your eyes.

So, get inked and have some fresh calamari for lunch and dinner this month.

LOCAL GARDENING WITH KAT

DAHLIA DAYS

BY KAT PEARSON, *GIRL IN THE GREEN*

I have three designated veggie beds in the backyard. In theory, I was going to have amazing tomato crops, trellises of cucumbers, salad greens, and brassicas. In reality, I haven't got a lot of time for attention-seeking annual veggies, and while I did have a very impressive broccoli and cabbage crop one winter, I decided to give that bed over to beautiful flowering dahlias the following summer.

I justify this situation with the fact that they're technically edible. The petals can be used as garnishes or added to salads, and the tubers can be eaten like potatoes. The original dahlias come from the mountainous regions of Mexico and Central America and were consumed by the Aztecs as a starch source. The dahlias we love to grow now are generally significantly hybridised, and not necessarily with tuber taste in mind, so it might be a bit hit-and-miss flavour-wise if you care to try.

Dahlias love a spot in full morning sun with a little protection from the harsh afternoon rays. They can be grown from seed or, more commonly, from tubers. When planting tubers, water sparingly until they shoot, so they don't rot. Once established, they do like a fair bit of water. Taller varieties will need staking, but there are many dwarf cultivars that are fine on their own.

When they die down in winter, if your soil is sandy and free-draining, you can leave them in the ground (hence why mine haven't moved from their original veggie patch location!). If you have heavier clay soil or they are in a spot that often gets waterlogged, it's best to lift them and replant next season.

With flowers ranging from 20 mm single open flowers to 20-30 cm massive double extravaganzas, it's easy to see how quickly the dahlia bug can grab you. Mid-summer to autumn is the peak dahlia-flowering time, so have a look at your nursery now and see if you can pick up some potted plants. Save the tubers for next year, and you're well on your way to your next addiction!

ABOUT KAT

I love gardening, growing my own food and plants in general. I've been working on our current garden in subtropical Brisbane for the last six-plus years, but have been gardening for much, much longer in all sorts of places. I'm an ex-engineer, recently turned horticulturist (life's too short not to work in something you love!). 
